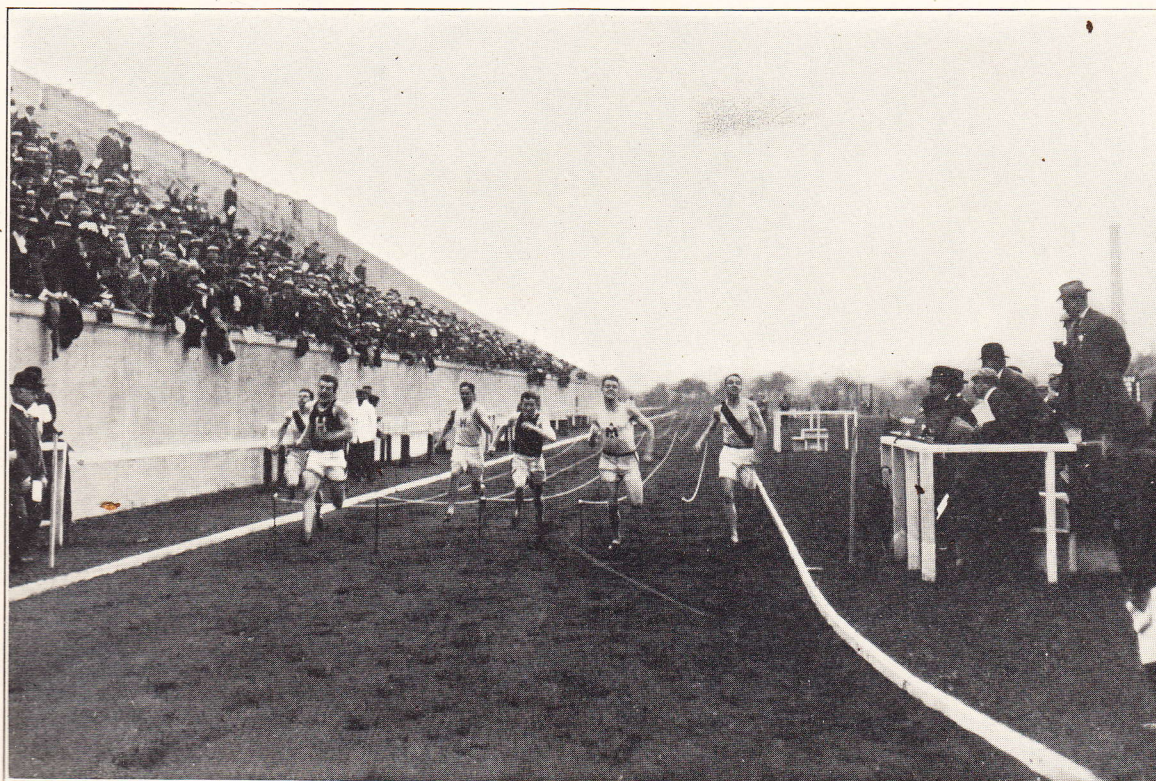

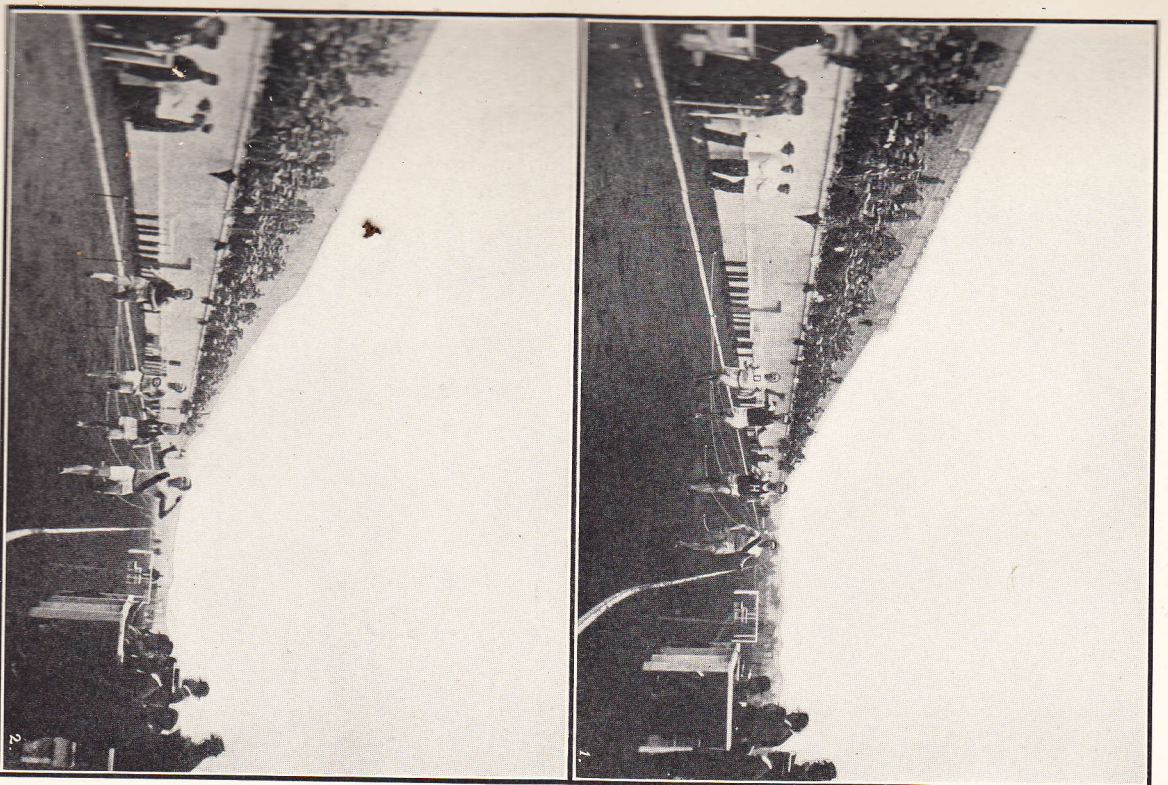

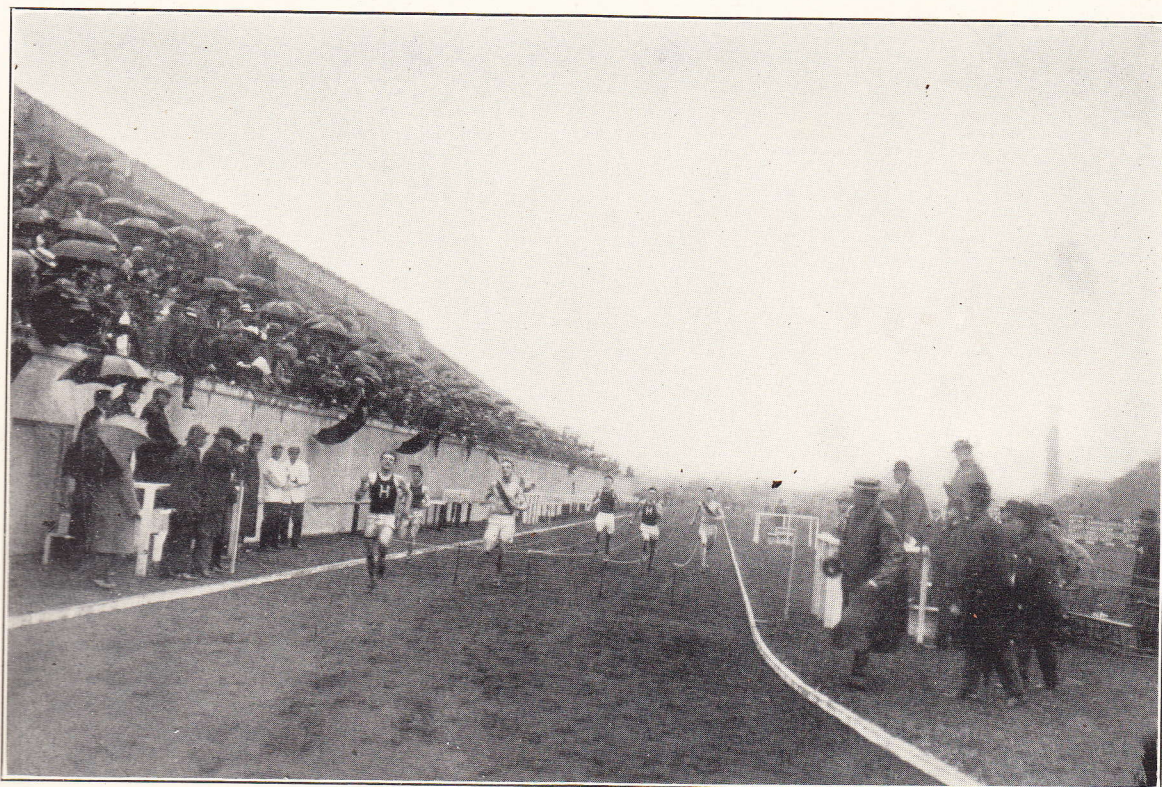

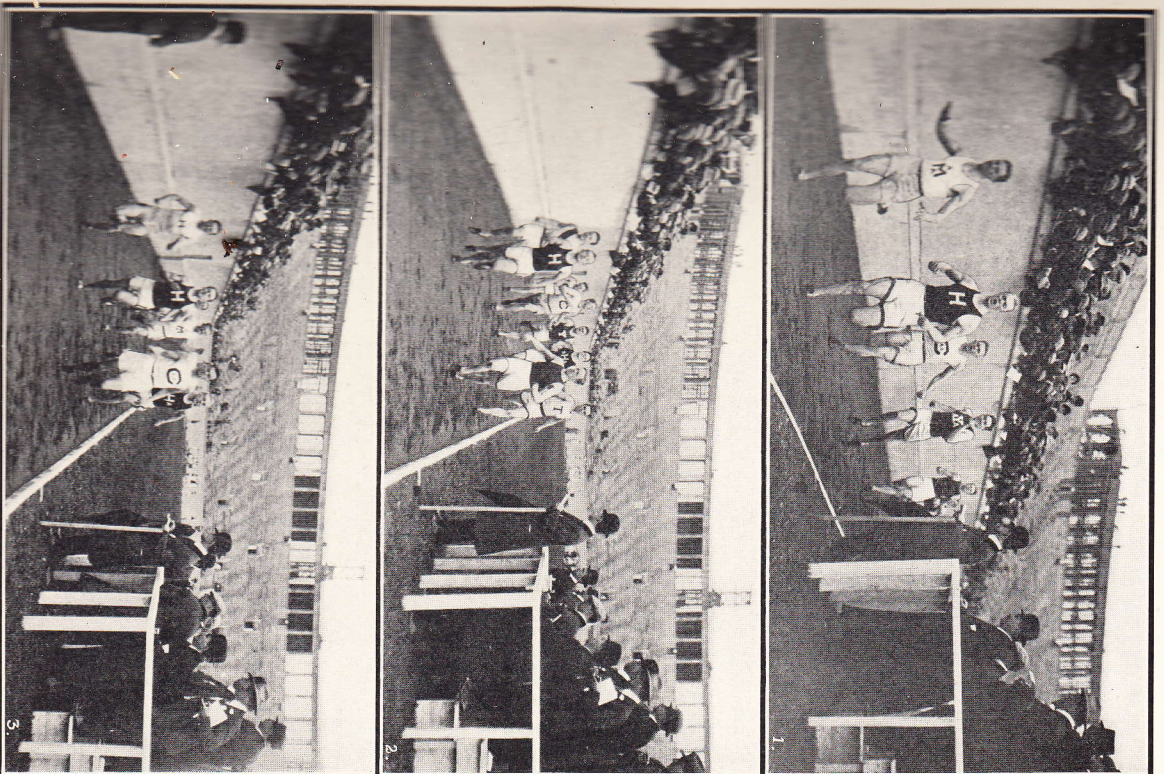

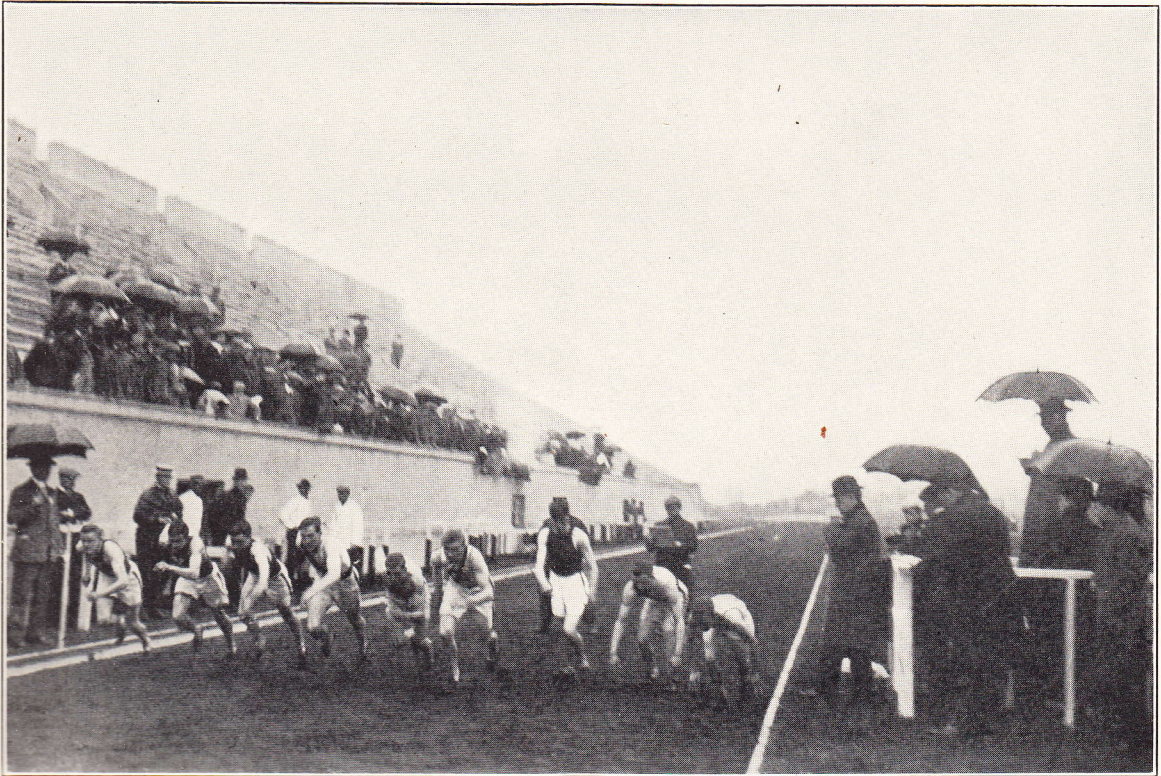

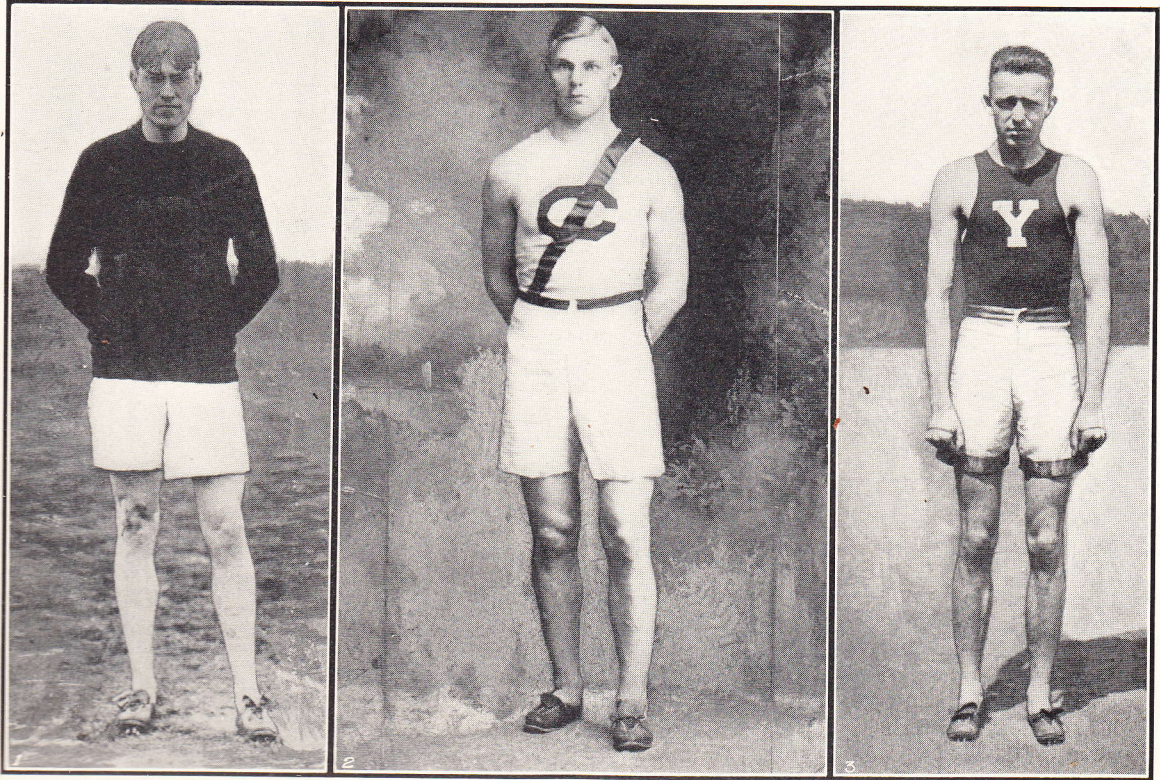

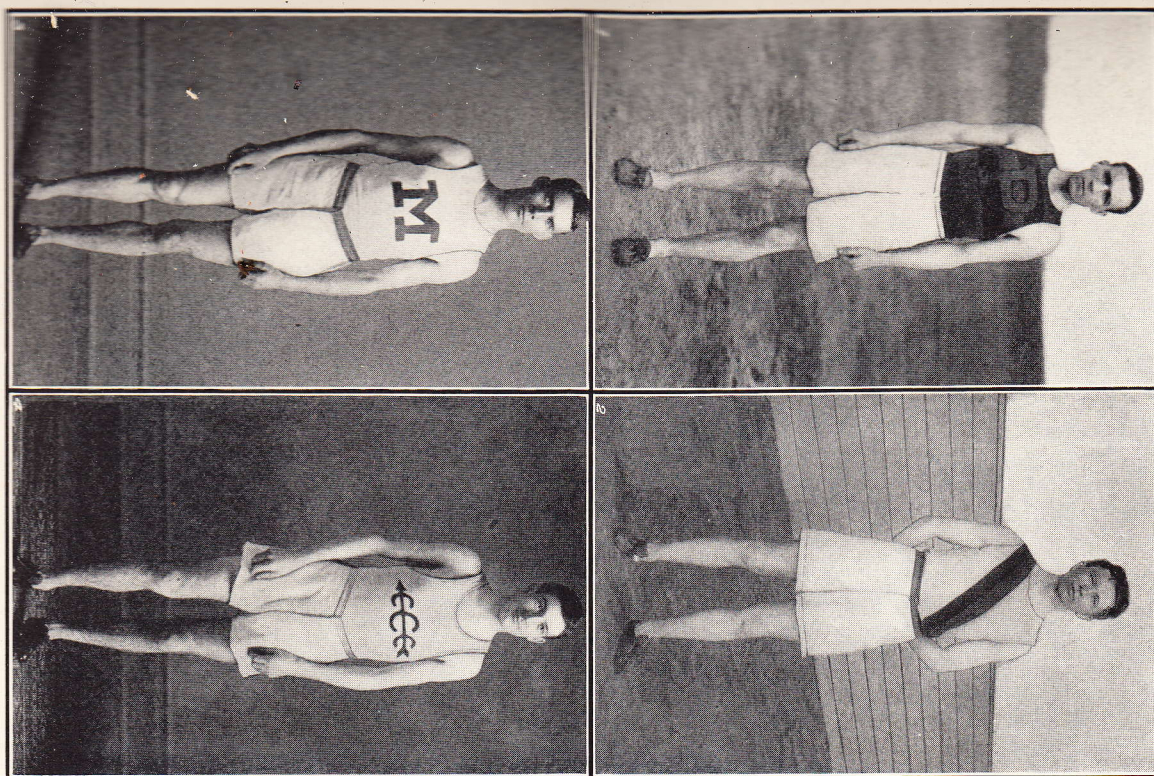
W. C. PAULL WINNING 1 MILE RUN.

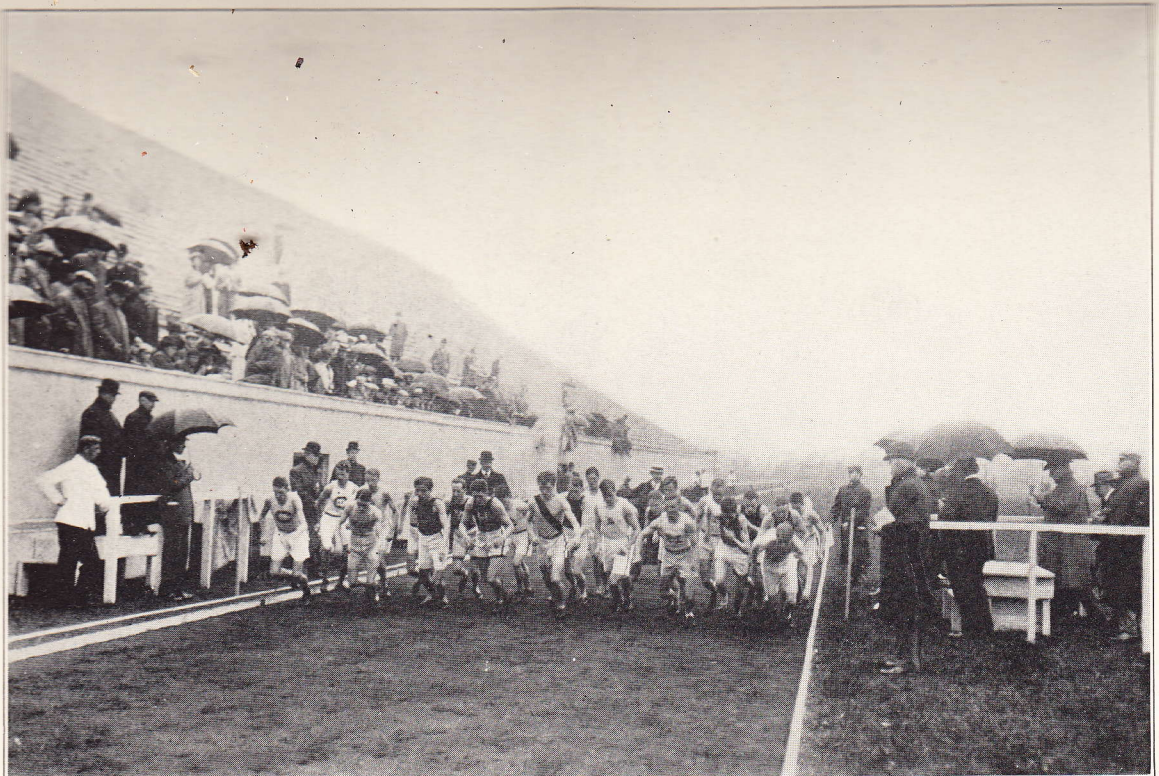

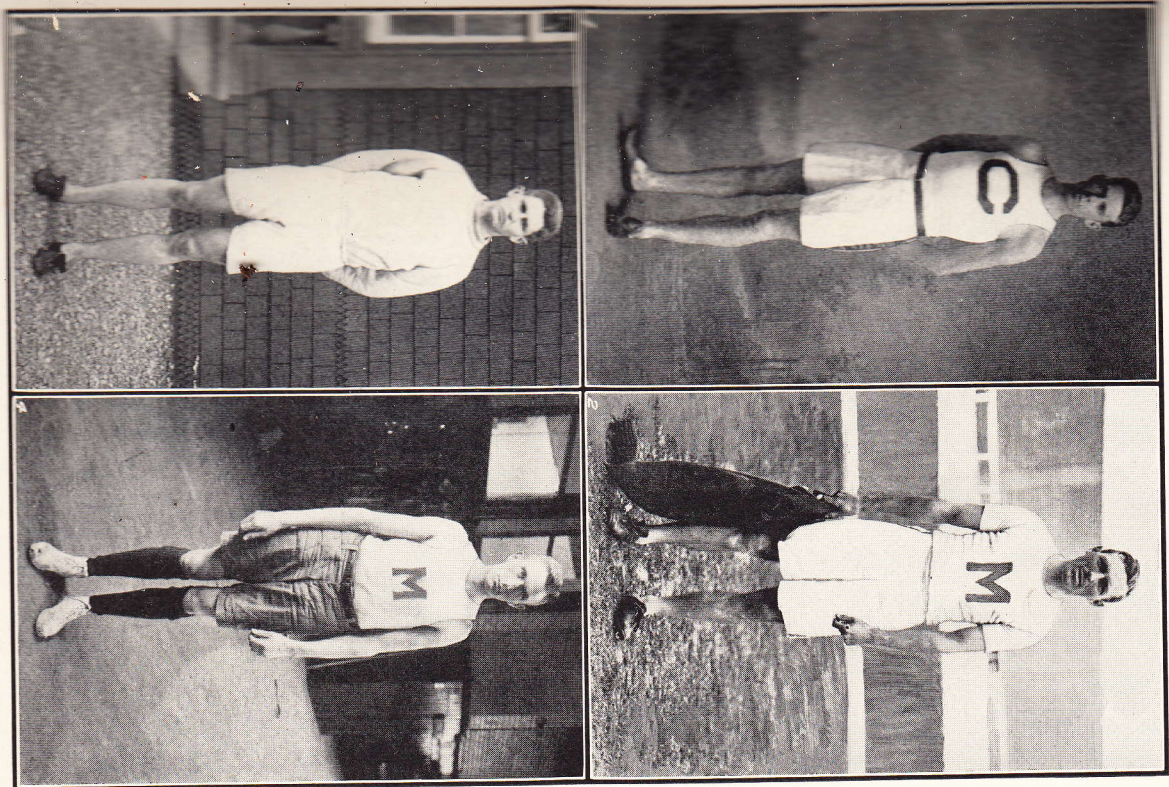

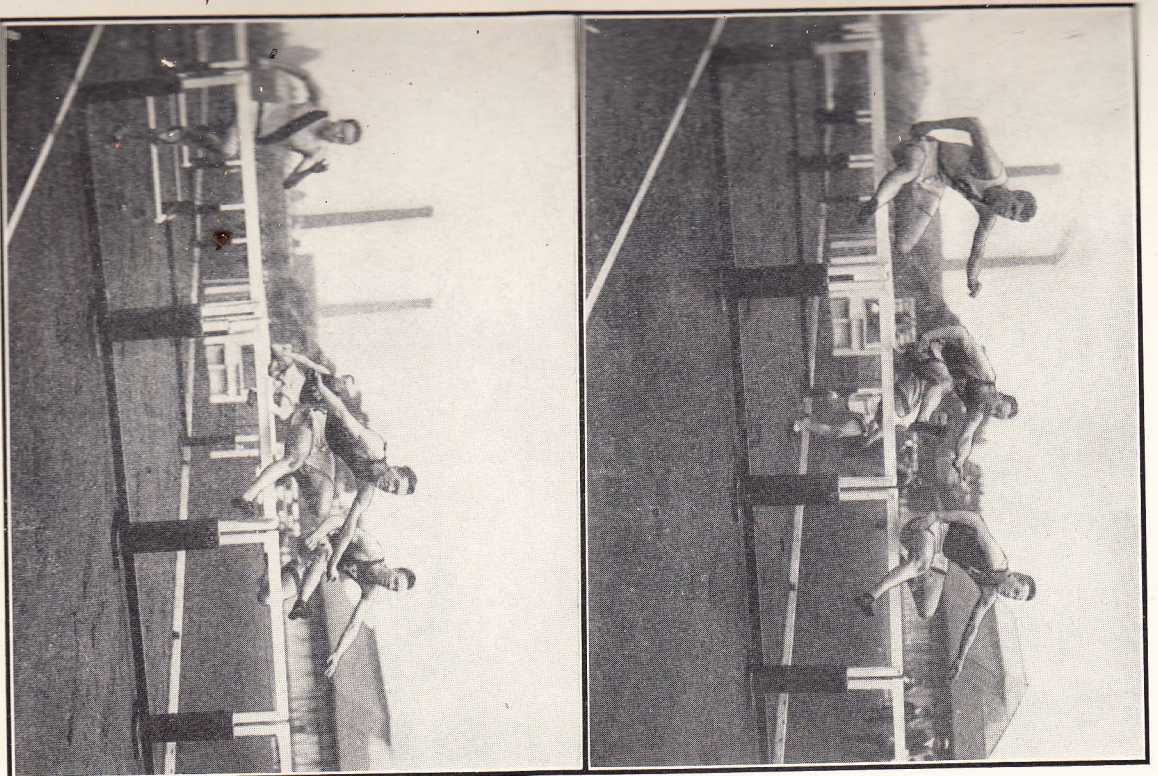

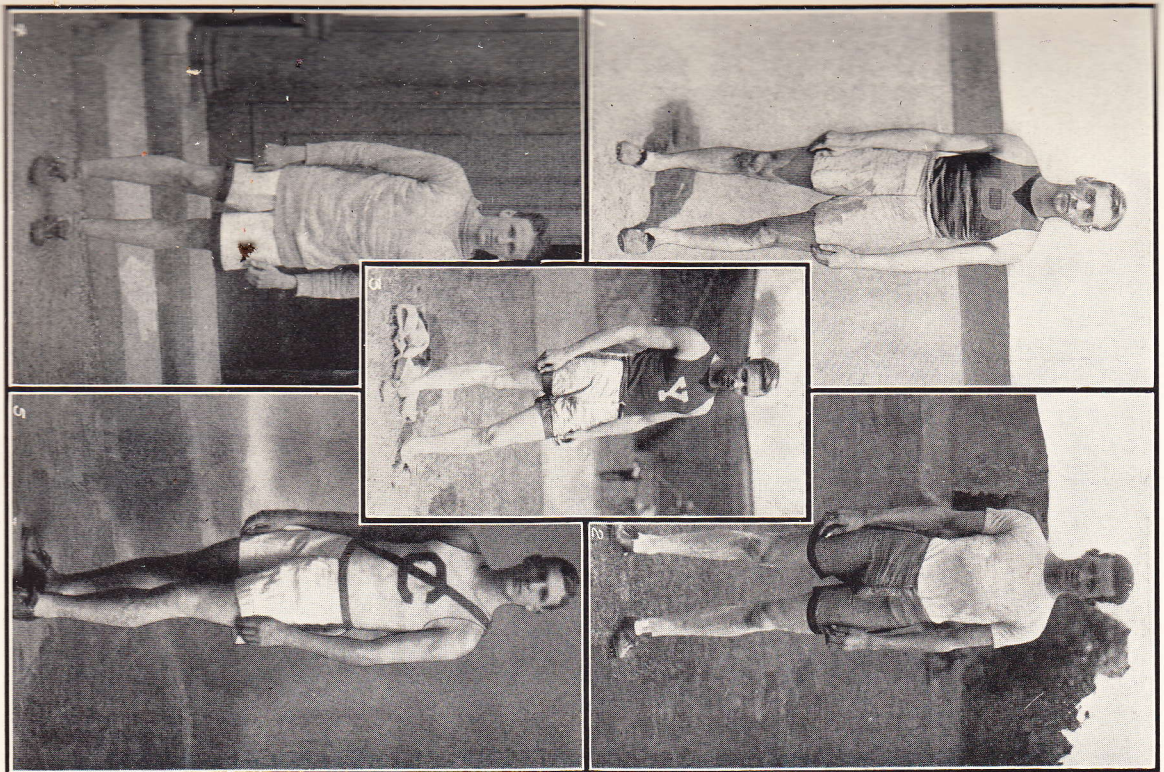

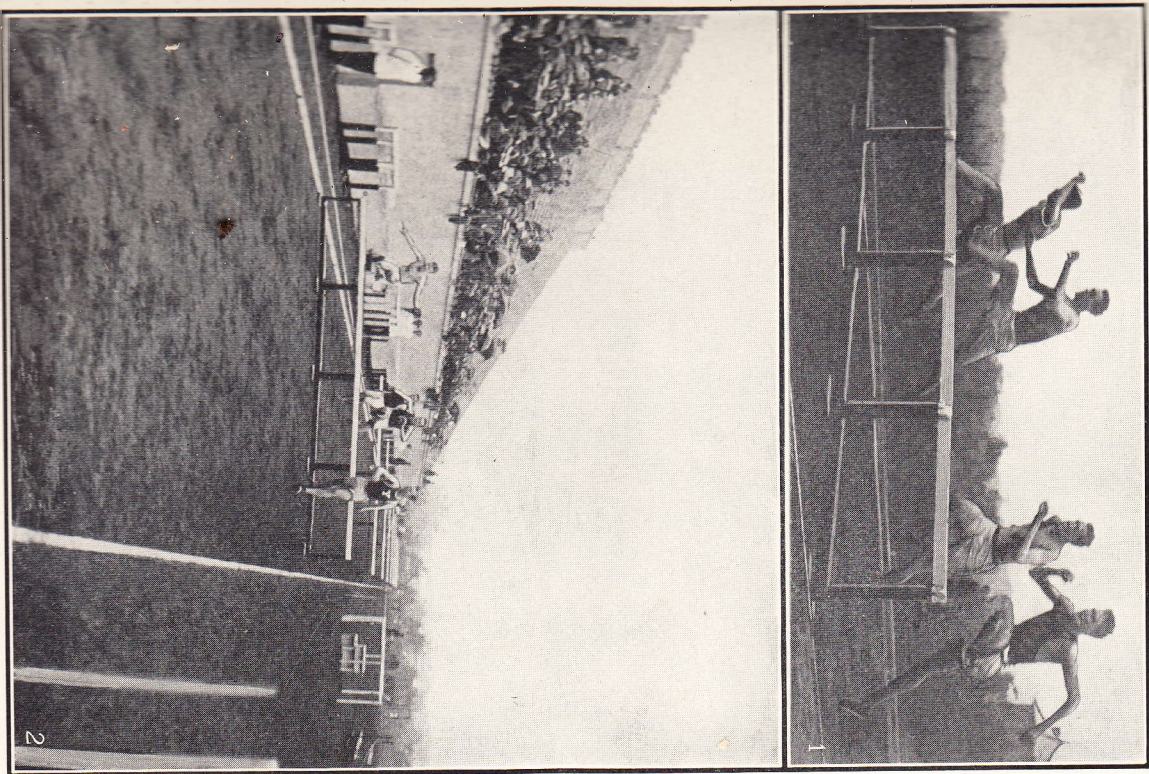

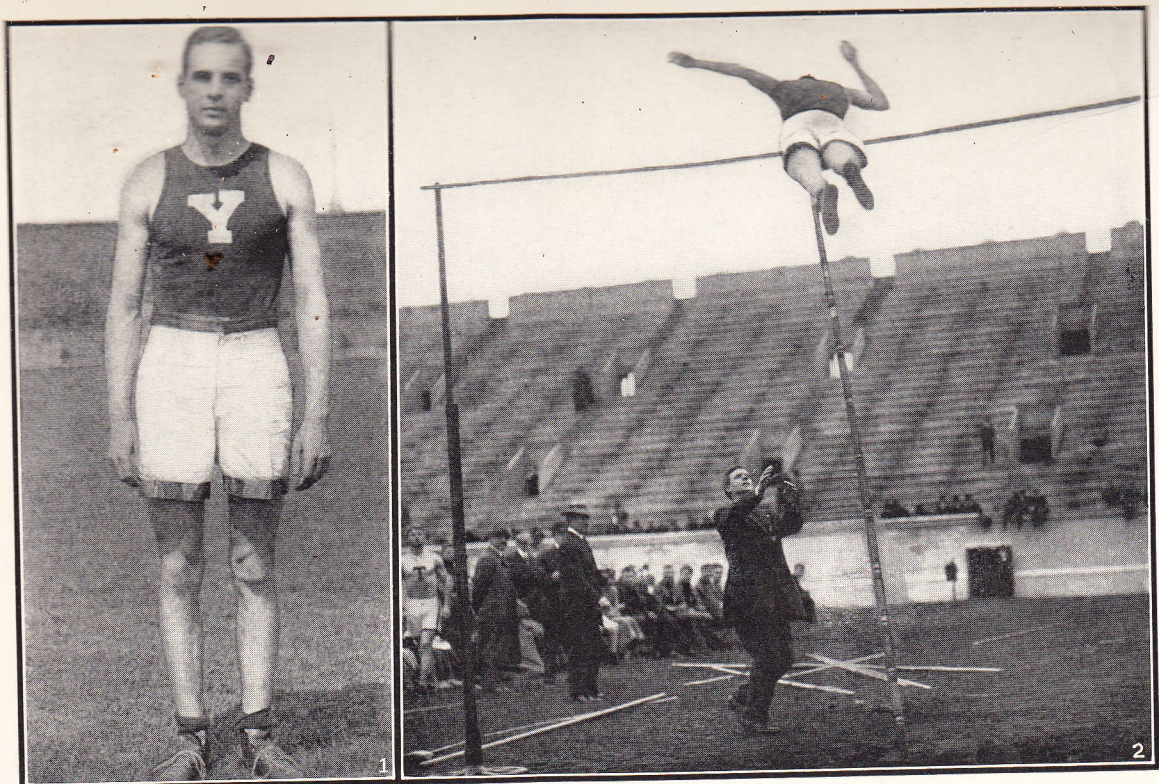

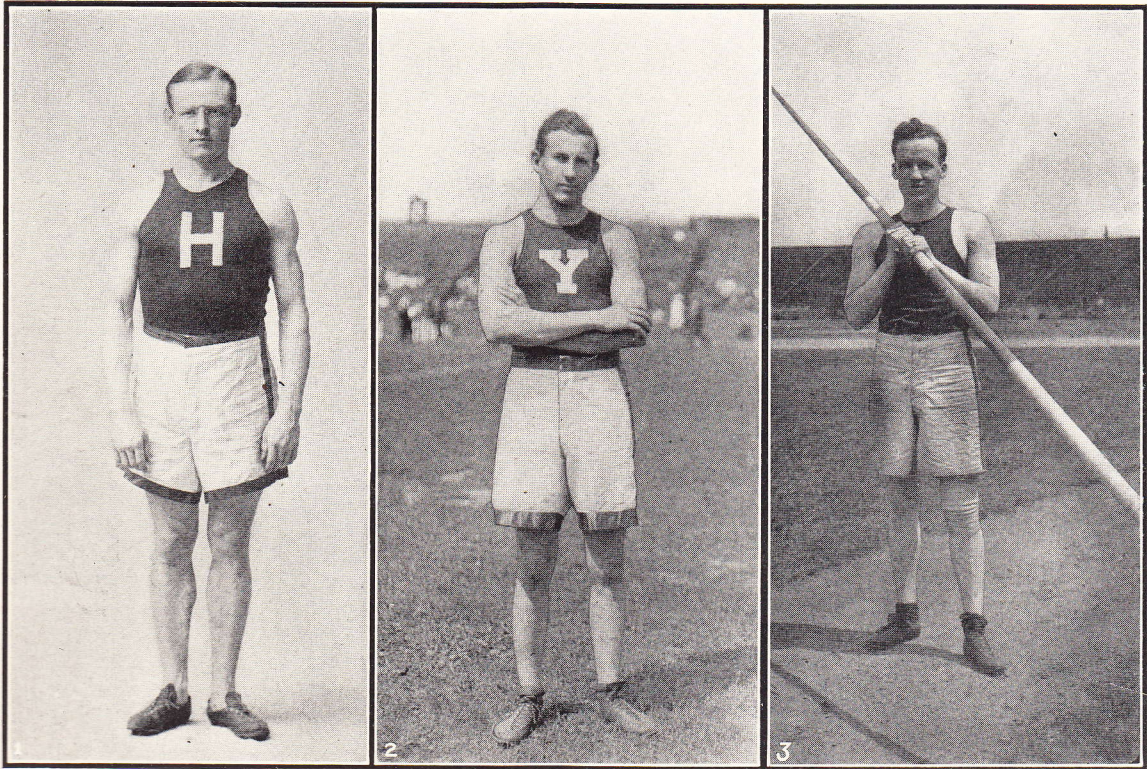

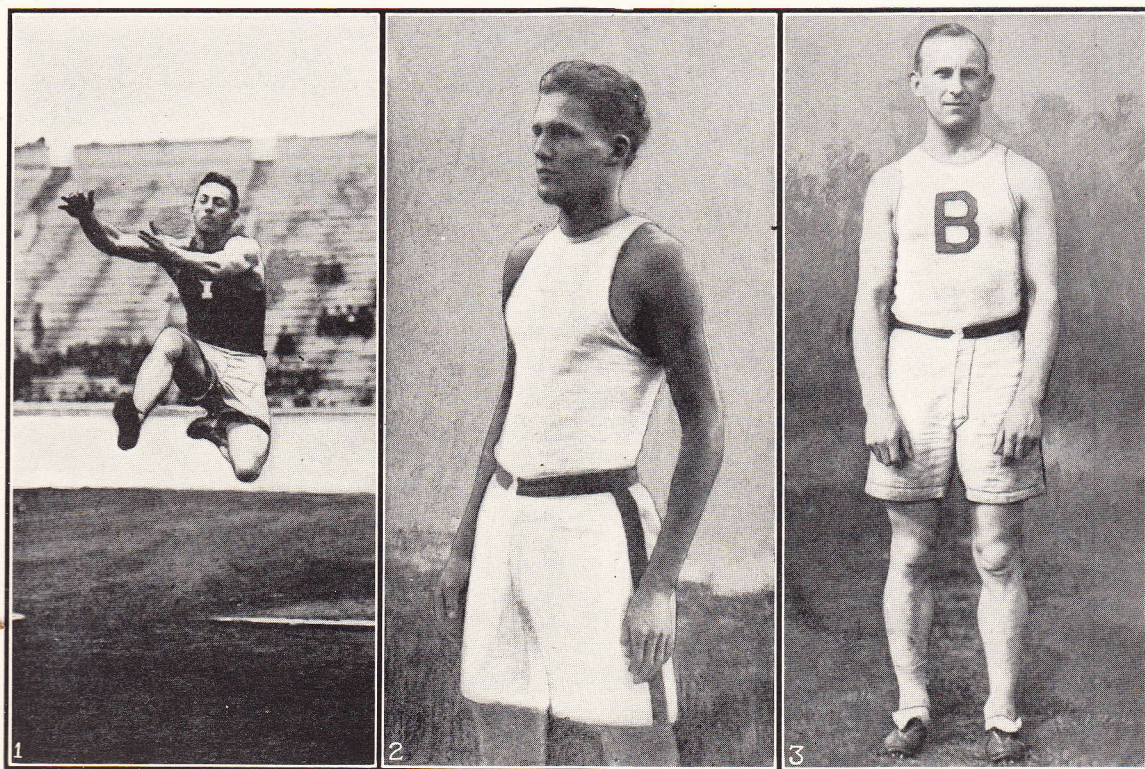
