THIRTY-EIGHTH INTER-COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

PENNSYLVANIA won the thirty-eighth annual track and field championship of the Inter-Collegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America with a score of 24 points.

Harvard was second with 21½, Michigan third with 19 and Cornell fourth with 17½.

Although but one inter-collegiate record was broken, it was a new world mark. In addition three inter-collegiate records, two of them also world records, were equalled. In the one mile run J. P. Jones, of Cornell, lowered his mark of 4 minutes 15 2/5 seconds which he made on the same track in 1911, to 4 minutes 14 2/5 seconds. In the 100 yards dash J. E. Patterson, of Pennsylvania, equalled the inter-collegiate record of 9 4/5 seconds. In the 220 yards dash D. F. Lippincott, of Pennsylvania, equalled the inter-collegiate and world record of 21 1/5 seconds. In the 220 yards hurdles J. I. Wendell, of Wesleyan, equalled the record of 23 3/5 seconds established by A. C. Kraenzlein, of Pennsylvania, in 1898.

An unusual feature of the meet and illustrating the closeness of competition was the fact that Pennsylvania's victory of 24 points was the smallest total with which these games were ever won, and the first time that the meet was ever won with less than 25 points.

The competitors were favored with ideal weather conditions on both days. The track was dry and the sun warm, with a light wind blowing down the stretch. The elimination trials in the field events and the preliminary heats in the track events, except the mile and two mile runs, were held on May 30th. The finals were decided on May 31st.

The games were held on Soldiers' Field, Cambridge, Mass., through the courtesy of Harvard University. Walter H. Tufts, Jr., and William F. Garcelon, both of Harvard, managed them efficiently. About 12,000 spectators witnessed the games on the day of the finals.

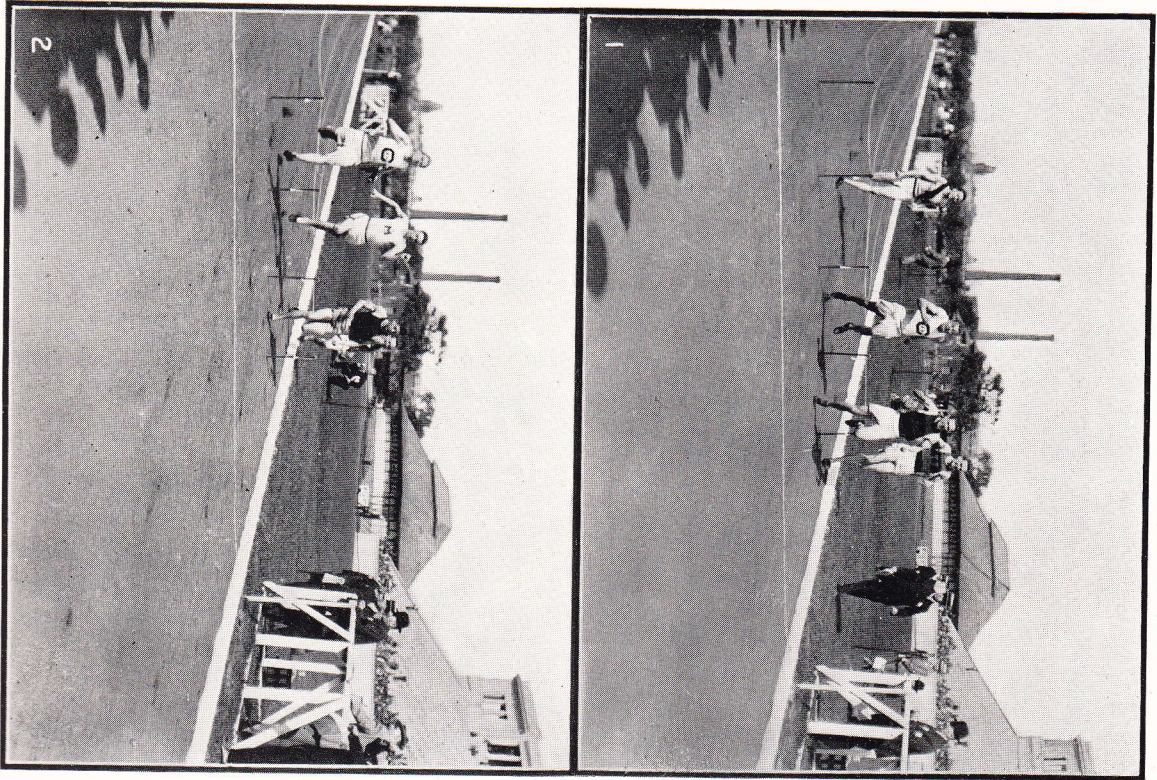

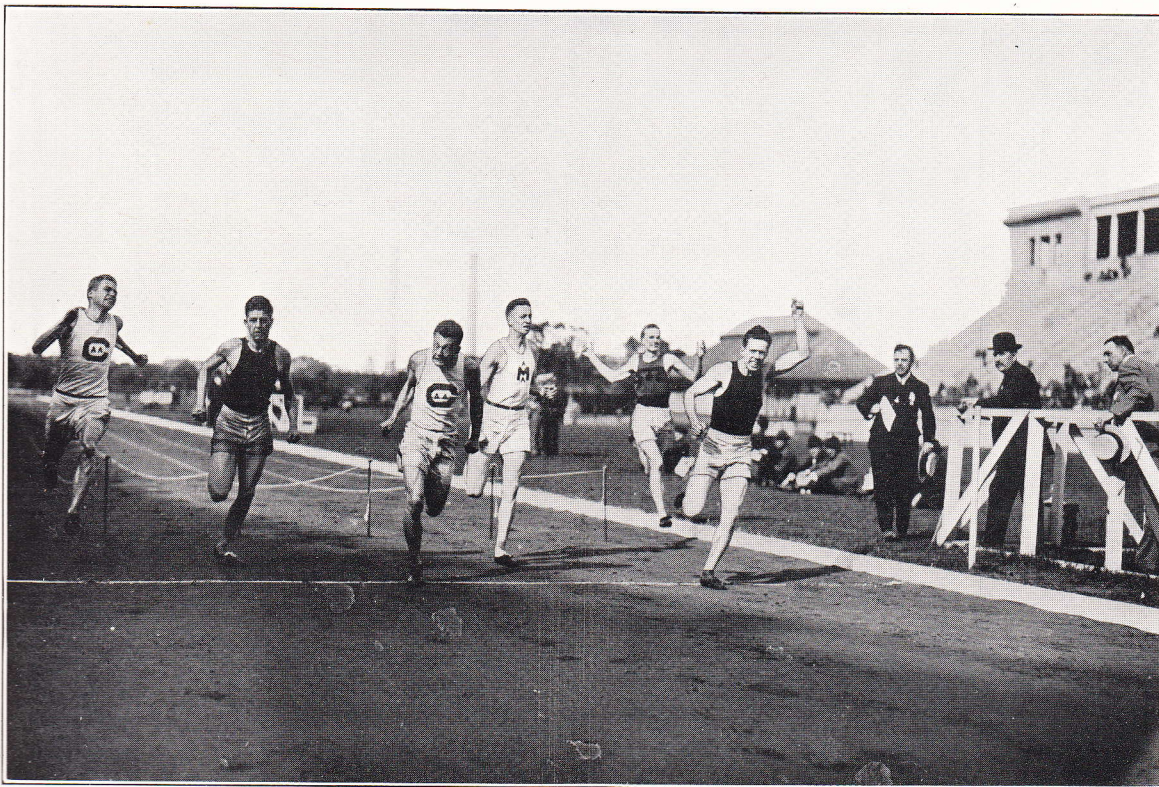

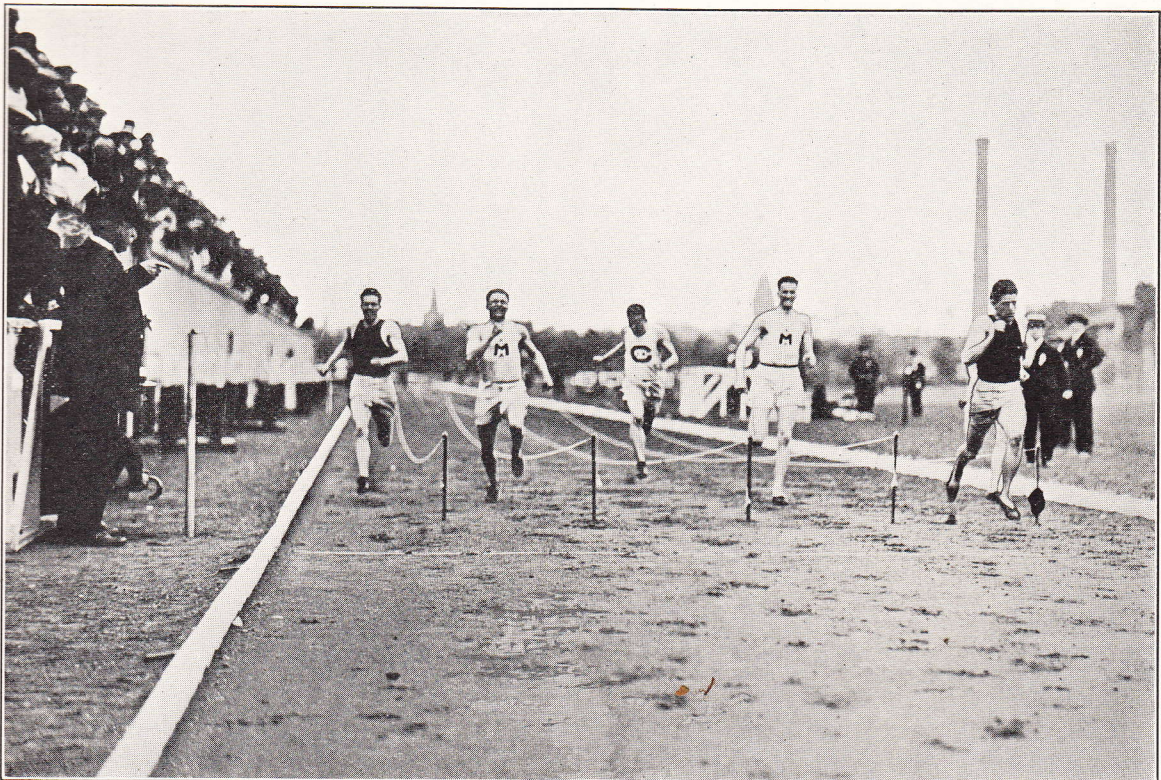
START FINAL HEAT 220 YARDS DASH.

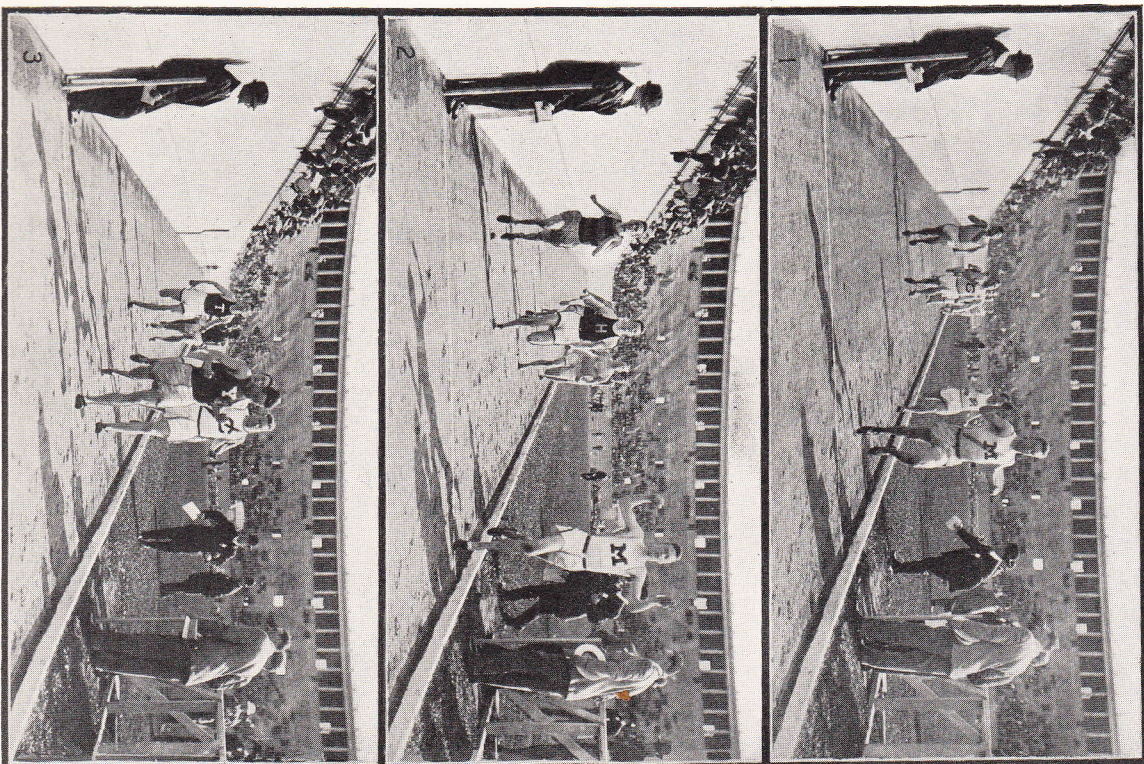

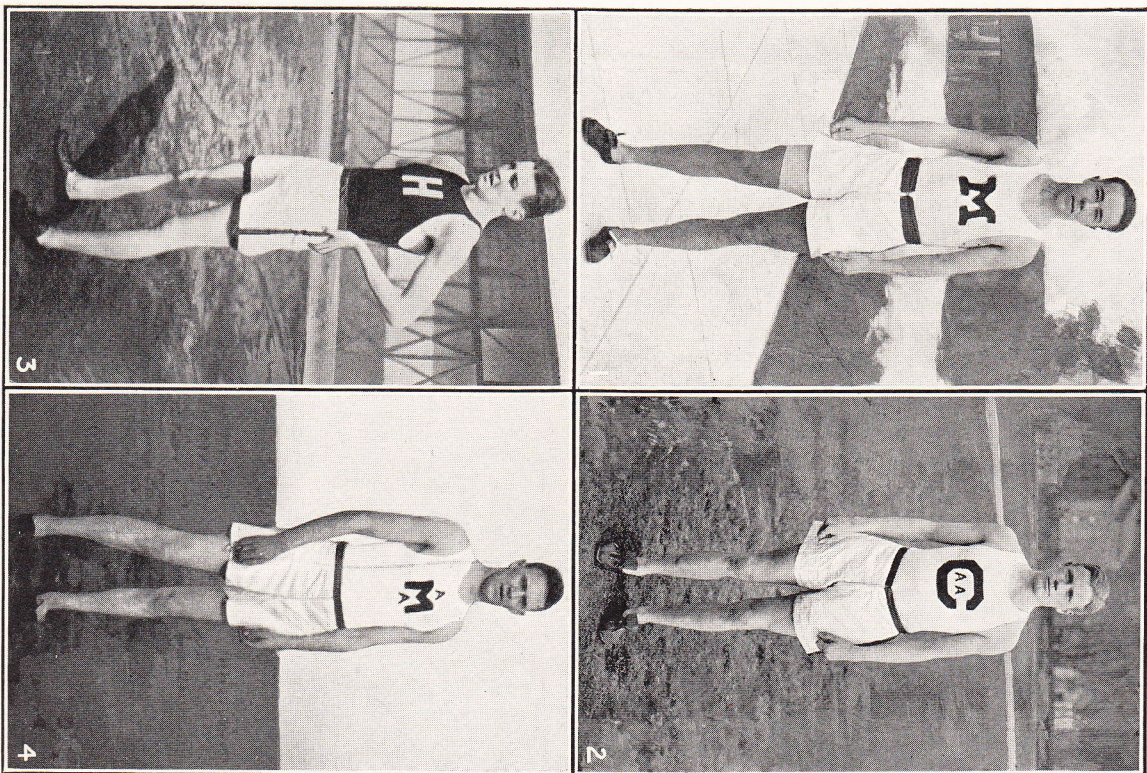

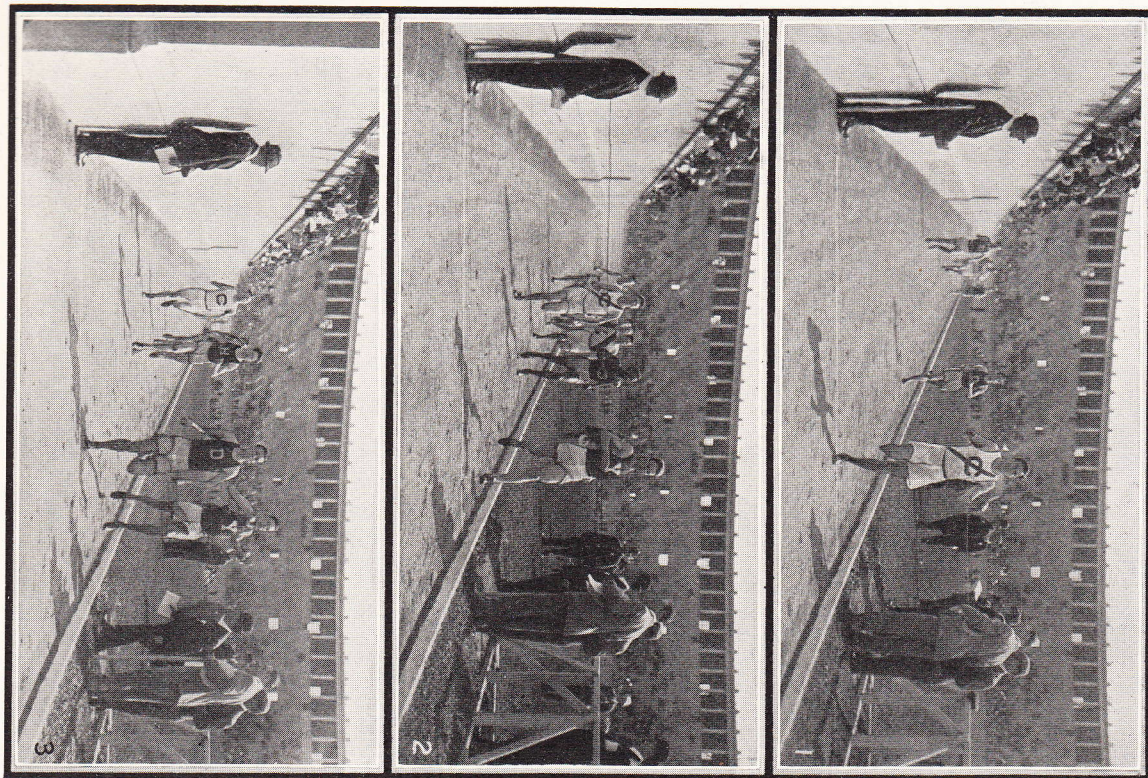

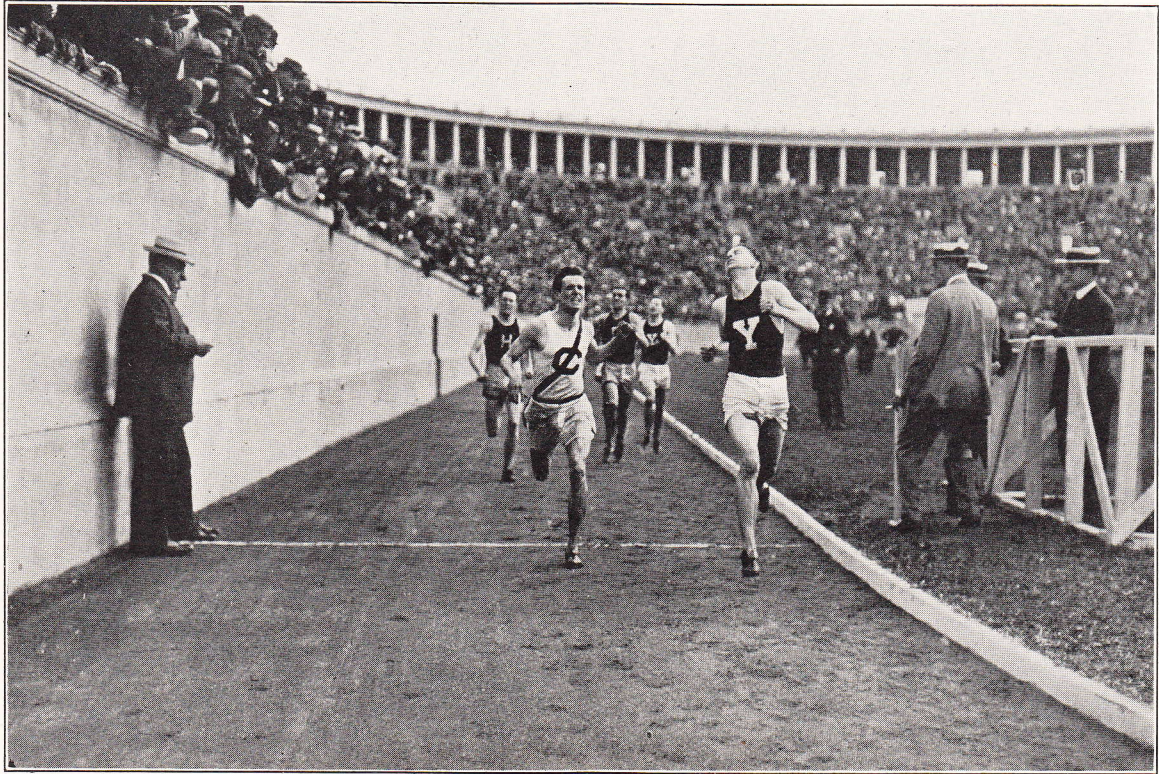


1. Jones, Cornell, winning first heat.

START OF THE 880 YARDS RUN.



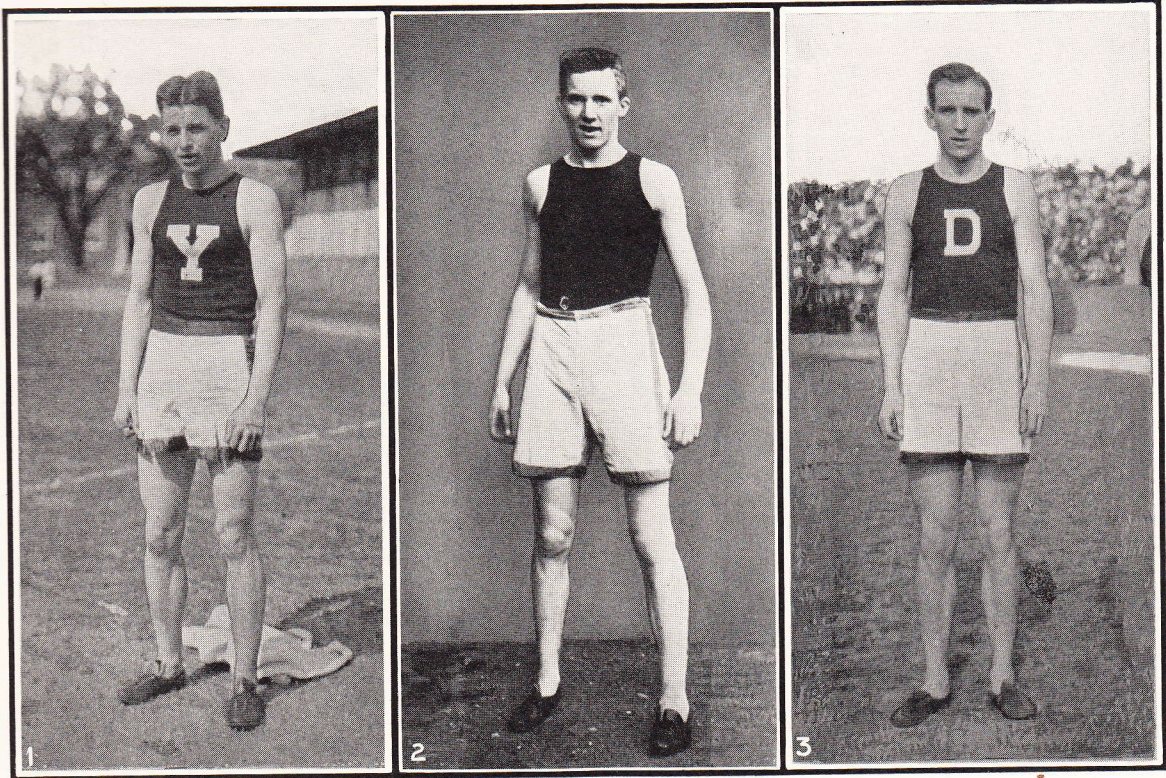
FINISH OF THE 880 YARDS RUN.

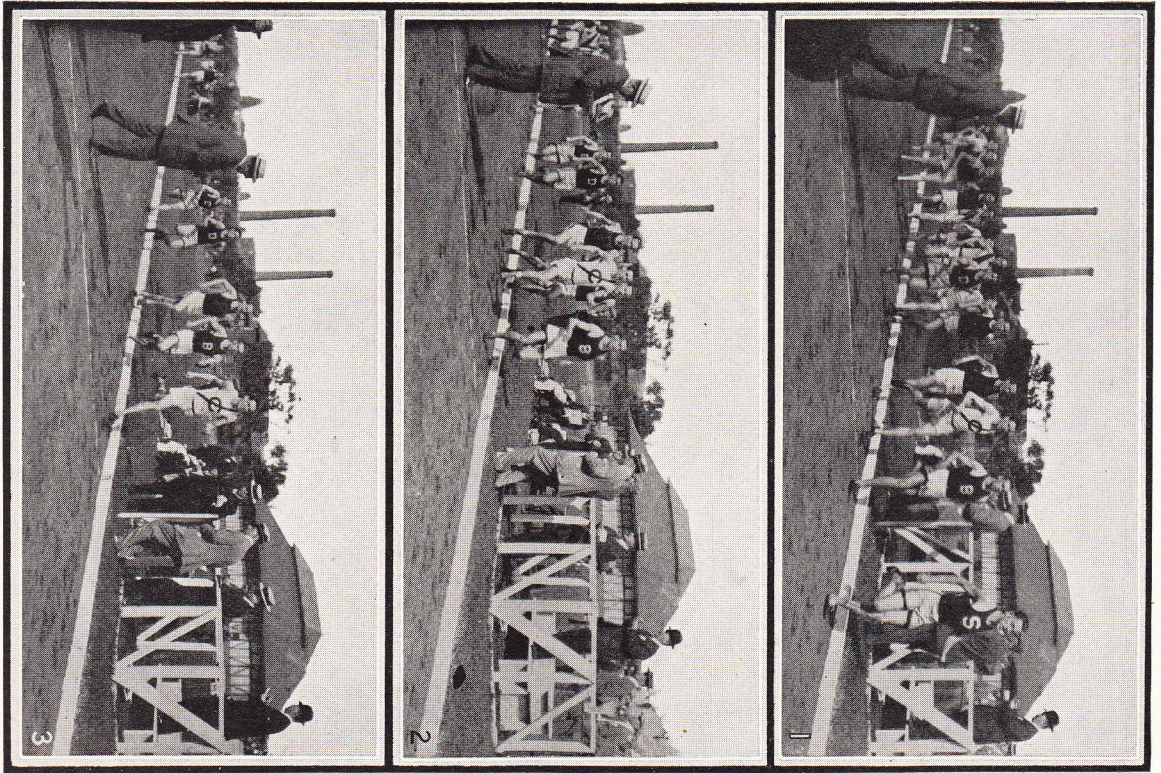

INTERMEDIATE QUARTERS OF WORLD RECORD MILE RUN.



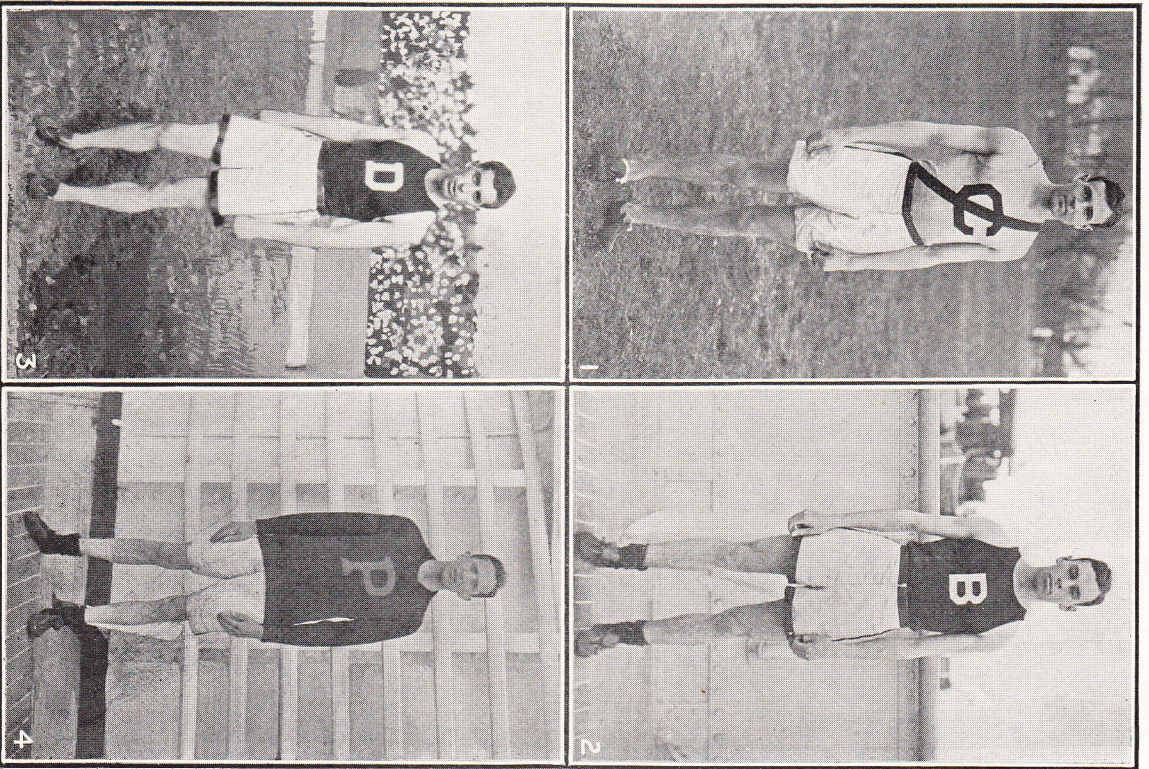

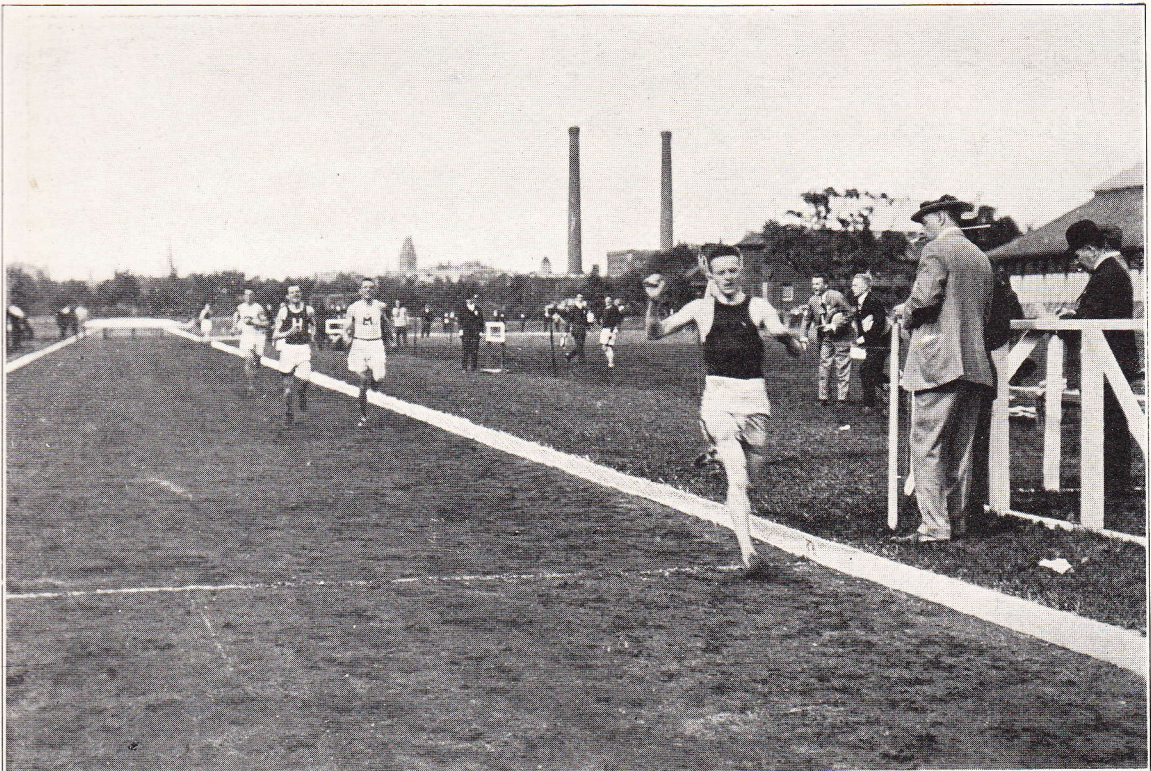
START OF THE 2 MILE RUN.

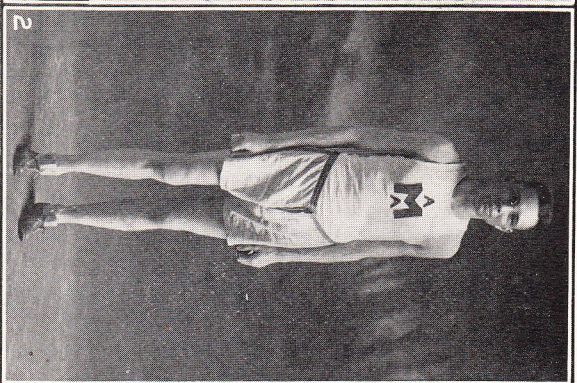
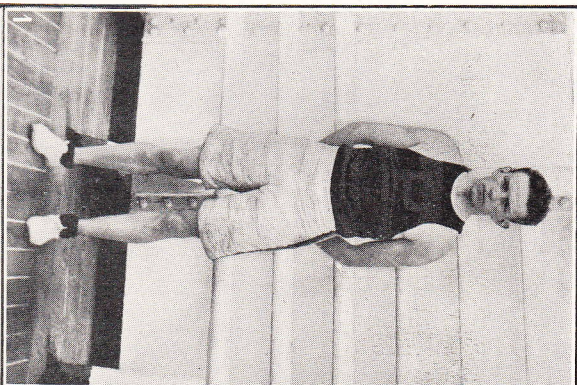
FINISH OF THE 2 MILE RUN.

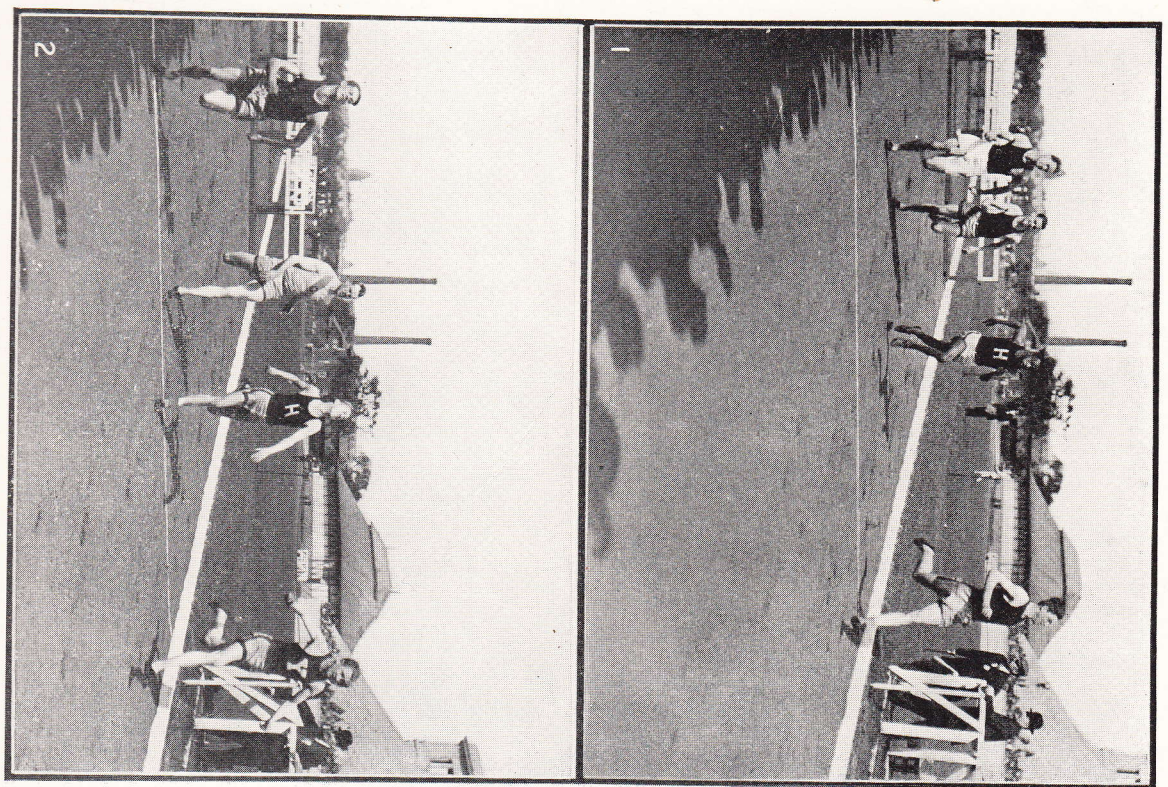

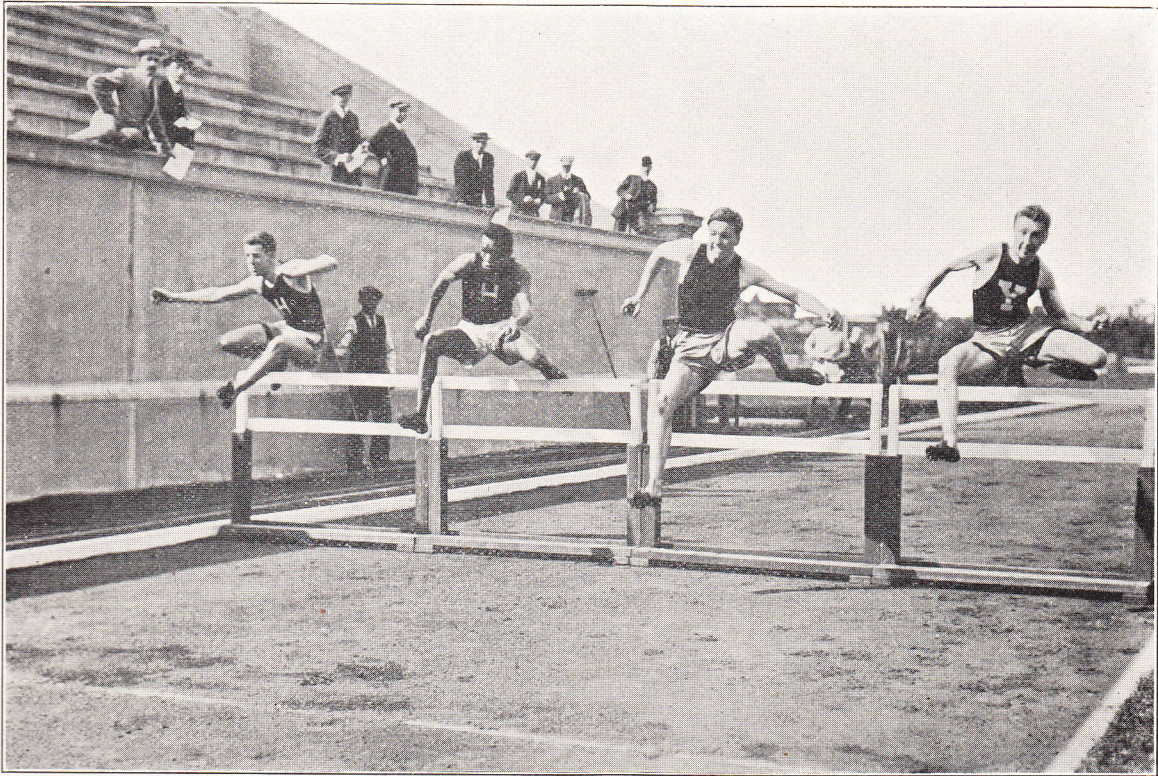

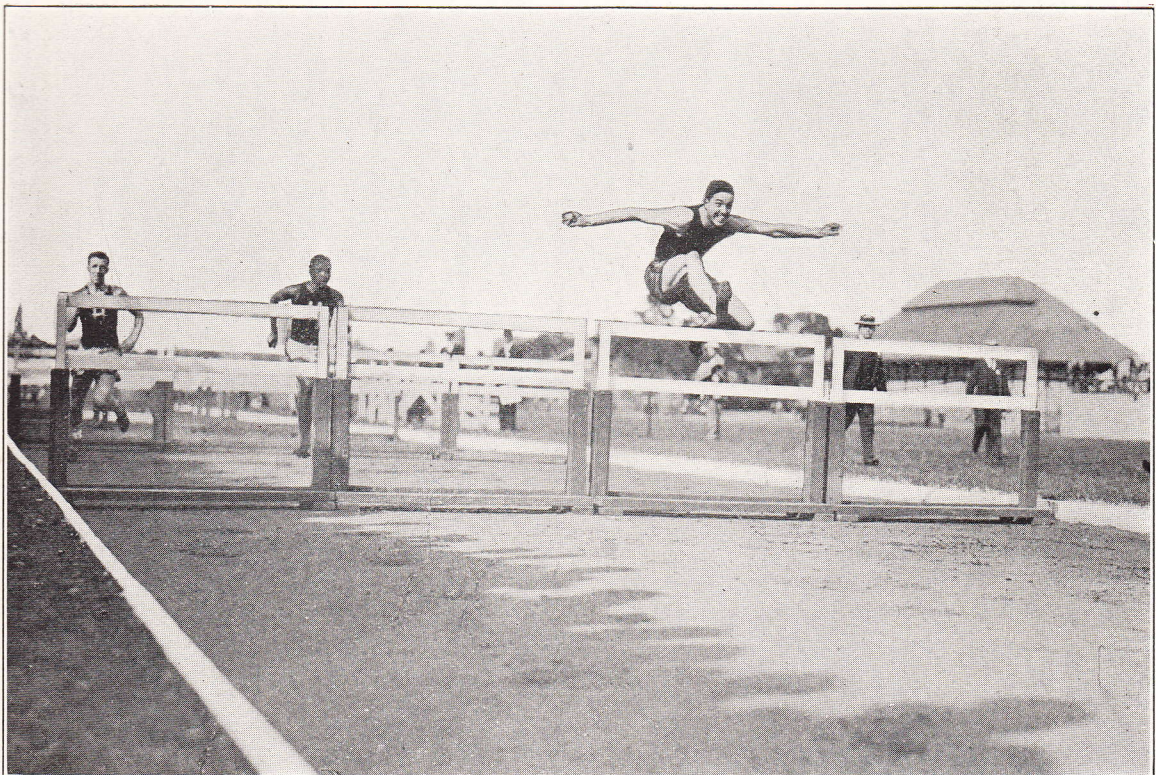
OVER FIRST HURDLE, 120 YARDS HURDLE RACE.

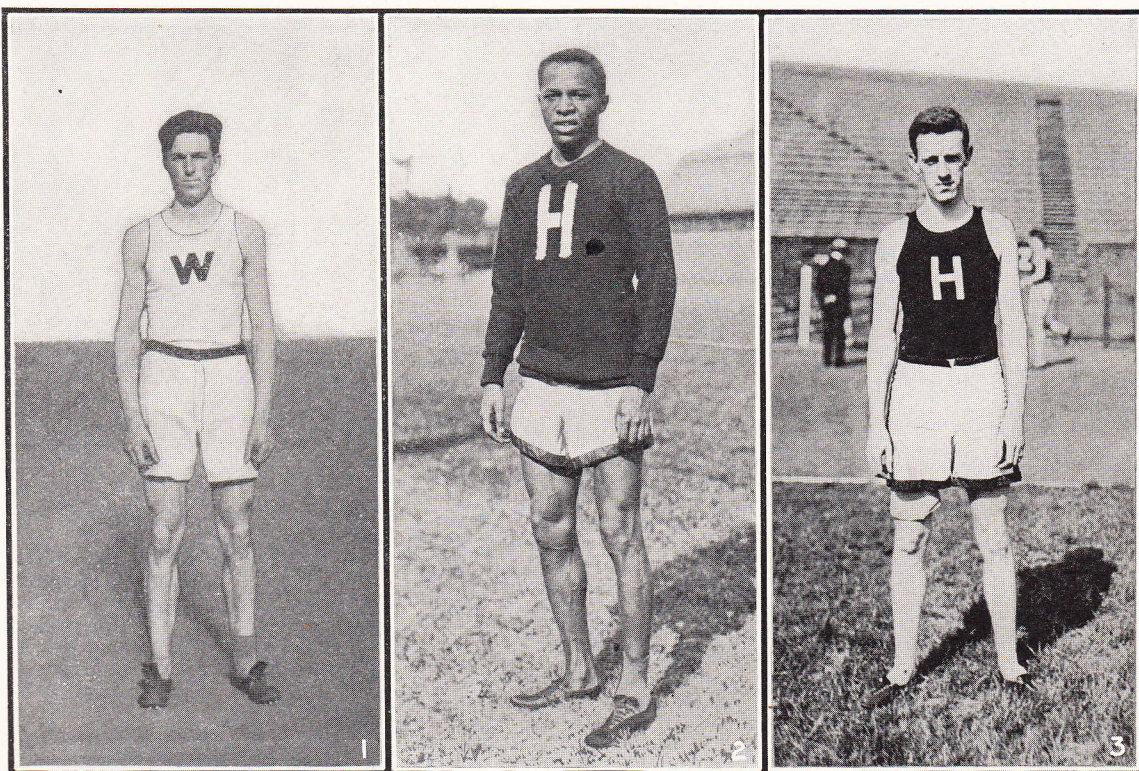
WENDELL WINNING 120 YARDS HURDLE RACE.

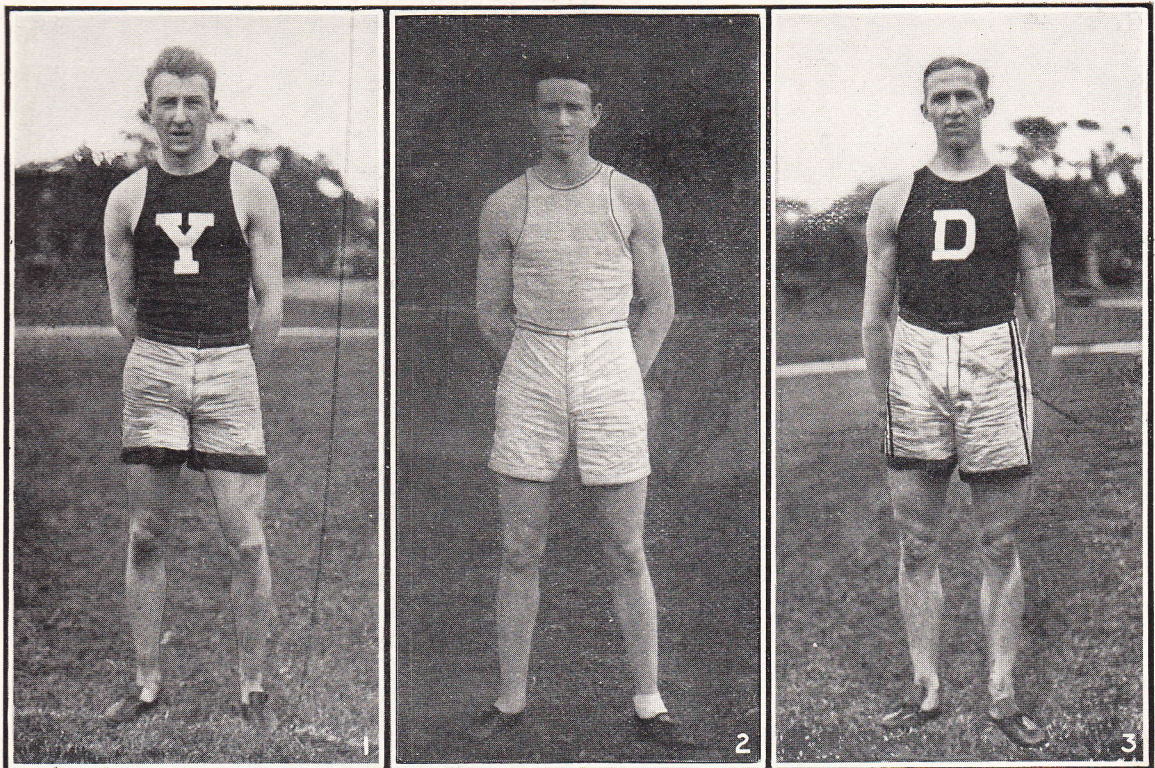

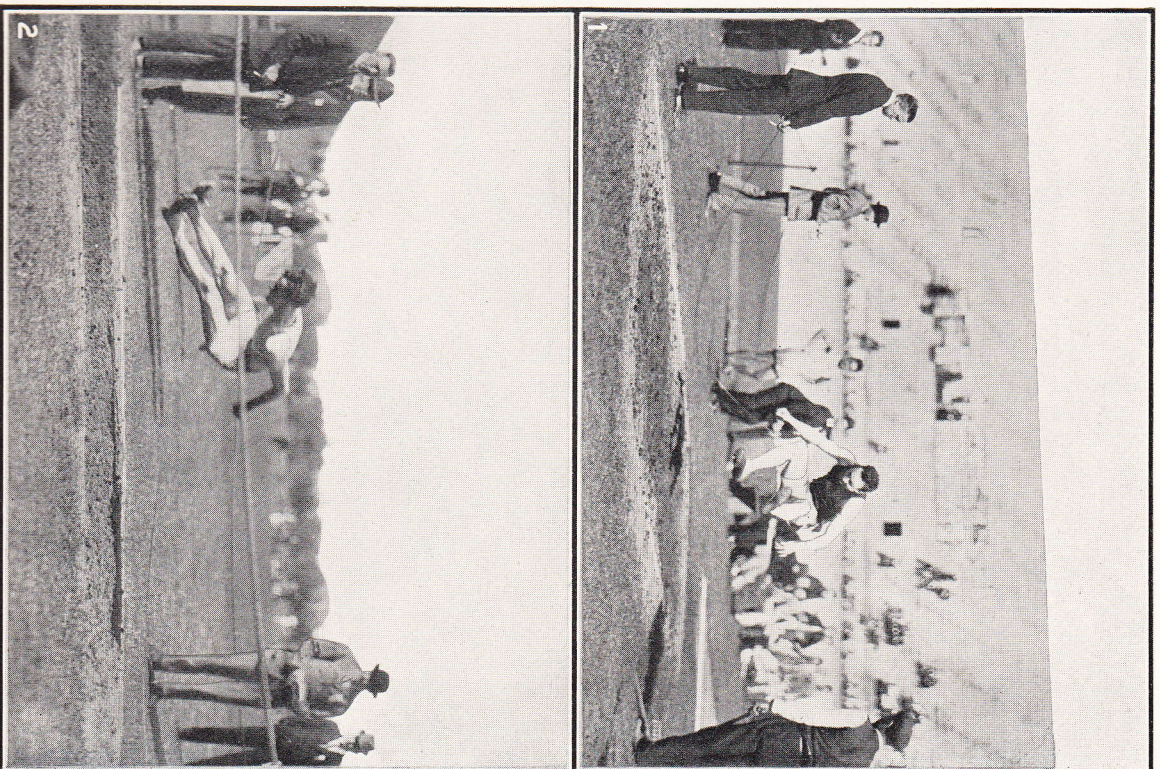

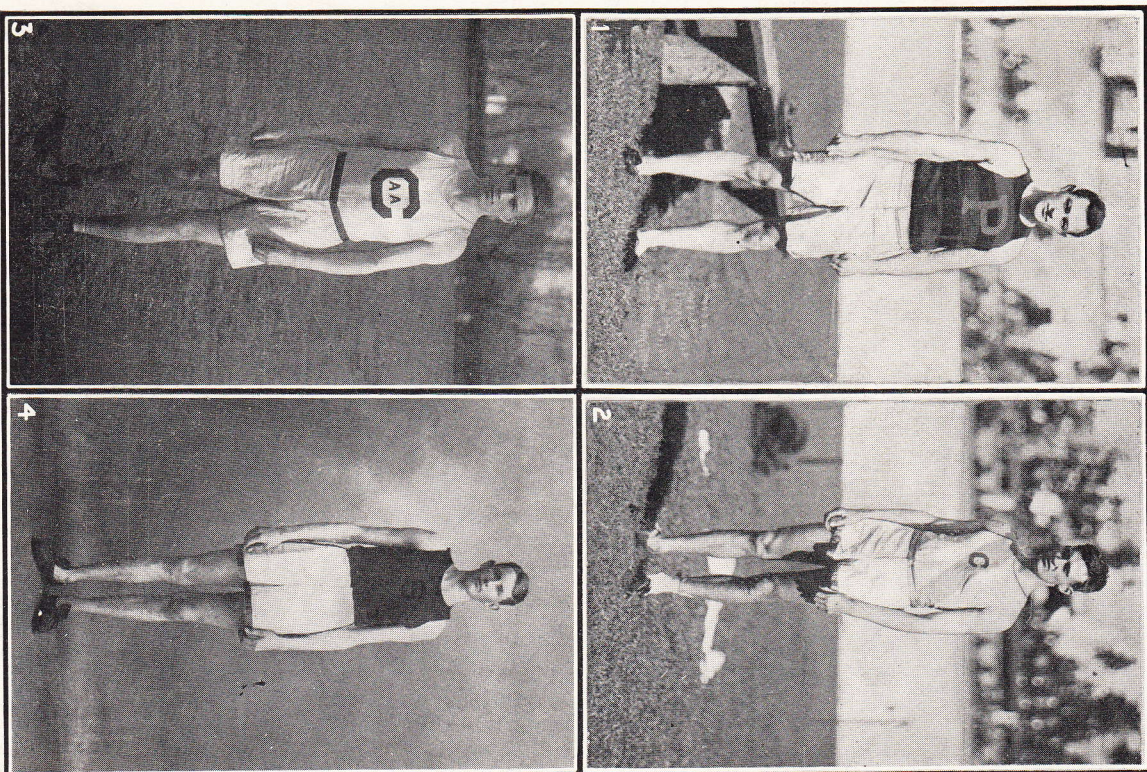

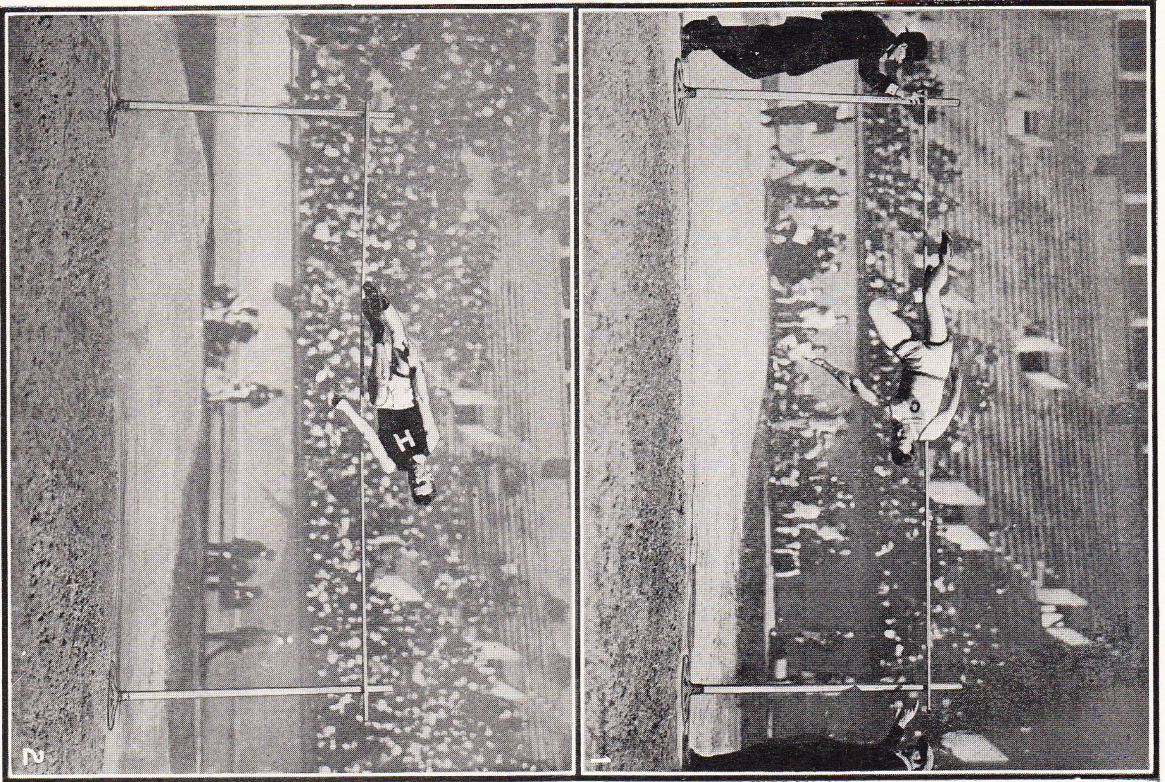

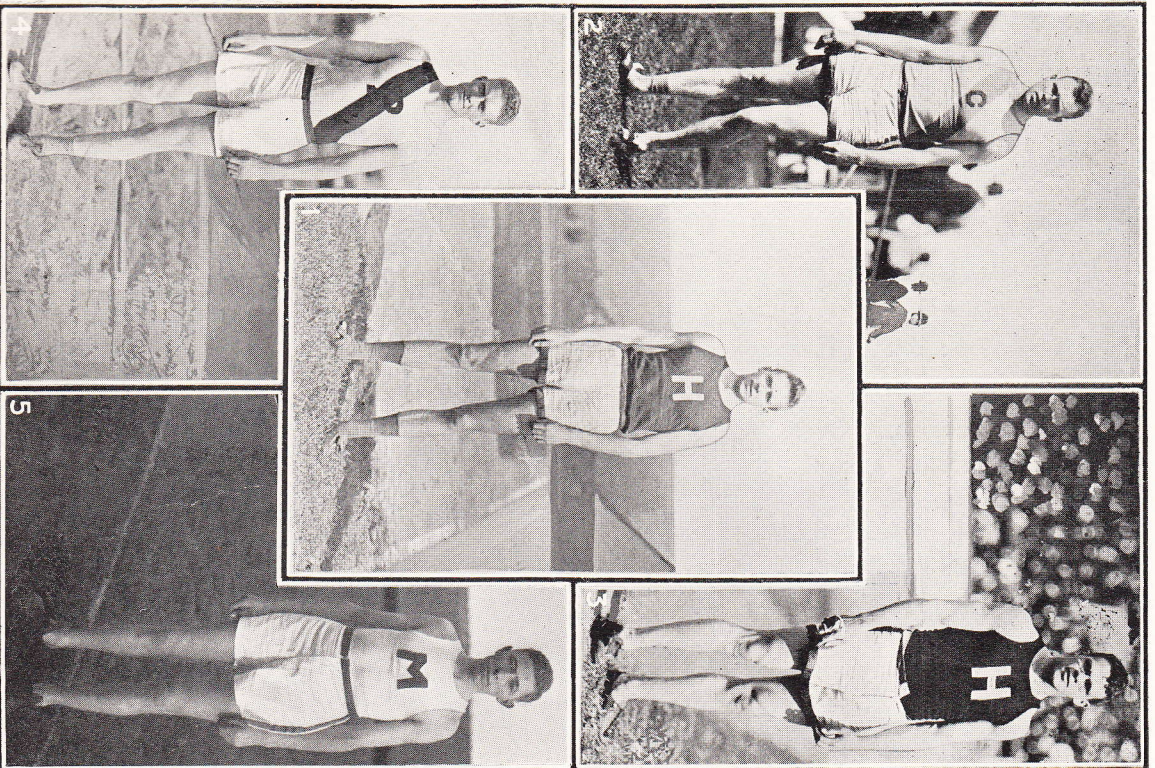

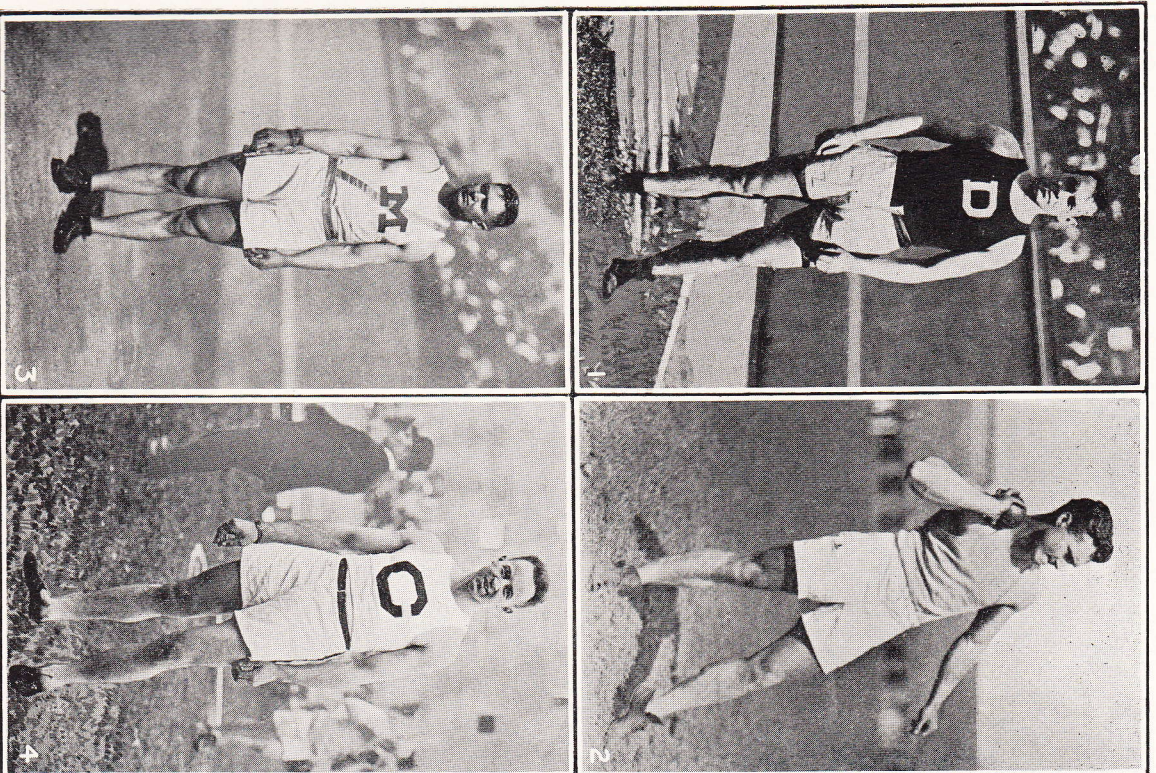

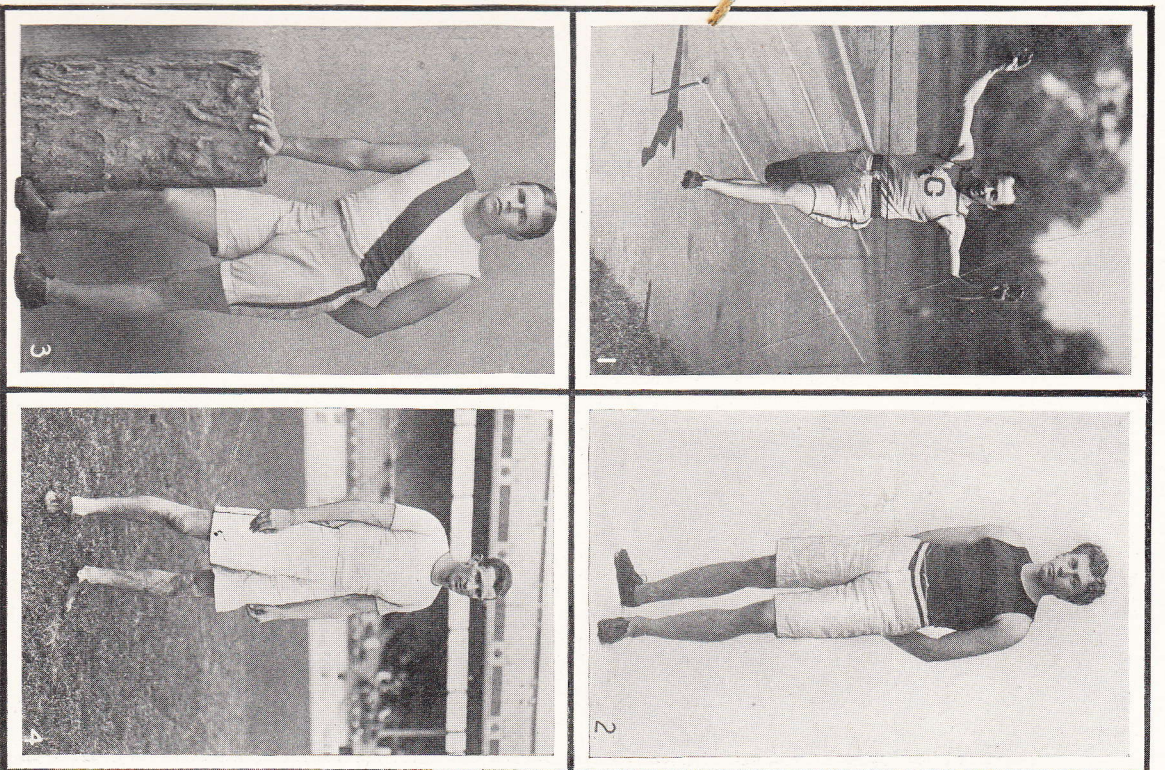

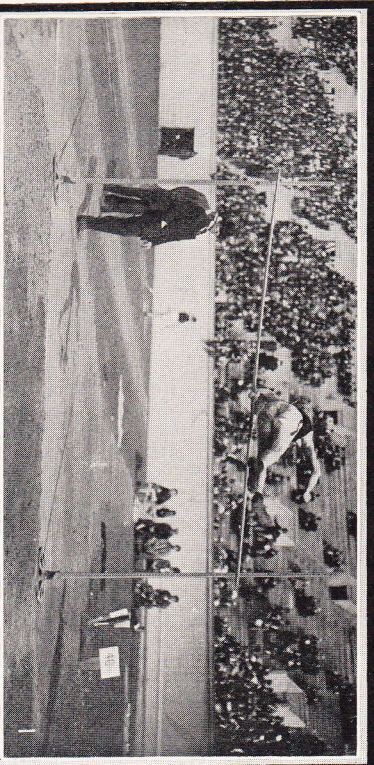
