

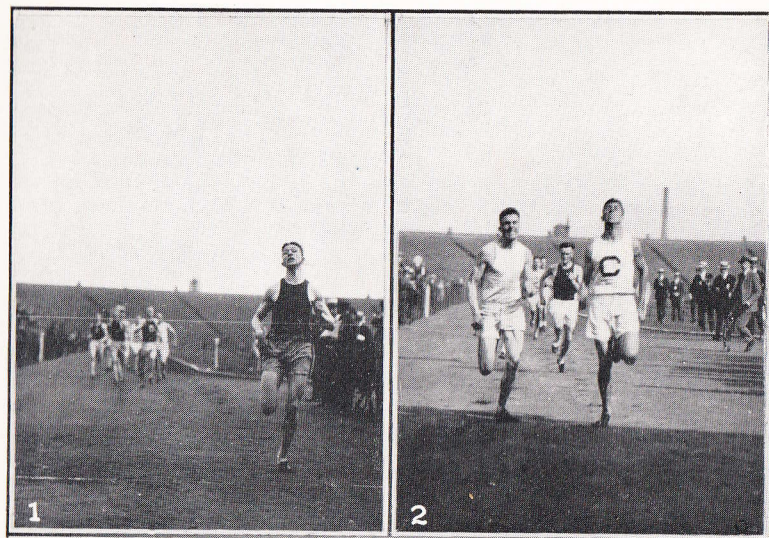

CORNELL, with an unusually well rounded team, was an easy victor in the meet which was held on Franklin Field, of the University of Pennsylvania, May 31 and June 1. The Ithacans scored in eight of the thirteen events, getting nearly all of their points in the middle distance runs, the two hurdles and the running broad jump. They took four of the five places in the 2-mile run and three of five in the running broad jump. The University of Pittsburgh was second with 30 points, Dartmouth third with 26, Princeton and Pennsylvania following in order with 19 and 18 each. This meet was hardly a fair intercollegiate test, for the reason that several institutions, on account of the war, made no serious effort to send full teams. Because of war conditions, several institutions also eliminated the one year residence rule from their eligibility code.

Although no records were broken, the standard of competition was unusually high. The most notable performance was that of Frank J. Shea, Pittsburgh, 1920, who won the quarter mile run in 47¾ seconds. This was only one-fifth of a second slower than the intercollegiate and world record set up in 1916. It should be noted, however, that the field of competitors for this event was so small that only seven men reported for the preliminary heats. In consequence the race was run in one heat on Saturday.

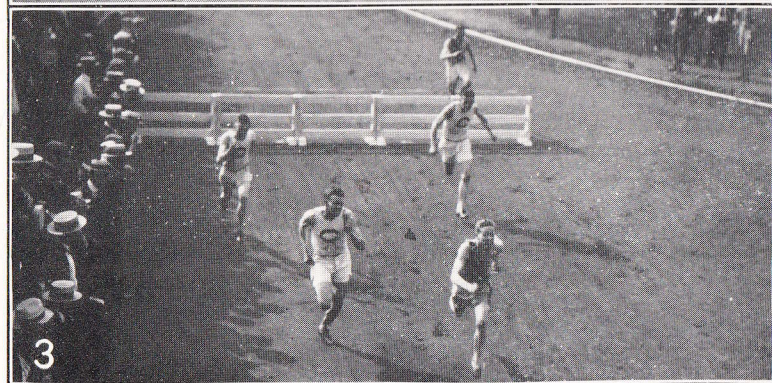
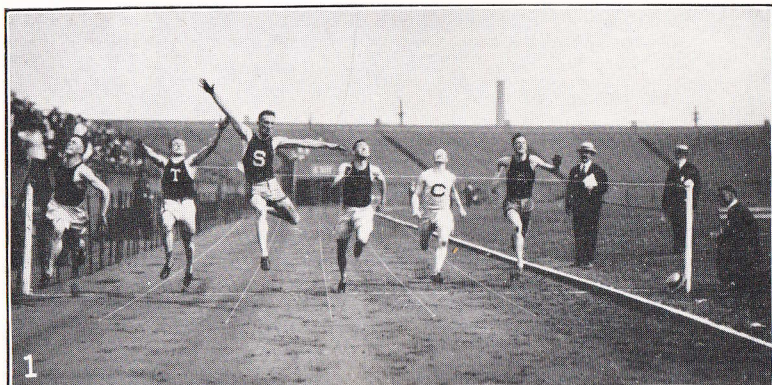

CONDITIONS were still considerably unsettled in 1919, but the Armistice had been signed and the colleges were doing everything in their power to restore conditions to normal. Cornell, with a team which was unusually strong in the middle and long distance runs, as well as the two hurdles, scored a comparatively easy victory. Pennsylvania was the runner up with a score of 29 points. Michigan, with a team which scored in seven events, was third with 25½. Harvard was fourth with 23.

One new intercollegiate record was established. This was in the 2-mile run, which Ivan C. Dresser, Cornell, 1919, won in 9 minutes 22⅔ seconds. Two other very good performances were those registered by W. C. Haymond, University of Pennsylvania, 1919, who won both the 100 and 220-yard dashes and K. A. Mayer, Cornell, 1920, who did the same for the quarter and half mile events. Walker Smith, Cornell, 1920, similarly was first in both hurdle races.

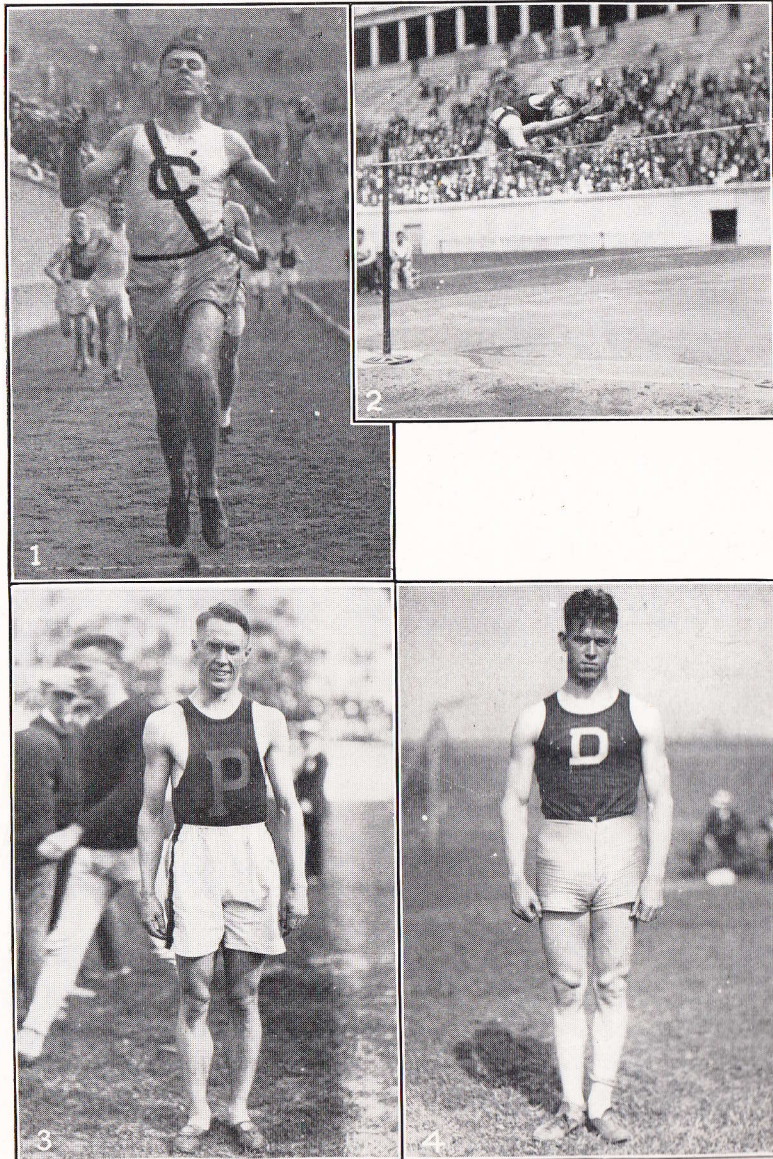

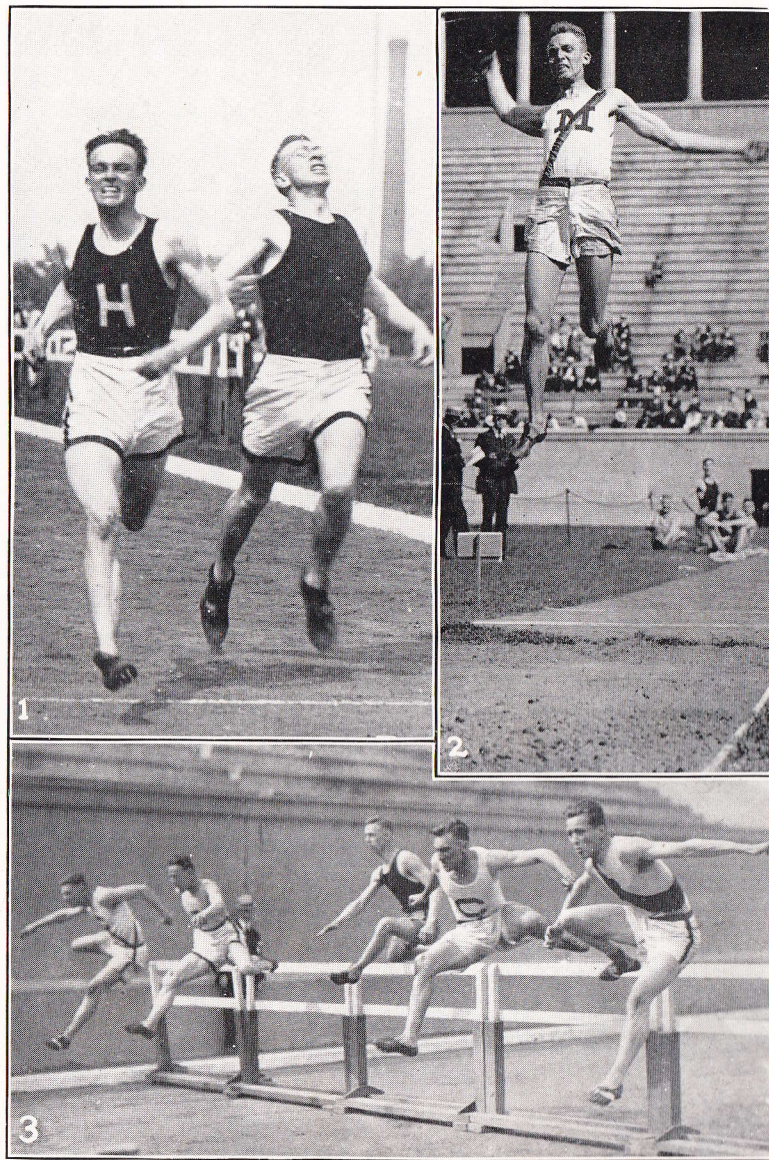

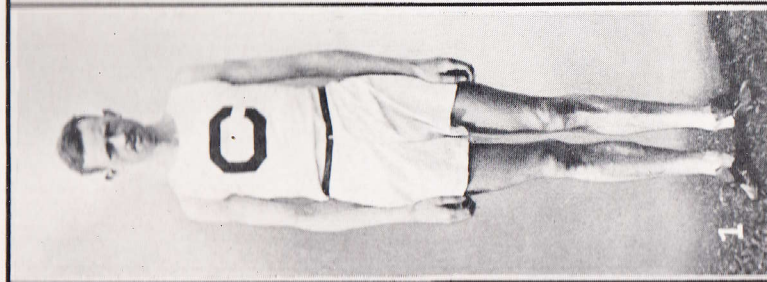

THE UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA won the forty-fourth championships after a close and spectacular fight with Princeton. Pennsylvania triumphed by scoring 30½ points, Princeton finishing second with 29. Dartmouth and Cornell were third and fourth with 24 and 20 points respectively. The meet was in doubt until the finish of the 220-yard dash, the final event on the program. Princeton outscored Pennsylvania in this event, but securing second place in this race gave Pennsylvania the necessary point and victory.

This meet was featured by E. J. Thomson, Dartmouth, 1921, who won the 120-yard hurdles in the world record time of 14⅔ seconds. The day and the track were absolutely perfect for record performances. Thomson was in front going over the first hurdle, and this lead he gradually increased until he was nearly three yards in advance of Walker Smith, Cornell, 1920, when he reached the last hurdle. So perfect was Thomson's form that he did not hit a single hurdle. His time bettered the previous inter-collegiate record by three-fifths of a second, made in 1916 by F. S. Murray, of Leland Stanford. It also bettered by two-fifths of a second the previous world record of 14⅔ seconds.

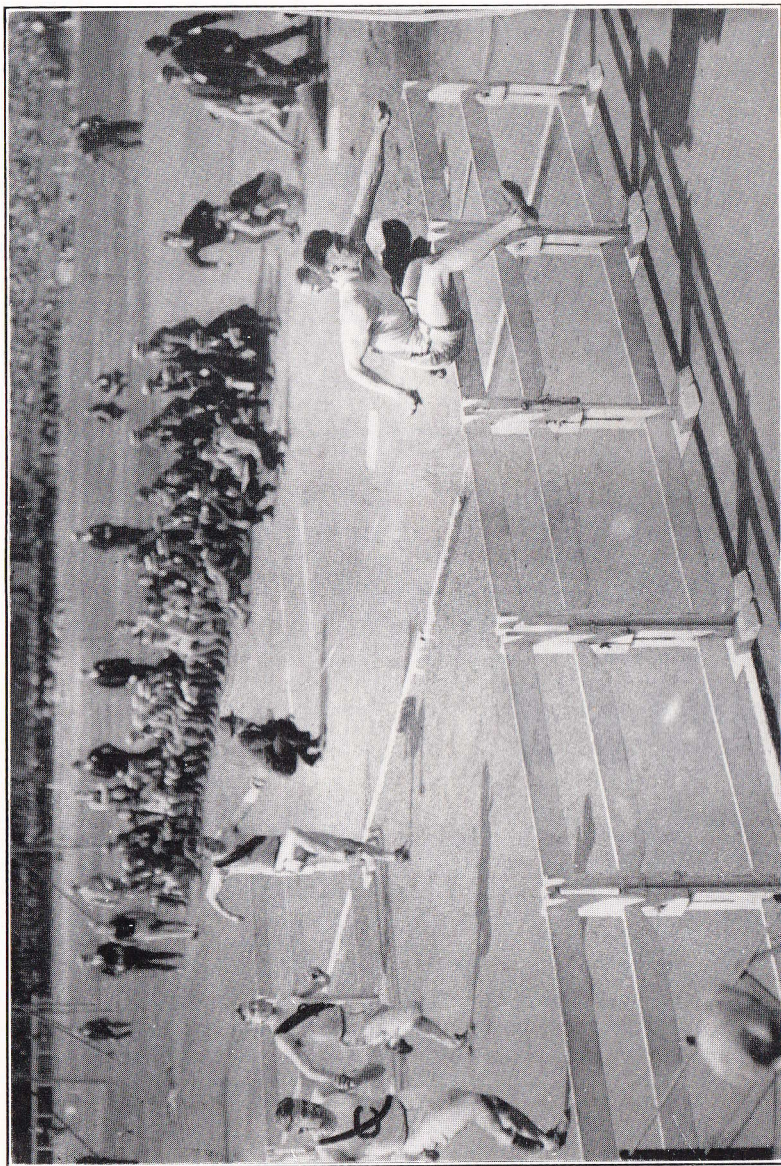

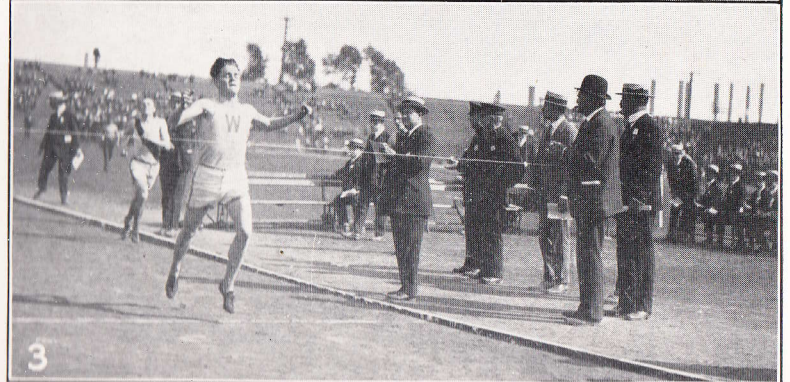

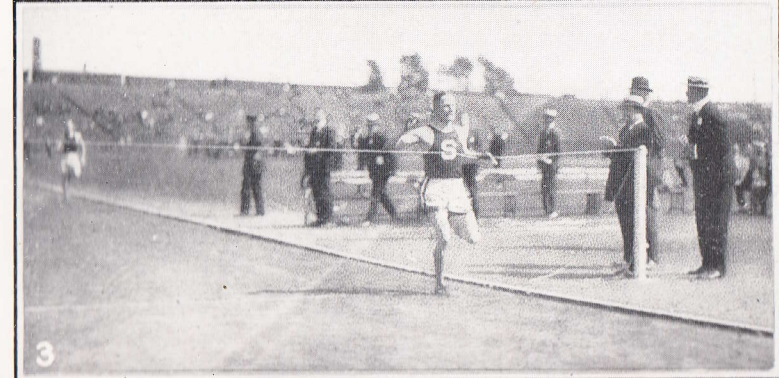

THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA distinguished itself by winning the forty-fifth annual championships at Soldiers' Field, Harvard University, May 27-28, 1921. It was not only the first victory for the California, but the first time that any team other than an eastern one had accomplished this. California won over Harvard by the narrow margin of one-half a point, their respective scores being 27½ and 27 points. Dartmouth was third with 23 points and Pennsylvania fourth with 18½. Leland Stanford, also from the state of California, was fifth.

A dramatic touch was given to this meet, because Harvard was leading by 2½ points when the final heat of the 220-yard dash started. The California entry, R. A. Hutchinson, 1921, was obliged to finish in at least third place to give his team victory by the margin of half a point. This was precisely what he did, for he was beaten only by Woodring of Syracuse and LeConey of Lafayette. By finishing third his team managed to win by this narrowest of margins. While no records were broken, several notable performances were recorded. Worthy of special mention was the work of Allen Woodring of Syracuse in the 220-yard dash which he won in 21½ seconds.

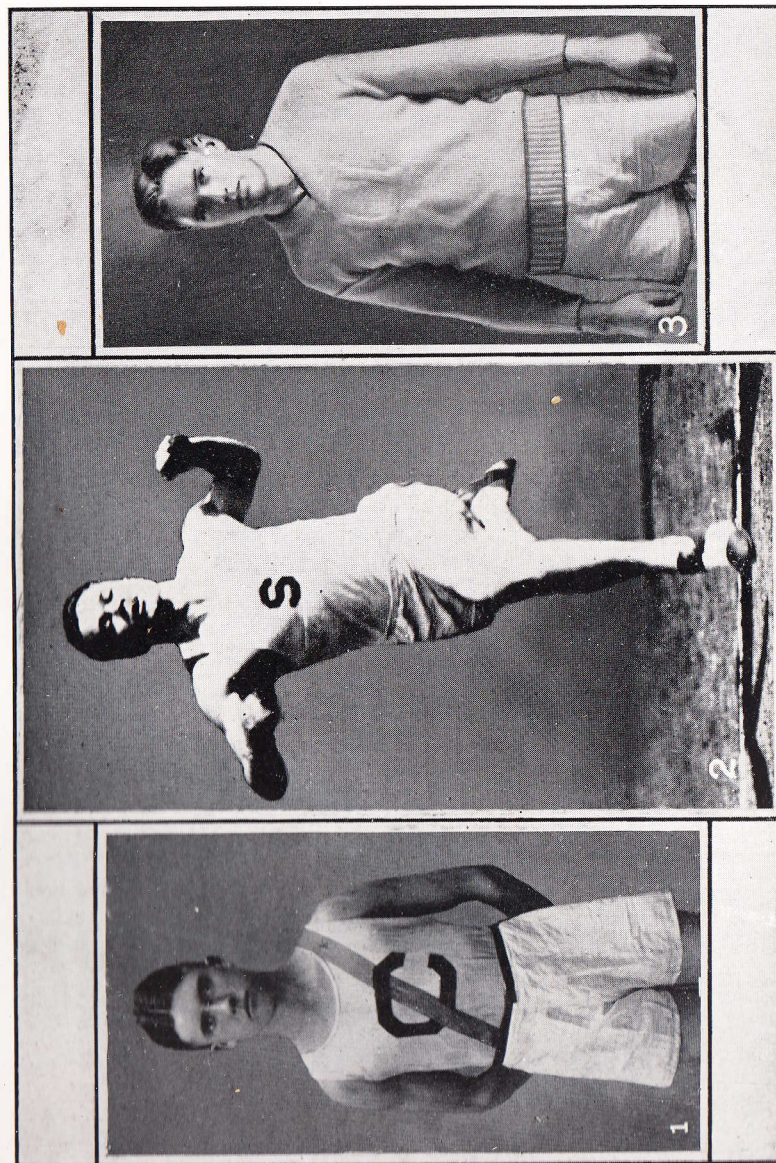

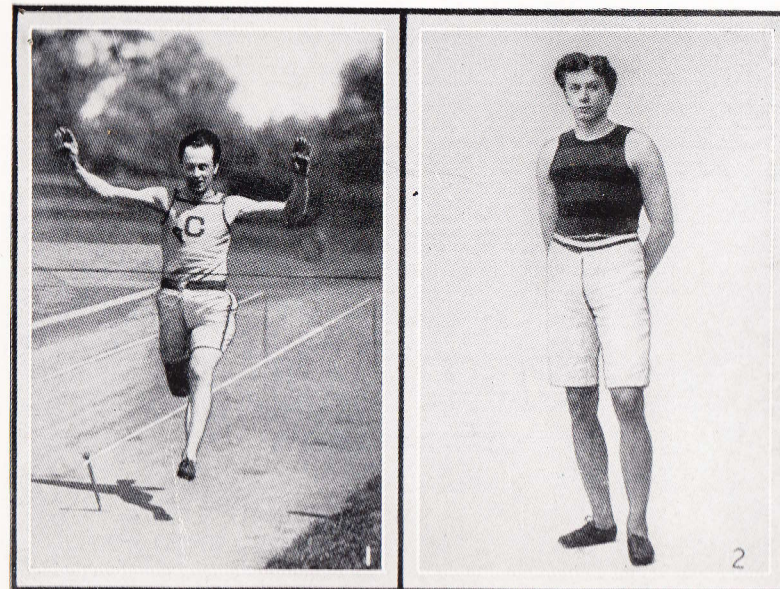
