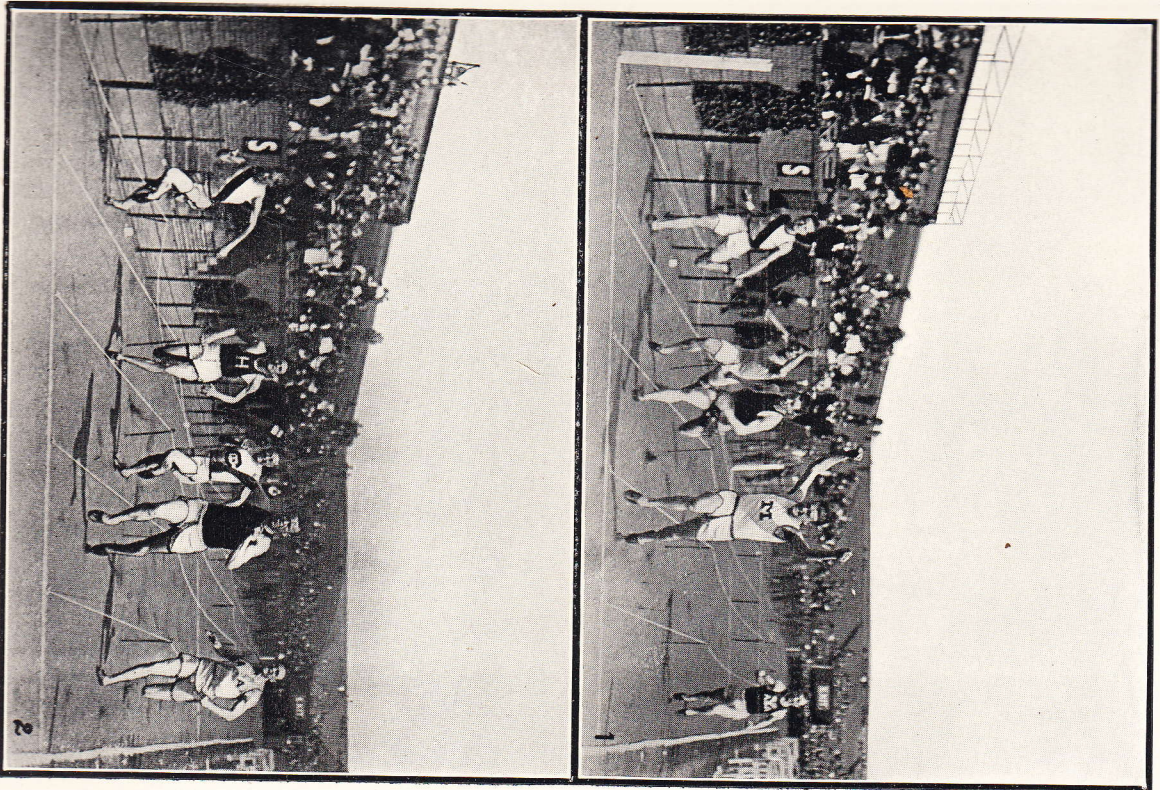

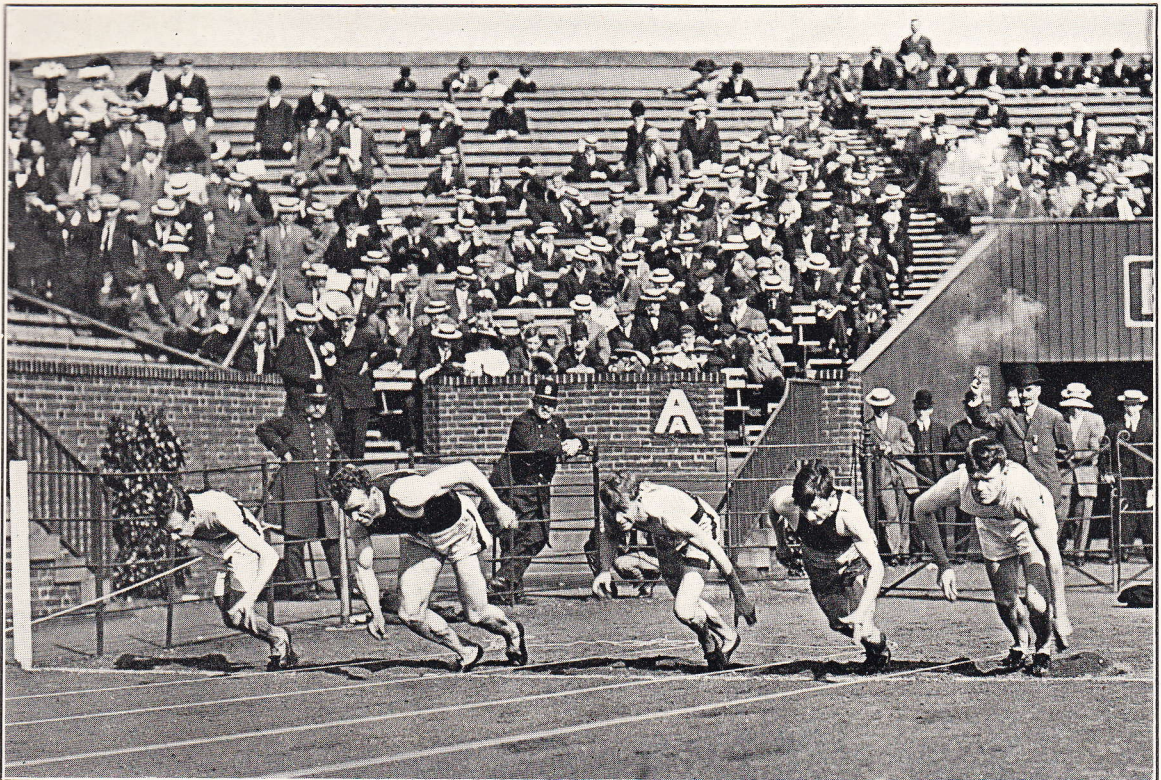

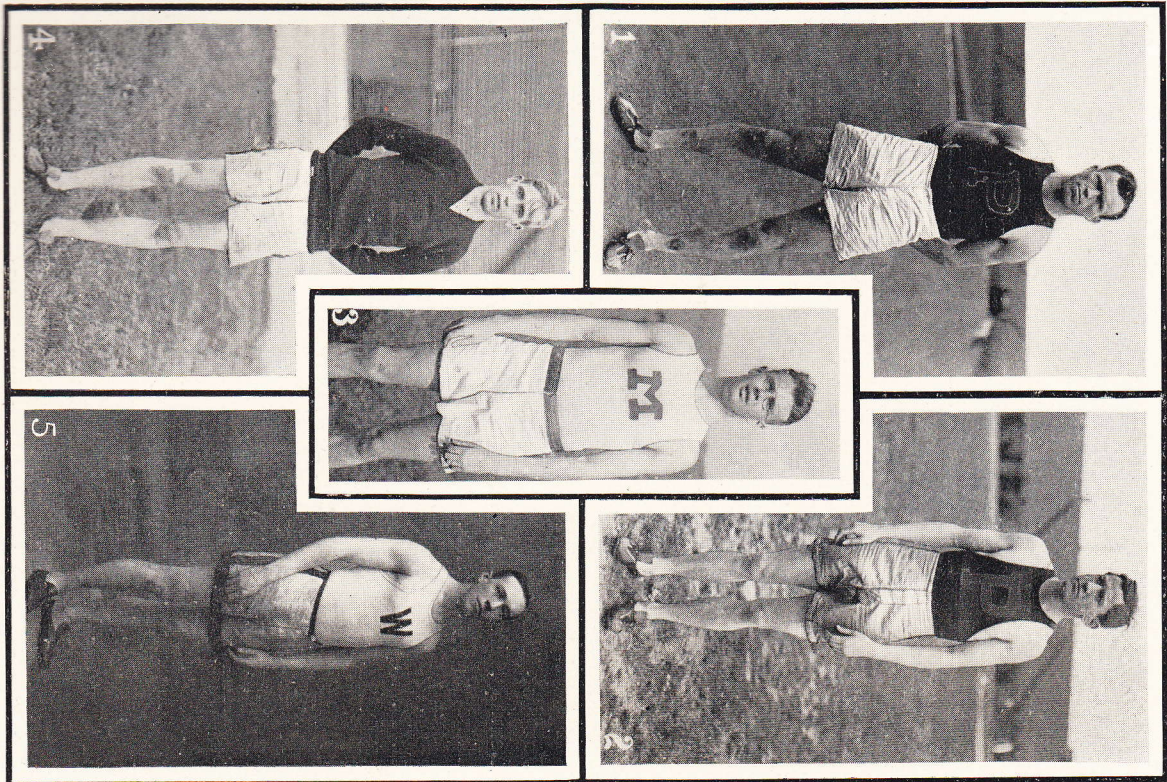

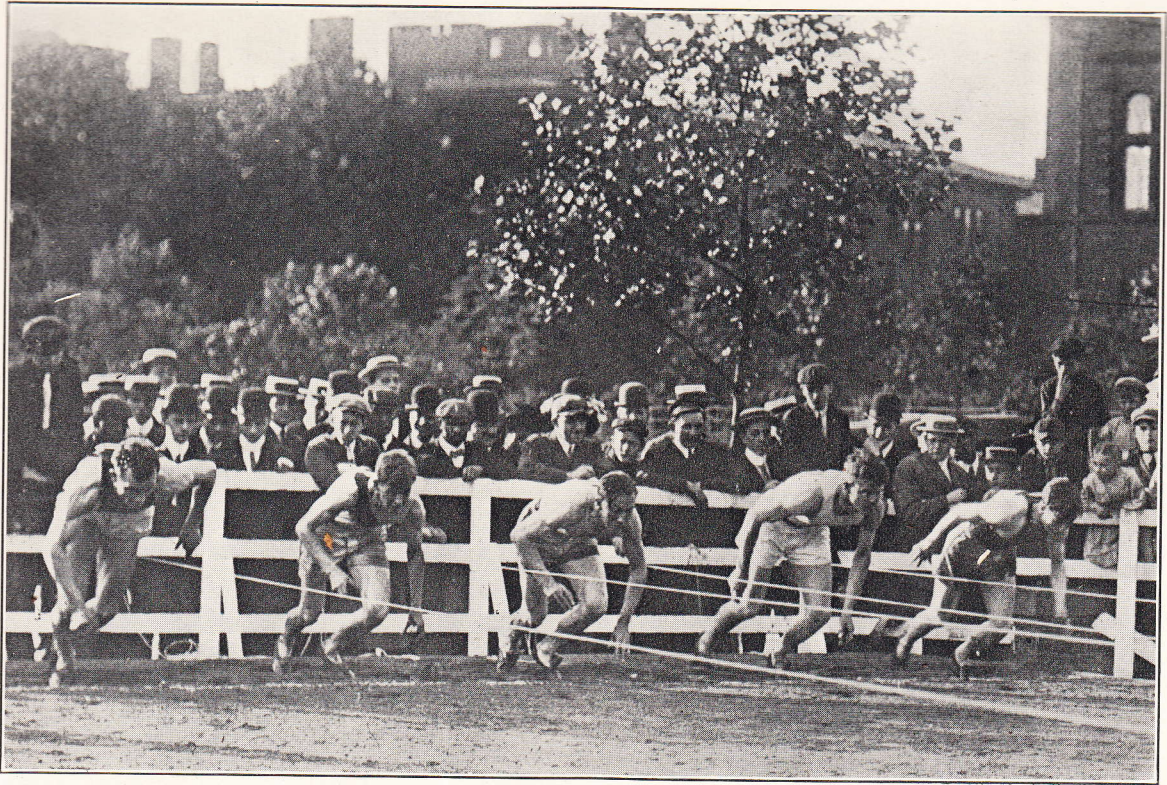

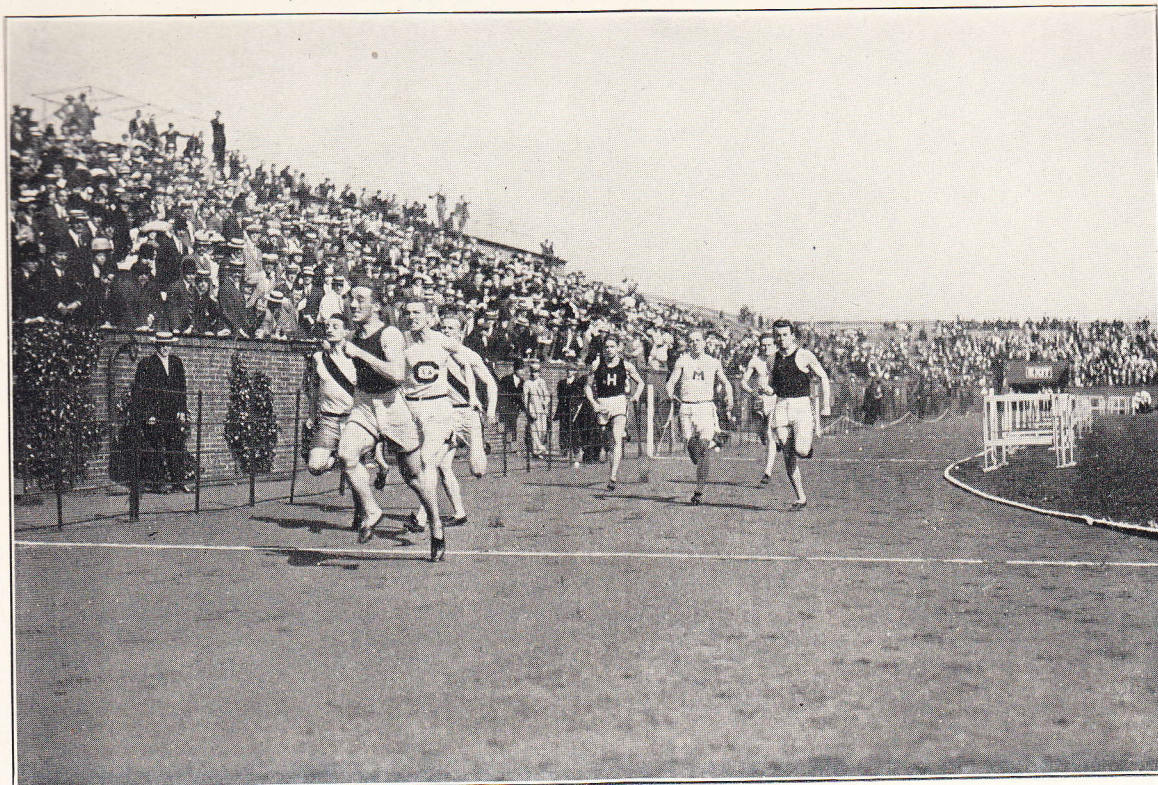

START, FINAL HEAT, 440 YARDS RUN.

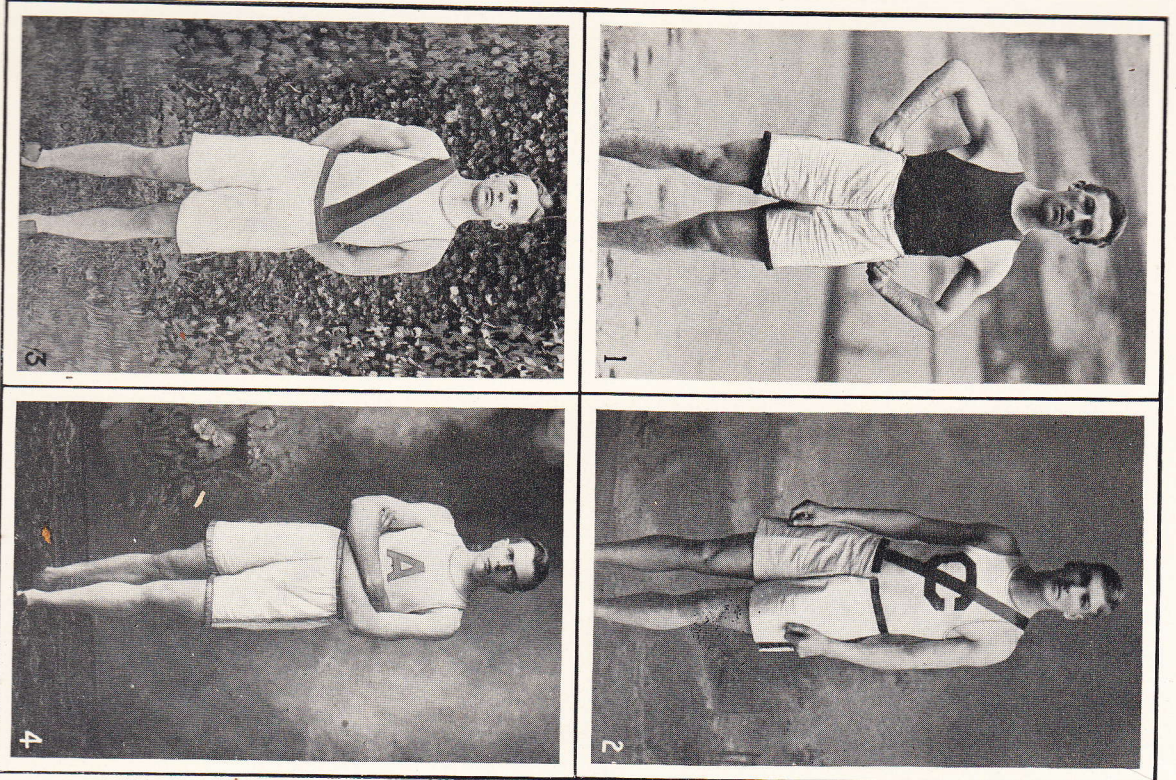

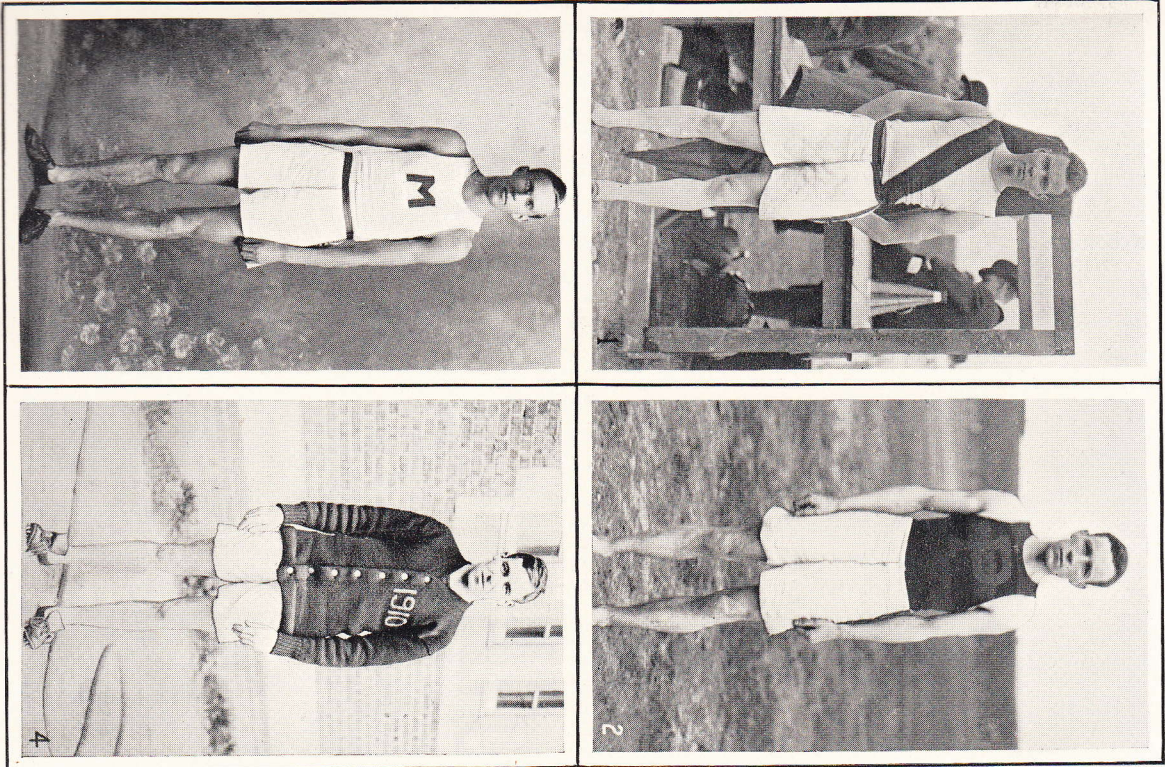

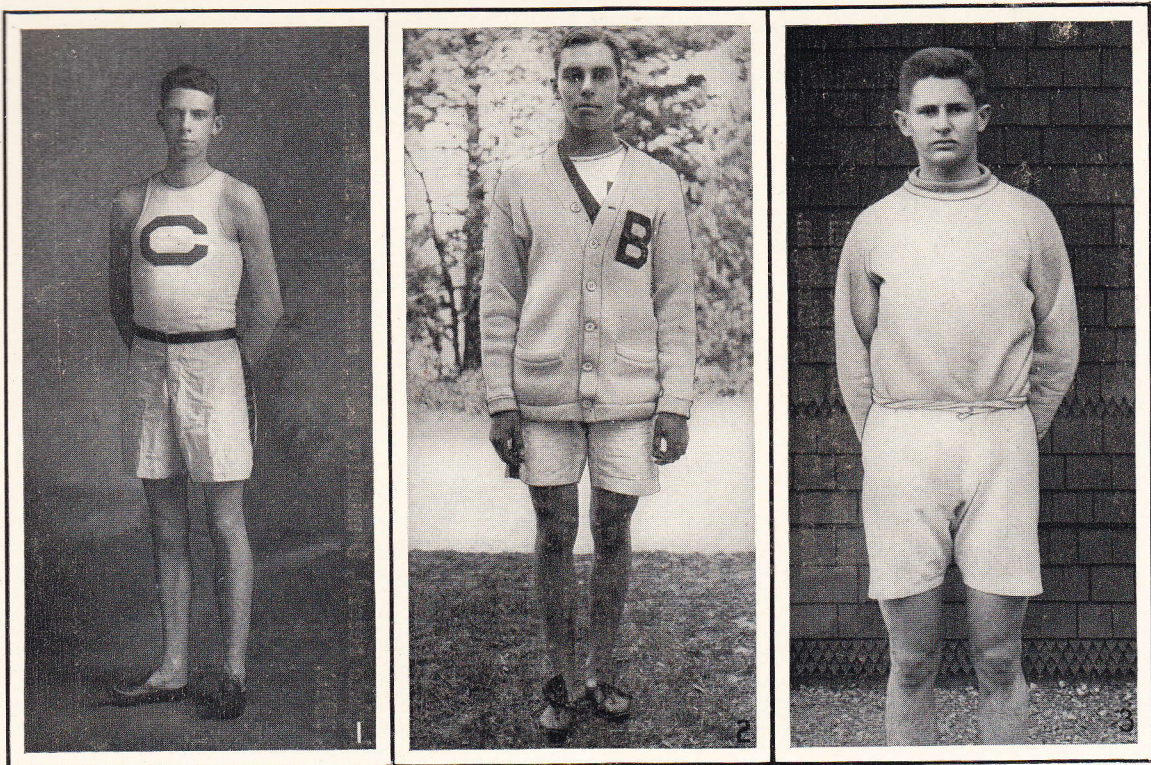

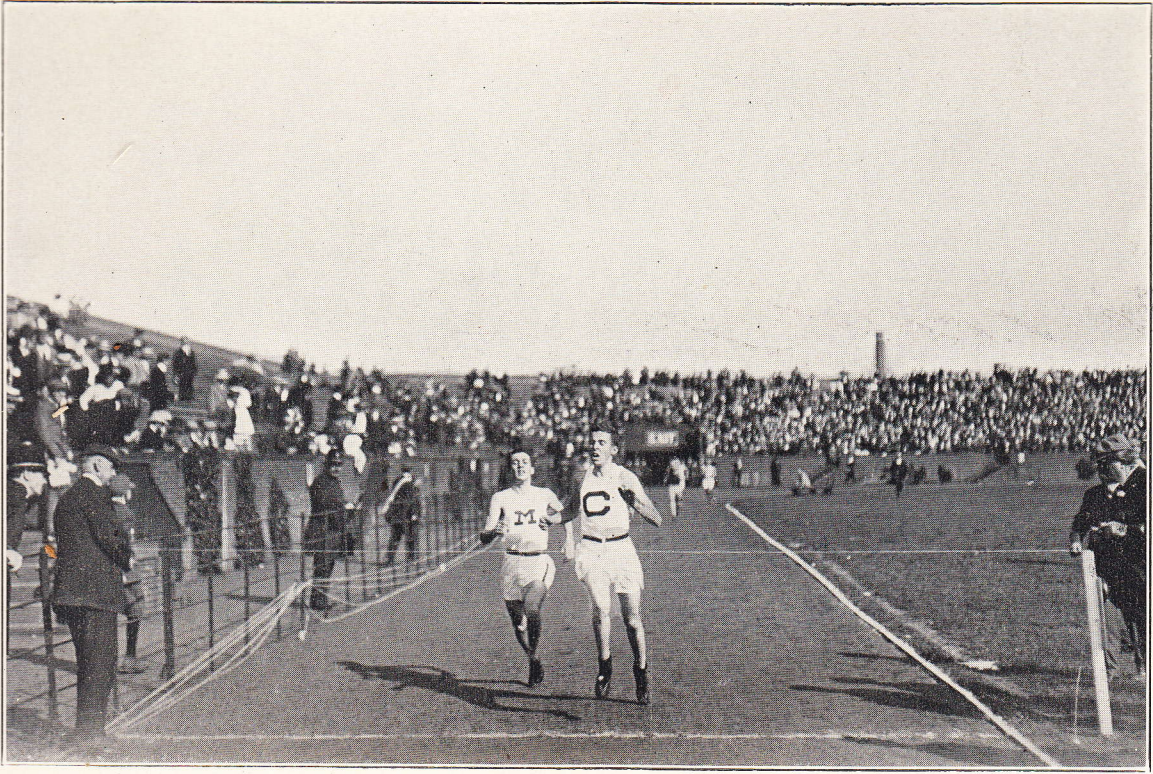

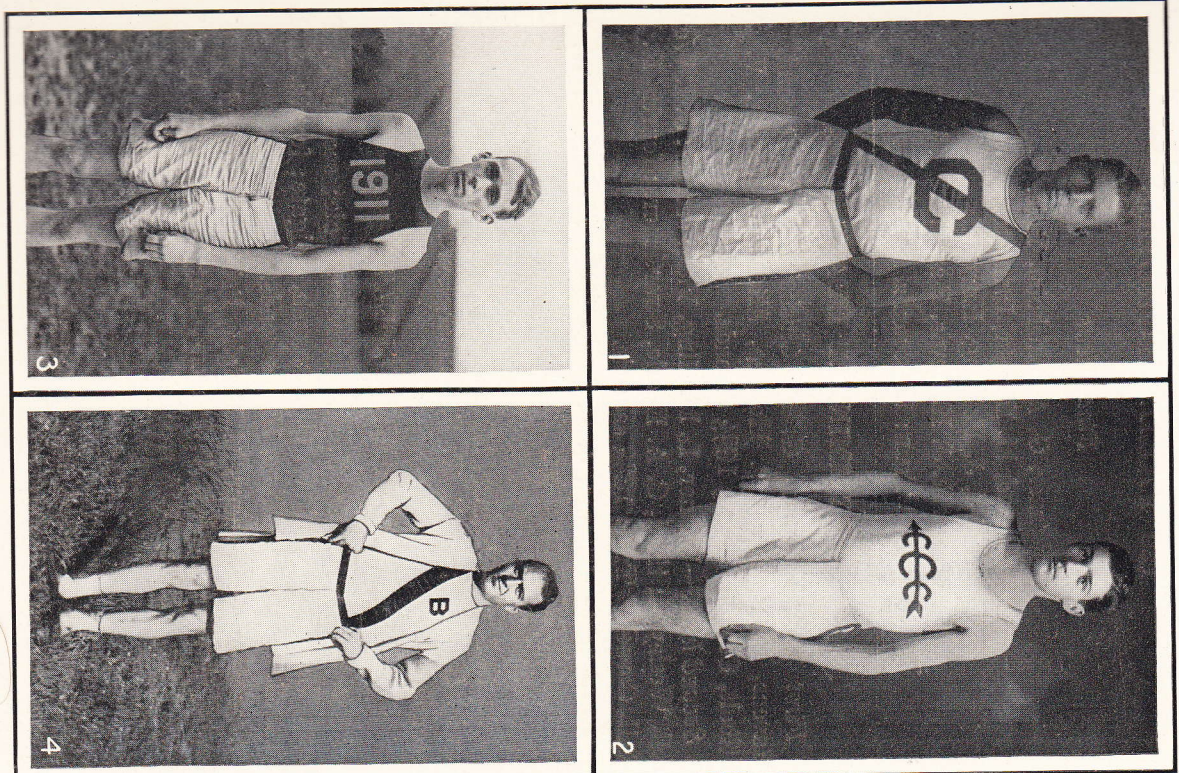

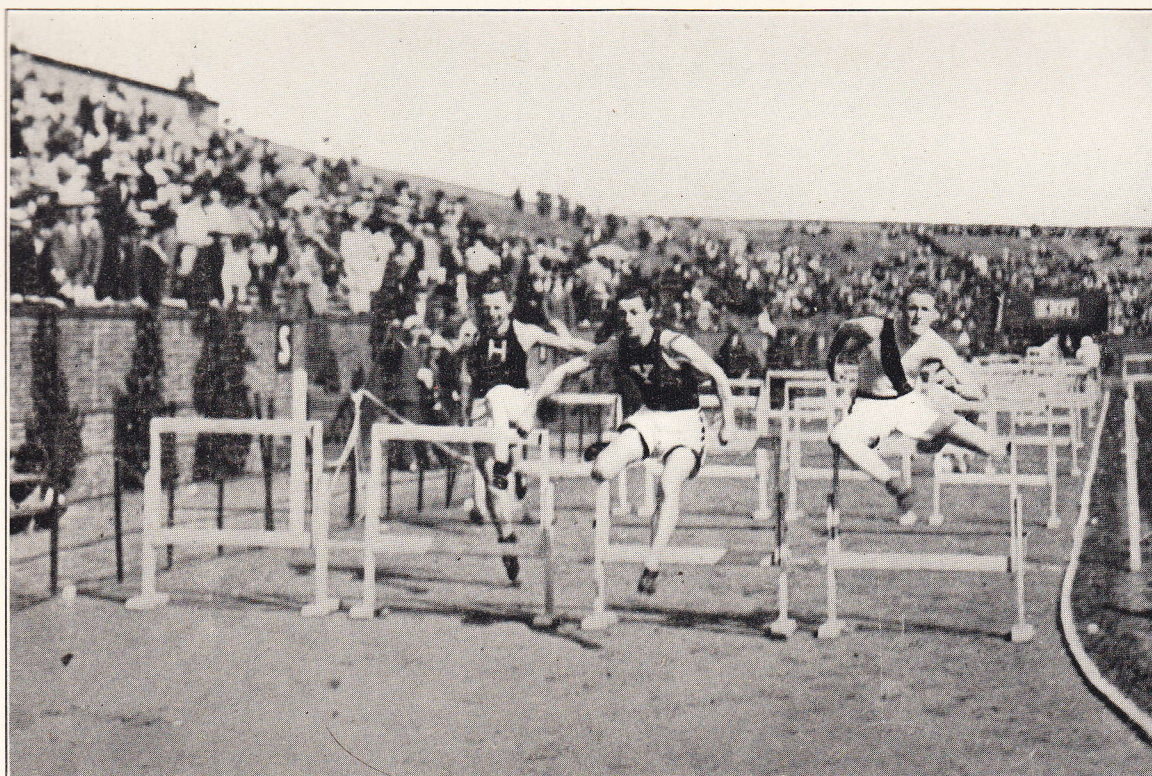
OVER FIRST HURDLE, FINAL HEAT, 120 YARDS HURDLE.

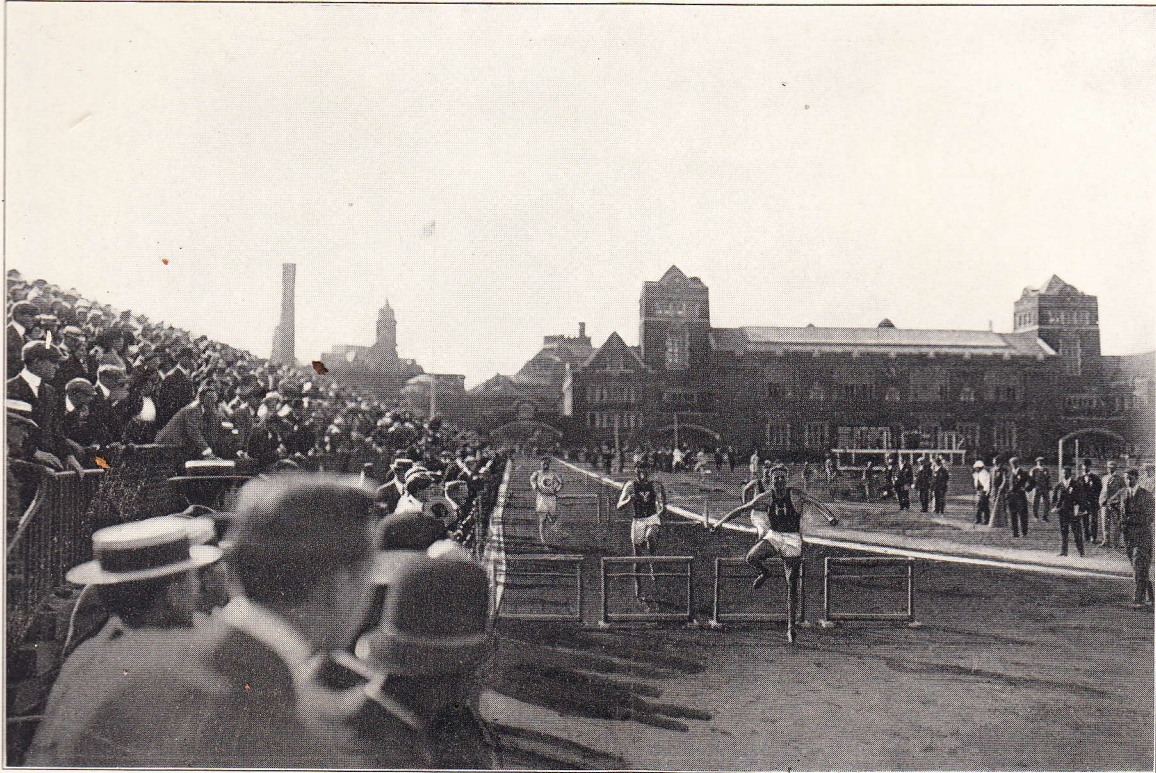

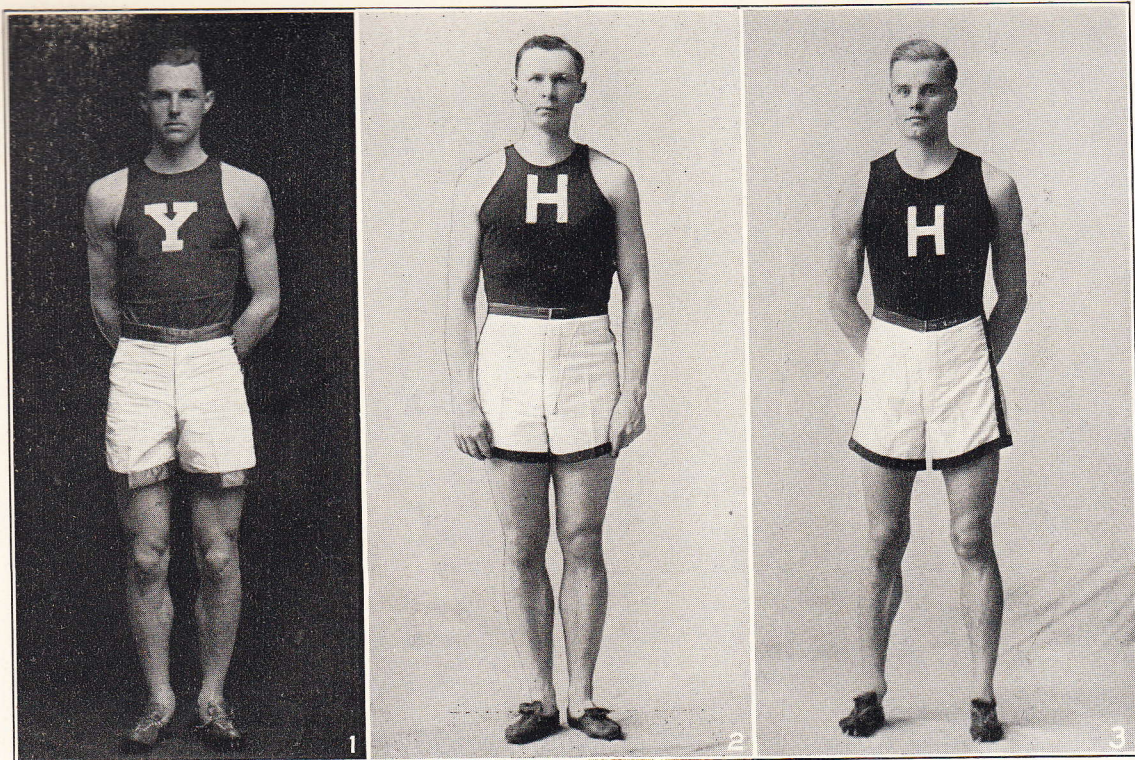

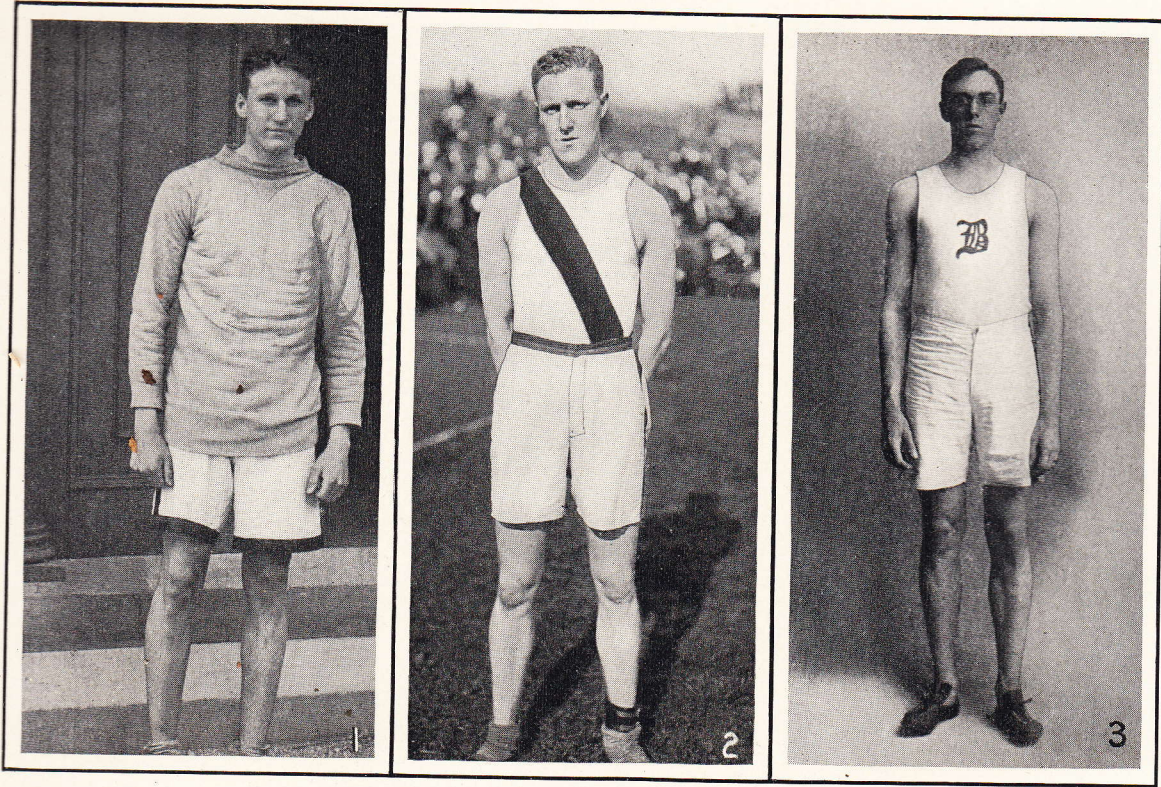

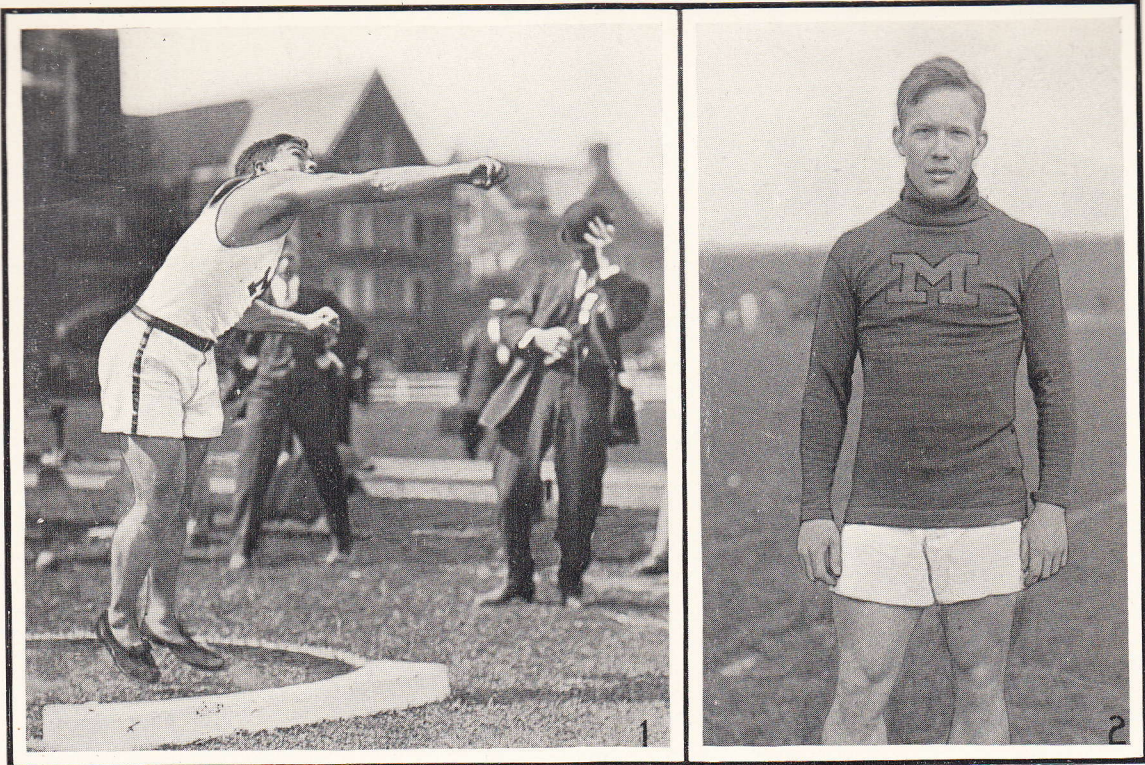

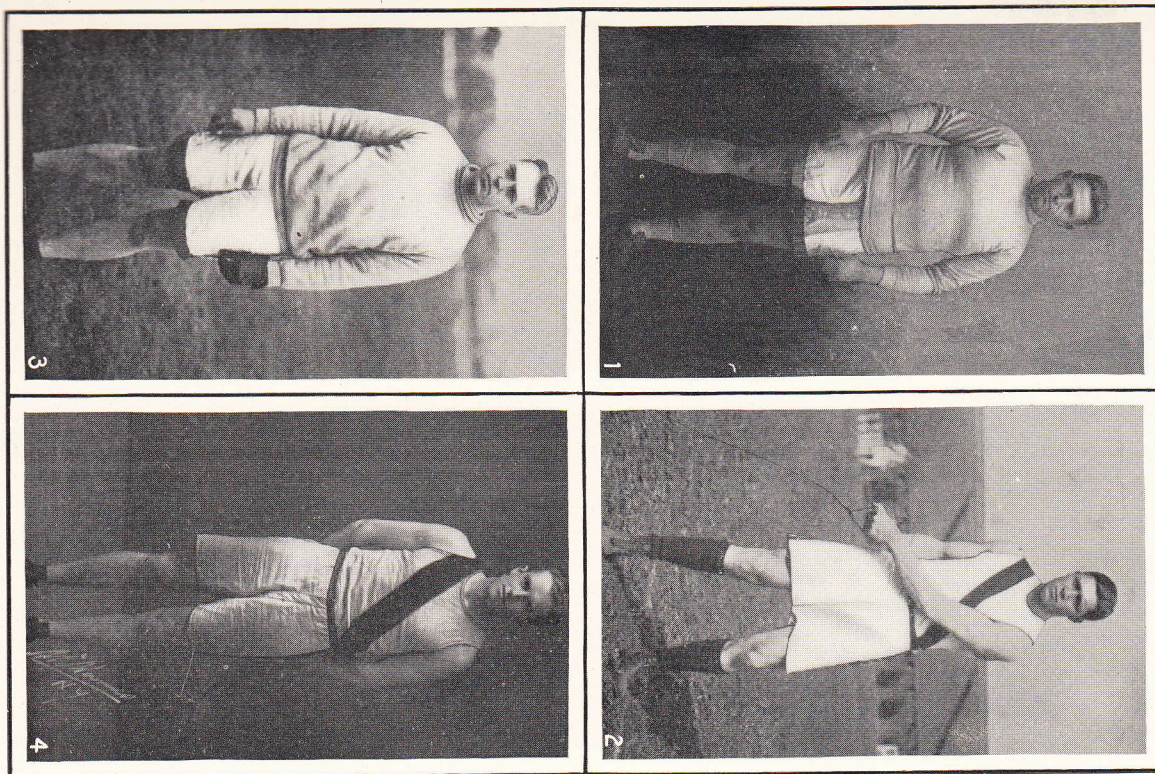
