## THIRTY-NINTH INTER-COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

**C**ORNELL UNIVERSITY won the thirty-ninth annual track and field championship meeting of the Inter-Collegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America, held on Soldiers' Field, Cambridge, Mass., May 29 and 30, 1914. Cornell scored 43 points, while the University of Pennsylvania was second with 31. Michigan was third with 29½ and Dartmouth fourth with 23.

The meeting was featured by the fact that Cornell's victory gave this university permanent possession of the cup which was put up for competition in 1904. Under the rules of competition the cup became the permanent property of the university first winning it five times. Of the other members of the Association, Pennsylvania has won it four times, Harvard once and Yale once.

Another feature was the new scoring system by which a fifth place was added and the points distributed as follows: First place, 5; second place, 4; third place, 3; fourth place, 2; and fifth place, 1. Cornell would have won by a substantial margin even under the old scoring system.

Although the competition was unusually close, only two new records were established. In the half mile run D. S. Caldwell of Cornell reduced the record of 1 minute 53 <sup>4</sup>/<sub>5</sub> seconds, established by J. P. Jones of Cornell at Philadelphia in 1912, to 1 minute 53 <sup>2</sup>/<sub>5</sub> seconds. In the two-mile run J. S. Hoffnir of Cornell lowered the record of 9 minutes 24 <sup>2</sup>/<sub>5</sub> seconds, made by P. R. Withington of Harvard at Philadelphia in 1912, to 9 minutes 23 <sup>4</sup>/<sub>5</sub> seconds.

The games were held on Soldiers' Field through the courtesy of Harvard University and were managed by Charles G. Squibb of Harvard. Ideal weather favored the competitors both on the day of the preliminaries and the finals. On the final day about 12,000 spectators were present.

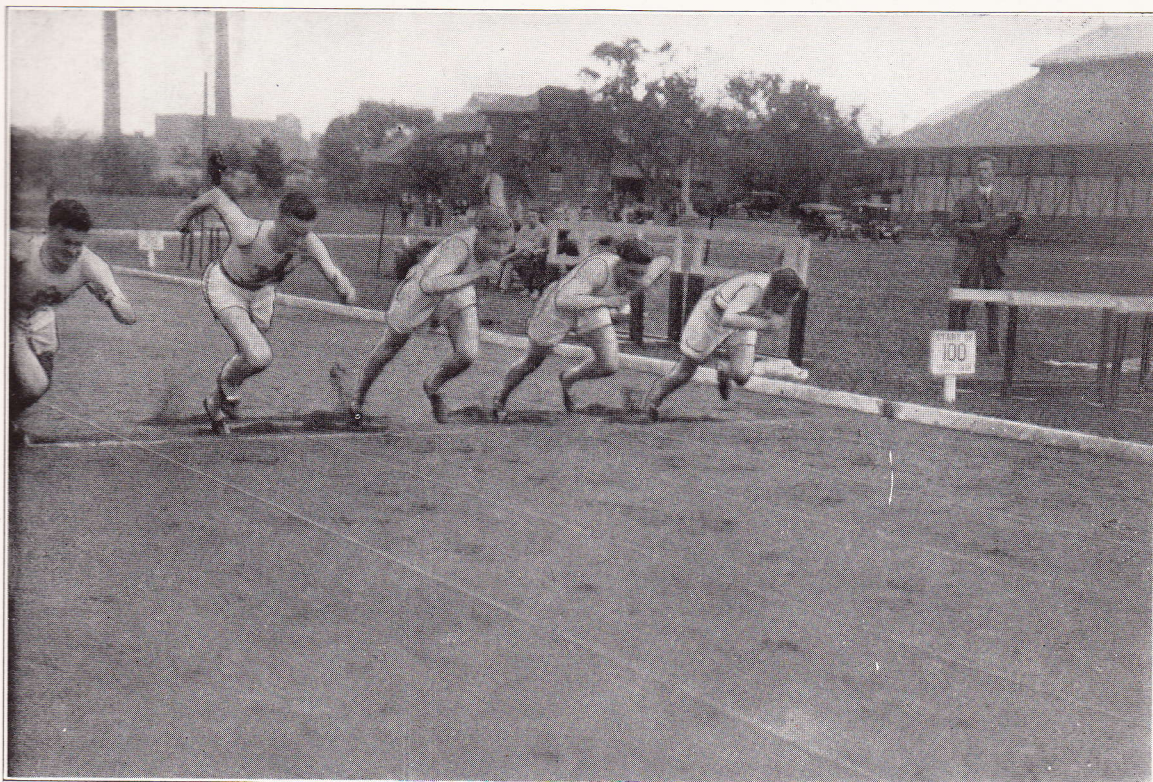

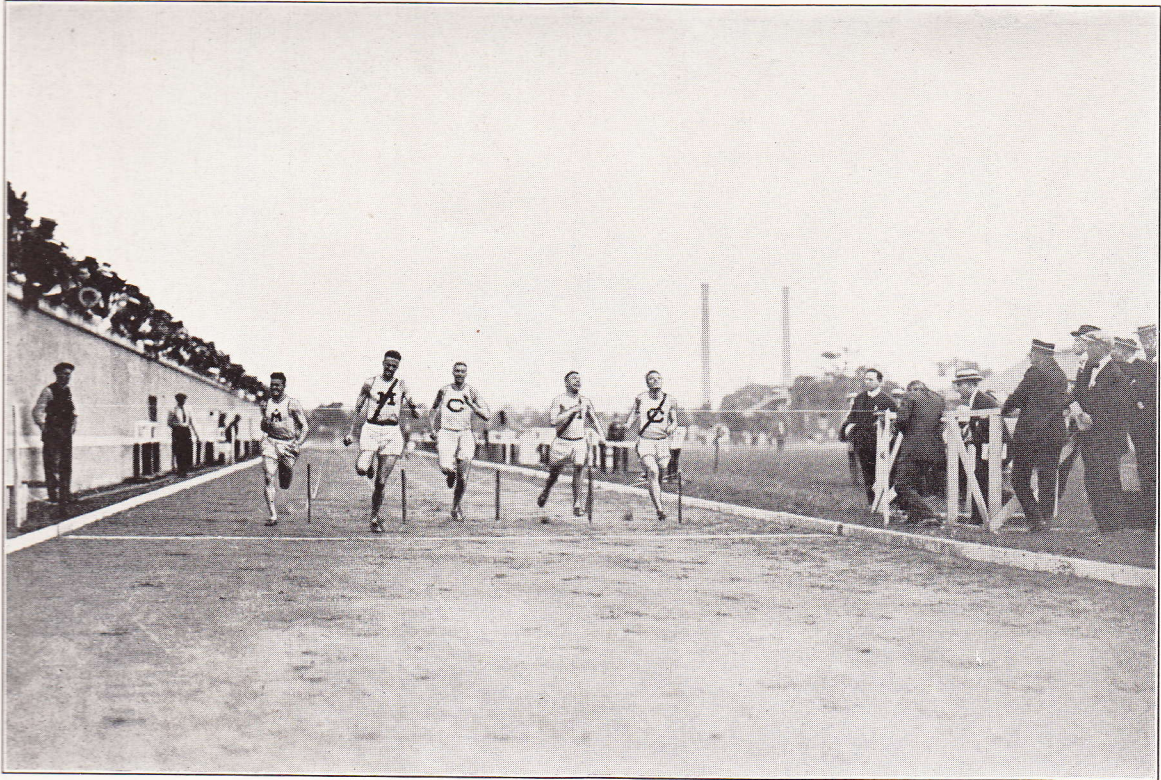

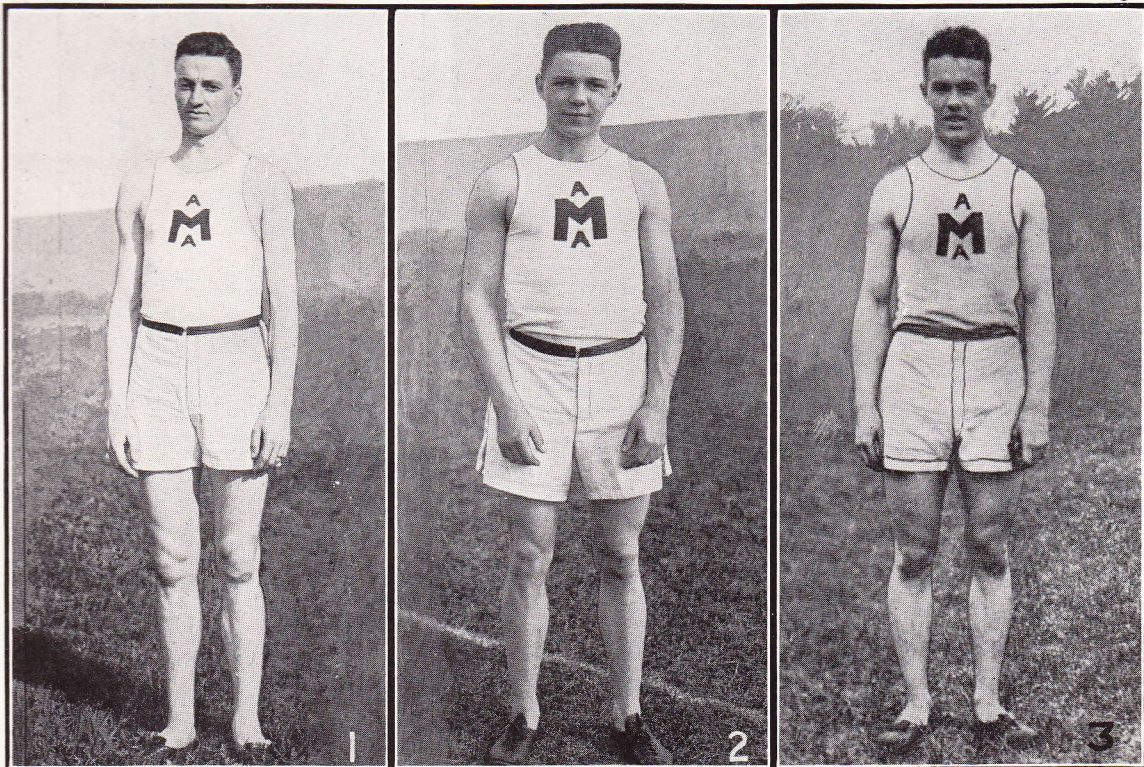


BOND, OF MICHIGAN, WINNING FINAL HEAT 100 YARDS DASH.

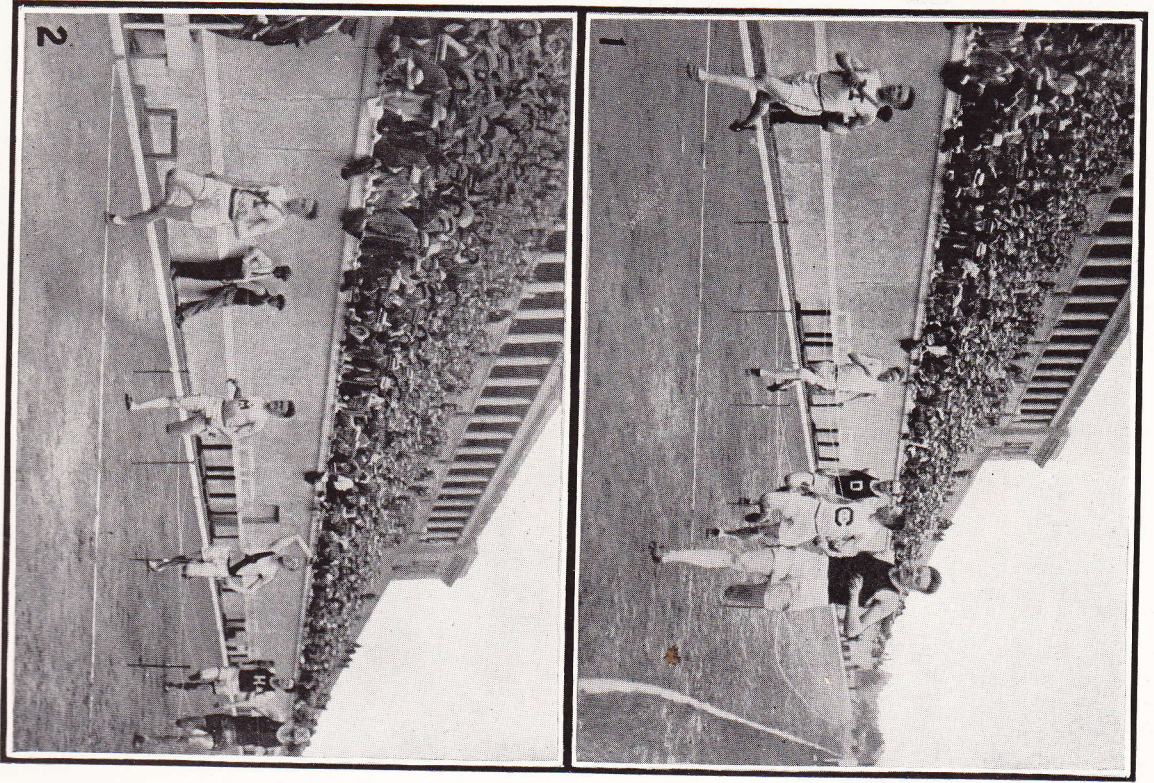

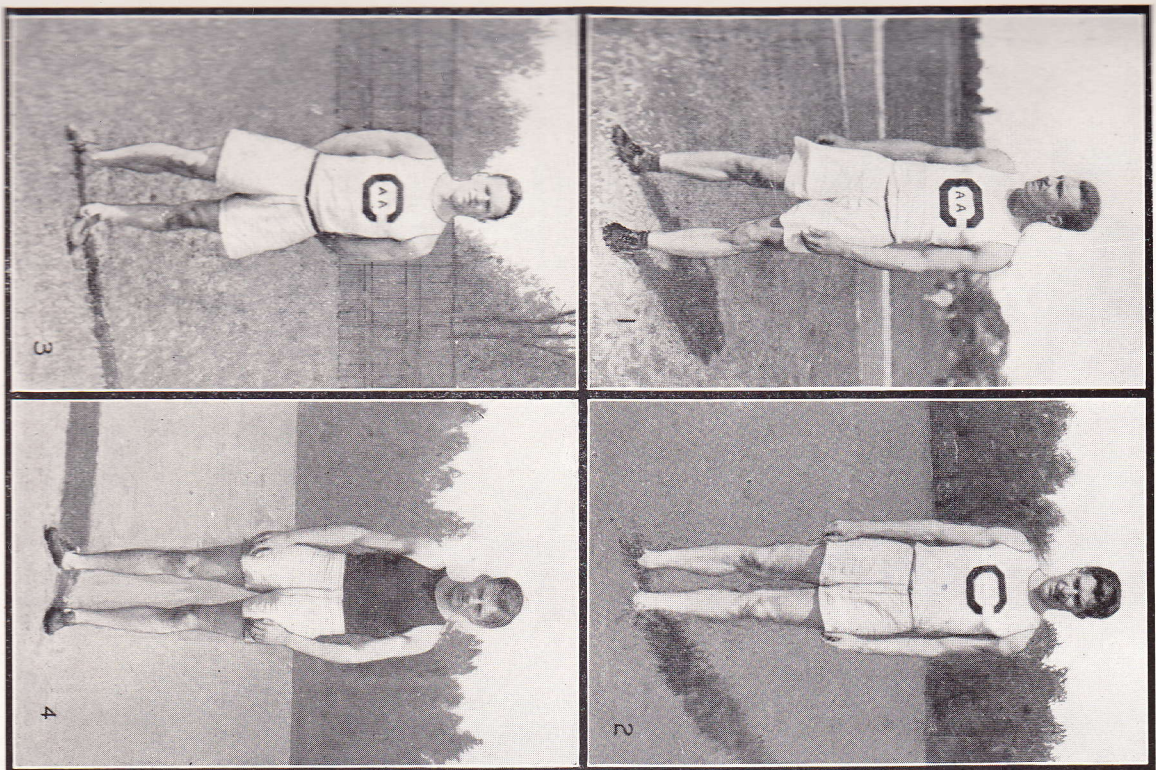

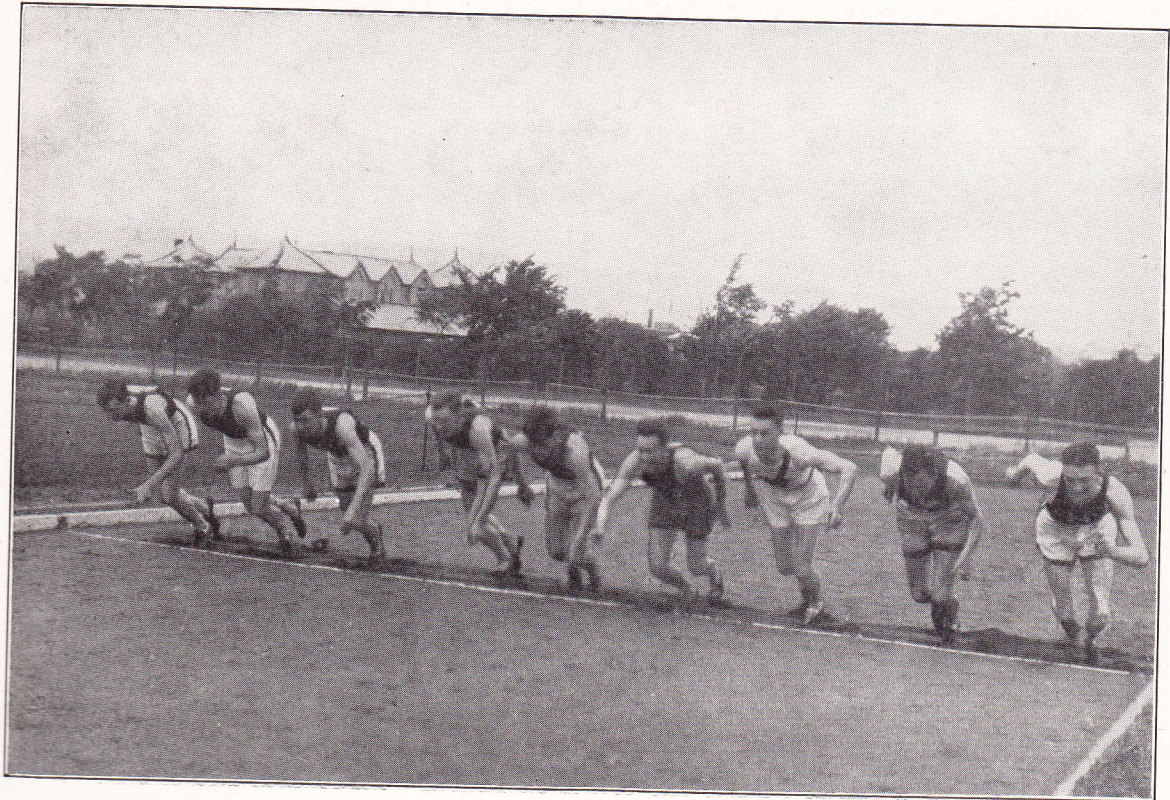

START FINAL HEAT, 440 YARDS DASH.

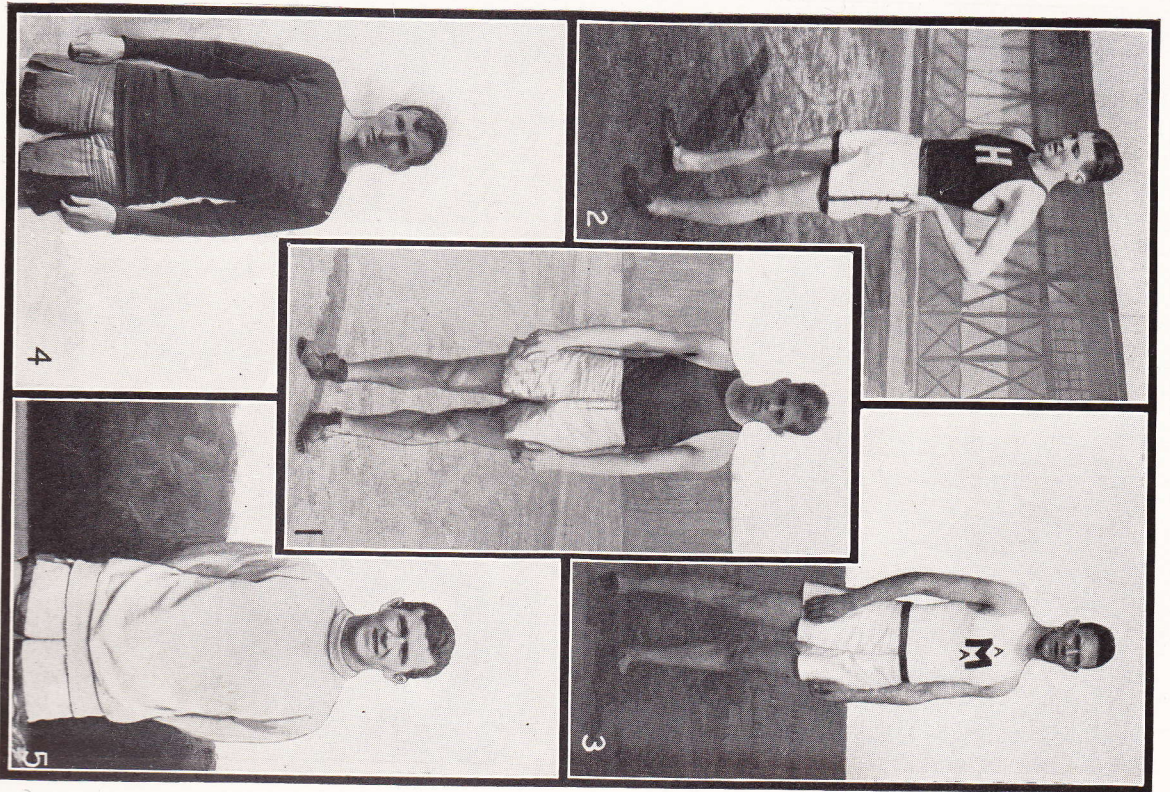

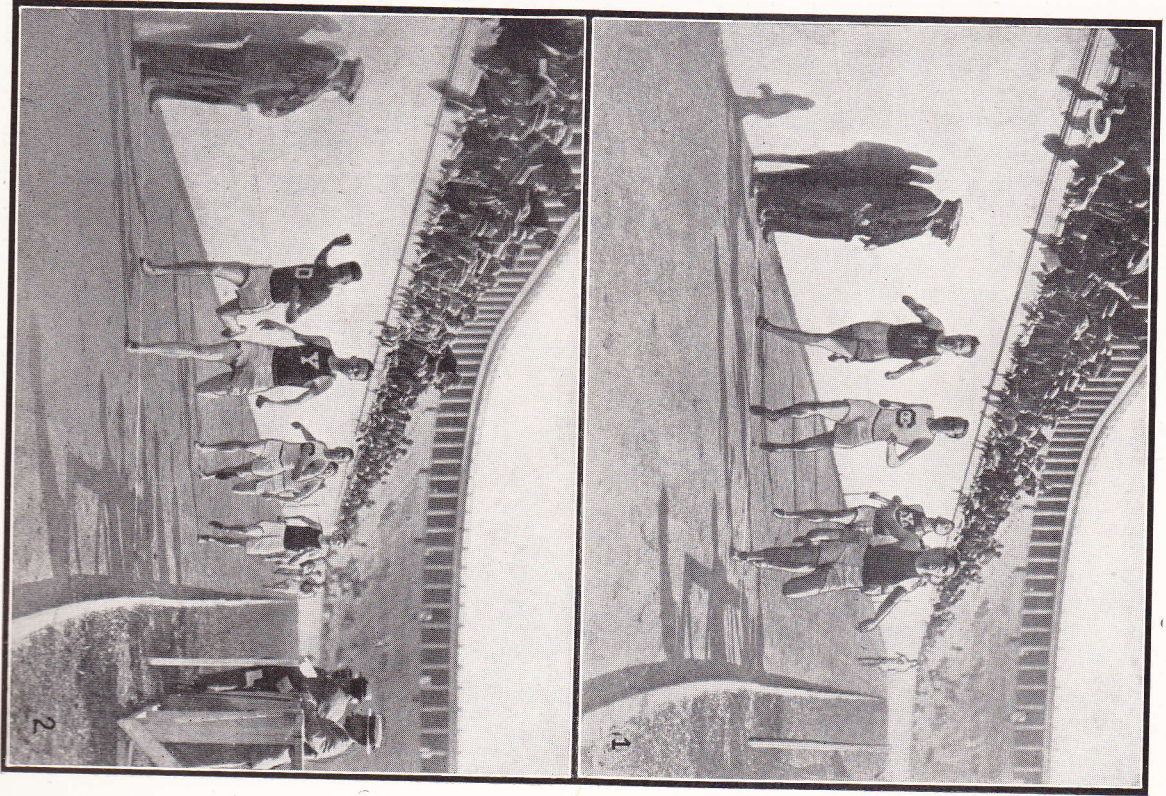

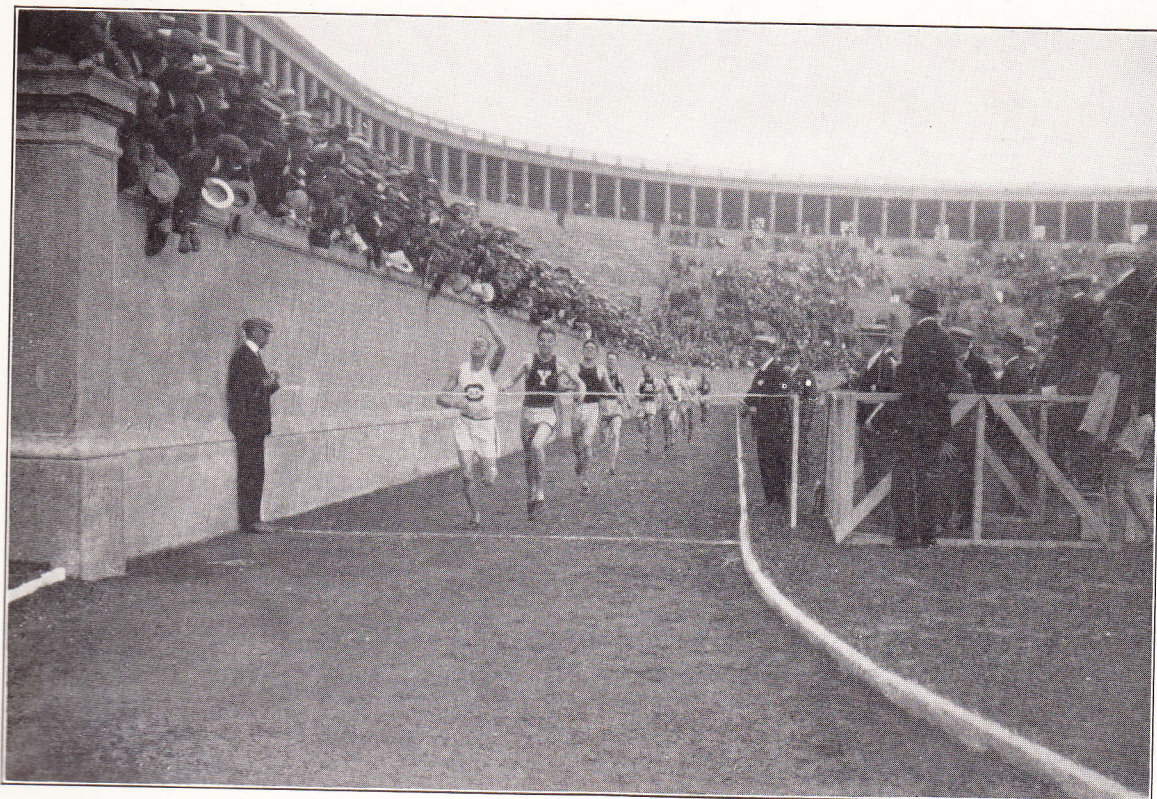

END FIRST QUARTER OF HALF MILE RUN.



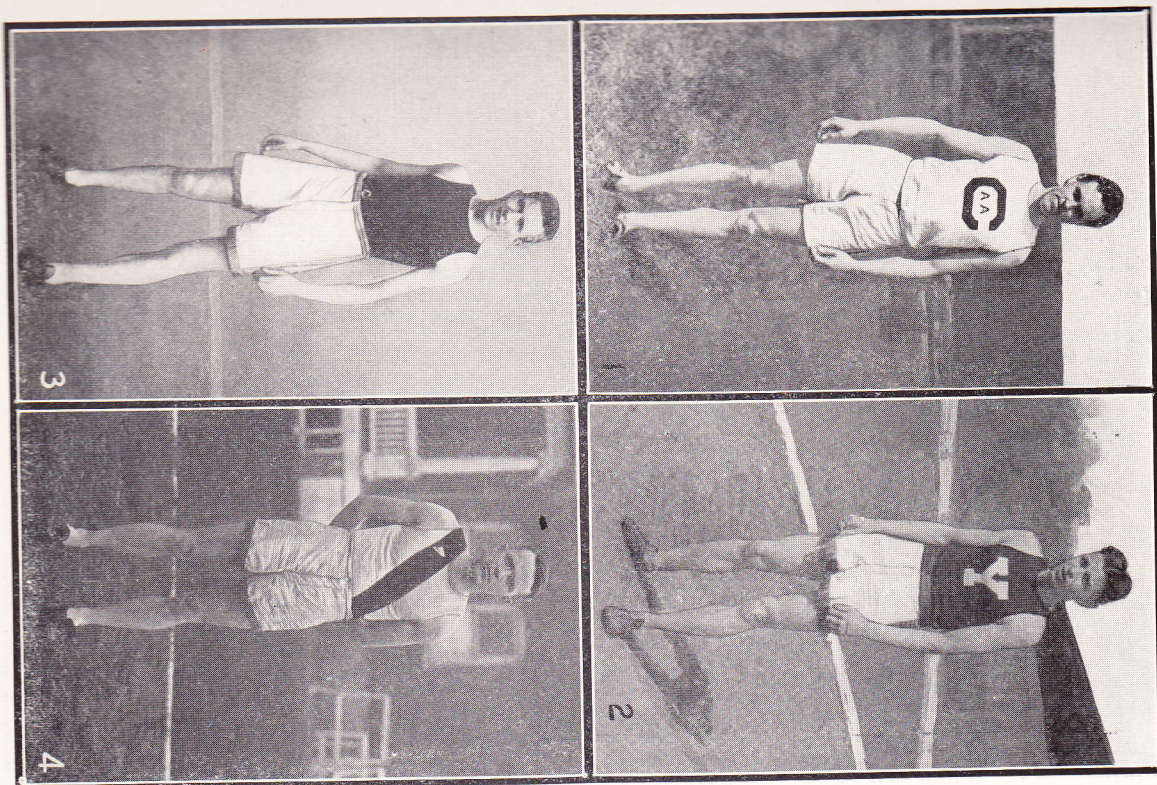

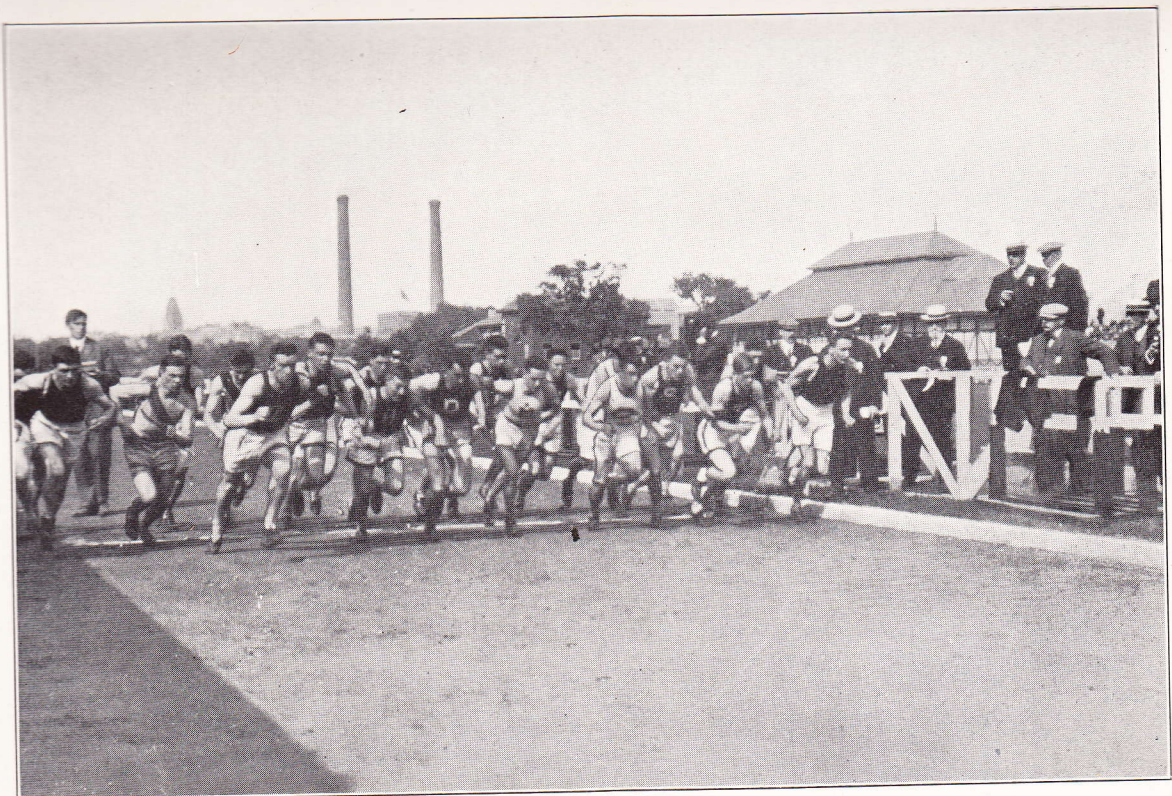

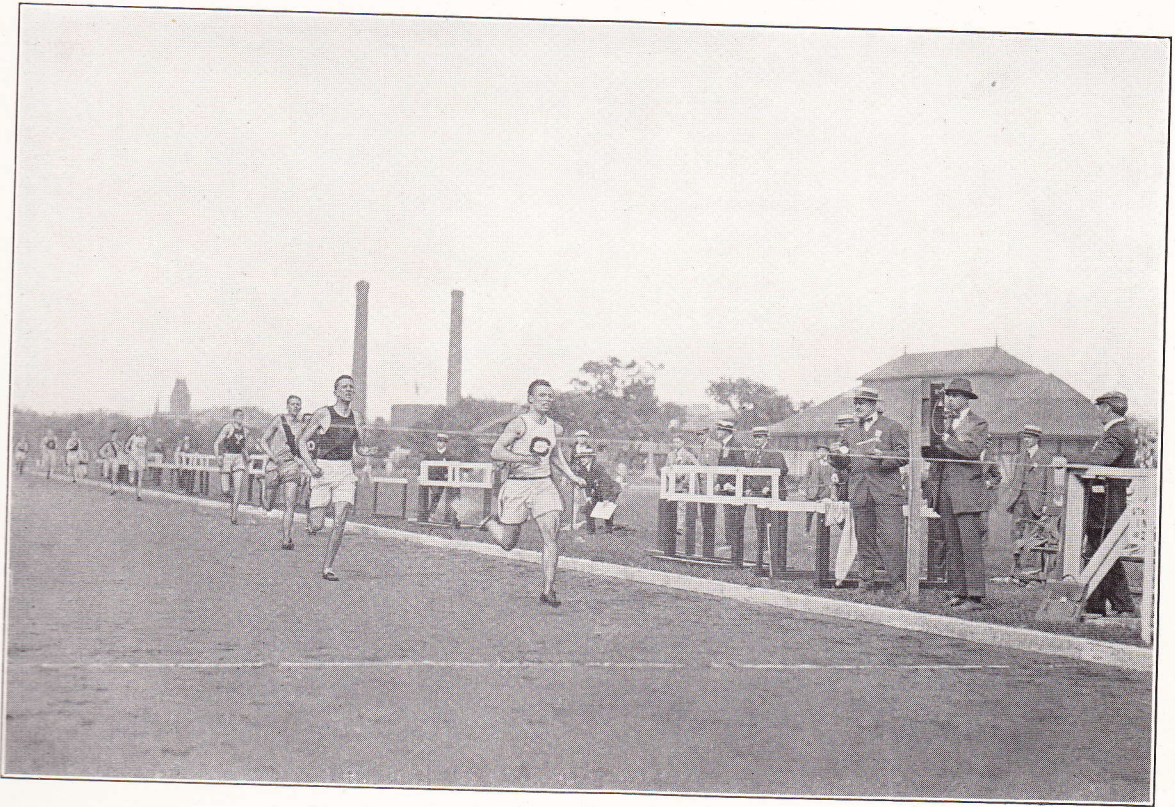

START OF ONE MILE RUN.



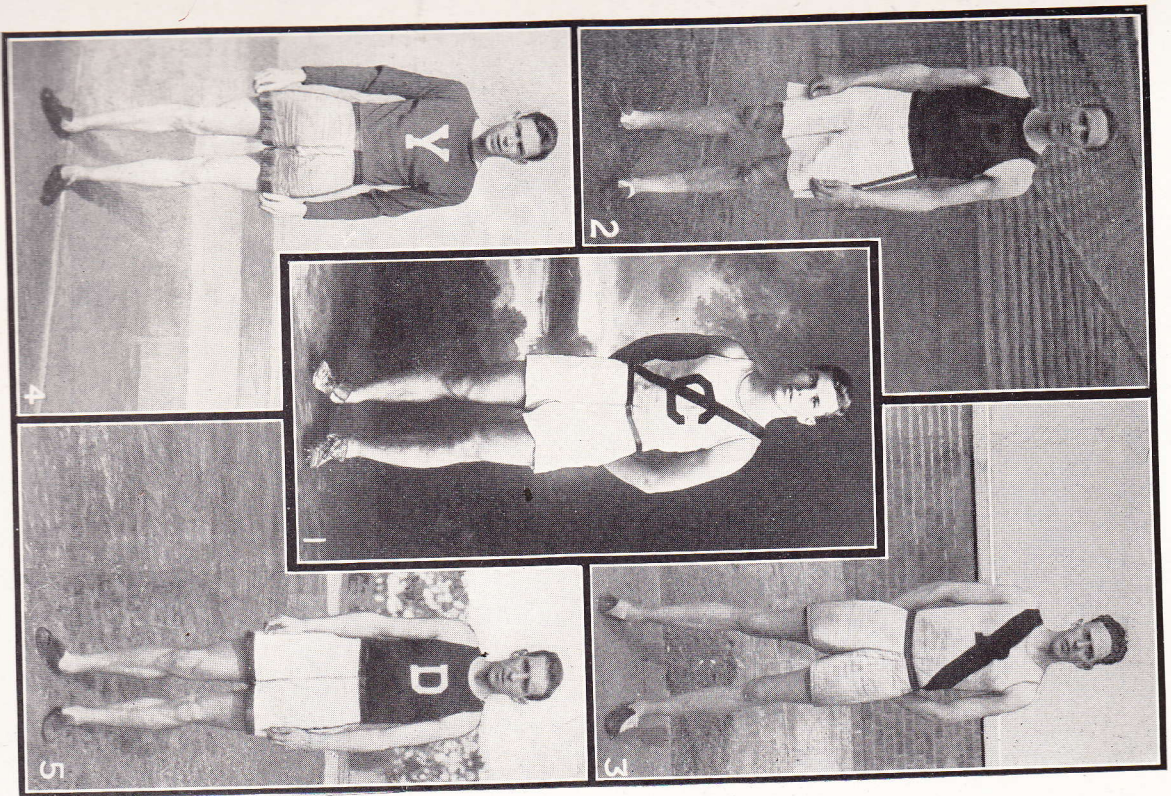

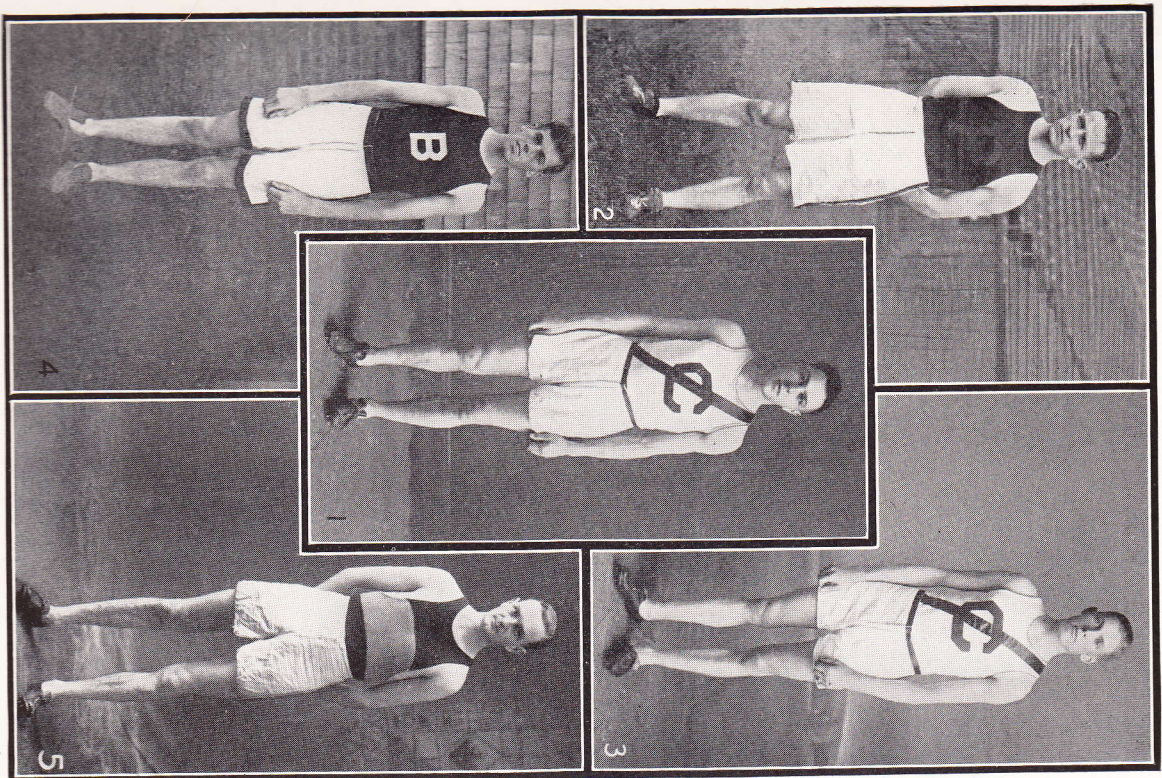

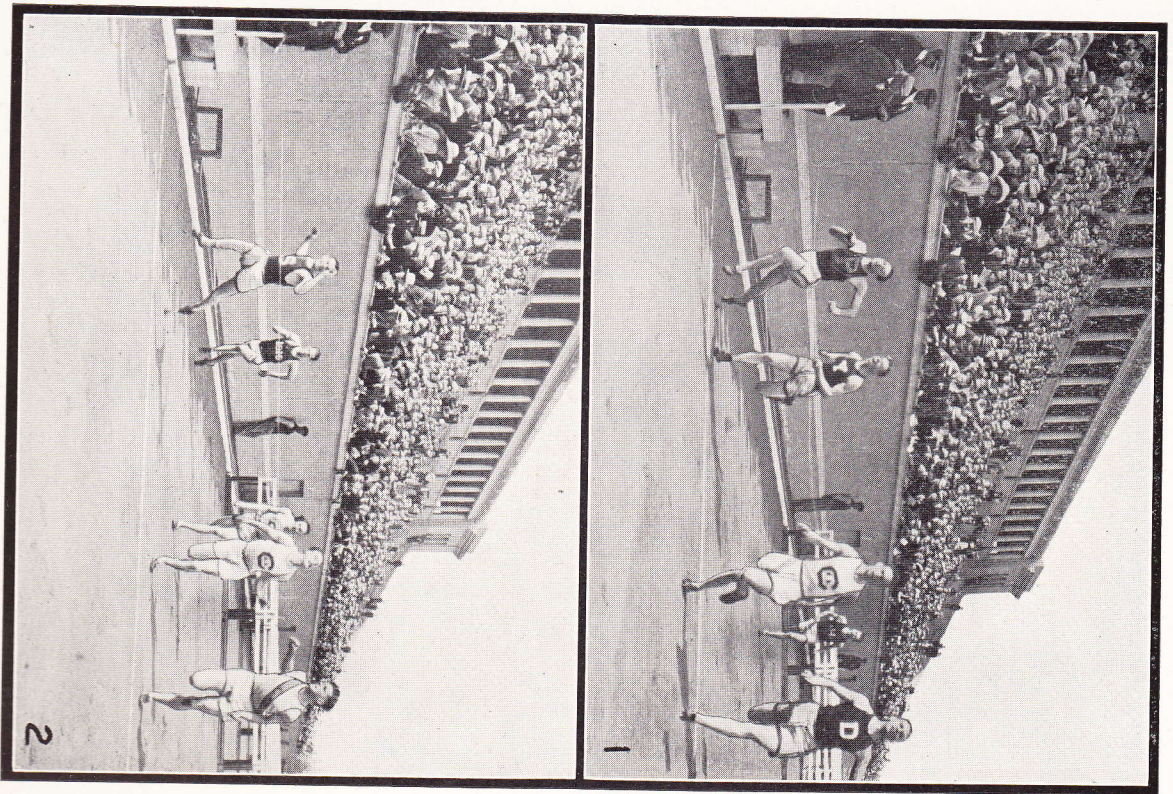

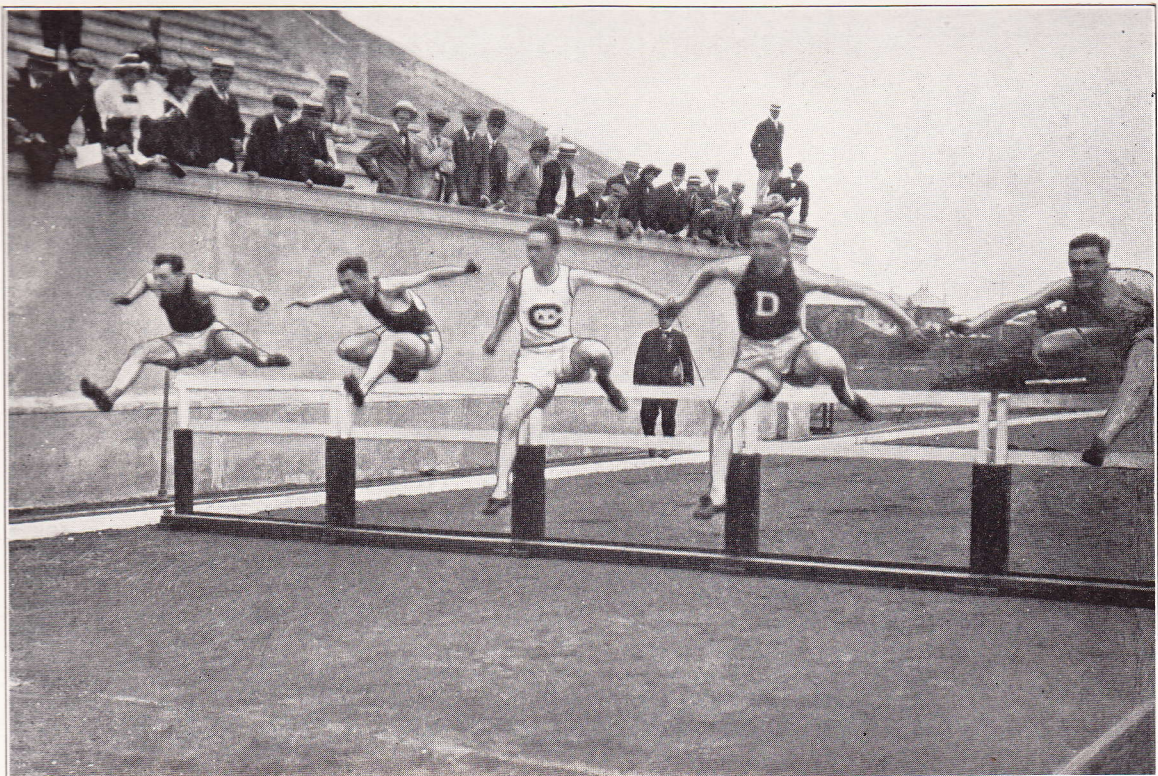

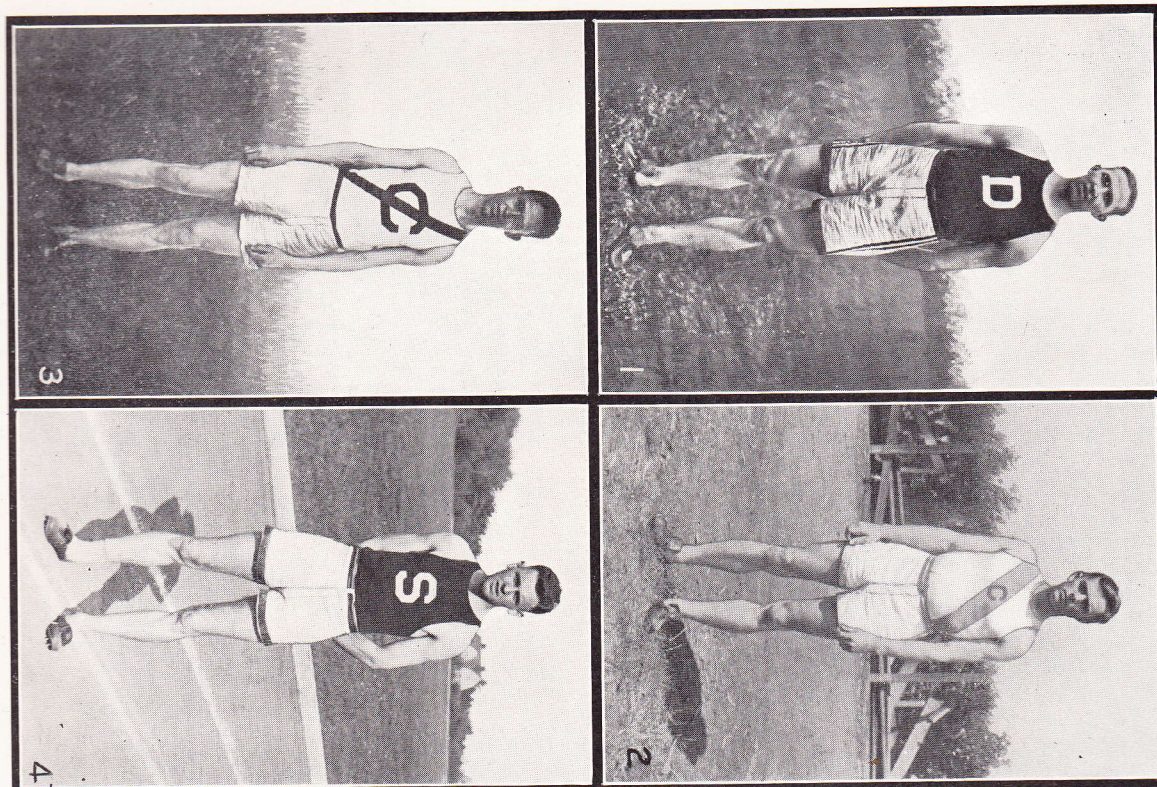

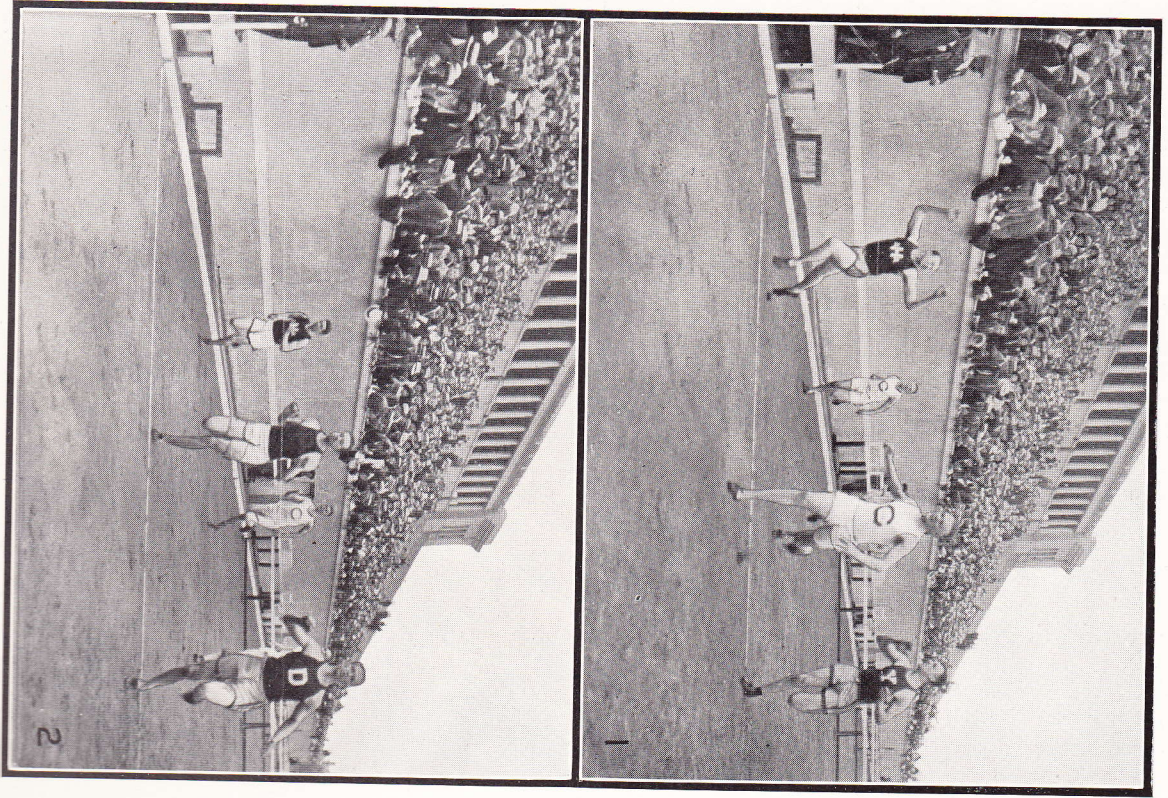

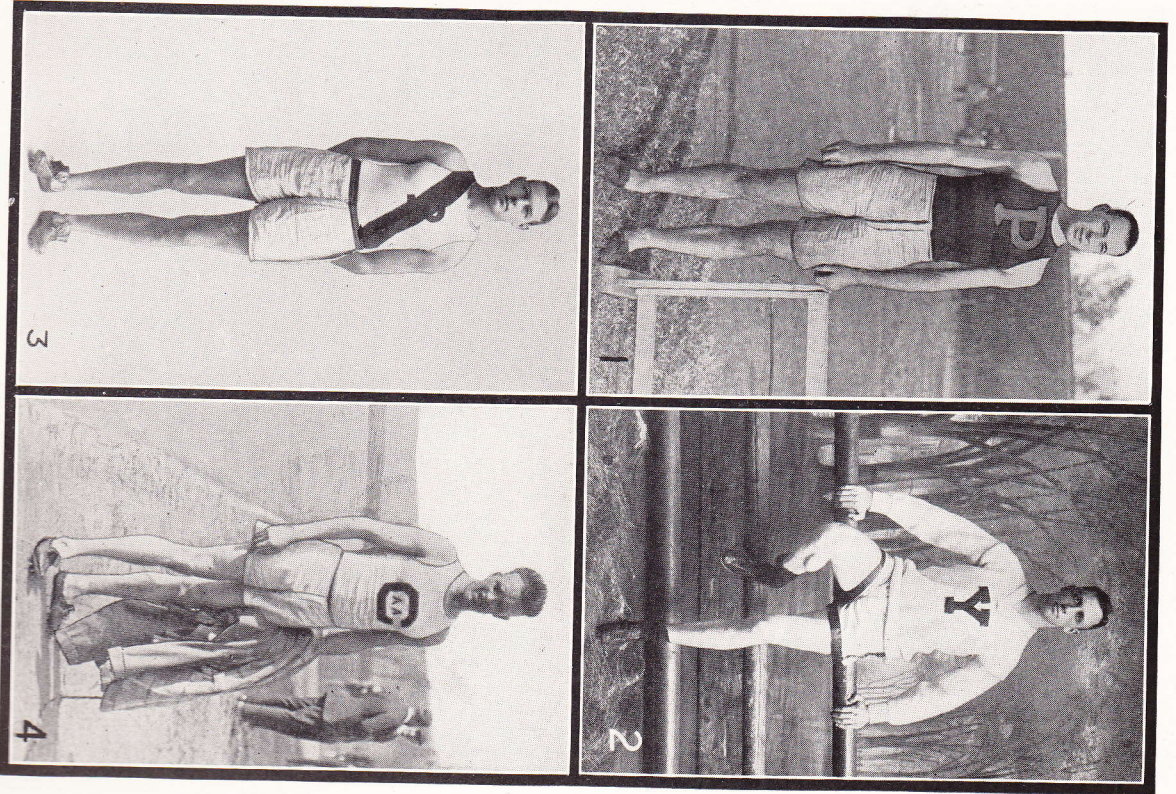

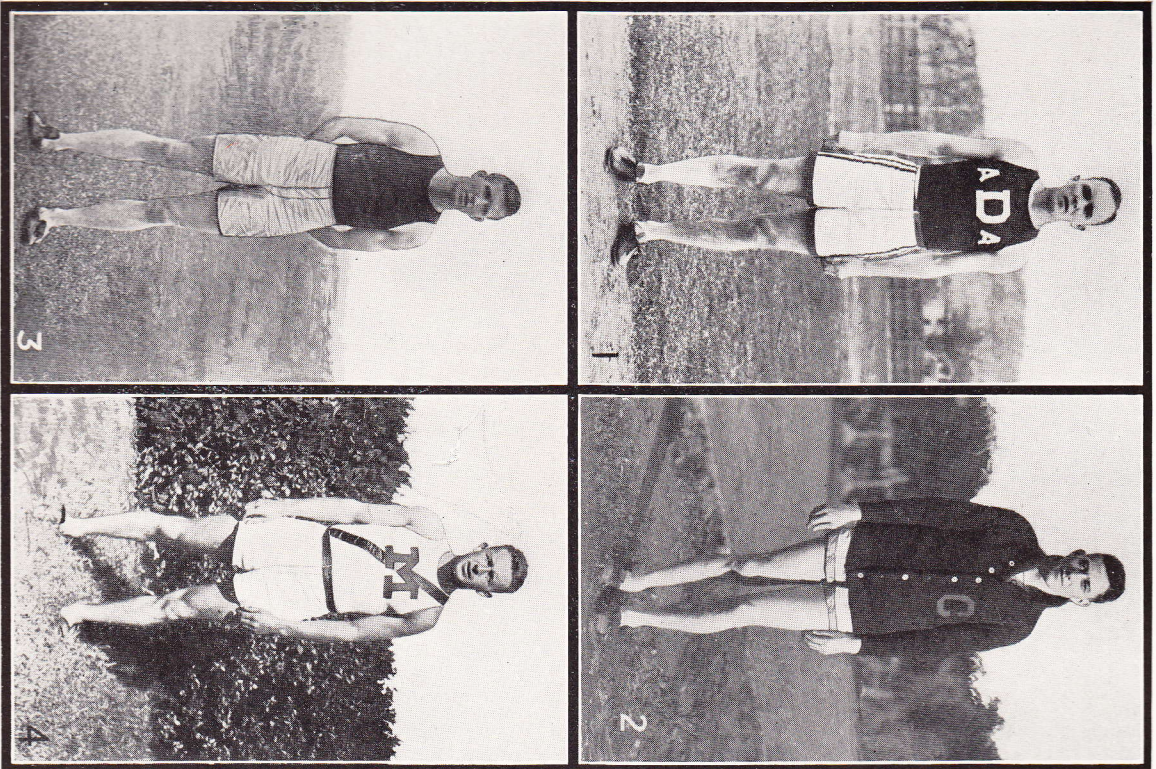

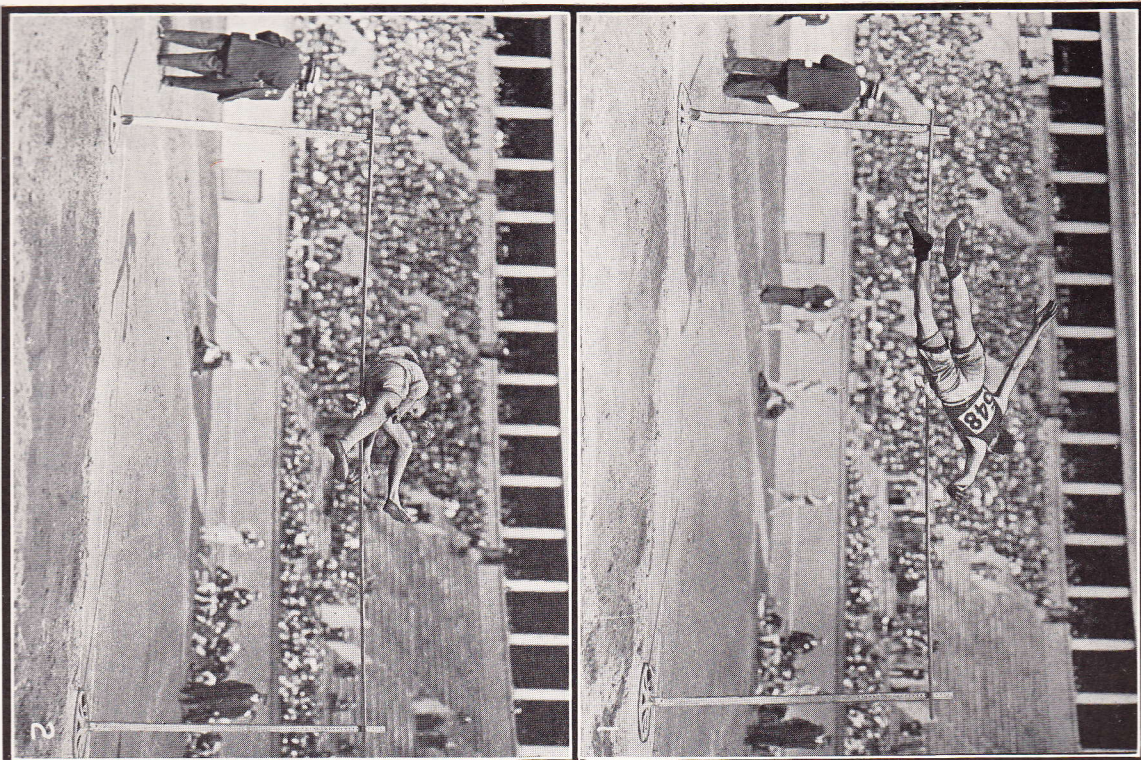

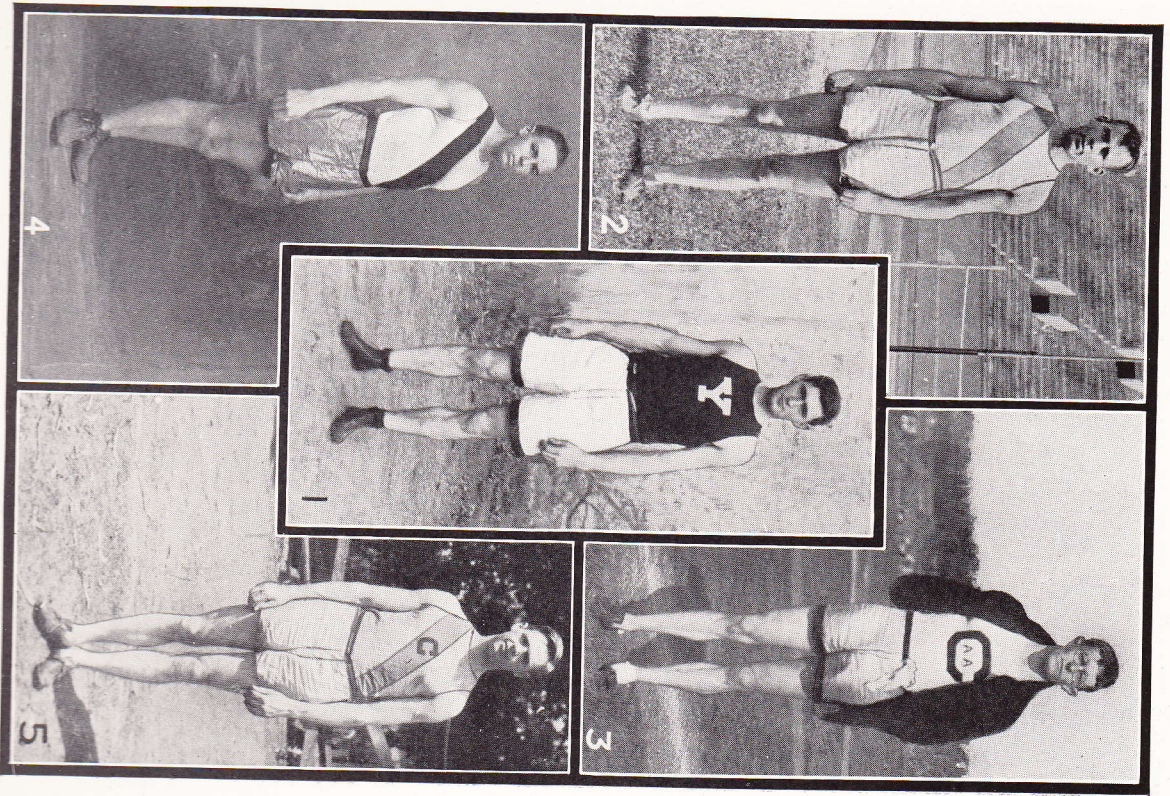

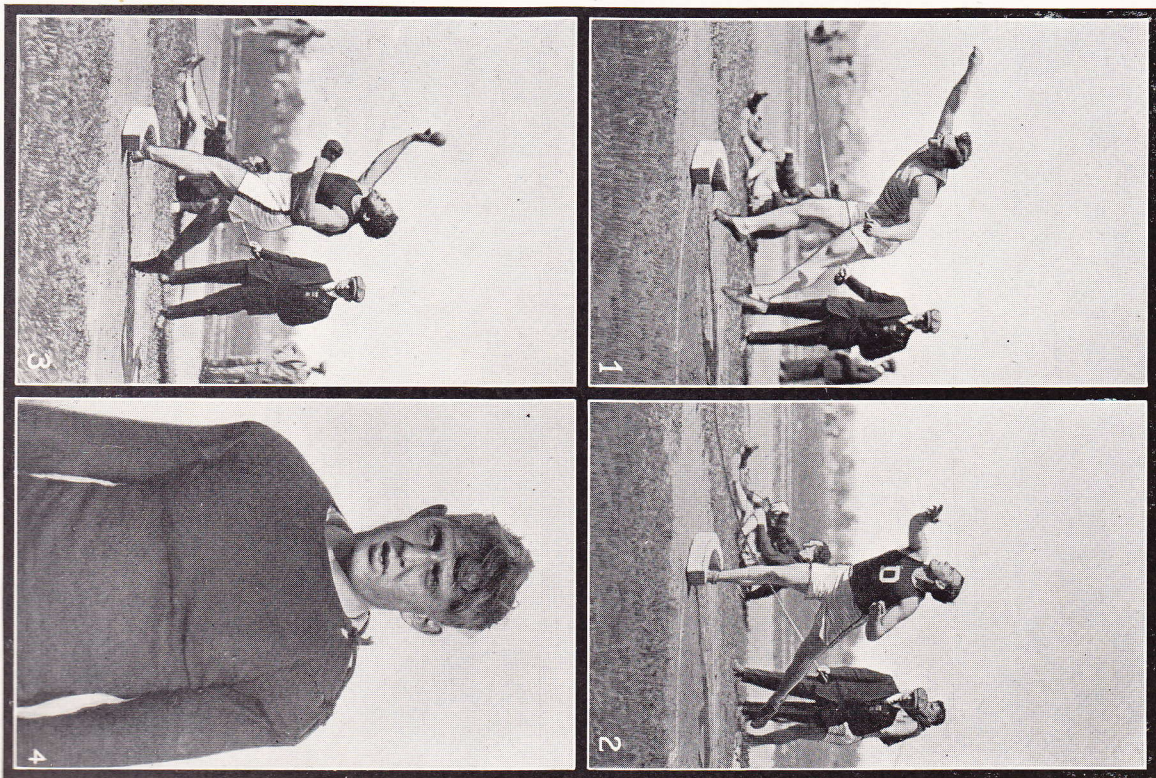
