National Collegiate Championships

Five meet records and as many defending champions fell victims to the 34th National Collegiate Championships last June at Memorial Coliseum in Los Angeles.

A sixth record was tied, and only Southern California's Ernie Shelton could successfully defend a 1954 title. However, Jim Golliday of Northwestern, who won the 100 meters in 1952, did return from two years in the Armed Service to re-capture the century and also the 220.

Southern California, aiming for its 19th team title and its seventh in succession, was forced into the final event before subduing cross-town UCLA, 42 points to 34.

Fans were scarcely in their seats for the Friday preliminaries before three javelins sailed beyond the meet record of 228-8 3/4 set by George Roseme of California in 1952. First it was Phil Conley of Cal Tech (231-7), then Charley Higgins of Brigham Young (232-5) and finally Jerry Church of Oregon State (232-6).

The thrills turned to shocked amazement a few moments later when Pittsburgh junior Arnie Sowell failed to qualify in his 880 heat. The heavily favored defending champion, Sowell had a mental lapse and contentedly loitered in fourth (first three places qualifying) in 1:52.6, a yard behind the leader. The remorseful Sowell later acknowledged that he "just went to sleep."

The 14,005 spectators saw the finals open with the javelin competition and two more record tosses. LaSalle's diminutive Al Cantello, who throws while diving headlong toward the scratch line, hit 245-3 1/2 and Les Bitner of Kansas followed with a 246-1 title throw.

The mile was a big upset as Australian Jim Bailey, Oregon sophomore, fulfilled the confidence of coach Bill Bowerman. Bailey had concentrated in the 880 all year, and Bowerman was eyed with surprise when he entered Bailey in the mile. The bulky 21-man field narrowed to four abreast into the straightaway—Bailey and the three favorites: UCLA sophomore Bobby Seaman, Emporia State sophomore Billy Tidwell and defending champion Bill Dellinger, Oregon junior. Tidwell was the first to weaken, then Seaman faltered and finally Dellinger fell off the pace as Bailey sprinted home in 4:05.6.

Golliday captured both sprints impressively. He ran an effortless 9.5 in his first 100 heat and lost a top challenger in the semi-finals as Penn State's Art Pollard confused the finish lines and quit too soon. In the finals, Golliday broke on top with Florida sophomore Bill (Bumper) Watson and eked out a two-foot advantage in 9.6. Golliday set a new meet record of 20.9 for a turn in his 220 heat and won the furlong final easily in 21.1.

An exciting 440 between Michigan State's Kevan Gosper and J. W. Mashburn of Oklahoma A&M was expected after they coasted to identical 47.6 semi-finals wins. But in the finals Manhattan sophomore Charley Jenkins provided the challenge for Mashburn, who won in 46.6.

With Sowell out of the 880, his season-long adversary, Tom Courtney of Fordham sprinted away from Michigan's Pete Gray for a new meet record of 1:49.5. Kansas' challenge for second place in team standings was thwarted on the first turn as Lowell Janzen was clipped on the heels and fell to the track.

Courtney's performance erased two famed 880-men from the record book, the old mark of 1:50.3 having been set by John Woodruff, Pittsburgh, in 1937 and equalled in 1949 by Mal Whitfield of Ohio State.

In the two-mile, Ken Reiser of Oregon turned on a \$9.5 final quarter for an easy 9:04.5 triumph. Jim Beatty, North Carolina sophomore who set a blistering early pace of 2:13.6 for the first 880, came back strong to pass Al Frame of Kansas for second.

Injuries in the preliminaries sidelined several hurdlers, among them defending high hurdle champion Willard Thomson of Illinois. Milt Campbell of Indiana, the surprise of the trials, pulled away from Manhattan's Charley Pratt in the finals to win in record-equalling time of 13.9, a time he also posted in the semi-finals.

The low hurdles were run from a chute and here Pratt displayed his superiority, continuing an unbroken victory string with a 23.1 win. Leon Clarke of Southern California finished third, thereby turning the tide against challenging UCLA, whose Charles Holloway finished sixth.

The pole vault was the last event to finish. UCLA gained one point and Southern California 10, thus settling the team championship and focusing all attention on Villanova's slender sophomore Don Bragg. He became the third collegian in history to clear 15 feet as he slithered over 15-1 cracking the 14-9 3/4 meet mark set by Don Laz of Illinois in 1951. Defending co-champion Earl Poucher of Florida finished in a four-way tie for second.

Shelton cleared 6-11 1/8 in the high jump to break Les Steer's 14-year-old meet record and then missed narrowly three times at the legendary seven feet. Only two men exceeded 24 feet in the broad jump. Joel Shankle of Duke was the winner at 24-3 1/4 after Mal Andrews of Arizona had taken an early lead at 24-1.

Shot put competition was the keenest in the meet's history, and a throw of 54-9 1/4—good enough to win in 1954—placed Billy Joe Wright of San Jose only seventh. Kansas Bill Nieder got off a 57-3 toss in the preliminaries and it stood up. Defending champion Tom Jones of Miami, O., fell one-half inch short.

USC's Des Koch completely mastered the discus field, arching a toss of 176-3/8, more than 12 feet beyond his nearest rival. Five of the six place winners were from the Southern California area.

THE EAST

Barring fire, flood, an infirmary full of pulled leg muscles and an unexpected epidemic of flunk-outs, Villanova could be the scourge of the eastern intercollegiate track and field world in 1956.

Indeed, if Coach Jumbo Jim Elliott's mob lives up to everybody's great expectations, it might even pose a formidable threat to Southern California's continued domination of the National Collegiate championship picture.

All set to lead the Philadelphians are three of the finest young performers in the world: Don Bragg, who with 15-1 in last year's National Collegiate Championship Meet became the fifth human ever to vault over the magic 15-foot mark; Charley Jenkins, National AAU quarter-mile champion at 46.7; and Ron Delany, who as a freshman last year won the Los Angeles Coliseum 880 in 1:50.4 from one of the greatest invitational fields ever assembled.

Not far behind the terrific trio are such other brilliant national championship prospects as George Snyder in the sprints, Roland Simpson in the 440 to 600-yard races; milers Alex Breckenridge and John Kopil, and high jumper Phil Reavis.

As a freshman last year, Snyder placed second in the Boston Knights of Columbus and NYAC sprints behind Rod Richard, the Pan-American titlist. He also beat Lindy Remigino, the Olympic century king. Simpson, also a sophomore this season, easily bettered 49 seconds in relay quarters last spring.

Breckenridge and Kopil ran one-two in the indoor ICAAAA mile last winter. Though both had rather mediocre seasons otherwise, potentially they are among the very best. Back home in Glasgow, Scotland, Breckenridge ran a 4:11.2 mile in 1953. That same year Kopil, as an 18-year old Bayonne, N. J., high schooler, ran an astounding 4:20.1 mile on a flat indoor track.

George Eastmont, whose Manhattan teams won the ICAAAA crowns indoors and out last season, admitted, "Yes, it seems like Villanova's year. They look as though they can score 40 points right now in our league. But we still appear good for at least 30 and we could make it interesting with our greater depth."

Probable Jasper pace setters are Ken Bantum, rapidly improving junior giant who is an outstanding shot and discus threat; Jim Doulin, 4:12 miler last year; Len Moore, sprinter and broad jumper; Bob Sbarra, two miler; Bill St. Clair and Tom Murphy, 800 and 1,000-yard runners; hurdler Lou Knight; Dick Simmons and Bob English, 440 and 600 striders; and high jumper Dick Shipley.

Individually, too, it shapes up as a tremendous season with Delany expected to provide one of the main highlights by challenging Amazing Arnold Sowell, Pitt's Pan-American champion. Many still believe Sowell the world's greatest current half-mile and 1,000-yard strider. And he may drop down to challenge his pal, Jenkins, in the 440 and 600.

Penn's John Haines, two-year winner of the National AAU 60-yard dash, seems ready to fight off dash challenges from Snyder, Moore, Penn State's Art Pollard and Princeton's Gabe Markisohn.

Maryland's Burr Grim, sophomore surprise winner of the ICAAAA outdoor mile last spring, will get strong threats from Breckenridge, Kopil, Doulin, NYU's Ike Matza and Syracuse's Les Vielbig.

George King, outdoor two-mile champion from NYU, has a reputation as an erratic runner, but figures to become more consistent under continuing pressure from Sbarra and Georgetown's Frank Pflaging and others.



THE SOUTH

As the South—and all other sections—sets its sights on track and field accomplishments that might lead to Olympic berths in 1956, the better collegiate bets down Dixie way seem to be Maryland's Burr Grim, North Carolina's Jim Beatty, Georgia Tech's Carl Vereen and Florida's Earl Poucher.

All of them turned in standout performances during the 1955 season and look forward to further assaults on the clock and tape this spring.

Among their accomplishments of the past season were Grim's record-setting mile of 4:09.6 in the ICAAAA meet, Beatty's 9:19.8 pacing of the Penn Relays Two-mile Special, Vereen's 172-11 sailing of the platter at the Drake Relays and Poucher's 14-6½ vault for second place in the National Collegiate Championship meet. He reached 14-10 in indoor competition.

Runners, jumpers and throwers from the Biscuit Belt projected themselves into commanding positions in 11 of the 14 regular events listed on the national track and field rankings. Dixie athletes did not participate in the 15th category, that of hammer throwing.

Others than the above named quartet could well knock at the Olympic door—fellows like George Dennis and Bob Barksdale, the Morgan State aces who have bettered 6-8 in the high jump; and Florida's Bumper Watson, who placed second in the National Collegiate 100 yard dash in a time of 9.7 despite having to limp home on a pulled muscle.

Teamwise, the only odds-on probability in Southern circles is that Morgan State should be a shoo-in for the CIAA crown. That's been the CIAA title picture for almost as many years as memory serves man.

The other battles should be fierce all along the line: Maryland, North Carolina and Duke look best in the Atlantic Coast; Auburn, Florida and Alabama in the Southeastern; V.M.I., Virginia Tech and William and Mary in the Southern; Roanoke, Bridgewater and Hampden-Sydney in the Mason-Dixon.

One of the South's really bright luminaries of the past three years graduated from Duke. Joel Shankle bedecked himself with blue ribbons from all areas of the country, and climaxed his collegiate action with the National Collegiate broad jump crown and with third place in the high hurdles.

North Carolina eased Maryland out of the championship circle in the Atlantic Coast Conference, while Auburn successfully defended its Southeastern Conference title and V.M.I. pulled the same trick in the Southern.

The temperature of competition in the Southeastern for the coming season is indicated by the return of all but three individual champions and the continued presence of the runner-up in every event.

Auburn's spotlight is on half-miler Dave Powell and high jumper Jack Yarborough; Florida has quarter-miler Jim Crosier and hurdler Lincoln Knowles to go with Poucher and Watson; and Louisiana State looks for title distance from javelinist Joe May.

With the setting of Shankle's collegiate sun, a new star is peeping over the Duke horizon—sophomore sprinter Dave Nime, a sprint sensation the experts say is labeled for greatness. Maryland banks heavily on distance runners Carl Party and Ben Good, sprinters Joe Hemler and Dave Leas and hurdler Perry Moore. Half-mile king Bob Jones is back at N. C. State.

Independent Navy comes in with a strong dual meet team headed by

quarter-miler Mark O'Hara and middle-distance star Walt Meukow. Georgetown's fine group of returnees includes two-milers Frank Pflaging and Bob Lippmeier, high hurdler Pete Fedak and shot tosser Paul Baroncelli.

Check 1956 as the season on sensational newcomers to midwest varsity competition, and put Michigan in dire peril of losing the Big Ten crown if it won after a long struggle to dethrone Illinois.

Wolverine Coach Don Canham has a certain first in the pole vault coming up with Eeles Landstrom of Finland, who set a new European record of 14-9 last summer. Other good sophomores include Dave Eldred, a 155-foot discus man; Dick Hill, a 14.7 hurdler; and Brendan O'Reilly of Ireland, a 6-3 high jumper. Geert Kielstrup is a 4:19 miler from Denmark.

Michigan State has a torrid sophomore trio: Dave Lean of Australia, British Empire Games 440-hurdles champ; Selwyn Jones, fine Canadian miler; and Henry Kennedy, a Scotsman via Canada who Coach Karl Schlademan believes will push nine minutes for two miles, plus stars like Joe Savoldi, Ed Graham and Dave Hoke.

Iowa welcomes back Ted Wheeler, Army serviceman who won the All-Army 880 in a nifty 1:50.2, and former Big Ten broad jump champion Earl Smith has recovered from injuries that kept him out in 1954. Soph Charles (Deacon) Jones ran 4:11 and 9:20 last winter as a yearling. Murray Keatinge, a 1:52 half miler, veteran vaulters Nick Piper and Gardner Van Dyke and crack hurdlers Les Stevens and Jack Matthews make Coach Francis Cretzmeyer happy again.

Indiana's Coach Gordon Fisher can start with a sure first place in the broad jump with sophomore Greg Bell, who exceeded 26 feet as a freshman and will also be a sprint scorer. Another top soph is Harold Caffey, Illinois schoolboy 440 champ, Tom Campbell, a service returnee and older brother of the famous Milt, beat Milt in 8.5 in a 70-yard high hurdle scamper last winter. Milt, after his brilliant 13.9's in winning the National Collegiate and NAAU high barrier titles, should be almost unbeatable.

Karl Jonsson, two miler, is the only man Leo Johnson has at Illinois who placed in the conference outdoor meet. Shot putter Larry Staff and vaulter Jerry Stannard have returned, and sophomore sprinters Bob Mitchell (9.7), Bob McKown and Curtis Griswold should help the rebuilding.


Ohio State has a truly great sophomore in Glenn Davis, who Coach Larry Snyder believes will become a 13.6 hurdler. He is also a crack sprinter and broad jumper. Roger Houck in the highs, Jack Blackburn in the mile and Jim Weaver in the vault will all help.

Minnesota will again be good in the weights, but there is little team balance. Field veteran Dale Yonkey, soph shot man Bob Henry and experienced sprinters Bury Carmichael and Bill Garner are the team foundation. Northwestern has more depth and a top-notch in 9.3 sprinter Jim Golliday, backed up by sizzling soph Charlie Carroll and hurdlers Toye and Movers.

Wisconsin lost little from 1954 and gets Dick Estick, who ran for Jamaica in the Pan-American Games. Sam Mylin, 6-5 jumper, is a good newcomer. Purdue looks weak, with two miler Vic Blumenthal as the best holdover.

Alex Wilson has his strongest Notre Dame squad with veterans Bernie Allard, 6-8 jumper; Bill Squires, a fine miler; Al Schoenig, Irish 880 record holder; 53-plus shot putter Byron Beams. Alex Petrichella will be reinforced in the dashes by great sophomore Aubrey Lewis.

Coach George Rider will turn out another good team at Miami of Ohio, while Western Michigan, Michigan Normal and Baldwin-Wallace are likely to be the powers among the less populous schools.



THE MISSOURI VALLEY

The monotonous pattern of Midlands' track and field that has kept Kansas and Oklahoma A&M marching in the vanguard will continue through 1956.

Bill Easton's Jayhawkers, now riding a streak of 12 consecutive Big Seven championships look stronger than ever and likely will challenge Southern California and UCLA for the National Collegiate title.

Kansas will again leap high into the relays limelight after a year of chasing A&M. Easton returns every boss in his distance stable and owns a anchor ace in Al Frame, 1954 National Collegiate cross country champion.

Oklahoma A&M lost much of its distance punch, but Ralph Higgins will build combinations from the 440 through the mile around J. W. Mashburn, National Collegiate 440 champion, and will field enough team strength to dominate the Valley as the Cowpokes have through 15 consecutive titles.

Returning are two national champions, a pair of two-event conference outdoor winners, a host of veterans and likely sophomores that include Al Oerter, the new national freshman discus record holder at 171-3; Kent Floerke, two-time AAU hop-step-jump place winner; 213-foot javelin thrower Jim Landerholm; and potential 14-foot vaulter Dave Tams.

Bill Nieder and Les Bitner are the returning National Collegiate kings. The former fired the shot 57-3 for the big title, set a new Big Seven record of 57-11 $\frac{3}{8}$, and scored a grand slam of the Texas, Kansas, Drake relays circuit. Bitner set a new National Collegiate javelin mark of 246-1.

The two-event conference winners are Dick Blair in the 100 and 220 and Frame in the mile and two mile. Frame's times of 4:16.5 and 9:27.9 represent the lowest aggregate clocking ever among the seven men who have brought off the distance double in the conference.

Furthermore, Easton returns every member of a cross country team that won its eighth consecutive conference meet and placed fourth in the National Collegiate. And some of the veterans will be pressed by youngsters Bobby Nicholson and Jerry McNeal, who ran 1-3 in the Kansas Relays Steeplechase.

Oklahoma A&M's baton foursomes in the shorter races will be as formidable as last year. Chuck Scully, transfer from Oklahoma U. who ran second in the Big Seven 440 as a sophomore, is again ready for action, and Jackie Hays, Fred Schermerhorn and the valuable Mashburn are again on hand.

Kim Ellis, the grand slam broad jump king of the Texas-Kansas-Drake relays also returns with Valley javelin champ Delane Woolfolk; discus titlist Dick Joyner; pole vault winner Charles Manwarring. Sture Landqvist is the only holdover member of the Scandinavian distance gang.

Houston again figures second. New coach Johnny Morriss has Ronnie Pruitt, winner of both hurdles; Doyle Jones and Jerry Beck from last year's torrid sprint foursome; and shot champion Bill McHroy.

Oklahoma and Missouri will pose the chief barriers to Kansas. The Sooners return pole vault titlist Hendrik Krueger; 440 winner John Dahl; broad jump king Erwin Cook; indoor two-mile champion Bobby Buchanan; all members of the indoor and outdoor mile relay title teams; conference discus record holder Bob Van Dee who tossed the plate 165-3 $\frac{7}{8}$ and hurdler Bob Derrick. The latter set a board track indoor record of 6.7 in the 60-yard lows to win the Big Seven and also copped the Kansas Relays 120 highs.

Missouri returns Bill Constantine, high hurdles champion; 880 indoor titlist Pete Beard; a 13-4 vaulter in Karl Englund and a flock of capable half-milers, quarter-milers and hurdlers.

THE SOUTHWEST

Sophomore Bobby Morrow of Abilene Christian College and freshman Eddie Southern of Texas may dominate the 1956 southwest track picture and be this section's top Olympic prospects.

Morrow was undefeated in the 100 as a freshman. He won the Texas Relays, the NAIA (with a wind-aided 9.1) and the National AAU, suffering defeat only in the AAU 220. Southern shattered the national schoolboy 440 record in the state meet (47.2), and equalled Jesse Owens' 220 mark (20.7) and missed the high hurdles record by one-tenth of a second with a 14.1.

The Texas frosh also have a spectacular mile relay team: Southern, Wally Wilson, Hollis Gainey and George Willis. They can run close to 3:12.

Texas' two-year hold on the SWC track crown could be snapped by Texas A&M, second by two points last year, or third-place Rice. Graduation hit the Longhorns a wicked blow, but Jerry Prewit and Robert Whilden, half of Texas sprint relay team which set a world record of 40.2 at the California Relays, remain. Prewit is a 9.6 dashman and Whilden a 21.1 stepper. Other holdovers include Bob Hanson (880), Hulen Hale (mile) and James Pfau (high jump). Sophomores Paul Schumann and Joe Irvin offer needed weight strength.

Texas A&M's points are again in the hurdles and field events. James Hollingsworth, SWC high hurdle winner, is back, and up from the frosh squad is hurdler Emmett Smallwood. Tom Bonorden, Herman Johnson and Lew Newman picked up 18 points in the SWC weights. And add Bobby Gross, 1954 shot and discus winner who missed last year because of an injury. Winton Thomas was second in the pole vault and Fritz Connally tied Pfau for first in the high jump.

If Rice can shake the injury jinx, the Owls could take their first SWC title since 1939. They count on Harold Griffin, third in the 1954 National Collegiate 440; Dale Spence, upset victor in the SWC 880 in 1:52.6; Orville Trask and Ed Keasler in the shot and javelin. Wesley Hight missed the SWC meet because of an injury, but the Texas Relays high hurdle winner may be one of the nation's best. His top time was 14.1. The better Rice sophomores are sprinter Richard Stone and field specialist James Charnquist.

Baylor should be improved under new coach Jack Patterson. Low hurdler Robert Herod (23.2) and broad jumper Raymond Vickery (23-10½) head the lettermen. There are six outstanding sophomores: Allen Mayne, 440 and 880; Tom Kelley and Fred Bentley, who high jumped 6-7¾; Troy Moody, 220 and 440; Merton Fuquay, sprinter and hurdler; and Larry Cowart, frosh shot winner.

SMU, where Coach McAdoo Keeton has harvested his best freshmen crop, is a year away, though his one-two punch of Don Morton and David Weaver return. Morton finished fourth in the 1954 National Collegiate 440 and Weaver had a 1:52.2 in the SWC 880. Sophomores high jumper Clarence Miller (6-6¾) and broad jumper Dick Orsini (23-3) will help.

TCU's Olympic candidate is hurdler Bill Curtis, out of school last year after winning the SWC highs as a soph and beating Illinois' Willard Thomson in the Drake Relays. The Frogs also have a new coach, J. Eddie Weems.

Arkansas has only one point-winner back from the conference meet, Ed Morton, junior from Winnipeg, Canada, who was second in the mile.

Abilene Christian lost but two men from its NAIA championship squad and

may come up with the nation's fastest sprint quartet: Waymon Griggs, James Forrest, Don Conder and Morrow. They had a 41.3 in the 440 relay and 1:26.0 in the 880. Then there are Mack Clark (23.0 low hurdler) and Paul Johnson (4:17.0 miler).

North Texas State landed the state's best high school half miler, Bobby Moschart, who had a 1:54.3 last year. Standout lettermen are sprinter Boyd Dullay (9.6 and 21.1), quartermiler Jimmy Weaver (48.3) and weightman Bob Burch.

THE ROCKY MOUNTAINS

Brigham Young dominated track and field activities of the Rocky Mountain region in 1955 as no other school ever has, and no relief is in sight for the other seven members of the widely-spread Skyline Conference.

In the smaller Rocky Mountain loop, Idaho State won its fifth championship in a row, again spreadeagled the field in the RMC relay carnival and returns enough strength to be rated the odds-on favorite in 1956.

The cinder sport is building in the high mountain country and the way the BYU Cougars, under the fine tutelage of Clarence Robinson, are grabbing hold, they'll soon be a factor in the National Collegiate championships.

The Mormon boys scored 85½ points in the Skyline meet, within three of the total of the next three teams and 54½ more than second place Montana. They smashed three conference records, tied another, won seven blue ribbons, placed in all but one event and finished lower than third twice.

BYU's greatest strength is in the javelin where Harold Norton and Charles Higgins reach 220 feet consistently. Other strong points are the middle distances, the broad and high jumps.

Headliners are halfmilers Arlin Finlinson, Paul and Oscar Anderson, one-two-three in the Skyline meet; quartermilers Jim Crittenden and Guy DeHart; sprinter Harry Anderson; hurdlers Willard Hirschi and Tom Burr; distance champ Serald James; high jumpers John Gourley and Doug Spainhower; broad jumpers Mel Wilkes, Ben Brooks and Raynor Pearcee and shot-putter Mary Roberson.

Montana's main loss is Don Brant, double sprint winner and conference century record holder. The Grizzlies regain Dick Lindsay, '53 high stick runner-up who returns from service, and discus champ Russ Sheriff is back.

Elsewhere in the western division Utah looks somewhat weaker on the basis of graduation losses, though a strong freshman contingent will give the Redskins greater balance. Miler Bruce Johnson is perhaps the Utes' top returnee in the flat races, while high jump champ Cal Clark is also back. Top notch pole vaulter Oscar Jackson may also be on hand to help the Utes.

Sprinter Ezra Smith and 440 champion Doug Anderson are the nucleus of Utah State's hopes.

On the other side of the mountains a wide open battle looms for the eastern division title with New Mexico again slightly favored, but with Denver definitely stronger, and both Wyoming and Colorado A & M improved.

Albuquerque's Lobos will miss the services of sprinter Bobby Lee, but brother Oliver in the hurdles will again be bidding strongly for both divisional and conference titles. Shot put champion and record holder Larry Ross will head Denver's contingent, which will be bolstered by good sophomores and renewed track and field interest under Coach Dale Hardy.

Colorado A&M will depend upon youngsters to give it the balanced power it once had. Pole vaulter Bill Vaughn and quartermiler Don Shoemaker are the best of the returning crop.

Conference titleholders Jim Elder in the mile and John Rushing in the broad jump head Wyoming's squad and the Cowboys have hopes that Arthur Brauss, a freshman pole vaulter; Phil Mulkey, a service returnee who likes the decathlon and a sprinkling of freshmen will provide better balance.

Idaho State's freshman sensation, Wilbur Harris, broke two Rocky Mountain Conference marks when he ran a 9.8 century into a five-mile wind and around one turn in the furlong in 22 flat, Western State's Clifford Jantz set a new low hurdle standard around one turn of 25.3s.

THE PACIFIC COAST

Southern California's Trojans, winners of the last seven National Collegiate titles, are coming up with another powerhouse, but may be pressed nationally by Kansas and U.C.L.A.

The Bruins have solid big-meet points in Bob Seaman, a shade under 1:50 in the half and two seconds over 4:00 in the mile; 46.6 quarter-miler Lusa Ellis; Don Vick (57-5 and 168-9) in the shot and discus; and Ron Drummond, who has bettered Vick's best discus mark by almost a foot.

Sophomore Rafer Johnson, the amazing kid who broke Bob Mathias' world deathlon record, can score in just about everything. He's skimmed the highs in 14, the lows in 22.9 and broad jumped 24-6.

The Trojans may have their best dual meet team with quarter-miler Mike Larabee, distance runners Sid Wing and Fernando Ledesma, hurdler Leon Burke, shot putter Ray Martin, brilliant footballer and broad jumper Jon Arnett and vaulters Ron Morris and Walt Levack. Then there are newcomers Tom Anderson, 1:51.2 half-miler; 14.6 high hurdler Bob Lawson; Max Bruex, 9:16 two-miler; Dick Bronson, 54-foot shot man; sprinter Dick Dorsey; half-miler Chuck Kirkby; and low hurdler Bill Swisshelm.

California's Bears lack dual meet balance and depth, but should do well in the nationals. Three sophomores are brilliant: sprinters Leamon King, 4 and 20.9; Don Bowden, 1:51.5 and 4:11.7 in the 880 and mile; and Monte Lushaw, 25-foot broad jumper. And don't forget veterans like 14-foot vaulter Larry Anderson, 54-foot shot putter John Kahnert and Charley Butt, just under 55 feet in the shot and over 160 in the discus.

Stanford's best bets are hurdlers Jim Luttrell and Bernie Nelson, high jumpers Phil Fehlen and John Stewart and broad jumper John Herrmann.

Northwest talent is thin, but Oregon still has its terrific distance duo of Jim Bailey and Bill Dellinger, who run the mile in about five seconds over four minutes and finished one-two at last year's National Collegiate meet.

Occidental's Eddie Shinn flirts with 1:50 in the half; Tom Meyer has bettered 57 in the shot; Kelley Hester has passed 165 with the discus with Jim Mathias only a foot behind; Bob Gutowski vaults 14-6 and Dick Haddon high jumps 6-6; and Phil Presher broad jumps 24-5.

Good sophomores are quarter-miler John Zetzman and miler Ty Hadley; top junior college transfers include distance runner Danny Schweikart, JC mile and two-mile record holder, and low hurdler Mickey Machamer.

Fresno State has sprinter Mike Agostini, who wandered to the Pacific Coast from Trinidad via Villanova University, vaulter Art Pederson, 880 ace Dave Casper and hurdler Ancel Robinson. San Jose returns the 1953 National Collegiate half-mile champion, Lang Stanley, from service to go with 231-foot javelin thrower Lynn Greene, 14-foot vaulters Chuck High-tower and O. W. Rhodes and 55-foot shot man Billy Joe Wright.

Other top Far West individuals are Cal Tech's javelin thrower Phil Conley (231-7); San Francisco's spectacular basketballer and high jumper Bill Russell; Cal Aggies' 9.6 sprinter Jack Threlkeld; Willamette's 14.3 high hurdler Den Benson; and San Diego State's half-miler Tom Noll.

There's a wealth of talent in these parts and wholesale assault on collegiate records should result, especially in the longer relays where Southern California, U.C.L.A. and Occidental are loaded. And the distance duels, featuring Seaman, Dellinger, Dailey and Wing, could produce America's first sub-four-minute mile, assuming Wes Santee doesn't get it first.


