

THE NATIONAL MEET, 1934

For the first time in the history of the N.C.A.A. track and field championships the thirteenth annual meet was held in some other locality than Chicago. The University of Southern California had the very distinct privilege of acting as host to this great meet in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum in Los Angeles.

It was with a feeling of confidence, so far as the interest in track and field athletics is concerned, that the University agreed to guarantee the sum of \$20,000 for expense allowances for the outstanding athletes of the country. The Track and Field Rules Committee, with T. Nelson Metcalf as chairman, was authorized to select the outstanding athletes of the entire nation based upon performances of the 1934 season. Their selection resulted in expense allowances being assured to approximately 189 athletes from 78 different colleges and universities.

The University of Southern California was happy to submit the net receipts of the meet, deducting from the gross only the actual operating expense, for the pro rata distribution to those who did not share in the original expense, and based upon the rules of distribution of the N.C.A.A. These net receipts permitted an additional distribution of approximately one-half of the Pullman and railroad transportation to the additional competing athletes, members of the rules committee who attended, members of the technical committee who attended, and to coaches who accompanied three or more athletes. And so, from a financial standpoint, considering the expenditure of any individual institution, the expense of representation was reduced to the minimum.

The city of Los Angeles certainly showed its appreciation of a meet of this caliber by patronizing it to the extent of gross receipts totaling over \$30,000, which no doubt is the largest amount of gross receipts that has ever been taken in at any N.C.A.A. championship meet.

In writing of the meet it is difficult to select any outstanding event. The great finish of the mile run between Bonthron and Cunningham, the great quarter mile run between Glen Hardin and Ivan Fuqua, the blanket finish of the high hurdles, the phenomenal burst of speed on the part of Hardin to win the 220 yard low hurdles, the double victory of Ralph Metcalfe, the duel between Lyman and Torrance in the shot put, the memorable throw of the discus on the part of slinger Dunn on his last throw, which assured Stanford of a victory; in fact, each and every event could be cited for its outstanding performances and interest on the part of the spectator.

The establishing of records by: Glen Hardin, Louisiana State, in the 440 yards run; William Bonthron, Princeton University, in the one mile run; Jack Rand, San Diego State Teachers College, pole vault; Jack Torrance, Louisiana State, shot put; Robert Parke, Oregon University, javelin, and the record tied by Glen Hardin, Louisiana State, for the 220 yards low hurdle, is again significant of the caliber of competition. In other words, from the standpoint of intercollegiate track and field athletics, certainly this thirteenth N.C.A.A. meet was second to none in history of track and field athletics.

There were entries from 89 colleges and universities, with 323 individual entrants. The fact that in this entry list there were approximately ten of the nation's outstanding athletes in each event, is indicative of the high quality represented.

The University of Southern California was honored in being selected to act as host to the thirteenth annual track and field championships of the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

The Staging of a Track Meet

During the last few years it was felt that our large track and field meets, such as the Western Conference and the National Collegiate championships, were not drawing sufficient attendance. The meets as conducted satisfied most of the usual requirements. They were run off on time and were filled with record breaking results, but interest fell off instead of increasing.

In conversations with the writer as to the cause of this decline of interest, Henry Schulte, track coach of the University of Nebraska, and Major John L. Griffith, Commissioner of Athletics of the Western Conference, both felt that the showmanship exhibited in the staging of these meets was exceedingly poor. Interest in the usual big meet was so divided that the average spectator had little time to get a good glimpse of some event and see the results before another one was under way. Then, too, the track usually was crowded with officials, so that it was difficult for the man who paid admission to get a good view of the finish. The time schedule was arranged more for the benefit of the athlete than the spectator, and the field events usually were held so far away from the grandstand that it was impossible to see any of the performance at all.

Shortly after New Year's Day, Major Griffith called a meeting of the Western Conference Track Committee, which included Amos Alonzo Stagg, Mr. Griffith, and the writer. It was decided at that time to try to follow out some of the procedures that were so admirably carried out at the Olympic Games at Los Angeles, and to add several innovations that would stir up interest among the spectators.

At the start the committee figured the time schedule of events so that the spectator's attention could be held on one event at a time, with the idea of letting him know exactly who the competitor was and what his best mark had been; in other words, focus the spotlight on one event at a time. At first it seemed impossible to work out such a time schedule. It meant that instead of the usual ten or fifteen minutes lapse between events, our intervals would have to be from three to ten minutes. It meant that the Clerk of the Course would have to be extremely alert in getting the men placed for each event and ready to go. We also decided to make one man responsible for the entire running of the meet—the Announcer. Before any event could start he was to signal the Starter or Field Judge. This was done after he had announced the event and the competitor's best mark of the previous day, and had the entire attention of the crowd centered on the event about to start.

Beginning with the officials, we first eliminated all possible unnecessary help, cutting down the number for each event to the bare number required to work the event smoothly. In order that the officials would thoroughly understand the rules of their event, they were sent a page from the rule book covering the event in which they were able to work. As a double check the rules were pasted on the score sheet of each event. They were further informed that no official would be allowed on the field unless he was actually officiating at his appointed task. All finish-line

work was to be done from the stands, the Finish Judges and Timers being placed in the grandstand.

We reserved the first five rows of the stadium for use of officials and competitors who were not engaged in the event being contested. Much objection was raised at first by the officials group, as they felt they could not judge accurately from the grandstand. After they had tried it they found that it would work equally as well from the stand and no further trouble was experienced.

The schedule of track and field events for Friday was so follows:

It was practically the same program as always except that the hammer throw was run off, trials and finals, on this day. This was necessary because the event had to be held away from the stadium due to lack of space and also because it usually held up the meet for some time.

The field in all weight events and in the running broad jump was narrowed down to six competitors by holding both preliminaries and semi-finals on Friday. This would give each of the competitors in these events three attempts on Saturday.

The pole vault, which formerly had dragged more or less throughout the whole meet, was started at 2:30 on Saturday with the bar placed at 12 feet 6 inches. The pole vaulters could come out and start warming up at 12 o'clock, but at 2:30 the bar would be placed at twelve-feet-six and they would start the event.

An attempt was made to begin the meet with a bang. A parade of the band, officials, track coaches and competitors was held at the start. Everybody was required to march except the pole vaulters who were vaulting at the time, the mile runners who were to be ready to go to the marks immediately after, and the high jumpers. The marchers assembled under the stadium and at the appointed time began their march, going around the track to the flagpole, where the flag was raised and the "Star-Spangled Banner" was played.

To add further zest to the meet and give the crowd a chance to see the winners of each event, a victory ceremony was put into effect. The Northwestern University May Queen with her Court of Honor were seated on the football field at the edge of the track. At the finish of each event four buglers sounded a fanfare and the athletes who had won the first five places mounted the winners' stand. This was a box-like affair which permitted the winner to stand on the top step, with the second and third men on either side a step lower, and the fourth and fifth a step below them. As soon as the winners were placed the band played the song of the victorious school and a large pennant with the school's colors was run up on the flagpole.

At the conclusion of the song the winners marched over to the May Queen's throne, where they were presented with their medals. It was feared at first that difficulty would be had in getting the men up to the ceremonial stand, and this was true of the first two events. They had to be ordered up. After that they were awaiting their turn to be announced. It proved to be a delightful ceremony, greatly appreciated by the crowd, and seemed to be enjoyed by the athletes.

Naturally the Announcer played a very important part in the plan. As each place winner stepped up to the Queen's Court, his name, the event, and the winning time or distance was announced.

Credit for the preciseness of this schedule is due to Major Griffith and Frank Hill, Northwestern University track coach, who worked it out. Experiments were tried with intramural track teams to determine how long it would take to run off a flight of javelin throws, or how long

a man took to complete a broad jump. All were astonished by the short space of time the competition actually required.

As mentioned before, the Announcer really was a Master of Ceremonies, responsible for the time schedule and other details. As the time came for each event—say the one mile run—he announced the competitors, the defending champion, if he was running, and the lanes in which the men were to run. As the shot putters came up to begin their first round he gave their names, the best put each had made the previous day, and no event was allowed to start until the preceding one had been finished and out of the way.

Trouble was experienced at first in getting the weight men to realize that they would not be allowed any practice throws from the official circle. The Head Judge of the Shot Put, for instance, led the squad over to the practice ring and the men got thoroughly warmed up. It was found that two minutes was ample time for them to get six throws off. All field competitors were instructed that they must have their sweat garments off and be ready to throw following the man whose name had just been called. In the shot put, discus and javelin the men threw in flights and no measurements were taken until after the last man had thrown.

Although a 220-yard straightaway was available, in the Big Ten meet all races, including the 220 yards dash and the low hurdles, were run on the oval. This permitted spectators to see both start and finish of every race, a feature which added materially to the interest in these events.

When the events were completed a ceremony was held for the team winning the meet, with the May Queen presenting the victory plaque to the winning coach, and the color of the school was raised on the flagpole while its song was played. Following this a fanfare of trumpets was blown and the flag lowered.

The meet proved to be extremely interesting to spectators. For the first time many of them saw the field events at close range, knew who was competing and actually witnessed the throw. They were also able to keep in closer touch with everything through the careful announcing that was made, and had their entire attention focused on each event in turn.

Many interesting comments were received after the meet. The field events seemed to be particularly attractive. In previous years the big fellows had thrown the weights off in one corner of the field and secured their medal after the meet, and the crowd had no chance to get a look at them. The various alumni sections got a distinct thrill out of seeing their pennant raised as their man won and hearing the old school song played.

It was felt that since the running off of this meet was so successful the same procedure should be tried at the National Collegiate Meet, which was held at the Century of Progress three weeks later. Several changes, of course, had to be effected in the running of the meet. So many schools were represented that it would be impossible for a band to play all of their school songs. However, the Victory Ceremony was followed out and the medals awarded by a bevy of campus queens representing the fairest from several nearby universities. The meet was held in the evening and the opening parade of officials and contestants presented a colorful picture as they marched around.

The crowd got a great thrill out of the various ceremonies and a lot of attention was given to keeping the spectators informed as to the team standings, which proved interesting right to the end of the meet. The officials were again asked to stay off the track and this met with the approval of the crowd.

Innovations of this kind, many of them tried for the first time at these two meets, should start a new era of track interest. It will add so much to the enjoyment of the spectators in that they see each event as it happens, know who is competing, and are able to find out the result almost immediately.

The writer has had experience with many large track meets, but for the first time in his career received a large number of telephone calls and fan letters from people who were so delighted with the meet that they took the trouble to call or write expressing their pleasure.

In conducting a meet in this fashion it was found necessary to have a corps of assistants for the Announcer, who could immediately secure, after each event was run off, the competitor's name, number, school, and time or distance. Two roving assistants picked up interesting information as it happened and rushed it to the Announcer. We found that when a man had just completed what looked like a record breaking performance, the crowd would think of little else until they knew the exact result definitely.

We were careful to use as many mechanical devices as possible to inform the spectators what the height of the pole vault was, length of the broad jump, and by placing flags of the schools where the various field events were thrown, they could tell at a glance who was ahead.

It has been the writer's opinion that the crowd is interested only in action, that they do not care to see a man spend a lot of time taking off his sweat clothes and warming up, but desire to see only what he does in actual competition. We try not to wear out our audience by having them witness the necessary details of the track meet, but instead concentrate their attention on the things that are most interesting.

Knowing the impatience of the average American sport spectator, we tried to speed up decisions of the Judges after a race. Instead of having a long drawn out argument in a huddle over the time, each Timer wrote his computations on a slip of paper and handed it to the Head Timer. We found that where we could not give the results in a few moments the crowd became impatient.


The Announcer must be a dictator in a meet of this type. He must, of course, have vigorous assistance from the Clerk of the Course and his assistants. We found that where one man was responsible for the starting of each event and getting things under way, we could co-ordinate all the events and make things move smoothly.

We probably have not yet devised the best method of conducting a meet, but believe that each year it can be improved. We had the hearty co-operation of every coach and athlete, and it made the running off of these two great meets a distinct pleasure. This writer feels confident that the plan will increase attendance by bringing enjoyment to the individual who knows little about track and field meets, and will add him to our growing roster of sport fans.
