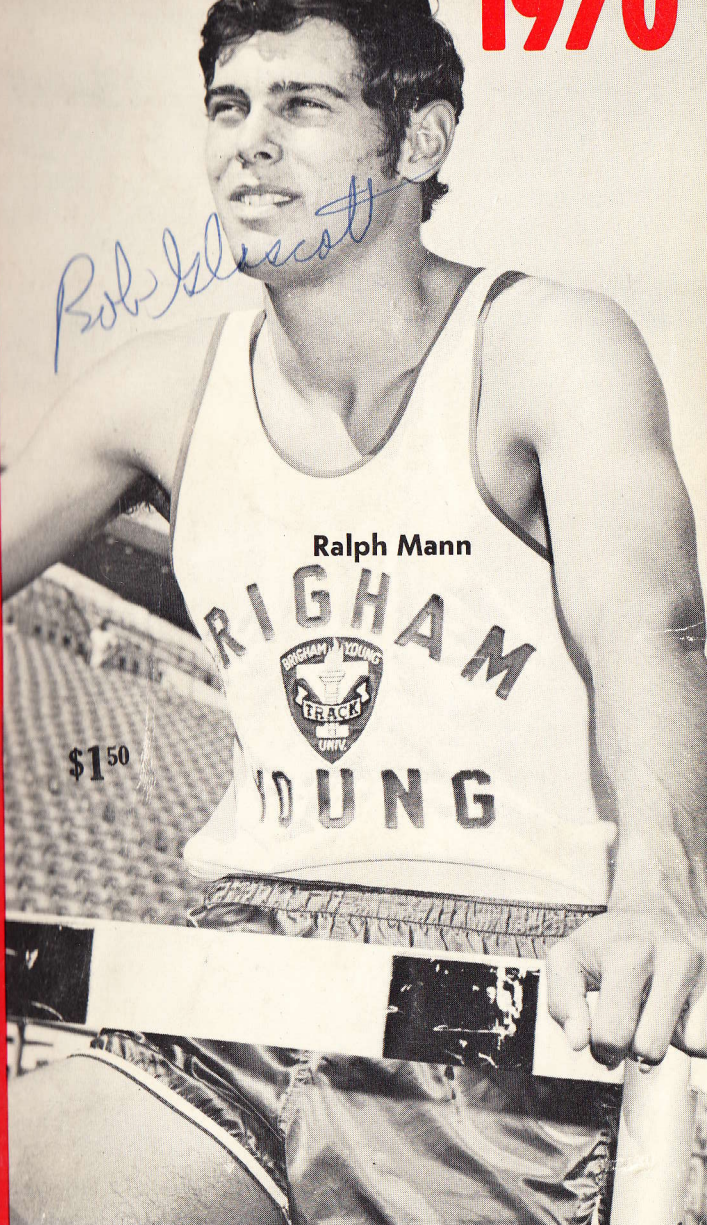

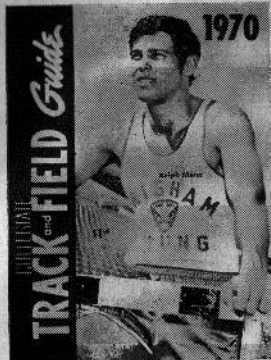

ON THE COVER: Brigham Young University's Ralph Mann, 440-yard intermediate hurdles champion in the 1969 national collegiate finals, clocking 49.6 to tie the American and NCAA records in that event. Mann toured Europe with a U.S. team last summer and will be back to try for another NCAA title in '70 since he's only a junior. The 6-4, 20-year-old Californian is a mechanical engineering major, follows sports closely and was a standout pitcher in high school. 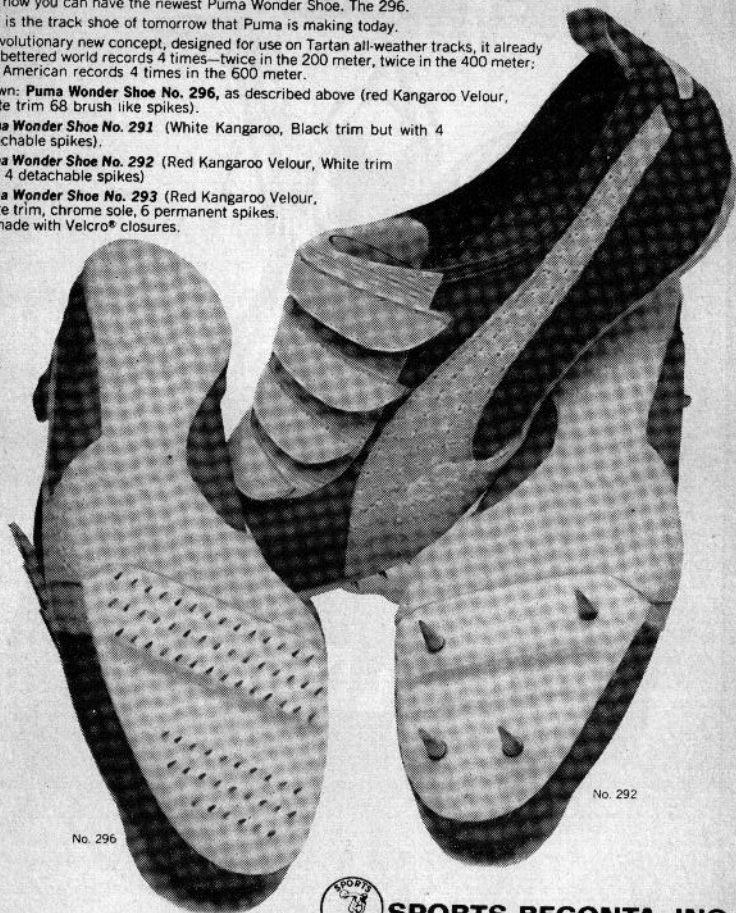

NATIONAL PREVIEW-REVIEW

San Jose State Crown-Defense Hopes Dim If Sprint Star Doesn't Compete

Defending champion San Jose State will be hard-pressed to repeat as national collegiate track and field champion in a year where several challengers loom for the outdoor crown.

Coach Bud Winter's San Jose Spartans will have to be very lucky to retain their title. The questionable status of Olympian John Carlos, winner of the NCAA 100 and 220 titles, leaves a big hole. Carlos, only a junior, has hinted he may not compete this spring.

If he stays out this will put a burden on returning stars Ronnie Ray Smith (100, 220), Kirk Clayton (100), Neville Myton (880), Darold Dent (steeplechase), Sam Caruthers (pole vault), George Carty (hurdles) and Marion Anderson (long jump). This is a talented group but several other schools are fortified and will make strong bids for the NCAA crown.

These include Kansas, Brigham Young, University of Texas at El Paso, Villanova, Oregon State, Washington State, UCLA, Southern Cal, Tennessee, Oregon and possibly Arizona State. All have potential to develop by the time the nationals are staged at Drake in Des Moines, Iowa.

KANSAS WON'T BE AS STRONG as last year but the Jayhawks have a good nucleus, plus several promising newcomers. Brigham Young is a long-range choice. UTEP has an impressive group of sprinters, a raft of milers and a new high jumper, Torbjorn Larsson, a Swede who has cleared 6-11.

Ronnie Ray Smith could be San Jose's big headliner. He was a gold medal winner as a member of the 1968 U.S. Olympic 400-meter relay team at Mexico City and is co-holder of the world record in the 100 meters (9.9). Clayton was a collegiate freshman record-holder at 100 yards (9.3). If Billy

Gaines, national high school sprint champion who has a 9.2 century, becomes eligible, the Spartans will be as strong as ever in sprints.

CARTY, A 13.5 high hurdler, missed most of last season with an injury but is healthy again. Anderson, who had a best long jump of 26-5 in '69, looks solid, and Caruthers posted a 13.9 hurdles time and pole vaulted 16-6.

Coach Winter had a good recruiting year, bringing in junior college trans-

fers Gary O'Sullivan (57-10 in shot, 175-0 in discus), Victor Dias, a 16-6 vaulter; Leonard Gaskell, a 52.2 intermediate hurdler, and Dave Palmer, national JC mile champ with a best of 4:07.

The Pacific-8 Conference always has challengers for the national title and this season will be no exception, with UCLA and Washington State having the best chance.

Returning UCLA stars are Wayne Collett (9.4, 20.2, 44.9), pole vaulter Jon Vaughn (17-5), weightman Mark Ostoich (62-6, 178-4), long jumper Denny Rogers (24-5), jumper-sprinter John Johnson (9.6, 21.2) and sprinter-jumper John Smith (9.7, 21.1, 47.2 and 24-4).

In addition to Collett, two members of the mile relay team which sped to the second fastest time (3:03.4) in world history in winning at the NCAA meet are back. They are Smith and Young. Coach Jim Bush has Senior Chip Minnick or sophomores Gene Williams, Paul Williams and Reggie Echols as replacements.

Another talented returnee is high jumper Hal Greenwood (6-10). With freshmen now eligible for varsity competition, Bush has high hopes for the following yearlings: Bob Langston (48.0, 1:51.6), pole vaulter Bob Langston (16-0), jumper Bruce Simpson (25-1, 50- $\frac{1}{2}$), sprinter Ron Welch (9.6, 21.4, 49.6) and distance ace Ruben Mejia (4:13.7, 9:04.1).

At Southern Cal, Coach Vern Wolfe is counting on Ole Oleson (3-mile), Edesel Garrison (440), Herman Franklin (hurdles), triple jumpers Tim Barrett and Howard Pratt and shot putters Tom Colich and Dave Murphy. Leading freshmen are Fred Richerson (distances) and Steve Smith (pole vault).

Oregon hopes to challenge with a flock of distance runners, a top steeple-chaser and talented weightmen.

The Ducks' top miler could be freshman Steve Prefontaine of Coos Bay, Ore., who had the best time among preps in the mile and two-mile (8:41.5). Roscoe Divine, who has a lifetime best 3:57.2, is another standout. Other milers are Tom Morrow (4:03.0), Terry Dooley (4:03.2) and Rick Ritchie (4:07.2). The pole vault has great potential with Jim McMillan (16-0) and Allen Paz and Tim Enquist, both in the 15-6 class.

Washington State has a lot of talent, headed by two-time national discus champion John VanReenen. Half-miler Art Sandison (1:46.1), two miler Rick Riley (8:45.2), high jumper Jim Voss (7- $\frac{3}{4}$), and hammer thrower Tony Tenisci (191-6) are other big names. Sprinter Bob Payton (9.4), Australian jumper Peter Wright (6-10 $\frac{1}{2}$) and javelin man Colin Young of South Africa (226-0) also figure to help.

New California coach Dave Maggard boasts solid veterans. Despite the return of Clarence Johnson (7-3 $\frac{1}{4}$), Bob McLennan (14.2, 52.2), Jim Fraser (24-10, 49-1 $\frac{1}{2}$), distance ace Bob Walden (8:54.1) and Steve Wilson (176-11), new prospects will form the basis for Cal's hopes. These include miler Cliff West (4:04.4), halfmiler John Drew (1:49.5) and shot putter Rolin Luka. In from junior college is California state sprint champion Eddie Hart (9.2, 20.9). Also on hand is hurdler Kerry Hampton (14.6 for the college highs), miler Eugenio Amaya (4:11.1) and sprinter Ed Bonner.

Among the many fine prospects Washington Coach Ken Shannon recruited is John Davies from England, a member of the British Olympic team and holder of 1:47.2 and 4:02.0 bests. Then there are high jumper Don Shields (6-11) and long jumper Jerry Fellows (24-11).

Top freshmen are Rich Albright (1:54.0), milers Bob Brandon (4:12) and

Mike Hann (4:14) and halfmiler Al Oliver (1:55.3).

Eric Klein, a 51-5 triple jumper; Bernard Baptiste, a 9.4 sprinter; shot putter John Hubbel (62-11); halfmiler Rich Mesmer (1:50.5), and intermediate hurdler Kim Hoelting (51.9) will boost Cougar hopes.

With the return of 1-2 sprint punch Willie Turner and Ernie Smith plus Tracy Smith (back from Army hitch), Oregon State has a strong base working. Smith is a national champion and world-class distance runner. If long jumper George May returns, the Beavers will have added point potential.

Oregon State returns two NCAA champions—hammer thrower Steve DeAutremont and steeplechaser Jim Barkley. And with Smith and possibly May available, the Beavers could make a strong run for the national title. Lowell Harris (14.1) and triple jumper Joe Ortega have possibilities for stardom. Top freshmen could be javelin thrower Don Reeves, distancemen Doug Crooks, Dennis Weed and Chris Carey and pole vaulter Ed Lipscomb.

Even without Jim Ryun, Stan Whitley, George Byers and Kenny Gaines, who have completed their eligibility, Kansas has 11 of 15 back who competed in the '69 NCAA meet and rates as the team to beat in the Big Eight.

Heading Kansas' strong cast are outstanding weightmen Karl Salb, Steve Wilhelm and Doug Knop. They'll be helped by intermediate hurdler Bob Bornkessel, three and six-mile ace Rich Elliott, hurdler-long jumper Ron Jessie, pole vaulter Jan Johnson, sprinters Mickey Mathews and Julio Meade, hammer thrower Bill Penny and miler Doug Smith.

Other Jayhawk prospects are Randy Julian (47.8), Jim Neihouse (1:49.6), Roger Kathol (1:51.5) and steeplechaser Paul Mattingly (9:09). Outstanding frosh are Brian McElroy, one of two preps in the U.S. to break 1:50 in the 880, two-miler Jon Callen (9:03.4), Frank Johnson (9.6, 21.3), Mile Larimore (48.0) and distance ace Dave Anderson.

Timmons expects to have the services of Ulysess Xerxes White, a football split end who had a fabled career at New Mexico Military Institute. He had bests of 21.0 and 47.2. His best 400 meters is a sizzling 45.5 relay leg.

Nebraska had very few losses. Leading returnees are Garth Case, a Jamaican who won the Big Eight 440 and mile titles, halfmiler Dan Morran (1:47.8), N. S. Hurd (25-3) and distance runners Pete Brang, Mel Campbell, Greg Carlberg and Jim Lang. Top frosh prospects are Jamaican sprinter Don Quarrie (9.3, 21.0), Dan Brooks (6-8) and Jim Hawkins (1:53.0).

Wisconsin is the team to beat in the Big Ten even though several stars have graduated and Coach Charles (Rut) Walters has retired. Assistant Bob Brennan, an aide for six years, will have a tough act to follow as Walters went out in a blaze by winning the league's indoor and outdoor titles.

Brennan has 14 lettermen plus a number of fine sophs and top frosh who are now eligible for varsity competition for the first time in the Big Ten. Standouts among the veterans are long-striding middle-distance men Mark Winzenried and Don Vandrey and triple-jumper Mike Bond.

Juniors Fred Lands, defender in the conference steeplechase, three-mile champion Dean Martell and pole vaulter Joe Viktor also return.

Top sophomores include flashy Greg (Grape Juice) Johnson (24-5 in long jump and 6.2 in 60-yard dash), milers Chuck Baker (4:08.6) and Glenn Harold (4:09.8), plus shot putters John Dettburner and Marcel Mangual.

Indiana will be a threat to unseat Wisconsin because of sprinters Larry Highbaugh and Mike Goodrich. The Hoosiers also have a new coach, Sam Bell, former Cal mentor.

High jumper Gary Hauper, who cleared 7-1 $\frac{1}{2}$ to become Indiana's first

seven-footer, is back seeking another conference crown. Coming up from the freshman team are Scott Hiles (4:08, 8:56), pole vaulter Gary Tharp (15-1), two-miler Steve Kelly (9:20) and Russ Keucker (1:54).

Michigan State expects good performances from Bill Wehrwein and sprinter Herb Washington. Wehrwein is the NCAA indoor 600 titlist (1:09.8) and Big Ten outdoor 440 champ (46.2). Hurdler Charles Pollard also returns. Frosh prospects include hurdler John Morris (13.6) and miler Ken Popejoy (4:09, 9:06).

Illinois boasts three jumpers who cleared 6-10½ last season. They are juniors Terry Webb and Bob Richardson and sophomore Larry Dykstra. Giving the Illini strength in the sprints and relays will be junior Mark Koster, sophomores Gary Pateau and freshman Rob Mango.

Six prospects figure to brighten Ohio State's picture. They are distance runners Doug Scorrar and John Dextras, sprinters Jimmy Lee Harris and Jerry Hill, discusman Mark Debeve and quarter-miler Gary Lindstedt.

Iowa will be strong in the pole vault, high jump and hurdles. Top returnees include vaulters Rich Gershezon (15-0) and Phil Wertman, hurdlers Jay Pedelty and Bruce Presley and high jumper Larry Wilson.

Michigan's big hope is pole vaulter Larry Wolfe (16-0).

Western Michigan's reign as Mid-American Conference champ will be seriously threatened by Ohio University. Western lost several top performers, including NCAA 220 runnerup Tom Randolph. So Coach George Dales is counting on sophomores to fill the breach. Leading returnees are Jack Magelssen (1:51.8) and Jerome Libenberg, Penn Relays steeplechase champ.

Ohio lost nationally ranked sprinter Emmett Taylor but Coach Stan Huntsman still has plenty of manpower with hammer throwers Dave Leitch (183-5) and Ron Hungarter (182-6), javelin thrower Roy Madsen (239-4), distance runner Bob Bertlsen and quarter-miler Jerry Marshall (47.0).

The outstanding distance runner in the Mid-Am league should be Sid Sink, Bowling Green junior who holds every Falcon record from the mile up.

Kent State sees big performances from distanceman Ed Norrs, discus thrower Al Schoerman (170-0) freshman miler Ted Harris and triple jumper Len Turner (51-0). Miami's leading prospects are Pete Miller, conference discus champ, and triple jumper Milan Tiff (52-3). Intermediate hurdler Pete MacEwin is the lone returning conference champion at Toledo.

Drake bids for its third straight Missouri Valley Conference title. The Bulldogs amassed 161 points to sweep past North Texas State and Wichita State in last year's meet.

Cincinnati expects to improve because of distance runners Dan Mock, Dave Udovic and Mike Rogers. Scott Stargel, a senior who clocked 52.0 in the intermediate hurdles, also is back. Top freshmen are Al Lanier (23-6), Ron Stapleton (4:15.0), and two-miler Dan McCrone (9:19.5).

Southern Illinois will field one of its strongest teams in years with sprinter Ivory Crockett and distance ace Gerry Hinton leading threats.

Tennessee will be a strong choice to win the Southeastern Conference crown for the seventh time, but it's unlikely the Vols will make a runaway as they did last season because other teams have improved.

Key returnees are Bill Skinner, Bill High, Gary Womble, Hardee McAlhaney, Audry Hard, Lonnie Hance, Jeff Gabel, Bob Sprung, Chip Kell, Dave Scire, Dickie Kleier and Owen Self. Sprung, the SEC pole vault champion, cleared 16-8. Kell holds the school shot put record at 58-7 and Scire won the SEC mile title. The Vols' mile relay unit of McAlhaney (45.8), Womble

(45.2), Hardy (46.0) and Abe Henderson (46.0) could challenge the collegiate and world records. Promising newcomers are high jumper Tony Wilson (6-8), sprinter Bob Hauk (9.5) and pole vaulter Dick Martin (16-0).

Florida has a good blend of experience and new faces and figures to show improvement. Back is high jumper Ron Jourdan, who cleared seven feet 21 times in 27 attempts last season. The 6-1, 150-pound senior heads a cast that includes sprinter Roger Carson (9.5), pole vaulter Mike Flanaga (16-6), intermediate hurdler and 440 man Jerry Fannin (51.0, 47.0), jumper Ron Coleman (49-3, 24-6) and triple jumper Grover Howard (48-2). Coach Jimmy Carnes invaded Ireland to sign a 4:08 miler, Kevin Humphreys. He will join Eamonn O'Keefe, who ran a 1:48.8 half mile.

Alabama continues its rebuilding by hiring Kansas aide John Mitchell as head coach. The Crimson Tide looks for help from miler Angelo Harris (4:09.3), intermediate hurdler Tom Huev (52.3), pole vaulter Tim St. Lawrence (15-6), shot putter Van Polidoro (55-4), javelin thrower Barry Phillips (235-1) and sprinter Dick Chandler (9.5, 21.4).

All-America sprinter Jim Green (9.3) heads Kentucky's crew. Green will move up to the 440 this season in hope of avoiding injuries which plagued

him in 1969. Vic Nelson should be better than last season when he repeated as SEC three-mile champion. Sophomore John Casler (171-4), shot putter John Stuart (60-0) and Bill Lightstory (24-1) are other top prospects.

A new Tartan track and stadium with a multi-purpose scoreboard may be the inspiration LSU needs. Coach Joe May sees an upswing in fortunes. He signed LSU's first Negro athlete, Charles Stewart of Shreveport, a 9.5 sprinter and Lloyd Wills, who ran a 47.5 high school 440 and John McKinnon, a 4:12 miler. Speedster Al Coffee (9.5, 20.7, 45.6) should be better.

William & Mary has dominated the Southern Conference the last four years and the Indians again figure to be threats. Coach John Randolph expects sprinter Mike Fratkin (9.5), 440 man Bill Finler (48.0), miler Howell Michael (4:01.4), high jumper Bruce Dallas (6-10), long jumper Scott McLennan (24-2) and Dan Henneberg (15-9) to be threats.

With 12 of last year's 13 lettermen back at The Citadel, prospects are bright. Leading the list are Dick Murray (9.6, 21.0), Charlie Davis in the 880 (1:53.1), Gordon Barber in intermediate hurdles (53.5), Bo Thomas, versatile in field events, Jan Behney, conference javelin champ, and distance man Paul O'Reilly.

VMI has a two-man track team in Gordon Williams and Jan Essenberg. Williams is a 16-foot vaulter and Essenberg a 6-10 high jumper. Hurdler Carl Wood is expected to be the prime threat at University of Richmond. Sprinter Gary Smullen, distance ace Doug Nelson, 440-man Gary Stratton and hurdler Paul Vincent will carry most of the load at Furman. Bruce Jones (9.7) and hurdler-jumper Wade Sellers are other prospects.

Texas A&M and Rice are expected to dominate the Southwest Conference. Leading A&M prospects are junior Curtis Mills, who set a world record of 44.7 in winning the NCAA 440 last year, Rocky Woods, a 9.3 sprinter and Scott Hendricks, a 440 relay man. Other prospects are Ronnie Lightfoot (58-6, 171-0), Ben Creathouse (6-6), Larry McIntyre (16-0) and Marc Black (201-0).

Rice expects to have an outstanding team. At the NCAA the Owls were second in both the 440 and mile relays. Returning on the mile relay are Steve Straub and Bill Askey. They will be joined by Chip Grandjean (47.1) and standout freshman Denny Dickey (47.3).

SWC champion high hurdler Greg Gillian (14.1) returns. The Owls picked up several promising freshmen, including Jim Pearce, who had the best javelin throw in the U.S. for preps. Emmett Brunswon, dean of all SWC coaches of all sports, expects to be back at his post. He suffered a stroke last summer but has recovered.

Brigham Young and Texas-El Paso will battle it out for the Western Athletic Conference title, with New Mexico and Arizona State standing by if either falters. Four NCAA champions return. They are BYU's Pertti Pousi in the triple jump and Ralph Mann in intermediate hurdles, Arizona State's superlative javelin thrower Mark Murro and Texas-El Paso steeplechaser Kerry Pearce. Pearce won in 1968; Pousi, Mann and Murro in '69.

Brigham Young edged Texas-El Paso to win its seventh WAC title, but UTEP could turn the tables this season. UTEP will have back Mike Fray (9.3) and adds Clyde Glosson, who finished fourth in the 1968 100-meter Olympic trials. Glosson transferred from Trinity (Texas). Pearce and soph Ken Breen are ace distance runners. The Miners also appear formidable with high hurdler Paul Gibson (13.6) and pole vaulter Paul Heglar, fourth

in the National Collegiate Championship.

BYU has the frontliners with Pousi, a world-class jumper, and Chris Celion, winner of the USTFF high jump title and second in the NCAA. In addition the Cougars have added intermediate hurdler Jaakko Tuominen and pole vaulter Altti Alarotu—both injured last year—plus freshman high jumper Ken Lundmark, a Swede who has cleared 7-1 $\frac{1}{2}$.

New Mexico should be improved behind a standout freshman crew that will blend with a rapidly improving varsity. Discus thrower Ervin Jaros is back. Among new faces are Fernando Abugattas, a 7-foot high jumper from Peru, Ulf Johannsson, 245-foot javelin thrower, and weightman Kerry Eskeli.

Arizona State had an excellent frontline last year, but no depth and injuries cut deeply into Sun Devil strength. In Murro, who threw 292-8 last season, and Chuck LaBenz, a four-minute miler, the Devils have two of the best in the country. Six junior college transfers will help, including sprinter Doug Hawken and discus thrower Winston Landes.

Rare is the season when Villanova isn't considered a threat and the Wildcats will be the best team in the East and challenge for the NCAA crown. Villanova returns Marty Liquori (mile), Larry James (440), Chris Mason (mile), Donal Walsh (six miles) and Dave Wright (three miles).

Liquori rose to the top of the class of milers when he beat Jim Ryan at the NCAA in a meet record 3:57.7. Another top-notch is James, who ran on the winning 1600-meter relay team in the Mexico Olympics. Freshman Phil Banning, a 4:02.9 miler from England; Phil Hern, a 13.7 hurdler, and Bob Carpenter (9.6, 21.1, 47.4) are best newcomers.

Penn State Coach Harry Groves says his team will make its presence felt in Eastern circles because lettermen return in several events. There's strength in distance events with milers Ralph Kissel and Jim Miller, three-miler Greg Frederics, javelin thrower Scott Hagy and hammer thrower Roger Kauffman. A promising new miler is Dan Supulski (4:12.5).

Army, always a strong contender in the East, has three possible NCAA candidates. They are high jumper Bruce Olson (7-0), javelin thrower Bob Wallis (254-2) and sprinter Kevin Flanagan.

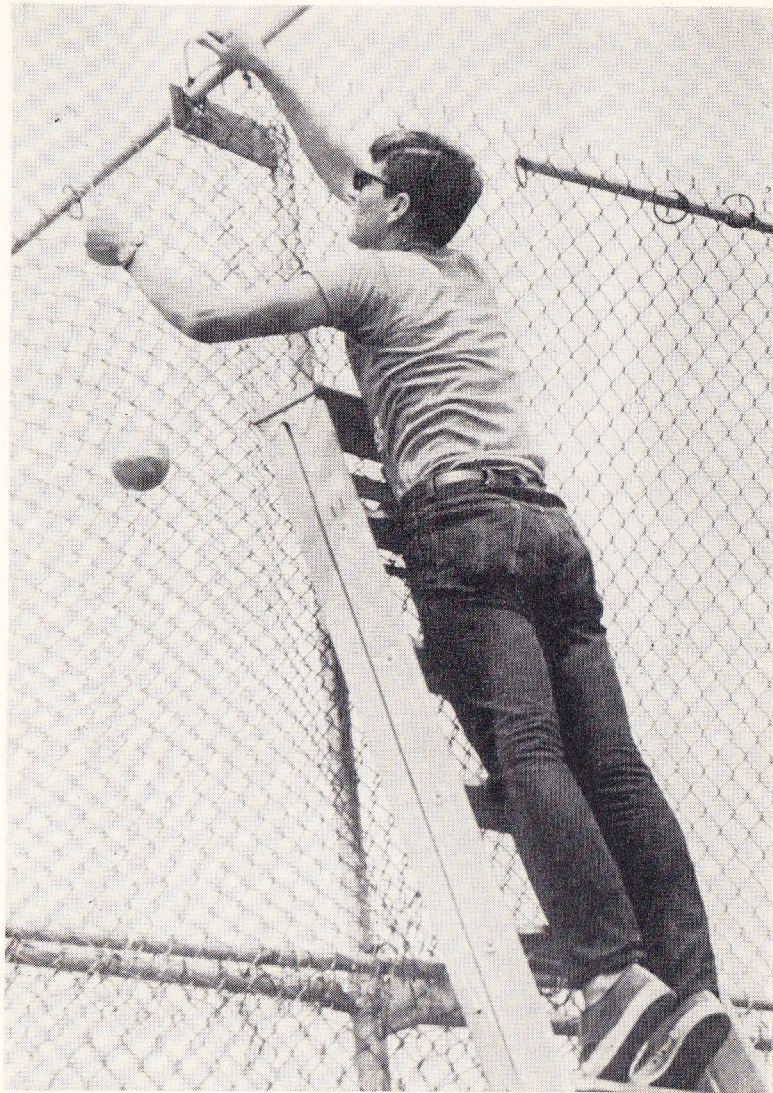
Pennsylvania rates the edge in the Ivy League. The Quakers return almost the entire 1969 team that produced the Red and Blue's best season in a decade. Standout is discusman Ken Dietz (181-8). Harvard has strong distance runners in Keith Colburn, Royce Shaw and Dave Pottetti. Tom Spengerl, Jon Enscoe, Bob Seals and Mike Koerner will provide depth.

Cornell counts on weightman Adrian Burnell, long jumper Walter Jones, triple jumper Glen Fausset, distance ace Phil Ritson and two-miler-steeplechaser Jon Anderson. Yale figures to be strong in the sprints and hurdles with Don Martin, Mel Currie and Earl Downing. Triple-jumper and hurdler Kwaku Ohene-Frempong also returns and will captain the team.

New York U. sorely will miss two-time NCAA 880-champ Byron Dyce and three other relays runners. Bruce Selman, ineligible last year, is back in the distances and should offset Dyce's departure. Fordham Coach Art O'Connor celebrates his 25th year and he couldn't be more pleased about allowing frosh to compete, especially Marcel Philippe.

St. John's is headed for a down cycle after two good seasons. Best prospect is miler Don Rowe.

Maryland is the choice to repeat in the Atlantic Coast Conference, with Duke threatening because of world-class hurdler Jeff Hower.

NATIONAL COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Texas A&M Soph Curtis Mills Is Big Surprise In 440 Win Over Lee Evans

In a national collegiate championship meet full of surprises, John Carlos of San Jose State was Old Reliable.

The Olympic veteran won the 100 and 220-yard dashes and anchored the winning 440-yard relay team to lead San Jose to its first team title in the 48th outdoor championships at University of Tennessee.

San Jose State scored 48 points to 45 for co-favorite Kansas on the rubber composition Tennessee track—the first time the NCAA meet had been held in the Southeast.

Both favorites had expected to score about 20 points higher, but record-breaking competition and their own misfortunes cut them down.

The biggest individual surprise was provided by Curtis Mills, a sophomore journalism student from Texas A&M, who defeated the Olympic gold and silver medalists and set a world record of 44.7 in the 440.

Another world record was tied (13.2 in the high hurdles trials by Erv Hall of Villanova) and the NCAA meet record was broken or tied in 11 of the 20 events.

CARLOS AND MILLS STOOD OUT in a flock of sophomores who won nine of the 18 individual titles. Only three of 10 defending champions won.

The 440 was supposed to be a private argument between Lee Evans, the Olympic 400-meter champion and world record-holder from San Jose, and Larry James of Villanova, who finished a tenth of a second behind in the Olympics. James had only slightly avenged that result by blasting away from the start and beating Evans in the NCAA indoor championships.

He tried the same tactics outdoors, passing the 220 mark in 21 seconds. But it broke him down so much he faded to fifth.

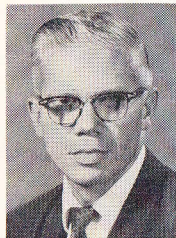
Evans took command in the homestretch only to watch Mills burst past him.

BUT WHILE SAN JOSE lost the victory it expected in the 440, Kansas lost the mile title it counted on with Jim Ryun.

The new glamor runner in the glamor event was Villanova sophomore Marty Liquori, who whipped the world record-holder with an NCAA record of 3:57.3.

Liquori's time was one-tenth short of his personal

best, set in a race where he finished third to Ryun. Ryun had sprinted from behind to beat Liquori for the NCAA indoor title in a race so close they were clocked in the same time. He tried the same thing outdoors, but couldn't make it and broke stride in the last few yards.

Liquori, who had been sick all week with an intestinal virus and didn't expect to win, let out a shout and waved his fists in the last few steps as he realized he had the race clinched.

Ryun tried to come back in the three-mile an hour later, but dropped out after less than a mile, and Kansas' last chance faded with him.

San Jose lost expected points when Larry Walls was disqualified from the intermediate hurdles for dragging a foot around a hurdle; Kirk Clayton was disqualified in the 100 final for running out of his lane; Ronnie Ray Smith failed to reach the 220 finals and Richard Marks had foul trouble and failed to qualify for the shot put.

But it picked up decisive points when discus thrower John Powell placed fourth—ahead of all three Kansas stars—Doug Knop (fifth), Karl Salb (sixth) and Steve Wilhelm (ninth).

Carlos won the 100 in 9.2 and said, "I'm past the hard one. Anyone who beats me in the 220 had better run 19 seconds, and we'll win the relay unless we drop the baton."

He took the 220 in 20.2, tying the NCAA record, and teamed with Davis, Clayton and Smith in a 39.1 relay despite running in the inside lane and through puddles from rain which fell just before the race.

Champions who repeated were Dick Fosbury of Oregon State, with a meet record 7-2½ high jump; John Van Reenen, Washington State, with a meet record 200 feet 8 inches in the discus; and Byron Dyce, NYU, with 1:45.9 in the half mile, a meet record and the world's third-best ever.

Pertti Pousi of Brigham Young lost his long jump title but dethroned Lennox Burgher of Nebraska for the triple jump crown at 52-1½.

Other meet records were Bob Seagren's 17-7 in the pole vault for Southern California; UCLA's 3:03.4 in the mile relay; Ralph Mann's 49.6 (tying the record) in the 440 hurdles for Brigham Young and Bill Skinner's 273-3 in the javelin qualifying. Skinner placed second to Mark Murro of Arizona State in the competition proper, however.

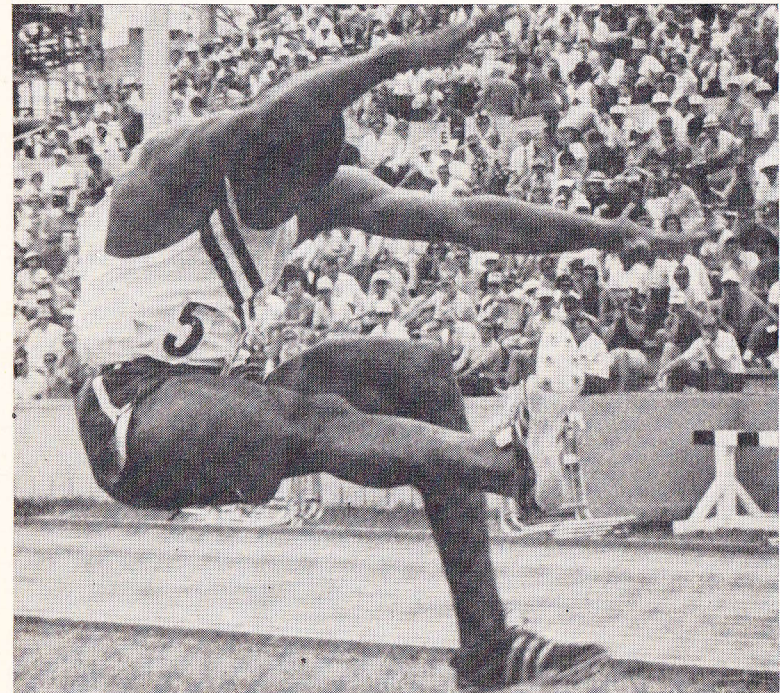
Hall, after tying the world record with his 13.2 in the trials, won the high hurdles final in 13.3.

Frank Shorter of Yale, who never had run a six-mile race, not only took that title in 29:00.1 but then placed second in the three-mile to Ole Oleson of Southern California.

Other champions were Jim Barkley of Oregon State, with 8:44.4 in the 3000-meter steeplechase; Jerry Proctor of Redlands with a long jump of 26-11¼ (nullified as a meet record by wind); Salb of Kansas with 64-9 in the shot put, and Steve DeAutremont of Oregon State with a hammer throw of 190-5.

And the most unfortunate loser was Ed Nosal of Harvard, one of the favorites in the hammer throw. He was warming up by jumping up to chin himself on the crossbar of a football goalpost, but he knocked the bar loose and it fell on his head.

Still woozy after stitches were taken to close the cut, he made one weak throw, fouled twice and failed to qualify.

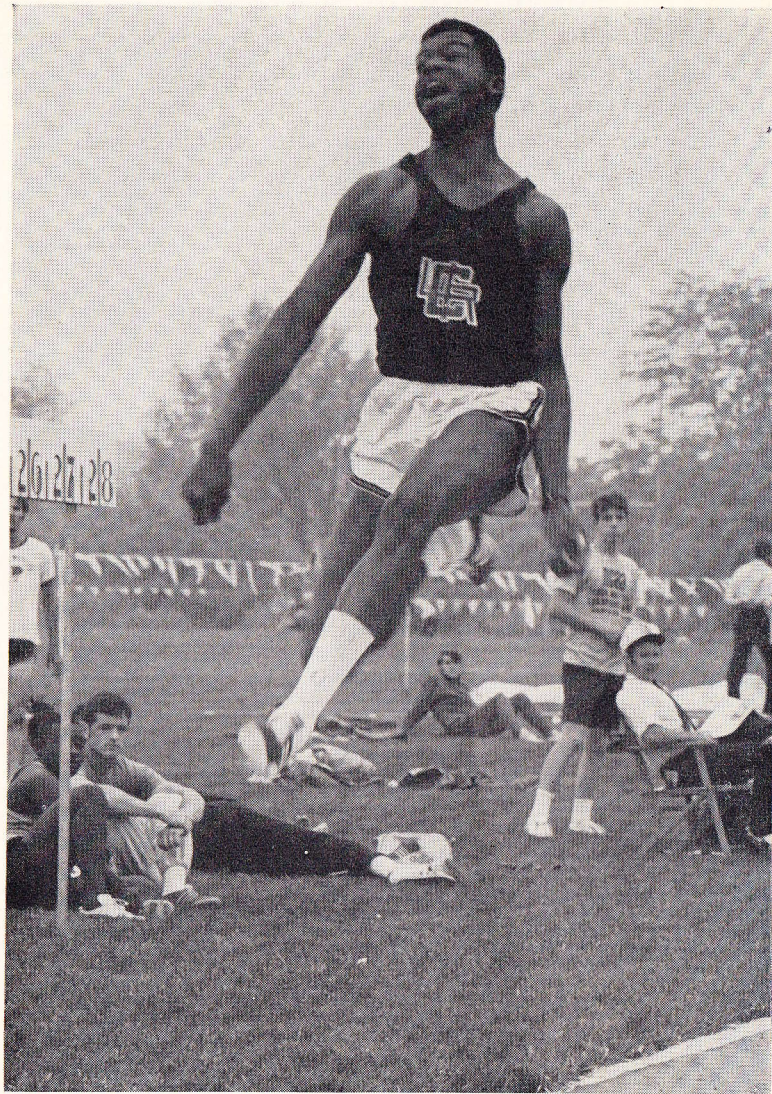

COLLEGE DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIPS

Cal Poly's 2,000-Mile Trip Pays Off With Sixth Straight California Title

The warm sun that shines down on the Golden State of California must have a special effect on athletes—particularly those who compete in track.

That could be one plausible theory to explain the success story of West Coast schools in the College Division Track and Field Championships.

Since this prestige-packed national event began in 1963, California colleges have come away with six straight victories. Oddly enough, the string began after Maryland State scored 98 points, still a record, to earn the first NCAA championship in Chicago.

Last June, California Poly at San Luis Obispo journeyed more than 2,000 miles to prove it had the best college division track team in the nation.

COACH DICK PURCELL'S MUSTANGS traveled to Ohio where ambitious Ashland College had built an all-weather track with seats for 4,000 fans. Some 96 schools and an estimated 500 athletes were entered in the 20-event, two-day meet, with predictions that at least seven records were destined to fall.

But chilly weather and nine mile-per-hour winds hampered individual efforts, particularly in the sprints. The competitive desire of the participants was not to be denied, however.

Although performances in the sprints were below expectations, they nevertheless produced some stirring duels. Three records were set, there were a host of outstanding efforts by athletes from all sections of the country and, as expected, Cal Poly successfully defended its 1968 championship.

When it was all over, the Mustangs had won three events, finished second in two, third in two and scored in three others for a total of 76 points.

John Craft of Eastern Illinois set the first of three records. With darkness

closing in on Friday, he won the triple jump with a tremendous leap of 53-9. The effort eclipsed the 51-9½ meet record set in 1964 by Fresno State's Charles Craig.

GARY TUTTLE of Humboldt State successfully defended his steeplechase crown by breaking his own record with a 8:54.9 clocking, while runnerup Ben Wilson of MIT (9:08.7) also topped the old standard of 9:10.4.

Tuttle's teammate, Bill Scobey, won the three-mile

run in 14:00.4, erasing 10 seconds from the old standard set in 1966.

Arjan Gelling of North Dakota State was second in 14:05.4 and captured the gruelling six-mile run the day before in 30:16.5.

And talk about a busy week. Greg Magee was graduated from the Coast Guard Academy and commissioned an ensign, married the next day and honeymooned in Bermuda before flying back for the NCAA event. It was worth it. Magee zipped to victory in the 120-yard high hurdles, edging Larry McCready of Northern Iowa as both hit 14.5.

Aside from Gelling, only Smith of Cal Poly and William Ritchie of Howard were close to taking doubles.

Smith, second in the 100-meter dash last year, won the 100-yard dash in a blanket finish with Ritchie and Doug Eckert of Chapman. All were clocked in 9.9 seconds.

Ritchie turned on the power in the homestretch to take the 220 in 21.7, nipping William Walker of Wilberforce by a tenth of a second. Smith finished fourth in 22.1.

Smith teamed with DeWinter, Edmondson and Manuel Murrell to bring Cal Poly a victory in the 440 relay (41.0) while the Mustangs scored their other first in the 880 when freshman Mathyas Michael covered the distance in 1:49.6 holding off Dave Hodge of Macalester who finished in 1:50.8. Michael's effort was just three-tenths seconds off the record.

In another near miss, Jackie Causey of Southwest Louisiana high jumped 6-10, three-quarters of an inch under the standard.

It was, indeed, a banner meet, despite adverse weather. The final count showed 55 schools chalking up at least one point.

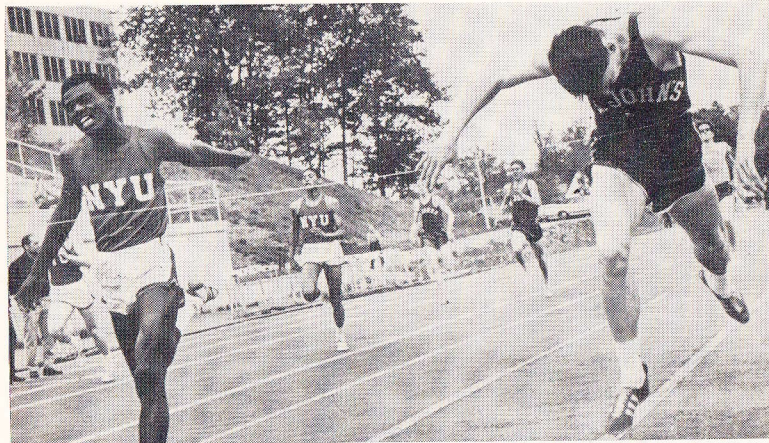

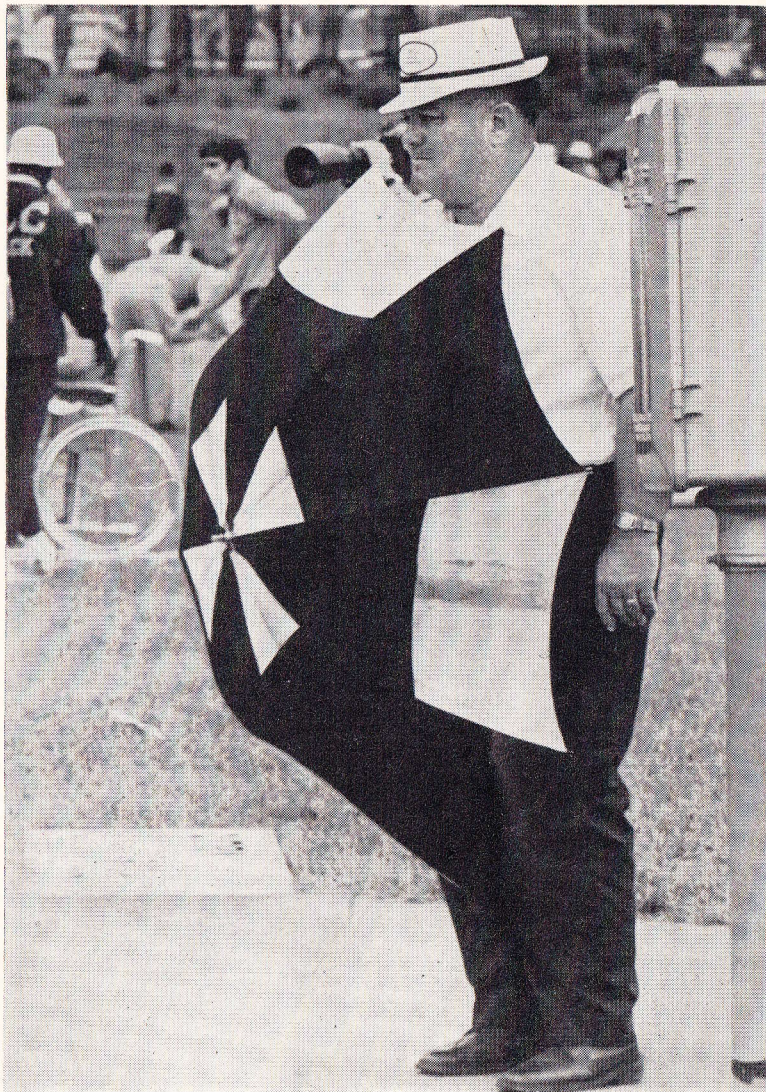

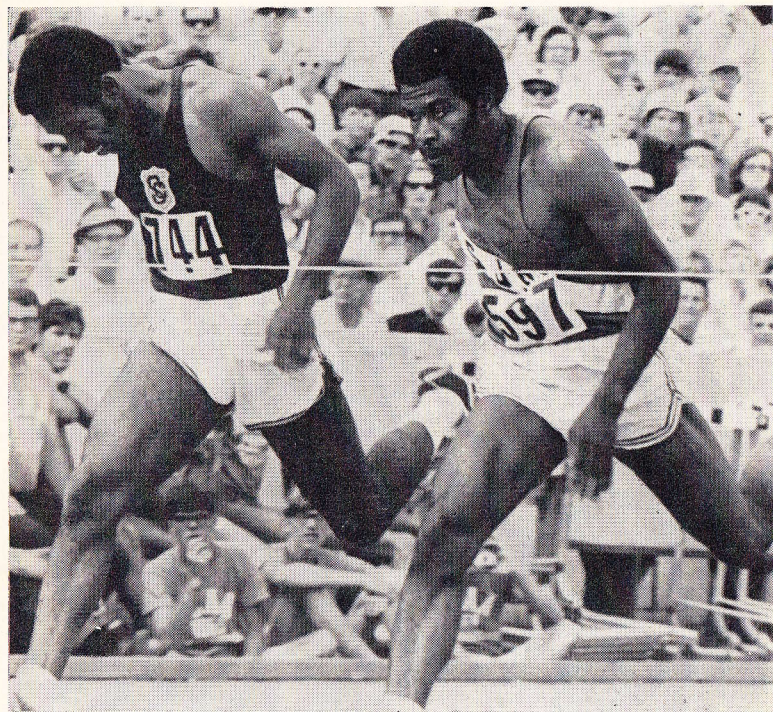

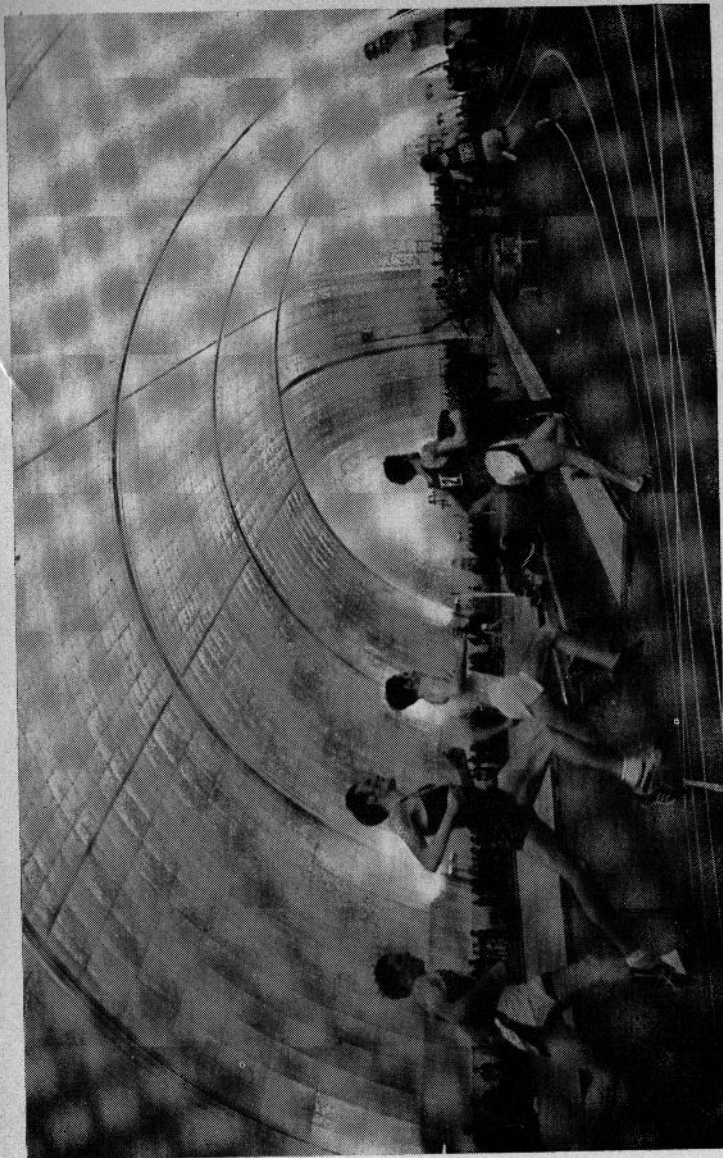
