Standards for NCAA Field Entrants

How good must a field event athlete be in order to merit being entered in the NCAA championship meet?

That's a question which faces coaches every year as they prepare for the annual "big meet," and it's often a difficult question to answer to the satisfaction of an ambitious athlete who believes he deserves the opportunity to compete, whereas in reality he may possess but scant chance of scoring.

For the assistance of these coaches, and also for the statistical significance involved, we hereby tabulate the sixth-place performances for the last six NCAA championships in the standard field events. In the high jump and pole vault these sixth-places often have involved ties for higher placings.

Digging back into even earlier records, these other facts relating to sixth-place field event performances come to light:

SHOT-PUT—First sixth-place performance of beyond 50 feet was in 1934 (50-3 $\frac{3}{4}$), and there were three other such incidents (1938, 1939 and 1940) prior to 1947.

DISCUS THROW—First sixth-place performance of beyond 150 feet was in 1929 (153-1 $\frac{1}{2}$), not repeated again until 1935 (150-10 $\frac{3}{8}$), and then also on three other occasions in 1940, 1941 and 1942.

JAVELIN THROW—Only three times prior to 1947 did it take a throw of more than 200 feet to place sixth. These were 1934 (206- $\frac{3}{4}$), 1935 (210-11) and 1938 (203-10 $\frac{3}{8}$).

HIGH JUMP—First sixth-place performance of beyond 6-4 was in 1936 (6-4 $\frac{3}{8}$). The record sixth-place height occurred in 1938 (6-7 $\frac{1}{4}$). Other 6-4 placings prior to 1947 occurred in 1939, 1940 and 1946.

BROAD JUMP—Sixth-place performances of beyond 24 feet prior to 1947 were in 1936 (24-15 $\frac{3}{8}$), 1937 (24-5) and 1938 (24-6 $\frac{1}{2}$).

POLE VAULT—Highest sixth-place prior to 1947 was in 1939 (13-10). In the Olympic events of the hammer throw and hop-step-jump, now contested only quadrennially in the NCAA championships, last year's sixth-place mark in the hammer of 165-11 $\frac{1}{2}$ was by far the best. The previous record was in 1934 (149-3). Likewise the best for the hop-step-jump was last year (46-11 $\frac{3}{4}$). The best previously was 43-7 $\frac{3}{8}$ in 1936.

In retrospect, it appears that a field event athlete will fail to score in the NCAA championships unless he is consistent at 51 feet in the shot put, 155 feet in the discus, 200 feet in the javelin (although this event may now be on the decline with the curtailment of competition in interscholastic and certain collegiate circles), 6-4 in the high jump, 23-6 in the broad jump and 13-6 in the pole vault.

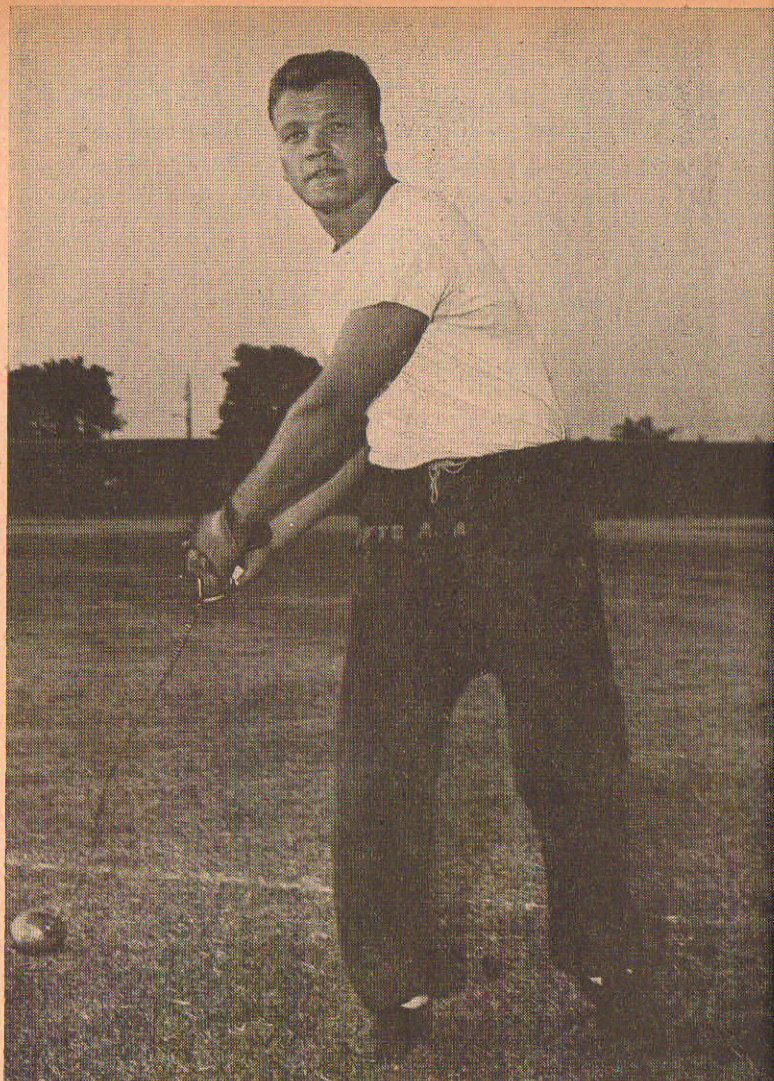

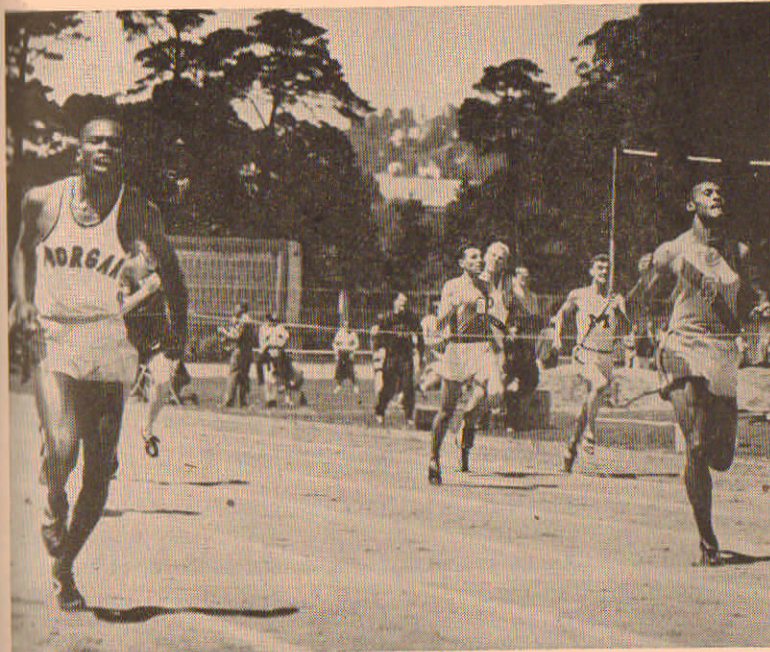

THE MIDDLE WEST

The duels between Illinois and Michigan for both the indoor and outdoor Western conference crowns easily can be considered one of the highlights of midwestern track during the 1952 season. Seventeen squad members will be missing from Michigan's squad this spring while Illinois has to make up for the absence of 11. The Illini won both titles, 59 3/5 to 52, indoors in Champaign and 67 3/5 to 65 1/10, outdoors in Ann Arbor.

Illinois again will be strong since Marv Berschet, who took fourth in the discus and shot put events, is the main loss via graduation. Back are such outstanding stars as Stacey Siders, who set a conference outdoor record of 1:51.2; Willie Williams, first in the 220; Ron Mitchell, who tied for first in the high jump; Joel McNulty, first in the 120-yard high hurdles and fourth in the 220 yard lows; Cirilo McSween, winner in the 440 and second in the 220; Joe Corley, third in the 220 yard low hurdles; Clark Hiller, fifth in broad jump; Ocie Trimble, third in the 2-mile run, and Tom Floyd, fourth in the broad jump. Henry Cryer, winner of the indoor 880 and second to Siders in the outdoor dash, gives the Illini a potent middle distance weapon.

Michigan's leader probably will be John Ross, the Canadian who won the Big Ten indoor and outdoor miles in 4:09.4 (a record) and 4:10.7, respectively. Ross also was fourth in the outdoor 880 after taking second in the indoor race. Still eligible are Horace Coleman, winner of the indoor broad jump and second outdoors; Jack Carroll, who made the same record as Coleman but in the 440; Van Bruner, third in the 120 high hurdles; Roland (Fritz) Nilsson, the Swedish import who led the conference indoors and outdoors in the shot put and took second in the discus, and Roy Pella, third in the discus.

Missing will be Don McEwen, the indoor two mile champion and runner-up in the mile, who also took second in the outdoor mile and two mile runs; Bill Konrad, fourth in the 100 and fifth in the 220 low hurdles; Bill Hickman, fourth in the 2 mile; Walt Atchison, second in the 120 yard highs, and Tom Johnson, runner-up in the shot put both indoors and outdoors.

Northwestern is looking to Jim Golliday to retain his indoor 60 yard and outdoor century crowns but whether the leg injury, which stopped him at the end of the 1952 season and kept him off the Olympic team after he had won the NCAA short dash, has been corrected remains the big question mark.

The Central Collegiate conference outdoor meet at Marquette again proved one of the highlights of the season, and both relay meets at Drake and Kansas were top spots, as usual, on the midwestern scene. Outstanding was Illinois' 7:31.6 American college record for the two-mile relay, and Kansas' 17:15.9 four-mile relay American mark, both set at Drake.

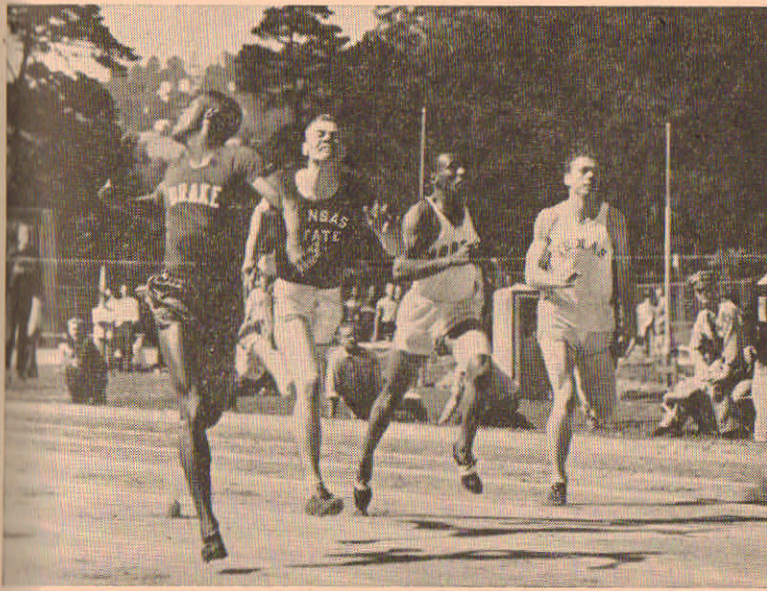

THE MISSOURI VALLEY

There were great running performances in the midlands last fall—both long and short—and indications are that there will be more of the same this year.

Kansas, featuring amazing sophomore Wes Santee, cashed in on the Big Seven and national jackpot; for the first time in the history of the loop (including Missouri Valley and Big Six days) one school, the Jayhawks, managed to sweep the cross-country, indoor and outdoor meets.

Santee, a little-known 19-year-old lad from the Kansas wheat fields a year ago, was the Nation's best known distance runner at season's end, and represented the United States in the 5,000 meters in the Olympics.

During the fall he gave advance notice with a 9:07 two-mile performance, but he didn't really rocket into prominence until the Drake Relays. Then, running against the cream of the nation, he ran a pair of anchor leg miles on successive days that were agreed to be of about 4:07 calibre.

The lithe, Finnish-style youth had a best time of 4:08.8 in the mile event, but hit his peak in the national meets running meters. He pared something like 22 seconds off the national collegiate record in winning that event in 14:36.3, then won the NAAU 1,500 meter crown the following week with a 3:49.3 clocking.

The chorus was loud and long in predicting that Santee, coached by Bill Easton, would be the man to run the long-awaited four-minute mile. And he may well be.

But there were others who starred in the national picture. Another Jayhawk, Bob DeVinney, set a NCAA meet record of 51.7 in the 400-meter hurdles. He had earlier set an American college record in the 440-yard event at Drake, running 52.7.

Kansas, which climaxed its great team year at Drake by setting four of the five new relay records, established an American record for the four-mile there, zooming around in 17:15.9.

And don't forget Herb Semper, the senior Kansas captain, who won his third national collegiate cross-country crown, as Kansas finished second, and also won the Big Seven fall two-mile title.

The area boasted two of the top sprinters, too. Drake's Jim Ford, a junior who since has been inducted into the Army, won the NCAA 200-meter dash around a curve in 21.0. A leg injury kept him from further success. Kansas State's Thane Baker, also a junior, ran some of the best sprint times in the nation in early competition, cooled off temporarily, but came back to finish third in the 200-meter event at Helsinki.

Another Drake lad, sophomore Arnie Betton, was one of the nation's top high jumpers, soaring 6-8 $\frac{3}{8}$ to tie for second in the AAU meet and winning a place on the Olympic team.

The Big Seven meet, held in Norman, Okla., for the first time, was staged in a sheet of water because of an all-day downpour. Still the times were presentable. Baker, winner of the 100 and 220, plus a great leg on the winning mile relay team, was picked as the outstanding athlete.

Greatest surprise was the performance of Warren Rouse, an Oklahoma sophomore. The previous year he had been spotted running in an intramural race; John Jacobs grabbed him and last spring he upset Semper and Bill Fox—the Drake Relay two-mile king—to win.

Final tally was Kansas 121 1/3 to Oklahoma's 104 2/3, with the others way back. As a sign of the times, 10 of the 14 individual winners were undergraduates with more competition coming.

Outstanding youngster was Oklahoma freshman J. W. Mashburn, who won the 440, and later made the Olympic squad in his event. Besides the underclassmen mentioned, Kansas half-miler Art Dalzell and Oklahoma broad jumper Neville Price were sophomores; Iowa State discus king Jim Robertson and Missouri javelin champ Bill Fessler were juniors.

In the Missouri Valley conference meet, Oklahoma A&M swept to its 12th straight title by scoring 121 points at Stillwater. Houston was second with 65.

Outstanding performances were Houston's 440-yard relay record of 41.8, Houston's Nick Spillos' 151-8 toss in the javelin, and Aggie sopher Roscoe Vrooman's record-breaking leap of 6-6 $\frac{7}{8}$ in the high jump. The three records broken all belonged to Drake, which had withdrawn from the conference earlier in the year, along with Bradley.

Looking ahead, Coach Tom Deckard at Drake may weld a distance crew together at Drake this year. Senior Dewey Johnson, who ran under 4:10 to beat Don Gehrman last winter in the Bankers Mile at Chicago, has a 4:17 team-mate named Ray McConnell, who will be a sophomore.

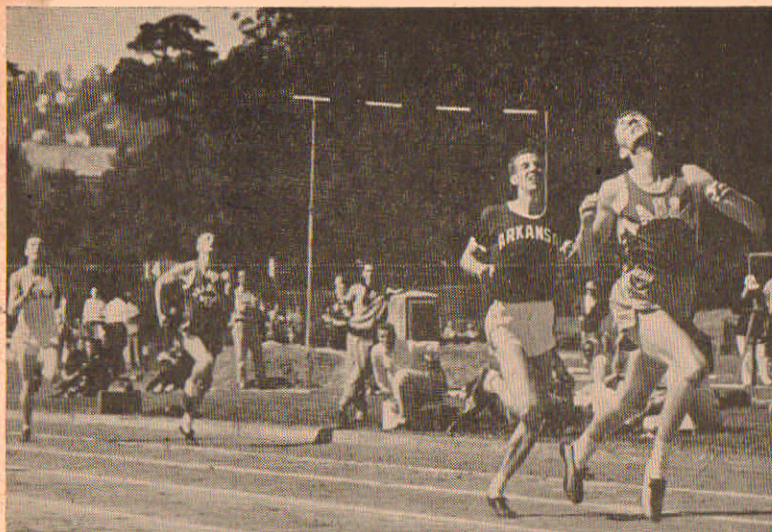

Texans, still cheering about the performances of their track and field cham-
 pions in last year's National meets and the Olympics, can look forward to another
 rosy season in 1953.

Three Olympic performers are still around. They are Texas A&M's Darrow
 Hooper, Texas' Dean Smith and Arkansas' Lee Yoder.

Hooper, who pushed the shot past the 57-foot mark for the first time in his
 collegiate career in winning the tryouts and finishing second to USC's Parry
 O'Brien by less than an inch in the Olympics, has his eye on Jim Fuch's World
 record.

The A&M senior, twice-Southwest conference champion in both shot put and
 discus, has added weight (to 220 pounds) and confidence (in hitting the 57-foot
 circle) to possibly realize his ambition. He also wants to regain the NCAA title
 lost to O'Brien last year.

Despite Hooper's shot put achievements, A&M Coach Frank Anderson still
 believes the Fort Worth boy will be a better discus thrower. Hooper got his
 best discus throw, 170 feet, in the SWC meet.

Smith, first Texas sprinter to perform impressively on the West Coast, will
 be after his second SWC 100-yard dash crown after equaling the 9.5 record as a
 sophomore. National AAU 100-meter champion and fourth-place finisher in the
 Olympics as well as a member of the winning U.S. 400-meter relay team, Smith
 faces another fine SWC sprint field this season.

There'll be teammates Charles Thomas, Jim Brownhill and Bill Turner, plus
 SMU's Buddy Goode and TCU's Ronald Clinkscale, a sophomore who was clocked
 in 9.6 last year.

Smith, Thomas and Brownhill—all juniors—are due to form three-fourths of
 Texas' spring combination this season. This unit with the departed Carl Mayes
 as a fourth, won major titles at the Texas and Kansas Relays in 1952.

This season, either Turner or football star Gib Dawson will become the fourth
 as Texas Coach Clyde Littlefield again aims at his long-time ambition—snapping
 the World's 440-yard relay record. Turner, a sophomore, has been clocked in
 9.8 in the century, while Dawson, who skipped track the past three years because
 of football, was timed in 9.6 as a schoolboy sprinter.

Littlefield could, in such meets as the Coliseum Relays, use his prize freshman,
 Joe Childress Peugh. The Odessa graduate dominated the Texas Scholastic
 Field for the past three years. His best time in the 100 is 9.6 seconds.

Yoder, who represented the U.S. in the 400-meter hurdles, will have to return
 to the 440 dash. The junior failed to qualify in the SWC quartermile last year,
 but became one of the season's surprises by placing second to Charles Moore in
 the 400 hurdles of tryouts.

Texas A&M again will be favored to grab its third consecutive SWC crown
 with Texas providing the swiftest competition. SMU, a surprise third, is likely
 to be in the same spot, with Arkansas, Rice, TCU and Baylor fighting for the
 remaining places.

The Aggies gathered 93 1/2 points last year but lost 36 by graduation. A&M will
 field a well-balanced team with its weakest event being the high jump where the
 departed Olympic record holder, Walt Davis, has left a big hole to fill. Too,
 Anderson won't have the depth that has overcome Texas' first places in recent
 years.

A&M has 15 returning lettermen with leading candidates being Hooper;

Bobby Ragsdale, broad jump and low hurdles; Glen Spradlin and Marcomb Marks, pole vault; and James Blaine, Dale Derouen, Charles Hudgens and Vernon Westmoreland, distance events.

Ragsdale won the SWC broad jump and trailed Texas' Ralph Person home in the lows, an event he figures to win with Person gone. Spradlin and Marks are capable of 14 feet in the pole vault while Blaine is three-time cross-country champion.

Texas lost 24 of its 70½ points by graduation. But Littlefield's team should be stronger in many events because of up-coming sophomores and junior college transfers plus Tom Rogers, back from a two-year hitch with the Marines.

Rogers is supposed to make Texas forget about a mite named Jerry Thompson. Rogers had excellent times as a freshman, but then the Marines grabbed him.

He'll help Texas in the distance and middle distance events along with James Carruthers, Richard Forester and Bruce Miller.

Forester, who hails from Illinois, was Texas' most promising freshman in 1952, doing well in the 220, 400 and half-mile. Miller, a transfer from Victoria, placed third in the 1951 National haycee.

Sophomores carry Texas' hopes in the field events—Bob Billings and Wayne Delancy in the high jump, David Dale in the broad jump and Jim Samuelson in the weights. Glenn Hoffman, another Victoria transfer, will give needed lift in the pole vault. He's done 13-6.

SMU has Bill Forester, Goode, Bobby Crooks, Lenroy Lowe and Ed Richardson for potential points. Forester has shadowed Hooper for two years. Goode, who qualified for the tryout 200-meter finals, pushed Texas' Thomas home last year in the 220. Crooks has a bright future in the quartermile while Lowe defends his two-mile championship.

Arkansas, minus track coach Johnny Morriss, who was moved out in a de-emphasis move, will again be strong in distance events spearheaded by Rick Heber, SWC one mile titlist; Temple Brown and Jim Bean, second and third place finishers in the two mile; and freshmen Alan Eshbaugh and Ed Morton.

Rice has no first place prospects but can count on points from quartermile Billy Ed Danielk, shot putter Ronnie Berger, freshman high hurdler Lamoiné Holland and discus throwers Ed Jackson and Fred Stancliff.

Baylor is building while TCU has Clinkscale and javelin thrower Wesley Ritchey to pour in a few points.

Abilene Christian College, which has risen under the regime of Oliver Jackson, may produce the Southwest's best quartermiler as well as the top mile relay team. George Adrian, sophomore from California, ran a 47.6 last year and also qualified for the NCAA finals.

Adrien anchored ACC's mile relay team which was clocked in 3:15.4 last year. Two of the lads who ran with Adrien are back—Buddy Garner and Burl McCoy. Don Conder, 1952 Arkansas State high school champion in the 440, 220, 100 and broad jump, will probably be the fourth member.

North Texas State will challenge ACC in the college class with potential point-getters in Ray Lucas, 13-9 pole vaulter; Charles Teague, 9.6 and 21.0 sprinter; Victor Rodriguez, 1952 junior college national champion in 880 with 1:57.4 and Dale Immel, sophomore miler with best time of 4:28.2.

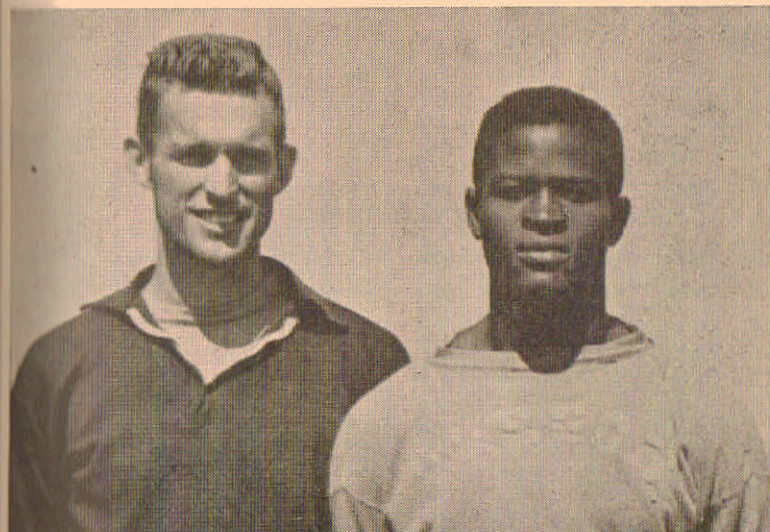

THE PACIFIC COAST

The Pacific Coast, barely recovered from its most glorious track and field season in 20 years, will suffer no let down during the post-Olympic year of 1953. To be sure there will not be the concentration of great meets—the NCAA's, National AAU's and Olympic tryouts were all in California in 1952—but the calibre of team and individual competition will continue on its always high level. Number one prediction is that Southern California, coached by Jesse Mortensen, will win its fifth consecutive NCAA championship, for the Trojans have men returning who scored all but ten of the 66 7/12 points they rolled up at Berkeley last June.

Stanford has the world's greatest all-around performer, Bob Mathias, Olympic decathlon champion for the second straight time with the new world record. Mathias, with no Olympic decathlon to work for will be used more in the hurdles and discus, where he has individual achievements comparable to the best. One of the greatest of athletes, Mathias has every necessary attribute to excel in any sport—marvelous coordination, physical qualifications to adopt himself to any event coupled with a terrific will to outdo the other guy.

Keith Brownsberger, promising sprinter who was injured in his freshman year of 1952; George, better than average quartermiler; and Bob Simon, Bob Reed and Wilfred King in the distances give Stanford strength on the flat. On the field, Chuck Renfro will aid Mathias in the discus; Howard Hertz promises to near 55 feet in the shot put, while Bob Kimball, Leo Long and Chuck Harlow, Jr., can all better 200 feet with the javelin.

UCLA still has George Brown, who hopes to make amends for his failure at Helsinki to break Jesse Owens' broad jump record. Brown will double in the sprints with Rod Richard, forming a dangerous 1-2 combine for dual meets. Jack Sage is strong in both the 440 and 880 and little Larry Carter should be one of the Coast's best two-mile runners. Dave Roselini is greatly improved in the hurdles, but lack of field strength in the weights will hamper the team.

Brutus Hamilton, head coach of the all-victorious American Olympic team, had a young and coming team last year at California, and many fans look for the Bears to worry the Trojans the most, especially in dual competition. Lon Spurrier, who improved tremendously in his sophomore year, figures to be the top halfmiler in the West. Jim Hutchinson, injured in an early 1952 meet, will be strong in the 440 and Steve Turner, Jr., likewise hurt last season, figures to have a fine hurdling and broad jumping campaign.

Guy Blackburn, who ran 9.6 as a freshman, is Hamilton's top dasher. On the field, the Bears have a trio of 52 feet or better shotputters in Clyde Wetter, back from Modesto JC, Hal Norris, eligible now, and Sam Adams, who also tosses the javelin 217 feet.

No Pacific Northwest school has all-around team strength, although there are several individuals to worry the California teams. Most notable is Oregon's high jumper, Emery Barnes, who did 6 feet 8 inches last year, and who tied Olympic champion Walt Davis for first in the NCAA meet.

For national team strength, though, there is no western team to touch USC. Olympic champions, Parry O'Brien in the shot put and Sim Iness in the discus, along with Helsinki high-hurdle runnerup Jack Davis will form the nucleus for another great Trojan team.

These three scored 46 points in the NCAA meet. O'Brien won the shot at 67 feet 5/8 inches, and was second to Iness (173 feet 2 3/8 inches) in the discus at

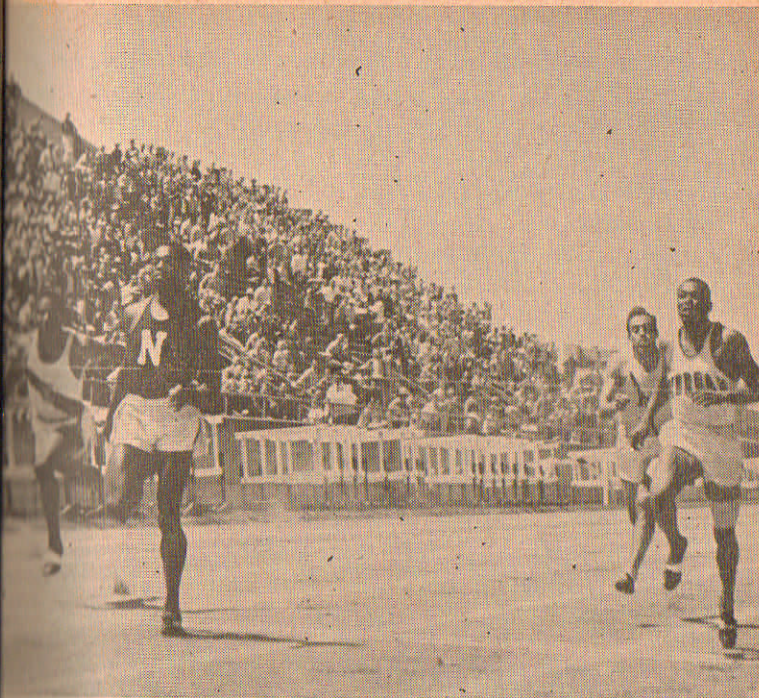

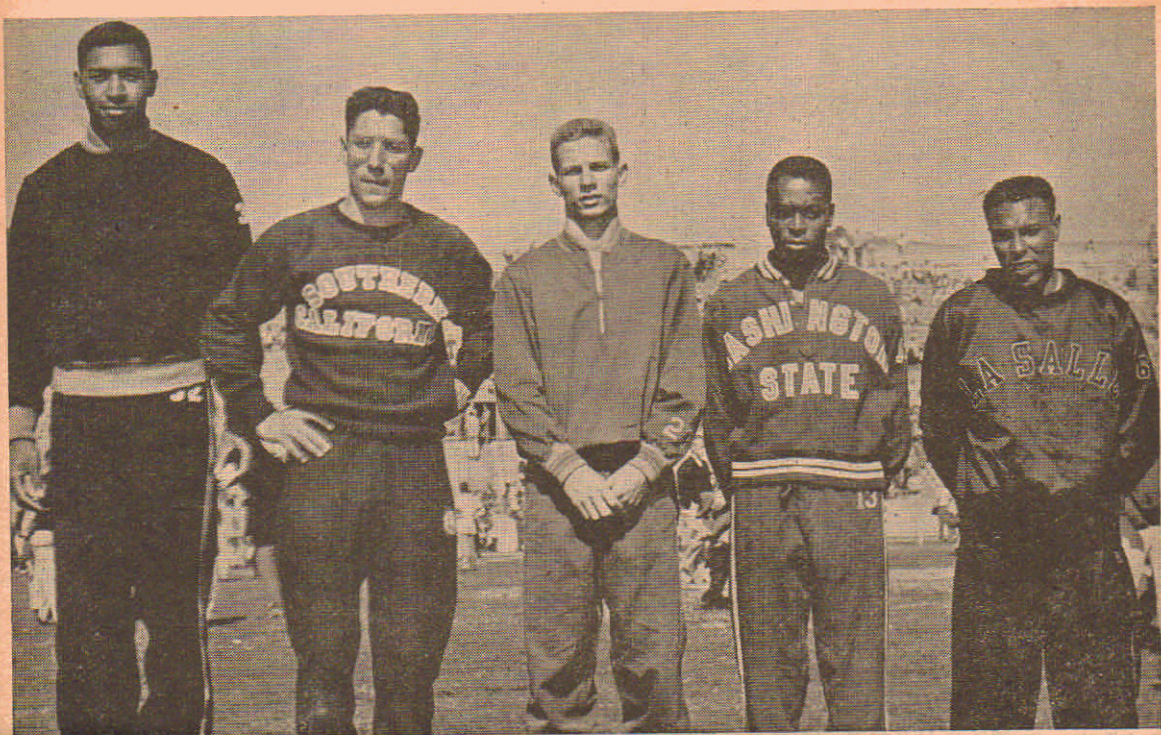

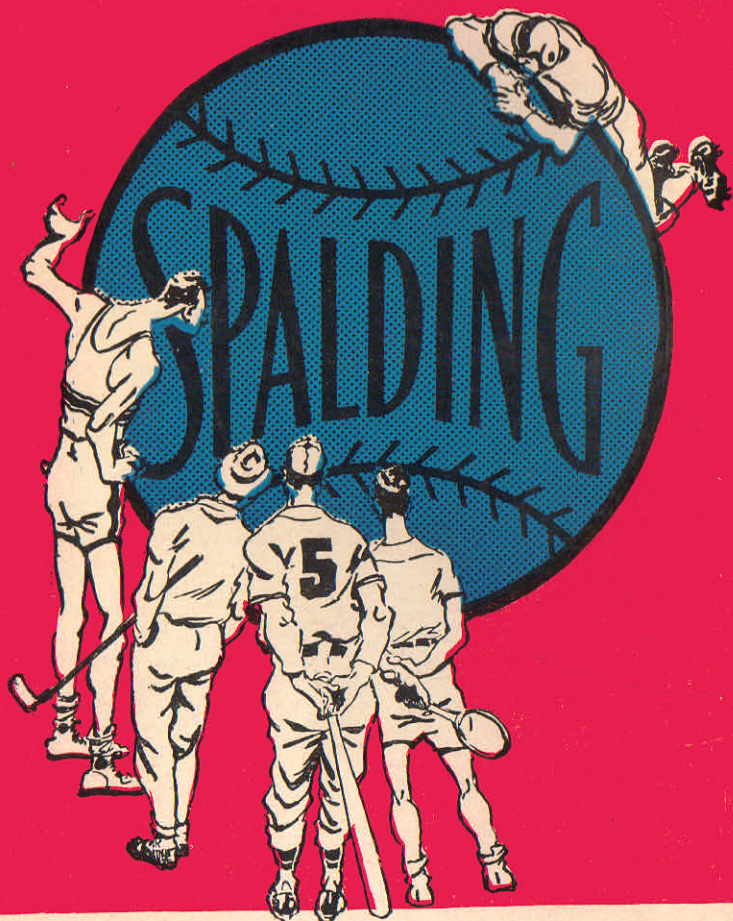
