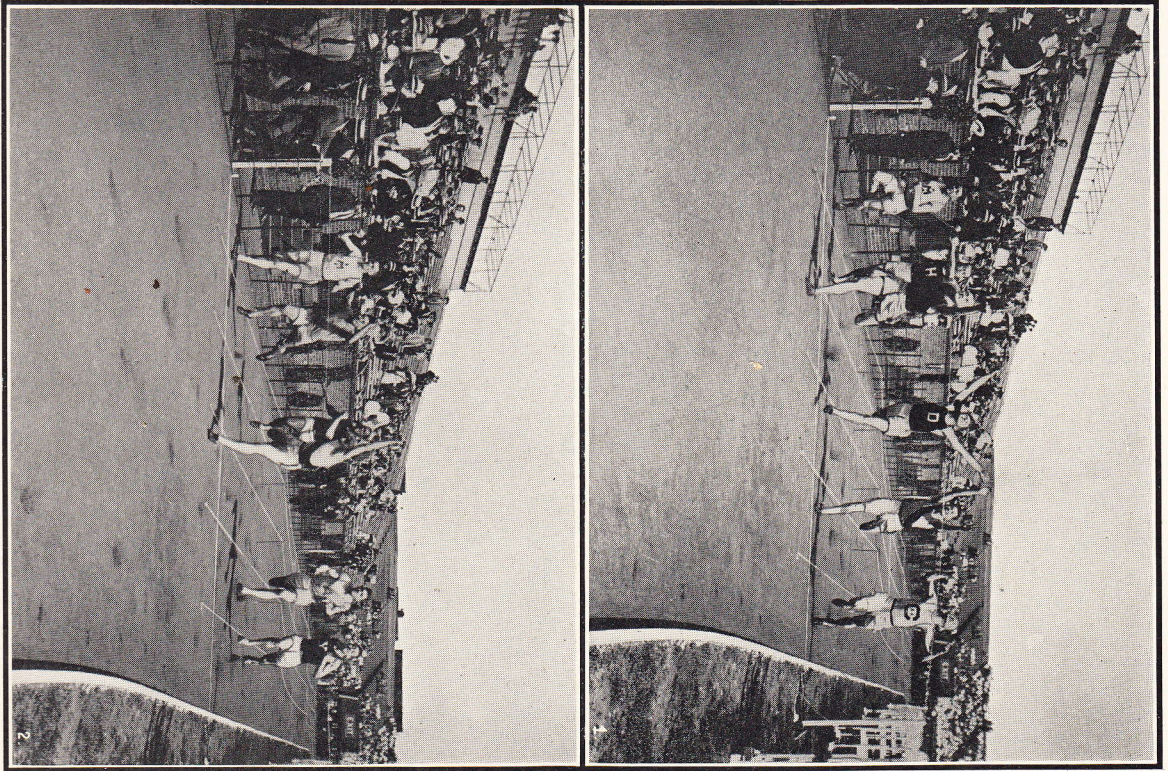

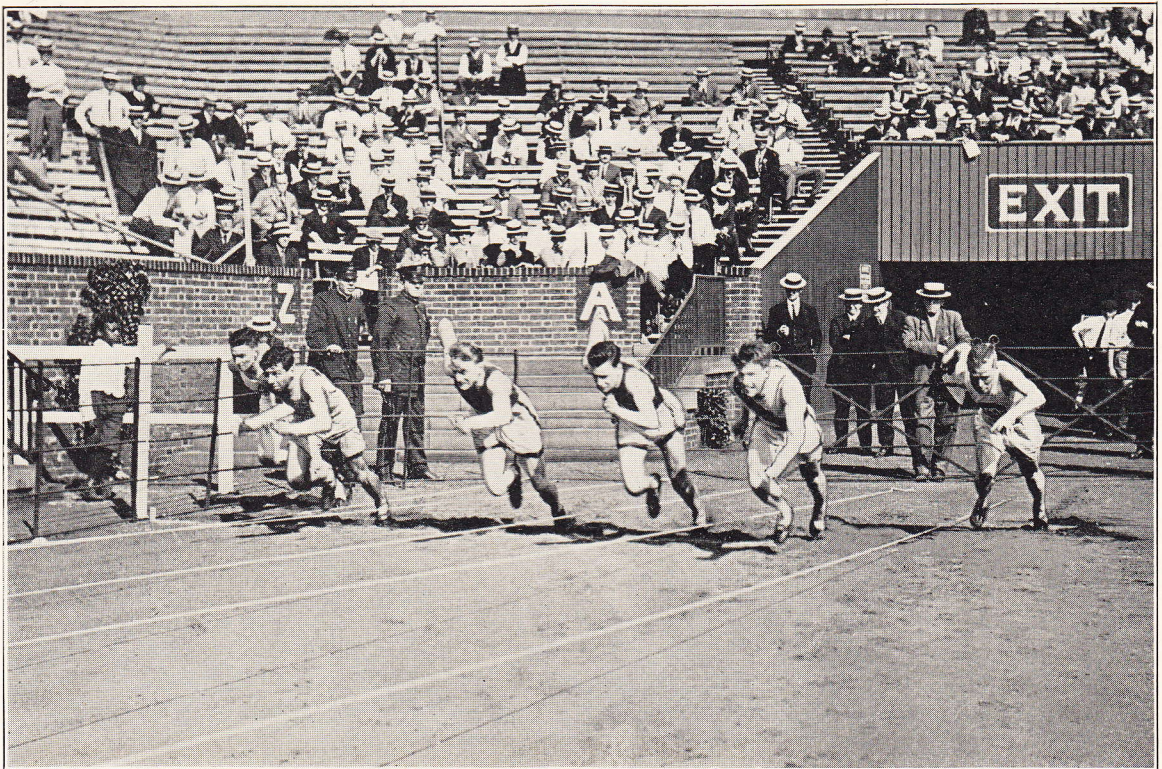

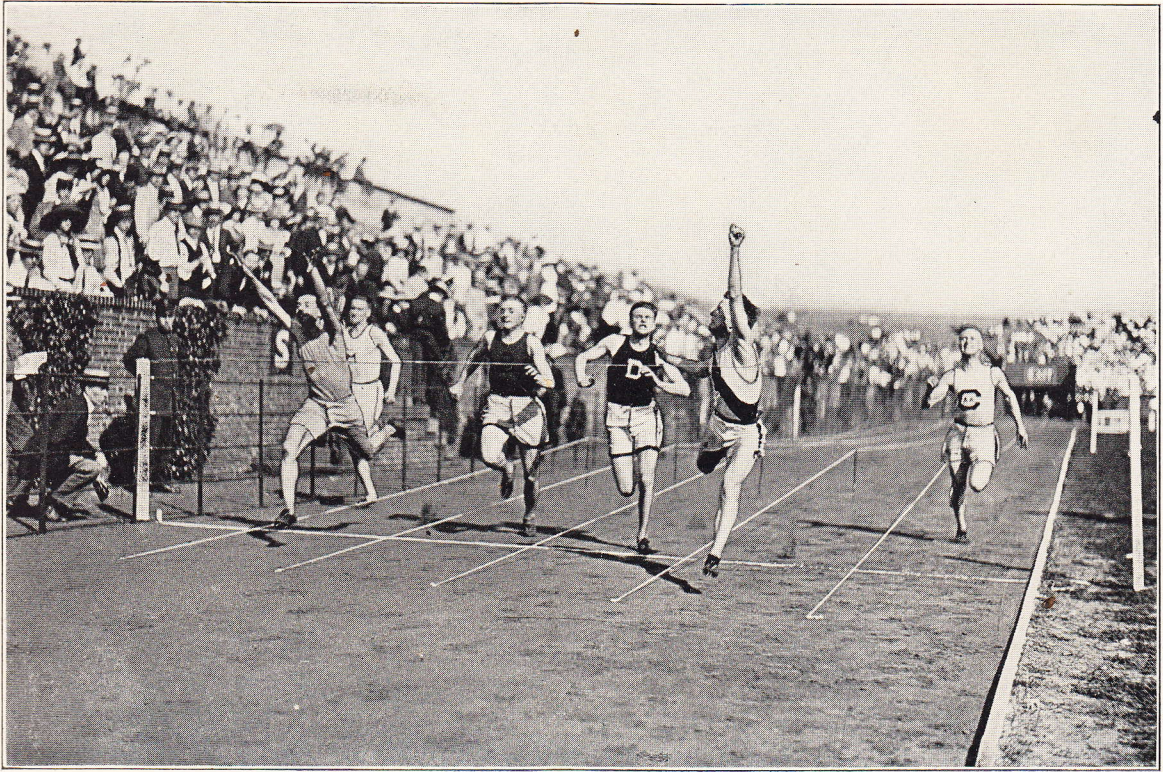


1. ROBERTSON, Syracuse, winning first heat.

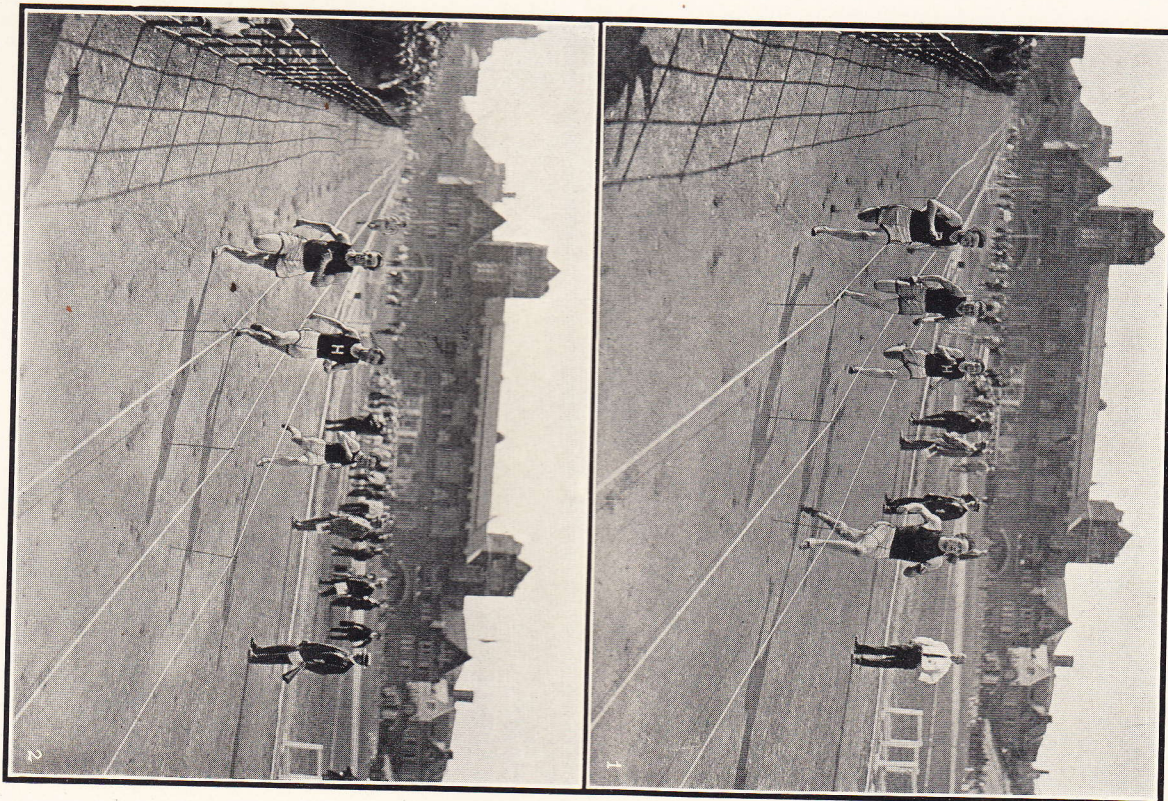

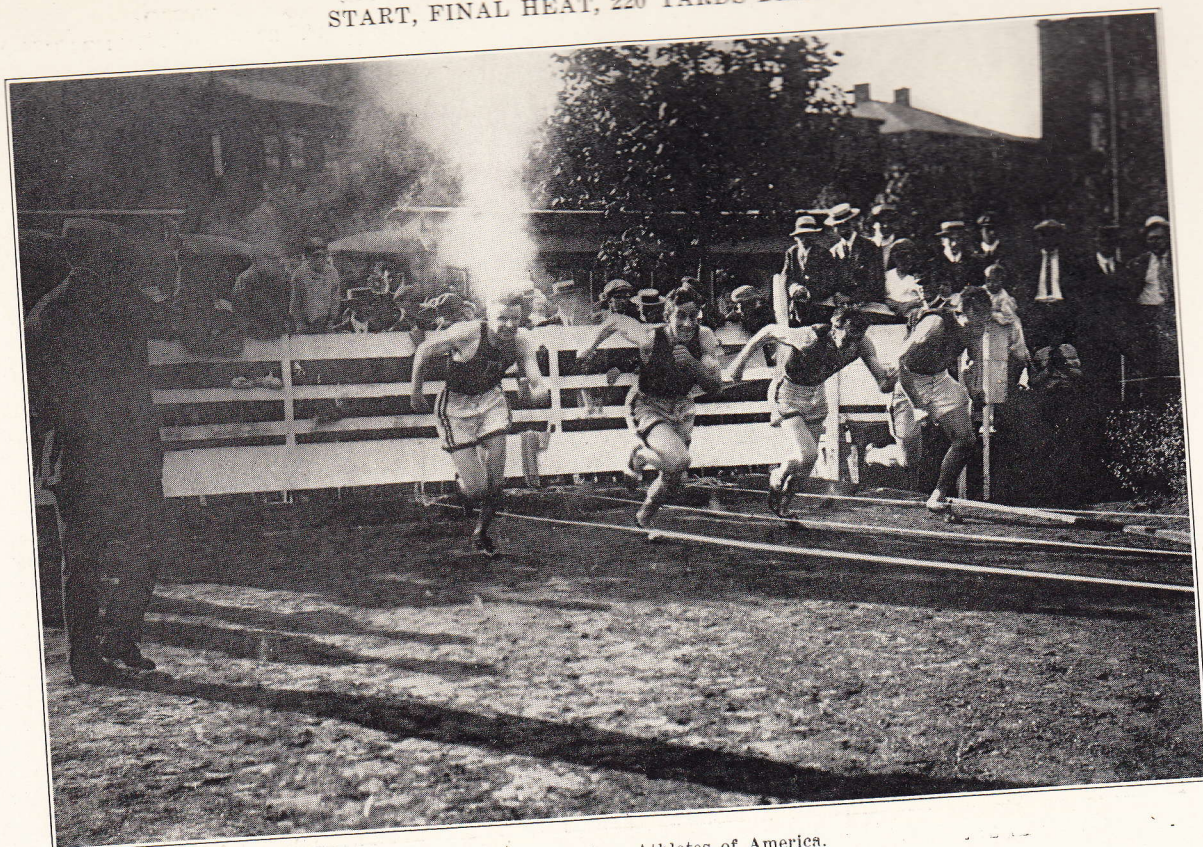

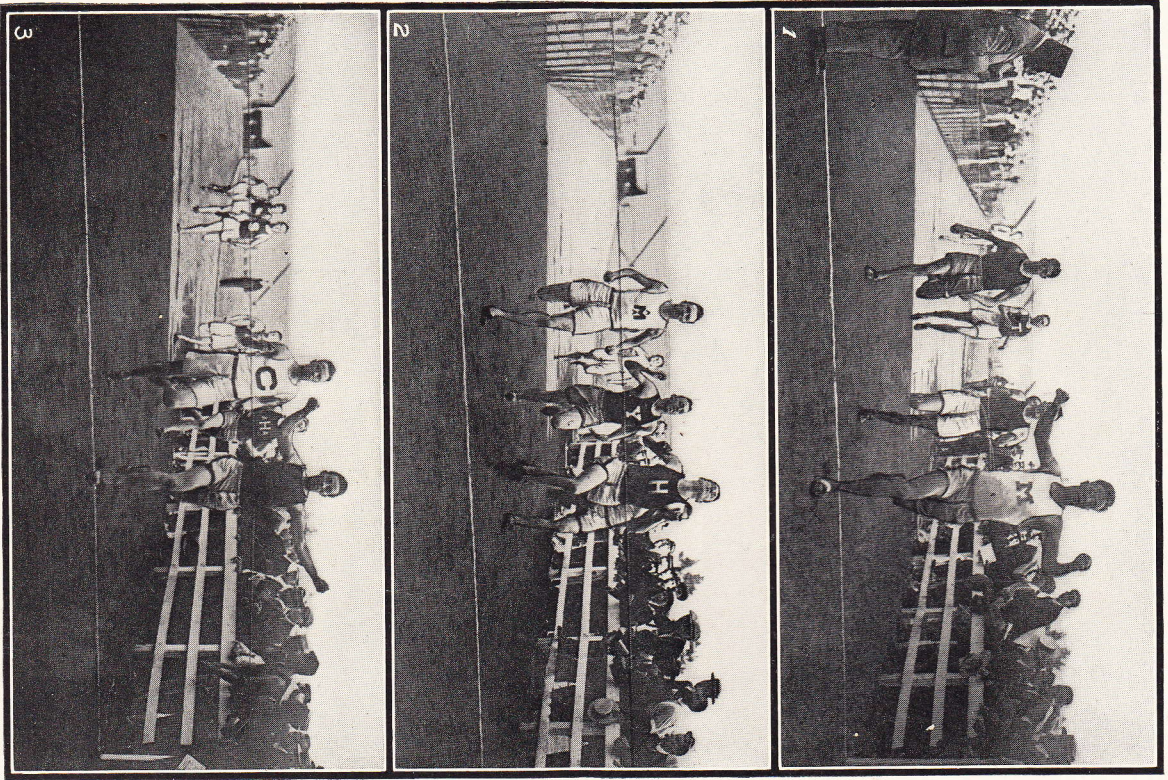

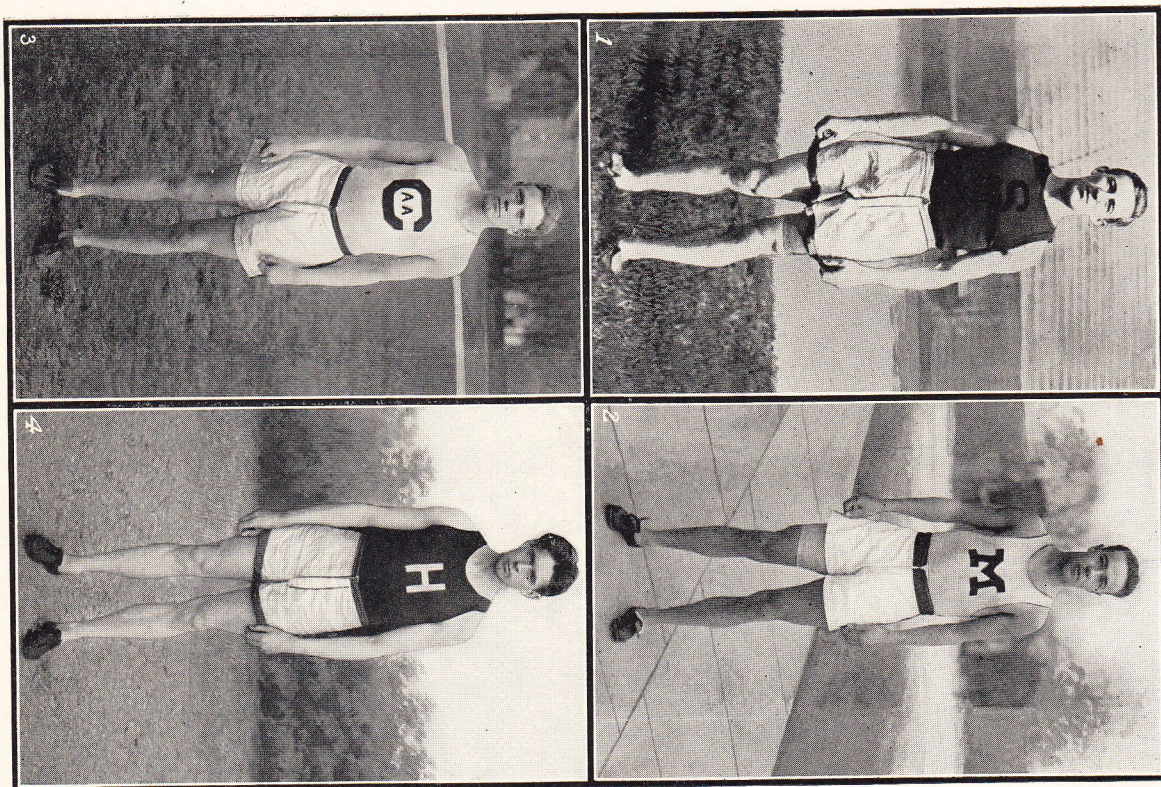

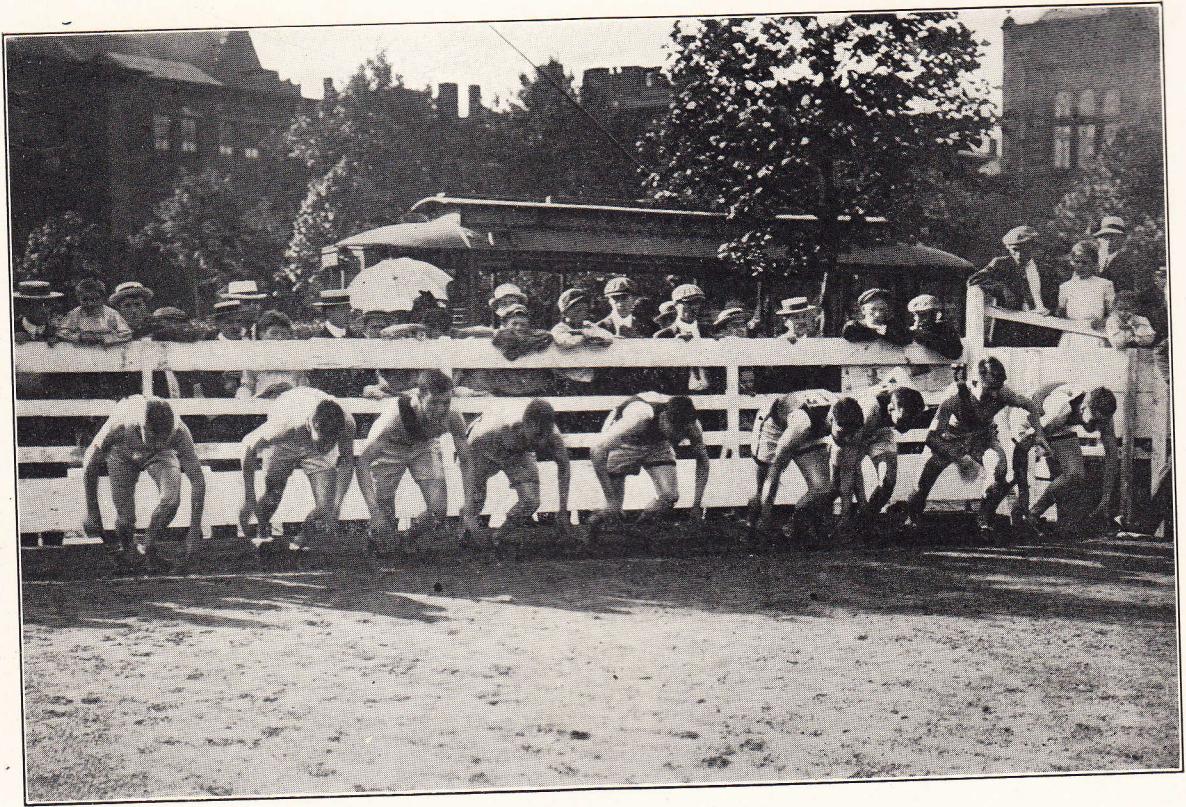

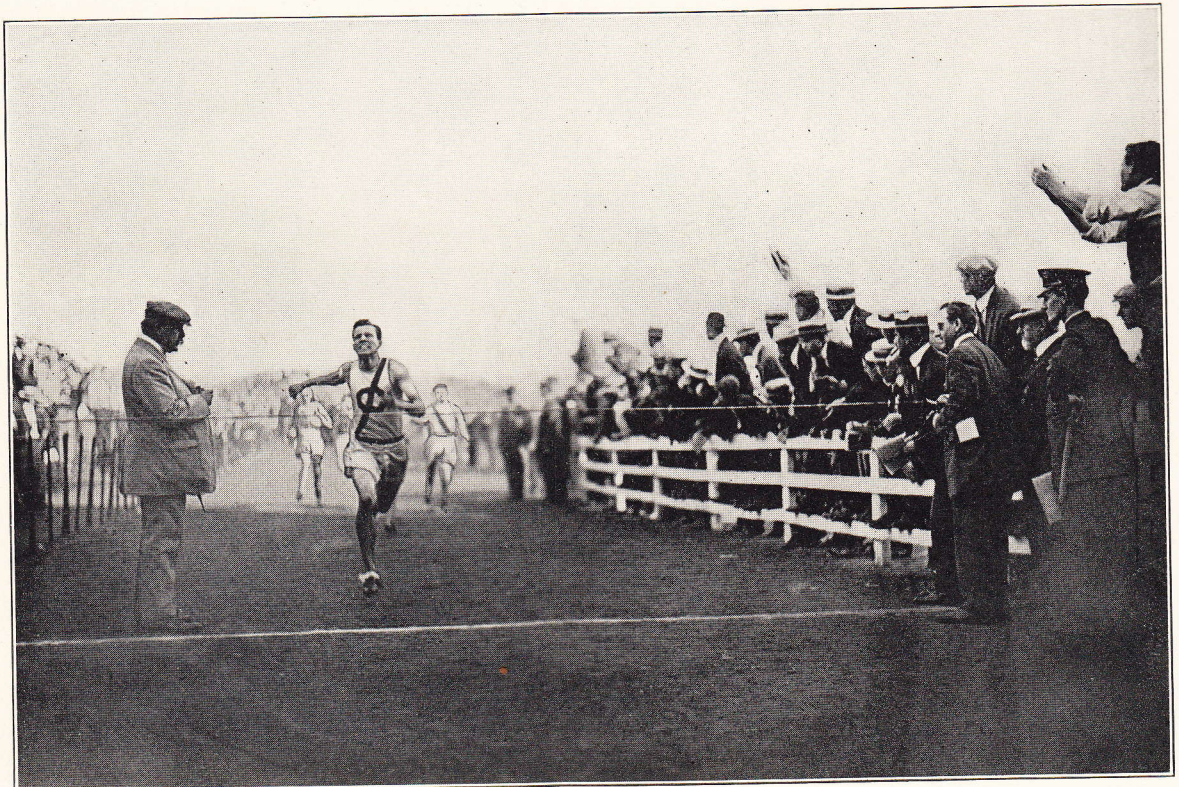

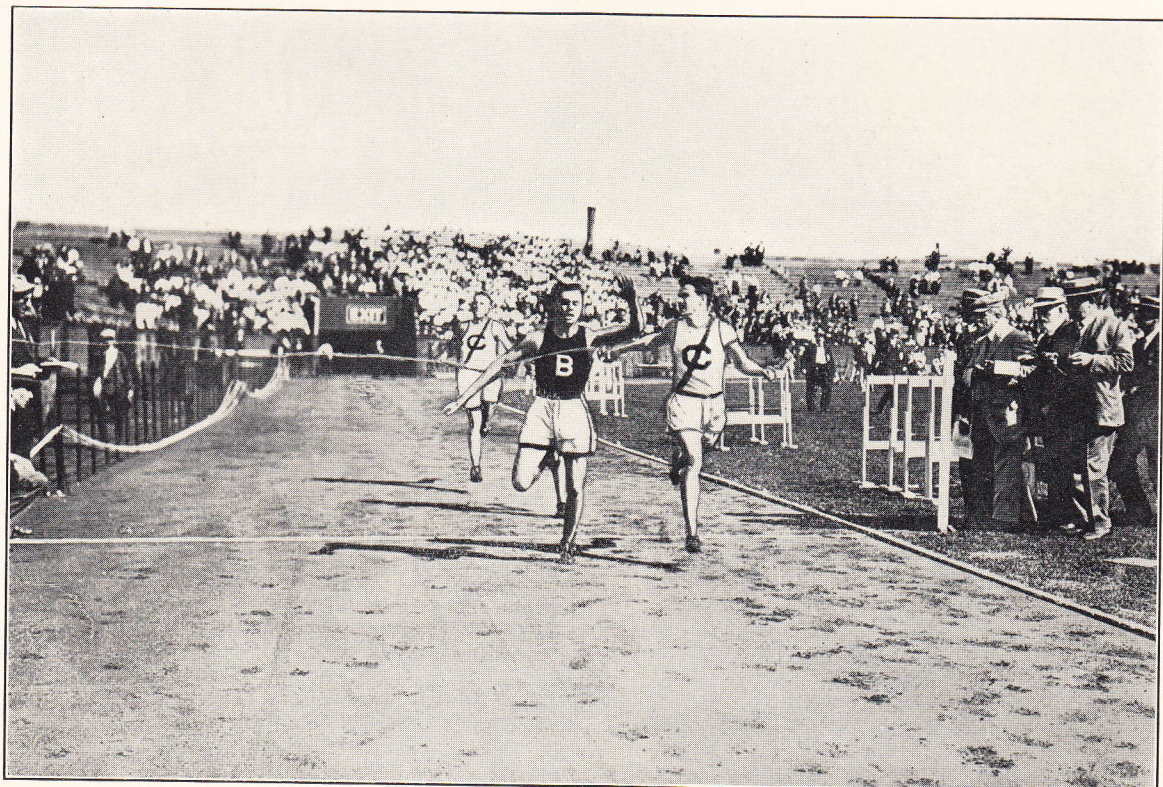
START, 1 MILE RUN.

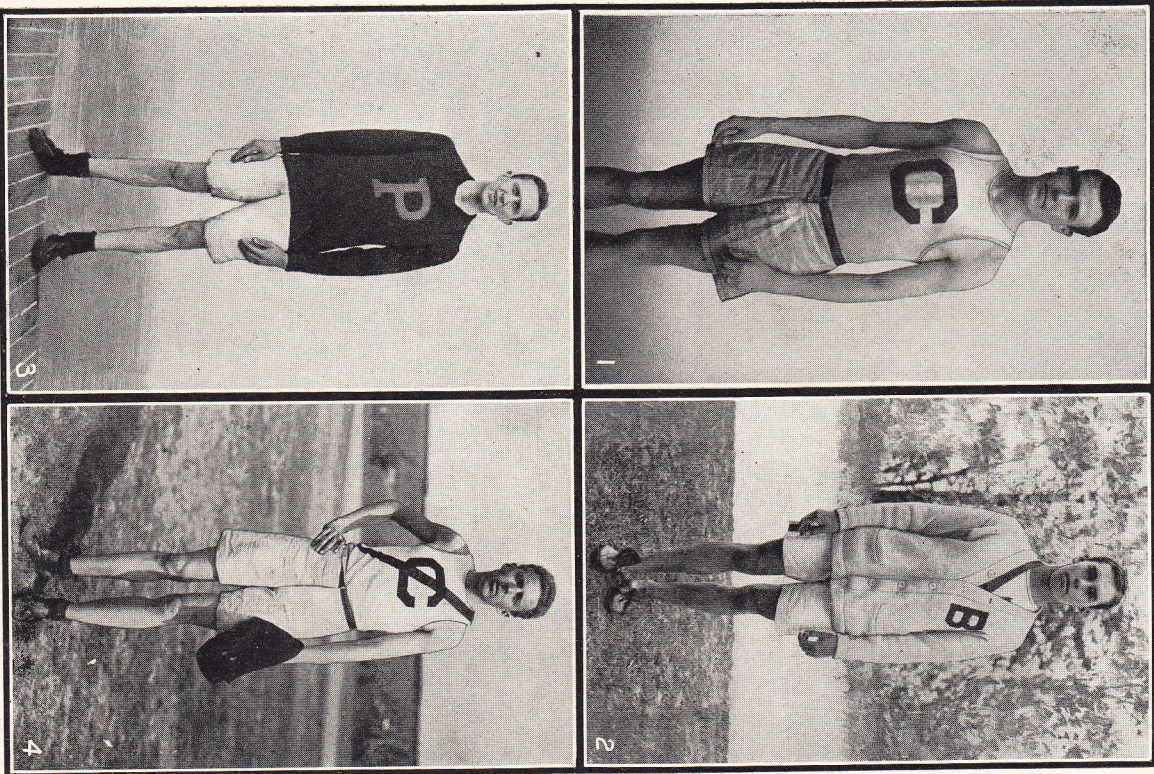

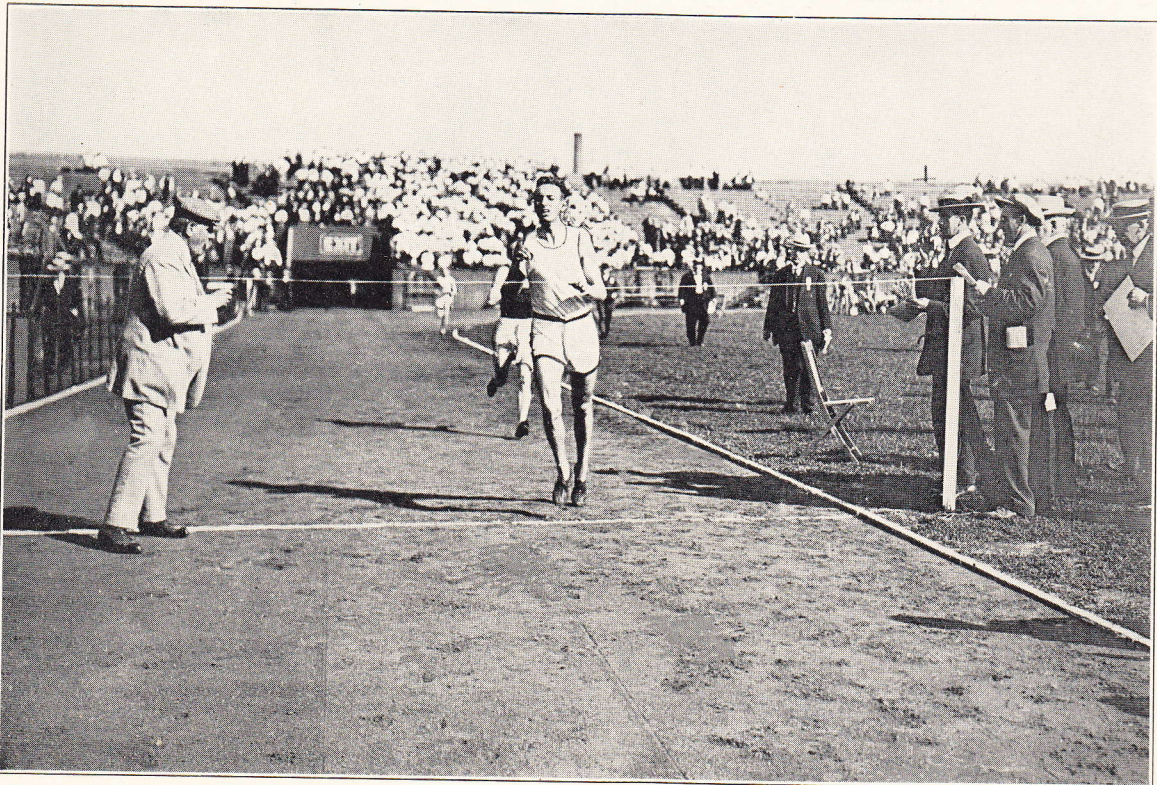

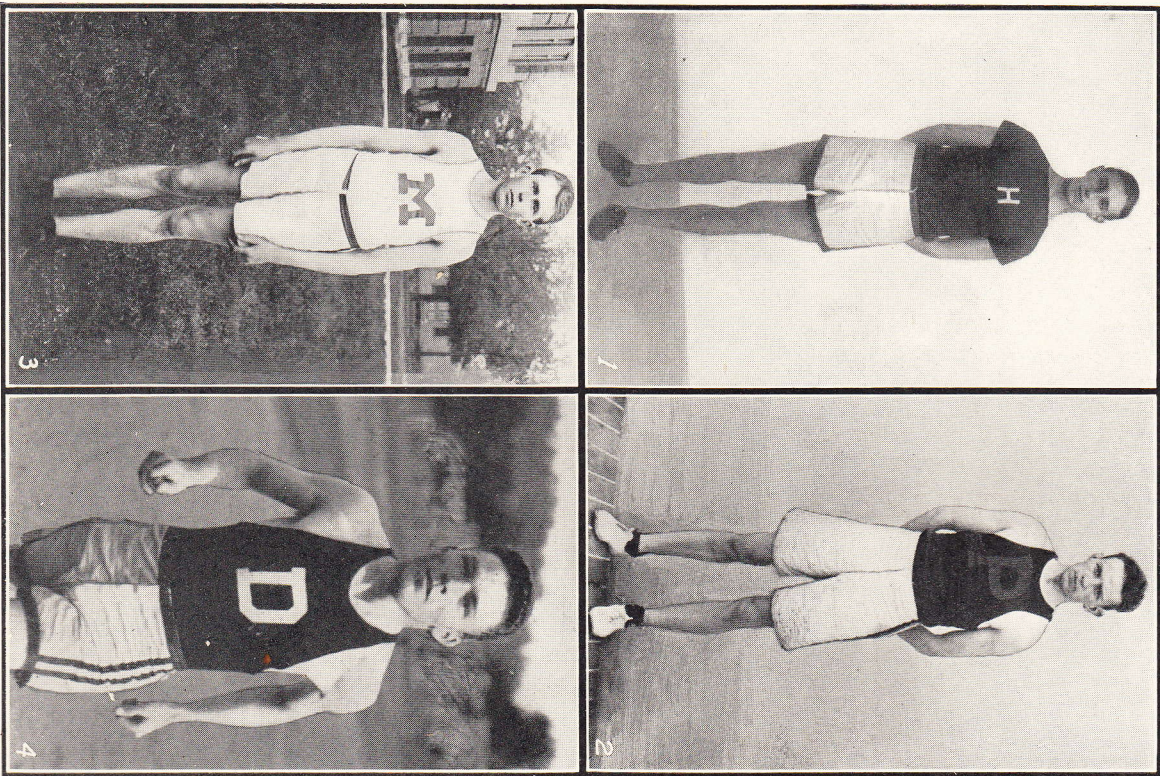
FINISH, 2 MILE RUN.

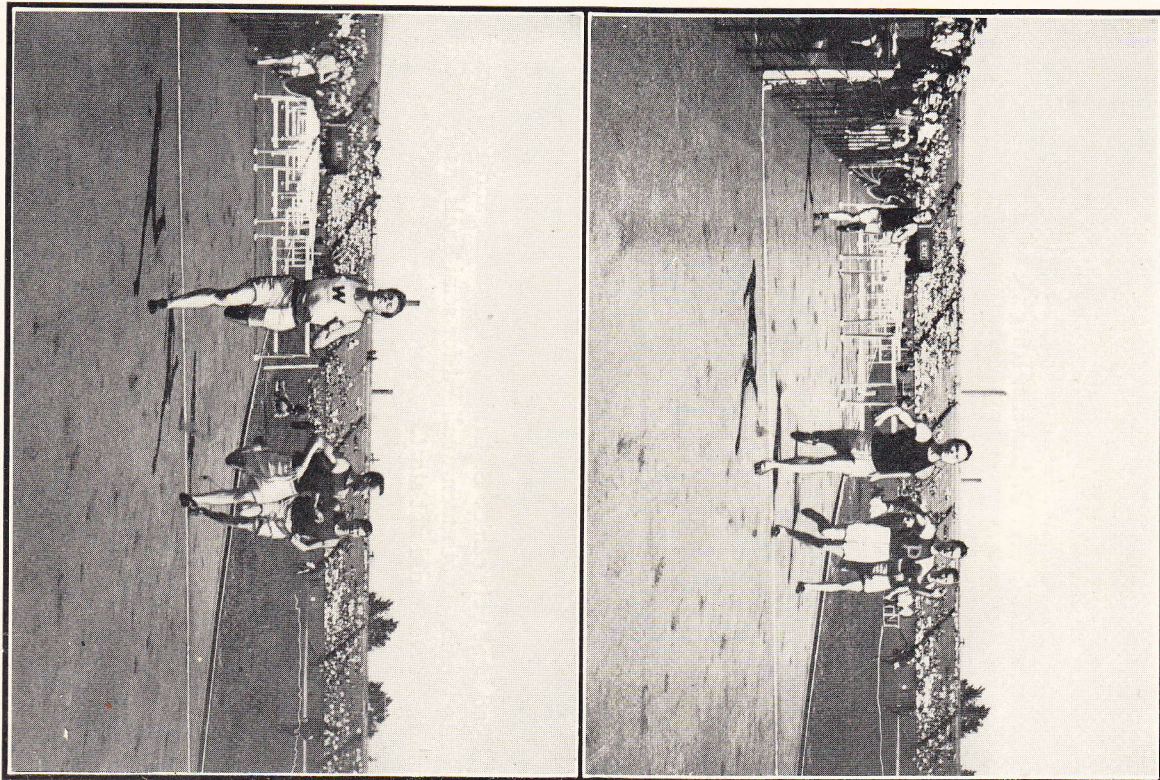

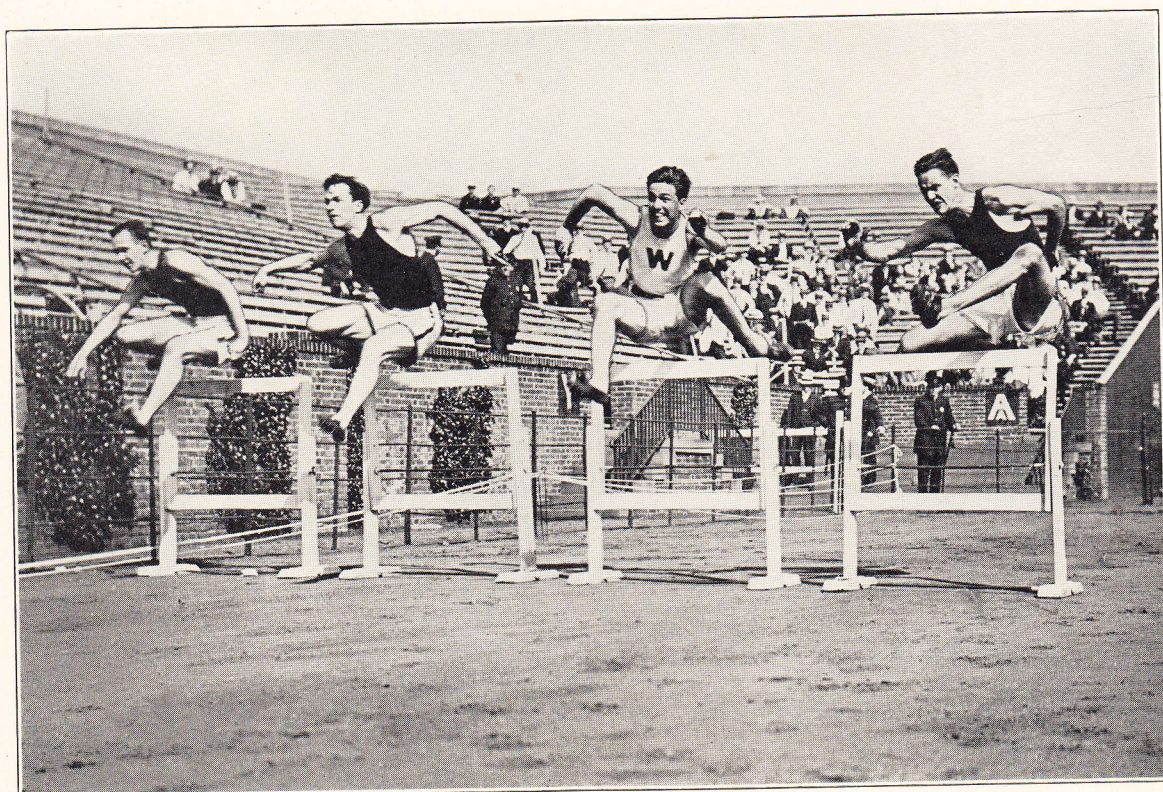

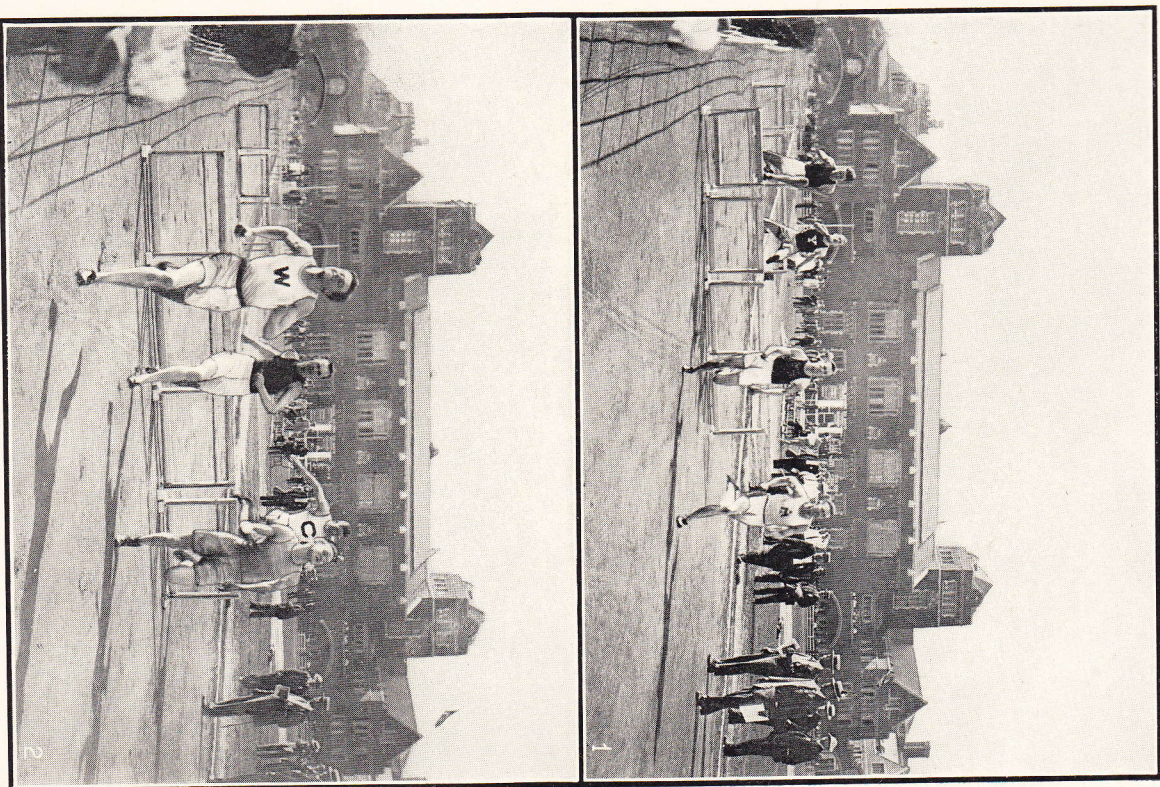

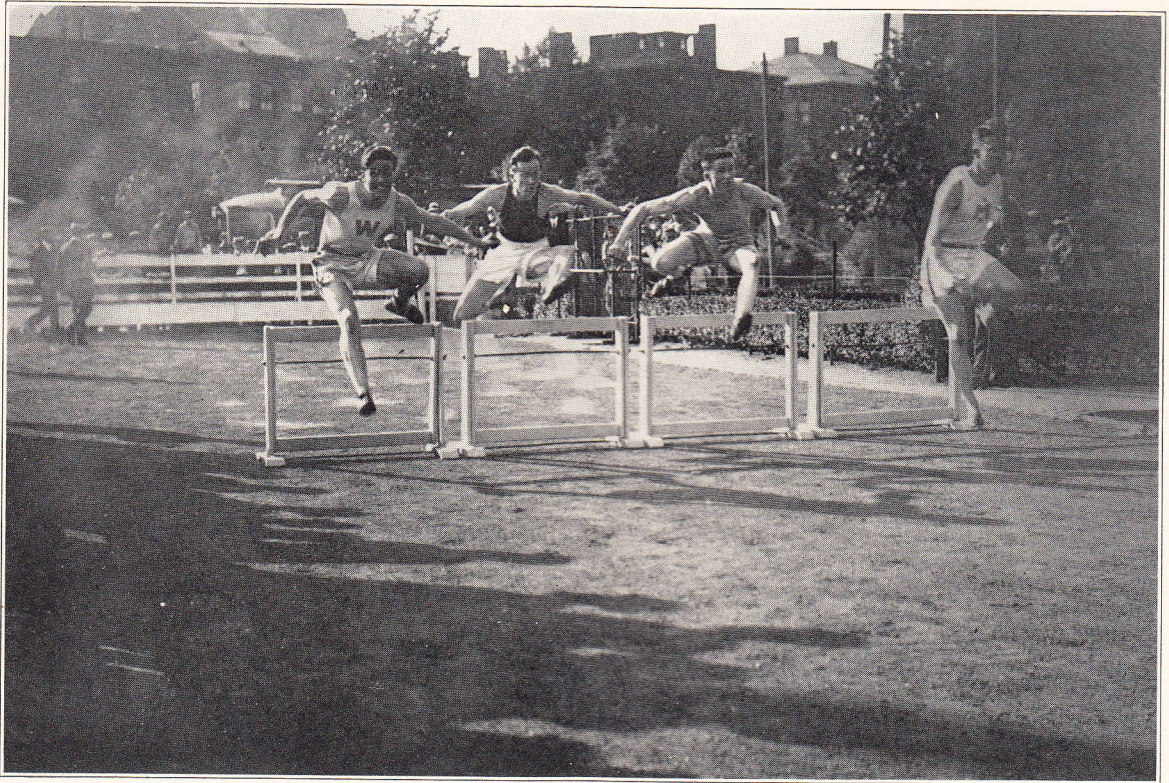

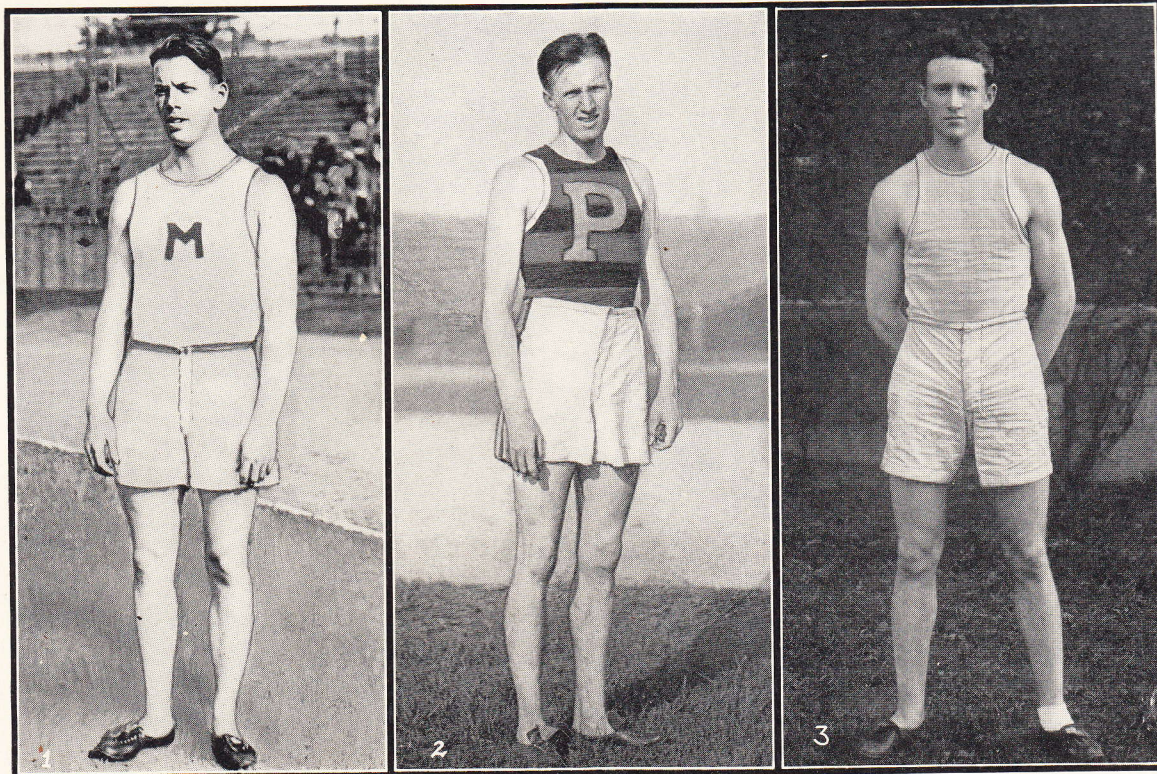

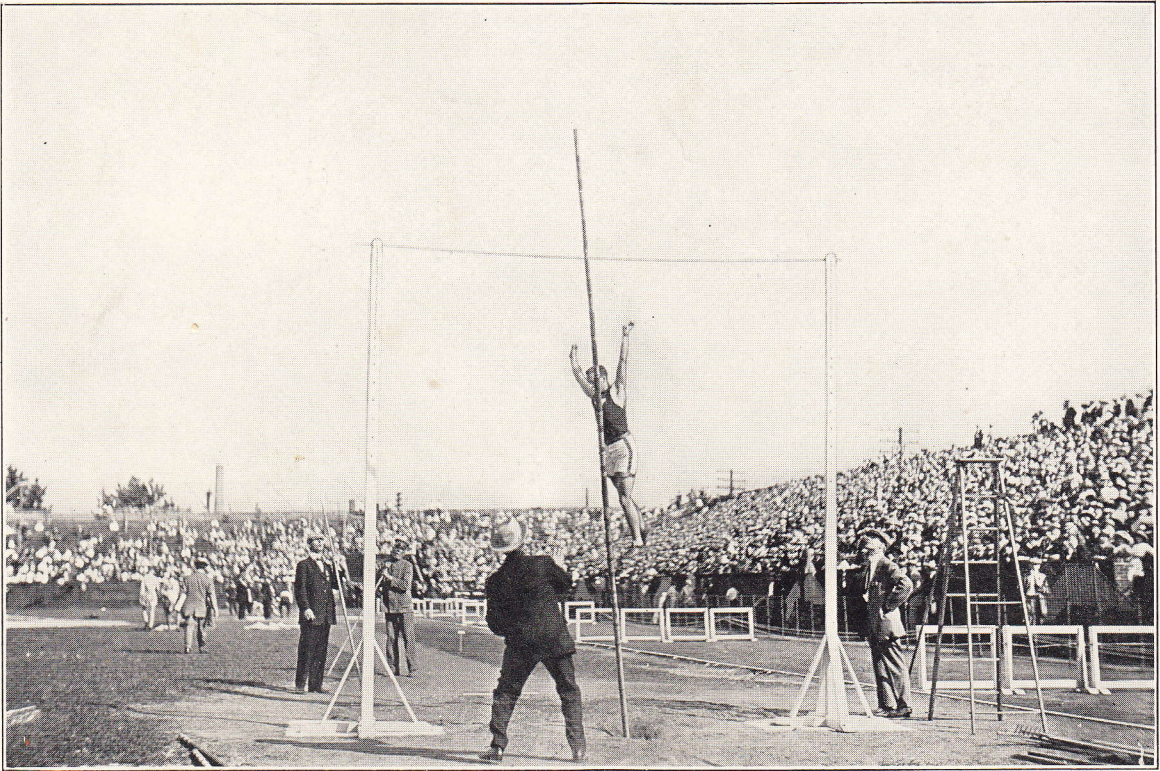

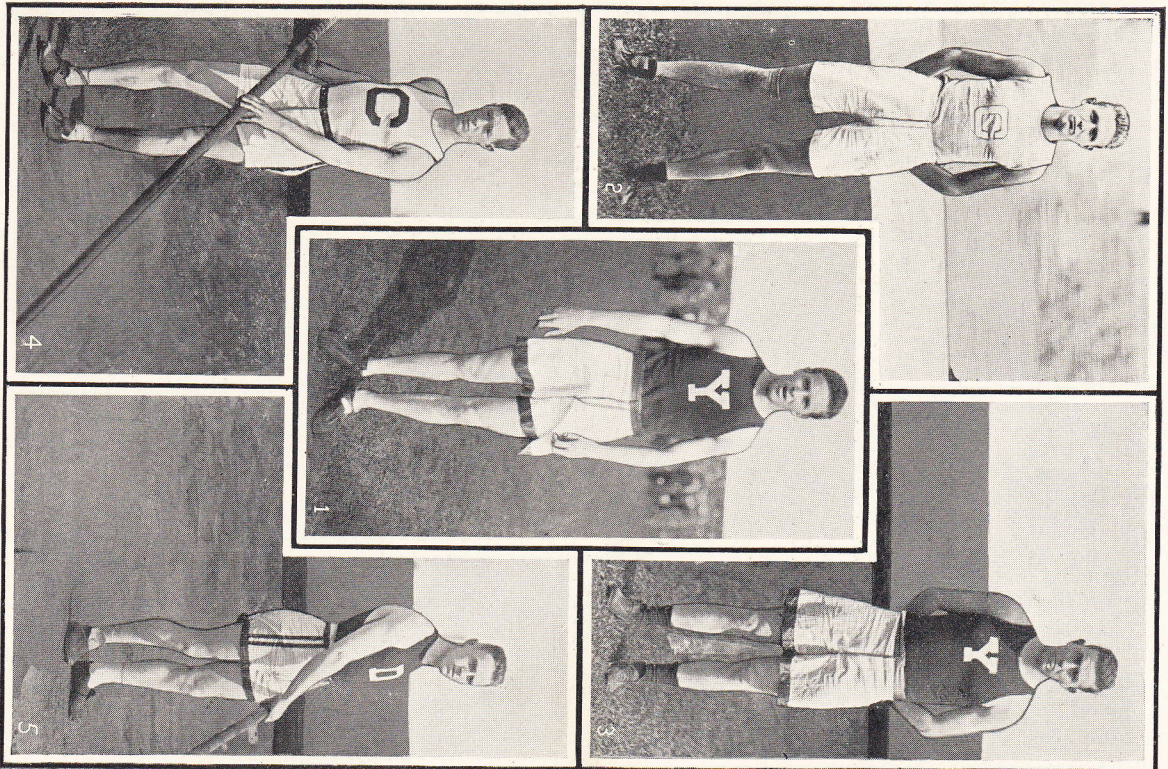

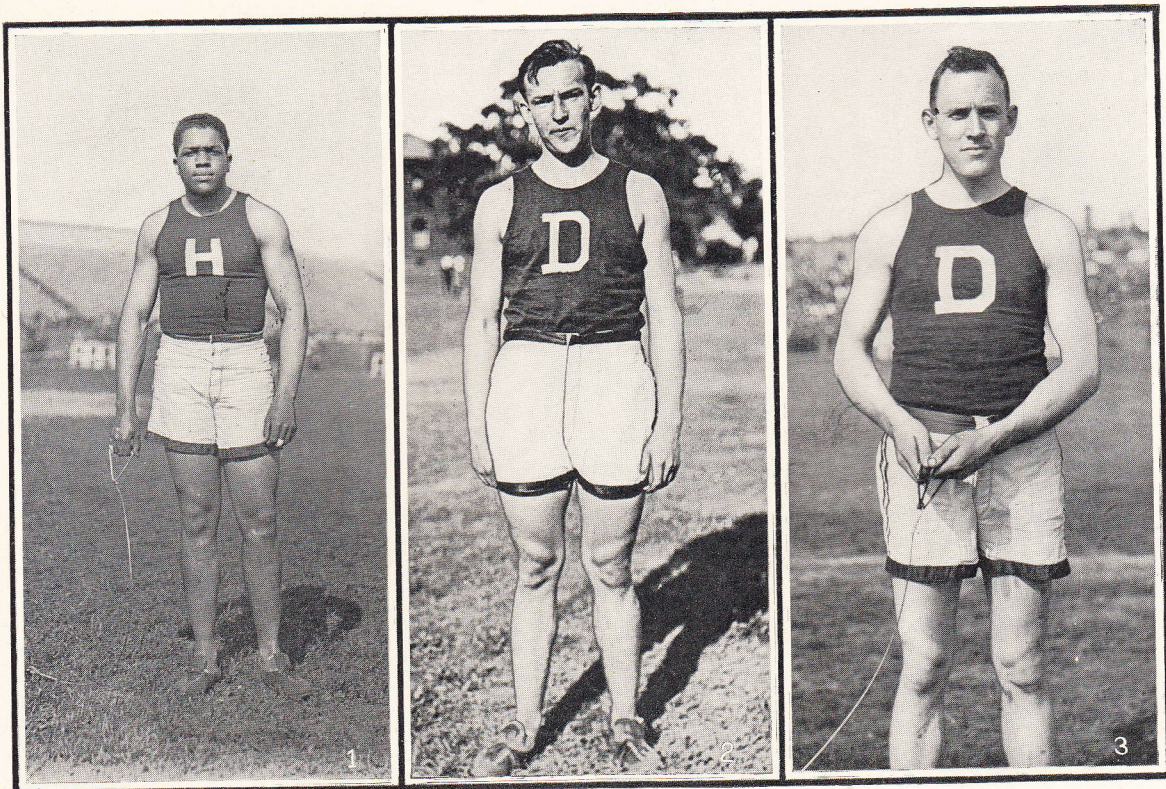

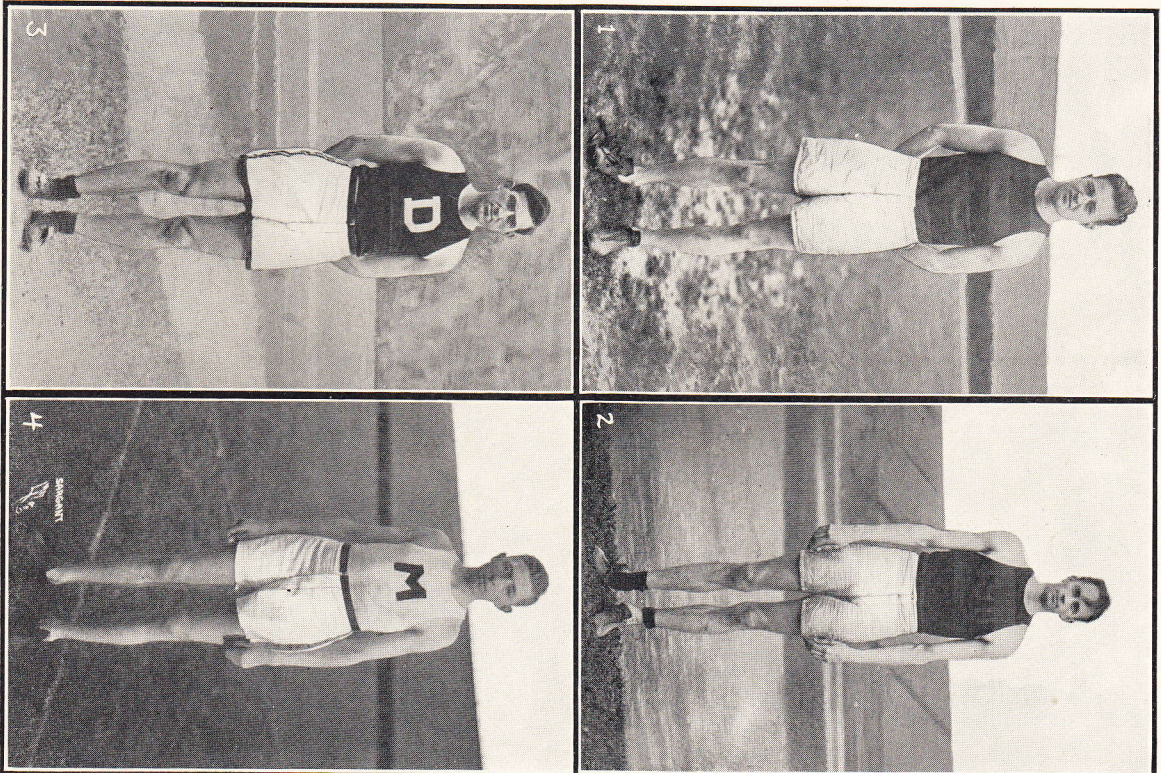

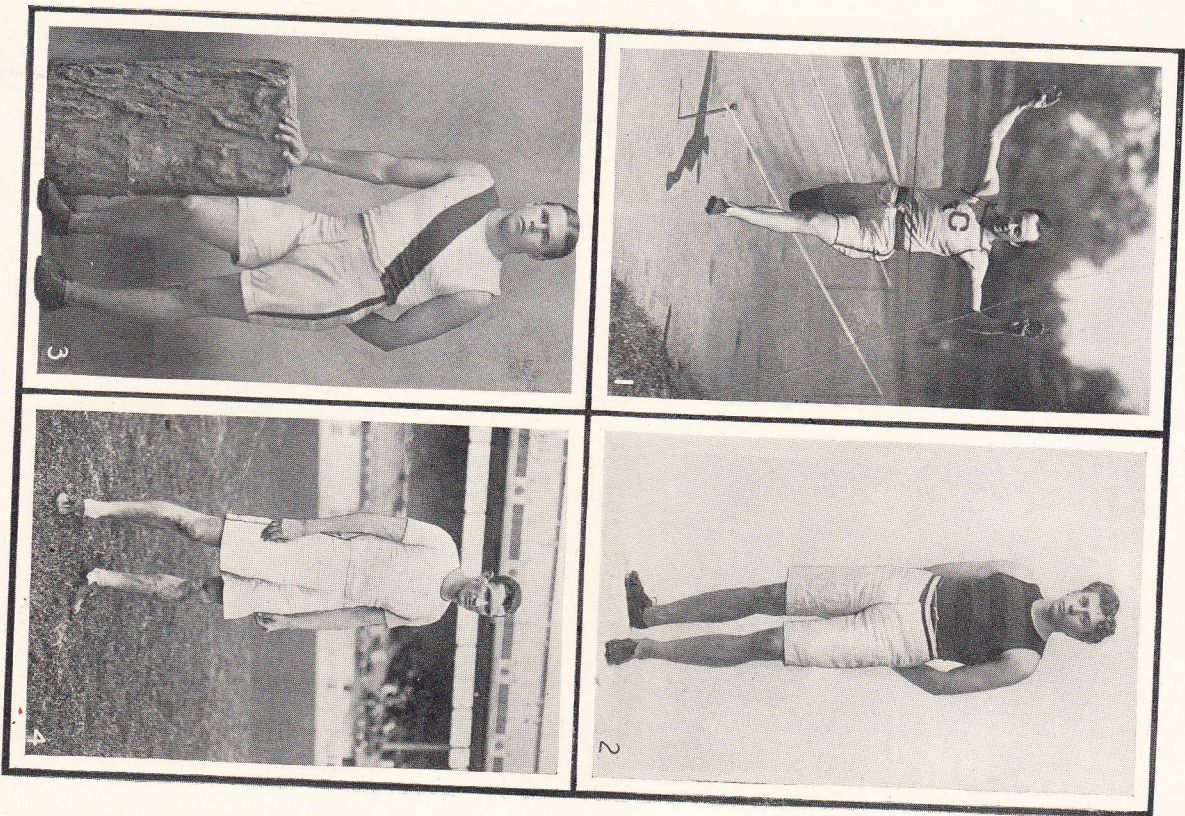

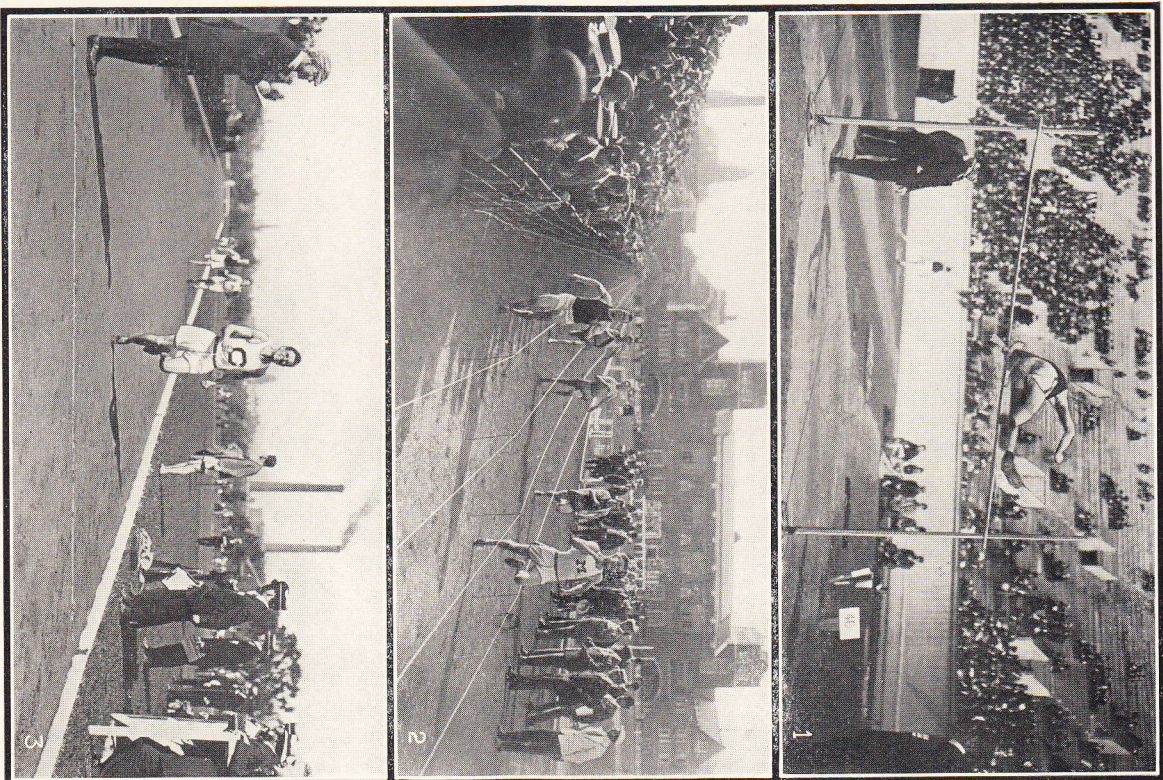
