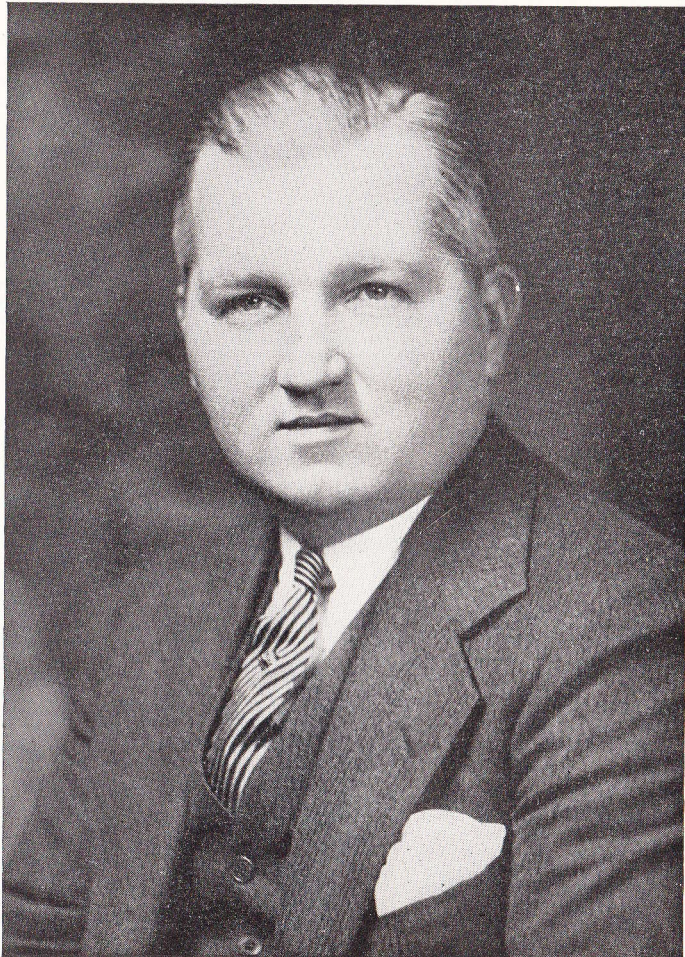

MACMITCHELL WINS SULLIVAN TROPHY

Leslie MacMitchell of New York University, the youth who dominated the mile event last season before he had reached his 21st birthday, has been chosen as the one, who "by his performance, example and influence as an amateur and a man, has done the most during 1941 to advance the cause of sportsmanship."

Such was the decision of the tribunal of 600 outstanding sports leaders throughout the United States which determines each year the American sportsman most worthy to receive the James E. Sullivan Memorial Trophy.

MacMitchell won after a fairly close battle with Cornelius Warmerdam of the San Francisco Olympic Club, the world record holder in the pole vault and the only 15-footer in history. The N. Y. U. senior polled 848 points (on a 5-3-1 basis) to 662 for the Fresno State alumnus. Then came Joe Platak, Chicago's handball champion, 463; Billy Brown, Louisiana State track star, 413; Bud Ward, amateur golf champion, 378; Nancy Merki, women's swimming titleholder, 351; Earl Clark, Ohio State diver, 253.

The 41 district associates of the A.A.U. submitted candidates after being asked to take into consideration acts of sportsmanship, qualities of leadership, excellence of performance, strength of character, force of personality and high ideals of amateurism before naming the candidates.

The Sullivan Committee studied the original list carefully and pared it down to the seven they considered most worthy. Then these seven were submitted to the Tribunal for a final vote along with a summary of reasons for the selection.

This Tribunal is composed of the country's leading sportsmen, sports writers and radio commentators.

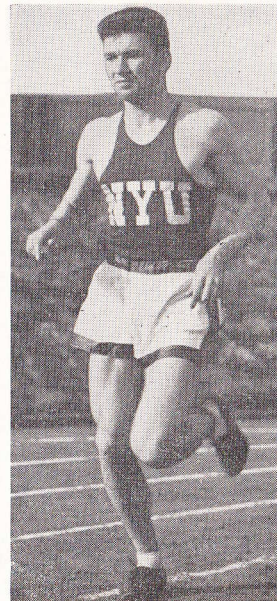
MacMitchell, 21 years of age in September 1941, is the youngest athlete ever chosen for this high honor. He won the National A.A.U. outdoor 1,500-meter championship, the National Collegiate A.A. mile title and the Intercollegiate A.A.A.A. indoor and outdoor mile crowns for a grand slam of the year's major honors. On boards he ran a mile in 4:07.4 to equal Glenn Cunningham's and Chuck Fenske's competitive record. In winning the ICA cross country championship he remained unbeaten in the harrier sport after five years of schoolboy and collegiate competition.

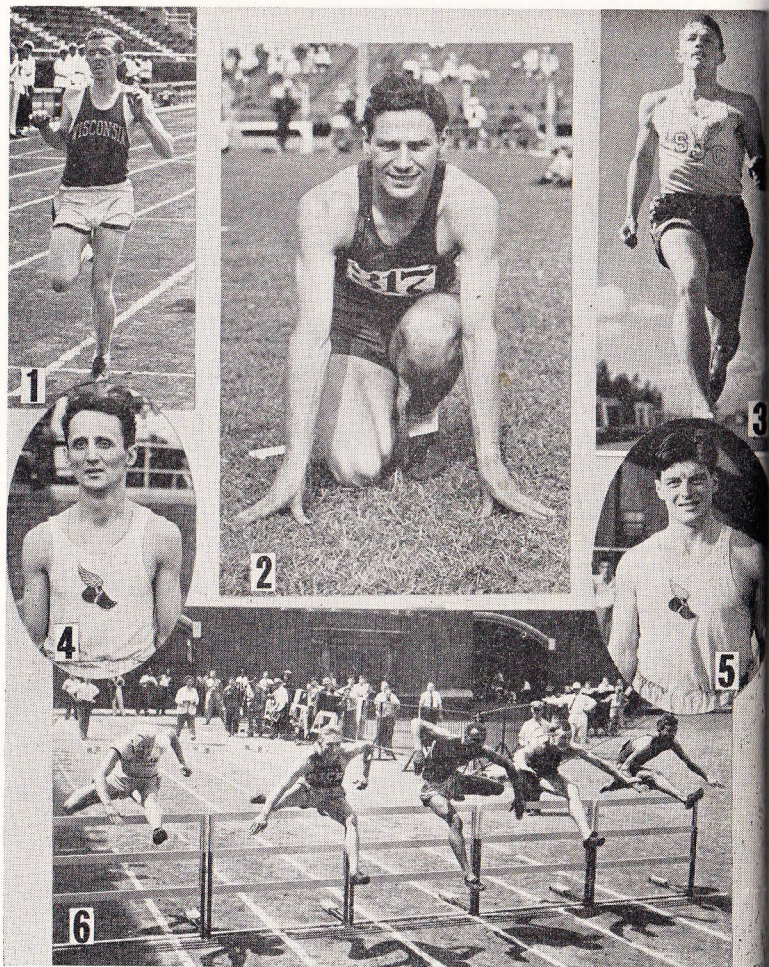
Despite his youth he is extremely modest in victory and unassuming and gracious in defeat. He has always been a team competitor, frequently running two or three relay races to win team honors for his school rather than seek individual laurels for himself.

Has maintained a high standard of sportsmanship, has always upheld the amateur code, and despite long hours devoted to training he is a top-ranking student. Makes friends easily and is helpful to team mates and others seeking knowledge or assistance in connection with athletics.

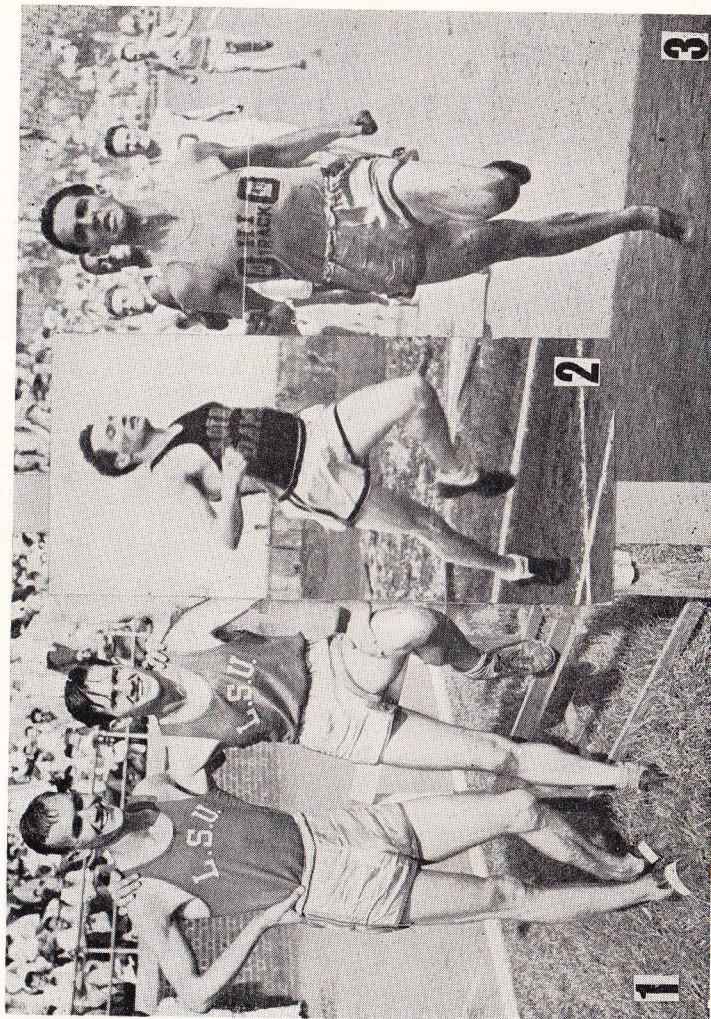

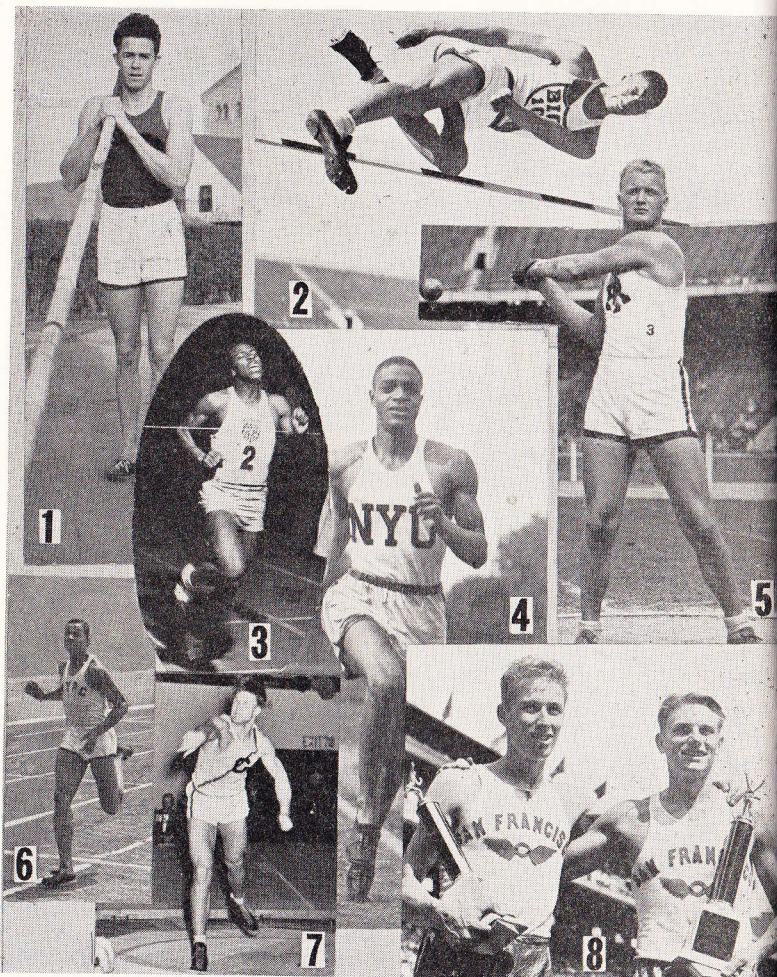

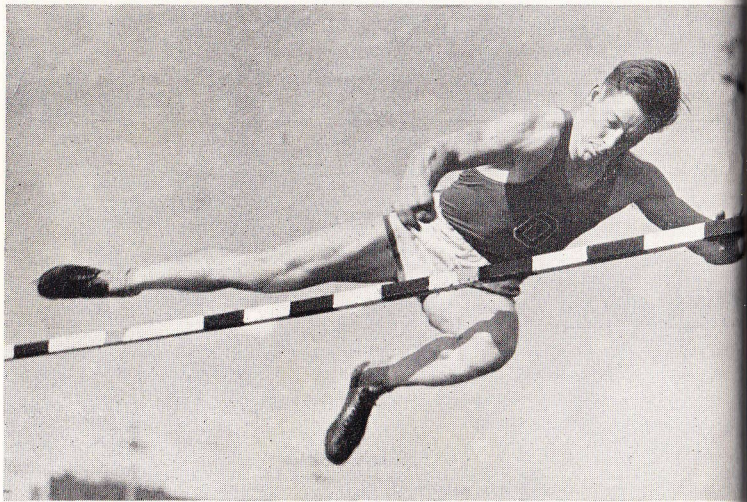
