THIRTY-SIXTH INTER-COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

CORNELL won the thirty-sixth annual track and field championships of the Inter-Collegiate Association of Amateur Athletics of America with a total score of 30½ points, Yale being second with 24½, Michigan third with 24 and Pennsylvania fourth with 19⅔.

The meeting was featured by the breaking of five inter-collegiate records and one world's record. In the mile run, J. P. Jones, of Cornell, lowered the mark of W. C. Paull, Pennsylvania, made in 1909 on the same track, from 4.17⅔ to 4.15⅔, also reducing T. P. Conneff's world record made in 1895 by one-fifth of a second. Jones also lowered E. B. Parsons' record for the half mile, made in 1905, from 1.56 to 1.54⅔. In the two mile run T. S. Benna, of Cornell, lowered the record of 9.27⅔, made by P. J. Taylor, Cornell, at Cambridge in 1909, to 9.25⅔. In the shot put J. J. Horner, Michigan, broke the record of W. F. Krueger, Swarthmore, of 46 feet 5½ inches, with a put of 46 feet 7⅛ inches. The fifth record broken was in the pole vault, in which H. S. Babcock, of Columbia, cleared the bar at 12 feet 8⅜ inches, displacing the mark of 12 feet 4⅜ inches, made by F. T. Nelson, Yale, in 1910.

Three inter-collegiate records were equaled. In the 100 yards dash R. C. Craig, Michigan, equaled the record of 9⅔ seconds, made by B. J. Wefers, Georgetown, in 1896, while in the 200 yards dash he equaled the time of 21⅔ seconds, an intercollegiate and world mark made by Wefers in 1896 and equaled by Craig in 1910.

The finals on Saturday, the 27th, were held on a fast track and dry field, with a bright, warm sun and no wind. The climination trials in the field events and the preliminary heats in the track events, except the mile and two-mile runs, were held on the day previous. The few showers which fell on this day did not seriously affect the performance.

The meeting took place in the Harvard stadium, Cambridge, Mass., through the courtesy of Harvard University. It was efficiently managed by William F. Garcelon and Richard C. Floyd, both of Harvard. There were over ten thousand spectators present on the day of the finals.

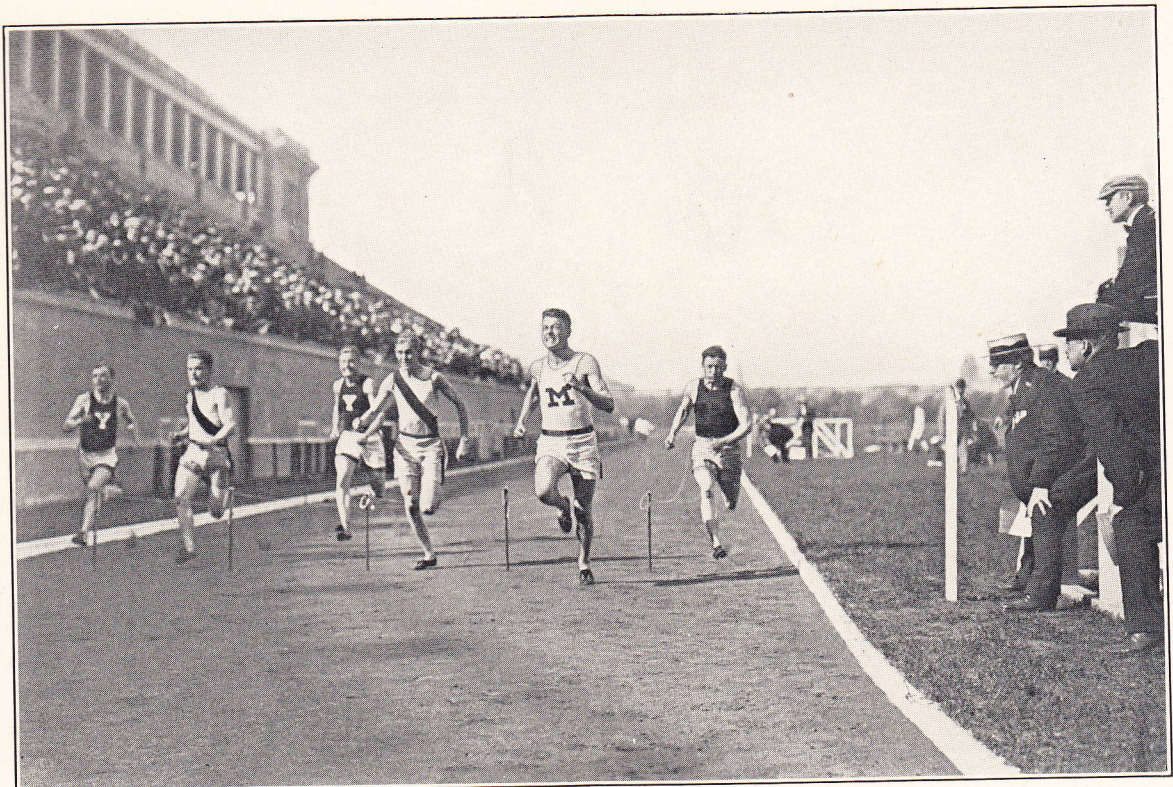
START FINAL HEAT, 100 YARDS DASH.

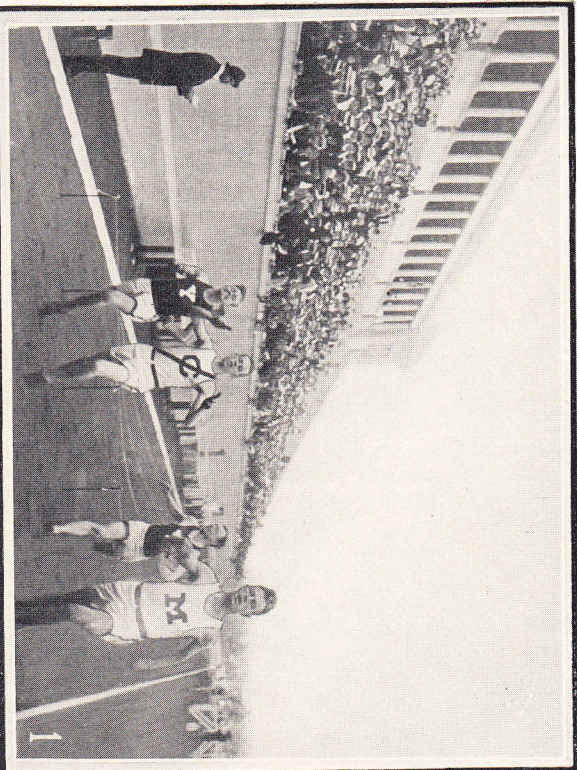

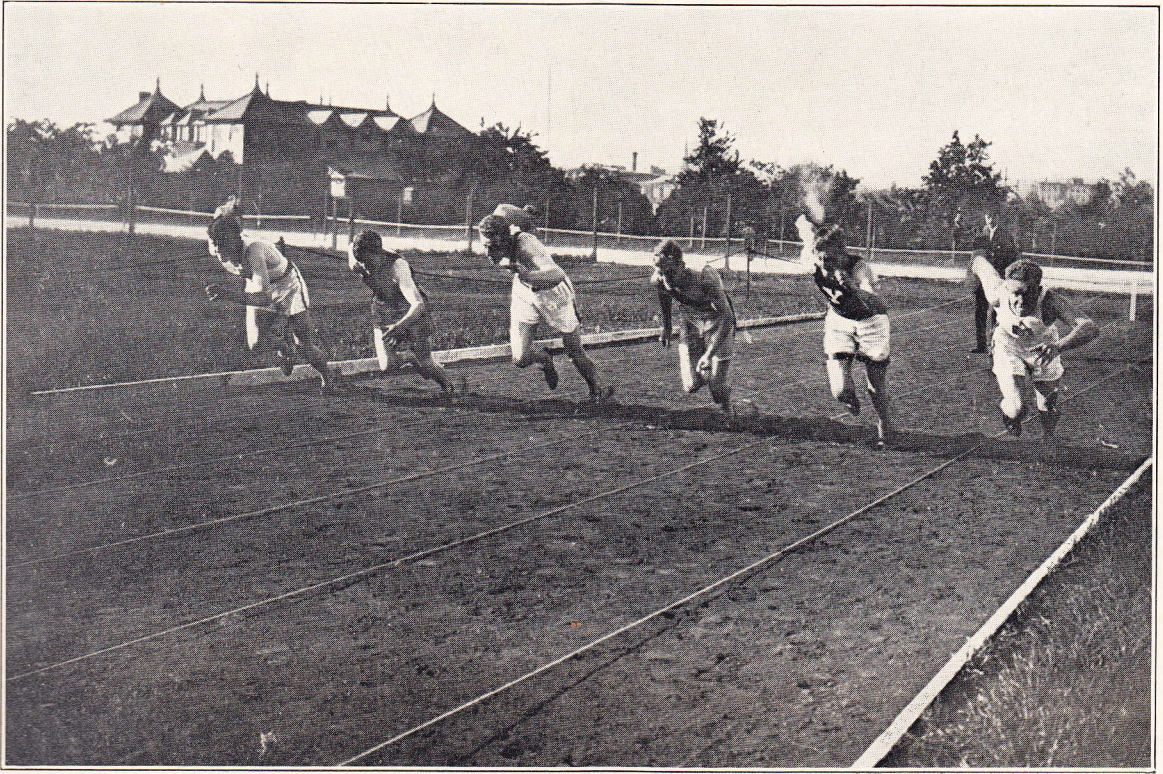

 2. Second heat, Minds, Pennsylvania, winning.

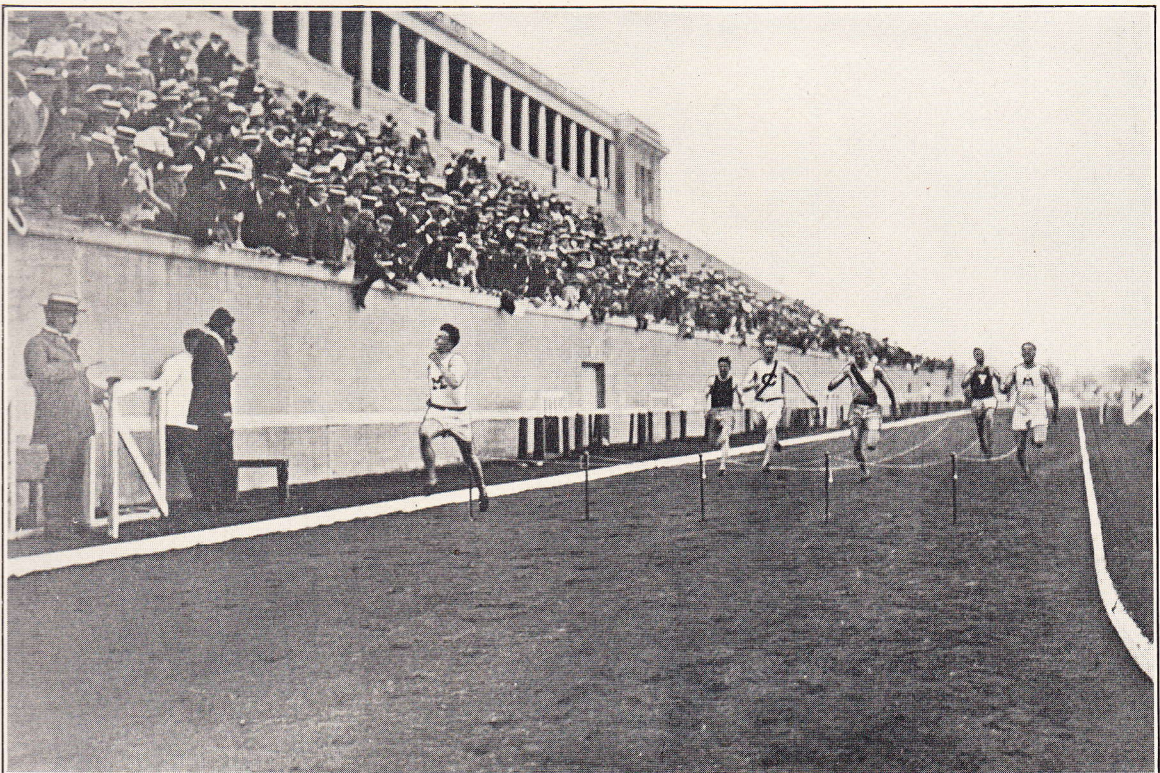
START FINAL HEAT, 220 YARDS DASH.

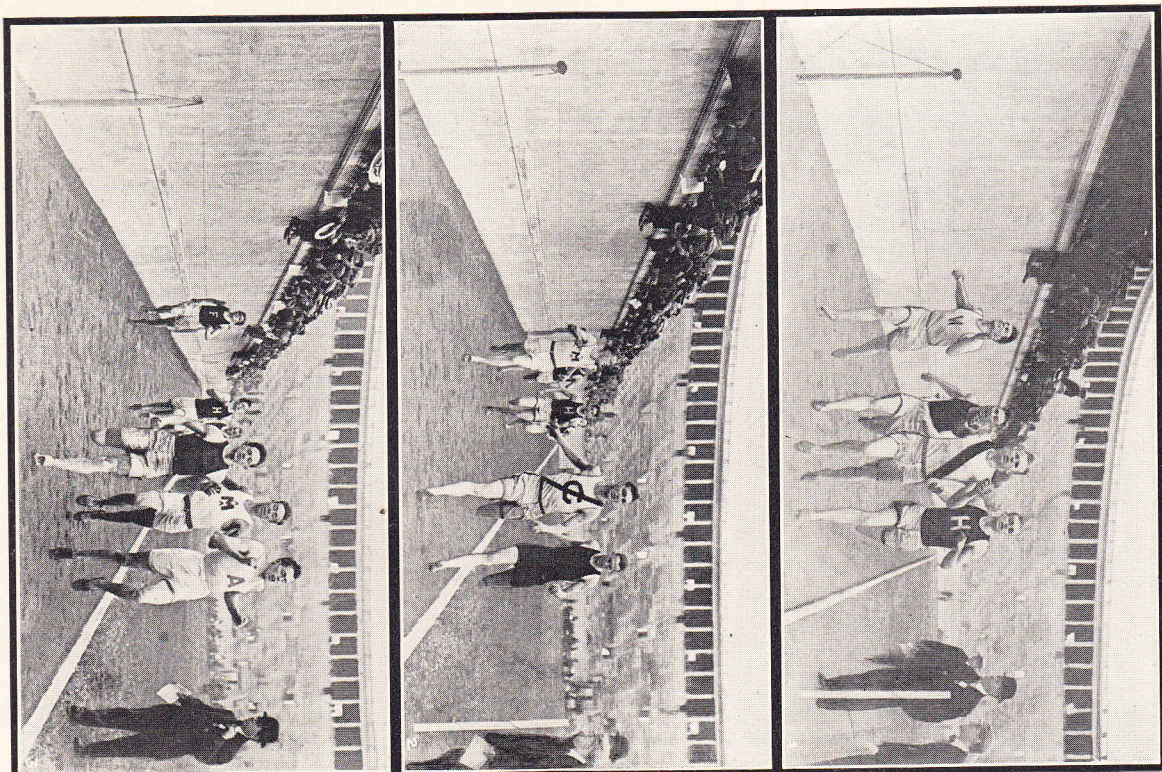

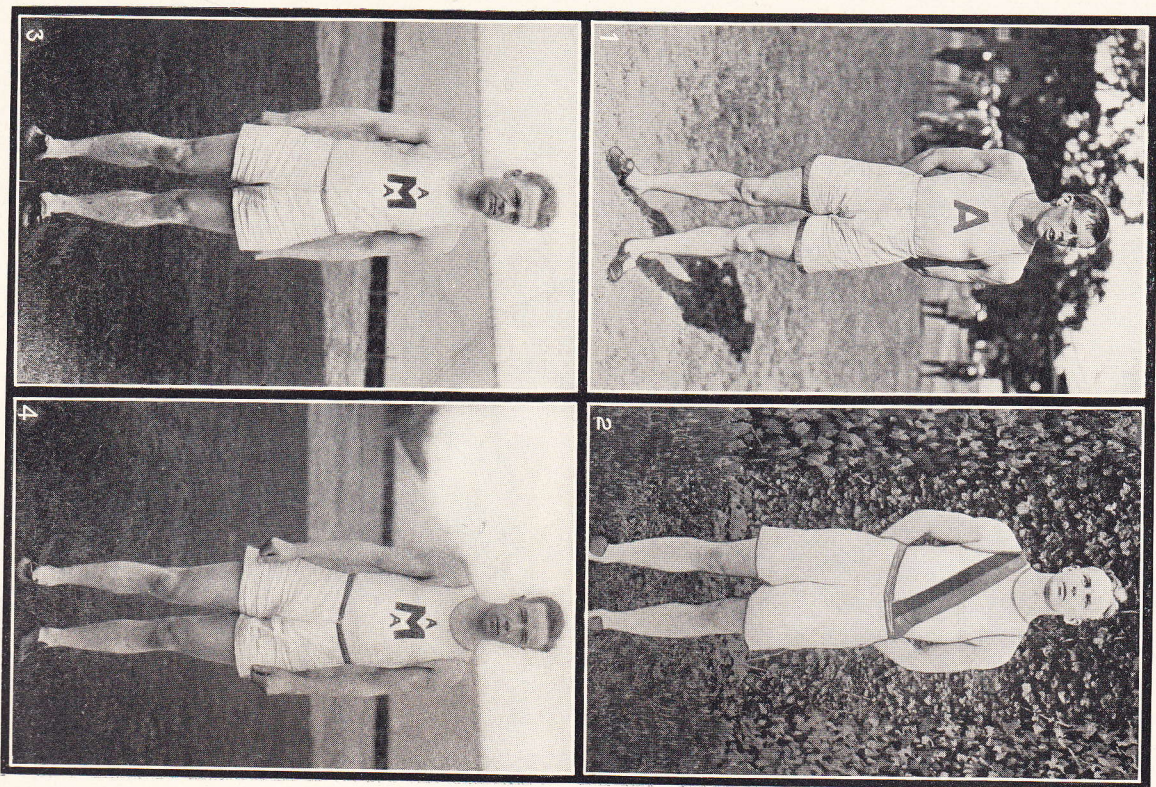

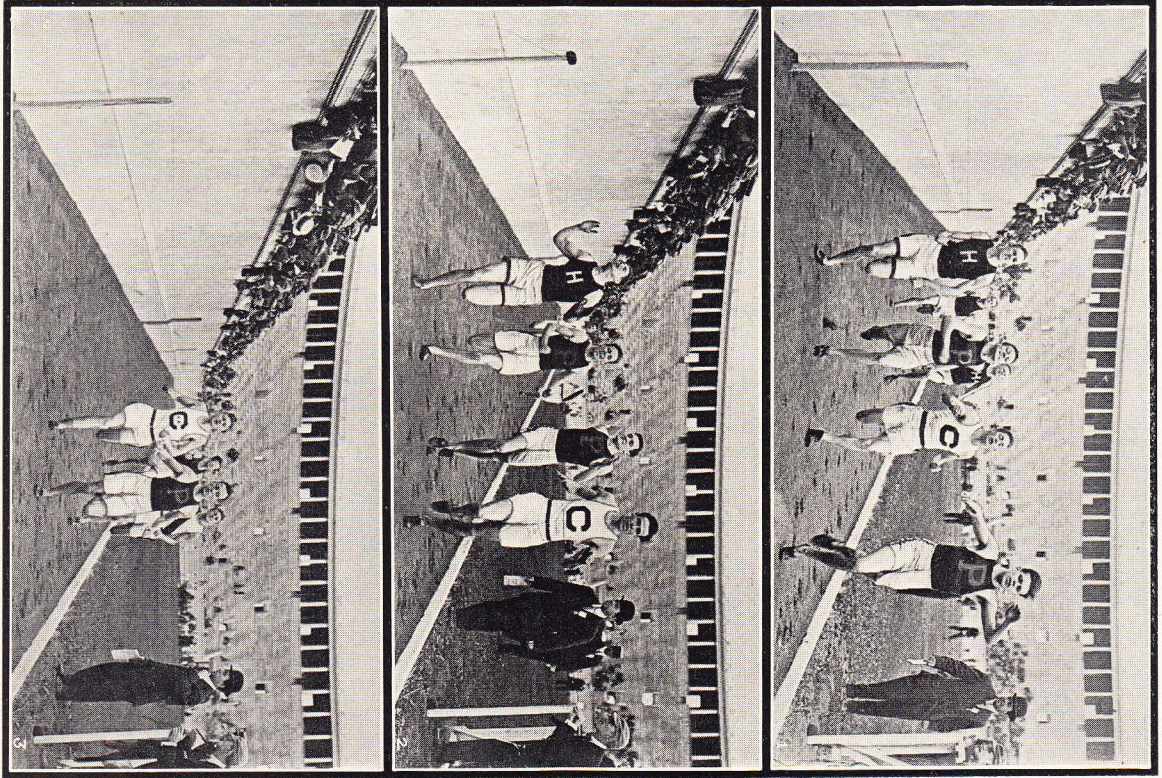

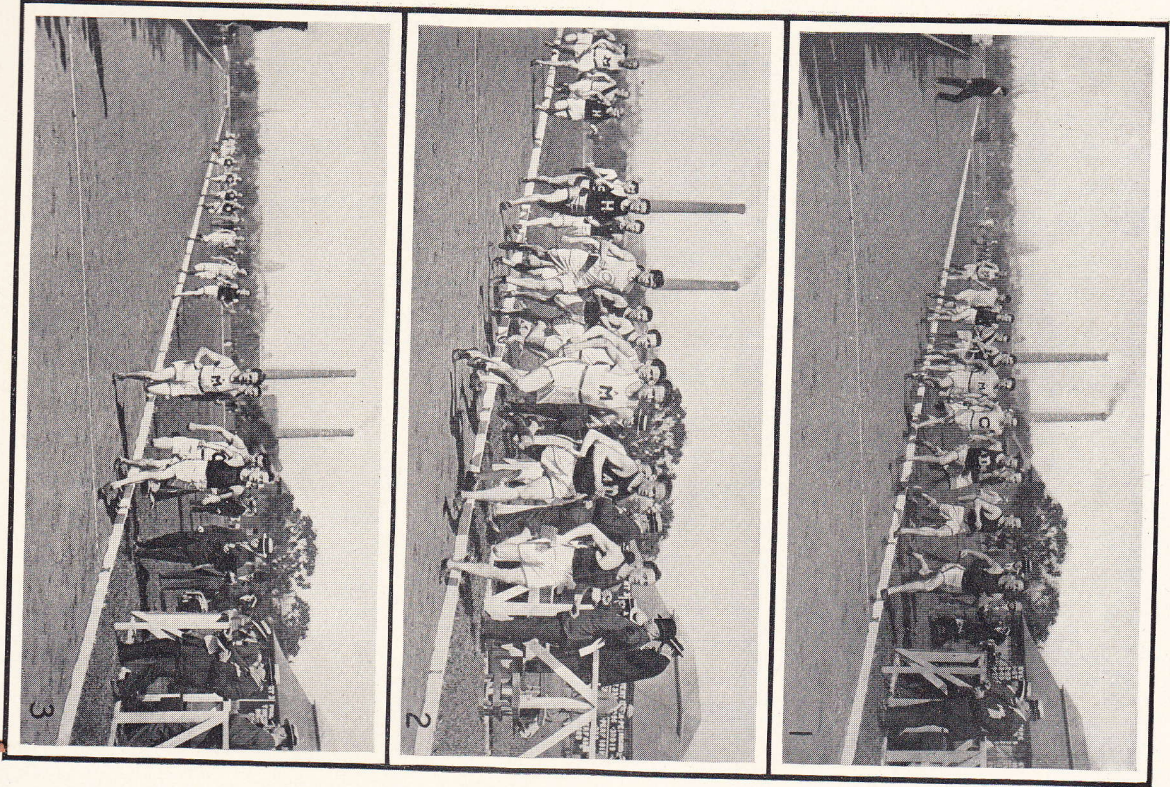

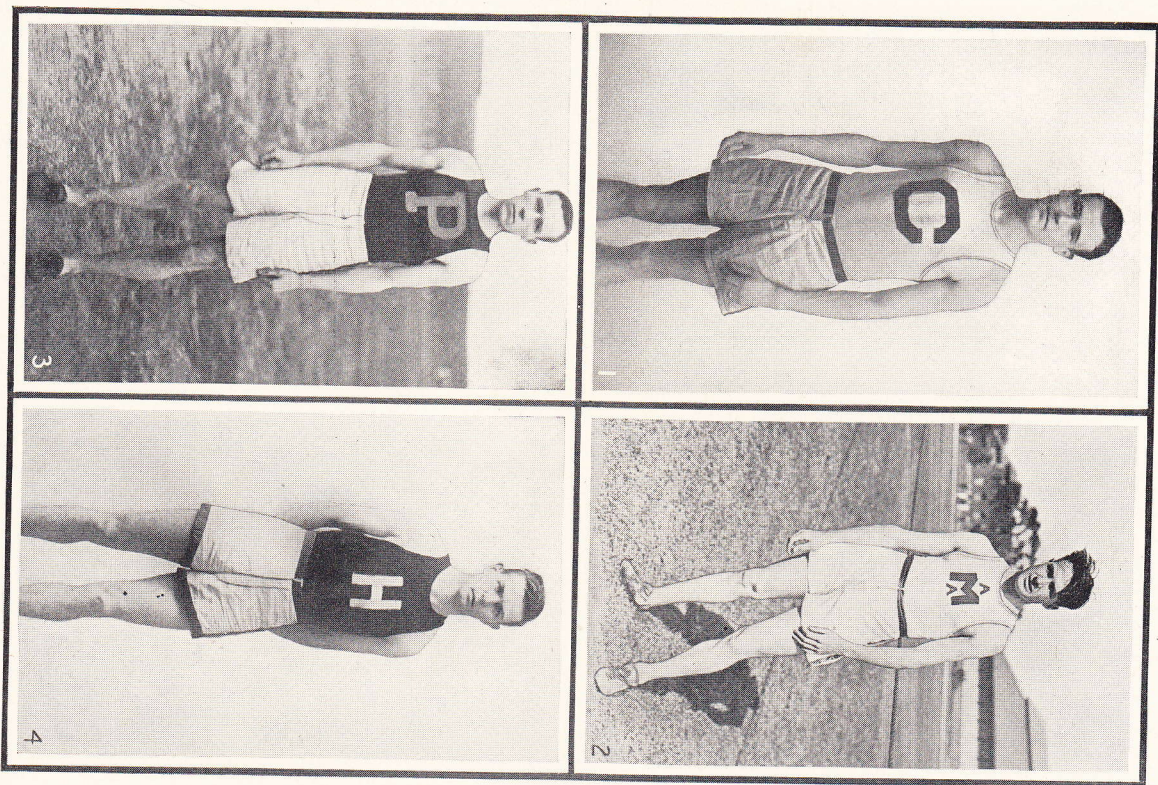
1. End first quarter; Boyce, Pennsylvania, leading.

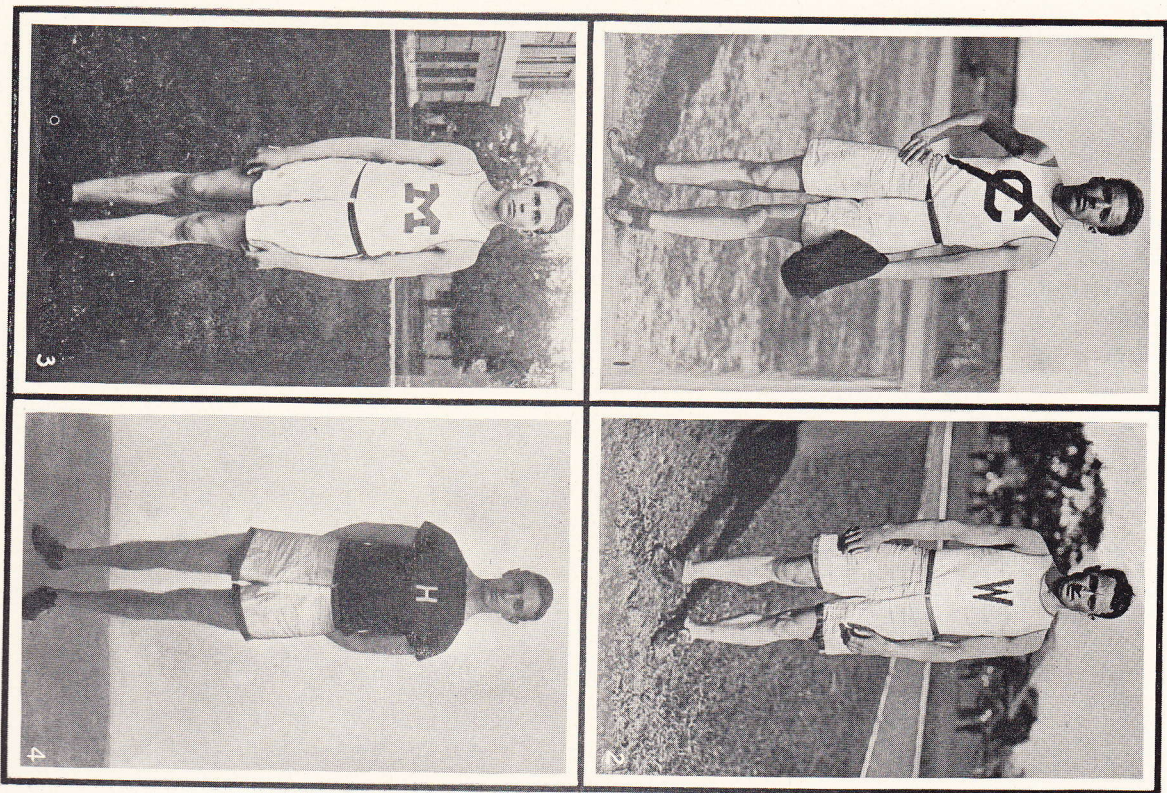

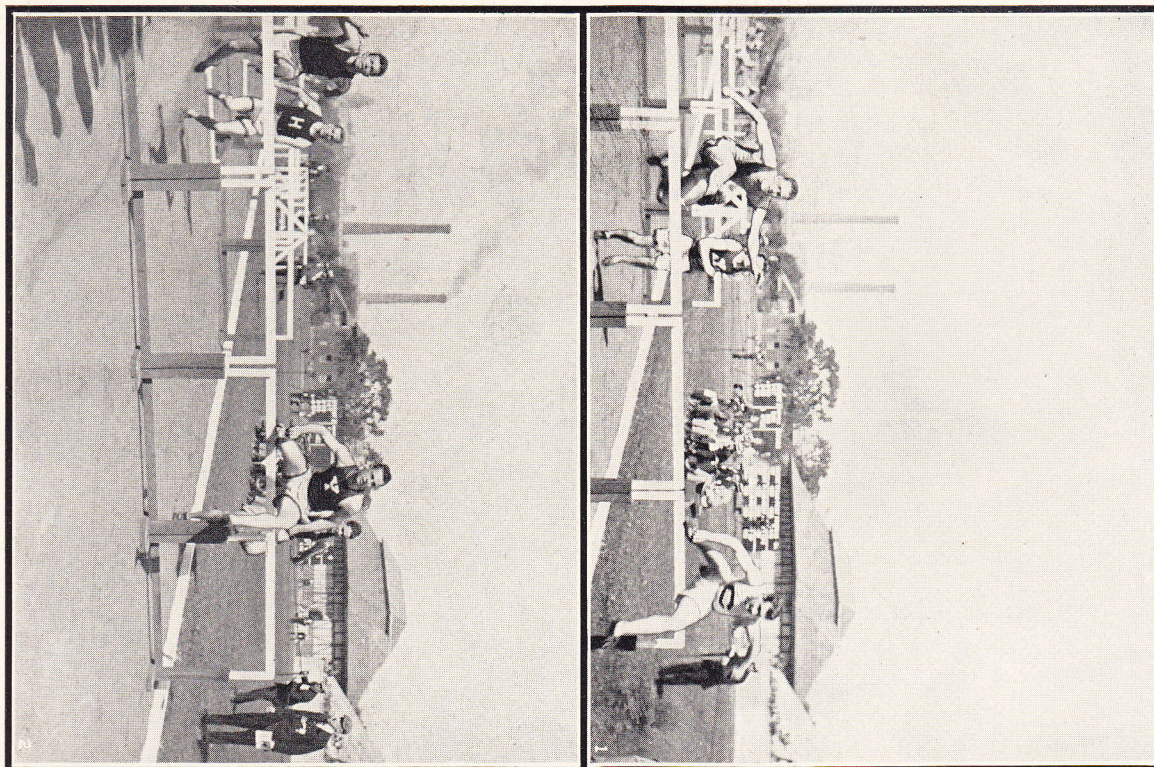

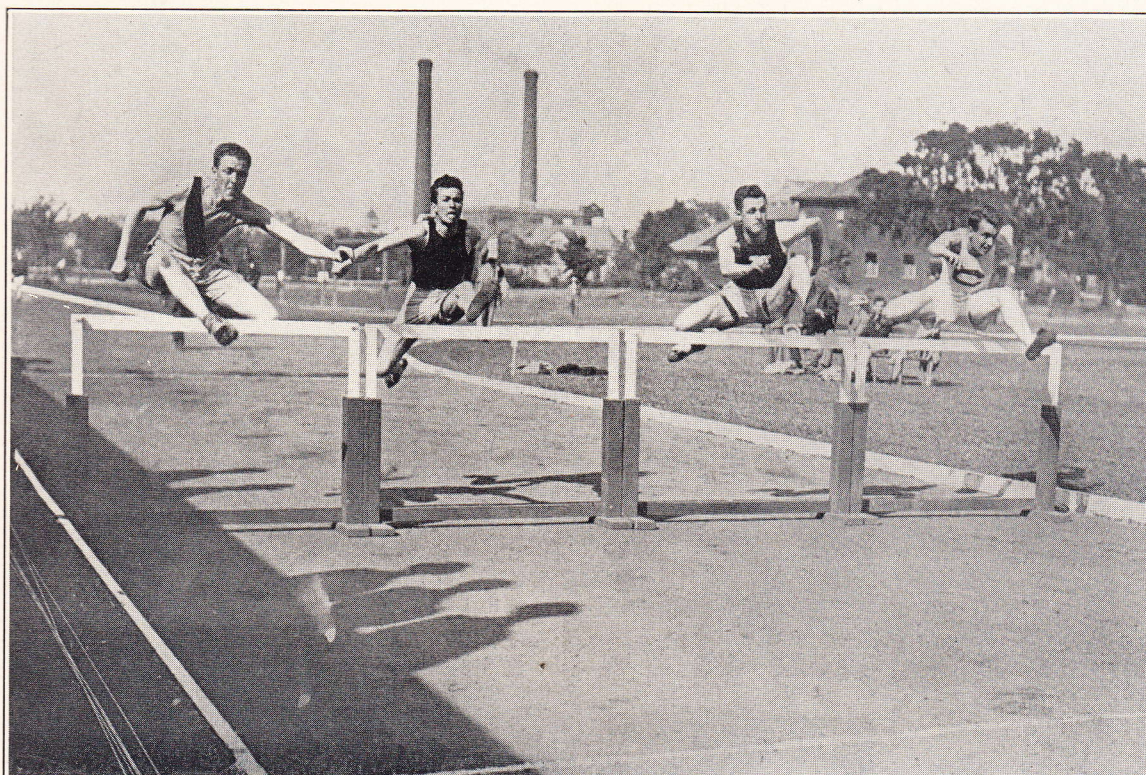

OVER FIRST HURDLE, FINAL HEAT 120 YARDS HURDLES.

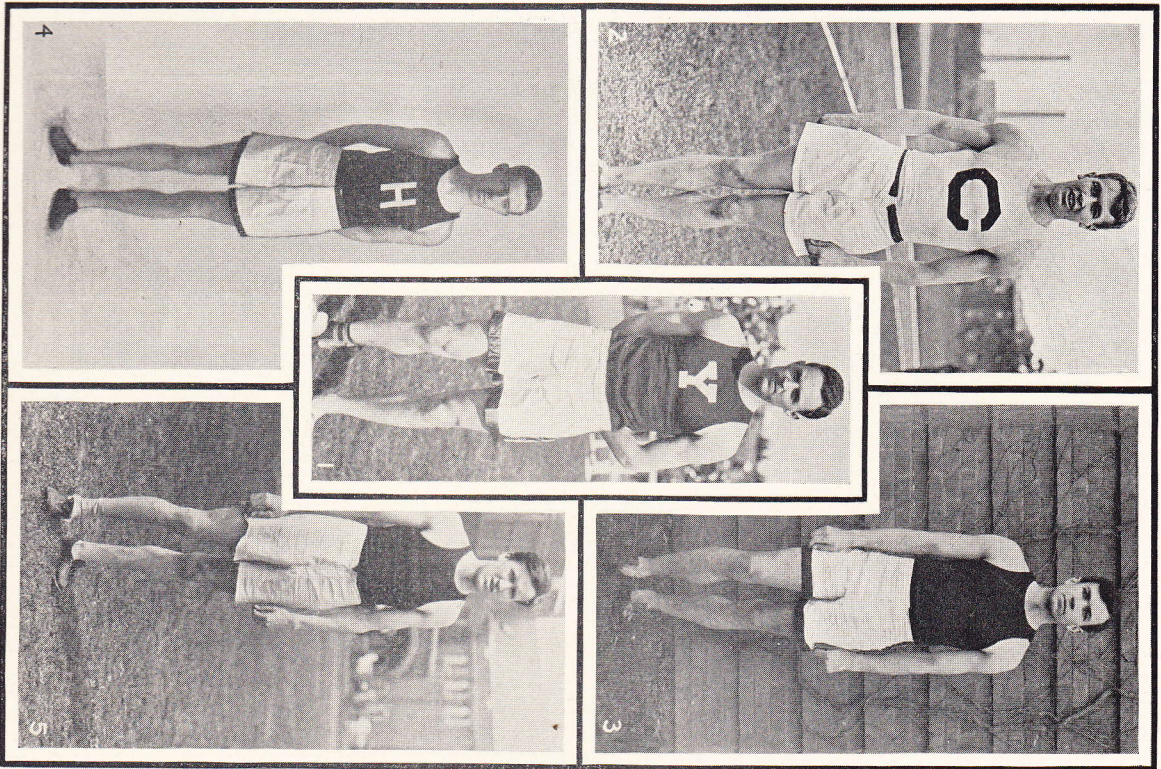


FINISH FINAL HEAT, 120 YARDS HURDLES.

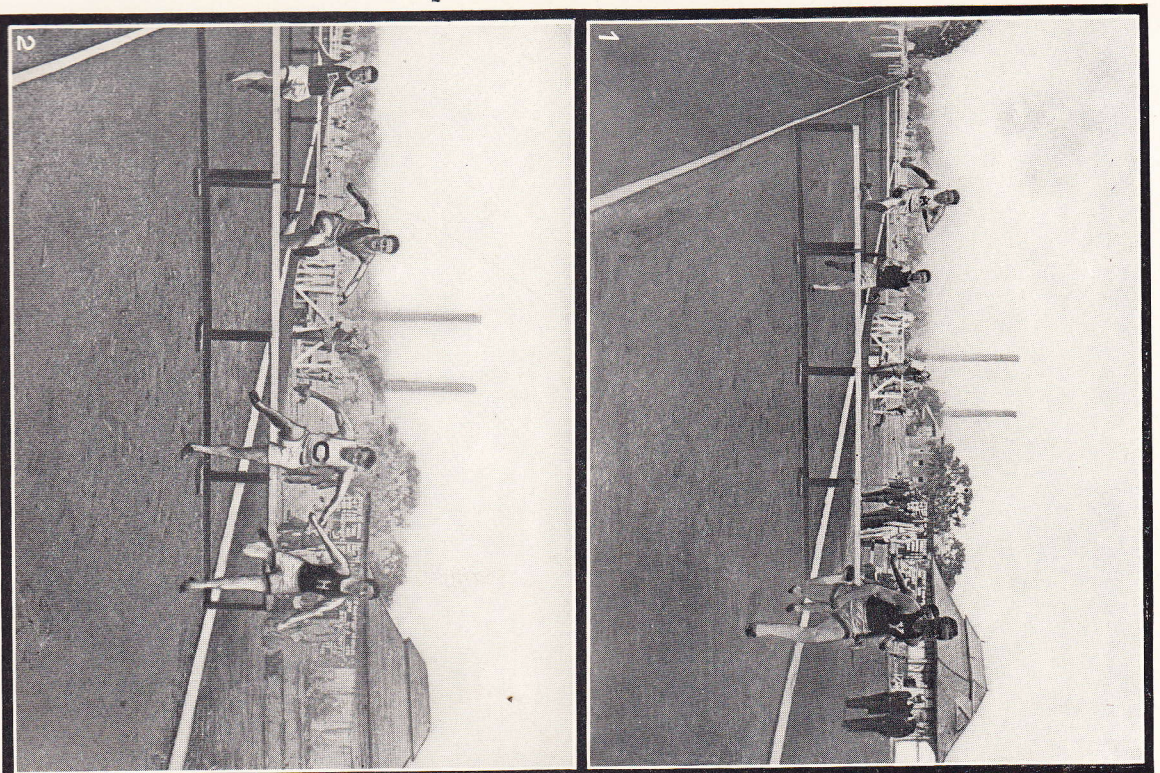

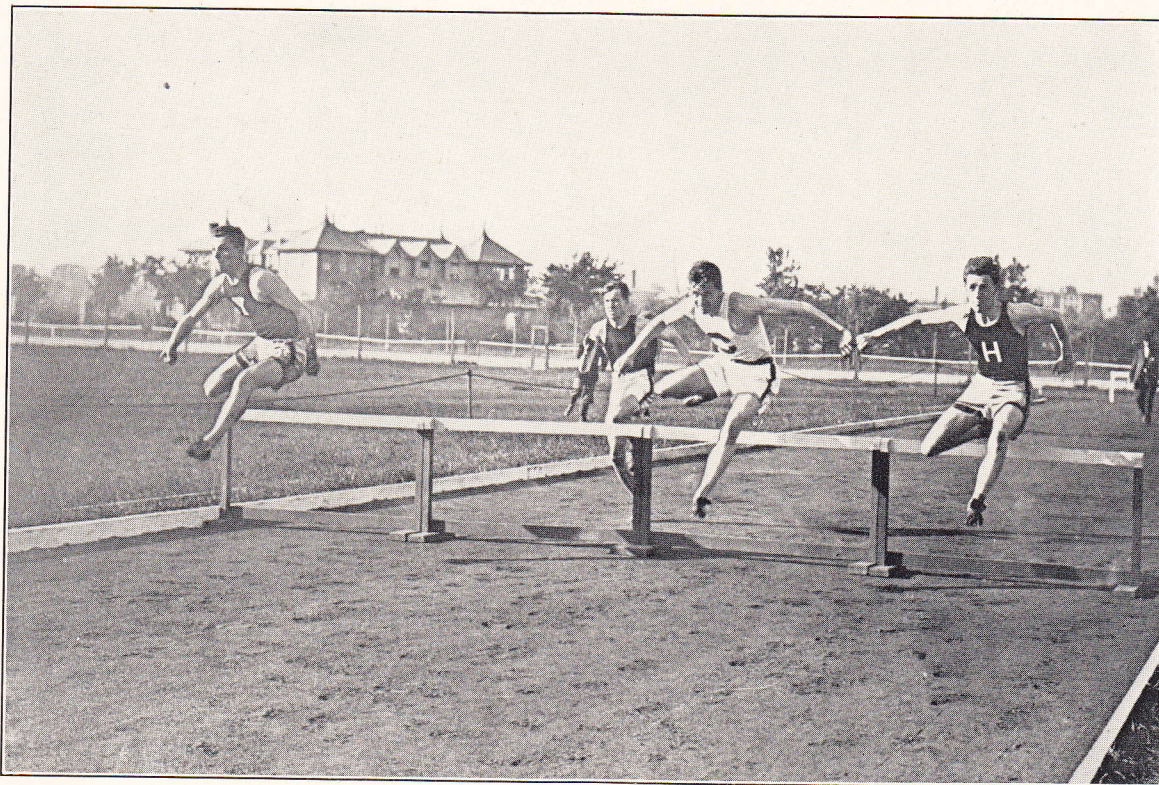

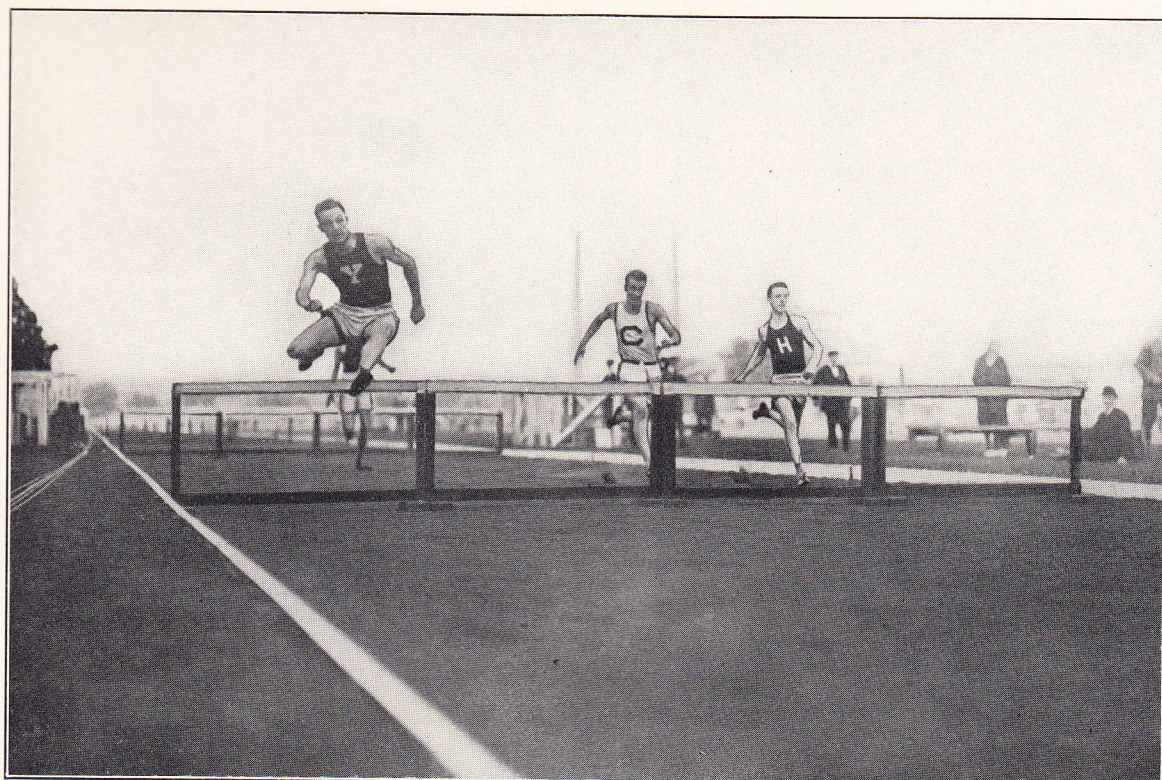
OVER FIRST HURDLE, 220 YARDS FINAL HEAT.

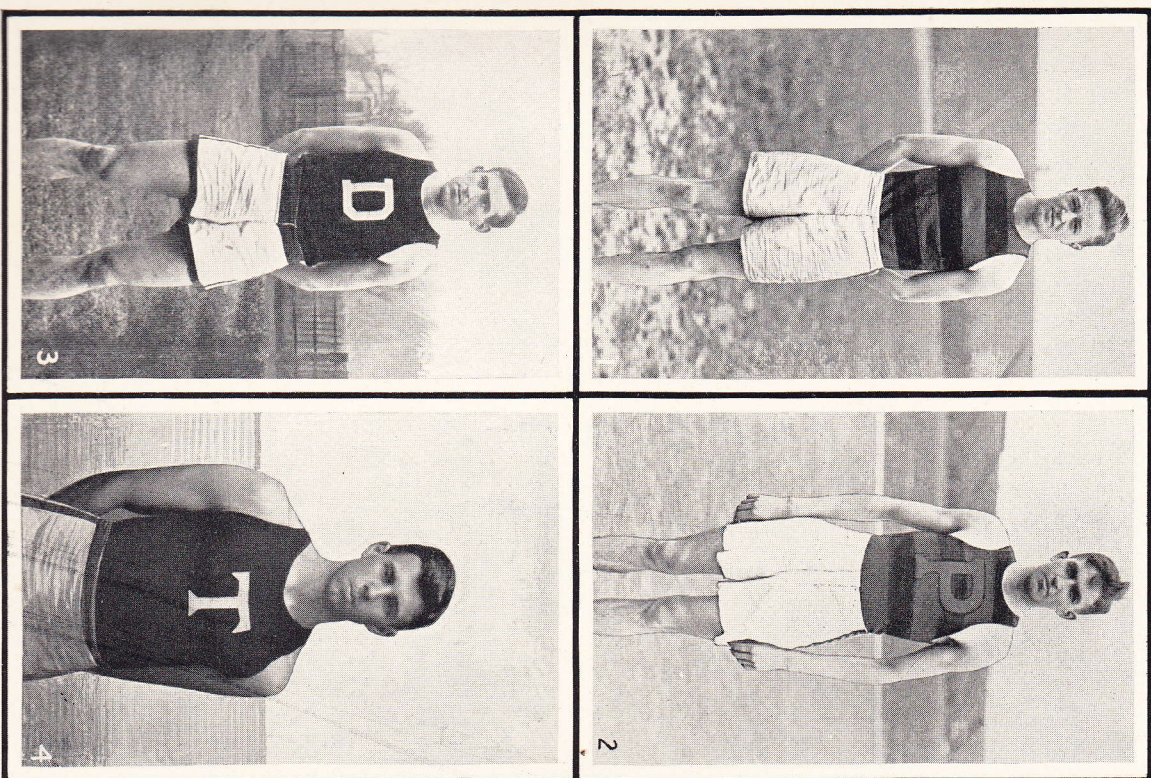

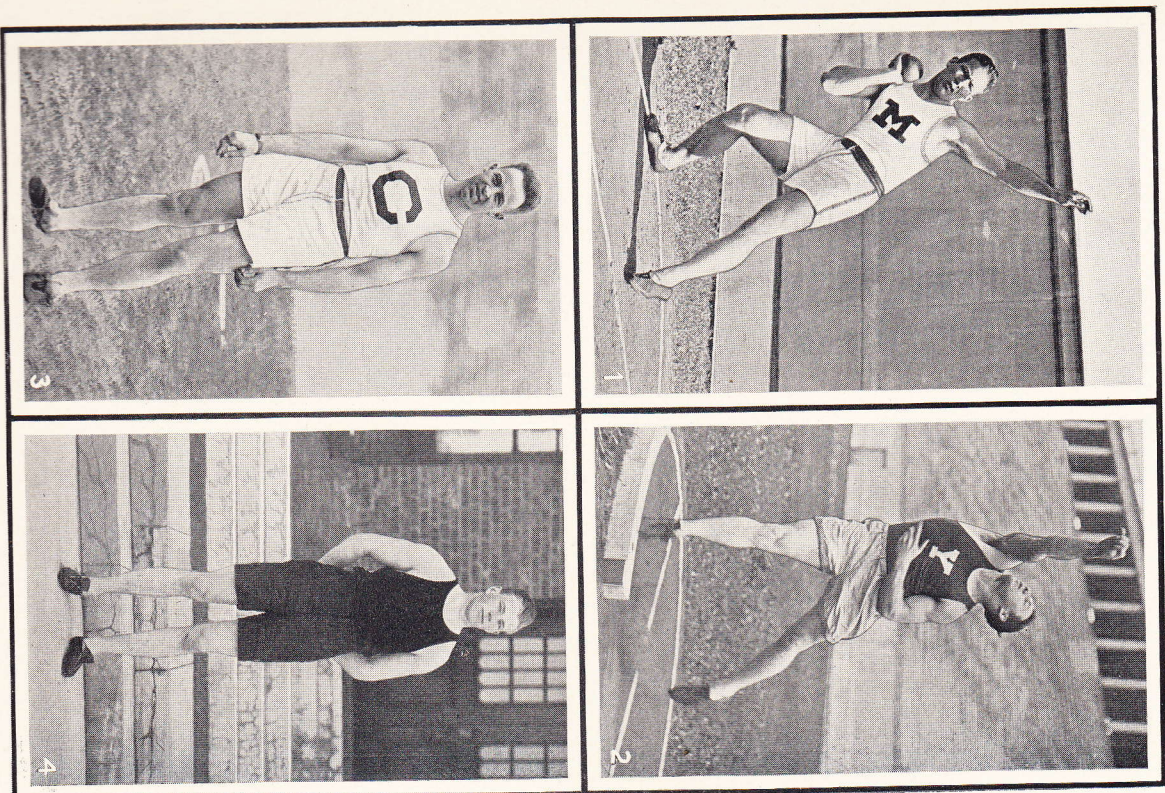
