



NATIONAL PREVIEW-REVIEW

South's First Track Win In 41 Years Could See Repeat Performance In '75

A way down South in the Land of Cotton, the National Collegiate Track and Field Championship pennant flutters in the breeze for the first time in 41 years.

Many a bale of cotton has been lifted between 1933 when Louisiana State wrapped up an NCAA title in Chicago and last June when Tennessee ended UCLA's three-year reign at University of Texas Memorial Stadium.

Graduation bit deeply into champion Tennessee's ranks. Gone are two-time national steeplechase winner Doug Brown, last year's half-mile victor Willie Thomas and quarter-mile runnerup Darwin Bond.

Still, coach Stan Huntsman is optimistic over being the first "outside" team since Kansas to keep the title from the Pac-8 powers two years in succession. Kansas achieved back-to-back victories in 1959 and 1960.

"AT THIS STAGE WE'RE STRONG. But it would be nice," smiles Huntsman, "to find another Reggie Jones on the squad."

Jones was rather sensational as a freshman in his NCAA debut, providing 19½ points to Tennessee's championship cause by winning the 100, missing a sprint double by a half-step in the 220 and running on the third-place 440 relay team. For this, the Track and Field Writers honored him as the "Meet's Outstanding Performer."

Huntsman puts the finger on UCLA, Brigham Young and Oregon as those likely to dethrone him.

"UCLA has talent and depth. BYU will be back in there. Oregon should be tough although their distance men flaked out last year."

Dr. L. T. Walker, whose North Carolina Central team finished a surprising fourth last year with 35 points behind third-place BYU's 41, strings along with Tennessee.

Dick Moore's interest in track and field goes back to many years before the 25-year veteran of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram sports staff began covering meets for his newspaper.

Vacations in the Moore family always coincided with the dates and site of the National Collegiate Track Championships for that year.

He began working the meet on assignment from his employer in 1956. He's covered every Olympic Trial meet since 1948 and has witnessed three Olympics.

Moore, a graduate of TCU and Texas, is currently serving as president of the Track and Field Writers' Association.



"THEY HAVE so much depth. They will be tough as before. UCLA and USC will also be strong. I see no real challenge from the East. My team? How do you replace a Larry Black?" he asks.

Kansas coach Bob Timmons sees another scramble among Tennessee, UCLA, USC, Oregon and possibly Texas-El Paso.

"Oregon was down last

year. But they won't stay down. UTEP will be strong if they go out and get some world-caliber performers," added Timmons.

Both Huntsman and Timmons touched on the expected accelerated recruiting of older foreign athletes now that the gates are down.

"The recruiting of 25, 26 and 27-year-old foreign athletes will be unbelievable," predicts Huntsman.

"Some team that is only average now could go out and recruit the world's best runners and field men and be right in the championship picture next June," foresees Timmons.

IRONICALLY, THE 1975 CHAMPIONSHIPS will be staged on the picturesque campus of Brigham Young, one of the strongholds for foreign athletes.

Collegiate coaches still vividly recall the crowd enthusiasm, warm hospitality and delicious food at the 1967 meet at BYU.

A lightning-fast track that year produced a world record of 38.6 by Southern Cal's 440 relay team and a 9.1 100 by Charlie Greene of Nebraska.

The 1975 championship meet will bring back 11 individual champions including BYU's own Paul Cummings in the mile.

Others are sophomores Jerry Herndon of UCLA in the long jump, Charlton Ehizuelen of Illinois in the triple jump and Jones in the 100; juniors John Ngeno of Washington State in the six-mile, Paul Geis of Oregon in the three-mile and James Gilkes of Fisk in the 220, and seniors Pete Farmer of UTEP in the hammer, Jesse Stuart of Western Kentucky in the shot, Charles Foster of North Carolina Central in the high hurdles and Randy Smith of Kansas in the high jump.

IN ADDITION, TWO 1973 WINNERS who were slowed by injuries—shot putter Hans Hoglund of UTEP and 440 hurdler Robert Primeaux of Texas—are back for their senior years.

Tennessee will have solid scoring potential from Jones; SEC high jump champion Mark Branch; Ron Addison, who chased teammate Brown home in the steeplechase; javelin thrower Danny Martin; John Johnson, high hurdles semifinalist; Bob Bentz, three-mile finalist, and putter Tom Stock.

Top newcomers include javelin thrower Mike Matter, a Pennsylvanian with the best distance of any schoolboy in the nation, as well as the top prep triple jumper in Paul Jordan and discus thrower Scott Genther.

One thing for sure, "4" was not a winning number for UCLA in 1974. Although the Bruins scored four more points than in 1973, they lost to Tennessee by four points (60-56) and their bid for a fourth straight NCAA team title. They also lost by four (134½-130½) to Southern Cal in the Pac-8 championship.

"I HONESTLY BELIEVE WE'LL HAVE a better team than last year," says UCLA coach Jim Bush, "because we are filling our weak spots with such talented newcomers. Also, our proven young veterans should be much better."

UCLA will have seven point winners from the NCAA meet—long jump champion Herndon, third-placer Rory Kotinek in the high jump, fourth-placers Ron Moers in the pole vault and Gordon Innes in the steeplechase and fifth-placer Clarence Taylor in the triple jump.

And the Bruins will be after a seventh straight mile relay title with two members back in Lynnsey Guerrero and the great Benny Brown.

Southern Cal, winner or sharer of 25 national championships, should improve upon its tie for seventh place. However, the only returning NCAA point-maker is Olympic champion Randy Williams, second in the long jump.

High hurdler Ogie Williams, sprinter Mike Shavers and 440 hurdler Tom

Andrews all made the semifinals last year. The Trojans' strongest events should be the long jump, both hurdles races and the quarter mile.

The Troys have everyone back from their fourth-place mile relay team—Trevor Campbell, Ken Randle, Greg Jones and Claude Brown.

Cummings, who led all the way in his surprising mile victory, spearheads BYU's bid for a first undisputed NCAA crown. BYU shared it in 1970.

Among the Cougars' returning point producers are fourth-placers Bengt Gustafsson in the javelin and Kent Gardenkrans in the discus and fifth-placer Anders Arrenius in the shot.

TEXAS-EL PASO IS ANOTHER WESTERN Athletic Conference track power. Heading the Miners' returnees—UTEP finished sixth—are gold medalist Farmer in the hammer, silver medalist Wilson Waigwa in the mile and bronze medalist Hoglund in the shot. Larry Brown took sixth in three-mile.

Coach Ted Banks' brightest newcomers are weightman Hans Almstrom from Sweden (66-8 and 184-0), high jumper Greg Joy from Canada (7-1½) and 440 hurdler Joseph Gichongeri from Kenya (51.0).

Oregon State, which finished a point ahead of UTEP with 26 points, builds its 1975 hopes around high jumpers Tom Woods and Mike Fleer. Others in the Beaver camp are sprinter Yaw Atuahene and triple jumper Steve Rimm, and newcomers include Rich Kimball, who led preppers in 1974 with a 4:06.2 mile.

Graduation wiped out three-fourth of Kansas' national championship 440 relay team, but coach Timmons feels he will be competitive in the mile relay due to the addition of Randy Benson and schoolboy Clifford Wiley, winner of the Golden West 440. Timmons looks for times under 3:06.

NCAA HIGH JUMP WINNER SMITH will be joined by 7-2 jumper Keith Quinn, coming back from a knee operation. Big Eight steeplechase winner Kent McDonald, and long jumpers Theo Hamilton and Danny Seay. A top newcomer is pole vaulter Ralph Haynie, who set a jaycee record of 17-¼.

Bill Dellinger's first venture as a head coach in an NCAA meet was a nightmare. Oregon, a second-place finisher with 31 points in 1973, managed only 10 points from Geis' three-mile victory.

Dellinger will rebuild from Geis (3:58, 8:24.8, 12:55.8), decathlon former Craig Brigham, half-miler Steve Bence (1:48.2), javelinist Jeff Carter (253-2), milers Mark Feig (3:58.5) and Scott Daggatt (3:59.6), vaulter Judd Eddy, discus thrower David Voorhees, steeplechaser Tom McChesney and distance runners Terry Williams and David Taylor.

Washington State expects good performances from six-mile winner John Ngeno and Pac-8 champions Kip Ngeno in the high hurdles and Gary Minor in the 220. Other top returnees are sprinter Tim Geisa, half-miler Dale Scott and seven-foot jumpers Bob Niehl, Lee Braach and Al Darneille.

THREE NEWCOMERS FIGURE TO BRIGHTEN Stanford's picture. They are Golden West long jump winner James Lofton, jaycee pole vaulter Robert Flint and quarter-miler Alan Sheats.

Few teams can match San Diego State in sprinters with Steve Williams, who has a world record equaling time of 9.9 in the 100 meters and was second in the NCAA 100; Harold Williams (9.2) and fifth, and James Reed. Also around are quarter-miler Don Tyler and hurdler Gary Greene.

Fresno State's big hope is PCAA hammer and shot winner Mike Giroux.

Long Beach State boasts PCAA champs in steepler Jim Sweeney and javelin thrower Keith Goldie, plus jaycee quarter-miler Albert Shorts (46.8).

Indiana, winner of the Big 10 outdoor title by an 86-point margin, has an

awesome lineup of talent and will be hard to dislodge in 1975.

Heading Indiana's cast are high hurdlers Phil Stapp and Charlie Jackson, miler Steve Heidenreich, quarter-miler Bill Wallace and Craig Caudill, second in the NCAA 440 hurdles.

Illinois has four outstanding performers. They are Ehizuelan, who set an NCAA triple-jump record; Big 10 mile champion Mike Durkin; weightman Mike Bayette, and sophomore Craig Virgin, who broke almost every schoolboy record in the books but was injury-prone last year.

OHIO STATE HAS BRILLIANT TOM BYERS, who failed to place in the NCAA mile, then bounced back to win the junior 800 and 1,500 titles and capture the USA-Russian junior 1,500.

Michigan expects to improve with Greg Meyer in the steeplechase, Dave Williams in the 880 and Andy Johnson in the 880 or mile.

Sprinter Marshall Dill, who won the conference 100 and 220 titles, headlines the Michigan State team.

Purdue will count on sophomores Harold Vaughn in the long jump and John Mitchell in the sprints and hurdler Alex DiMarzio.

Wisconsin will rely on sprinter Tariq Mughal and distance runners Jim Fleming, Mark Johnson, Tom Schumacher and Dan Lyndgaard.

Southern Illinois will field one of its strongest teams in years with triple jumper Phil Robins, the only collegian to beat Ehizuelan; Bill Hancock in the decathlon, and a recruiting harvest that includes jaycees George Haley in the 440 hurdles and Wilber Haney in the 440 along with schoolboy Gary Hunter, the Golden West pole vault champion (16-8).

KENT STATE WILL REBUILD WITH Frenchman Bruno Cherrier in the sprints, high jumper Bob Francis and distance man Mike Irmen.

Kansas State will be strongest in the hurdles, middle distances and distances. The Wildcats boast distance runners in Keith Palmer (3:59.2), Jeff Schemmel (3:59.4), Don Akin (4:02.0) and Ted Settle (4:04.5). Also around are half-milers Lennie Harrison (1:49.7) and Jim Hincliffe

(1:48.3), hurdlers Vance Roland and Bill Kehmeier, high jumper Rick Slifer and javelin thrower Bob Obee (256-10).

Despite the loss of Tony Waldrop, North Carolina should be strong. Leading the Tars will be three-miler Dave Hamilton and miler Tommy Ward.

Manhattan has a good blend of experience with miler Matt Centrowitz (4:02); Tony Colon, a 3:58.8 miler and three-time indoor all-America; half-miler Warren Gordon (1:50); Ken McBryde, who was second in the NCAA triple jump (54-2), and sprinter Jim Nathaniel.

Penn will be strong in the sprints with Hep 100 and 220 champion Mike Seitz back along with Bernie Gansle, Colvin Gramm and Ed James. Not to be overlooked is 440 hurdler Howie Schwab, third in the NCAA.

CORNELL WILL FEATURE SHOT PUTTER Dave Doupe, sixth in the NCAA and winner in the USA-USSR junior meet, and triple jumper Jim Leonard, who has done 51-3. Another top field man is Carl Shields in the hammer.

High jumpers Tim Riley and George Jupin head Pittsburgh's returnees.

Texas will be strong again this year with the return of shot putter Dana LaDuc, fourth in the NCAA; SWC mile winner Paul Craig (3:58.9); Jim McGoldrick in the discus; high-hurdle finalist Nate Robinson (13.6); miler Reed Fischer (3:59.9), and sprinters Marvin Nash and Overton Spence. John Lee will bolster the mile relay team, as will national schoolboy 330-hurdle record holder Bill Blessing, who joins the talented Primeaux in the collegiate intermediate hurdle event.

Texas A&M will be improved with three SWC champions—high hurdler Scottie Jones (13.6), javelin thrower Bill Newton (237-7) and quarter-miler Doug Brodhead (47.0), also second in the SWC 220.

BAYLOR LANDED A PRIZE RECRUIT in Mark Collins, state 440 champion, who should help the Bears' outstanding mile relay team that won 10 straight meets. Collins will have to dislodge someone for the foursome returns intact—Steve Lang, Michael Carter, James Jordan and Tim Son.

TCU welcomes back SWC 100 champion Bill Collins, 440 hurdler Greg Roberts, high hurdler Gary Patterson and quarter-miler Sam McKinney.

Arkansas will lean heavily on distance runners Steve Houk, Randy Melancon and Niall O'Shaughnessy, while Rice has sprinter Zoe Simpson, half-miler Bob Nellums, Buddy Briscoe's discus and hurdler Mike Fulghum.

Clifford Outlin, who upset Reggie Jones in the SEC 100 and has a wind-aided 9.28, heads Auburn's cast. David McKannan set school records in the three and six-mile runs, though only a freshman.

LSU should be stronger with high hurdler Larry Shipp (13.4), who was second in the NCAA, and miler Bob Smith (4:02.3), along with hurdler Allen Misher and sprinter Barney Cobb. Coach Joe May also signed Texas' No. 1 schoolboy sprinter, Greg Edmond.

HIGH JUMPER WARREN SHANKLIN returns at Northeast Louisiana.

Marshall Smith, who swept the discus titles on the Midlands relay circuit and was third in the NCAA, tops Colorado State's veterans.

Michael Solomon, the 1974 WAC champion in the 440 and 600, is the best of the returnees at New Mexico. Long jumper Robert Nance (25-4), hurdler Mal Powers (14.1 and 51.6) and distance runners John Allison and Blair Johnson will lend depth.

A recruiting violation penalty that prohibits Arizona from signing anyone for two years will leave the Cats depending on sprinters Larry Brown and Wardell Gilbreath, WAC six-mile champion Ed Mendoza and Ed Arriola in the mile and 880.

NATIONAL COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Tennessee Halts Bruin Track Dynasty With A Little Help From Its Friends

A bunch of midwesterners from Tennessee got a little help from Nigeria and New York City to dethrone a UCLA dynasty deep in the heart of Texas.

It sounds like a poker game in the United Nations, but it was the 53rd National Collegiate Track and Field Championships.

With the competition as hot as the weather, the race for the team title went to the final event—the triple jump—before Tennessee's Volunteers ended UCLA's three-year stranglehold by four points, 60 to 56.

"We wanted to win," said the Vols' Willie Thomas, who won the half mile. "But we knew UCLA wanted to win, too. We knew they weren't going to give us the title, so we knew the only way we'd get it was to go out and take it. And that's what we did."

INDEED, IT WAS THAT WAY on the track as Reggie Jones won the 100 and was second in the 220; Doug Brown and Ron Addison ran 1-2 in the steeple-chase; Thomas won the 880; Darwin Bond was second in the 440, and Greer Radcliff, Jones, Jon Young and Bond placed third in the 440 relay.

But things weren't so orange-colored in the field, where Tennessee was shut out as UCLA's Jerry Herndon won the long jump and the Bruins picked up points in the high jump, discus and pole vault. When a UCLA foursome made it six mile-relay titles in a row, the score was Tennessee 60, UCLA 54, and it all depended on the triple jump.


If UCLA's Clarence Taylor could finish first or second, Tennessee's quest would be in vain. Third would create a tie. Taylor, jumping with an injured knee, clung to third behind Middle Tennessee's Tommy Haynes and Long Beach State's Rayfield Dupree through four rounds.

Don Pierson has been writing about track and field for nearly half of his 30 years. He was hooked on the sport when his high school coach left the relay lineups to him.

He wrote about it at Ohio State, where he became the first journalism student ever to request the cross country beat. He has been covering it for the Chicago Tribune since 1967.

Pierson's primary assignment is football. He has written a book on the history of football at the University of Southern California. He's covered tennis, baseball and basketball.

But if he had his choice, he would be "sitting at a finish line somewhere with a stop watch."



But Manhattan's Ken McBryde fought a cross-wind to take the lead with a 54-1½ jump and Illinois' Charlton Ehizuelen, a freshman from Nigeria, came through with the only meet record of the week—54-8.

TAYLOR FINISHED fifth and Tennessee's happy athletes chased coach Stan Huntsman into the steeple-chase water pit.

It was a fitting place to celebrate, because the 1-2 finish by Brown and Addison in Saturday's first run-

ning event seemed to provide the momentum the Vols needed to capture their first track title.

For the first time ever outdoors, professional athletes competed under new NCAA rules allowing a pro in one sport to remain an amateur in another. Larance Jones of Northeast Missouri, who had signed a football contract, repeated his indoor victory by winning the 440-yard dash. UCLA's Roger Freberg, another pro griddler-to-be, placed second in the discus.

Tennessee won without a foreign athlete on its squad, a feat of no small proportion since foreigners scored 25 per cent of the meet's points. Brigham Young, third with 41 points, got 31 from foreigners.

SWEDEN LED THE PARADE OF FOREIGN countries with 33 points and it was a Swede from Brigham Young who got things started by winning the decathlon on Tuesday and Wednesday. Runald Backman scored 7,784 points on two humid nights to beat Fresno State's Roger George by 35 points.

Australia's Peter Farmer of Texas-El Paso set an Australian record of 230-6 in winning the hammer throw as the first defending champion fell in Friday's first event. Kent State's Jacques Accambray was fifth.

Next up to the victory stand was UCLA's Herndon in the long jump. The 5-7, 135-pound freshman leaped 26-6½ on his first attempt.

North Carolina Central, another pre-meet favorite, got a boost in Friday's first running final when Charles Foster edged LSU's Larry Shipp by a tenth of a second, 13:35 to 13.45, in the high hurdles.

Moments later Tennessee asserted itself in spectacular fashion. Reggie Jones, a 20-year-old freshman from Saginaw, Mich., beat San Diego State's Steve Williams, who had been vying all spring with ex-Southern Illinois sprinter Ivory Crockett for the title of "World's Fastest Human."

"I JUST WANTED TO SHOW EVERYONE Reggie can run, too," said Jones, who pounded down the Tartan surface in 9.18 seconds with a 10.3 m.p.h. wind. Williams, a notoriously slow starter, closed fast with a 9.20.

Western Kentucky's Jesse Stuart won the shot put at 66-5¼ as defending champion Hans Hoglund of Texas-El Paso was third.

The last event on Friday's schedule—the six-mile run—was delayed an hour because of the heat, but when the race started at 8:45 p.m., it was still above 90 degrees.

Under those conditions it was remarkable that 20 of 29 starters finished the 24-lap grind, won by John Ngeno, a Kenyan from Washington State, in 28:14.6. Defending champion Charlie Maguire of Penn State took a giant lead at the start only to fade after a mile and finish 18th. Dropouts included Boston Marathon winner Neil Cusack of East Tennessee State, 1971 six-mile champion Garry Bjorlund of Minnesota and Tennessee's Doug Brown, who decided he had a better chance in the steeplechase.

HE WAS RIGHT. LEADING ALMOST from the start, the senior from St. Claire Shores, Mich., won in 8:36. Step for step on Brown's shoulder was Addison, a Tennessee sophomore who added second-place points with an 8:36.8. Brown was the only one of six returning champions to defend his title.

UCLA kept pace in the field, however. Freberg placed an unexpected second to Brigham Young's Zdravko Pecar (Yugoslavia) in the discus.

The Bruins got third and fourth in the pole vault from Francois Tracanelli and Ron Mooers in a 6½-hour competition won at 17-3 by Oregon State's Ed Lipscomb.

Rory Kotinek high jumped 7-2 to get third place for UCLA behind Kansas' Randy Smith and Indiana's Dennis Adama—both also at 7-2.

Oregon State got another first from Jim Judd in the javelin as the senior set a personal record of 271-3.

The 440-yard relay followed the steeplechase, and Kansas got a brilliant third leg from Mark Lutz to enable the Jayhawks' quartet of Tom Scavuzzo, Eddie Lewis, Lutz and Emmett Edwards to win in 39.54 over Texas Southern and Tennessee. The Vols got a swift second leg from Jones.

The mile run had been ballyhooed as the feature race of the meet because of North Carolina's Tony Waldrop, a senior who had run nine straight sub-four-minute miles earlier in the year. But the 89-degree heat, 66 per cent humidity and 12 m.p.h. wind held the time to 4:01.1. The winner was Brigham Young's Paul Cummings, who collapsed at the finish line and had to be helped up. "I was just hot, that's all," he said. Waldrop finished third in 4:02.3.

Another defending champion abdicated in the 440-yard hurdles as Texas' Robert Primeaux, hindered by injury all season, failed to advance from his qualifying heat. But Penn's Bruce Collins, who won the race in 1972, came back with a victory over N. C. Central's Mel Bassett in 50.30.

In the 440-yard dash, Jones turned back Tennessee's Bond and UCLA's Maxie Parks in a close finish in 45.46.

The half mile brought Tennessee 10 unexpected points, even though win-

ner Thomas was the 1972 champion. The senior from Chicago hadn't even qualified for the 1973 meet and returned in 1974 as a darkhorse at best.

"But I knew if I made the finals I would win," he said. He almost didn't, finishing third in quarterfinals and fourth in semifinals.

That set the stage for the 220-yard dash. Defending champion Marshall Dill of Michigan State and 1972 winner Larry Burton of Purdue had been eliminated and scratches and injuries cut the final to six men.

The talented Jones, voted the meet's outstanding performer, seemed to build an insurmountable lead heading into the stretch before James Gilkes of Fisk University and Guyana blitzed the final 50 yards like he was shot out of a cannon and won in an amazing 19.9 seconds. The wind was slightly illegal at 7.4 m.p.h., but the time equalled the fastest wind-aided 220 ever run on a curve. Jones was second in 20 seconds flat. The race was timed manually because the electronic timers was not turned on.

Oregon's Paul Geis, a native Texan, won the three-mile as expected but in a cautious 13:39. That set up the final running event—the mile relay.

Favored North Carolina Central led going into the anchor lap. Third was UCLA's Parks, who followed teammates Lynnsey Guerrero, Benny Brown and Jerome Walters. Parks blazed a 45.3 and the Bruins had made it six titles in a row in the mile relay, this one in 3:06.6.

It only set up the triple jump finish, however, and for the first time since 1970 UCLA had to learn how the other half lives.

NATIONAL DIVISION II AND III CHAMPIONSHIPS

Ashland Cops Division III Inaugural While Eastern Ill., Norfolk St. Tie

Eastern Illinois, Norfolk State, Ashland, the best quarter-miler in the country and a retiring coach got most of the spotlight in the first and last (unless the format is changed) combination National Collegiate Division II and Division III Track and Field Championships held at O'Brien Field on the Eastern Illinois University campus.

The 12th annual meet was held in two divisions; and after rain, high winds and lightning caused all sorts of problems in the decathlon, the meet was nothing short of outstanding—both on the performance level and on the management level.

THE TEAM BATTLE IN DIVISION II went down to the final event, the mile relay. Norfolk State had to take the relay to tie Eastern Illinois (which didn't have a team in the final), but Northridge State could better them both with at least a fourth-place finish.

Bill Neely's 46.1 third leg paced defending champion Norfolk State to a 3:09.6 victory, while Northridge finished last in the eight-team field and fell to fourth in the standings. Norfolk and Eastern Illinois finished with 51 points each, with Cal Poly SLO taking third with 48½ and Northridge getting 48 points for the meet.

Ashland really never had much to worry about after Jim Baum got the Ohioans off and running to the title in the first Division III championship with a first in the decathlon.

Ashland, seventh last year under the old one-division format, totaled 61 points, while Southern U. of New Orleans took second with 48, Mount Union third with 44 and Fisk fourth with 40.


Four meet records were broken and two bettered but wind-aided, while 16 O'Brien Field records fell.

Only Division II performers could break meet records as all best performances in Division III established division records.

LARANCE JONES of Northeast Missouri and Steve Riddick of Norfolk State became only the third and fourth three-time champions.

Jones was the crowd favorite as he ran way with the 440. The Texas, Kan-

sas and Drake Relays champion broke the old meet record of 46.1 that he shared with Willie Lyles of Lincoln as he sped around the track in 45.9.

Riddick had all he wanted from freshman Clancy Edwards of Cal Poly in the 100. Riddick, winner in 1972 and 1973, needed a photo decision to nip Edwards, both timed in a windy 9.2.

Edwards got his revenge in the 220, showing tremendous acceleration in the final 40 yards for a 20.4 and a two-tenth victory over defending champ Riddick. Again, the wind was a little too strong.

IN DIVISION III, KIP KORIR of Coe ran away with the 440, posting a 47.3 victory. Korir also took third in the triple jump.

The big talk of Division III was James Gilkes of Fisk. The sophomore from Guyana ran away and hid from all other Division III sprinters. He took the 100 in an easy 9.4 and breezed to a 20.7 victory in the 220.

In the pole vault, Dave Hamer of Cal Poly returned, after failing to clear a height last year, to break the meet record. Hamer, champion in 1972, sailed over 16-9 $\frac{1}{4}$ to break the record of 16-8 he set in 1972. In Division III, Steve Hughes of Westmont sailed 15-6 for the victory.

In the 440 hurdles, Carl Stevenson of Southern U. broke the meet record of 51.0 set in 1967 by Andrew Bell of American. Stevenson skimmed over the barriers in 50.8. Tony Cornelious of Augustana (III.) won in Division III at 53.3. Baum gave Ashland fuel by finishing third in 53.7.

THE FINAL MEET RECORD BROKEN was in the three-mile. Garry Bentley of South Dakota State successfully defended his title with a record 13:33 effort, breaking the mark of 13:36.4 set in 1971 by Gordon Minty of Eastern Michigan. Bentley now has won the 1,500 meters (as a freshman in 1972), the three-mile last year and captured the Division II cross country title last fall. David Moller of Rochester took Division III in 13:54.6.

Eastern Illinois' lone victory came in the long jump where senior Darrell Brown sailed 25-7 $\frac{1}{4}$ for a 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch victory. The Panthers of coach Maynard "Pat" O'Brien performed almost to their maximum all meet long.

But the best jump of the meet came from David Boyd of Fisk, the champion last year at Wabash. Boyd took just one jump and landed 25-8 into the pit. He finished nearly two feet ahead of Chuck Larsuel of Mount Union.

The mile was tough in both divisions. In Division II, Dennis Schultz of Northern Iowa, fourth last year, led a pack of runners home under 4:08 with his 4:03.7 victory. In Division III, Steve Foster of Ashland won in 4:05.1. Foster was defending champion.

Chuck Smead defended his six-mile title with a 29:17 effort in Division II, while Glenn Behnke of North Central took Division III in 29:30.8.

SECOND PLACE SEEMS TO BE the place for Ken Johnson of Puget Sound. Johnson finished second last year in the javelin behind the record-setting effort of Anthony Hall of Norfolk State, and this year Johnson took second. Bob Parker of San Francisco State won at 242-11, with Johnson throwing 240-0. Robert Sing of Ursinus won Division III at 234-11.

Rick Livesey of Eastern Illinois is in the same boat as Johnson. The junior steeplechaser took second for the second straight year. Steve Sooter of Seattle Pacific won in 8:56. Gary Johanson of Westmont won Division III in 9:17.8 with Lee Pollock of St. Lawrence second.

The 440 relays were scorchers. Northridge State nipped the Riddick-anchored Norfolk State team with both getting 40.2s. In Division III, Mount Union won in 41.1 with Southern U. of New Orleans second in 41.2.

Anthony Terry of Cal-Davis defended his triple jump crown easily. He

rode a tail wind to a 52-7 $\frac{1}{2}$ three-stepper, with Len Jenkins of East Stroudsburg second at 51-7 $\frac{1}{4}$. Anthony (seems to run with triple jumpers) Palumbo of Rochester took Division III with a 49-11 effort.

Wet approach areas forced the high jump inside, where Clarence Frazier of Northridge bested the field with a 6-10 victory. John Barron of Eastern Illinois took a surprising and very important second as the next seven jumpers cleared 6-8. Kurt Nielsen of Nebraska Wesleyan captured Division III at 6-7, the same height as Greg Gorsuch of Wheaton.

The 880 was also an outstanding event with Mark Robinson of Catholic sneaking up on the field for a 1:48.7 victory. Ray Geter of Prairie View finished second in 1:49.6.

ASHLAND PROBABLY SALTED AWAY its title after the 880. Barry King led an Ashland 1-2 sweep by winning in 1:51.2, with Bob Linn taking second.

The weights supplied Hayward State with most of its points. Brad Nave took the discus for Hayward with a fling of 175-3, while Greg Blankenship gave Hayward 10 points with a 183-11 hammer victory. Richard Leavitt of Bowdoin won the shot by one-quarter inch over David Arciere of Adelphi, 55-4 to 55-3 $\frac{1}{4}$.

Bill Iovino of Ohio Wesleyan won the Division III discus at 171-1, with John Pearson of MIT taking the hammer at 170-5 and Steve Lindgren of Hamline winning the shot at 55-10 $\frac{1}{4}$.

Robert Martin of Southeastern Louisiana sped over the high hurdles in a quick 13.5. In Division III, Roger Rutherford of Otterbein bested the field with a 14.2 win.

The decathlon was closer to a water sport than a land sport. It rained both days; and due to the two-division setup and the weather, the javelin, the first day's final event, was held only with the aid of automobile headlights. But the many inconveniences didn't bother the "super athletes," with the first six placers in Division II notching personal records.

PAUL FINK OF FULLERTON STATE DEFENDED his title and topped the field with 7,067 points, followed by Bill Fletcher of Slippery Rock.

In Division III Baum led from start to finish. He turned in some outstanding performances enroute to his 7,030 total.

But Dr. O'Brien took home more awards and honors than anyone at the meet. The 68-year-old legend was voted Division II Coach of the Year, and it was announced that the track and football field (formerly Lincoln Field) would be renamed O'Brien Field. And he was presented with a championship after having produced such outstanding athletes as John Craft, Rodney Jackson and Sandy Osei-Agyeman during his 28 years at EIU.

The two divisions presented Dr. O'Brien and EIU assistant coach Neil Moore with many problems and much work. But every coach who was asked about the meet had nothing but praise for the running of the program. In the future each division will be held at a different site, but the 1974 meet will be remembered as one of the smoothest-run meets ever.

Randy Lussenden of the Chicago TC set a steeplechase record of 8:38.2. In the three-mile, John Halberstadt of PCC ran 13:22.8 for a record, and in the pole vault, the PCC's Casey Carrigan sailed 17-6 for a new mark. The Pacific Coast Club's other individual titlist was Jim Bolding, who copped the 440 hurdles in 50.0.







NATIONAL COLLEGiate INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

While Tony Waldrop Steals The Show, Miners Steal Team Win From Colorado

A professional football player won the 440-yard dash, seven foreign athletes collected first-place medals and Texas-El Paso took team honors in a suspenseful photo finish with Colorado.

But challenge someone to describe the 10th National Collegiate Indoor Track and Field Championships in two words and the reply is as certain as death and inflation: Tony Waldrop.

The North Carolina senior left a Saturday afternoon crowd of 9,756 with an epidemic of tennis-fan neck—swiveling from his floppy blond hair to the Cobo Hall clock—as he surged through the final quarter in 55 seconds to produce his seventh straight sub-four-minute mile, 3:59.5.

When Mike Durkin of Illinois set the pace through the three-quarter mark in 3:03.8, it appeared that Waldrop's incredible string was about to be snapped. Then, 250 yards from the finish, Waldrop raced into the lead.

THE CLOCK FAILED TO TICK FOUR, and the faithful celebrated their presence at a happening. The man who made it happen was more restrained.

"This is the one I really wanted to win," he said. "A national championship is something. Truthfully, whether it was under four wasn't nearly as important as winning."

Jim Ryun's meet record of 3:58.6 remained inviolate, but in surpassing—in less than two months—Ryun's career mark of six sub-four indoor miles, Waldrop had accomplished a far greater feat. Besides, among the sensational seven was the world record of 3:55.0.

While the suspense surrounding Waldrop's clash with the clock was quickly resolved, the struggle for the team title created heart thumping that stretched into hours.

Texas-El Paso, on a meet record shot put by Swede Han Hoglund and Aussie Peter Farmer's second place in the 35-pound weight throw, matched the first-day production of 10 points by Colorado-Ghanaian Kingsley Adams' long-jump title and Ted Castaneda's second in the two-mile.

As assistant sports editor of the *Washington Post*, Robert Fachet wears several hats. His primary duties are layout and makeup, but his principal satisfaction comes from covering track and field.

The multiple duties had his hats spinning last Feb. 17. He called Tony Waldrop that evening to discuss an upcoming meet, only to learn that a change of plans had sent Tony flying to the San Diego Indoor Games.

At 2 a.m., Fachet was in the composing room supervising a sports page tearup for a new banner: "Waldrop Races to 3:55."

The Northwestern graduate is father of five children and is a soccer referee in his spare time.

They were, however, able to muster only a fourth-place finish, while Wilson Waigwa's 4:00.6 anchor mile brought UTEP home third. So it was Colorado 16, Texas-El Paso 13, and two men held the balance of power: UTEP pole vaulter Larry Jessee and Colorado high jumper Bill Jankunis.

Jessee was the first to be tested. He cleared 16 on his second try, then topped 16-3 and 16-6 on his initial attempts. Tim Hamilton of Alabama matched Jessee at 16-6, while Bob Pullard of Southern California needed two tries. Defending champion Terry Porter of Kansas and Jim Green of Ohio State passed at 16-6 and the quintet moved up to 16-9.

NOT ONE GOT OVER. THIS LEFT JESSEE and Hamilton tied for first place and required a jumpoff. Each attempted 16-9 once more, each failed and the bar was lowered to 16-6. Jessee went over and UTEP was in front, 19-16.

Now, with all other events completed, the pressure shifted to freshman Jankunis, and for a time he responded admirably. When he matched his personal best of 7-1 on his second attempt, he held second place, behind Oregon State's Mike Fleer. Had Jankunis finished in that spot, Colorado would have been the team champion. Third place would have created a tie.

Dennis Adama of Indiana, the next jumper, equalled Jankunis' leap and moved ahead on the basis of fewer attempts. Favored Tom Woods of Oregon State managed 7-1 on his third attempt and the bar was raised to 7-2.

A week later Jankunis would clear 7-3½, but for this day he had reached his limit. Woods matched Fleer's 7-2 clearance on the first try to flop from fourth place to second. Jankunis' two points for fourth place left Colorado one shy, permitting UTEP coach Ted Banks to celebrate his school's first NCAA track title.

THE FRIDAY NIGHT CROWD OF 8,245 witnessed an historic first, as Larance Jones captured the 440 in 48.6. Jones, from Northeast Missouri, had signed a three-year pro football contract a month before, but was eligible to run under the recently enacted NCAA rule that a professional in one sport could compete as an amateur in another.

The massive foreign contingent grabbed four of the seven titles at stake Friday, with three resulting in meet records.

Jacques Accambray, of France and Kent State, literally threw the 35-pound weight out of sight at Bowen Fieldhouse in Ypsilanti. On his second effort, measured at a record 71-5½, the implement disappeared from sight. Accambray, after a 60-second search, located it nestling in a rolled-up canvas against the wall of the fieldhouse.

On his next try Accambray threw the ball beyond the line marking George Frenn's world indoor record of 73-3½, but he lost his balance and his right hand touched outside the circle. "That was the foulest foul of my life," Accambray said. "I was going all out. I was ready on that throw."

IN THE FINALS, HE RAISED his meet record to 71-10¾.

Hoglund and Jesse Stuart of Western Kentucky, drawn for the same flight, shot their bolts in the trials of the 16-pound event. Stuart hit 65-11 on his first attempt, then Hoglund achieved 66-8. Stuart's second throw was 67-4½, two inches beyond the meet record. Hoglund replied with 67-7½.

Hoglund was the only individual champion to repeat, although Waldrop had won the 1,000 in 1973.

John Hartnett, of Ireland and Villanova, trimmed the meet record in the two-mile to 8:33.6. He galloped through the first mile in 4:09.9.

Adams survived keen competition to win the long jump at 25-3¾, as only 2½ inches separated the top three.

When John Ngeno of Kenya and Washington State opened Saturday's program by winning the three-mile in 13:20.8, the foreign delegation was batting five for eight. It simmered a bit thereafter, with only Danny Smith and Wesley Maiyo intruding on the home-based talent.

Smith, from the Bahamas and Florida State, breezed through the 60-yard high hurdles in 7.0. His task was made easier when favored Larry Shipp of Louisiana State was caught in the blocks in the quarterfinals.

Maiyo, from Kenya and Wyoming, became the only freshman titlist when he ran away with the 1,000 in 2:08.1.

Tommy Haynes of Middle Tennessee succeeded graduated teammate Barry McClure as triple jump champion and surpassed McClure's meet record by five inches with a startling 54-6¼. Haynes barely advanced to the finals, managing 51-8 on his last qualifying attempt.

Two heroes of the U.S.-Russia meet the previous week came back to win NCAA titles. Cliff Outlin of Auburn, the 60-meter winner at Moscow, took the 60-yard dash in 6.0. Stan Vinson of Eastern Michigan, who beat the Russians at 400 meters, won the NCAA 600 in 1:10.1.

Seton Hall retained its mile relay crown in a meet-record 3:14.0. Howard Brock's 48.5 anchor was preceded by the Caribbean trio of Alf Daley (48.7), Charles Joseph (48.4) and Art Cooper (48.4).

The Pirates sweated more the night before than they did on the track. The honest effort committee wanted Brock barred from the relay because of his two false starts in the 600 semifinals Friday night, but its decision was overruled by the games committee.

Missouri won the distance medley in 9:44.9 as Charlie McMullen (4:01.1) fought off Pennsylvania's Dennis Fikes (4:00.4). South Carolina nipped Oklahoma State in 7:27.4 in the two-mile relay.

Most Familiar Outcome In 34th Meet: Another Track Trophy In Mesa's Case

Mesa Community College of Mesa, Arizona, won its fifth national junior college track and field championship in the last seven years, easily outdistancing Essex County (N.J.) in the 34th annual NJCAA meet at San Jacinto College, Pasadena, Texas.
