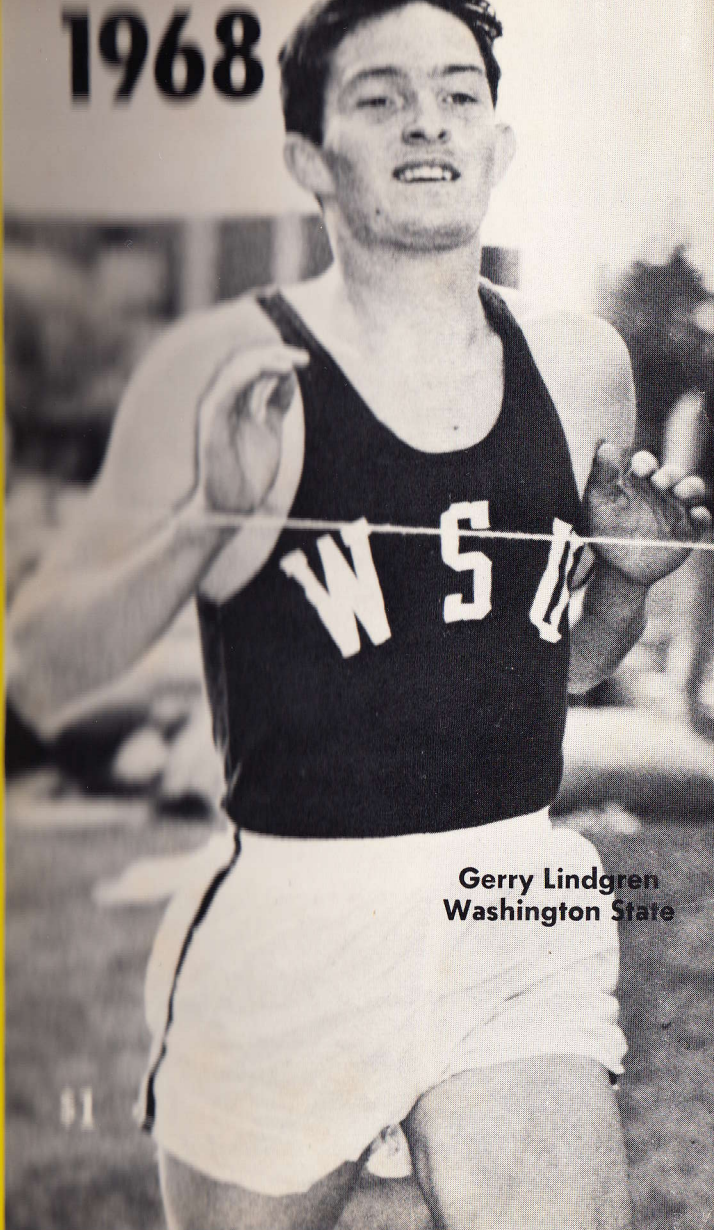

Southern Cal Choice To Retain Title As Collegians Point For Olympic Team

"Go West young man for that's where the 'gold' is."

It may sound trite but true because California beckons college trackmen in 1968 as it bids for gold medals in such major meets as the Pacific-8, NCAA championships, National AAU and final Olympic trials.

The Olympic Games in Mexico City are the prime goal of every collegian. Many have been working in that direction for some time and several stand a good chance of making the U.S. team when it's named after the final trials in Los Angeles late this summer.

THE UNIVERSITY of California at Berkeley will host the Pacific-8 meet May 17-18 and the National Collegiate finals June 13-15 where USC is favored to repeat as champion. Southern Cal did not win the Pacific-8 title in 1967—that went to Oregon in an upset—but the Trojans scored a smashing victory at the National Collegiate where the first three places went to AAUW institutions—Southern Cal, Oregon and UCLA.

Coach Vern Wolfe's Trojans won at Provo, Utah with sprinters Lennox Miller, Fred Kuller and O. J. Simpson hurdles king Earl McCullough and pole vault greats Bob Seagren and Paul Wilson, who both cleared 17-4 at Provo.

Wilson, a 19-year-old sophomore last season, came into his own at the NCAA meet. A week later in Bakersfield, he took the world record away from teammate Seagren by soaring a staggering height of 17-8.

McCULLOUGH teamed up with Lennox, Kuller and Simpson to set a world 38.6 clocking in the 440-yard relay on Provo's rubber-asphalt track and this quartet could do it again in '68.

The Trojans, again fortified in sprints, hurdles and pole vault, figure to go all the way. Only crippling injuries could stop them. In addition, Wolfe has two fine halfmilers in Dennis Carr (1:48.0) and Dave Buck (1:48.9), intermediate hurdler Geoff Vanderstock, miler John Link (4:04), Steve Johnson in the shot and discus and Chuck Shulz in steeplechase.

Pushing Southern Cal will be UCLA. Look for Coach Jim Bush to turn out another strong Bruin team, capable of taking the AAUW and NCAA titles. After scoring a clean sweep in 1966, UCLA was hit hard by key injuries last year and had to settle for third place in both events.

UCLA did retain one important national honor. The Bruins again were undisputed dual meet champions, winning eight straight, including victories over USC, Oregon and Kansas and now have a two-year string of 16.

UCLA'S FRONTLINERS will be sprinters Harold Busby (9.4, 20.6) and Don Domansky (9.6, 20.9), miler Rick Romero (4:02.2), pole vaulter Dick Railsback (17-4 unofficially), high jumper Rick Sloan (6-11), triple jumper Gerald Lee (51-9), shot putters Steve Marcus (59-9) and Russ Hodge (58-3½) and discusman Kirk Wassel (182-3).

Domansky, Canada's 400-meter record holder (45.8) and UCLA's 440 record

holder (46.3), figures to be one of the country's super quarter-milers. Two sprint newcomers, junior Randy Lynch (9.5, 21.4) from Fullerton JC and soph Johnny Johnson (9.6, 21.2) from Santa Monica CC have unlimited potential. They form the nucleus of another fast 440 relay.

Oregon's Bill Bowerman, one of the most successful collegiate coaches, says his '68 Ducks will not likely be as strong as in 1967. Main reason is loss of 880 champ Wade Bell and three-time Pacific-8 winner Neal Steinhauer in the shot.

But Bowerman should be stronger in the sprints, hurdles and long jump. As usual, Oregon will have a great stable of distance runners, headed by junior Dave Wilborn (3:56.2) Roscoe Divine (3:57.2) and Arne Kvalheim (3:59.4). Two newcomers will be long jumper Tom Smith, who set a frosh record of 24-6½ in 1967 and hurdler Gary Knoke from Australia, who is not eligible for the National Collegiate meet. Knoke has top marks of 49.7 in the 400 meter hurdles, 50.4 for the 440 intermediates, 1:52.4 in the 880 and 46.9 in the 440 dash. Three top sprinters are Mike Deibele (9.6, 21.5), Rick Howard (9.8) and Bob Bauer (9.8).

CALIFORNIA WILL field its strongest dual meet team in years. Returning intact is the Bear mile relay team which clocked 3:08.0 for fourth at Provo. In this quartet is senior Larry Hengl (46.7), a sixth place NCAA scorer as a sophomore.

Senior Pat Weddle, a fourth-place PAC-8 scorer in the 440 (47.5), missed the NCAA, but he returns as do Parry McCrary, the PAC-8 440 IH champ; sixth-place NCAA long jump scorer Stan Royster (25-1½) and fifth-place NCAA pole vault scorer Greg Miguel (16-6). Tops among newcomers is Clarence Johnson, whose 7-3½ high jump was the top leap in the world last year.

Washington State returns Gerry Lindgren for his senior year and the little fellow is still unbeaten indoors and out through seven separate NCAA events. Gerry probably will be favored again in the three and six-mile tests and the Cougars should add considerable strength here with Larry Almborg, place-winner in the six-mile last year at Provo as a soph and Rick Riley, the nation's outstanding prep distance runner two years ago at Spokane's Ferris High.

Riley will be a sophomore and he has run 4:04.7 and 8:43.3. Jan (he prefers John) Reene, a 6-7, 270-pound Dutch boy from Bethleme, South Africa, will be a sophomore and should be a nationally ranked weight man. He put the shot 59-9 and had 185-7 in the discus as a frosh.

STANFORD'S PAYTON JORDAN, named head coach of the 1968 U.S. Olympic team, has most of the top performers returning from last year, including two school record holders. They are junior high jumper Peter Boyce (7-0), an Australian who placed third in last summer's U.S.-British Empire Games and senior Ian Arnold, a 49-5½ triple jumper who is the Canadian junior record holder.

Junior Allen Sanford (4:07.5, 9:03.4), senior Jim Letterer (9:03.6), senior Jim Ward (47.0), Craig Vaughn (24-11½) and Clint Ostermader (15-2) return.

Oregon State's returnees are long jumpers Charlie Olds (24-4½) and George May (24-0), high jumper Dick Fosbury (6-9), three-miler Lew Dahlin (14:30.5) and vaulters Dennis Phillips (17-1) and Bob Glaeson (15-6).

Even with fabulous Tommie Smith gone, Coach Bud Winter figures San Jose State will be a stronger dual meet team in 1968. Basis for his prediction is arrival of 24 junior college transfers and two key sophomores who will join durable Lee Evans, the world's most consistent quartermiler the last two seasons.

LEADING THE LIST of new faces is Fresno City College's Sam Davis (9.4, 21.3 and 24-6 long jump). Half miler Harold Dent, quartermilers Tonp Perz and Jeff Peo will join returnees Bob Talmade (220), 6-11 high jumper Dwight Tucker and vaulter Chris Papanicolaou.

Fast-rising Tennessee is expected to be better than last year when the Vols swept to the Southeastern Conference title and made their best-ever showing in the NCAA meet by tying New Mexico for fifth.

Coach Chuck Rohe has another strong team, built around All-Americans Richmond Flowers, Larry Kelly, Gary Wagner and Chick McGeehan. The addition of Hardee McAlhaney, top 440 freshman (45.8), gives Rohe a strong nucleus.

Flowers, well-known in track and football circles, set an NCAA record in the

120-yard high hurdles at 13.4 in the semifinals and placed second in the finals behind Southern Cal's McCullough. Kelly is ranked sixth in the world in the 880 after placing third at the NCAA. In addition, the Vols lost only two members from their 440 relay team that placed second at Provo.

Five soph milers give Tennessee plenty of strength in that event as all ran 4:11 or better as freshmen. The best is Tony Masi. Other returnees are Steve Owens, SEC champ in the vault (15-6); Pat Murphy, hurdles; Henry Rose and Butch Stewart in the 880; Tom Fisher and Steve Keltner, both 24-foot long jumpers and high jumper Karl Kremser (6-10½).

TENNESSEE'S MILE relay should be one of the nation's best with McAlhaney (45.8r), Kelly (45.7r), Bob Dickson (46.7r) and Flowers (47.1r) or Russ Whitenack (47.2r). This group can go under 3:05.

Florida expects to have its finest team. The Gators lost only three seniors from last year's team which finished second to Tennessee in the SEC. The Gators will be led by junior All-America John Morton, a 6-4, 245-pound weightman who last year as a soph had best marks of 57-6½ and 187-8½. Other talented performers are Frank Lagotic (4:07.9), Frank Saier, the first jumper to clear seven feet in the South; Mike Burton (24-6½), Barry Handberg (9.5) and Don Hales (1:51).

Tulane's strength will be in the two-mile relay and half-mile run. The relay team is back intact. It clocked 7:28.6 and returns Paul Arsuaga, Bob Brown, Malcolm Meyer and Dick Rogers. Rogers has a best half of 1:49.6 and Arsuaga 1:49.9. Gary Groff is a potential 26-foot long jumper and Bob Manard is one of the South's better vaulters. Tulane Coach John Oelkers has been named to the U.S. Olympic team.

LSU lost NCAA javelin champ Delmon McNabb, but the Tigers have enough talented sprinters to maintain a strong spot in the conference. Carl Hight (9.4, 20.9t), Scooter McCarron (9.8), Rusty Hight (22.0, 47.6) and Malcolm Gott (9.6) give Coach Joe May reason to smile. LSU's 440 relay (40.5) and mile relay (3:11.6) will be improved.

AUBURN EXPECTS juniors Jack Marsh (long jump) and Mickey Jones (triple jump) to be tough. Sophomore sprinter Donnie Fuller, senior 440 man Joe Buch

and senior 2-miler Vic Kelley are promising.

Alabama's standout will be senior David Adkins, who won the SEC 220 and 440 titles as a junior a year ago. The Crimson Tide will host this year's SEC meet on their new \$100,000 tartan track where Tennessee is favored again.

Georgia could have its greatest sprinter in history if junior Kent Lawrence can avoid injury. Lawrence, star tailback on the football team, has run 9.4 but missed the 1967 season with calcium deposits on an ankle.

Rice and Baylor are figured to be the dominant teams in the Southwest Conference, with Texas, Southern Methodist, Texas A&M and Texas Tech behind.

Texas and Texas Tech are rebuilding. After winning the 1966 SWC title in an upset by breaking Rice's three-year string, Texas fell far back last spring. Coach Jack Patterson's Longhorns aren't quite ready, but they're coming because they ran away with the frosh division last spring and have another good freshman group led by highly touted and versatile Dave Morton. He can run from 220 through 880.

TEXAS RETURNS 12 of 16 varsity lettermen. Top men include Rudy Alaniz (880), Ed Canada (440), Charles Clifton and Bill Elliott (BJ), L. H. Cohen (440) and David Matina (880). Texas Tech's strength will be depth and its best event will be the javelin where four boys can throw from 190 to 220 feet. The Red Raiders have four 14-foot plus vaulters and four promising hurdlers.

New Mexico, bolstered with five members of the Swedish Olympic team, is favored to win its fifth straight Western Athletic Conference title, with the main competition coming from Brigham Young and Arizona State. Heading the Lobo veterans are NCAA triple jump champion Art Baxter, javelin standout Frank Burgasser and discusman Mike Jeffrey.

Brigham Young returns two conference champs—Finnish Pertti Pousi in the long and triple jumps and high hurdler Tom Bonin. Jerry Bright, WAC 100 and 220 champion and NCAA placer, tops the list of returnees at Arizona State.

A young but experienced Kansas team will be the crew to beat in the Big Eight. Again leading the charge for the Jayhawks will be junior recordholder Jim Ryun, who captured the conference and national mile titles in 1967 and returns with a world standard of 3:51.1.

The incomparable Ryun will be backed up by Gene McClain and Allen Russell, both 4:05 milers, plus an outstanding sophomore group of middle distance runners that includes Paul Mattingly, Roger Kathol and Glenn Cunningham—all posting mile times at 4:10.

THE ONLY MAJOR loss was long jumper Gary Ard, who like Ryun, scored firsts in the Big 8 and NCAA meets. An able replacement should be Stan Whitley, a California junior college champion with bests of 25-2½ and 49-10½.

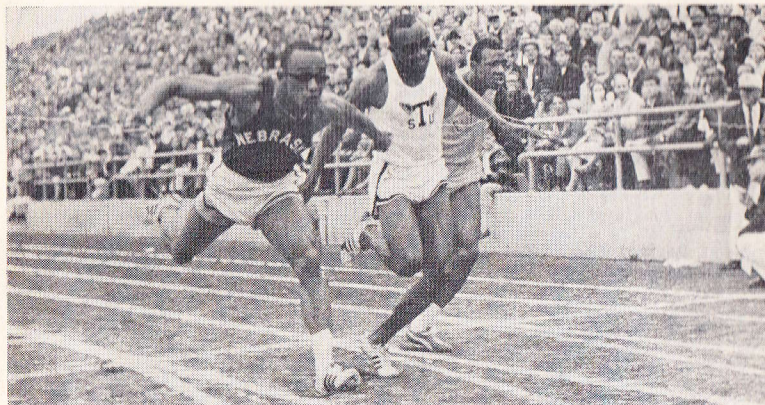
The hurdles will be the Hawks' best events where defending Big 8 champ George Byers, a junior, brings back a 13.7 clocking. Other aces are Lee Adams and Aye Stevens. Kansas should show improvement in sprints where senior Ben Olson's school record of 20.8 and 46.7 will be tested by smooth-striding Julio Meade (9.5, 20.9, 46.8). Versatile soph Mark Ferrell will be one of the conference's brightest 880 prospects (1:51.8 in high school).

Colorado hopes to give a big going away season to Coach Frank Potts, who will end a 41-year tenure this spring. Potts has lost strength in the weights (Barry King) and long jump (Lynn Baker), but has point winners back in addition to some good soph prospects and junior college transfers. Chuck Rogers, Craig Runyan and Mark Keller should be the leading men.

Missouri's top guns will be long jumper Gary Rainwater, who shook off an injury last year to win the Big 8 indoor title at 24-0 and placed third in the NCAA. Distanceman Glenn Ogden and Bill Wells will be improved. Ogden has run two miles in 8:45 and was the NCAA runnerup at three miles. Wells has run the mile in 4:06.

IOWA, DEFENDING Big Ten champion, returns 13 lettermen plus two who were held out of '67 competition because of injuries, but the Hawkeyes will be hard-pressed to retain their title.

Wisconsin appears to have one of its strongest teams. Michigan State has

several blue chip performers, while Indiana and Michigan are rated tough.

Iowa will be headed by Mike Mondane, third in the NCAA 440 (45.9) who was a member of the Hawks' record-setting NCAA champion mile relay team (3:06.8). Mondane is the Big Ten indoor and outdoor champion. Larry Wiczorek, Big Ten indoor mile winner in 1966 and 1967 with a best 4:05, may give more attention to the three-mile this season. Rollie Kitt, conference steeplechase winner, returns.

Iowa will be helped by Don Utsinger, a 15-6 vaulter; Carl Frazier, who has run the 440 under :47; Curt LaBond, Ron Griffith and Steve Szabo, distance runners. Jerry Stevens and Steve Dertinger are middle distancemen who did not compete last year because of injuries.

WISCONSIN WILL build a major part of its plans around middle distance ace Ray Arrington and hurdler Mike Butler, both standouts on the national scene last year. Arrington set records in winning the Big Ten indoor 880 and outdoor mile and he won the NCAA 1000 run at Detroit (2:07.8). He's a solid threat for more honors this season and perhaps could make the Mexico City trip.

Butler won the conference indoor high and low hurdles titles and captured the 120-yard highs at the USTFF meet in 13.7 before pulling up lame at the NCAA. Shot putters Bob Hawke, Don Bliss and Jim DeForest placed 1st, 3rd, and 5th in the Big Ten indoor meet and soph Stu Voigt has hurled the college shot 55-5. Sprinter Aquine Jackson, Big Ten 100 king (9.6), is another key figure.

Michigan State's big scoring guns are gone—Das Campbell, Mike Martens, Dick Sharkey, Bob Steele, Jim Summers, Gene Washington and Eric Zemper—but the Spartans hope Roland Carter (16-0); John Spain (1:50.7); Chuck Pollard (13.9), Pat Wilson (1:11.3), Roger Merchant (2:11.5) and Don Crawford (23-2½) will take up the slack. Best of the sophs are Bill Wehrwin, 440; Richard Stevens, mile; Dick Elsaner, hurdles; Keith Grantham, shot, and Don Highsmith, hurdles.

Virtually everyone is back for Indiana, which scored 31 points in last year's Big Ten meet. Coach Jim Laver has a fine soph group, headed by 6-8 high jumper Charlie Taylor and Dave Atkinson, a sub 14-minute 3-miler. Top veterans include miler Mark Gibbins (4:05.8), discusman Rich Fihls (177-10) and hurdler Bob White (13.8). A newcomer is vaulter Paul Gaydos (16-0).

MINNESOTA, WHICH always produces several standouts, looks to Capt. Tom Stuart (6-10½), Hubie Bryant (9.6, 21.4), Steve Hoag (9:05), John Warfoed (14.1) and Dick Simonsen (9.7, 21.2). Ohio State has an outstanding pair of high jumpers, junior Glenn Pettaway (6-8½) and soph Stan Albright (7-1). Soph half-miler John Jeffcoat, miler Mike Fischer and Ralph Marinello, who won the Big Ten long and triple jump title, should be in the spotlight. Purdue is still a year away, but the Boilermakers have a fine freshman class and these individuals: junior vaulter Bob Raftis (15-0), second in the Pan Am Games at Winnipeg at 15-7; half-miler Doug Conquest and Mel Felton (440).

Notre Dame's headliners will be senior middle distance ace Pete Farrell and junior sprinter Bill Hurd. Farrell hopes he's over the foot miseries which hampered him throughout last spring. His best 880 is 1:47.8 and he's the IC4A king. Hurd, hobbled by a hamstring injury, is looking better.

Miami University's defending Mid-American Conference champs will have better depth than ever, according to Coach Stan Imhulse. Top returnees include Ted Downing, 1967 NCAA indoor high jump champ (7-0); Bob McElroy, steeplechase, who finished second in the Penn Relays and won the MAC title as a soph last year and long jumper Bob Glover, who spanned 24-0 to win the MAC. Other standouts back are hurdler Sim Sibold (14.1) and vaulter Les Smith.

Western Michigan, which had a string of nine straight MAC titles severed by Miami last year, will be strong as usual. Returning are veterans Don Castronova (9.6), Horace Coleman (9.6), Steve Strauch (9.6), Jerry Missig (48.3), Ken Coates (4:09.4), Keith Reed (8:55.4), Lee Frost (9:02.6), Mike Hazilla (9:06), Chuck LeMon (13.9, 50.9, 5th NCAA) and Wayne Lambert (15-5).

BEST OF WESTERN'S sophs will be Al Randolph, an Army veteran who ran 9.5, 20.6t and 46.3 last summer. Also high jumper Al Dixon (6-8) and shot putters Tom Wiench, Chuck Andrews and Jim Pritchett, all 60-footers as preps, make their debuts.

Kent State's headliners will be sprinter Orin Richburg (6th NCAA 220) and miler Sam Bair (3rd NCAA 4:06.7). Bair broke four minutes for the first time last year, 3:58.7 in the AAU nationals when Ryum clocked his historic 3:51.1. Brightest of Kent's newcomers is soph Ed Norris, in the three and six-mile.

Ohio University brings back standout Emmett Taylor, NCAA 440 champion, and Toledo looks for more consistency from Aaron Hopkins, 1966 NCAA long jump champion, who was plagued with injuries last year. Jim Kincaid (880) and Frank Liller (440) are blossoming prospects.

Drake, runnerup in the Missouri Valley Conference last spring, expects to be strong in distances. The Bulldogs return conference mile champ and runnerup Elliott Evans (4:09.8) and Dennis Hunt (4:08.6), both juniors. Sophs Brent Slay (46.7r) and Ray Dunn (1:51.5r) should score.

WICHITA STATE HAS a new coach, Herman Wilson, and new enthusiasm. Top performers back are pole vaulter Fred Burton, named to the '67 All-America team, and shot putter Tom Holliday.

Idaho State will dominate the Big Sky Conference because of a host of fine sprinters—John Turner (9.6, 21.2), Ike Gayfield (9.6, 21.1, 47.8), Tim Dunne (47.5) and Larry Lewis (48.0).

Maryland has dominated the Atlantic Coast Conference for 12 straight years and the Terps again loom as the team to beat. Coach Jim Kehoe has enough holdovers and newcomers to make a strong run. His leading scorers will be high jumpers Bill Betts and John Stevens, shot putters Dave Delmar and Gary Parsons, discusman Dick Drescher, sprinter Jim Callough and javelin ace Wayne Donegan, IC4A king.

North Carolina State had a 5-0 record last year for its best overall dual mark. Dick Trichter, AAC champion in the 100 and 220; Pete MacManus, distance man from Dublin, Ireland who set a N.C. State mile record of 4:18.1, are back.

CLEMSON SHOULD be improved if sophs come through. Holdovers are shot putter Greg Benz, hurdlers Jim Taylor, triple jumper Carl Jones, sprinters Bill Shirley and Hunter Clarkson and miler Tom Leonard. Virginia expects more balance with good sprinters in Peter Pettit, Jeff Calamos, Bob Sterling, John

Womack and Joe Segal; milers Bill Bailey and John Wilson; half-miler Phil Stafford and high jumpers Mark Lodge and George Hawkins.

Duke returns defending pole vault champion Clint Brown, distance star Ed Stenberg and rising soph Jeff Howser, a 13.8 high hurdler in high school.

Army has enough returning strength to keep pace with Villanova and Harvard, perennial powers in the East. Coach Art Crowell's Army Cadets won the Heptagonal the past two years and with lettermen back in every event, plus help from the plebe team, the Cadets should be tough again.

Returning are co-captain Dan Seeba, indoor and outdoor Hep shot and discus champ (56-2, 172-3), co-captain Greg Camp '67 Hep 1000-yd. king recordholder with a best of 2:09.1; Bob McDonald (4:04.5), Jon Nolan (4:10.1); Larry Hart (192-0) and the most versatile man in Army's history—Jim Black, 233-11 javelin, 55-0 in the 35-lb. weight and 175-0 in the hammer. John Armstrong and Bob Keller have cleared 6-6 in the high jump and LeRoy Outlaw, plagued with injuries for two years, could be Army's first 50-foot triple jumper.

HARVARD SHOULD be among the Ivy leaders and could steal some of the Army thunder. The Crimson boasts potent middle distance and distance entries with Jeff Huvelle, Dave McKelvey, Frank Snowden, Tom Downer, Trey Burns, Tom Callhan and Keith Colburn. Harvard is stocked in the weight events with Ron Wilson, Bruce HENDENDAL, Dick Benka and Charlie Ajootian. Doug Harding (8:48.8), Royce Shaw (4:03.4), Dick Howe, Jim Baker and Tim McLoone should be Harvard's prime distance men.

Rutgers had its greatest track team in 1967, winning the Metropolitan title. Hurdlers Don Kay, John Novak, Bill Muir, Ed Shattuck loom as top men along with high jumper Eli Miller (6-11) and relayman Pete Schuder.

Navy hopes to duplicate last year's 6-2 record as 15 lettermen return. Top men are Bob Donohue (dash), Jim Kiffer (600), Ron Knode (1000) and Jim Dare (2-mile). Lettermen Dave Wallace and Steve Hanvey will support outdoor mile recordholder Dick Brantigan. Junior Bill McCauley is a top jumper (6-6½).

Coach Jim Tuppeny, now in his second year at Penn, says his team will be improved over last year. The main interest will be senior Rick Owens, who won the IC4A 220 title last year.

SPRINTERS LARRY Jefferson and Mike Johnson and weightman Jim Kavanaugh, who was one of the top men in the nation the last two seasons, will be headliners at Boston College.

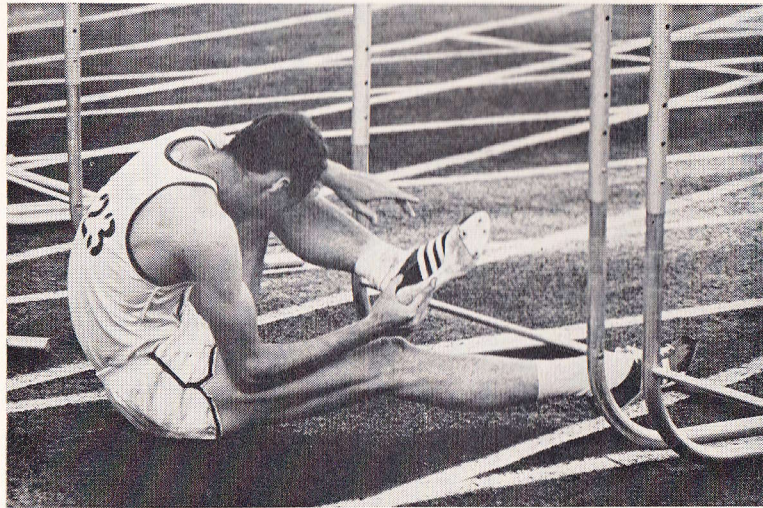
New York University will spotlight Byron Dyce, a junior who is rated one of the top half-milers in the East. Dyce set an NYU record of 2:08.9 in the 1000 and ran a 1:49.8 half-mile outdoors. Quartermilers Hal Bogrow, Reggie Pearman, Jim Herbert, Jim Brown and Jim Wedderburn lend promise. Junior Greg Farah is touted as the best pole vaulter in New York. He cleared 15 feet indoors against Army and St. John's and Easterners say they can't recall when a home-grown N.Y. product ever accomplished that feat. Farah was ineligible for outdoors, but he clears 15-7 regularly.

Manhattan College set a school record of 9:47 and ran the ninth fastest distance medley in the country at the Penn Relays last year as soph Brian Kivlan anchored with 4:05. He returns as do Del Benjamin, a junior who won the IC4A long jump title with a leap of 24-8; Ed Mulvihill (14-6, 6-9) and half-miler Van Exel (1:52). Soph Ed Walsh, a cross country phenom, is the distance star.

St. John's could have another Tommy Farrell in the making. Miler Don Rowe turned an impressive 4:08.8 mile as a freshman last year.

William & Mary started a trend last season which should continue for some time. The Indians won all nine possible championships in one academic year and romped off with their second straight Southern Conference title. One of its brightest stars is miler George Davis.

West Virginia expects to improve its fourth place finish in last year's SC meet. Only champion to graduate was vaulter Jack Carter, but returning are flashy three-miler Charl Hatfield, javelin winner Jeff Riley, miler Mike Chvalovich and sprinter Ted Dresinger.

NATIONAL COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Provo Mountain Setting Proves Nifty Romping Range For Mercurial Trojans

From the start, the 46th annual National Collegiate track and field championships had an unusual tone. The mountain setting in Provo, Utah provided a striking backdrop for the events. Cool weather and evening showers kept the rubberized-asphalt track lightning fast. There was even a suggestion that the team competition would be close. But it turned out to be the same old story: Southern Cal won by a country mile as the Trojans compiled a total of 86 points.

What was supposed to be a three-way race between titans of the West Coast—UCLA, Oregon and Southern Cal—was turned into a cakewalk by the triumphant Trojans. They amassed the second highest point total in NCAA history, and incidentally, captured their 24th National Collegiate championship.

OREGON, THE champion of the AAWU, trailed the winners by 46 points for undisputed second place. Defending champion UCLA picked up two points in the final event of the meet, the mile-relay, to beat Brigham Young University by one point (27-26) for third. Seven other teams with point totals between 24 and 20 were bunched together to form the balance of the top ten.

In terms of energy expended, especially at Provo's 4,300-foot elevation, the USC victory has to be a new high in team effort. This teamwork was best exemplified in the 440-yard relay where the Trojan foursome (Earl McCullough, Fred Kuller, O. J. Simpson and Lennox Miller) carried the baton on a :38.6 trip around the track to set a world record.

And in one of the most impressive one-two finishes of the meet, USC's vaulting duo of Bob Seagren and Paul Wilson both cleared 17-4, breaking the old NCAA record by nearly a foot. Versatile Earl McCullough, who seemed to be picking up points in every event, set a high hurdle standard when he nosed out Richmond Flowers of Tennessee in a 13.4 clocking.

Meanwhile, others on the USC squad were adding to the Trojan total with second place finishes; Lennox Miller in the 100 and 220, Dennis Carr in the 880, Geof Vanderstock in the 440-hurdles, and Gary Carlsen in the discus.

AS COACH Vern Wolfe's crew tightened its grip on the team title, the 35,800 fans who watched the three-day meet were caught up in a series of brilliant individual performances. At the Thursday night opening Lennox Miller won a round of applause for his heat-winning time of 9.2 in the 100. Minutes later Nebraska's Charley Greene, piqued by an unattractive press, tied the world record in the 100 with a blistering 9.1. Charley went on to win his third consecutive NCAA sprint championship and have his name listed with a select few who have won titles as sophomore, junior and senior.

San Jose's Tommie Smith, who holds every major record in the 220, finally eclipsed the NCAA record, breezing through the two trial heats and final furlong with identical 20.2 clockings.

Although some of the returning champions from the 1966 NCAA meet did falter, most of them were not seriously threatened. Massive Randy Matson of Texas A&M set a NCAA shot put record with a 67-9/16 put in the trials that

stood up through the finals. Matson's discus throw of 190-4 was good for another blue ribbon and the other half of A&M's 20 team points.

Gerry Lindgren of Washington State, as expected, repeated as six and three-mile champion. Considering the thin-air factor, Gerry's times of 28.44.0 and 13:47.8 were very respectable.

HOWEVER, IT WAS Kansas sophomore Jim Ryun and the mile run that seemed to stir most interest among the fans in BYU stadium. Ryun, running in his first NCAA outdoor championship event, won his qualifying heat in 4:09.6, then came back on the final day to win the high-altitude, low-pressure mile in 4:03.5, nearly three seconds ahead of Oregon's second place Roscoe Divine.

A native of Utah, Oregon's Wade Bell, was cheered to an impressive win in the 880 with a 1:47.6, and a sophomore from Ohio University, Emmett Taylor, captured the quarter-mile in 45.9. Taylor, who reached the finals with heat times of 45.9 and 46.0, nosed out Iowa State's Steve Carson in the finals.

Michigan State's Bob Steele, defending champion in the 440-yard hurdles, was two-tenths of a second under his winning time of last year at Bloomington, Ind., 50.4. The steeplechase title went to Chris McCubbins, senior from Oklahoma State, whose time of 8:51.4 was better than 8.5 seconds faster than his nearest challenger.

In two of the field events, the winning marks came on the final efforts of the athletes. Louisiana State's Delmow McNabb registered a 263-5 measurement in his final throw of the javelin, and Kansas senior Gary Ard saved his best jump—25-9—for last. In the other jumping events, Art Baxter of New Mexico won the triple jump, and Idaho's Stephen Brown took first in the high jump. Baxter set a NCAA record in the triple jump with a 52-4½ mark, and Brown won the high jump title from Arizona's Ed Caruthers on fewer misses. Both Brown and Caruthers cleared 7-1, but it was the third place finisher, BYU's 5-9 Ed Hanks, who stole some of the thunder when he cleared 7-0.

RHODE ISLAND'S Robert Narcessian, only a junior, replaced Boston College's John Fiore as hammer throw champion, winning with a throw of 197½.

In the meet's final event, the mile-relay team from Iowa (Fred Ferree, Carl Frazier, Jon Reimer and Mike Mondane) set a NCAA record. Anchored by Mondane who ran a 46.0 lap, the Hawkeys whipped around in 3:06.8, shaving six-tenths of a second off the old mark. The second-place team from Rice also was timed under the old record set by California in 1964.

Nearly a dozen champions (members of relay teams included) are expected to be back to defend their titles in the 1968 track and field championships to be staged in Berkeley, California.

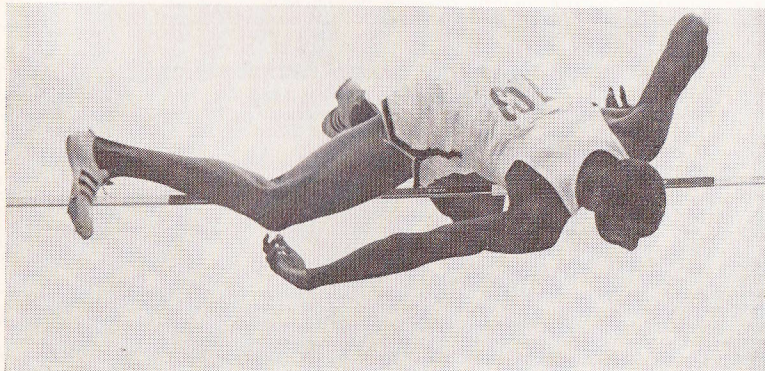

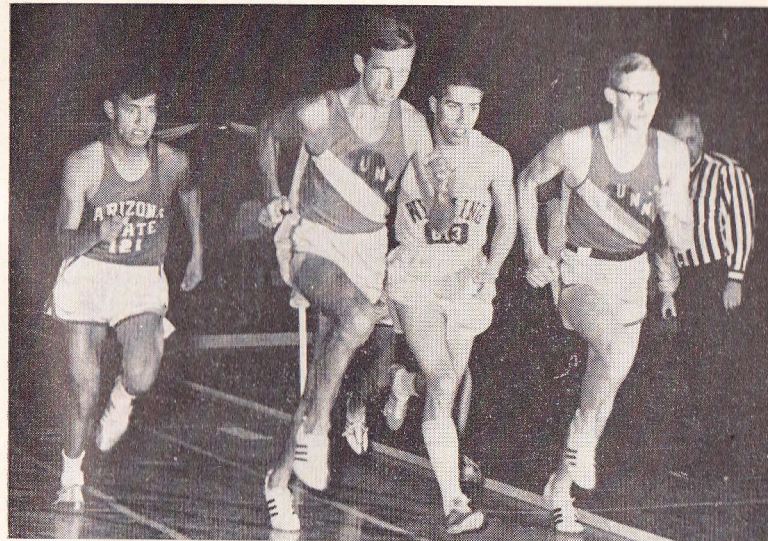
