



ON THE COVER: Big Eight high jump champ Nat Page, who set a conference outdoor record by clearing 7-41/2 in 1977 as a sophomore. In his freshman season at the University of Missouri, the Evanston, Illinois, jumper cleared 7-21/4 to win the outdoor meet event, duplicating the height to place third at the 1976 collegiate championships. Despite matching the performance (7-31/4) of last year's NCAA indoor winner, UTEP's Greg Joy, Page dropped to the runner-up spot on the basis of more misses. The Tiger physical education major tied the Texas Relays mark of 7-3 in winning there, finished second at the Kansas Relays with a 7-11/4 jump and won the Drake Relays with another 7-3 clearance during the spring of '77. After his Big Eight record placed him sixth on the list of all-time jumps by collegians, Page managed just 7-1 and seventh place at the 1977 national collegiate championships.

## Scholarship Limits Balance Talent, Making Title Quest More Difficult

The NCAA Track and Field Championships return to the University of Oregon in Eugene this spring, meaning fast tracks and records—and Ducks—might share trackside conversation with scholarship limits and foreign athletes.

Hayward Field's reputation gives hope of super marks and exciting competition, and Eugene's famous fans hope they can whip up a serious challenge by the home team.

All of it could happen. Eleven of 19 individual champions return; and one of them, Washington State's Samson Kimombwa, brought back the world 10,000-meter record.

Oregon, meanwhile, significantly has bolstered a good dual meet team into an NCAA contender, perhaps the Ducks' best since the last time the meet was held in Eugene, 1972. And longtime coaches won't forget how Oregon crushed the field in 1964 in Eugene.

BUT BECAUSE OF THOSE favorite coaching topics, scholarship limits and foreign athletes, the follow-up to 1977's Champaign meet may be wide open.

Arizona State coach Baldy Castillo, whose Sun Devils rose from third in the Western Athletic Conference to first in the NCAA last year, gave his perspective: "I've always maintained that winning the national collegiate title in track was the hardest thing of all. because you're up against the best in the world—everybody's literally world class. It's an accomplishment for any team, no matter where your athletes are from."

Washington State's John Chaplin, whose Kenyan trio of Kimombwa, Joshua Kimeto and Henry Rono (along with Texas-El Paso's James Munyala) will make it tough for Oregon to bring its distance strength into play, says there wouldn't be such a "foreign athlete issue" without the current scholarship limits.

"I'd like to have more rides, too, and think we need more," says Chaplin. "But one thing about the limits—more schools have a shot at winning the NCAA.



But there are a host of "perennial contenders" and some new threats, too.

Castillo is not counting on a rerun. "We'll have good individuals again but not enough to repeat as NCAA champion." Along with 400 champ Herman Frazier, ASU must do without high jump champ Kyle Arney, who'll sit out the year to catch up on academic credits.

But with WAC sprint champs Tony Darden and Gerald Burl, NCAA long jump placer Dannie Jackson and lots of sprint and jump depth, the Sun Devils won't be helpless.

UTEP's Ted Banks also fears he lost too much. Most other coaches think the Miners, who won in 1975, are a prime threat.

Three-time steeplechase champion Munyala and discus defender Svein Walvik lead the Miners, along with hammer runner-up Emmitt Berry and 10,000 placer Kip Sirma. The Miners add middle distance runners Kenyan Peter Lemashon and countryman James Kipngetich, plus prize U.S. recruits Jerome Deal (sprints) and James Headley (discus).

BYU, SIXTH LAST YEAR, looks stronger yet. Coach Clarence Robison returns decathlon champ Tito Steiner, indoor three-mile champ Luis Hernandez, steeplechaser Henry Marsh

and weightmen Kenth Gardenkrans and Per Nilsson.

JC decathlon stars Dennis Miller and Karl Johanson and 7-2 prep jumper Rob Olson head BYU's recruit crop, and former WAC 800 champ Alan Schultz returns from a mission.

USC loses NCAA MVP Tom Andrews, but coach Vern Wolfe has back LJ champ Larry Doubley and hopes for an injury-free NCAA for World Cup sprinter Clancy Edwards.

Vaulter Russ Rogers, sprinter Joel Andrews, Pac-8 high jump champ Tim Walker, hurdler Rich Graybehl and the 800 trio of Rayfield Beaton, Lloyd Johnson and David Omwansa also return. James Sanford, a 46.6 in the 440 as a prep, joins up.

AT WSU, CHAPLIN returns all 25½ Cougar NCAA indoor title points and 42 of 46 outdoor points. In addition to Kimombwa, Rono and Kimeto, Ian Campbell (indoor TJ) holds an NCAA title; and all-around weightman Paul Buxton and vaulters Brian Worden and Dennis Dudley are other national point threats.

Newcomers include another Kenyan overlander, Joel Cheruviot, and two homegrown National Junior Olympic champs, Geoff Ramsey (400) and Keith Collins (decathlon).

Jim Bush's UCLA Bruins have a formidable "NCAA team"—all 35 points return. Foremost are Olympian hurdlers James Owen and Greg Foster, World Cup vault champ Mike Tully and NCAA TJ runner-up Willie Banks. The newcomers are dandy—JC champs Charlie Brown (17-4 vault) and David Laut (61-9 SP) and transfer Joe Phillips (7-2 HJ).

Along with Oregon, other perennial contenders hoping to regain the Top 10 are Vil-

lanova, Tennessee, Kansas and San Jose State.

OREGON COACH BILL Dellinger welcomes back discus thrower Dave Voorhees after an injury-redshirt year and has some class recruits including prep superstars Bill McChesney (distance) and shot putter Vince Goldsmith.

McChesney falls in with a brilliant young corps including sophs Rudy Chapa and Alberto Salazar, Don Clary, Larry Hurst and Mike Friton. Olympic 1,500 man Matt Centrowitz,

battling back from injuries, and vaulter Tom Hintnaus are other vets.

At Villanova, Jumbo Elliott returns his entire 3:04.87 mile relay team—NCAA 400 runner-up Tim Dale (45.5), Glenn Bogue, U.S. Junior 200 champ Derrick Harbour and 400 runner-up Keith Brown. Joining those four is prize 440 recruit Anthony Tufariello (46.0).

The Wildcats still have indoor champ/outdoor runner-up Mark Belger in the 800, plus

Don Paige and IC4A triple jump champ Anthony Cooper.

Tennessee goes for its 15th straight Southeastern Conference title, with former NCAA sprint champ Reggie Jones trying, after injuries, to regain his old form

With Ricci Gardner, 400 finalist Jerome Morgan, Lamar Preyor and Ronnie Harris, dash power is super; and recruits Antone Blair and Albertus Horne embellish it.

Past javelin champ Phil Olsen and TJer Paul Jordan also return.

Kansas is going for No. 12 in the Big Eight.

Coach Bob Timmons has Cliff Wiley, the U.S.-Soviet 100 winner, in the sprints, joined by Kevin Newell and David Blutcher; two-time Big Eight highs champ Anthony Coleman; two vault champs in Tad Scales and Mark Metzger, and three 7-2 or better high jumpers in Jay Reardon, Steve Rainbolt and "comebacking" Keith Guinn (7-4).

At San Jose State, Ernie Bullard builds around two-time TJ champ Ron Livers and 1976 highs winner Dedy Cooper. Sprinter Ron Whitaker, 17-6 vaulter Greg Woepse, 61-10 putter Bob Feuerbach and such frosh as 9.4 Alabama sprinter Marcus Washington and 4:08 miler Stan Ross are other reasons the Pacific Coast loop champs will contend nationally.

And "new" challengers? Try Maryland, Auburn, Alabama and Houston.

Maryland has been winning IC4A titles with powerful field events, but the Terps haven't really made a strong NCAA bid-until now.

Coach Frank Costello has lots of veterans; but Renaldo Nehemiah, who ran the prep highs in 12.9—yes, twelve-nine—is the reason they're excited in College Park.

NEHEMIAH JOINS EXCELLENT vets such as NCAA highs placer Greg Robertson and IC4A or Atlantic Coast champs Ian Pyka (shot), Dennis Ivory (LJ), Andre Lancaster (200)

and Brian Melly (HJ). Bob Calhoun (9.4) is another in a big recruiting crop. Auburn and now Alabama are building SEC challengers to Tennessee.

Two-time 100 champ Harvey Glance, indoor 400 king Willie Smith and 100 finalist Tony Easley keep Auburn superswift; and intermediate hurdler James Walker is back, too.

Alabama coach John Mitchell found the answers to a lot of problems at Essex JCnational champs Joseph Coombs (45.7 in the 400) and TJer Maxwell Peters (52-5¾). They join excellent veterans including NCAA 400 finalist Darrell Gatson.

Houston could be the sleeper of the bunch. Coach Tom Tellez, Jim Bush's old assistant,

brought along 8,000-plus decathlete Steve Alexander from UCLA to join current NCAA runner-up Rich Lacombe. With NCAA indoor 60 champ Greg Edmonds, SWC 400 champ Elrick Brown, Kevin Nance and some hot newcomers, the sprints are strong; and Houston has field strength with NCAA TJ placer Greg Caldwell and weightman Randy Coffman.

IF THE FOREGOING 15 ARE "favorites"—and that's a bunch—a lot more athletes, and teams, will make noise in 1978. Skimming the regions:

FAR WEST-In the Pac-8, all's relative; and if USC, UCLA, WSU and Oregon entertain national title hopes, the rest have their individual threats.

Washington has two-time hammer champ Scott Neilson, still just a junior, plus national team hurdler Robert Gaines. Pac-8 javelin champ Duncan Atwood is another top veteran.

California has added Olympian Quentin Wheeler, who won the intermediates for San Diego State two years ago. JC sprinter-jumper Mike McRae bolsters the squad.

Stanford returns James Lofton, NCAA LJ fourth-placer and a valuable sprinter, too. U.S. Junior sprint placer Gordon Banks and Alan Sheats add speed.

Oregon State hopes for "comebacks" by injured 400 ace Curtis Byrd and former Pac-8 champs Scott Fisher (vault) and John Okoro (LJ).

NCAA 200 placer Jerry Jordan and jumper Bruce Smith are top returnees; Australian distanceman Dave Smith and JC weightman Dave Fuller head the newcomers.

SAN JOSE DEFENDS its Pacific Coast Athletic Association title but may get a tussle from Long Beach State, which retains 18-2 Aussie vaulter Don Baird and lots of speed led by

league champ James Williams, NCAA 400 finalist Hubert Beasley and Canadian Olympian Brian Saunders. To them add transfer Jim Neidhart, a 65-0 shot putter. California-Irvine moves into the PCAA with AAU 1,500 champ Steve Scott and fellow

Division II winners Ralph Serna and Eric Hulst in distances and Mauricio Bardales in the decathlon. U.S.-Soviet junior LJ winner Lamont King joins up.

San Diego State has hurdler Rhan Sheffield and decathlete Scott Young, plus half-miler Brian Donohue. Sprinter David Russell and Ned Armour (25-51/2 LJ) are top recruits.

Fresno State has the U.S. Junior discus champ in Scott Endler and javelin-decathlon placer Dennis Morley, joined by prep vault star Billy Jack Pierce.

Hayward State is a threat to repeat as Division II champ, with national champ Dave Haber (HJ) and runners-up Marvin Wamble (LJ) and Mark Sawyer (HJ) all returning.

ROCKIES—Both UTEP and BYU wound up just behind A-State in the NCAA meet, but

the superb WAC showing was offset by the fact no other conference team scored.

New Mexico, fourth in the WAC, surely would have scored except that coach Bill Silverberg missed the entry-declaration deadline. He promises that won't happen again and returns a fine group of runners minus 400 great Mike Solomon but including WAC 800 champ Sammy Kipkurgat and 8:33 steeplechaser Harrison Koroso.

Arizona hopes for an injury comeback by 1976 sprint champ Dwayne Strozier, returns World Junior cross country champ Thom Hunt and WAC decathlon runner-up Steve Jacobs and adds a dandy group of distancemen and jumpers headed by prep miler Dirk Lakeman.

Utah has sprint power with WAC runner-up Doug Parrell and Senegal Olympians Barka Sy and Adama Fall and has added 60-0 JC putter Roy Martin. Colorado State returns 1:47.9 WAC 800 runner-up Don Frichtel. Wyoming recruited three of the nation's top preps in weightman Jared Finley, high jumper Mike White and long jumper Paul Bates.

IDAHO STATE GOES FOR its 11th Big Sky title in 15 years but has some graduation gaps. Idaho renews its challenge with hopes for an injury-free spring for Nigerian Olympian Ben Omiodale at 400 meters. Montana retains soph vault star Bill Halverson.

MIDLANDS-Oklahoma and Missouri hope to press Kansas in the Big Eight.

Missouri has a host of Big Eight champs in 7-4½ high jumper Nat Page, NCAA 400 placer Dele Udo, 26-plus long jumper Peppie Whitaker, shot putter Steve Clark and soph 800 flash Scott Clark. Hurdlers Godwin Obasogie, an NCAA placer; Dan Lavitt, U.S. Junior runner-up, and sprinter Ed Ofili are other veterans.

Oklahoma returns NCAA 200 champ William Snoddy and Drake Relays 800 surprise Randy Wilson, along with conference hurdles runners-up Colin Williams and Greg Byram.

Nebraska has NCAA indoor highs champ Jeff Lee, soph 400-800 star Scott Poehling and NCAA discus finalist Lee Kunz to make a bid. Iowa State hopes to crack the first division with league indoor mile champ Jeff Myers and 7-2 leaper Steve Kuehl.

KANSAS STATE HAS conference TJ champ Vince Parette and a good group of jumpers, plus 254 javelin thrower Frank Perbeck and vaulters Ron Nofsinger and Doug Knauss. Conference intermediate hurdles champ Chuck Roberts leads Oklahoma State.

Colorado, which returns 5,000-meter champ Mark Spilsbury, adds prep weight star Mark Sutherland and hopes for sprint help from footballer Melvin Johnson.

SOUTHWEST—Texas is going for its seventh straight SWC title and will be tough to dislodge, no matter how much of an "NCAA team" Houston builds.

Olympian Johnny Jones, second in the NCAA 100, leads Texas, and javelin thrower Porky Lyons and high jumper Terry Davenport are other SWC champs returning.

Rice has NCAA 100 placer Carlton Derrett and loads of hurdles power in SWC highs

champ Doc King and IH placers Curtis Isiah and Jesse James.

Texas A&M recruited 16-10 prep vaulter Randy Hall to go with sprint sensation Curtis Dickey and returning SWC champs Bill Blair (vault) and Steve Stewart (discus).

ARKANSAS LOST Niall O'Shaughnessy but has another Irish miler in Michael Lowther. Mark Collins in the 800 and 7-2 high jumper Bill Wimberley return at Baylor.

Southland Conference champ Arkansas State finally must do without three-time NCAA vault champ Earl Bell but still has sprinter Ed Preston and hurdler Donnie Taylor.

MIDWEST-Illinois lost all 30 of its seventh-place NCAA points, and coach Gary Wieneke can't hope to replace superstars Charlton Ehizuelen and Craig Virgin. But the Illini can defend their Big Ten title with such veterans as 800 champ Tim Smith and Steve Schellenbarger, 400 man Clif Hill and jumpers Rudy Reavis and Al Perryman.

Michigan returns all of its Big Ten champ 400 relay team, headed by 400 co-champ James

Grace. There's also a good middle distance group including Mike McGuire.

Indiana returns NCAA finalist Robert Cannon, who goes with Wayne Pate and James Ewald for jump power, and also has back Big Ten 400 co-champ Tim Peters.

Wisconsin has past NCAA placers in miler Steve Lacy and hurdler Mike Murei, plus Big Ten champs in sprinter Lawrence Johnson and shot-putter Jeff Braun.

Michigan State, third last year, lost miler Herb Lindsay but returns U.S. Junior 100

champ Randy Smith and Rick Flowers, 1-2 in the Big Ten 200.

Minnesota may be on the rise, returning almost everyone, headed by distanceman Steve Plasencia and sprinter Robert Frazier. Purdue also looks for improvement, returning NCAA HJ placer Noel Ruebel and Big Ten IH runner-up Ken Cammack. Ohio State returns distanceman Steve Crane. Iowa hopes to build around hurdles phenom Randy Elliott.

Southern Illinois will defend its Missouri Valley and Central Collegiate titles with national team sprinter Mike Kee and vaulters Tim Johnson and NCAA placer Gary Hunter.

Eastern Michigan defends its title in the Mid-American, where individual stars include NCAA indoor 1,000 champ Kelley Marsh of Ball State, 1,500 placer Tom Duits and steeplechaser Bob Lewis of Western Michigan, NCAA vault placer Roger Gilders and jumper Alfred Ogunfeyimi of Ohio, NCAA shot placer Bruno Pauletti of Central Michigan, 1,500 finalist Joe Dubina of Kent State and 800 man John Anich of Bowling Green.

SOUTH—If Auburn and Alabama intend to challenge Tennessee in the SEC, Florida can't be far behind. The Gators have two super recruits in prep discus recordman Dock

Luckie and U.S. Junior decathlon champ Vince O'Reilly.

If national team 400 vet Evis Jennings gets another year of eligibility, Mississippi State could make a move, too. Georgia lost Olympic high jumper James Barrineau but retains SEC placer William Breeding; Louisiana State returns dash standout ReVey Scott.

IN THE ATLANTIC Coast Conference, everyone concedes another Maryland runaway; but the Terps don't have all the talent. North Carolina has national team distanceman Ralph King and other ACC champs in Don Lockerbie (800) and Gary Hofstetter (10,000).

North Carolina State adds world class sprinter Albert Lamotey of Ghana to a veteran group including NCAA shot finalist Joe Hannah and triple jumper James Coleman.

Clemson has two NCAA placers in javelin third-placer Stu Ralph and discus sixth-placer Mike Columbus and adds 8:48 two-miler Tommy Frye. Duke's Robbie Perkins gets another year in the distances, joined by prep standout Brett Hoffman. Virginia has two U.S. Junior teamers in distanceman Chris Fox and hurdler Karl Williams.

Florida State just keeps getting faster. The Seminoles return super-sprinter Mike Roberson and add prep sensation Cyril Wyatt (9.2) and former JC champ Kevin Johnson. East Carolina has NCAA 200 placer Calvin Alston and semifinalist Otis Melvin.

MIDDLE TENNESSEE defends its Ohio Valley Conference title with even more jump power—two-time NCAA LJ placer Sheikh Faye and finalist John Do Doo were joined by the nation's top prep TJer, Greg (Dr. Leap) Artis.

Elsewhere in the OVC, East Tennessee returns 1,500 ace Ray Flynn and 26-plus long jumper Mike Halim; Western Kentucky retains distance strength, plus 20.9 sprinter Richard Hopkins and jumper Forrest Killebrew, and Austin Peay still has sprinter Johnny Williams.

Other Southern standouts include NCAA steeplechase placer Hilary Tuwei of Richmond, U.S. Junior TJ champ Larry Lowe of Georgia Tech, 400-meter placer Dennis Duckworth of Jackson State and world champion hurdler Edwin Moses of Morehouse.

**EAST—MARYLAND** and Villanova will dominate the IC4A, as is their custom; but things are lively throughout Eastern track. The Metropolitan Conference, for instance, may have the nation's best group of 800 men, including returning NCAA placers James DeRienzo of Fordham and Sam Summerville of Manhattan, plus Bill Martin of Iona.

NCAA sprint placer Calvin Dill of Seton Hall, veteran quarter-miler Kevin Price of Adelphi, hurdler Tim Hanlon and decathlete Joe Schneider of St. John's and Fairleigh Dickinson's amazing Franklin Jacobs, who stands 5-8 and high jumped 7-5 and 7-51/4 for second in the NCAA and AAU, are other standouts from in and around New York.

Distance power remains evident, headed by West Point's Curt Alitz and Providence's John Treacy. Northeastern retains 8:33 steeplechaser Bruce Bickford.

Penn State lost some stars but still has 1,500 man Mike Wyatt and 8:40.4 steeplechaser Bruce Baden, joined by U.S. Junior IH champ Paul Lankford.

Penn brings back NCAA sprint finalist James Brown and decathlete Dave Morey. East Coast Conference champ Bucknell has distance star George Buckheidt.

# No Need For World Marks To Create Excitement At Collegiate Showcase

The 56th NCAA championships are proof you don't need world records, double winners or a bunch of superhuman individual performances to attract attention.

There were none of those things at the University of Illinois last June. But there was still plenty of excitement as the showcase of collegiate track and field unraveled with Arizona State's "all-Americas" scratching their way to the coveted team crown.

Consider the following notes from Champaign:

—Auburn's Harvey Glance won the shootout with Texas freshman phenom Johnny Jones in the glamour event—100 meters—and became the first sprinter in a decade to win back-to-back 100 titles at the collegiate meet.

—UTAH STATE'S MARK ENYEART, Washington State's Samson Kimombwa, Southern California's Larry Doubley and San Jose State's Ron Livers provided NCAA meet records.

—Arkansas State's Earl Bell and Texas-El Paso's James Munyala each scored a "turkey" by capturing third straight outdoor firsts in their specialties. Washington State's Joshua Kimeto and Washington's Scott Neilson successfully defended titles also.

Four other defending champs failed to repeat in '77.

—Southern Cal's versatile Tom Andrews was named the meet's MVP after winning the 400 intermediate hurdles and running with two victorious Trojan relay teams. Washington State's Kimombwa was high-point man with 18.

So there was more than enough about which to shout.

But it was a couple of previously unheralded athletes who slipped quietly into Champaign and pulled the biggest surprises. One was a senior, the other a freshman.

Scott Dykehouse, Florida senior and walk-on who tried out for the team on a lark three years earlier, was the most improbable of the 19 who won individual gold medals during the

five-day meet.

The 6-0, 185-pounder was the eighth and final qualifier for the javelin finals, earning three more throws and a chance to place by a scant two inches. He moved up to seventh on his next-to-last throw.

**DYKEHOUSE** then led off the final round with a personal-record 258-5 and moved past Nebraska's Scott Sorchik into first place. The mark stood; and the Clermont, Fla., native was the 1977 NCAA champion.

"I was concentrating on having a good throw to move up one place so I could make all-America," said Scott, recalling

his thoughts just prior to the fateful toss. "Then it just happened." William Snoddy, Oklahoma freshman from Tulsa, provided the other major surprise. Running in lane one after qualifying for the finals by a mere .02 of a second, Snoddy hit the tape first in the 200 meters, defeating such notables as Texas' Jones, Arizona State's Tony Darden and Kansas' Clifford Wiley.

Snoddy, who very nearly passed up the meet because of a run of bad luck, was clocked in 20.48 running into a four m.p.h. headwind. Darden was second in 20.52.

"That's not a surprise; that's a shock," Snoddy exclaimed. "I didn't even want to come to this meet because my luck has been so bad. I even got hit by a discus a month ago."

ASU's triumph was something of a surprise—to everyone except the Sun Devils.

"They picked us for fifth or sixth here," said ASU coach Senon "Baldy" Castillo, who saw the realization of a 28-year dream, "but we felt we could win all along."

Nicknamed "Baldy's Blazers" after breaking one world and two collegiate relay records earlier in '77, the Sun Devils scored in nine of the 21 events and picked up two gold medals—Herman Frazier in the 400 and Kyle Arney, another walk-on, in the high jump.

ASU FINISHED WITH 64 points, matching Southern Cal's winning total in '76. Texas-El Paso took three firsts and finished second with 50 points. Southern Cal had the most gold

medals-four-and was third with 48 points.

Nine Sun Devils scored; and in contrast to the previous two NCAA outdoor champions (UTEP and USC), each of those 64 points was American born and bred. ASU became the first school since Tennessee in 1974 to win the outdoor crown without "foreign" points. And like Tennessee, the NCAA outdoor victory was the first in the school's history.

Frazier, a senior, led the charge with 14 points, anchoring two runner-up relay teams in addition to his 400 triumph. The prelaw honor student took the 400 in 45.51. Villanova's Tim Dale was second in 45.89. Auburn's Willie Smith, the 400 favorite, missed the final after pulling a muscle in the 400 relay finals.

ASU freshman Darden, a Philadelphia, Pa., native like Frazier, added 12 points with a

second-place finish behind Snoddy in the 200 and legs on both relay teams.

"WE KNEW HERMAN and Tony would come through for us, but you need help from your little people, too," Castillo said. Among the "little people" was 6-7 high jumper Arney, a junior who wasn't even recruited out of high school.

Arney cleared 7-4, 7-5 and 7-6 on his third attempt at each height, the final clearance

pushing him up to No. 3 on the all-time American list.

Fairleigh Dickinson's Franklin Jacobs, high jump runner-up at 7-5, was credited with a

world record of sorts. Just 5-8, Jacobs jumped 21 inches above his height.

Auburn's Glance, 20-year-old sophomore, became the first sprinter to win successive 100 titles since Nebraska's Charles Greene won three straight from 1965 through 1967. Harvey won the much-talked-about duel with Jones despite a painful groin injury.

Glance had won both the 100 and 200 as a freshman, but with the injury being aggravated during Thursday's long qualifying session, he failed to advance out of his first 200 heat. But like a champion, he came back Friday to run away from the field in the 100.

HARVEY TOOK FIRST IN 10.22. Jones, last out of the blocks, came back to take second

in 10.27, just nipping Seton Hall's Calvin Dill (20.28).

Southern Cal didn't have a finalist in either the 100 or 400, holding out for solid pushes in both relays. The sprint foursome of Tom Andrews, Mike Simmons, Joel Andrews and Clancy Edwards roared home in 39.56 to nip Arizona State (39.60). The Andrews brothers were joined by Lloyd Johnson and Rayfield Beaton in the 4x400 victory.

Utah State's Enyeart, '75 champion who passed up the '76 meet, gave the U.S. its last victory in an individual race before the Kenyans of Washington State and Texas-El Paso

took over in the distance events.

The Aggie junior threw away his game plan and led the 800, a tactician's race, virtually from start to finish, winning in 1:45.16. Villanova's Mark Belger, the NCAA indoor 880-yard champ, also came in under the old record, taking second in 1:45,85,

An American distance runner has not won at 1,500 meters or any race longer since 1974. The trend continued in '77 as a quartet of Kenyans—two each from WSU and UTEP dominated the 1,500, 5,000, 10,000 and 3,000 steeplechase.

Washington State's Kimombwa chopped more than 12 seconds off the NCAA record in the 10,000, winning in 28:10.27. Craig Virgin of host Illinois was a distant second, but his time of 28:22.46 was also under the old record of 28:22.66 by three-time NCAA champion

John Ngeno.

'It wasn't very nice to beat Virgin on his home track, but competition is competition—it isn't war," said Kimombwa, who was able to turn around Virgin's "home-track" advantage. "When the crowd was cheering for him (Virgin), I imagined it was for me."

UTEP's Munyala, NCAA steeplechase record holder, posted his "turkey" with an 8:29.51 clocking. "I wanted to run faster, but no one made me run faster," he said. As a senior in '78, Munyala could become only the second athlete to win four straight NCAA titles in the same event. The late Steve Prefontaine did it in the three-mile.

Cougar Kimeto won the 5,000 at 13:38.14 with Kimombwa second.

UTEP's Wilson Waigwa, previously NCAA runner-up in both the 1,500 meters and mile, took the 1,500 gold as a senior, running 3:39.89.

UCLA's James Owens, much the same as Waigwa, shed his bridesmaid tag by winning

the 110 high hurdles. The Bruin junior, runner-up as a freshman and sophomore, ran 13.46 with Arizona State's Rick Walker second.

USC's Tom Andrews won the intermediate hurdles in 49.48 with Mississippi State's Dennis Otono, a Nigerian, second. World record holder Edwin Moses of Morehouse College, the Division III champ, passed up the meet.

The jumping competition, except for the wind-plagued pole vault, was exceptional. USC's Doubley, just a freshman, and San Jose's Livers broke NCAA records in the long and triple jumps, respectively, with Arney coming close in the high jump.

Doubley, who began his career jumping over cars for quarter bets as a ninth grader, had two jumps of 26-11¾ although one was wind-aided. Illinois' Charlton Ehizuelen, a Nigerian who set the old record in 1975, was a close second at 26-11.

"I'm the tallest (6-8) long jumper in the world," said Doubley, who is also so near-sighted he has difficulty seeing the takeoff board. "The only disadvantage is that I have to have super stomach muscles to lift these long legs up."

Livers, also a '75 champion, won the triple jump at 55-3¼, with UCLA's Willie Banks a whisker back at 55-3½. Four jumpers bettered the old record (54-8¼).

Arkansas State's Bell, a senior, added excitement to the pole vault, even though swirling winds held his winning mark to 17-6. He matched the three straight vault titles won by Rice's Dave Roberts (1971-73), though his winning jumps the first two years had been much better—18-1 and a meet-record 18-1¼ in 1976.

"I had only one jump with a favorable wind," Bell said. "I was praying for good wind on that last jump. If it hadn't been blowing in the right direction, I wouldn't have been able to jump 17-6 or anything close to that."

In the weights, it was an even split between Americans and foreigners. Florida's Dykehouse (javelin) and Stanford's Terry Albritton (shot put) recorded firsts for the U.S.; while Washington's Neilson, a Canadian, and Brigham Young's Svein Walvik, a Norwegian, took the hammer and discus, respectively.

Albritton, a transfer from Hawaii hampered by injuries throughout his career, won with a 67-3½ effort. Neilson threw the hammer 228-4 and sophomore Walvik ousted defending champ Ralph Fruguglietti of Southern Cal with a discust oss of 198-11.

Brigham Young's Tito Steiner, an Argentinian, was crowned the NCAA's outstanding athlete after piling up 7,659 points in the decathlon. The 6-6, 195-pound freshman posted the top marks in the long jump, shot put and discus en route to the title.

## 'Field' Explosion By Hayward State **Dumps Anteaters For Championship**

Don't forget the word "field" when discussing the outdoor sport of track and field. Coach Jim Santos of Hayward State didn't when he assembled his squad for a shot at the 1977 NCAA Division II Track and Field Championships on the track at North Dakota State University in Fargo last Mav.

The Pioneers loaded up in the field events to capture the title with 66 points. Hayward left the running to others while amassing 54 points in five field events.

Hayward's field success was a contrast to California-Irvine's winning formula in 1976, which emphasized the long-distance talents of Ralph Serna and Steve Scott.

It was pretty much a California show in the 15th annual championships held at Division II's northernmost outpost. Defending champion California-Irvine was second with 58 points and Los Angeles State third with 51.

ADELPHI OF GARDEN CITY, New York, collected 46 points and Western Illinois 32 to round out the top five. Forty-five schools scored points.

Irvine came to Fargo on the heels of two straight Division II cross country titles to go with its 1976 track and field championships title.

And with proven point-getters like Serna, Scott, Mike Sabatino and Mauricio Bardales, the Anteaters were natural favorites to repeat.

But Hayward's performance shouldn't have been too surprising. The Pioneers finished fifth a year ago, and they had some firepower returning.

"A lot of people didn't know much about us," conceded Hayward coach Santos, "but I knew we had a great team even though we lost six of our nine dual meets."

Record-setting high jumper Dave Haber led Hayward's explosion in the field events. He reached 7-21/4 to erase the old mark by a quarter of an inch and had plenty of clearance over

runner-up Jeff Carruthers of Bloomsburg State who jumped

6-10 before succumbing.

Other records in the five-day meet were entered in the books by Irvine's Sabatino, who sailed 17-0 in the pole vault to beat his old standard by almost three inches, and by Anteater teammate Bardales in the decathlon.

HAYWARD'S concentration on the field events resulted in 14 points in the hammer throw, a dozen in the pole vault, 10 in the triple jump, 10 in the high jump and eight in the long jump.

And the decathlon success showed additional "field" talent. Bardales gave Irvine 10

points by winning the decathlon, first of the 21 events, with a record 7,621 points.

But the Anteaters had to share the first-day lead with Mt. St. Mary's of Emmitsburg, Maryland, which got a second place from Barry Stebbins and fifth from Tom Delmoor.

The decathlon was a two-man duel between Bardales and Stebbins, who was looking for his third straight title.

Bardales trailed Stebbins by 100 points after the first five events—and was happy to be that close because Bardales' best events were ahead. "I should win it," said Bardales. "This was my best first-day performance ever."

The Irvine junior proved to be a prophet, winning three of the five events the second day. He captured the discus, javelin and 1,500-meter run to go with a fourth-place tie in the 110-meter high hurdles and a share of sixth place in the pole vault.

On the first day, Bardales won the 400 meters and tied for first in the 100 meters. He set a decathlon javelin record of 221-5, while his worst finish in the 10-event program was when he placed 15th in the long jump.

WITH THE GLAMOROUS decathlon out of the way, Hayward went to work in Friday's finals. The Pioneers moved to a 10-point lead after seven events.

In the hammer, Mark Sawyer was second and Greg Blankenship third, giving Hayward 14 points. Marvin Wamble added eight points with a second in the long jump.

The Pioneers showed they had some speed when Roy Clark finished third in the 100-meter dash, good for six points.

Virginia State's John Christian won the sprint race in 10.62.

Heading into Saturday's windup, Hayward had 28 points, a comfortable margin over Southeast Louisiana with 18 and Irvine with 16.

Sabatino got the glory for Irvine with his record 17-0 pole vault, which was a full foot higher than the best vault of the runner-up; but Hayward's Darryl Robinson and Bob Olson stole some of the thunder by placing second and fourth, respectively. So depth outscored individual brilliance, 12-10.

JOHN LEGRANDE FOLLOWED by winning the triple jump, and Haber flew over the high jump bar in record style to give Hayward 20 additional points.

That completed Hayward's harvest in the field events. But the Pioneers had something left to add to their championship effort.

Their 400-meter relay team picked up six points with third place behind Virginia State (40.60) and Adelphi. That, said coach Santos, was a bonus.

"We were seventh going into the last exchange, and our anchorman, Calvin Corker, brought us up to third," said Santos.

With 19 events completed, Hayward led Irvine's Anteaters, 66-56, and the Pioneers were out of potential point-getters going into the last two events—the 5,000 meter run and the 1,600-meter relay.

**IRVINE HAD TWO RUNNERS** in the 5,000; but only Serna scored, placing fifth for two points. California-Riverside's Mike Garcia broke the tape first in 14:47.2.

In the final event, Irvine needed second place to tie and first to win. But the Anteaters, crippled by an injury to their regular anchorman, finished a struggling last in the 1,600meter relay and were forced to give up the crown.

Scott was the meet's outstanding individual. The Irvine distance star, fresh from a victory over world-class runner Filbert Bayi in the 1,500 meters, was the only double winner. He captured the 1,500 and 800 titles.

Mike Bollmann of North Dakota State gave the home folks something about which to cheer when he pushed Scott to the tape in the 1,500.

Scott won in 3:47.69—about eight seconds slower than his previous best time and not fast enough to replace his Division II record which stands at 3:46.36.

Scott nipped Northeast Missouri's Dan Futrell by 14-hundredths of a second in the 800 with a time of 1:51.21, here again off a record pace.

The 1,500 crown was the third straight victory in the event for Scott and, along with the

800 win, gave him four Division II titles in three years.

Five athletes gained repeat titles—Scott, 1,500 meters; Sabatino, pole vault; Haber, high jump (his third); Pete Heesen of East Stroudsburg, Pa., 3,000-meter steeplechase, and hammer thrower Wayne Durrigan of Southern Connecticut.

Adelphi won its second straight 1,600-meter relay with three of the four runners from the 1976 quartet back for the encore.

Besides Stebbins in the decathlon, three other defenders failed to repeat.

Ed Hatch of Eastern Illinois did not place in the 400 meters, and 800-meter winner William Dabney of Adelphi finished fifth.

Triple jump champion Peter Pratt of Mankato (Minn.) State fouled in his three final attempts, leaving the title to Hayward's LeGrande.

JEFF RUSSELL OF CAL Poly Pomona won the javelin, edging Bob Myers of Chico State by seven inches with a toss of 243-7.

In the discus, Bill Edwards of Western Illinois finished second to Colin Sutherland of Los Angeles State. It ended a remarkable career for Edwards, who finished sixth in 1974, first in 1975 and second in '76.

Donald Dykes of Southeast Louisiana was an inch shy of the NCAA Division II long jump record when he reached 25-11.

First in the shot put went to Indiana Central's Dave Wallman at 57-31/2, though he was pushed closely by Marcus Gordien of Cal Poly Pomona.

Dwayne Wall of Western Illinois nipped Southeast Missouri's Eric Hornsby by threehundredths of a second to win the 200-meter dash.

Adelphi finished 1-2 in the 400, with Mel Richardson nipping teammate Kevin Price in 47.31 seconds. Price had placed third in last season's race.

CENTRAL MISSOURI'S Rick Clear outlasted the 10,000-meter field, but as in so many of the 1977 events was well off a record clocking.

Virginia State's fine crop of sprinters took the 400-meter relay, using 100 winner Christian for the anchor leg.

Ricky Davenport of Southern (Baton Rouge) missed the 110-meter high hurdles record by two-hundredths of a second with his time of 13.82. But he stepped up from his '76 performance when he was fifth to cross the finish.

The 400-meter intermediate hurdles crown went to Sam Turner of Los Angeles State.

Hayward's triumph was a victory for pure amateur athletics.

"We are a nonscholarship school in a nonscholarship conference," said coach Santos. "Our athletes get no financial assistance."

And Santos displayed his versatility. Now in his fifth year as the Pioneers' men's coach, he guided the Hayward women's track team to the national title in 1972.

The Division II meet moves to Western Illinois in 1978.

## Southern Defends Title, But Moses Grabs Attention In All-America Bid

Someone mentioned that Edwin Moses got an Olympic gold medal before he received his first all-America certificate—an award that accompanies an NCAA championship.

But pick up all-America certificates he did—three of them, in fact—at the fourth annual NCAA Division III Track and Field Championships, where Southern University at New Orleans routinely picked up its third title.

Less than a year before the Division III meet at Calvin College in Grand Rapids, Michigan, Moses was as unknown as his school, Morehouse of Atlanta, where prior to the 1976 track season, Moses' grade point average in physics and mechanical engineering was more noteworthy than his lap times.

**BUT ALL OF THAT CHANGED** in Montreal when he won his gold medal with a world record performance in the 400-meter intermediate hurdles, then joined former Penn State hurdler Mike Shine in a victory lap that long will outlive Moses' records.

Moses came to the Division III meet as the leading qualifier in three events—the 400 intermediate hurdles, the 110 high hurdles and the hurdleless, open 400 meters.

But he also came looking for his first all-America certificates.

When he fell in the semifinal round of the intermediates in the 1976 NCAA Division III meet in Chicago, he had forfeited his pre-Olympic shot at all-America recognition.

Moses also came to Grand Rapids after a week-long period of inactivity because of the flu. That fact, plus the impact of 90-degree weather, led Moses to bypass the open 400 competition. Nonetheless, he awed spectators and competitors alike as he skimmed to records in winning both hurdles events.

Moses lowered the Division III record in the intermediate hurdles three times, finally settling for 49.59, nearly two seconds better than the previous mark set in 1976 by Mark

Stebbins of Rochester Institute of Technology.

Stebbins really didn't have much of a chance of defending his title and was runner-up to Moses in 52.06.

In the high hurdles, an event Moses had started running only weeks before the Division III meet, he took the record down three times.

HIS BEST time for the book was 13.72, 0.70 faster than three-time national champion Roger Retherford of Otterbein had done in 1976 and 0.66 faster than 1977 runner-up Charles Paschke of Baldwin-Wallace.

In each of his hurdles races,

has covered the Olympics at Montreal, major college football and Olympic swimming and track trials. Moses was running virtually unchallenged. That wasn't the case when it was the Olympian's turn in the 1,600-meter relay, however.

Moses' strong anchor runs had gotten Morehouse's 4 x 400 squad into the finals of the 'elay, where he got the baton well after all the other teams had made their last exchanges in

relay, where he got the baton well after all the other teams had made their last exchanges in the final event of the meet.

But Moses closed the meet with a flourish, overtaking runners from Fort Valley State and

But Moses closed the meet with a flourish, overtaking runners from Fort Valley State and Gettysburg as easily as he had stepped over the hurdles. At the finish line, he nearly caught one of those sprinting speedsters from Southern University and unofficially was timed at 44-flat for his anchor leg.

For comparison, open 400 winner V.J. Rempel of Stanislaus State ran only 46.93 in his championship performance.

BY FINISHING IN FRONT of Moses in the relay, Southern picked up six third-place points and its third consecutive national championship.

Southern was runner-up in the inaugural Division III meet in 1974.

SUNO finished with 50 points, all of them coming from runs of 400 meters or less. California schools took three of the next five positions, with Occidental second at 47 points, Stanislaus third with 32 and Humboldt State sixth with 20.

Filling out the top six were Ashland with 25 points, Moses . . . er, Morehouse with 24 and Lowell, which equalled Humboldt's 20-point total.

SUNO got all of its points from sprinters.

Four-time national champion Joe Franklin was shut out in his bid for a third successive sweep of the 100- and 200-meter titles, but he did join teammates Lloyd Langford and Gerald Robinson in a 2-3-5 performance in the 100.

As an encore, he ran anchor behind Langford, Clyde Rice and Robinson to set a meet record of 40.71 in the 400-meter relay.

**PAUL BROWN OF WESTMONT** took Franklin's 100-meter crown with a record-setting 10.32. Franklin, who set the former mark of 10.49 in Chicago last season, also bettered the previous standard with a 10.40.

Robinson and Langford went 1-2 in the 200, while Franklin finished seventh despite a painful cyst on the back of his left leg.

SUNO got its other points from the 1,600-meter relay team.

Runner-up Occidental also won three events, with Tom Colley leading the 1,500 in 3:46.94 and Danny Williams topping the triple jump at 49-8½.

Rudy Beaver set a Division III national record with a 6-11 high jump, three inches over his previous personal best.

IN ADDITION TO THE MEET marks established by Moses, the SUNO relay quartet, Brown and Beaver, other national standards for Division III tumbled in the mile relay, steeplechase, hammer throw and decathlon.

Stanislaus State's Ian Seale, Russ Nelson, 400 winner Rempel and Dennis Hope combined for a 3:10.67 in the 4 x 400 relay, more than two seconds faster than SUNO had done it in 1975 and nearly two seconds faster than 1977 runner-up Ashland.

The 3,000-meter steeplechase not only provided a meet record but one of the most exciting races of the championship week.

The finals were a two-man show between Gordon Innes, a 23-year-old engineering student from Humboldt, and Pat Weiler, a junior at Aquinas College in Grand Rapids.

Weiler had been the host area's leading candidate for a national championship; but Innes, a veteran who had been a Division I all-America at UCLA before transferring to Humboldt, led the Michigan runner for most of the race.

Weiler forced himself into the lead after the final water jump, but the experienced Innes pushed back in front at the tape to win in 8:48.33, 0.27 ahead of Weiler.

The Division III record had been 8:57.67, set in 1976 by Boston State's Mark Duggan. Like the steeplechase, another event new to Grand Rapids area spectators—the hammer throw—proved to be one of the most stimulating competitions of the week.

NATIONAL DIVISION III CHAMPIONSHIPS

Four throwers—Mark Linscheid and Bill Haskell of Lowell, Ed Healy of Fitchburg State and Len Laub of Brandeis—broke the national record of 183-7 set in 1976 by Thomas Lowell of Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute.

And they took turns breaking it a total of eight different times!

Linscheid, an 18-year-old freshman from Ireland who at 6-2 and 190 pounds appeared as a David among the Goliaths, won the event with a best throw of 190-7.

While the repeated record breaking may have impressed the spectators, it was the throwers' genuine camaraderie, an outward showing of "I've got the record now, but I hope you throw farther because this thing is fun" which really endeared the hammer throw competition to its first-time viewers.

Endearing himself to everyone was repeat decathlon winner Tony Hale of Fisk. Hale, who was as personable as Moses was serene, won five of the 10 events and, with personal records in two of the last three segments—the pole vault and 1,500—raised his own and the Division III national record to 7,500 points.

For many defending champions, however, it was not an outstanding meet.

Stebbins was runner-up in the intermediate hurdles; Franklin couldn't repeat in the sprints, and Chris Horton of Brandeis was third in the 1,500.

In the pole vault, Kevin French of Westmont could do no better than fourth, and Domenic Finelli of Brandeis was 10th in the 5,000 meters.

And while Barry King of Ashland won his fourth consecutive championship in the 800, a teammate who trotted around the last turn and down part of the final straightaway at the outside edge of the track nearly cost the king his crown.

Meet officials ruled, however, that the overexuberant teammate didn't provide King with any help in winning the 800-meter race and therefore allowed King to step to the top of the victory platform for the fourth year in a row.

Crossing the finish line in the two longest events were Dale Kramer of Carleton in the 5,000 and Frank Richardson of MIT in an amazing effort in the 10,000 meters in which he lapped all but five of the other competitors.

Capturing titles for field events were Todd Wunderlich of Slippery Rock in the pole vault, horizontal leaper Keith Journey of Westminister (Mo.) in the long jump, Robert Grimm of St. Thomas in the discus, Scott Haverty of Fitchburg State in the javelin and Bill Versen of Carthage in the shot put.

And Calvin College, voted an all-America-caliber performance as host school, will have a chance to repeat when the championships meet returns in 1978.

# Jayhawks Lead University Entries; PCC Dominates Field For Club Title

Nine United States Track and Field Federation records were established in the 1977 championships in Wichita, Kansas, but only one came in the men's events. Seven others were set in the women's competition, with another in junior action.

The Pacific Coast Club continued its domination of the club title, taking top honors with 58 points over the University of Chicago Track Club and its 39 points.

PCC athletes captured titles in three field events. Dan Ripley bested a vault contingent that included Arkansas State's Earl Bell and UCLA's Mike Tully. Mac Wilkins had a comfortable edge in the discus throw, placing third in the shot put won by teammate Al Feuerbach. Wilkins was a repeat winner; Feuerbach was shot put runner-up in '76.

In University men's competition, Kansas ran away with the title by amassing 73 points to Rice University's 31. Clifford Wiley dashed to victory at both 100 and 200 meters, while Tommy McCall was the best runner over the 800-meter distance.

Dwight Stones, competing for the Oasis Track Club, bettered his own standard in the high jump, clearing 7-41/4 to surpass 7-31/2—his record mark set in 1973.

## Kenyan Cougars Spearhead Narrow Title Victory Over Favored Miners

The University of Texas-El Paso's reign over the National Collegiate Indoor Track and Field Championships, born in the jubilation of a one-point victory in 1974, died in the agony of a half-point defeat in 1977.

Washington State amassed 25½ points in the 13th edition at Detroit's Cobo Hall, half a loaf more than the favored Miners.

The East's perennial challenger, Villanova, finished third with 21 points.

Ironically, UTEP's finest moment of the two-day meet also served as its funeral. While Wilson Waigwa was sprinting to snap the mile tape in 3:58.97, Kenyan countryman Henry Rono was carrying the maroon and gray of Washington State to a third-place finish.

THOSE THREE POINTS WERE enough to assure the Cougars' first NCAA title, providing sufficient cushion to offset the expected high jump triumph by UTEP's Greg Joy.

Rono, a 25-year-old freshman from the Kipchoge Keino country of Kenya's Rift Valley, was earning those valuable points just one hour after capturing the two-mile run in the meet-record time of 8:24.83. It seemed that Rono might have been unwise in sprinting for a record, since runner-up Tony Staynings of Western Kentucky was far back, but Rono proved that his stamina is virtually unlimited. In November, the 5-7, 140-pounder had been an unchallenged winner of the NCAA cross country title.

Two other Kenyans recommended to Washington State coach John Chaplin by Keino, junior Josh Kimeto and sophomore Samson Kimombwa, also contributed valuable points to the Cougars' championship. Kimeto, the pacesetter for Rono through the first mile in 4:14.8, eventually placed third in the two mile. Kimombwa, the leader through much of the three-mile run on Friday, finished second to Mexican Luis Hernandez of Brigham Young.

While the Kenyans accepted their achievements stoically, another Cougar proved most

Bob Fachet covers ice hockey and track and field for The Washington Post, noting that the two assignments can produce tight travel schedules during the overlapping season of January to May.

As a perfect example, he cites one spring's Stanley Cup-IC4A agenda that had him in Buffalo for hockey on Thursday, at Williamsburg, Va., for track on Friday and Saturday and into Philadelphia for more hockey action on Sunday.

Fachet claims he got lucky one year while covering the NCAA indoor championships at

Cobo Hall in Detroit. The Washington Capitals just happened to be playing at nearby Olympia Stadium. demonstrative. Freshman Ian Campbell of Australia, bounding 54-3 on his third attempt in the triple jump, leaped ecstatically from the pit and embraced all who were within range of his excitement.

A HALF-POINT victory spotlights many heroes. One Cougar, Paul Buxton of Great Britain, hardly could have known at 10:30 Friday morning, at Bowen Fieldhouse in Ypsilanti, the importance that would attach to his fourth-place finish in the 35-pound weight throwing competition.

The last of Washington State's point producers, little

Brian Worden cleared 17 feet in the pole vault for the first time in competition Friday and thus earned a spot in Saturday's seven-man final. Unable to match that effort, Worden nevertheless went high enough, 16-6, to share fourth place with Tad Scales of Kansas; and his 1½-point contribution was just enough to assure a victory party.

Worden was the only American to score for Washington State, and the abundance of foreign medal winners reopened that old wound suffered by U.S. coaches who lack imports from abroad. Oddly, the first major outcry came in 1974, the year Texas-El Paso began its victory string with a one-point decision over Colorado. That time, foreigners won seven of 15 individual events; this year their total achieved a majority, nine.

Waigwa, Rono and Hernandez continued the foreign domination of distance events. In the last four years, only miler Tony Waldrop of North Carolina, in 1974, has been a genuine all-America distance champion.

ALL THREE MEET RECORDS were produced by foreign athletes. Besides Rono, who clipped more than six seconds off the two-mile mark of Western Kentucky's Nick Rose, Canada's Joy boosted the high jump standard to 7-31/4; and UTEP's all-Kenyan distance-medley relay quartet was clocked in 9:43.11, bettering Manhattan's 1973 mark.

Actually, Nat Page of Missouri will share the high jump record with Joy; but the Olympic silver medalist was the winner on the basis of fewer misses. Joy also was the champion in 1975, then Dwight Stones of Long Beach State prevailed last year at 7-3.

James Munyala, UTEP's anchor man, overhauled Villanova's Phil Kane on the final turn of the distance-medley to virtually destroy the Wildcats' once bright hopes for the team title. Kane looked back several times on the final lap, then he didn't need to bother, for Munyala had sailed past. A key factor in UTEP's triumph was the 2:56.0 three-quarter mile leg by Frank Munene. Fred Ongaga ran the half, Paul Njoroge the quarter.

AFTER FOREIGN ATHLETES HAD won the first four events, an American finally broke through. His name? England. That was Gary England of Alabama, whose toss of 63-34 was the shortest to win the shot put since 1968.

Before England proved there always will be an American winner, championships were spread among representatives of Canada, Mexico, Nigeria and Australia.

Scott Neilson of Washington, the NCAA hammer champion in 1976, heaved the 35-pound weight 68-10½ to settle the meet's first title. The Canadian also proved a lift to neighboring Washington State's team challenge, because he unseated defender Emmitt Berry of Texas-El Paso, who earned third place by only five inches over Buxton.

Hernandez became the second winner in the four years that the three-mile run has been contested at Cobo. In the three previous races, graduated John Ngeno of Washington State was always the first to the tape.

CHARLTON EHIZUELEN, Illinois' superb horizontal jumper from Nigeria, joined UTEP's distance-medley quartet as successful defenders by capturing the long jump at 25-84. Ehizuelen then placed third behind Campbell in the triple jump, an event in which the competitors were hampered by a rule preventing them from beginning their runs on the banked track in Cobo Hall.

Don Baird of Long Beach State ended Earl Bell's two-year reign of the pole vault, winning on fewer misses at 17-4. Both the balding Australian and the favored Arkansas Stater passed at 17-8 and failed at a meet-record 18-1.

Bell lost because of an early miss at 17-1/4.

Michael Solomon, who represented Trinidad and Tobago in the 1976 Olympics, matched Rono and Ehizuelen in collecting gold and bronze medals. The New Mexico senior held off Adelphi's Kevin Price to win the 600 in 1:10.0, after placing third in the 440.

Willie Smith of Auburn captured the quarter in 48.28, one-tenth of a second in front of Howard's Richard Massey, the winner of the second section.

There were two big surprises on the straightaway, as a couple of long-forgotten guys named Greg and Jeff carried off championships that seemed reserved for others.

Greg Edmond of Houston, a Texas high school phenom who gave up running in 1974

because of disillusionment, was persuaded to resume training this year by Cougar coach Tom Tellez; and it proved a satisfying decision. Edmond captured the 60-yard dash in an amazing 6.12, leaving Olympic gold medalist and defending champion Harvey Glance of Auburn soundly beaten in 6.18

Jeff Lee of Nebraska, whose lengthy absence from track following knee surgery approached the three-year hiatus of Edmond, upset outdoor hurdles king Dedy Cooper of San Jose State in the 60-yard barrier event. Lee, a junior football player, hadn't hurdled since his senior year at Racine, Wis., High School; and Track and Field News labeled him "an obscure unknown." But he followed up his Big Eight hurdles sweep with a 7.17 clocking at Cobo. Cooper, closing fast, came up a hundredth of a second shy.

Kelley Marsh of Ball State wasn't a household name, either; but he woke up a lot of people with a runaway 2:07.89 success in the 1,000. It was only the second trip over boards for the freshman whose effort ended Villanova's championship dreams, the Wildcats' Don

Paige placing second by almost 15 yards.

Mark Belger was Villanova's only winner, taking the 880 in 1:49.17. Belger, the 1,000 king in 1976, ran away from Mark Enyeart of Utah State, the man whose closing lunge at Eugene had cost Belger an Olympic 800-meter berth.

Randy Wilson's 1:50.3 anchor half mile enabled Oklahoma to overcome Illinois' lead and win the two-mile relay in 7:30.96. An excellent 1:50.1 third leg by Jeff Jirele was the

high point for the Illini quartet.

Massey, the split-section victim of the 440 on Friday, suffered through a not-so-instant replay the next afternoon. Massey charged through the anchor quarter of the mile relay in 47.9 to run down Villanova's Tim Dale.

But Kansas, led by Cliff Wiley's third leg of 47.8, took the second heat in 3:15.61, and Howard was shunted to second in the overall standing.

## Essex Enjoys Championship Role; Three Records Spark Repeat Victory

Essex County College of Newark, New Jersey, won its second consecutive track and field championship at the 37th running of the NJCAA Track and Field Championships at Pasadena, Texas. Essex County College far outdistanced runner-up Mesa Community College of Mesa, Arizona, bridesmaid at the meet a second straight year.

Four meet records were broken during the 1977 championships.

It was a night for record breaking as seven state meet standards were set, San Jose equaled its meet and national record in the 440 relay and Santa Monica's Houston McTear tied the fastest electric-timed 100 meters in the world this year with a 10.18.

Bakersfield's Memorial Stadium was the site, and 5,000 fans enjoyed the show which included the first ever win by Palomar in the 27-year history of the meet.

New state marks in field events came from Chaffey's Marcus Jennings with a 25-9¼ long jump, Palomar's Luc Laperriere at 266-8 in the javelin, Charles Brown of El Camino who won the pole vault from Steve Oravetz of West Valley on the miss rule at 16-11¾ and San Jose's Dave Laut with a 60-10¾ shot put.

San Jose ran 39.81 in the 440 relay to match the mark its quartet set in '76.

Houston McTear won the outstanding athlete trophy for his 100-meter show, which was hand-timed in 10.0.
