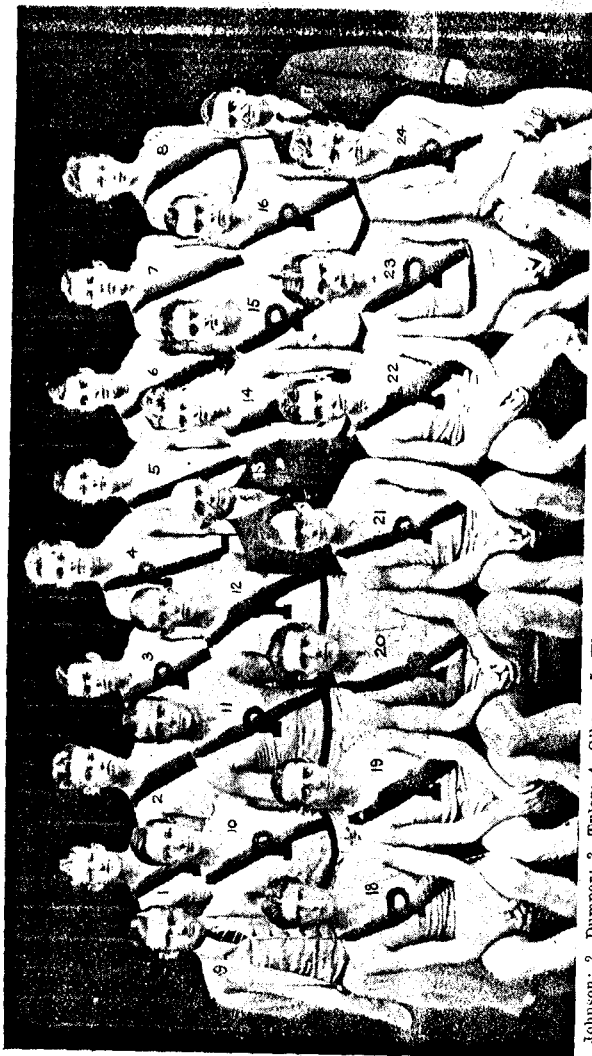

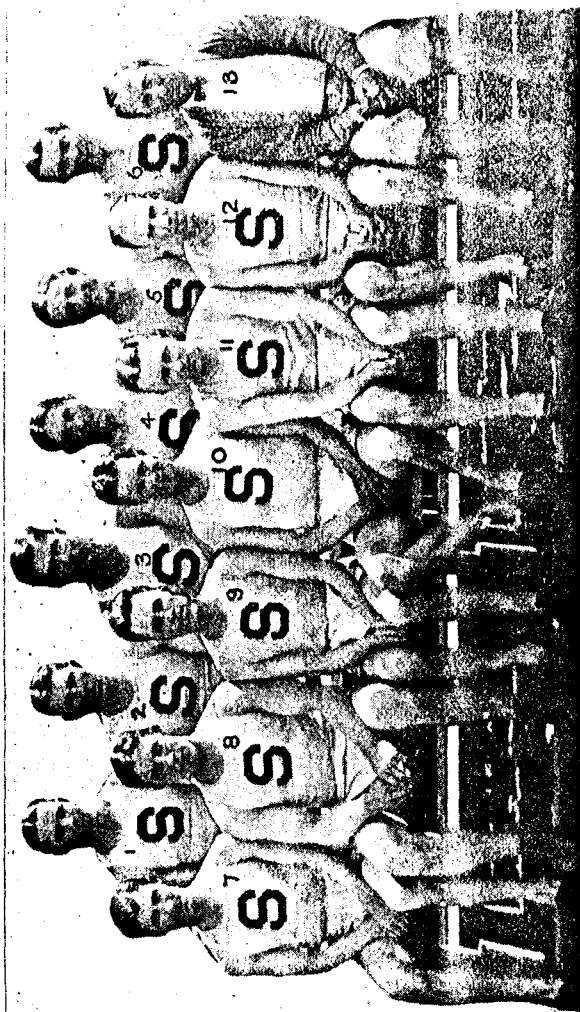

The report of Richard J. Kearns, the Undergraduate Manager of the Meet, shows a net profit of \$5,578.88; and the Treasurer reports that the balance to the credit of the Association on March 1, 1924, amounts to \$9,980.21.

Owing to the graduation from Yale of Mr. John N. Pharr, President of the Association, it became necessary for the Executive Committee to select a new President under the provisions of Article IX of the Constitution; and at a meeting of the said Committee held on October 14, 1923, at the Columbia University Club, New York, Mr. Edward M. Greene Jr. of Yale was duly elected President of the Association, in place and stead of Mr. Pharr, resigned.

The Executive Committee, pursuant to Article XVII of the Constitution, selected Mr. Gustavus T. Kirby to be referee of the Fifteenth Annual Cross-Country Run, and, in accordance with the same Article, selected Mr. Charles W. Crawford of Columbia to act as Manager of the Run.

The Executive Committee, pursuant to Article XIX of the Constitution, selected Mr. Gustavus T. Kirby to act as referee of the Second Annual Indoor Championship Meeting of the Association, and, in accordance with the same Article, selected Mr. Abbot Southall to act as Manager of the said Meet.

FIFTEENTH ANNUAL 'VARSITY AND FOURTH ANNUAL FRESHMAN CROSS-COUNTRY RUNS.

The Fifteenth Annual Varsity and the Fourth Annual Freshman Cross-Country Runs were held on November 26, 1923, under excellent weather conditions, over the new course as laid out by the Association. This course has been generally commended and the Park Department of the City of New York plans to monument it with permanent markers. The Amateur Athletic Union championships and the Olympic trials are now held over this course.

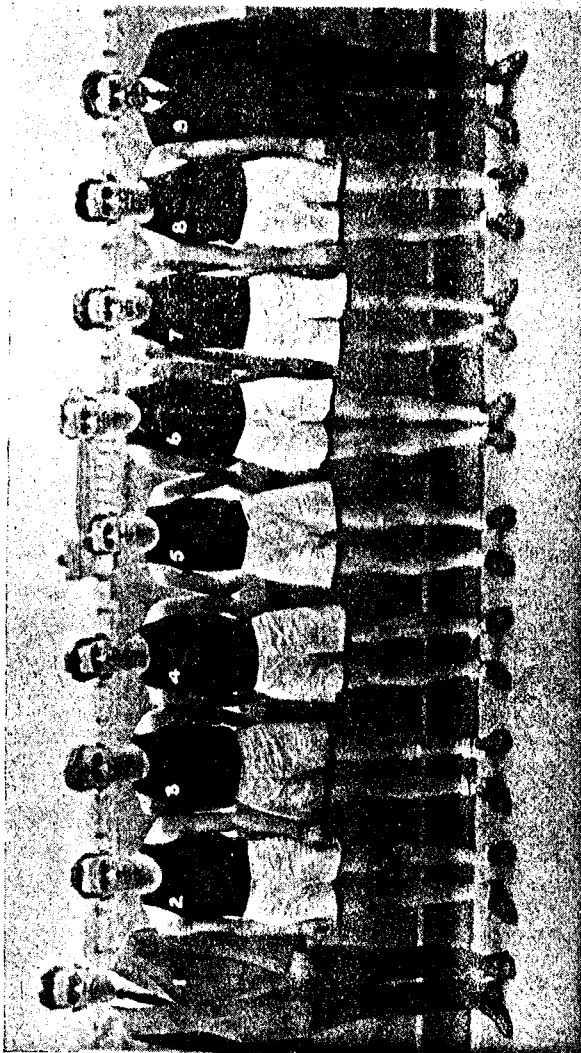
The Varsity individual championship was won by Verne H. Booth, Johns Hopkins, '24. Howard E. Dykeman, Carnegie Tech, '24, was second and H. W. Raymond, Maine, '24, was third. The course is six miles long.

The Varsity team championship was won by Syracuse with 58 points, Columbia was second with 66 points and Harvard third with 100 points.

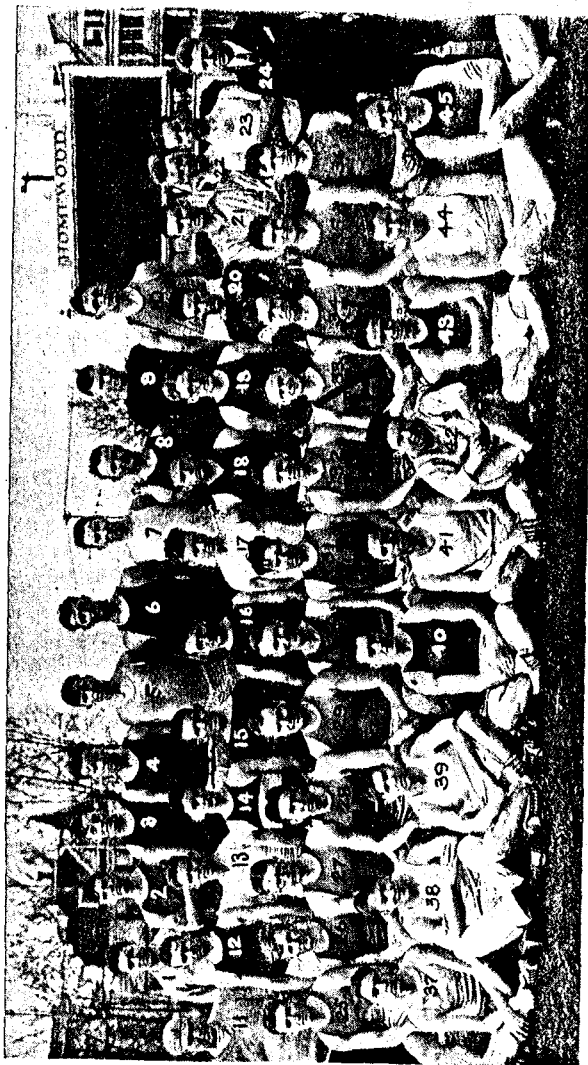

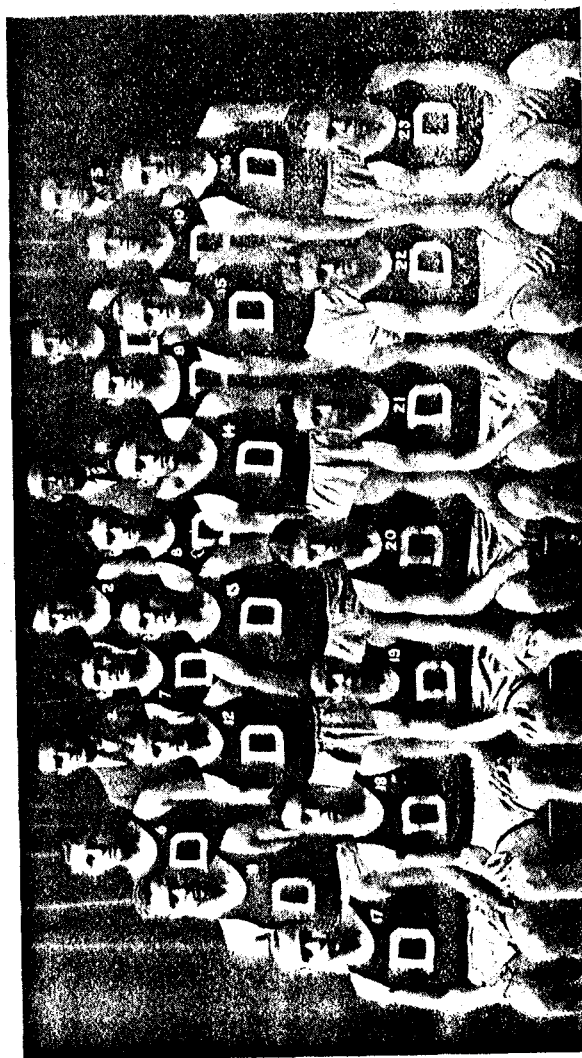

lishment of this central office the Executive Committee created a salaried position of Assistant to the President, who shall be available at all times not only to have charge of the central office but to establish and maintain suitable records and publications of the Association and to assist the various officers of the Association. Mr. James A. Taylor of Columbia has been secured as Assistant to the President.

The question of the publications of the Association has been given much thought by this Committee and a subcommittee composed of Messrs. Kirby, Thomas, Bushnell, Magrath and Taylor has reported advising the very great enlargement of the Handbook and the continuation of the Souvenir Volume, which shall be published and distributed under the co-operation and direction of Mr. Bushnell and the Assistant to the President. The Subcommittee also recommends the discontinuance of printed minutes and the distribution of mimeographed minutes in place thereof, and, that there be issued from time to time, as occasion requires, a news bulletin of convenient and uniform size and shape suitable for binding in permanent form, which bulletin shall contain:

1. Summaries of matters passed upon by the Executive Committee.
2. Reports of Meets.
3. Communications to members.
4. Matters of interest to members.
5. Important articles of interest to athletes and to members.

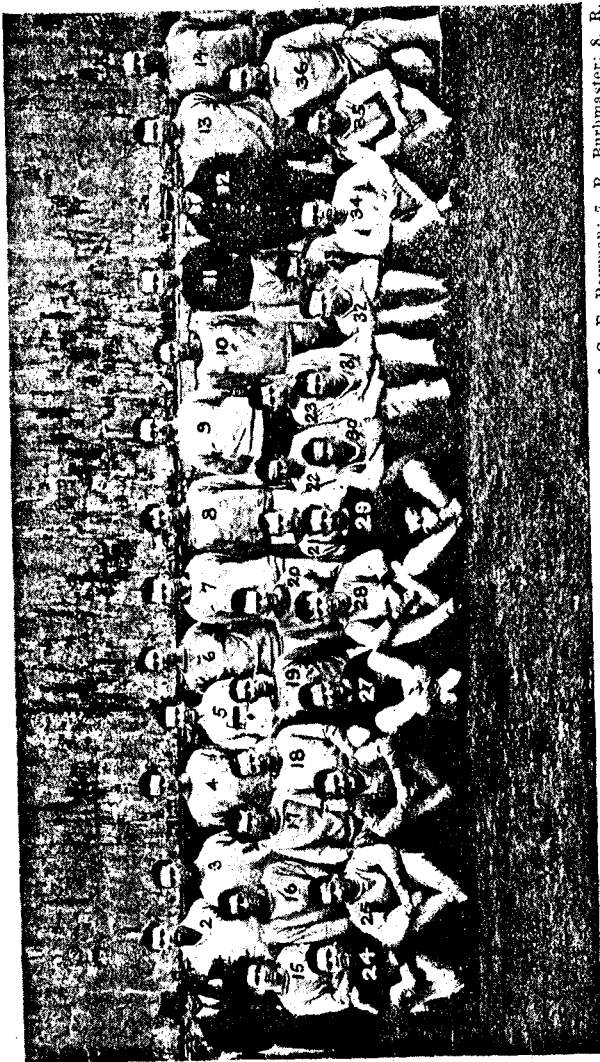
It is believed that after a little experience with a bulletin of this description a practical and valuable information service will result.

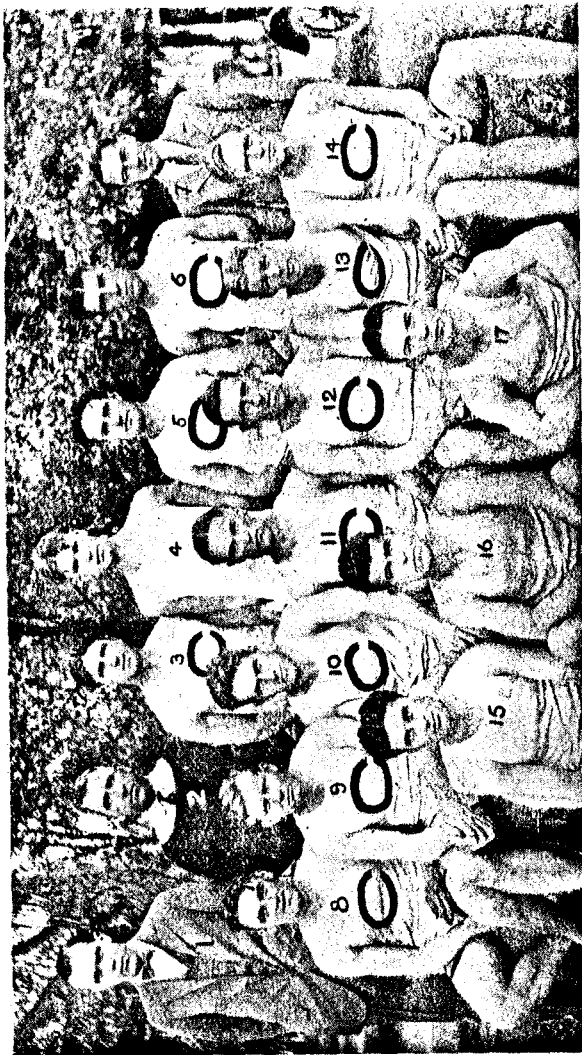

The exhibition of the film Saturday morning showed that the judges were in error and their decision as to the second place was reversed. 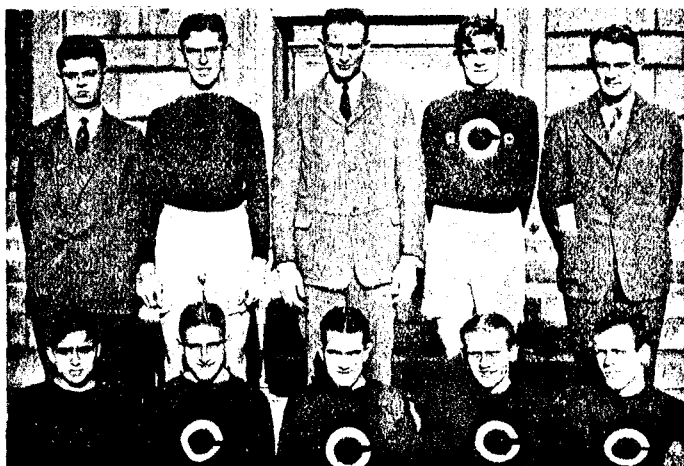

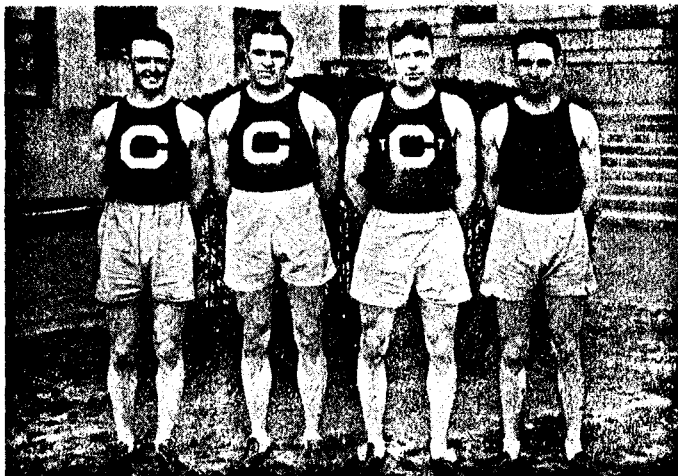

**THIRD ANNUAL INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIP
ATHLETIC MEETING.**

The Third Annual Indoor Championship Athletic Meeting was held in the One Hundred and Second Engineers' Armory, New York City, March 1, 1924. The University of Pennsylvania won for the second time with 21 1-3 points. Princeton and Yale tied for second with 20 points each. The competition was exceedingly keen. Two records were broken, the two-mile run by Verne Booth, Johns Hopkins, '24, run in 9m. 36s., and the shot put by Ralph G. Hills, Princeton, '25, with a put of 46ft. 3-4in. A new record was established in the 70-yard high hurdles, a new event, by Charles H. Moore, Penn State, '26, by winning the first heat in 9 seconds. Three contestants—Kenneth P. Libbey, Dartmouth, '25, Benjamin M. Owen, Pennsylvania, '25, and Sylvan S. Scholpp, Yale, '24, equalled the pole vault record by vaulting 12ft. 6in. In two events the winners came within 1-10th of a second of the record, and in the two-mile relay the dropping of a baton prevented a record. In this race George Marsters, Georgetown, '25, was unofficially credited with 1:54.4 for the half.

ANALYSIS OF UNITED STATES TEAM IN OLYMPIC COMPETITION.

The accompanying table (on following page) shows some interesting facts about the composition of and results secured by the United States team in the 1924 Olympic Games.

One hundred fifteen athletes composed the track and field team, which scored 254 points as against 166 by Finland, its nearest competitor. Of this team, 50 or 43.48% were athletes from members of the I.C.A.A.A. These men scored 125 $\frac{1}{16}$ points or 49.2782% of all the points scored by the team. Of these 50, all but eight were matriculated students of their colleges at the time of participation in the sports, and the eight men were recent graduates.

Thirty-seven athletes represented colleges other than I.C.A.A.A. members and scored 91 $\frac{1}{2}$ points or 36.0236% of the total number scored by the United States team.

In all, 75.65% of the team scoring 85% of the points were college men.

Including the high school boys, of whom there were four, a total of 90.75% of the points were won by representatives of educational institutions where athletics are, if not part of the curriculum, at least a definite part of the student activities. This analysis emphasizes the influence that proper training and care plays in modern athletics.

It is obvious that the points scored by college men on the team would easily have won the Olympic track and field championship. It is also interesting to note that of the 24 non-college men, 14 were entered in events which are not on the program of any college team, i.e.,

10,000 Meters Run,
10,000 Meters Walk,
and the Marathon,

and that the United States scored in these events only four points, won by taking third place in the Marathon. In other words, there were only ten men who gained a place on the team in direct competition with college or high school men, or 10.78%, and that these men won 7.81% competitive points. Of these competitive points 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ were won as members of a team in team races.

The average age of I.C.A.A.A. men on the team was 23.08; other college men, 23.06; non-college men (eliminating two men whose ages were respectively 43 and 45 years), 27.88.

Of the 50 I.C.A.A.A. members only eight were from private schools; all the others were from municipal high schools.

The college athletes came from 41 institutions. The university that furnished the greatest number was Southern California, with six to its credit. Pennsylvania, Princeton and Georgetown had five each, and Pennsylvania State, Illinois, Iowa and Mississippi A.&M., four each. Harvard, California, Kansas University and Missouri had three each.

FORTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL FIELD MEETING CAMBRIDGE, MASS., MAY 30-31, 1924

BY the margin of a single point Yale won the forty-eighth track and field championship meeting of the Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America held at Cambridge, Mass., May 30 and 31, 1924. Yale scored 28 points out of a possible 225, its first victory since 1904.

The University of Pennsylvania was second with 27 points. Leland Stanford was third with $24\frac{1}{2}$ and Princeton fourth with 23. Other teams scored as follows: Pennsylvania State College, 21; University of Southern California, 14; Johns Hopkins, $13\frac{1}{2}$; California, 13; Harvard, 13; Boston College, 12; Cornell, $10\frac{1}{2}$; Dartmouth, 8; Georgetown, 7; Massachusetts Institute of Technology, 5; Syracuse, 5; Colgate, $\frac{1}{2}$.

Intercollegiate records were broken in two events. William A. Comins, Yale, 1924, won the running broad jump with a leap of 24 feet 8 inches. His record displaced the former mark of 24 feet $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches made by A. C. Kraenzlein, Pennsylvania, 1900, and which had stood since 1899. S. Glenn Hartranft, Leland Stanford, 1924, was the second record breaker. In the 16-pound shot put his winning put was 49 feet $5\frac{7}{8}$ inches. It displaced the former intercollegiate record of 48 feet $10\frac{3}{4}$ inches, made by R. L. Beatty, of Columbia, in 1912. It also bettered the collegiate record of 49 feet $\frac{3}{4}$ inch, made by R. G. Hills, Princeton, in 1923. Although all the five point winners in the discus throw bettered the existing record of 140 feet $\frac{1}{8}$ inch, new figures were not allowed for this event because of a favoring wind outside the stadium, where this event was contested.

The meet had an unusual ending in that the deciding event was the hammer throw, the last event to be completed. Previous to its conclusion, the scores of the two leaders were, Pennsylvania, 27; Yale, 25. By virtue of taking third place in this event Yale won the meet by the margin of a single point. The games were held in the stadium at Soldiers' Field through the courtesy of Harvard University.

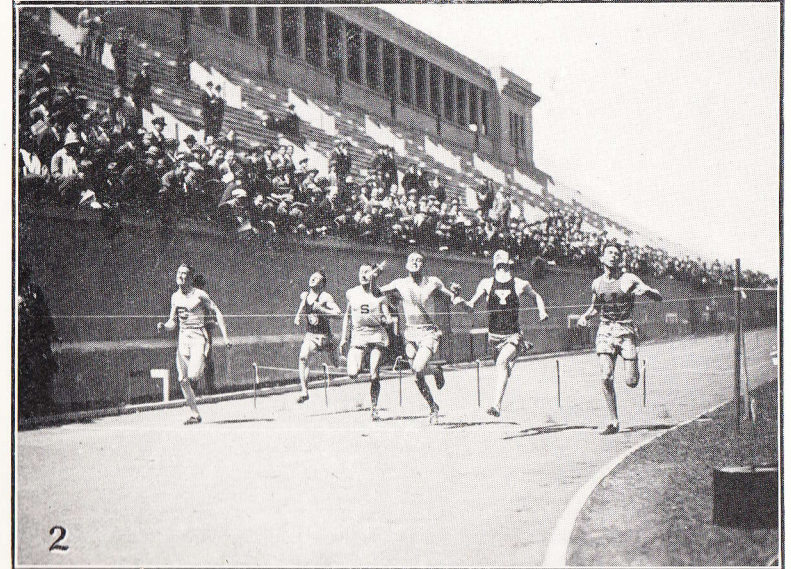
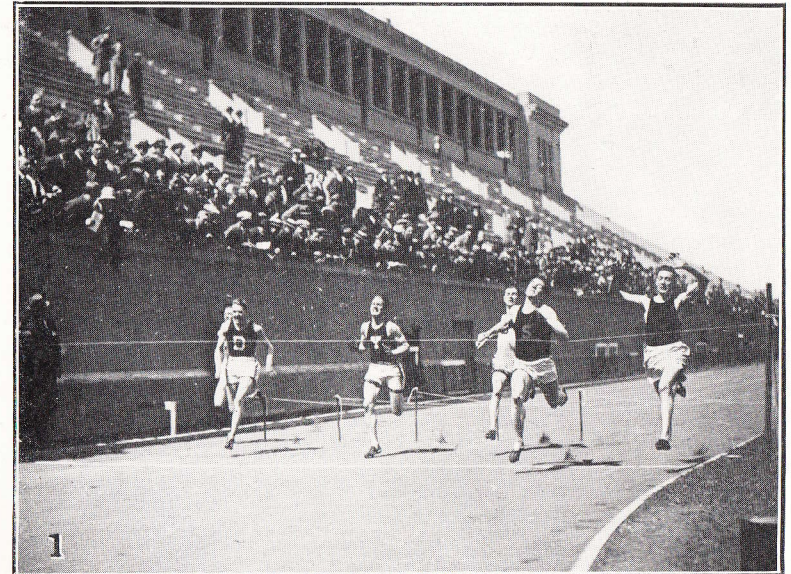

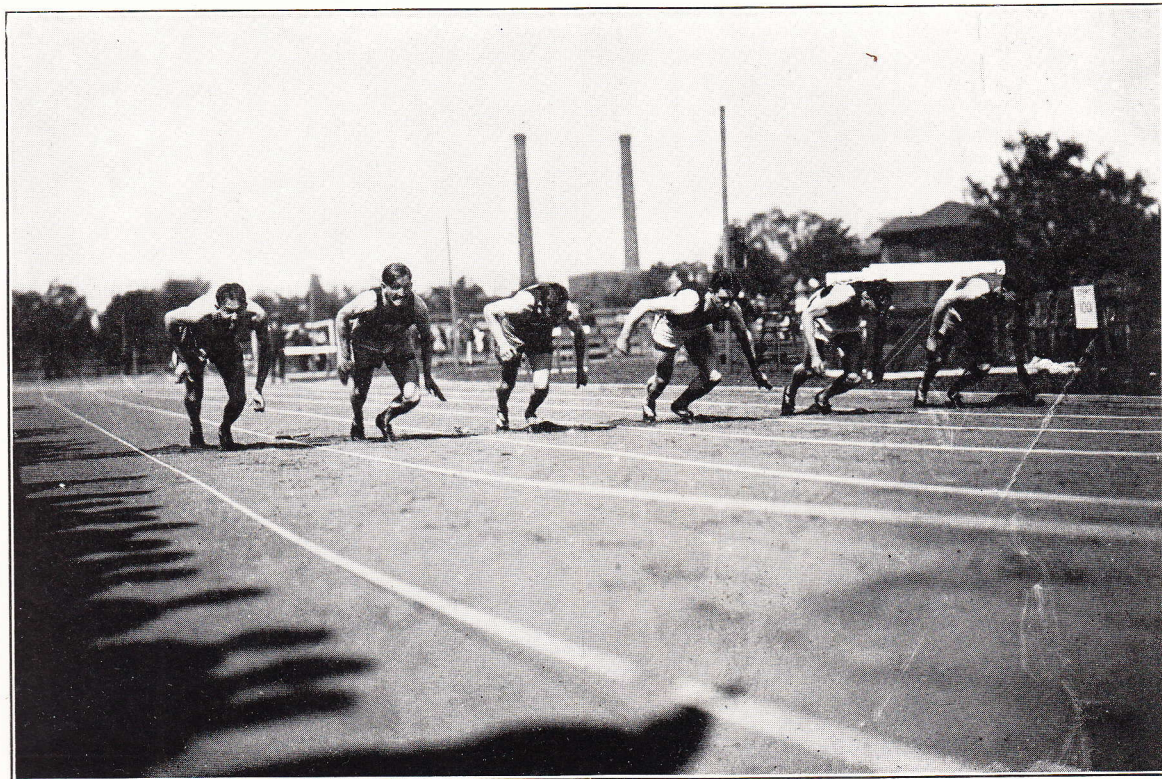

He won his preliminary heat in 21.7 seconds. The fastest time of any of the preliminary heats was that made by Louis A. Clarke, Johns Hopkins, 1924, in 21.6 seconds. Both of the semi-final heats, the first won by Clarke, and the second by Bayes M. Norton, Yale, 1926, were run in 22.1 seconds. In the final heat Hill ran a race very much like the 100-yard dash. He was led by both Clarke and Norton for more than half the distance. Norton was in first place at 175 yards, but here Hill began to make up ground and crossed the tape a yard and a half in front of Norton, who beat Clarke by a yard. Henry A. 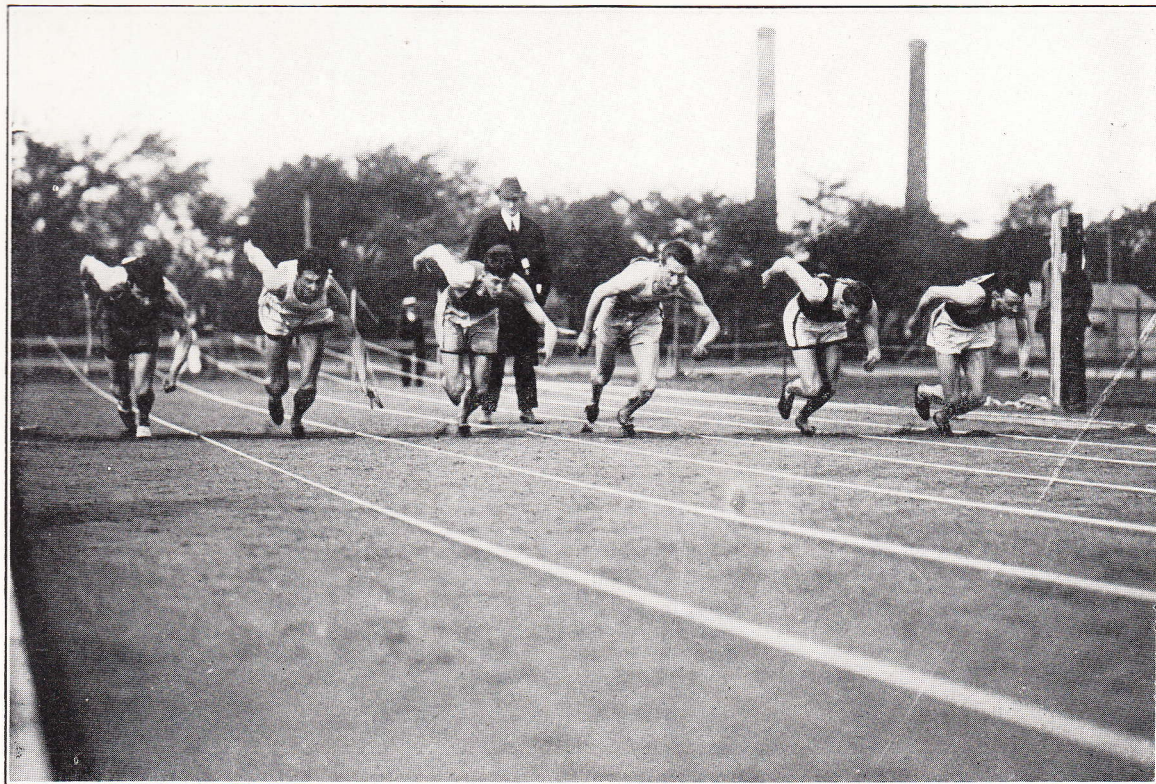

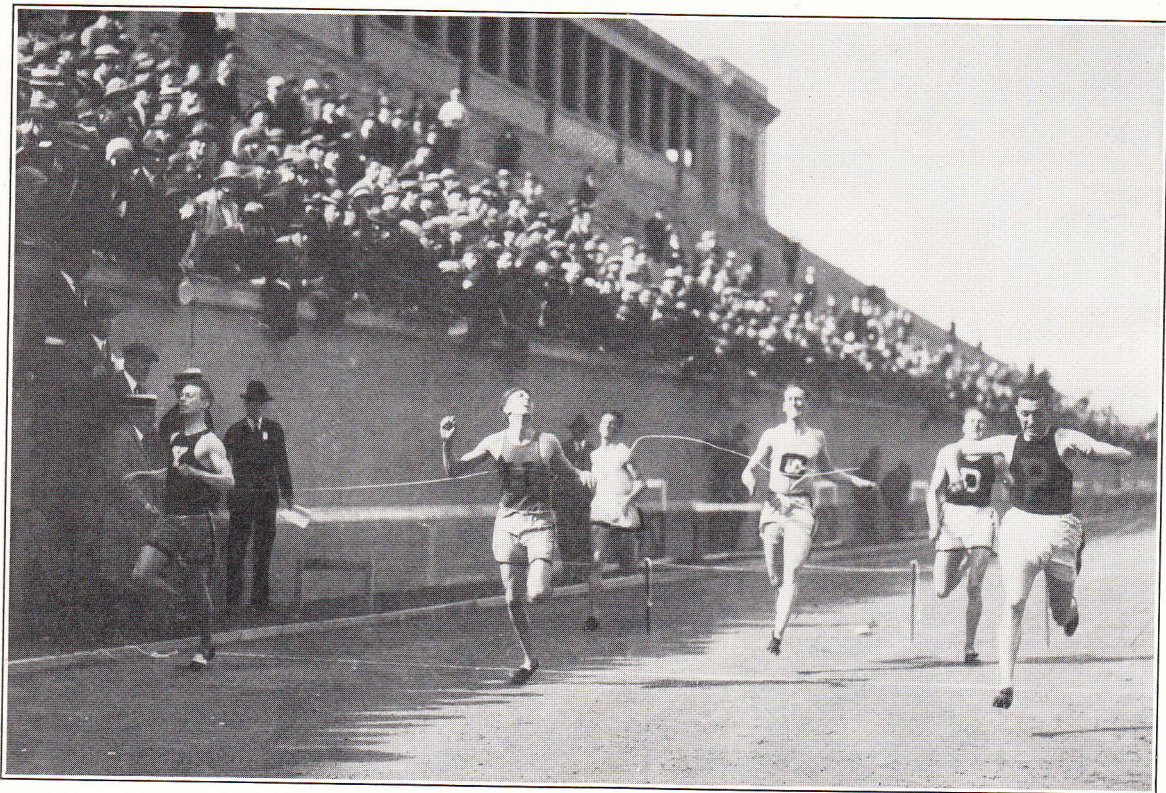


1. CLARKE, Johns Hopkins, winning first heat.

Jeppe continued to drop back and failed to score. Harold N. Bates, Dartmouth, 1925, was just beaten out at the tape for second place by Richard G. Croft, Princeton, 1924. Two Yale men, Gilbert W. Chapman, 1924, and Charles S. Gage, 1925, were fourth and fifth.

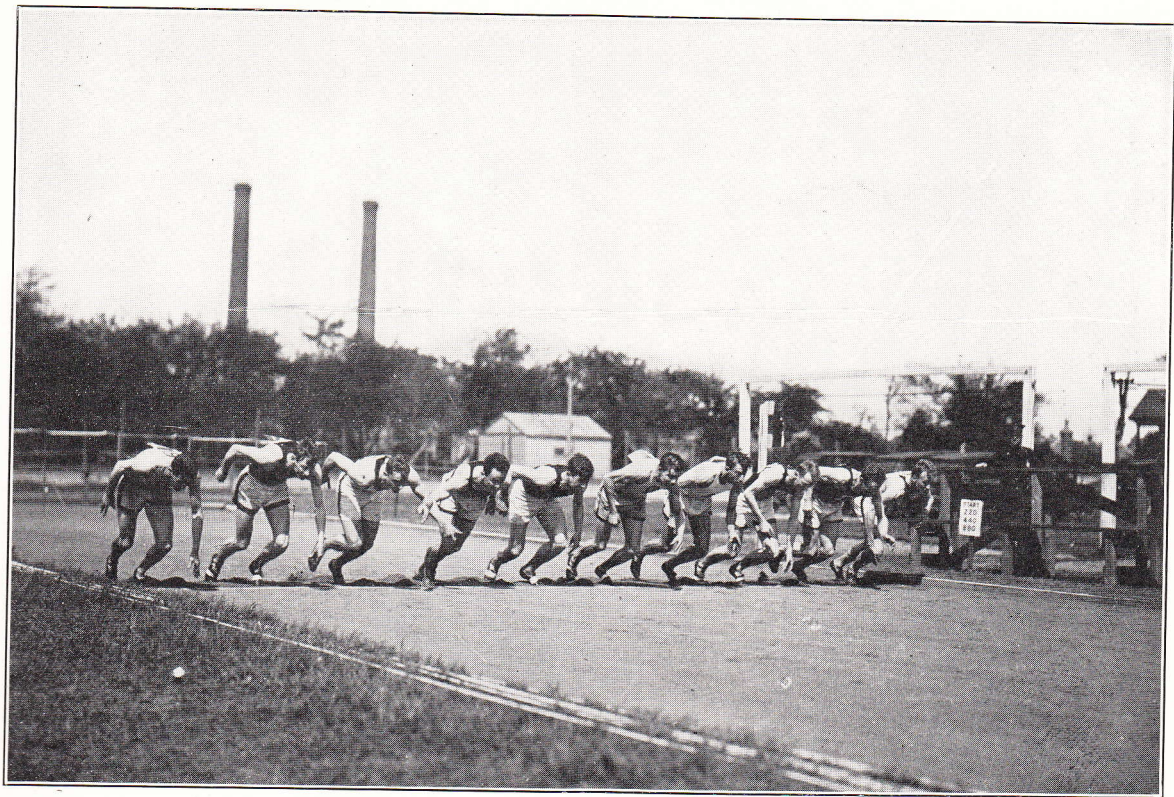

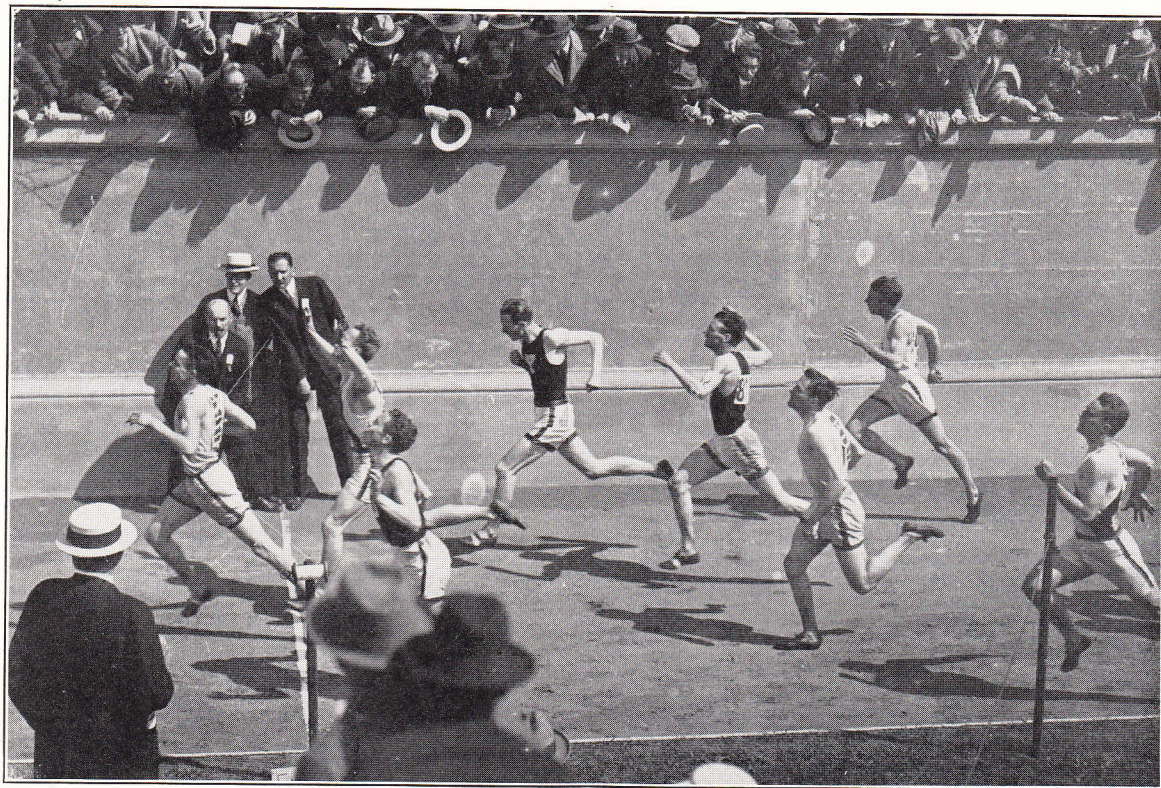

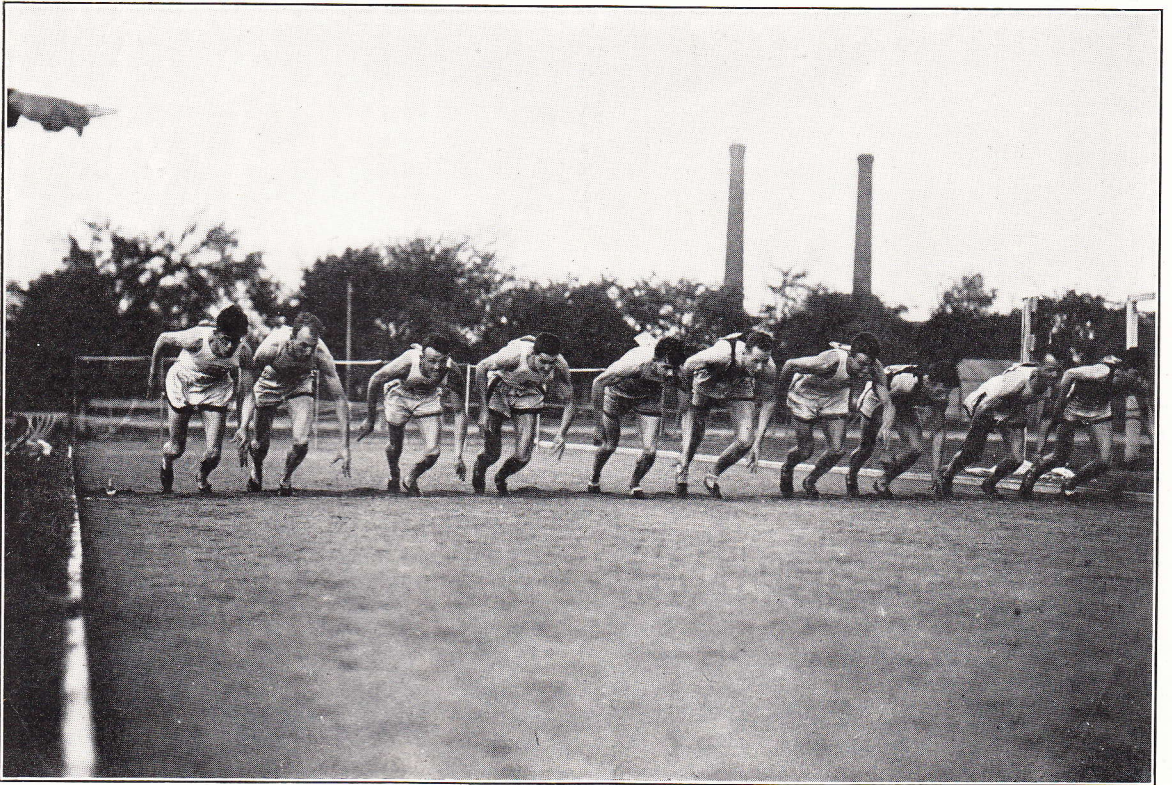

Schuyler C. Enck, Pennsylvania State College, 1924, proved to be the winner of a stirring though slowly run mile in 4 minutes 23.8 seconds. Thomas F. Cavanaugh, Boston College, 1926, was the runner up. He was unequal to Enck's sprinting ability and finished about eight yards back. It was not an exceptionally fast field. Cavanaugh insisted upon being pacemaker. He passed the quarter mile mark in 61 seconds, with Smith of Leland Stanford and Enck following in the order named. Cavanaugh was timed at the half mile mark in 2 minutes 10.2 seconds. Although Enck pressed him hard on the third quarter, Cavanaugh continued to stay in first place and was still leading at the three-quarter mile mark in 3 minutes 18.2 seconds. Enck was still in second place, with Gerry of Cornell and Douglas of Yale running third and fourth. Enck did not make his effort until the back stretch. Cavanaugh answered his challenge with another sprint, and it was not until the men rounded the last turn 150 yards from the tape that Enck could pass the Boston man. Enck proved the better sprinter and won out by ten yards. Gerry was a similar distance back of Cavanaugh. Douglas was fourth, while in the last rush B. R. Cutcheon, Harvard, took fifth place.

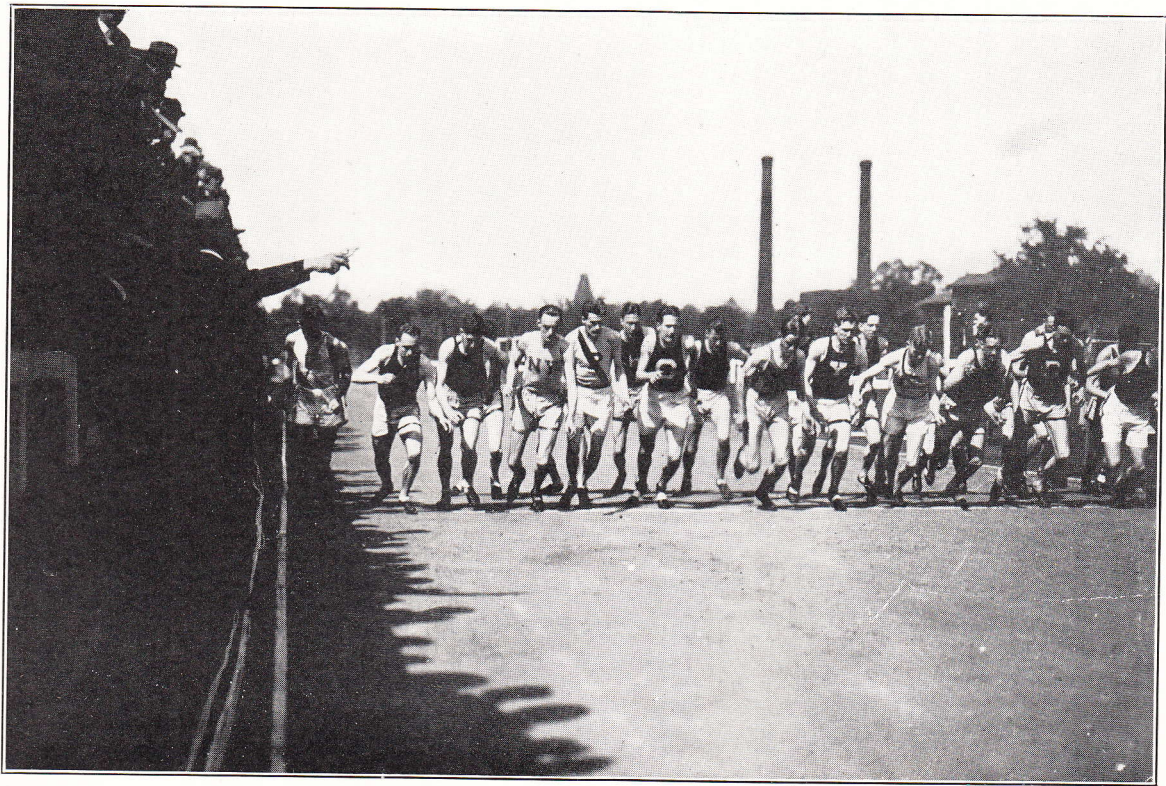

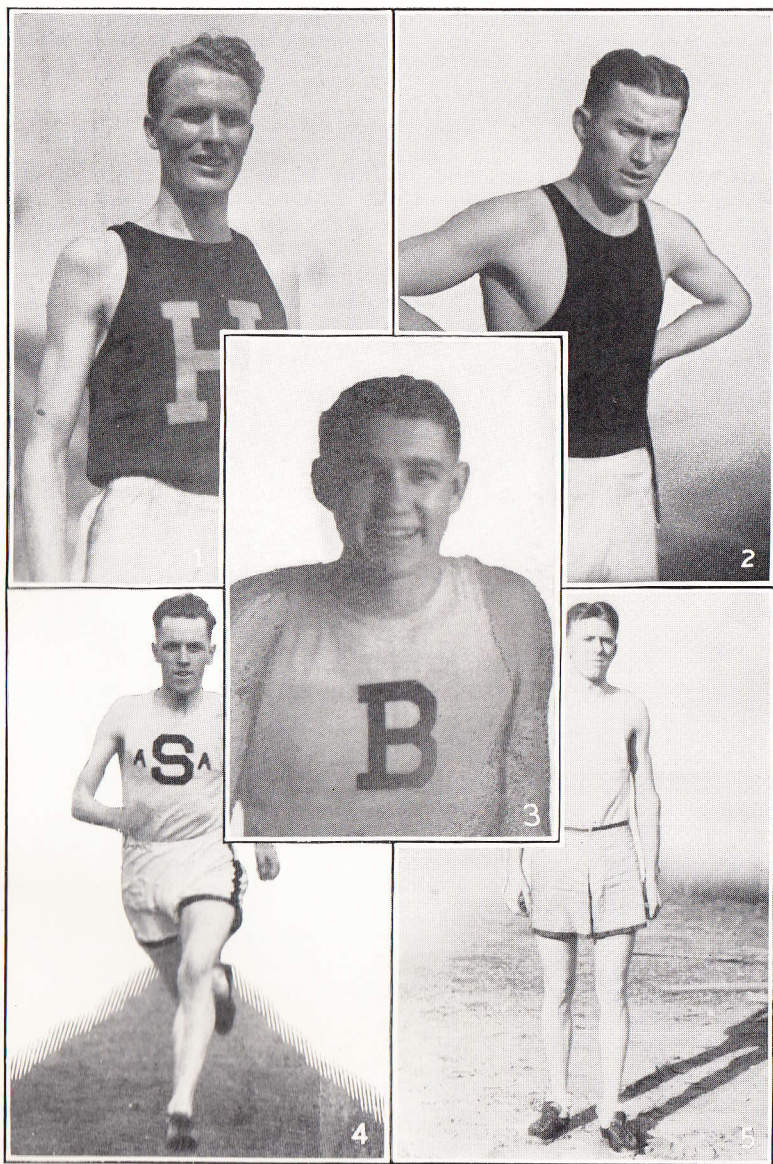

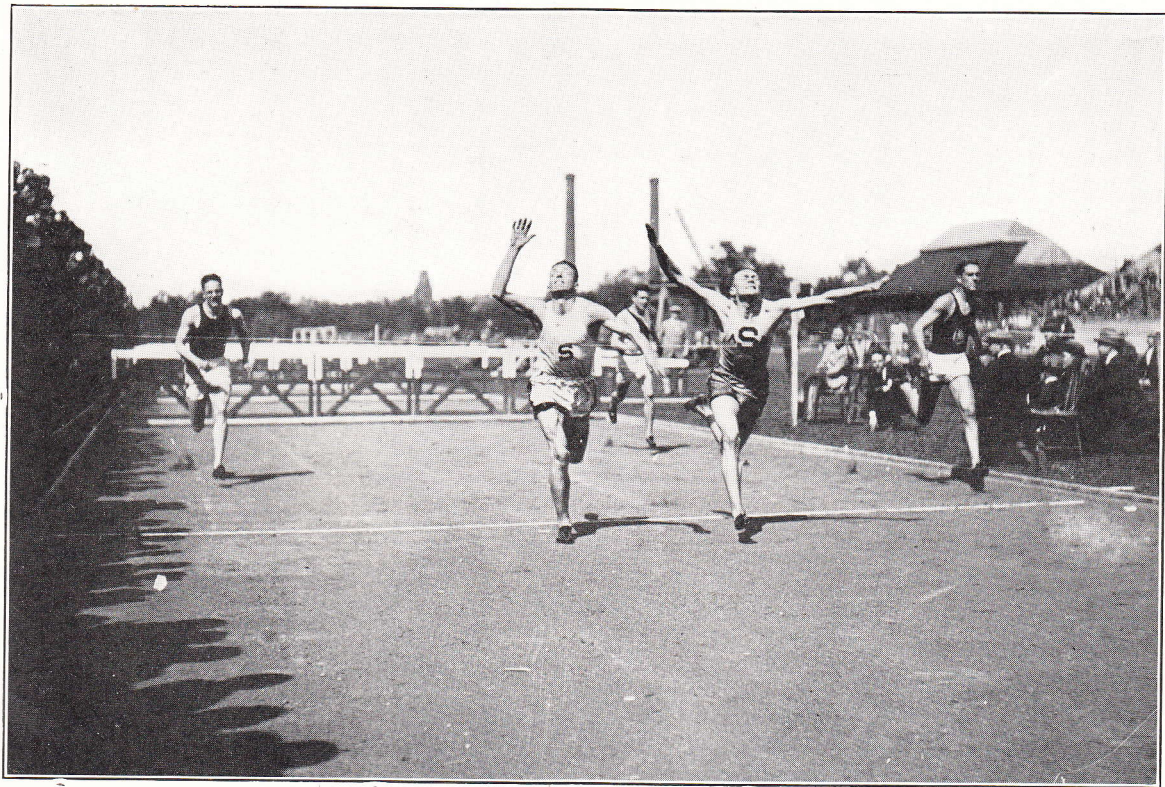

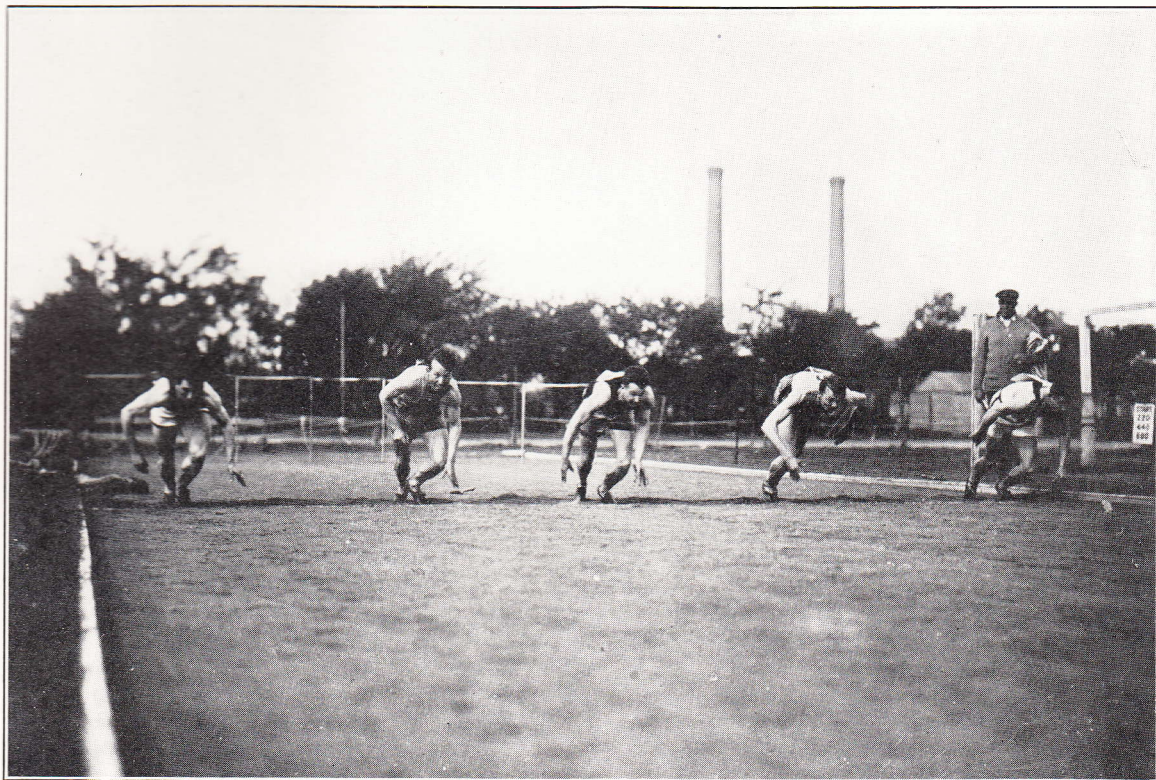

RUNNING BROAD JUMP

William A. Comins, Yale, 1925, broke the intercollegiate record twice in the running broad jump. His best jump in the preliminary round on Friday was 24 feet $5\frac{5}{16}$ inches, which displaced the record of 24 feet $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches made by Alvin C. Kraenzlein, Pennsylvania, 1900, just twenty-five years earlier. In his second jump of the final round Comins improved this performance with a leap of 24 feet 8 inches. Albert E. Rose, Pennsylvania, 1924, also came close to a new intercollegiate record. His first jump in the final round, which won him second place, was 24 feet $3\frac{11}{16}$ inches. 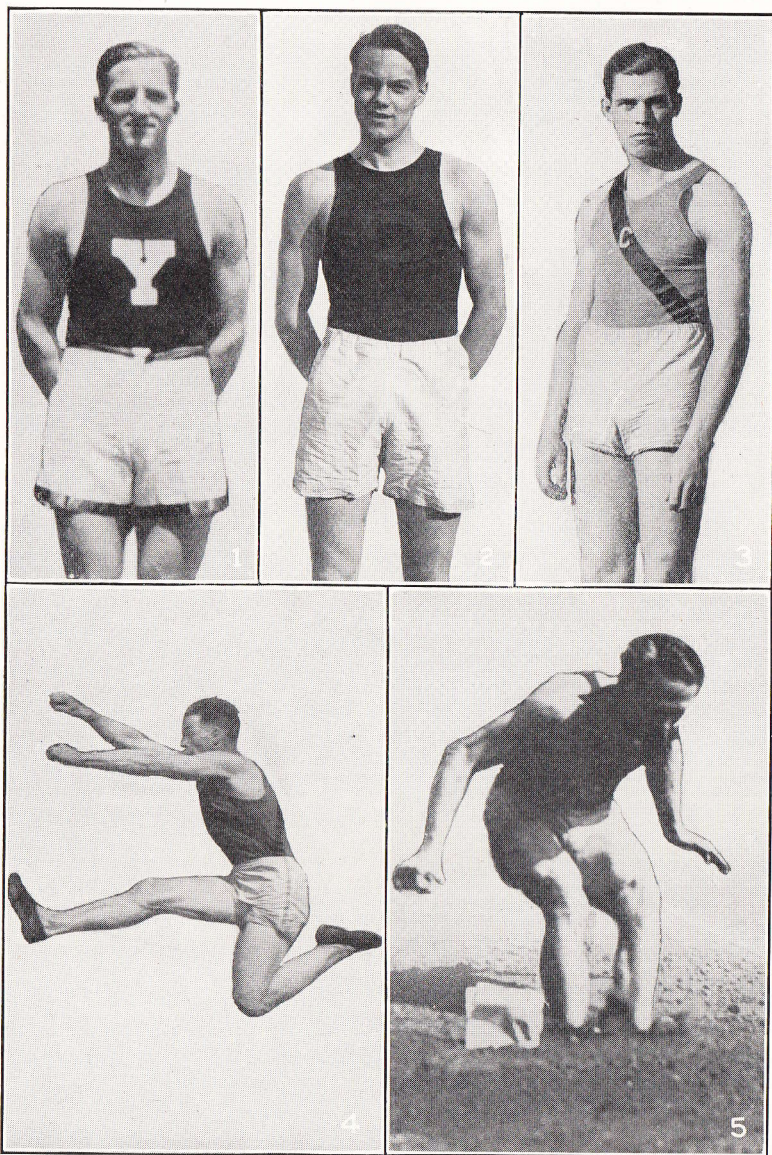

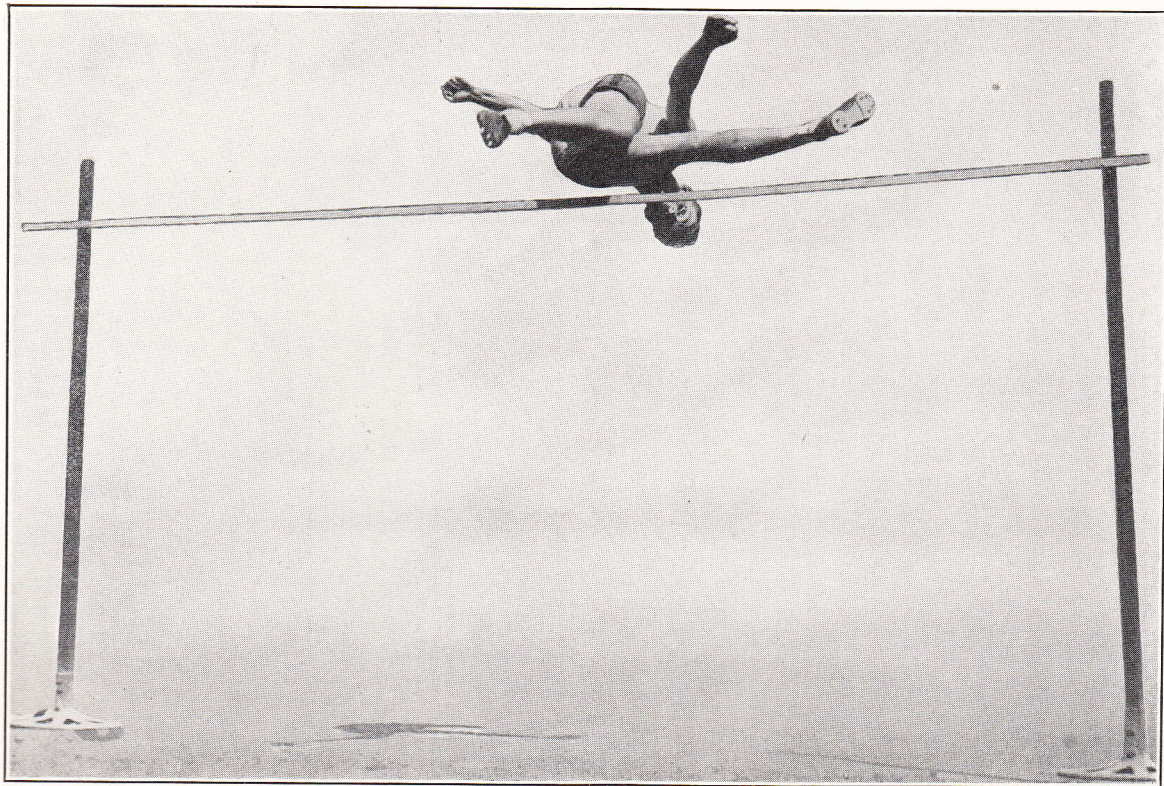

After making one balk at this height, Owen cleared the bar at the successive heights of 11 feet 6 inches, 12 feet, and 12 feet 6 inches on the first jump. When the bar was raised to 12 feet 9 inches he missed on the first trial but cleared it on the second. After winning the event at this height, the bar was raised to 13 feet 1 inch to give Owen an opportunity for a new inter-collegiate record. He failed on each of his three attempts, although once, with his body completely over the bar, he brushed it off in his descent. Nelson B. Sherrill, Pennsylvania, 1925, and Kenneth P. Libbey, Dartmouth, 1925, tied for second at 12 feet 6 inches. Sylvan S. Scholpp, Yale, 1924, and Nathan B. Durfee, Yale, 1926, tied for second at 12 feet.

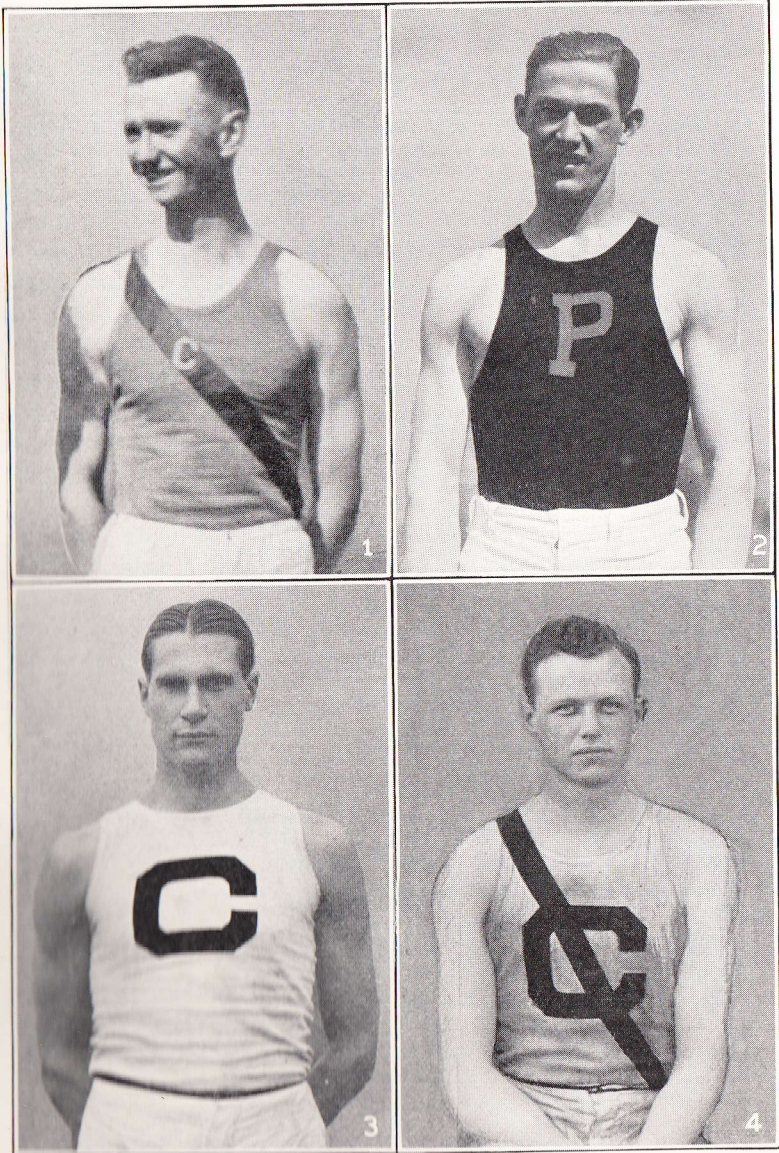

S. Glenn Hartranft, Leland Stanford, 1924, won the shot put with a new intercollegiate and collegiate record of 49 feet $5\frac{7}{8}$ inches. His best put in the preliminary round was 46 feet $8\frac{1}{8}$ inches. In the final round Ralph G. Hills, Princeton, 1925, moved into first place with a put of 49 feet $5\frac{3}{8}$ inches. He was first to break the intercollegiate record of 48 feet $10\frac{3}{4}$ inches previously held by R. L. Beatty, of Columbia, since 1912. It was after this that Hartranft put the leaden missile half an inch further, thereby winning the event and the honor of holding the record. Clarence L. Houser, University of Southern California, 1926, was third with a put of 48 feet $9\frac{5}{8}$ inches. Fourth place went to Norman F. Anderson, University of Southern California, 1925, with 46 feet $2\frac{1}{8}$ inches. Clarence A. C. Eastman, Harvard, 1924, was fifth with 46 feet $1\frac{3}{8}$ inches.

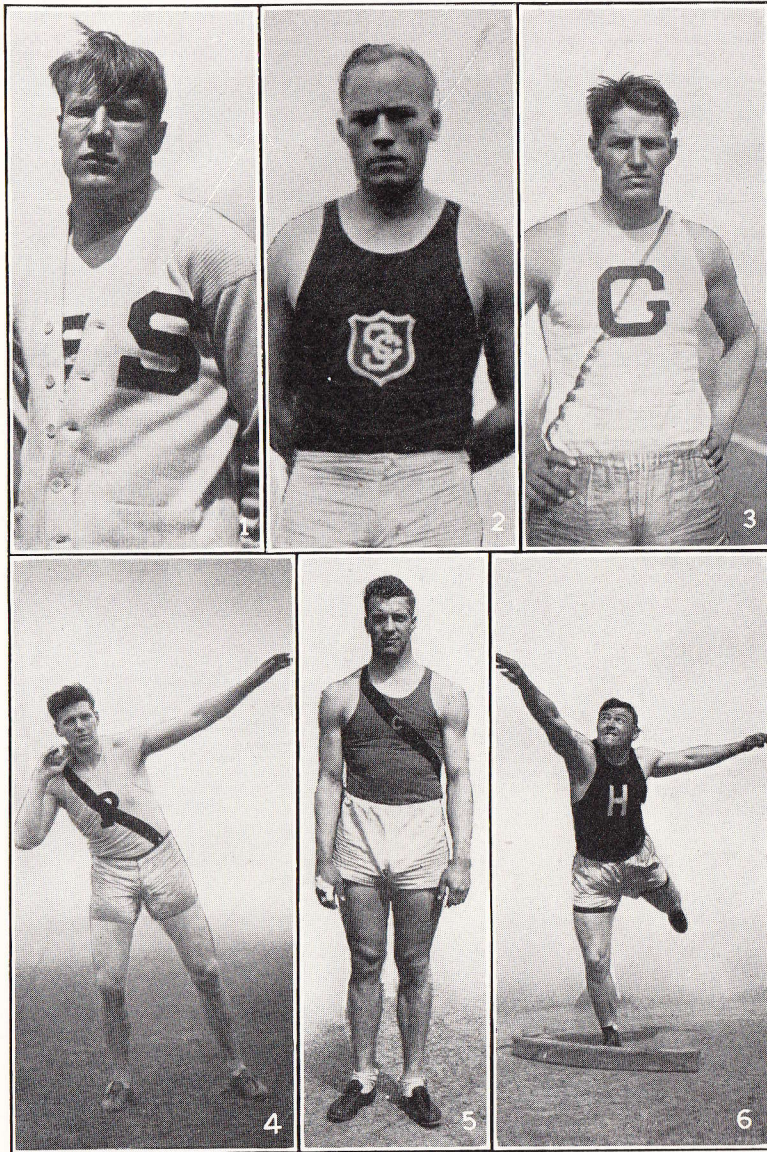

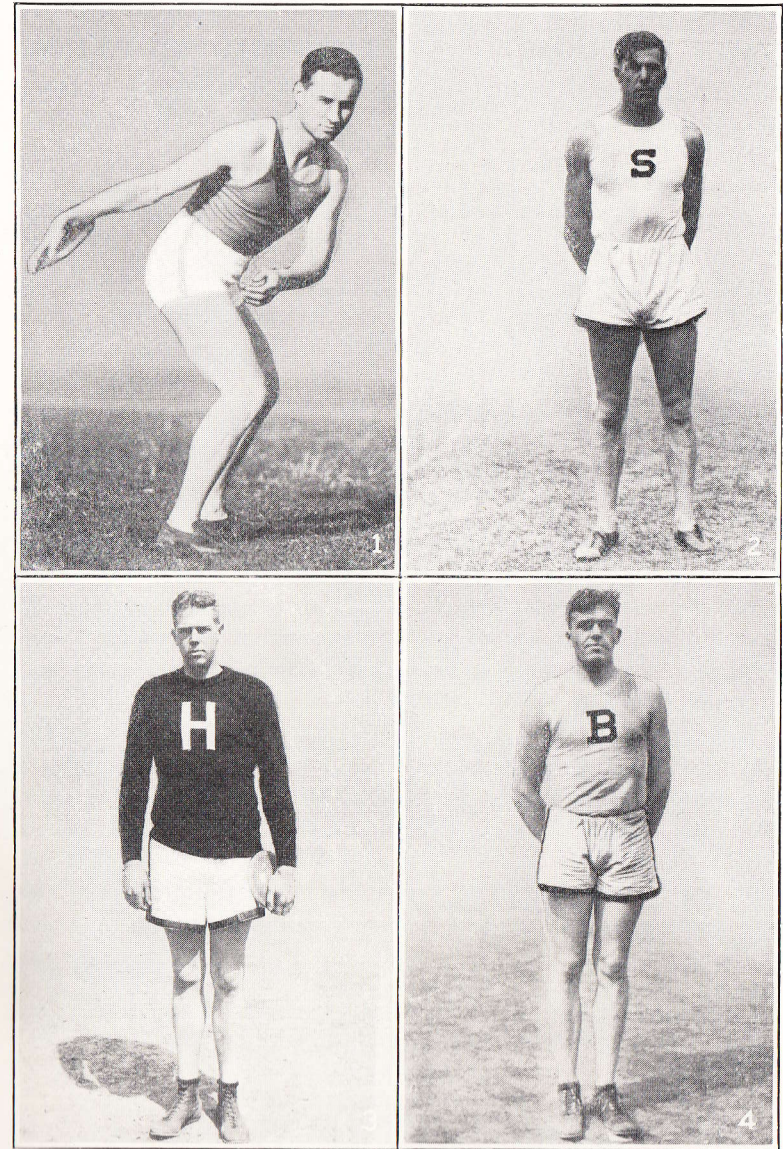
