



National Collegiate Championships

UCLA broke the seven-year victory skein of the University of Southern California and new individual champions were crowned in every event, save one, at the 1956 National Collegiate Championships at Edwards Field, Berkeley, California, on June 15 and 16.

Graceful Arnie Sowell of Pittsburgh led the dazzling pack of Olympic-year hopefuls as he raced to a new American record of 1:46.1 in the 800 meters to share the spotlight with a husky, crewcut blond sprinter from Abilene Christian, Bobby Morrow, who convincingly stamped himself as America's No. 1 sprinter with a double victory.

Meet records fell in rapid-fire order with 10 new marks, including Sowell's, in the 18-event program, but this was accounted for in part by Olympic year events and distances.

Southern California, team champion 19 times since 1921 and winner the past seven years, entered the meet with its chances dimmed due to a series of mid-season misfortunes. Trojan hopes sagged in the very first event on Friday when their diminutive distanceman, Max Truex, a leading contender, dropped from the 10,000 meters in the 17th lap. Selwyn Jones, the sturdy Canadian runner from Michigan State, continued to win the event in meet record time of 31:15.3, and Kansas moved into the favored role for the team championship as Allen Frame and Jerry McNeal picked up six points by finishing fourth and fifth, respectively.

The Jayhawks, in turn, fell victims to UCLA on Saturday as the Bruins contributed a series of come-through performances to score their first team triumph in National Collegiate Championship history. UCLA finished with 57 7/10 points to 51 for Kansas and 34 1/2 for Southern California.

UCLA scored heavily in the discus with Ron Drummond the winner at 173-0 1/2 and Don Vick second. Kansas sophomore, Al Oerter, who had been favored, finished fourth. Vick scored again in the shot put as he finished fourth to Ken Bantum of Manhattan who won in 60-0 1/2 for a new meet record and the distinction of being the third collegian of all time to put the shot over 60 feet.

Nick Dyer came through for UCLA in the high jump to tie for first with Phil Reavis, Villanova, and Bob Lang of Missouri at 6-6 1/4. Another nine points were scored by UCLA in the broad jump behind the winning mark of 25-9 3/4 set by Greg Bell of Indiana as Rafer Johnson finished second and Dick Knaub sixth.

Johnson also scored eight points in the 110 meter high hurdles with a spectacular race, losing by two feet to Lee Calhoun of North Carolina, who set a new meet record of 13.7. Johnson held the lead until the last 10 yards. UCLA also scored with a fourth in the 400 meters and another fourth in the 1500 meters.

A prize attraction of the afternoon was the 1500 meters and two sub-four minute milers, defending champion Jim Bailey of Oregon and Ron Delany of Villanova. The sun-drenched crowd of 21,000 was not disappointed, although the time was slow, as the pair turned on a brilliant burst of speed over the last furlong with Bailey the winner in 3:47.3, a new meet record. After a slow pace, Bailey was about to take over as leader from California's Don Bowden with 250 yards to go when Delany roared by the surprised Bailey and opened up a quick five yard gap which the defending champ couldn't close. Delany ran the final lap in 54.1. Bailey in 54.6.

J. W. Mashburn of Oklahoma A&M was the only 1955 champion to repeat his victory as he out-fought John Haines of Pennsylvania in a torrid stretch run to win the 400 meters in 46.4, the same time also being given Haines less than a foot back.

The durable Morrow gave an awesome display of sprinting power as he soundly whipped such performers as Dave Sime of Duke, Mike Agostini of Fresno State and Leamon King of California in a 10.4 100-meters. Morrow was off the blocks quickly and the race was never in doubt.

Morrow and Sime renewed their battle in the 200 meters as they shot from the blocks and into the turn in adjacent lanes. Midway round the curve, tragedy struck as Sime faltered and nightmarishly limped off the track with a leg muscle pulled from the terrific pressure of running the turn, in which he was lacking experience. Morrow won handily in 20.6, a new meet record around a turn.

Bill Dellinger of Oregon, mile winner in 1954 and second in 1955 toyed with the 5000 meter field as he stayed with the pack and then sprinted the final lap in 64.2 to win in 14:48.5. Henry Kennedy of Michigan State broke the meet record in the 3000 meter steeplechase as he withstood the late challenge of Ike Matza of NYU to win in 9:16.5 for a meet record.

Aubrey Lewis, Notre Dame football star, won the 400-meter hurdles in brilliant fashion in 51 seconds flat as he overtook Ohio State's Glenn Davis in the stretch with a superior display of pacing. Both men broke the meet record.

A superb field in the pole vault lost much of its luster when Villanova's Don Bragg, greatest collegian vaulter of all time, scratched due to a pre-meet injury. Jim Graham of Oklahoma A&M and Bob Gutowski of Occidental both vaulted well to tie at 14-8.

Cal Tech's four-sport man and honor student, Phil Conley, won the javelin at 231-8, thereby avenging his poor fortune of the previous year in which he was first to break the meet record, only to finish fifth as four others improved on his mark.

Four men exceeded the old meet record in the hammer throw as Bill McWilliams of Bowdoin won at 195-3. Two others were within two feet of him. Bill Sharpe of West Chester State set a new meet record in another Olympic year event as he hit 50-4 1/4 in the hop, step and jump.

The many brilliant performances in the 35th annual National Collegiate Championships, held on the University of California campus, were augmented by the precise manner in which the program was conducted and praise is due Head Track Coach Brutus Hamilton, Director of Athletics Greg Engelhard, and their staff for their efforts.



Eastern collegiate track and field in general and the ICAAAA in particular lost some of the world's greatest as the 1956 school year closed down.

Gone in the customary turnover were such wizards as Pennsylvania sprinter Johnny Haines, Pittsburgh half miler Arnold Sowell, New York U. two miler George King, Manhattan broad jumper-sprinter Len Moore, Harvard discus twirler Art Siler and Cornell 35-pound weight tosser Al Hall.

Just the same, the 1957 campaign promises to be at least as heroic as its predecessor.

Ron Delany of Dublin and Villanova U., who last spring joined the still-exclusive sub-four-minute mile club, figures to be back faster and slicker than ever.

Manhattan shot putter Ken Bantum and Villanova pole vaulter Don Bragg and 440 and 600 yarder Charley Jenkins—also among those who have achieved prominence in their specialties matched by very few other humans—were expected back to share individual glory with Delany.

Teamwise, George Eastman's ever-powerful Manhattan College forces once again were ready to defend stoutly in order to retain its indoor and outdoor laurels against fresh assaults from Jumbo Jim Elliott's smaller but more spectacular Villanova squad.

Eastern speed, strength and skill were never more strikingly apparent than in the 1956 Olympic year where more than a dozen IC4A standard bearers, past and present, were poised to make laurel-wreath bids in Melbourne.

Stickout among Olympic title hopes Down Under were such undergraduates as Bantum, Bragg and Jenkins, Delany, conqueror of John Landy's conqueror, Jim Bailey; Villanova's little Phil Reavis in the high jump and LaSalle's Ira Davis in the hop, step and jump.

Likely post graduate contenders in Australia were world record holder Lou Jones of Manhattan in the 400 meters; Tom Courtney of Fordham, 800; Horace Ashenfelter, Penn State, in the 3000-meter steeplechase, in which he's defending record holder; Curt Stone, also ex-Penn State, in the 5000; Dick Hart of Pennsylvania holder; and Gordon McKenzie, NYU, in the 10,000; Joel Shankle, Duke, high hurdles; Hall, Cliff Blair and Hal Connolly of Boston U., in the hammer throw, and Johnny (The Kid) Kelley, Dean Thackwray and Nick Costes, all of Boston U., in the marathon run.

What makes youngsters like Bantum and Bragg so unusual? Going into the Olympic trials, the former defeated Parry O'Brien, world record holder, and also joined O'Brien and Kansas' Bill Neider as the only 60-foot shot putters ever.

The scene could be brightened by Dave Sime, Duke's flying world record breaker in the sprints indoors and special outdoor features, provided he recovers from leg injuries and can spare time from his baseball outfielding.

Breaking the picture down by events, prospective 1956-57 stars appear to be Sime and Pitt's Herb Carper in the dashes.

Jenkins, Notre Dame's Aubrey Lewis, Harvard's Dick Wharton, Villanova's Roland Simpson, Cornell's John Ingle, Manhattan's Tom Murphy, Dartmouth's Doug Brew and Villanova's Delany appear as 440-600-880-1000 luminaries.

Delany, Manhattan's Jim Doulin, Maryland's Burr Grim, NYU's Ike Matza, Villanova's Al Breckenridge and John Kopil loom ready for mile and two-mile virtuosity.



THE SOUTH

An unfortunate injury kept 19-year-old Dave Sime from earning a place on the 1956 United States Olympic team, but the redheaded Duke University lad's record-breaking sprees during the past indoor and outdoor campaigns stamped him as the most exciting athlete in the history of southern track.

True Dave is a New Jersey native, but he is Dixie developed. This Blue Devil flash first hit the headlines during the indoor season but really became a sensation down in the football-minded South when he bettered two worlds records and tied another during the outdoor season. On May 5, Sime clipped Harrison Dillard's 220 yard low hurdles record by 1/10th of a second as he was clocked in 22.2.

Then six days later at the Atlantic Coast Conference championships, Dave reduced Mel Patton's mark of 20.2 for the 220-yard dash by a tenth of a second. On June 9 at the Central California AAU championships he covered the 220 in 20 seconds flat to improve on his own record. Long Dave tied the 100 yard mark of 9.3 twice. He whipped Olympic sprinter Bobby Morrow in the 100 at the Drake Relays. And then the pulled thigh muscle ruined his Olympic chances.

However, the speedy Blue Devil is already looking ahead to the '57 season and the 1960 Olympics. And Atlantic Coast track fans are looking forward to seeing him in action again.

While Sime was missing out on the Olympic team, Lee Calhoun of North Carolina College was capturing the National Collegiate high hurdle crown in meet record time of 13.7 and finishing in a dead heat (13.8) with Jack Davis in the final Olympic trials to earn passage to Melbourne. Jim Beatty of the University of North Carolina was another outstanding ACC performer in the distances. Maryland's Burr Grim was good enough to place eighth in the National Collegiate 1500 meters.

The Southeastern Conference produced some bright performers but none of them made much of a splash in the National Collegiate Championships. Carl Vereen, Georgia Tech's big football tackle, tossed the discus 175-5½ inches in a dual meet with Miami but couldn't reach this peak again during the year. His Yellow Jacket mate, 240-pound Fred Berman, put the shot 56-4¼, a new SEC and southern record.

Bill Duckworth, University of Georgia javelin thruster, brought his record up to 230-6½ but injured his arm in the National Collegiate trials though his 220-2 landed him the fourth place medal before his forced retirement. Duckworth still has another year of eligibility with the Bulldogs where he works under Coach Spec Towns, the former Olympic and world high hurdle record holder.

Percy Beard's Florida Gators captured the SEC team crown with a well balanced club headed by pole vaulter Earl Poucher. The team will be hit heavily by graduation but should have one of the conference's best sprinters in Ellis Goodloe. Goodloe did 9.6 as a freshman last season.

Coach Johnny Sines of Tennessee, who has developed some fine milers since taking over the Vol track reins, may have his best in senior Ed Murphrey. Ed did 3:52 in the National Collegiate 1500 meters which is equivalent to a 4:09 mile. He finished sixth at Berkeley, and was seventh in the Olympic trials.

Murphrey appears a sure bet to win the SEC mile for the third straight time and erase the conference record of 4:15.1 held by another former Tennessee runner, Alf Holmberg. Coach Sines believes Murphrey will hit 4:05 or 4:06 this season. He plans to campaign him in some of the big indoor meets.

THE MIDDLE WEST

There are indications that Michigan's two-year reign as kingpin in the Big Ten may be halted this year. Best bet to do the job seems to be Indiana, with Michigan state an unbalanced but fairly strong contender.

Of the Wolverines who beat off Iowa and Indiana last spring, only two individuals of great importance will be back. They are Dave Owen, the league's two-time shotput champion, and sprinter Dick Flodin, a fine furlong and 440 man.

Michigan will have good high jump strength with Irish record-holder Brendan O'Reilly and Stan Menees returning. Jimmy Pace, the football halfback who almost won the Big Ten indoor 60, is the only century man of consequence. But Flodin, Laird Sloan and Bob Rudesill furnish the basis for another tough mile relay combination. They helped run 3:13.9 that was good for second behind Indiana at the conference meet.

From the 880 up, the talent is not very outstanding. It includes Robin Varian, Geert Kielstrup and a soph distance man named Cam Gray from Canada. The upcoming frosh do not furnish as much strength as in recent years.

Indiana begins with Don Ward, the league's 440 champ who should crack 47 sec. this year, and with Olympian Greg Bell in the broad jump. The latter is improving as a sprinter, too, having run 20.8 in the state AAU meet.

Harold Caffey in the 440 and John Miller, a 1:52 half miler, return along with Tom Campbell, a 14.4 hurdler; Brealon Donaldson, pole vault and broad jump veteran, and Jerry Lane, who was second in the Big Ten shot and has tossed the discus 156 feet.

Coming up from the frosh is a very classy group. Willie May, a 14.1 high school hurdler, is included with several fine distance prospects. They are NaVerne Wille; a 4:23 Indiana high school miler; Ron Long, who ran 4:25 to win the Illinois state title, and Bill Abele, who took the Pennsylvania state championship at 4:26.

Michigan State lost only two big scorers—Edgar Brabham and Joe Savoldi, Jr. Veteran Canadians Selwyn Jones and Henry Kennedy again fortify the strong cross-distance corps, and Henry's brother Crawford, 5th in the National AAU cross-country meet, became a sophomore in January.

Coach Karl Schlademan's entire Big Ten cross-country championship team is back, and the versatile Dave Lean of Australia, hurt much of last season, is expected to score heavily in the hurdles or 440 and 880. Glen Burgett, former Michigan scholastic champ in the dashes, is among the good sophomores.

Iowa, which had to win the crown last spring or forget it for a while, will not be as strong as in '56. Caesar Smith, 440 and 880 ace, enlisted in the Army on top of many graduation losses. Charles (Deacon) Jones, the Olympic steeplechaser who enrolls in February upon returning from Melbourne, will furnish the distance punch. Gardner Van Dyke and Nick Piper, 14-foot vaulters, plus Jack Matthews in the hurdles are on hand again.

For the first time in several years, Ohio State will have balance. The superb Glenn Davis, world record holder for the 400-meter hurdles, can do anything below the 880, and broad jump too.

Jack Blackburn, ineligible last year, and George Jones, who has returned to school after a year's absence, add much to the strength between 440 and two miles. Vaulters Stan Lyons and Jim Weaver return, as does Jack McClain, a 1:53 half-miler. There are several sophomore whizzes, including Dick Payne, who ran 47.9

last spring; Ron Peel, who did 1:56, and Gene Cotterman, Ohio schoolboy shot and discus champ.

Illinois has a fair group of distance men, headed by Bob Dintelman and Karl Jonsson. Al Urbanckas, co-champion in the high jump; veterans Larry Staff and Bob Pellatt in the weights, and a new shotputter, Larry Stewart, will help in field events. Bob Mitchell, football halfback who had one 9.6 in high school, bolsters the sprint array.

The great Jim Golliday has used all his eligibility at Northwestern, and Chuck Carroll, his brother-in-law, must try to fill the gap. Len DePalma in the mile; half-mile Kent Clancy and 440 man Guy Osborn return. The sophomore crop includes an Ohio schoolboy hotshot, sprinter Wilmer Fowler, and George Schneider, a fine hurdler-sprinter from Chicago.

Wisconsin's hopes are down, with Jamaican Sam Estick out of school. A service returningee is Leo Shillingaw, who vaulted 14 feet four years ago. Purdue again will be weak, and Minnesota will be only average.

Amoag independents, Notre Dame has Aubrey Lewis, the NCAA 400-meters hurdle champion and fine sprinter; Joe Foreman, who made the Canadian Olympic team in the dashes; and distance man Dick DeCamillo and Byron Beams, 53½-foot shotputter.

One of the excellent prospects among small colleges is Charley Nance of Baldwin-Wallace, who ran the 440 in 48.2 as a freshman. He has hurdle and jumping star Estus Newberry as a companion.

Powerful Miami of Ohio won its ninth consecutive Mid-American Conference title last spring, but such outstanding stars as Tirrel Burton and Dave Wood are lost by graduation.



THE MISSOURI VALLEY

Kansas and Oklahoma A&M, which furnished four members of Uncle Sam's 1956 Olympic team, figure once more to dominate track and field in their conferences as they have to these many years.

The Oklahoma Aggies own a string of 16 consecutive Missouri Valley championships and Kansas has swept the Big Seven indoor and outdoor meets five years in a row, not to mention the ten straight league cross-country titles hauled in by Bill Easton's relentless Jayhawker harriers.

Neither of these cinder dynasties appears in immediate danger, but there are signs indicating more formidable competition in the offing.

Oklahoma and Nebraska, the latter under direction of former Georgetown coach, Frank Sevigne, have bristling rebuilding programs underway. Neither is stopping, even at the continental borders of America in search of the swift and the mighty.

Oklahoma A&M's reign in the Missouri Valley, which dates all the way back to 1937, will receive its greatest challenges from Houston and the new conference member, North Texas State. Johnny Morrissey, who took over the track portfolio at Houston only last year, imported several distance running Canadians to give the Cougars strength in races where they have been weak in years past. North Texas, long a power in the college divisions of large relay meets, is certain to become tougher now that the Eagles have reached major college stature.

Rival coaches and anchormen thought last season they would be plagued no more by Oklahoma A&M's swift Olympian, J. W. Mashburn. But their calculations were in error, for Aggie coach Ralph Higgins claims the Blond Blurr has one more spring of eligibility and what's more Mashburn will fulfill same following his sojourn to Melbourne.

Returning with Mashburn will be Jim Graham, a member of the U.S. Olympic pole vaulting team; Eddie Ray Roberts, who should be one of the nation's top hurdlers; sprinter Orlando Hazley (9.5), the first Negro athlete at A&M, and enough other help to keep the Aggies at the head of the class in the Valley.

Kansas returns one of its two Olympic weight twins (discus-thrower Al Oerter) but graduated 60-foot shot putter Bill Nieder, the other Olympian. Also gone are crack sprinter Dick Blair, Les Bitner, the national collegiate javelin recordholder; crack sprinter Dick Blair, and Allen Frame, the 1954 NCAA cross-country champ, among others. Yet, Easton has plenty coming on, such as sophomores Charlie Tidwell, national scholastic low hurdles recordholder, and Tom Skutka, who once held the national prep mile mark with a 4:19.5 effort at his home town of Rockaway, N. J.

Nebraska, a Big Seven track power in years gone by, will gear its rebuilding program to the flying spikes of Keith Gardner, a sophomore who carried the colors of his native Jamaica at the Melbourne games.

Gene O'Conner, one of the area's top all-purpose hurdlers, will be Kansas State's brightest light for the coming campaign, and Missouri points with pride at Pete Orr, who cracked the Big Seven quarter-mile record with a 47.1 burst last spring as a junior, and Karl Englund, a 14-plus pole vaulter.

Oklahoma graduated five athletes who won Big Seven championships (either indoor or outdoor), but the Sooners have a raft of topflight talent coming on and could challenge Kansas in the conference in another year or two. These youngsters will have to take the places of departed league champs Bob Van Dee, discus; Chuck Folsom, 440; Erwin Cook, broad jump; Johnny Dahl, 440, and Hendrik Kruger, pole vaulter. Kruger is another Big Seven product in the Olympics, competing for his South African fatherland.

THE MISSOURI VALLEY

In Big Seven carnivals last season four indoor and six outdoor records toppled to give Kansas' continuing reign. Missouri high jumper Bob Lang and Neider, the Jayhawks' premier shot putter, hung up new marks at both meets. Lang soared 6-7½ indoors and 6-8½ outside, while Neider lengthened the indoor shot standard to 59-9¼, then established a new collegiate record at 60-3¾ in the May festival at Manhattan, Kan.

THE SOUTHWEST

With two magnetic attractions such as Olympic performers Bobby Morrow and Eddie Southern plus the colorful National Collegiate Championships at Austin in June, this 1957 track and field season looms as a banner one for the state of Texas.

Morrow, the popular and powerful sprinter from Abilene Christian College, has a devoted following. The junior lost just one collegiate race in 1956 and topped the season by winning the National Collegiate and Olympic Trials 100 and 200 meters and repeating as the National AAU 100 champion.

Coaches have tagged Southern, a University of Texas sophomore, as one who can reach greatness in the high or low hurdles, 440, 220 or 400-meter hurdles. His best times for these events as a freshman were 14.1, 23.1, 46.6, 20.5 and 49.7.

Southern is the chief reason Texas is favored to extend its Southwest Conference victory string to four straight in 1957. He was a member of the powerful UT frosh team which scored 80½ points in the SWC freshman meet.

Almost every school in the SWC is due to be stronger with the harvesting of talented freshman crops. These sophomores are graduates of Texas' finest schoolboy year in 1955.

Among the leading sophomores will be SMU's Don Stewart, who high jumped better than 6-6 seven times with a high of 6-10½; Joe Villarreal, called Texas' best distance runner since Jerry Thompson with a new national collegiate freshman mile mark of 4:10; Rice's G. F. Alsbrook, 23.7 in low hurdles and Milton Seward, 1:56.0 in the 880; Texas' Hollis Gainey, 9.4, and 21.0, in the sprints; Wallace Wilson, 48.2 in the 440, and Bruce Parker, 209-7, in the javelin; Arkansas' Bobby Dixon, 9.6 in the 100; SMU's John Emmett, 48.3 in the 440 and TCU's Jon Cantrell, 49-8 in the shot.

ACC has returning intact its 440 relay team which matched the world record of 40.2 and three members from the 880 relay quartet which equalled the 1:24 world standard. Morrow will be anchoring preceded by Waymond Griggs, Bill Woodhouse and Jim Segrest.

Texas will as usual be strong in the sprint relays. The Longhorns will also field powerful teams in the mile, two-mile and four-mile. Texas' varsity teams had a 40.1 which bettered the world record in the 440 relay last year and a 3:12.4 in the mile relay. The freshman 440 and mile teams set new national frosh records of 41.1 and 3:12.4.

Key men in the relays will be Bobby Whilden and Gainey in the sprints; Southern in the mile and Villarreal on the distance teams.

Texas A&M, winner or runner-up in the SWC for the past 15 years, has slipped some and either SMU or Rice will move up to challenge Texas. Baylor came within one point of beating A&M last year in its first year under Jack Patterson. But Baylor, like A&M, will be rebuilding.

Eight SWC varsity champions will be back. They are (with season's best marks): Arkansas' Ed Morton, 4:18.0 in mile; Texas' Whilden, 9.4 and 21.0 (non wind) and Walter McNew, two mile in 9:31; SMU's Clarence Miller, 6-7 in high jump; TCU's Bill Curtis, 13.9 in high hurdles; Rice's Roy Thompson, 22.7 in low hurdles and Ed Keasler, 205-6½ in javelin; and A&M's James Clark and Winton Thomas who tied with Texas' John Novey in pole vault. Clark had a season best of 13-8¾, Thomas 13-8 and Novey 13-6.

ACC and North Texas State once again should dominate the college circles. Besides Morrow, ACC can count heavily upon Woodhouse in the sprints and Segrest in the 220 and 440. NTSC will have Boyd Dollar, Morrow's shadow for two years in the sprints, and sophomores John Cotten and Bob Mosshart.

THE ROCKY MOUNTAINS

The track and field record least likely to be broken in the Rocky Mountains is the one which keeps repeating over and over, "Brigham Young, Brigham Young."

The powerful Cougars under the polished tutelage of Clarence Robison have built up such a backlog of cinder talent that it seems unlikely any of the other seven members of the far-flung Skyline conference will threaten this domination for a number of seasons.

BYU won its second consecutive championship this past spring with so much ease it seemed as if the other entries were in a separate competition.

The same situation exists to a slightly lesser degree in the smaller-school Rocky Mountain conference where Idaho State reigns supreme from Pocatello, but the Bengals, after a six-year reign, could be challenged in 1957 by Western State of Colorado.

It is improbable that any individual star from the high mountain west will rise in 1957 to demand national attention, but hurdler Dick Lindsay of Montana and decathlon performer Phil Mulkey of Wyoming might come close.

The former qualified for the final Olympic trials with a 14.0 clocking at the National AAU, while the latter's seventh place finish at Crawfordsville in the Nationals plus his Kansas Relays Decathlon win indicates a bright future for the Cowboy thinclad as a junior and senior.

Other Rockies' standouts should include Idaho State's pole vault champ, Jim Wagstaff; Western State discus winner, Phil Knupp; Utah State's promising weight-man, Jay Sylvester; BYU's Harry Anderson in the sprints, Arlyn Finlinson and Jim Crittenden in the 440, Oscar and Paul Anderson in the 880, Bok Suk Shim in the distances, Hal Werner and Claude Blance in the javelin; Utah's Mike Moore in the hurdles and Bruce Johnson in the mile; Colorado A&M's Bob Miller in the pole vault; Denver's Dayton Smith in the sprints and Tarzan Honor in the broad jump; Montana's Jim Black in the shot and Russ Sheriff in the discus; New Mexico's Orlen Copeland in the discus and Stan Bazant in the shot, and Wyoming's John Watts in the 440 and Kenny Moore in the discus.

Skyline champion Brigham Young suffered the heaviest losses by graduation in 1956, but these will have little effect on the Cougars all around balance.

Runnerup Wyoming which posted its highest finish in history in 1956, may have enough returning strength to retain that position, but will yield supremacy in the mile for the first time in four years when Jim Elder graduates.

Montana, under veteran Harry Adams, is always tough, and loses only three seniors from the 1956 third place team.

Marv Peterson, top spear tosser in the Skyline, will be most missed by Utah State, fourth-place finisher, but middle distance star, Doug Anderson, is another.

High jumper Cal Clark, harrier Mike Morris, and quartemiler Gerald Tovey are gone at Utah, while Larry Ross, shot put record holder, graduated at Denver. Sprinter-hurdler Oliver Lee is New Mexico's most serious loss. Colorado A&M has nearly its entire team returning.

Only two Skyline records went by the boards in 1956—the shot put mark and the mile relay standard. Denver's Ross set the former with a toss of 52-9½, and BYU's relay quartet of Arlyn Finlinson, Dick Heywood, Oscar Anderson, and Jim Crittenden posted a 3:17.6 clocking.

Otherwise mountain competition most nearly compared favorably with the national top level in the high jump and javelin where leaps over 6-6 and throws over 220 were commonplace.

THE PACIFIC COAST

It will be an interesting season for the cinder sport on the slopes of the Pacific this spring. Both Southern California and UCLA, winner of the Conference and National Collegiate titles last year, are loaded with track talent but neither can compete in the Championships, having been suspended for excesses in their athletic programs. But neither the sport's appeal to its followers nor the assault on meet records by the athletes appear in jeopardy.

At Southern California, Olympic distance man Max Truex (9:01.5 two-mile) heads a veteran crew with exceptional strength in the throws. Rink Babka (179-8 1/2) and Jack Egan (174-1) in the discus, Doug Maijala (231-2) and Bob Valles (226-9 1/2) in the javelin, and shotputters Ray Martin (57-6 1/4) and Dick Bronson (54-1 1/4 national frost record holder) should score well in any competition. Fifteen footer Ron Morris and runners Dick Dorsey (sprints), Murray Colburn (11:51.4), Chuck Kirkby (1:49.8, 800 meters), and Wes McLeod (4:09.1) also return. Jaysee transfers are led by two-mile Ray Hale (9:21.5) and four-mile vaulter Ernie Bullard, and there are good sophomores.

UCLA still has its one man gang, Rafer Johnson, who does everything well and who scored 16 points in the National Collegiate Championships last year. The decathlon world record holder should run wild in dual meets. Another 28 of the Bruins' championship points were scored by returning Don Vick (2nd discus, 4th shot), Nick Dyer (tie first high jump), Bob Seaman (4th 1500), and Russ Ellis (4th 400). PCC broad jump champion Dick Knaub (24-10 1/4) may surprise again.

Two Olympians head a California squad which will lack depth again. Sprinter Leamon King (9.3) and 880-miler Don Bowden (1:49 relay leg, 3:46.6 or better 1500) may get first class help from Monte Upshaw (hurdles, broad jump), out last year with knee trouble. Bob House, 9:11 two-miler, and Dick Dailey, 6-7 sophomore high jumper, will assist.

Stanford has a new coach and is expected to begin an upward climb although material is limited this year. Payton Jordan, who made Occidental a big time track school, has a real distance prospect in Maury Graves (9:10 for two-miles), a 6-7 1/2 high jumper in Phil Fehlen, and good performers in hurdlers Chuck Cobb and Bernie Nelson, broad jumper Frank Herrmann, and javelin men Hank Roldan and Kirk Nieland.

Talent is more thinly spread, as usual, in the northern half of the conference. But Oregon has one of the world's greatest runners in Australian Jim Bailey, the 1:58.6 miler. Washington State has a top javelin thrower with Darrell Pearson (218-4), while Oregon State's best are 6-7 jumper Wayne Moss and low hurdler Paul Lowe. Canadian Olympian Terry Tobacco could better 47 seconds in the quarter for Washington and Idaho picked up 8:57.4 two-miler Ray Hatton from England.

Among the non-PCC schools Occidental, Fresno State and San Jose State all have a sprinkling of stars. Chuck Coker, the new Oxy coach, has inherited the school's best ever material with 15-footer Bob Gutowski, two good milers in Ty Hadley and Larry Wray, Dick Haddon at 6-7 in the high jump, and good depth.

San Jose was hard hit by graduation but gets back 14-4 vaulter Chuck Hightower and picked up a crop of junior college transfers, headed by nuggets Ray Norton (9.6 and 21.0) and Clint Redus, 14.4 hurdler and sprinter. Best of the Fresno squad are Mike Agostini, the 9.3 and 20.1 dashman from Trinidad, and hurdler Ancel Robinson (14.1 and 22.5).




