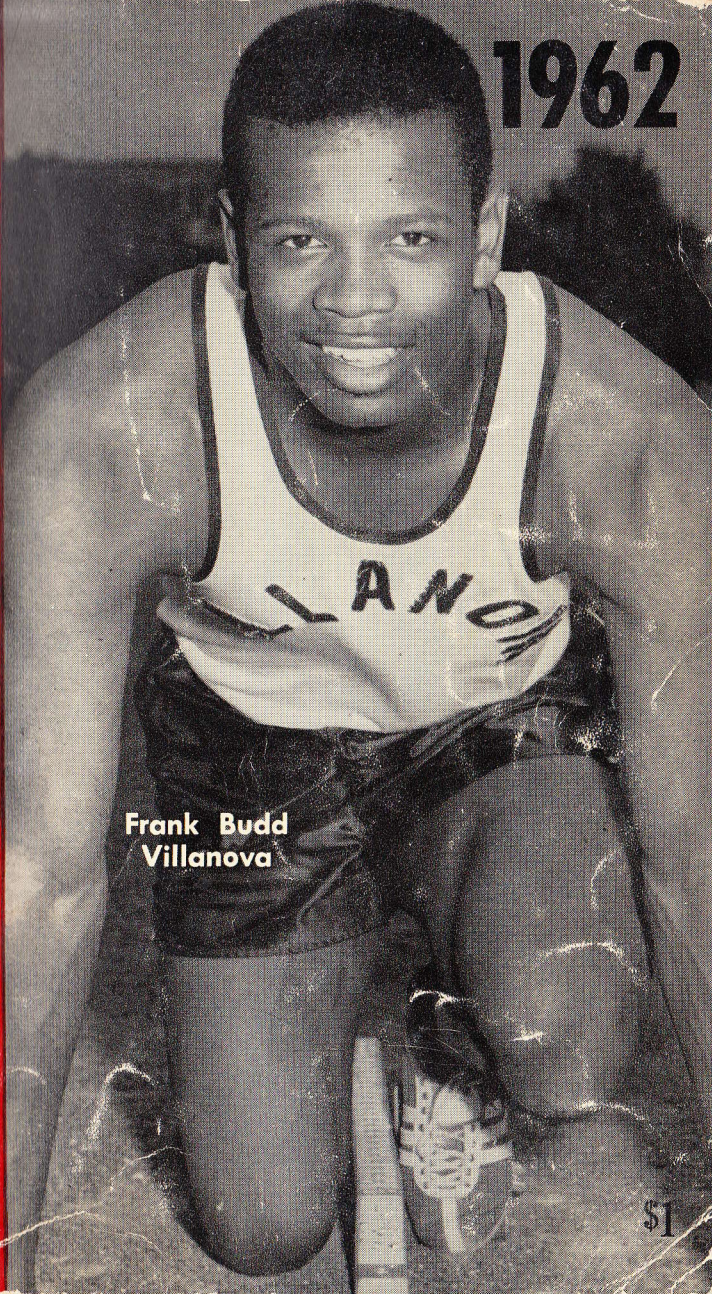

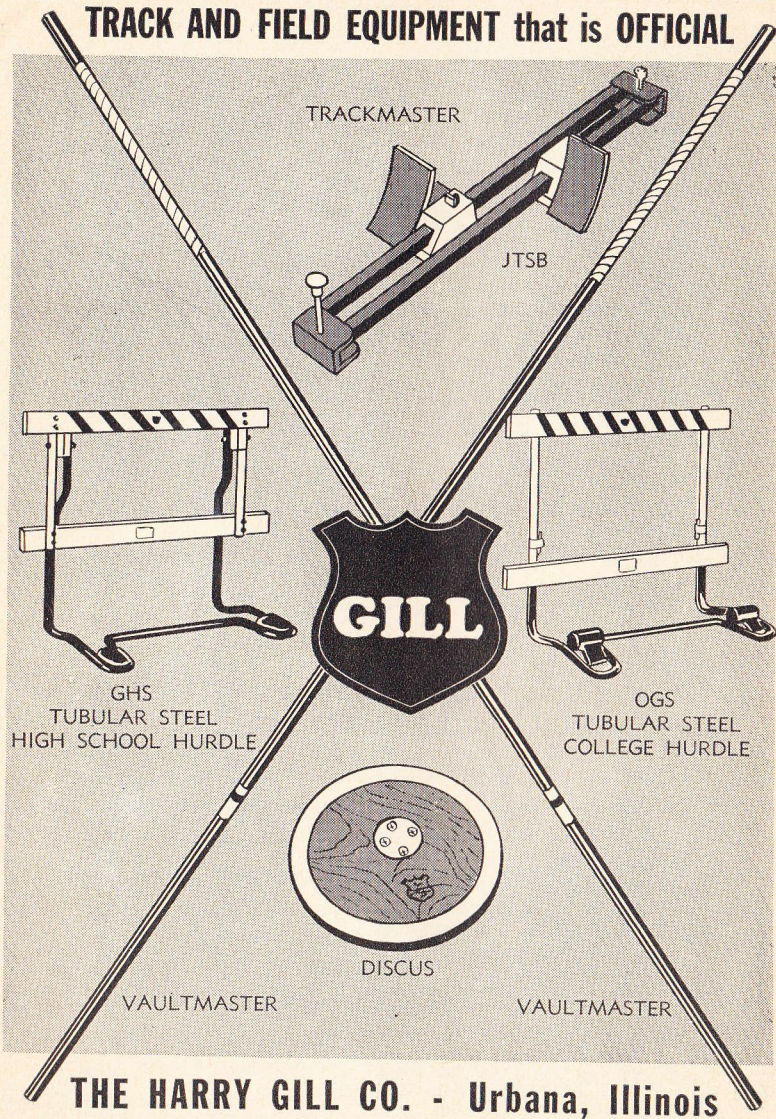

## National Collegiate Championships

Philadelphia, June 16-17, 1961

It took 40 years for the National Collegiate track and field championships to be held in the East. There are at least 15,000 persons who are hopeful they will return soon after what qualified observers described as the finest meet ever seen on University of Pennsylvania's Franklin Field.

If one athlete had to be singled out above all the rest, it would be Villanova's Frank Budd, who captured both sprints and wasn't even close to being beaten over the 100 and 220 yard distances in five races over the two-day period.

Team laurels were earned by the well-balanced Southern California squad, again on top after two years of University of Kansas domination. In sweeping to victory for the 21st time in 40 championships, coach Jess Mortensen's proteges didn't pick up a single point in the flat races.

The Trojans' Dallas Long in the shotput and Luther Hayes in the hop, step and jump, retained their 1960 crowns and established new National Collegiate Championship records. Long completely dominated the shotput with all six tosses being farther than the second man, twice breaking his own meet record, winding up with a Herculean effort of 63-3/4. Hayes' mark of 51-2 1/4 is the new standard for the triple jump.

In all, seven meet records went tumbling. Although the East was deprived of its first sub-four-minute mile, Oregon's Dyrrol Burleson breezed to a brilliant 4:00.5 victory and a meet record after a slow first half-mile had apparently killed any chance for "Burley" to break the four-minute barrier.

Jim Brewer, of USC, first high school vaulter to achieve 15 feet, wound up in a three way deadlock for first place at 15-4 with Oklahoma State's new world champion, George Davies, and Dick Gear of San Jose State.

For the record, Nebraska's John Bentley reporting on the 1959 Championships in the NCAA Guide, wrote: "It is doubtful if the National Collegiate field has ever provided a greater field of vaulters. Fifteen of 20 cleared the third height of 14 feet."

On the grasstex runways at Franklin Field, not only did 16 of 21 vaulters clear the opening height of 14-4, but eight went over the bar at 15 feet—including for the first time ever three from one school (San Jose State's Gear, Jeff Chase, and Dick Kimmell). Previously no more than six men had ever cleared 15 feet in a single meet.

There's no doubt that Budd dominated the sprints and Burleson proved his right to the title "greatest middle distance runner in NCAA history," but the runner who captured the fancy of the crowd was Western Michigan's John Bork.

In the early 880 heats, Bork came from behind to whip Yale's Jim Stack and Harvard's Fred Howard before succumbing to Michigan's Ergas Leps in a fast (1:49.2) semi-final. Never on Franklin Field had Easterners seen a better 880-yard performance than Bork gave in the final. He made his bid around the first turn on the final lap, roared from eighth to first in 20 yards and by the middle of the back stretch, enjoyed at least a 15-yard advantage over his conqueror, Leps. Bork won by 15 yards going away at the tape in 1:48.3.

Explosive Jerry Tarr proved somewhat of a surprise with his decisive victory in the high hurdles. The Oregon football end made a shambles of the opposition in the heats and semi-finals and completely dominated the final.

The 440-yard intermediate hurdles, replacing the Olympic distance of 400 meters that had been run previously, found Occidental's Dixon Farmer the complete master. He led Southern California's Bob Staten to the tape by about six yards in the final to hang up a record.

As expected, new records were set in both the three-mile run and the 3000-meter steeplechase. Australians were responsible for both.

Pat Clohessy of Houston ran a smart race to win over San Jose State's Charlie Clark and Jerry Ashmore of Western Michigan with a splendid effort of 13:47.7.

The steeplechase went to Abilene Christian's John Lawler, victor at the Penn

Relays over the same course earlier in the year. While Lawler was a polished steeple-chaser who learned his art well running in Sydney, Australia, his most persistent rival, Villanova's Pat Traynor, was running in only his fourth steeplechase event. Although Traynor held brief leads over Lawler, it was evident that the Australian-Team was the better man.

The biggest upset came in the 440-yard dash when Adolph Plummer, a transplanted Brooklynite running for New Mexico, nipped Abilene Christian's Earl Young.

Plummer, the Skyline Conference champion warmed up to his task by capturing his heat in 47.4 and then pushed Young to a semi-final 46.6.

On an outside lane in the final run in lanes all the way, Plummer didn't appear to hold an advantage until the eight runners hit the homestretch where he led Young by almost two yards. Despite Young's tremendous finishing drive, it was Plummer by inches. The Bulova phototimer confirmed 46.2 for both men.

In addition to Long and Hayes successfully defending titles with new meet records, John Thomas, Boston University, retained the high jump crown after a stirring duel with Bob Avant, Southern California. Thomas had to set a new meet mark of 7-2 to whip Avant who had cleared 7 feet. Thomas didn't have a miss until his first two tries at 7-2.

One of the minor surprises was registered by Colorado's Don Meyers, winner of the broad jump. In the trials, he fouled three of four attempts, his one legal leap of 25 feet holding up in the finals when he fouled two of three times.

The javelin throwing was a close competition as ever witnessed in the National Collegiate Championships. On the final day, Chuck Wilkinson, Redlands, overtook the first day leader, Dan Likens, Oregon State, who could not better his qualifying throw of 244-9. Wilkinson moved up from third place, with a victory toss of 247-8½.

## THE EAST

Even the New York Yankees, in their most dominating days, have nothing on Jumbo Jim Elliott's Villanova Wildcats.

Everyone agrees the Cats will be head and shoulders over the field in their own league this year. So good, in fact, they're touted here as a good bet to win college track's World Series—the National Collegiate Championship in Eugene, Ore. next June.

This is not just wishful thinking by wistful Easterners, who haven't crowned a national champion since 1957—Villanova. It just adds up that way. Take a team that finished third in last year's meet, subtract a couple of relay runners, add two sure-fire scorers up from the freshman team and the result is a title contender if you ever saw one.

Big man in the East is Frank Budd, he of the world record 9.2 in the National AAU championships. There are some revolutionaries who are predicting a 6 flat indoor 60 and a 9.1 century for the man who's so fast he outruns his shadow.

In case Frank gets lonely, there's teammate Paul Drayton, and what college anytime, anywhere could boast a pair of sprinters like that?

Don't get the idea this is a two-man team. Shotputter Billy Joe, IC4A champion, is back and he, too, has a partner—Jerry Donini, a possible place scorer. Then there's Pat Traynor, second in the steeplechase last year, and the two sophomore hot shots—Rolando Cruz and Vic Zwolak. Cruz is the classy Puerto Rican pole vaulter who's in the 15-foot bracket and could be a gold medal winner. Zwolak is a distance runner of high regard, who's a threat in the long jaunts.

Apparently there's no end to the wealth of Villanova talent, so it will do no good for rival Eastern schools to wait 'til next year. Sure, Budd and Drayton will be gone, but there's plenty more where they came from. The current Wildcat freshman roster has Tom Sullivan, the 4:03.5 schoolboy miler from Chicago, and Donald Webster, a 46.8 quartermiler. There's no getting way from it—the signs spell D-Y-N-A-S-T-Y.

If you're looking for an upset hope, in the IC4A, at least, take a glance at Yale, with distancer Bobby Mack and a group of talented hurdlers and high jumpers. Or Penn State with all those European half milers and distance runners, particularly England's Gerry Norman. Or Manhattan, with no outstanding star, but scorers in almost every event.

If the Wildcats have a lock on all the Eastern crockery as a team, the individual talent is at least spread thin.

At NYU they sing the praises of sophomore shot putter Gary Gubner, the East's first collegiate 60-footer, and Jimmy Wedderburn, senior quartermiler from Barbados, British West Indies, who appears ready to jump head first into the national picture.

Manhattan has a newcomer in Tyrone Pannell, "another Charley Pratt," according to coach George Eastment. Ty can do everything—high jump, hurdle, sprint, broad jump, but it's in the high jump and hurdles that he figures to score best.

Fordham could have the standout middle distance performer in Frank Tomeo, a lad compared favorably with Tom Courtney, the Ram's Olympic champion.

# THE SOUTH

In the three major conferences of the Deep South, only the Atlantic Coast champion appears to be cut and dried before the first cinder is turned.

Powerful Maryland has won the ACC title seven out of eight years, and although the loss of some stars to graduation may be felt, it is hardly likely that the long dominant power will fail to make it home first again.

If Auburn, under the clever handling of veteran coach Wilbur Hutsell, didn't have such a refined knack of turning the tables at the last minute, Louisiana State would be a cinch in the Southeastern Conference.

Only last season, Hutsell's fighting Tigers upset LSU at the wire, winning the championship meet, 56-55, despite a superhuman effort by Bengal Doug Constant.

A real fight is brewing in the Southern Conference, where The Citadel has taken the last three in a row and may make it four. But Furman, coming fast under aggressive coach Chuck Rohe, is a determined challenger.

The outstanding individual on the southern track, however, is a transplanted Texan who performs for Georgia Tech. Ronnie Ablowich, son of an Olympic star, is the finest trackman in Tech history and comes on for his senior year to captain the Jacket team for the third time.

Although Tech can't match LSU, Auburn or Alabama in depth, Ablowich appears to outshine even the fabulous Constant of LSU.

Last year, the little 5-9, 146-pound Texan hung up a host of records and climaxed the season by winning the low hurdles and 440 dash. Ablowich's times include 6.8 in the 60-yard hurdles; 23 flat in the low hurdles; 14.4 in the highs; 48.1 in the 440 dash and 52.1 in the 440 hurdles at the Drake Relays.

His chief SEC contender for individual honors will be Constant, who scored 17 points in the SEC meet as he won the 100, 220 dash and placed in the broad jump.

Alabama, with ace broad jumper Charley Moseley leading the way, should chase LSU and Auburn to the wire. Georgia Tech, Mississippi State and Kentucky will follow and Florida may enter the high middle circle.

Croky Frost, Jim Dozier, Gary Ray and Ken Winter give Auburn a core of veterans capable of pushing LSU. The Bengals, however, will be bolstered by sophomore Billy Hardin, son of former LSU great Slats Hardin.

Maryland returns strong, although some strength is lost in the sprints. Duke's Dick Gessman looks ready to dominate the shot put and discus after a fine showing in the championship meet. Second place in the ACC looks like a duel between the Carolinas and Duke, but none have the power to stop Maryland's streak.

The Terps will be strong in the dashes and middle distances and will get their stiffest competition in the jumps and weights. Traditionally, the Terps are not strong in distance events. Clemson and Virginia should fall next in line.

Although Citadel will shoot for four in a row in the Southern, Furman is much stronger. Bill Keel already holds the pole vault record; Thad Talley is a fine half miler and sprinter Dave Segal, from England, looks stronger than a year ago.

Three Citadel aces—shot putter Joe Grossi, javelin thrower Douse Rustin and hop-step-and-jump champ Bill Elliott will be back. They may not be enough.

VMI is traditionally a contender and this time William and Mary looks stronger, as does West Virginia with its versatile Rodger Holdinsky.

# THE MIDDLE WEST

Anyone who thinks Michigan can be ejected from the Big Ten throne room in 1962 should make an appointment with his head shrinker. He's having hallucinations.

True, Don Canham's squad sustained grievous graduation losses, including such as Tom Robinson, Dick Cephas, Les Bird and Dave Martin. But the returnees are headed by Ergas Leps, who already has won four Big Ten gold medals in the 880 and mile, and by Bennie McRae, the league's high hurdles champion outdoors and the high and low winner indoors. Ray Locke in the shot, Steve Overton in the pole vault and Carter Reese in the 220-440 range are certain point scorers.

Coming up is a powerful array from last year's loaded freshman roster. Among them are Mac Hunter, a 9.5 and 20.9 dash man; Dave Hayes, holder of the Michigan frosh mile mark at 4:15; George Wade, who set the Wolverine freshman pole vault record at 13-4; Ken Burnley, a 48.3 quarter miler, and three weight stars.

They are George Puce, who has heaved the shot 53 feet; Roger Schmidt, a 52-footer, and Ernie Soudeck. All three have bettered 160 feet with the discus.

Still, Western Michigan, the Mid-American Conference champion, edged the Wolverines in a dramatic dual meet last spring. So that tarnishes any claim to midwest supremacy by the Big Ten rulers.

Sizzling Joel Johnson is back at Kalamazoo. He ran the 60 indoors in 6.1, and did 9.5 outside. Alonzo Littlejohn and Jim Oliphant, who are in the 6-9 high jump range, take good care of that event. Carl Reid, who ran 9:14 for two miles despite an injury-riddled season, combines with 4:15 milers Dick Greene and Jerry Bashaw. Barry Donath is a powerhouse with the shot.

Runnerup in the Big Ten, Indiana, had important graduation losses. Ace sprinter Eddie Miles did not return to school in September.

Ray Spivey in the hurdles; Tom Siefert in the shot; middle distance men Larry Clinton and Gene Graham, and Russ Lash in the distances constitute the holdover nucleus. Indiana state scholastic mile champion Chuck Umbarger, who ran 4:19 and 9:16 last spring, and Art Campbell, a good 880-mile man, are best of soph.

Michigan State should improve sharply. The Spartans had only two serious graduation losses. Jerry Young and Morgan Ward are veterans of the always-strong cross-country array. Zack Ford and Don Voorheis are good holdover sprinters. Herman Johnson of Plainfield, N. J., who may follow on the heels of his illustrious fellow-townsmen, Milt Campbell, can do everything well. This 6-4, 205-pounder is a particularly brilliant hurdler. Sherman Lewis, 6.3 for the 60 and a good broad jumper; half-milers Bob Fulcher and Walker Beverly are fine newcomers.

Illinois seems destined to continue its slump. Deryk Taylor, the loop's outdoor broad jump king and Jim Hammond, indoor 600-yard champion, are the mainstays.

Iowa is moving up, however. Jim Tucker and Ralph Trimble are solid distance men. Gary Fischer in the 880, Cloyd Webb in the discus and Sid Gardner, a 6-8 high jumper return. Better sophs include Gary Hollingsworth and Larry Kramer.

In Jerry Golem, Vic Hofer and Ed West, Northwestern has three-fourths of its winning mile relay combination back. Barrett Townsend is a 9.6 sprinter and Bill Smith a 24-foot broad jumper among the newcomers.

Tom Creagan, Elmars Ezerins, and Jim Nelson will be joined by a good but not sensational group of sophomores at Wisconsin.

Minnesota has Jim Fischer, Big Ten outdoor 440 winner, as its only big scorer. Ohio State has very little holdover strength, and looks to sophomore Paul Warfield, a 9-7 sprinter and 24-foot jumper.

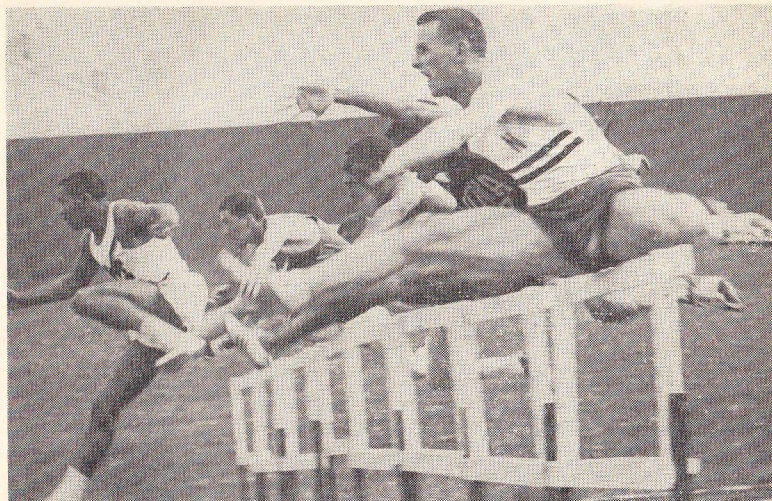

# THE SOUTHWEST

Until two years ago, the Southwest Conference championship track club was rather an exclusive one with only three members—Texas, Texas A&M and Rice. Baylor joined by winning in 1960.

Now SMU, retaining much of last year's strength and with a host of capable sophomores, could dethrone Texas and vault past runner-up Baylor into top spot.

The heavy influx of foreign trackmen definitely will keep SMU as well as the state's leading independent teams, Abilene Christian College and Houston, in the national picture. Lamar Tech will also be helped.

Two Englishmen, Brian Bolton (1:52.8, 4:12.1) and Clive Phillips (9:28.1), will be joined by SWC vault champion Dexter Elkins (15¾), quartermile runner-up Paul Holley (48.2) and newcomers Jimmy Langham (20.8 and 48.7) and distance runners Jim Rorabaugh and Mickey Wade as SMU makes its stoutest bid.

ACC has Olympian Earl Young returning along with Australians John Lawler and Denis Moore. Young ran the fastest collegiate 440 last year, 46.2; was runner-up in the National Collegiate Championships; clocked a 21.1t and anchored his team to a collegiate record equalling 3:07.6 in the mile relay and a new world record of 1:22.6 for the 880 relay.

Lawler, as a sophomore, won the National Collegiate steeplechase and clocked a 4:05.9 mile. Moore turned the two-mile in 8:56.0 and three-mile in 13:56.2. Up from ACC's freshman team are promising half-miler and miler Bobby Hargrave (1:54.4 and 4:12.2) and pole vaulter-hurdler Billy Pemelton.

Three Aussies again will enable Houston to offer a formidable distance challenge to anyone with Pat Clohessy, who posted last season's fastest three-mile mark (13:47.7); Barrie Almond (4:07.9) and Al Lawrence, 1960 National Collegiate 5,000-meter champion.

Lamar Tech hopes to arise with an English trio of Ian Stewart (4:11.4 and 9:07.2), Simon McNamee and Peter Linford as well as high jumper Colin Ridgway (6-10) of Australia.

Clyde Littlefield tucked away his 25th SWC championship and retired with Froggy Lovvorn grabbing the reins Littlefield had held since 1921 at Texas. Lovvorn must build around SWC hurdles champion Ray Cunningham (13.7 and 22.5) and talented sophomores Bob Sewell (14.3 and 23.9), Johnny Cram (9.8 and 21.1), Loy Gunter (4:18.7) and Larry Rhodes (1:55.7).

Thin Bill Kemp, who chased Texas' departed Ralph Alspaugh to wind-aided 9.2 and 20.0 times, heads Baylor's returning cast which includes Roy Smalley (47.9) and Glynn Fields (48.4) in the 440, SWC high jump co-champion Eddie Curtis and broad jumper Tommy Minter.

Recruits from its most powerful freshman unit in a decade makes A&M a threat. Danny Roberts set new frosh records of 53-9 and 156-10½, R. E. Merritt (440 in 48.4) and Pat Mitchell and Robert Martin will join Curt Roberts and Ed Williams in the sprints. Top returnee is Thad Crooks (4:13 and 1:52).

Bobby Bernard, Drake Relays high hurdles champion; Eddie Curtis, high jump title co-holder as a sophomore; and frosh miler Nolan Bradley (4:18) are TCU's stoutest performers. Rice can count on pole vaulter Fred Hansen (15-0) and javelin ace Ed Red (221-6) and Dave Edwards (217-0). Texas Tech offers hurdlers Bob Swafford and Bake Turner and miler Ronny Sessums.

Other top performers in the state will be sprinters John Dale Lewis (9.5), and Mike Stell and broad jumper Bill Miller of McMurry; distance ace Hyke Van der Wal and broad jumper Dudley Haas of East Texas State; hurdler Gary Petross and distance men Frank Santiago and David Noble of Howard Payne.

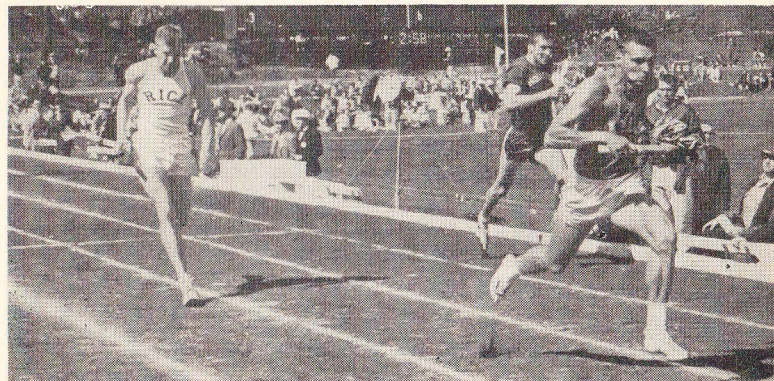

**THE ROCKY MOUNTAINS**By **DAVE SCHULTHESS***Sports Information Director, Brigham Young University*

Although the thin air in the Rockies is regarded as an inhibiting factor in some events, track and field in the Intermountain Area neared the summit in 1961. In the conference meet alone, seven track records were broken. And the season just ahead could shade some of the best of last spring, so improved is the calibre of performance.

Officially, the Skyline Conference will give up the ghost in June, but not before the schools in the league muster one final effort to overtake Brigham Young, champion for seven consecutive seasons. New Mexico and Utah State are in the best position to haul down the Cougars, but with new talent on the Provo scene, this isn't likely.

So the 1962 season won't be much of a change in the status quo; BYU of the Skyline and Idaho State of the Rocky Mountain loop should win gracefully.

Three newcomers from California—sprinter Ralph Turner (9.6 and 20.4), Rich Mertes in the weights, and Bill Marchant in the half mile (1:54.5)—will offset any graduation losses at BYU.

In addition to these, Coach Clarence Robison scooped up nearly a dozen top prep stars, including high jumper Lou Andrus (6-6), half miler Larry Austin (1:56.5), quarter miler Bob Tobler (49.0) and weight man Phil Reynolds. Finnish distance runner Matti Raty is back on campus, along with a 24-foot broad jumper from the Fiji Islands, Gideon Dolo.

These, along with the likes of 440 star Guy DeHart, hurdler Eldon Hastings, discus thrower Ron Mickle, pole vaulter Jim Williams (14-9½), and freshman all-arounder Kent Nance, should stem any serious threats to BYU's position.

Of the two major threats, New Mexico seems to have the best chance to up-end the Cougars. Coach Hugh Hackett's team came within nine points of turning the trick last spring with Adolph Plummer (47.1 and 20.9), Del Blanks, whose 25-7 in the broad jump set a new conference record, sprinters Jim Whitfield and George Heard, and weight men R. P. Waters and Andy Sinclair. All will be back, along with incoming talent.

Utah State, which finished third in the conference championships, looks a mile deflated, but still ranks as a threat. Glenn Passey, who came within a hair of breaking Jay Silvester's discus record, should be good for 180' this year. Shot champion Clyde Brock is expecting a service call, however, Jim Swindle will be broad jumping again, and newcomer Jay Smith has put the shot over 57 feet. But with both the Rice boys gone, it won't be the same.

Montana, another steady, will feature the distance running of Gary Wotjowick (4:15.4 conference record in mile) and three members of a mile relay team that broke the league record twice last year.

Some fine standouts but a lack of depth may keep Utah down in '62. Hurdler Blaine Lindgren (14.0 in highs) will rank with country's best. It's not likely Lindgren will be beaten in the league in either hurdle event. Javelin thrower Kregge Christensen (226-9½) is getting tougher with each meet. Quarter milers at Utah will be headed by Jon Johnson and Mike Soulier. Pole vaulter Neil Schmidt has topped 14 feet.

Two-miler Gary Glyde, who set the Skyline record with a 9:21.6, will lead the Colorado State U. contingent, but the Rams are thin thereafter.

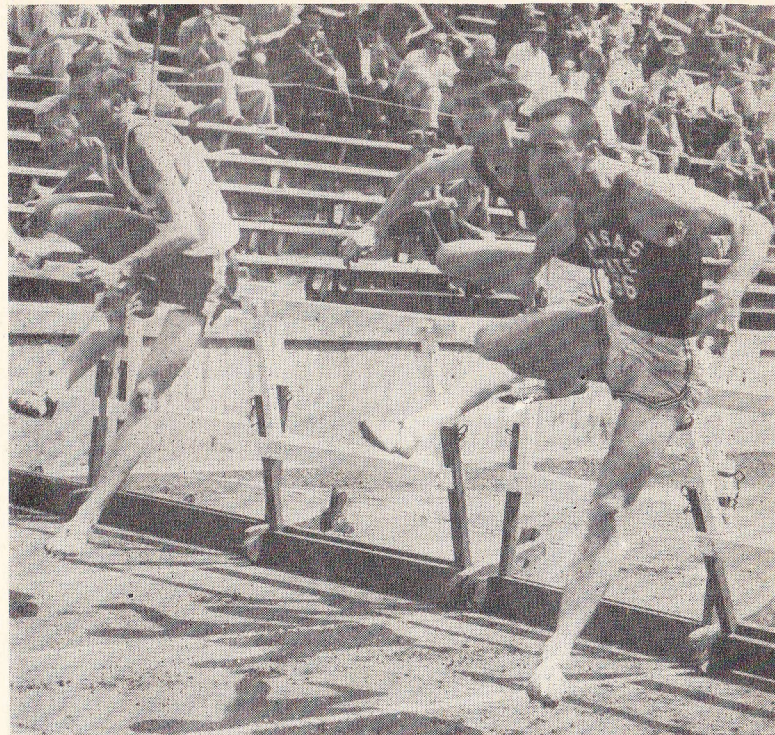

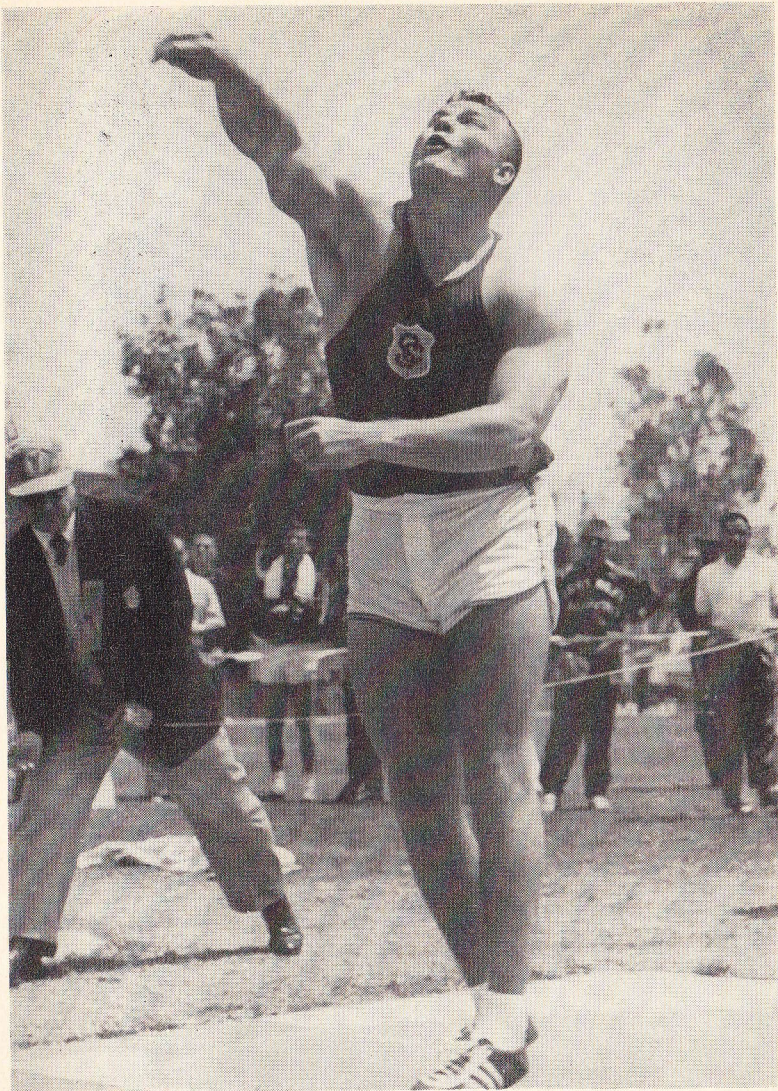

# THE PACIFIC COAST

Oregon, runner-up to Southern California in 1961, may turn out to be a very ungracious host at the National Collegiate Championships this June.

USC suffered heavily from graduation, losing 47 of its 65 points scored in the Championships, while Oregon lost only five points. This may sound like the Trojans are in trouble but they should have another good team in 1962.

The Trojans' leading contenders for national honors are Dallas Long, National Collegiate and AAU shot put champion, Rex Cawley, a fine 440 and 440 hurdles prospect, hurdler Bob Pierce and discus thrower Jim Wade, who threw 190-6 $\frac{1}{2}$  in 1950 but slumped badly last season.

Oregon fans have good reason to feel optimistic with such athletes as Dyrrol Burleson, Harry Jerome and Jerry Tarr returning. Burleson won the National Collegiate and AAU miles a season ago, Jerome was second in the National Collegiate 100 and Tarr won the high hurdles at the Championships. Sig Ohlemann adds depth to an already loaded middle distance crew. Newcomer Archie San Romani, who ran 1:50.6, 4:06.8 and 9:03.9 last season as a transfer student, will help.

Don't get the idea, however, that it will be all USC and Oregon on the Pacific Coast. Oregon State, Occidental and San Jose State also rank as contenders for national honors. Coach Sam Bell has one of the best balanced teams in the nation at Oregon State. Returning are Dale Story (4:07, 8:46.9), Norm Monroe (46.4) and Dan Likens, second in the National Collegiate javelin. Returning to the team is another javelin star, Gary Stenlund, who placed second in the 1960 National Collegiate Championships, but sat out last year.

Occidental, under new coach Jim Bush, lost heavily through graduation but has returning national 440 hurdles champion Dixon Farmer and Steve Haas, who ran 9.5, 21.0t and 47.1 last year. San Jose State has 9.3 man Dennis Johnson along with 15-2 vaulter Jeff Chase, Willie Williams (9.5, 21.1t) and Dan Studney, javelin.

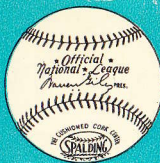
