

ON THE COVER: Fairleigh Dickinson-Teaneck high jumper Franklin Jacobs. Only a junior, the 5-8 jumper has cleared 231/4 inches over his head, which is a world record. One of 11 children in his Paterson, New Jersey, family, he has 28 collegiate titles to his credit, including the NCAA outdoor championships (7-3), a meet record in the indoor championships (7-5) and a world indoor record (later broken) in the Millrose Games (7-71/4). Perhaps the most amazing facet of Jacobs' success story is the fact that he did not compete until his senior vear at Paterson Eastside High School. In addition to NCAA crowns, he has set his sights for a gold medal at the 1980 Olympic Games in Moscow, Jacobs is a 3.0 student majoring in business and hopes one day to have his own business.

Cougars Aim For The Championship With The Washington State Wonder

The 1978 track season began with the first 5,000-meter world record ever set in April and the first record of any kind in a collegiate dual competition in 11 years, as Washington State's Henry Rono got off to an eye-popping start with his 13:08.4 against California in Berkeley.

But it turned out that, like the season, Rono was just coming into bloom. A month later he broke the world steeplechase record with 8:05.4, becoming the first man in history to hold both the 5,000 and steeplechase records. And following the collegiate season, he brought down two more world marks with 27:22.5 in the 10.000 and 7:32.1 in the 3.000 meters

WHEN IT WAS OVER, Rono had overshadowed everyone and everything. Track experts were left to debate whether the Kenyan star was the best ever and what he might offer for an encore in 1979.

Washington State coach John Chaplin is making his thoughts on that subject known early. After threatening to triple Rono in the 5,000, 10,000 and steeplechase in the NCAA Track and Field Championships last year, Chaplin is promising to do exactly that this spring when the 1979 championships unfold at Illinois.

"I told Henry long before anyone else even considered it that he could run under 8:00, 13:00 and 27:00," Chaplin said. "He doesn't think the records he's run so far reflect his potential, and neither do I.

"I want him to try the NCAA triple. It's not an Olympic year or a Commonwealth year...I want it to be my year. I want everyone to know and fear it."


Chaplin's strategy will be debated but not his goal. Washington State was deprived of a run at the NCAA title last year by illness and injuries; but given

good fortune in those areas, the Cougars will be very tough to beat at nationals.

Chances are that the battle will be between the Cougars and the top four from 1978—defending champion Southern California, UCLA, Texas-El Paso and Oregon.

OTHERS such as Washington, Villanova, Auburn, Arizona State, Maryland and Brigham Young have enough big point potential to battle for the top ten but not enough to make a run for the top.

There will be no fewer than 10 defending cham-

pions in the NCAA field this spring, and all the contenders are represented. Washington State has Rono in the steeplechase, USC has Billy Mullins in the 400, UCLA has Dave Laut in the shot put and Greg Foster in the high hurdles, Texas-El Paso has Peter Lemashon in the 800 and Mike Musyoki in the 10,000 and Oregon has Rudy Chapa in the 5,000.

Not to be overlooked are hammer thrower Scott Neilson of Washington, after his fourth title; Fairleigh Dickinson high jumper Franklin Jacobs; 1977 champ Kyle Arney of Arizona State, and Auburn intermediate hurdler James Walker.

IN THE SPRINTS, 1977 champs Harvey Glance of Auburn in the 100 and William Snoddy of Oklahoma in the 200 won't have Southern California's Clancy Edwards to contend with. Samson Kimombwa of Washington State hopes to regain his 10,000 title. Larry Doubley of USC is back in the long jump, and Tito Steiner of Brigham Young hopes to regain his decathlon crown.

Washington State's hopes center on Rono, but they don't end there. Kimombwa and Joel Cheruiyot figure in the distances. If Ian Campbell returns to school, he will be a potential triple jump winner at 55-814; and Paul Buxton could be

second in the hammer throw.

Gene Lorenzen (259-7) should score in the javelin; and Chaplin has hope for Gerald Pawrodikromo (1:47.5) in the 800, Brian Worden (17-31/4) in the pole vault,

Jim Jesernig (198-1) in the hammer and possibly some sprint points.

USC IS STRONG, as always, in the sprints. It has Kevin Williams (10.34), Joel Andrews (10.22), James Sanford (20.24) and Mullins (45.03) to go with awesome relays. Doubley won the '77 long jump with a 26-11% leap, and David Omwansa (3:39.5) is a potential scorer in the 1,500. The Trojans hope for points out of newcomer Ken Hayes (26-234) in the long jump.

UCLA coach Jim Bush is burning for the title this year, believing a questionable

relay disqualification deprived the Bruins of winning in Eugene.

Veteran Charles Brown and freshman Anthony Curran give UCLA two 17-foot vaulters, while Dwayne Joseph placed in the high jump last year (7-2). Donn Thompson figures in the 400 (45.65) this season after concentrating on the relay in '78. The Bruins landed junior college discus thrower Marcus Gordien (202-3) and boast others, including Conrad Suhr and Larry Goldston.

Texas-El Paso has big point potential in discus thrower Svein Walvik (204-9), shot putter Hans Almstrom (65-8), hammer thrower Thommie Sjoholm (216-7) and distance runner Rodolfo Gomez. The Miners also have landed prizes in 56-5 triple jumper Keith Connor and 220-foot hammer thrower Richard Olsen.

OREGON, FOURTH at home last year after a 5,000 win from Chapa and a surprising second in the pole vault from Tom Hintnaus, gets a boost from Ray Burton, third in the discus in 1977. Shot putter Jeff Stover (64-91/2), point winners Don Clary in the steeple and John McArdle in the hammer, distance runner Alberto Salazar and talented sprinter Don Coleman give the Ducks hope.

Six of the top ten teams could come from the expanded Pacific-10 Conference. Washington will make noise; it has potential winners in pole vaulter Steve Oravetz (17-8½), javelin thrower Tom Sinclair (259-0) and Neilson (238-7). Arizona State has high jumper Arney (7-6) back and Tony Darden (45.60) in the quarter, long jumper Dannie Jackson, high hurdler Kerry Bethel and the relays.

Villanova doesn't get the distance notice that traditionally strong Oregon has enjoyed for years. But the Wildcats' record at 1,500 is much better and will improve this year, with potential winners in Sydney Maree (3:38.9) and Don Paige (3:38.7). Anthony Tufariello was third in the 800 last year; triple jumper Nate Cooper, quarter-miler Tim Dale and 1,500 man Dean Childs boast point potential. And Villanova has three-quarters of its championship mile-relay team returning.

Auburn's Glance is a factor in both the 100 (10.11) and the 200 (20.47). Walker is a favorite in the intermediates, while Tony Easley figures in the sprints and John Tuttle in the 1,500. Auburn will be heard from in the sprint relay.

Maryland has a prize in high hurdler Renaldo Nehemiah. He finished second as a freshman but forced UCLA's Foster to run an American record to win, and he came within a hundredth of a second of that this summer (13.23). The Terps have long jumper Bob Calhoun, point potential in the short relay, Greg Robertson in the highs, Ian Pyka in the shot put and Dennis Ivory in the long jump.

Brigham Young could get additional points in the decathlon from Dennis Miller. Kim Nielson should place in the high jump, as he did last year (7-4). Luis Hernandez is a talented distance runner. Tapio Kuusela will be a factor in the

hammer and Jari Keihas could be heard from in the javelin throw.

SCANNING THE FIELD BY EVENT:

100 METERS-Glance is the favorite: but Curtis Dickey of Texas A&M equaled Glance's 10.11, finished ahead of him last year and will run fewer events this year. Michael Kee of Southern Illinois placed last year and has a 10.26, Dwayne Strozier of Arizona has a 10.27, Johnny Jones of Texas 10.23, Andrews of Southern Cal 10.22 and Andrew Banks of Oregon 10.22. Coleman of Oregon has a 10.11, and Mel Lattany of Georgia has a 10.09.

Among those with sub-10.4s are Mike Roberson of Florida State, Willie Turner of Louisiana State, Jesse Williams of Richmond, Carlton Derrett of Rice, Easley of Auburn and Williams of Southern Cal. If sensational Houston McTear surfaces

at a four year school, Long Beach State is the best bet.

200 METERS-Snoddy of Oklahoma, winner in 1977 and second last year, is the favorite with a 20.28. Sanford of USC will be formidable, and Glance is in the picture. Strozier of Arizona has a 20.43, Larry Myricks of Mississippi College a 20.44 and Darden of Arizona State 20.48. Other strong candidates include Jones of Texas, '78 placer Calvin Alston of East Carolina, LaMonte King of California-Irvine, Gerald Burl of Arizona State, ReVey Scott of Louisiana State, Roberson of Florida State, Carl Francis of Cornell and Georges Kablan of Washington State.

400 METERS-Mullins leads the field with 45.03. The closest time is the 45.23 by Kasheef Hassan of Oregon State. But the chief threats must include Darden of Arizona State (45.60), Thompson of UCLA (45.65), '78 placer Joseph Coombs of Alabama (45.70), Glen Cohen of Boston (45.49), Dale of Villanova (45.64), Dele Udo of Missouri, Walter McCoy of Florida State, Hamil Grimes of Kentucky State, Leslie Kerr of Texas A&M and Mullins' USC teammate Sanford.

800 METERS-Lemashon of Texas-El Paso won't surprise anyone this year as he did last year. The closest mark to his 1:45.5 is the 1:45.9by Southern Cal's Omwansa. Tufariello of Villanova will be a factor at 1:46.4, while Sam Summerville of Manhattan has run 1:46.5, Sam Kipkurgat of New Mexico 1:46.7, Evans White of Prairie View A&M 1:46.4 and David Korir of Iowa State 1:46.9. Others are Suhr of UCLA, Scott Clark of Missouri, Jay Miranda of Notre Dame, Dan Futrell of Northeast Missouri State and Pawrodikromo of Washington State.

1,500 METERS-Paige and Maree of Villanova are the only returnees with sub-3:39s. Chapa has a 3:39 and could become a threat. Omwansa will be tough if he doesn't choose the 800. Otherwise, Dan Aldridge of Cal. Poly-San Luis Obispo, Andy Clifford of California, Bruce Nelson of Oregon and Childs of Villanova look the strongest, with Tuttle of Auburn, Peter Favell of Washington, Todd Harbour of Baylor and Bruce Greene of Oregon worthy of mention.

STEEPLECHASE-Whether Rono can triple remains to be seen. But the steeple comes first, and there seems little way he can lose. Hillary Tuwei of Richmond (8:30.5) and Clary of Oregon (8:33.4) placed last year and return, while Harrison Koroso of New Mexico has 8:33.2, Bruce Bickford of Northeastern 8:33.6 and Mickey Morris of Utah 8:35.8. Sam James of Tennessee and Randy Jackson of Wisconsin are sub-8:37s, while Larry Hurst of Oregon is a possibility if he recovers from an injury. Others are Childs of Villanova, Jeff Zylstra of Western Michigan, Gordon Weaver of Minnesota and Gary Gustafson of Washington.

5,000 METERS—Chapa of Oregon did not seem pushed to the limit in running 13:25.6 last year. And who knows what Rono might do if he is in the last of three? Gerard Deegan of Providence was second to Chapa last year and has a 13:35.9, while Kimombwa of Washington State must be respected. Gomez of Texas-El Paso has 13:27.5, while Mike Novelli of Rice has run 13:36.9. Cheruiyot of Washington State and Salazar of Oregon are sub-13:38s; but both may be looking at 10,000, along with Musyoki. Others are Al Scharsu of Penn State, Thom Hunt of Arizona, Joseph Nzau of Wyoming, Bill McChesney of Oregon, Benton Hart of Brigham Young and Louis Kenny of East Tennessee.

10,000 METERS-Even after two prelims the day before, Rono would remain a strong favorite over defending champ Musyoki, teammates Kimombwa and Cheruiyot, Pat Davey of Tennessee and Salazar. Hernandez of Brigham Young with 28:18.2 could be strong, while Gomez has 28:10.6 if he wants the 10,000. Others are Nzau of Wyoming, Roy Kissin of Stanford, George Watts of Tennessee, Mark Nenow of Kentucky, Jim Stintzi of Wisconsin and Simon Kilili

of Wyoming.

HIGH HURDLES-Foster of UCLA set an American record by beating Nehemiah of Maryland in the championship, but Nehemiah beat Foster at the AAU meet. Dedy Cooper of San Jose State is 13.43 and should rebound after failing to place a year ago. Bethel, third at the AAU meet, has taken his 13.54 to Arizona State, while Donny Taylor of Arkansas State placed last year with 13.66.

Dan Lavitt of Missouri has 13.77; and Garnet Edwards of West Virginia was seventh last year with only 14.0. Walker of Auburn has 13.67 but probably will concentrate on winning the intermediates at the big meet. Others are Steve Darcus of Tennessee, Anthony Coleman of Kansas, Fatwell Kimaiyo of New Mexico, Robertson of Maryland, Dave Still of Arizona, Sam Turner of Los Angeles State, Kim Kelley of Oklahoma State and Joe Siai Siai of Cal. Poly-SLO.

INTERMEDIATE HURDLES-Walker will be one of the most clear-cut favorites in the field after dominating the NCAA and AAU meets with 48.91. The battle for second should be close among Turner of Los Angeles State (49.44), Bart Williams of Cal. Poly-SLO (49.64), Kimaiyo of New Mexico (49.48), Dennis Otono

of Mississippi State (49.62) and Gregg Byram of Oklahoma (49.85).

HIGH JUMP-Jacobs of Fairleigh Dickinson, an easy first in the NCAA, is favored with his 7-71/4 indoors but will be pressed. Arney is back in the good graces academically, Nat Page of Missouri (7-41/2) is back from redshirting and outstanding freshman Gail Olson (7-5) will be competing on home surface at Illinois. Mike Winsor of Central Michigan (7-5) hopes to avoid injuries before the big meet.

POLE VAULT-Last year, everybody competed for second while UCLA's Mike Tully had first to himself. Hintnaus got it on home turf at Oregon with 17-4. He will be tough at Illinois, where he was seventh as a freshman; but Oravetz of

Washington will be the favorite, off 17-81/2 and fifth in the AAU.

The competition should be extremely close, however, as Brown of UCLA has 17-6 and Bruin rookie Curran and Greg Woepse of San Jose State have 17-41/4. The 17-4s include Andy Pintus of Arkansas State and Brett Dames of Houston. Others are Worden of Washington State, Tim Johnson and Gary Hunter of Southern Illinois, Randy Hall of Texas A&M and Scott Fisher of Oregon State.

LONG JUMP-King of California-Irvine remains the favorite with 26-101/4; but

he may be challenged by Doubley of South Carolina, who had 26-1134 for the title in '77. Calhoun of Maryland (26-1) and Myricks of Mississippi College (26-6%) both placed last year. Jackson of Arizona State, a 26-footer, placed at both the NCAA and AAU meets. The other 26-footers are Ivory and Haves.

The list goes on and on, including Don Duvall of Wichita State, Joe Neal of Florida, Eugene McCain of Louisiana State, Darrin Nelson of Stanford, Stan Holmes of Tennessee. Harold Perry of Southern Methodist. Richard Rock of Southern Illinois, Derek Laing of Purdue and Rice of Western Illinois.

TRIPLE JUMP-Campbell of Washington State (55-81/4) has the better part of a foot on the returnees, but Connor of Texas-El Paso is almost a foot past that. Robert Cannon of Indiana (54-111/2) was third a year ago, while Cooper of Villanova (54-51/2) and Maxwell Peters of Alabama (54-11/4) also placed.

Ivory of Maryland (53-104) was the top collegian at the AAU. Mike Marlow of California, Jerome Hutchins and Steve Hanna of Texas-El Paso, Ajayi Agbebaku

of Missouri and Paul Jordan of Tennessee are 54-footers.

SHOT PUT-Laut of UCLA not only has the top mark (66-11/4) but also is a tough competitor, first in the NCAA and fourth in the AAU. Bob Feuerbach of San Jose State (64-04) came on strong in both the NCAA and AAU, and Stover of Oregon (64-91/2) also is a threat. Almstrom of Texas-El Paso has 65-8, while Steve Summers of Washington has 64-1.

Pyka of Maryland (62-634) leads the rest of the field, including John Marks of Southern Illinois, Jeff Braun of Wisconsin, Dock Luckie of Florida, Vince Goldsmith of Oregon, John McKenzie of USC and Tony Harlin of Manhattan.

DISCUS-Walvik of Texas-El Paso (204-9) must be considered after his second of a year ago and Burton of Oregon (204-2) after his third at Illinois, UCLA's Gordien moves among the leaders at 202-3, while Mark Baughman of Houston is at 199-0. Others are Luckie, Rob Gray of Southern Methodist, Lee Kunz of Nebraska, Greg Martin of Alabama, Mark Chew of Houston, Dave Fuller of Long Beach State, Brent Geringer of Northern Iowa and Tim Fox of Oregon State.

HAMMER-The only thing that seems to stand in the way of Washington's Neilson is injury; all six of his throws last year were more than 230. Buxton of Washington State returns with a 227-6, but he's coming off an injury. Texas-El

Paso will be heard from with Olsen and Sjoholm (216-7).

Greg Farmer of New Mexico (205-8) and McArdle of Oregon (205-1 and fourth last year) are the best of the rest, along with redshirt Manny Silverio of Manhattan (206-10). Others are Ken Jansson of Dartmouth, Tim Bruno of Brown, Fuller of Long Beach State, Ed Kania of Dartmouth, Marc Linscheid of Lowell, Jesernig of Washington State and Tom Lenz of Harvard.

JAVELIN-Frank Perbeck of Kansas State has a 262-3, while Frank Lyons of Texas has a 261-8. They are followed by Lorenzen of Washington State at 259-7, Sinclair of Washington at 259-0. Ron Parisi of Western Michigan at 258-8 and Steve Kreider of Army at 258-1. Then things drop off to Wavne Guy of California, Keihas of Brigham Young, Dennis Worley of Fresno State, Tom Heieren and Bob Moulder of Baylor, Mike Juskus of Glassboro State, Joe Bramlage of Kansas

State and Mike Hartle of Clemson.

DECATHLON-Steiner of Brigham Young is the heavy favorite with a hand-timed 8,026. Place winner Bengt Larsson of Oregon State is next with 7,637, while Steve Jacobs of Arizona follows with 7,528. Miller of Brigham Young and Joel Johnson of Oregon State are 7,400-plus. Other threats are Tom Harris of California-Santa Barbara, Jeff Swanger of Weber State, Devon Wheeler of UCLA, Tom Delmoor of Mount St. Mary's, Gary Bastien of Eastern Michigan. Joe Schneider of St. John's and Vin Reilly of Florida.

Champion USC Shares The Spotlight With Many Sparkling Performances

As always, the Division I championship meet was one of superlatives.

But surprisingly, one of the brightest stars was one whose gold medal and two meet records were modest accomplishments compared to the rest of his career.

It wouldn't be accurate to say that Henry Rono eventually was overshadowed in the 57th NCAA Track and Field Championships, or that the meet was one of his lesser performances. But the magnificient Washington State sophomore didn't break any world records, which set the NCAA meet apart from at least four others. And with the other Cougars in various states of disrepair, he didn't seriously affect the team race, even passively.

BUT ALMOST FROM THE MOMENT he stepped onto the track for the steeplechase heats early Thursday afternoon until the curtain came down on Southern California's 27th championship two days later, Rono captured the attention and imagination of the fans like no one ever had before.

In light of the other heroes and feats, that's phenomenal in itself.

For examples: Clancy Edwards ran nine sprints in three days and led USC to the team championship, wresting the most outstanding athlete award from Rono. UCLA's Greg Foster and Maryland's Renaldo Nehemiah hooked up for the first installment of what may become history's greatest high hurdles rivalry.

Southern Illinois-Carbondale's Bob Roggy gave what might have been the

finest exhibition of collegiate javelin throwing ever seen.

Washington's Scott Neilson threw the collegiate hammer record even farther into the distance for his third consecutive title. Oregon sophomore Rudy Chapa, benefiting from Rono's scratch, brought the

home-town crowd to a frenzy as he ran off with the

Those who listened scurried to the rulebooks and found that Chaplin was right. "All this commits him (Rono) to is the Thursday heats," he said. "We're not in the

So amid a bit of confusion, stories about who made what decision and why and a general misunderstanding of the Chaplin-Rono relationship, Rono went out to

fulfill his commitment in the Thursday heats. And fulfill it he did.

IN THE STEEPLECHASE, he charged from the pack on the third lap and didn't slack all the way to the finish. Although his qualifying for the final was immediately a foregone conclusion, Rono just kept pouring it on to finish in 8:18.6-equal to the fastest Olympic heat ever, three seconds faster than any other collegian had ever run it and six seconds under the NCAA meet record.

It was all the more amazing because he had to run the 5,000 just four hours later. After a 65-second first lap, he ran 61 and then 59. The first mile was 4:08; the crowd was agog, and it was even more so later as he turned it into a virtual interval workout, sprinting the home stretches and easing the back stretches. He finished in 13:21.8, less than two seconds off the Olympic record but well outside his own

world mark of 13:08.4.

Imaginations were running rampant then, but for the most part fans had to be satisfied with that surreal Thursday.

ON FRIDAY, RONO did indeed scratch from the 10,000 as Texas-El Paso's

Mike Musyoki pulled out the victory.

But on Saturday, Rono burst from the pack in the steeplechase final after one mile and went on to win in 8:12.4, the second fastest collegiate time ever behind his world record of 8:05.4. He left three-time defending champion James Munyala of Texas-El Paso an astonishing 11.6 seconds behind. He then scratched in the 5,000 with a bruised foot, leaving the wildly cheered Chapa to win impressively in 13:35.3. That time was still 14 seconds slower than Rono's heat.

That's why one gold medal and two meet records seemed like modest accomplishments compared to the year's four world records and double victories in the Commonwealth and African games. But the crowds didn't feel cheated, as

Rono underwrote a brilliant meet.

The other guys, you see, weren't exactly slacking. Even Chaplin didn't argue with Edwards' postmeet honor. "Clancy definitely earned it, although maybe I'd call him the 'most valuable' and Henry the 'most outstanding," he said.

Edwards, the World Cup 200 champ, never expected to have it easy. The NCAA sprint field included two-time 100 champion Harvey Glance of Auburn; his fellow Olympic relay gold medalist, Johnny Jones of Texas, and defending 200 champion William Snoddy of Oklahoma. But Clancy got there first every time but once (the 200 first round), including the 400 relay, where he ran third.

HIS 100s WERE scintillating. From admittedly wretched starts, he powered the last 60 meters to bury everybody but never so dramatically as in the semifinals. There, he was last by two meters at the halfway point but won it in 10.25. In the finals against Glance, Jones, Texas A&M's strapping Curtis Dickey

and Southern Illinois' Mike Kee, that wasn't going to do.

As it turned out, Edwards got a fair start. Glance was well out, but Dickey caught him at 40 meters. At 60, Edwards rolled past and held them off to the tape, finishing in a lifetime best 10.07 to Dickey's 10.11 and Glance's 10.19. Nothing remarkable, said Clancy. "That's the way I always run the 100-last out of the blocks, first at the finish," he said.

On Saturday, Trojans Kevin Williams, Billy Mullins, Edwards and James Sanford easily handled Auburn in the 400-meter relay at 39.31. Mullins, a sophomore who was USC's biggest find of 1978, then chested out Auburn's Willie Smith in a sensational 400, although both were timed in 45.33. And then Edwards buzzed 20.16 to easily win the 200, followed by Snoddy, Sanford and Glance.

Trojan Rich Graybehl, providing a cushion, was second to Auburn's James

Walker, who was 48.92 in the intermediate hurdles. USC had scored 51 of its 59 points in the dashes. It was fourth in the mile relay, won by Villanova; and Williams was sixth in the 100. Texas-El Paso and UCLA had 50 points each in second.

UCLA's hopes died with a disqualification in the mile-relay semifinals, to the displeasure of coach Jim Bush. But the Bruins made other noise. Mike Tully won the pole vault at 18-134, a meet record; and Dave Laut scored a 66-11/4 upset in the shot put. Foster won the high hurdles in an American record,

Foster's victory was remarkable for a number of reasons, he said, including "the number of hurdles I hit," a trick knee that gave out just before the finish and the presence of the brilliant Nehemiah of Maryland.

All but forgotten in the high hurdles was the Bruins' own two-time champion, Olympian James Owens, who recovered from an injury to hold up nicely through three rounds and place third. Owens led from the blocks, as usual; Nehemiah took over halfway through, and Foster caught Nehemiah at the eighth hurdle.

Texas-El Paso's biggest moments were provided by the newcomers from Kenya. Musyoki's 60-flat in the last lap won the 10,000 from Providence Irishman John Treacy in 28:30.91. Peter Lemashon scored a mild upset in the 800, beating Oklahoma's big kicker, Randy Wilson, in 1:45.7. Villanova's Mark Belger, unbeatable indoors, faded to last.

Another Providence Irishman, Gerard Deegan, was second to Chapa in the 5,000. Washington State's Samson Kimombwa, out of form all year, was fourth in the 10,000 despite a mid-race fall that eliminated teammate Joel Cheruiyot. Kimombwa rallied for third in the 5,000 as teammate and two-time champ Joshua Kimeto took fourth.

California-Irvine's Steve Scott won a super 1,500 from the front, forced by Oregon's Matt Centrowitz to a 1:58.9 pace before East Tennessee's Ray Flynn and Wisconsin's Steve Lacy pressed him to 3:37.6-equal to about a 3:54.6 mile. The field events were uniformly outstanding, producing great marks, great

competition or both. Only Franklin Jacobs, the Fairleigh Dickinson phenomenon,

seemed disappointed with "only" 7-3 in the high jump.

Roggy dominated the javelin throw in the qualifying round, launching 271-5, 276-6 and a meet record 293-0. In the finals he threw 276-6 and 283-9 before finally returning to earth. "The crowd is amazing-they know a good throw when they see it," said Roggy, who also admitted the cheering "got me a little too excited" and hurt his technique in the finals.

In the hammer throw, Washington's Neilson threw 237-5 in the finals to improve his qualifying-round meet record of 236-9. He won by almost 26 feet.

The long jump was phenomenal. Stanford's James Lofton, in his final meet before becoming a pro football player, lived up to his clutch-jumping reputation with 26-11% to beat the 26-5 of California-Irvin e's LaMonte King, Maryland's Bob Calhoun and Mississippi College Olympian Larry Myricks.

The field also was outstanding in the triple jump; but San Jose State's Ron Livers dominated, winning by more than a foot with a meet record 56-314. Four of his six jumps were better than Willie Banks' second-place 55-3 for UCLA.

The discus was a brilliant confrontation between rivals. Brigham Young's Kenth Gardenkrans from Sweden pulled out a personal-best 210-0 on his fifth throw to dethrone Texas-El Paso's Svein Walvik from Norway (204-9).

And for drama, it was hard to top the decathlon. Because of too-tight scheduling and a faulty pit, the pole vault lasted five hours and ended at almost midnight Friday by the light of the electric scoreboard and cars pulled to trackside. California-Irvine's Mauricio Bardales threw the javelin 233-11 in the dark and won with 8,007 points over Mississippi State's Lee Palles and defending champion Tito Steiner of Brigham Young.

NATIONAL DIVISION II CHAMPIONSHIPS

Dethroned Champs, Records Assault Set Stage For LA State Team Title

By the time the runners were lined up for the 1,500-meter finals at the 1978 NCAA Division II Track and Field Championships at Western Illinois, the sun was nearly out of sight. The air was cool, the wind still; and in the next 90 minutes. the runners would take advantage of the nearly perfect conditions, setting Division II records in the last seven track finals.

It was an astonishing finish to the four-day meet-line 'em up, start 'em off, another race and another record. There was hardly enough time for the spectators to catch their breath or notice what was happening in the pole vault, directly in

front of the main grandstand.

THERE, LOS ANGELES STATE was outscoring Cal. Poly-San Luis Obispo, 22-8, in the most direct of confrontations. The 14-point cushion that Craig Robinson, Raimo Eskola and Jeff Ferguson had provided with first-, second- and fourth-place finishes iced the team championship. Los Angeles State scored 54 points in the last 90 minutes to finish with 70 points to Cal. Poly-SLO's 591/2. The Diablos had finished second to Cal. Poly-SLO in the California Collegiate Athletic Association meet just two weeks earlier.

Western Illinois, which also will host the 1979 meet, was a distant third with 33 points, Mississippi College fourth with 30 points and Pembroke State fifth with 26 points, one-half point ahead of defending champion Hayward State.

The final day of excitement began long before the last seven races, as first the javelin throwers and then the triple jumpers took advantage of having the spectators all to themselves for awhile.

The lead changed hands three times in the final round of the javelin throw.

Stan Hieronymus started working at the Champaign-Urbana News-Gazette while he was in high school and contin-



ued there while attending the University of Illinois. He began working full-time in 1971 and eventually left the sports side to become city editor. In 1973 Hieronymus left to work for the Journal-Star.

There he covers high school cross country, a very popular sport in Illinois; high school and college basketball, and college track.

Last spring was a particularly

busy time for Hieronymus, as he covered the Illinois Intercollegiate meet, the Missouri Valley meet and the Division II meet.

Mike Tarnowicz of Springfield was the leader before the last set of throws. But then seventh-place Frank Paronish of Indiana (Pennsylvania) uncorked a throw of 231-11.

THAT TOSS gave Paronish the lead until Matt Opilo of Shippensburg State, letting out a vell that may have broken windows miles away, helped himself to a 236-9 effort. He had begun the final round in fourth place.

The drama was repeated in the triple jump, where good efforts even in the qualifying round were celebrated enthusiastically. Donald Dykes of Southeastern Louisiana seemed to have won the title with a 52-9½ leap in the qualifying round and passed his first two jumps of the finals. But in the final round, Doug Garner of Hayward State vaulted from fifth to first with a 52-11½ mark that Dykes couldn't match on his last jump.

The assault on the records began with the 1,500 as Cal. Poly-SLO's Danny Aldridge led five runners under the 3:46.36 mark set by Steve Scott of California-Irvine. That school had won the 1976 team championship and finished second in 1977 before moving up to Division I in 1978. Aldridge had a sizzling last lap and finished in 3:45.5. Reo Rorem of Eastern Illinois ran 3:46.3 for fifth.

Aldridge spent much of the spring chasing Scott in West Coast meets. "I'm used

to following him, and any pace seems easy," Aldridge said.

SAID CAL. POLY-SLO coach Steve Miller, explaining the California schools' strength in track and field, "When you see world records and near-world records

set every week, your expectations change."

Sam Turner of Los Angeles State stepped onto the track to defend his 400-meter intermediate hurdles title, expecting a showdown with Barton Williams of Cal. Poly-SLO to have a significant bearing on the team race. By the time the runners reached the closing straight, Turner had ended the race. He finished more than a second ahead of William Siegman of South Dakota in 50.30 for another record. Williams was fifth, and the Diablos had gained eight points.

Los Angeles State picked up 12 more points in the 400 meters a few minutes later as Don Miller and Gerold Peete finished second and fourth. Hamil Grimes of Kentucky State took charge early in the race and ran a personal best of 45.75, breaking the record set by Larance Jones of Northeast Missouri State in 1972.

The fourth record came from Evans White of Prairie View A&M in the 800 as he squeezed ahead of Steve Jones of Nebraska-Omaha, Kenneth Dotson of St. Augustine's and Dan Futrell of Northeast Missouri State. White ran 1:47.21, while Futrell, '77 runner-up, was fourth in 1:47.53, well under the record 1:48.3. THE NEXT RECORD to fall was 14 years old. Larry Myricks of Mississippi

THE NEXT RECORD to fall was 14 years out. Land the College, known as a long jumper, took Bob Hayes of Florida A&M off the books with a 20.44 in the 200 meters. Myricks ended the race before the runners came off the turn in his second victory of the meet. Defending champion Dwayne Wall of Western Illinois was eliminated in the semifinals.

Myricks nearly broke another 14-year-old record when he won his specialty, the long jump, with a 25-11 effort, just an inch under the mark set by Sid Nickolas of Fresno State in 1964. Myricks followed his 25-11 jump with a longer one but fouled. "I wasn't hitting the board," he said after capturing the second straight title for which he competed. Southeastern Louisiana's Dykes, the 1977 winner, was third behind Myricks and Kerry Rice of Western Illinois.

Myricks won the Division II long jump in 1976, then the Division I title and finally qualified for the Montreal Olympics. He was third in qualifying in Montreal before breaking his left ankle while warming up for the finals.

"I KNOW I HAVE the potential to get back to where I was jumping," said

Myricks, who didn't compete at all in 1977.

The other double winner was Jim Schankel of Cal. Poly-SLO, who set record No. 6 when he won the 5,000 in 14:12.6; the first four runners were under the old record. The night before, sophomore Schankel scored a slim two-tenths of a second victory over Garry Henry of Pembroke State in the 10,000. The pace was not particularly quick, but Schankel and Henry pulled away from the others and settled into a head-to-head battle before the race was half over.

Schankel, a 5,000 runner first with a superior kick, sat on Henry's shoulder until the final lap. Then victory didn't come as easily as expected. "He surprised me,"

said Schankel, who didn't lead until the final 200 meters.

He used a similar strategy in the 5,000 and this time was overpowering in the final lap, winning by nearly four seconds. Defending champion Mike Garcia of California-Riverside didn't qualify for the finals.

The last record came in the final event, where 800 winner White anchored Prairie View A&M to victory in 3:07.3 to break the record Adelphi set in 1971. Adelphi returned two runners from its 1977 championship team but was fifth. Los Angeles State, which had settled the team championship all but officially with the pole vault, made it certain with 3:07.6 for second in the mile relay.

Adelphi captured the 440-yard relay title, taking charge from the moment Ronald Clarke and Robert Gregory completed the first exchange. The Panthers hurried home in 40.12, safely ahead of second-place Western Illinois, the only challenge. Then things started to go badly for Cal. Poly-SLO. The Mustangs, who had the season's best time coming into the meet, dropped the baton.

Los Angeles State's other points came from Chester Hart's 13.88 first in the high hurdles and Spud Alford's third in the decathlon. Hart, third a year before, broke away from a logjam at the third hurdle; only Jerry Holloway of Western Illinois,

the 1976 champion, took off in pursuit.

Alford was the first-day leader in the decathlon with 3,800 points, but Tom Delmoor of Mount St. Mary's came on strong on the hot and muggy second day. Delmoor had the second-best time in the high hurdles and third-best discus throw, moving into first place after seven events and locking up the victory with a first in the javelin throw. Delmoor was fifth in the decathlon in 1977.

John Christian of Virginia State was the only competitor other than Los Angeles State's Turner to successfully defend his title, winning the 100 meters in 10.30. The most notable champion dethroned was high jumper Dave Haber of Hayward State, who was going for his fourth straight crown. Haber had problems with his approach, cleared only 6-11 and tied for fifth. Joe Phillips of Chapman, one of four jumpers over 7-1½, took first on the basis of fewest misses.

Charles Shipman of Pembroke State, the 1976 discus champion who didn't compete for the Division II title in 1977, was unable to regain that crown but won the shot put with a throw of 59-0½. Defending champion Dave Wollman of Indiana Central was third with 57-11. Brent Geringer of Northern Iowa, third in the discus in 1977, tied for the last qualifying spot in the preliminaries and surprised Shipman in the discus with a throw of 187-6½.

Mark Sawyer of Hayward State won the hammer throw at 198-234, and three

competitors from Lowell finished in the first five.

The steeplechase title went to Joe Boyles of Mississippi College. Boyles was unpressed in the second half of the race but still ran it in 8:51.5 to come up just four-tenths of a second short of the record.

Division III Credibility Is Heightened By Many Outstanding Performances

It wasn't accidental that Occidental won the Division III Track and Field Championships, or that athletes from the division gave milestone performances in their fifth national finals. The championship was the second of the year for Occidental, which won the division cross country championship last fall.

Winning in track and field is a tradition at Occidental, where coaches Payton Jordan of Stanford and Jim Bush of UCLA, a dozen Olympians and several Rhodes scholars preceded the "new young dimension" that 29-year-old coach

Kevin McNair has brought to the campus.

LAST YEAR'S OCCIDENTAL PROGRAM wasn't bad, however; the Tigers were runners-up to Southern-New Orleans. And they climbed from second to first under McNair, who was a sprinter and a relay runner at Stanford under Jordan.

McNair inherited Danny Williams, the 1978 triple jump champion; defending national champion Tom Colley, and all-America high jumper Kevin Hall. He brought with him freshmen Steve Henderson, Greg Jones and Steve Telaneus from a California high school where he had won coach-of-the-year honors.

Henderson was runner-up in the 400 and joined Jones, Telaneus and sophomore Wendell Morris on the 1,600-meter relay team that clinched Occidental's championship in the final event of the meet. Occidental went into that relay with a three-point lead over Glassboro State. Both schools had teams in the relay, but Telaneus' second leg put Occidental well ahead.

McNair had brought 15 athletes with him to the championships at the Calvin College campus, and a dozen of them reached the final day of competition in their

respective events.

has covered the Olympics at Montreal, major college football and Olympic swimming and track trials. "This is really a cohesive group," he said. "Track is an individual-oriented sport; but put the points together, and our cohesiveness really breeds quality."

THE TIGÉRS went on to demonstrate that cohesiveness and their quality as well. Williams won his second triple jump title, Henderson was second in the 400 and ran on the relay team, Hall was second in the high jump. Colley took third in the 1,500 and senior Ross Huchanan took third place in the decathion.

And between running,

jumping and throwing, the Occidental athletes were studying for final exams. They had brought books and typewriters in addition to track gear.

Occidental wasn't alone in its display of quality. Within a matter of minutes on Friday, the "little league" of the NCAA rapidly moved toward major-league status with a 200-foot hammer throw, a 50-foot triple jump and a 7-foot high jump—standards that are the distinction between class athletes and the rest.

Those performances, by hammer thrower Ed Healy of Fitchburg State, high jumper Mark Kelly of Glassboro State and Williams, complemented the efforts of James Gilkes and Tony Hale of Fisk, Glenn Behnke of North Central, Randy Veltkamp of Calvin and Olympic gold medalist Edwin Moses of Morehouse to give credibility to Division III and its athletes.

Williams, who went 50-21/2, said, "I haven't been thinking about the Olympics,

but now I want to go to the trials. That would be an accomplishment."

AND AN ATTAINABLE one, it seems. And don't be surprised if Williams

runs into Healy at the 1980 U.S. Olympic trials.

"This is my fourth meet in a row over 200," said Healy, a second-year thrower who extended the Division III record by nearly 12 feet, to 202. "It's starting to come too easy (to stop competing after graduation). There's going to be an Olympic training camp in Houston (this summer), and I think I'm going to be invited." Indeed, Healy's personal record of 205-10 ranked him among the top six American throwers competing during the first half of 1978.

With their enthusiasm, the hammer throwers (who delight in each other's accomplishments) helped lift triple jumper Williams past the 50-foot plateau.

"The hammer throwers (who were throwing near the triple jump runway) were exciting to me," said Williams, "and the crowd was very responsive."

WHILE WILLIAMS got a boost, Kelly suffered a letdown when the rest of the high jumpers failed to clear 7-0 with him.

"When everyone went out, my adrenaline stopped," said the senior, who had started moving up a year ago when he first made the Division III finals. Kelly's

started moving up a year ago when he first made the Division III finals. Kelly's success at Calvin gave him two 7-footers in three weeks.

In addition to Healy, Williams and Kelly, two other athletes established

Division III records—Rick Cotton of Doane and Dale Kramer of Carleton.

Cotton cleared 15-8 in the pole vault, two inches over the record. He had flown 16-1 during the decathlon competition, in which he scored 6,658 points; but his jump didn't qualify for meet record consideration because it didn't occur during the official pole vault competition.

KRAMER WON HIS second consecutive title in the 5,000 meters, dominating the race in 14:19.32 for a victory margin of more than 13 seconds and breaking the

division record by more than four seconds.

The margin of victory was considerably less in events such as the 100-meter dash and the 110-meter hurdles. It took meet officials 20 minutes to study the finish-line photograph before awarding the 100 to Charlie Kennedy of Miles over Lloyd Langford of Southern-New Orleans after both were timed in 10.74.

The finish in the hurdles was even more exciting; winner Silas Hudson of Coe was timed in 14.63, runner-up Mike Bissell of Ohio Wesleyan in 14.64 and Charles Lucky of Stanislaus State in 14.65. Charles Paschke of Baldwin-Wallace was

fourth in 14.91, and only 00.09 separated the next four runners.

Even more exciting was the conclusion of the meet's longest race, the 10,000 meters, although only a handful of spectators saw it because of heat and humidity delays. Dave Severance of Plymouth State broke from the field after two miles and stretched to a long lead, only to edged at the tape by Dan Henderson of Wheaton. Henderson was 75 yards behind Severance with two laps to go and

trailed by 50 yards with one circuit left; but he ran that final lap in an incredible 56

seconds to nip Severance, 30:05.38 to 30:05.82.

Three individuals moved from runner-up to championship status. Bob Moffat of Union, second in the 1977 Division III meet and third in the 1978 NCAA indoor. championships, won the 400 in 46.89. Mark Stebbins of Rochester Tech won the Division III intermediate hurdles in 51.42. And Pat Weiler of Aquinas gave the home-town crowd a champion to cheer when he overcame Humboldt State's proud steeplechase tradition (four national champions-including Weiler's 1977 nemesis, Gordon Innes-and all-America runners 10 of the past 12 years). He finished in 8:49.0, more than seven seconds in front of Humboldt State's Paul Heide, who was joined in the top four by teammate Ken Hammer.

Last year's runners-up fared better than the defending or former champions. Quarter-miler V.J. Rempel of Stanislaus State and distance runner Domenic Finelli of Brandeis missed the meet with injuries or illness; Dan Cooper of Augustana, William Versen of Carthage, Robert Grim of St. Thomas and Colley all failed to repeat, as did Southern-New Orleans' 400-relay team.

The only other repeat champions were Stanislaus State's 1,600-meter relay team, although only Russel Nelson was back from last year's lineup, and decathlete Hale of Fisk, who took his third straight Division III title with 7,359 points and qualified for five individual events and two relays.

The meet's only double winner was Mark Severson of Hamline. He won the discus by nearly seven feet with a throw of 173-8 and the shot put by more than two feet with 55-11%. Severson had throws of 60 and 188 in warmups.

Other winners were Kent Namikas of Pomona-Pitzer, 23-81/2 in the long jump; Mike Juskus of Glassboro State, 222-8 in the javelin; Morehouse, 41.56 in the 400 relay; William Strang of Bowdoin, 21.53 in the 200; Fred Wilson of Doane, 1:50.87 in the 800, and George Itz of Southeastern Massachusetts, 3:48.42 in the 1,500.

Robert Baker of Principia regained his runner-up award in the decathlon with an outstanding second-day performance. He was only 11th after the first half of the competition, but he won the javelin and discus and placed third in the pole vault and 1,500 for a 3,645 day and 6,964 total. Another decathlete, Paul Trocki, a junior at Keene, was 11th overall going into the final event but ran the 1,500 in 4:11.4 to move up to all-America status. Also gaining all-America status was long jumper Randy Veenstra of Calvin.

Following Occidental (45) and Glassboro State (35) in the team standings were Doane 28, Southern-New Orleans 22, Hamline 21, Stanislaus State and Humboldt

Jumpers Steal The Individual Shows With Best Indoor And Meet Records

Jumpers Mike Tully of UCLA and Franklin Jacobs of Fairleigh Dickinson made center-stage appearances with championship results at the 14th NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships, an event in which individuals overshadowed team performances.

In a tension-packed finale that had an appreciative crowd alternately clapping its hands and sitting on them, Tully and Jacobs jumped at world-record heights on adjoining runways. Tully ended with a best indoor pole vault mark of 18-5¼; and Jacobs ended with a meet record in the high jump, 7-5.

TULLY HAD COME TO THE MEET in Detroit with the express purpose of setting the record. And that he did—on his first attempt at the height and with the bar bouncing up and down before settling on the pegs.

"I thought the bar was going to fall for sure," he said, "but I had the height. Even if it had fallen that time, I'd have made it on another attempt."

The winning height not only took care of all amateur marks but also erased the professional mark of 18-5. And until Tully attempted 18-8%, he hadn't missed, jumping 16-8, 17-0, 17-4, 18-0½ and 18-5¼.

Jacobs, a 5-10 sophomore who had failed to qualify for the 1977 final by missing at 6-10, made sure this time, clearing 7-1, 7-3 and 7-5 on first attempts. That was the fourth time he had done 7-5 or better during the winter. And as he said of the attempt at 7-84, "I looked so good at 7-5 that I had to try it."

He proceeded to miss twice at 7-84 and pass on a third attempt at an inch above what was his world record until Russian Vladimir Yashchenko cleared 7-8½ in the European championships the next day.

John Stewart is a veteran of more than 20 years as a sports reporter. The last 15 have been with the Baltimore Sun,

where he covers both golf and college athletics.

In addition to other assignments, Stewart has covered four Olympic games.

He also has covered several NCAA championships, including those in soccer, basketball and both indoor and outdoor track and field.

A native of Auburn, New York, and a graduate of Colorado College, Stewart is not new to the Guide series. He also has written

articles for the Basketball Guide about the South and Divisions II and III.

Texas-El Paso overcame a rash of setbacks to win its fourth crown in the past five years by placing in seven events and totaling 44 points. James Munyala picked up the only individual victory for the Miners with a 3:59.8 mile run. Second-, third- and fifth-place finishes in the three-mile run, a second in the shot put and a third in the triple jump helped swell the Texas-El Paso point total.

ALONG THE WAY were a couple of disqualifications and several subpar performances; but the Miners ended with a six-point edge on runner-up Auburn, 38 points. Villanova, the perennial Eastern contender, was third with 35 points, followed by defending champion Washington State with 27.

Willie Smith led Auburn's bid with his second straight winning 48.28 in 440 yards, holding off Michigan's James Grace. The Tigers had their share of

problems, notably Harvey Glance's failure to make the 60-yard final.

Villanova could point to two disqualifications as all that stood between it and a championship. Experienced senior Glenn Bogue was tagged for running out of his lane in a 600 trial, and freshman Anthony Tufariello fell just short of the exchange

zone at the end of the second leg of a mile-relay trial.

The jumping heroics of Tully and Jacobs almost knocked defending triple jump champion Ian Campbell of Washington State out of the spotlight. He set a collegiate record with a jump of 55-84, the fifth best jump in indoor history. His right hand touched the sand-the official point of measurement-behind where he landed; otherwise, it would have measured beyond 56 feet.

Foreign athletes, who won seven of 15 events, once again dominated the

distance races, winning the one-mile, two-mile and three-mile events.

Last fall, Providence coach Bob Amato passed up the ICAAAA cross country championships; and a week later his Irish Stars John Treacy and Gerard Deegan

ran second and third behind successful defender Henry Rono.

The strategy paid off this year. After passing up the ICAAAA the week before, Treacy won the three-mile on Friday night; and Deegan took the two-mile the next day. Treacy led his race after two miles; he briefly relinquished the lead to Mexican Rodolfo Gomez of Texas-El Paso, then charged into the lead with a lap and a half to go. He finished in 13:10.2, bettering the meet record of 13:14.4. To win the two-mile, Deegan pulled away from a flu-weakened Rono to win in 8:41.4.

The other four foreign champions were in the field events, where Australian Campbell was joined by Nigerian Al Ogunfeyimi of Ohio in the long jump and by Canadians Bruno Pauletto of Central Michigan in the shot put and Scott Neilson

of Washington in the 35-pound weight throw.

Ogunfeyimi squeezed past Stanford's James Lofton, 25-61/2 to 25-61/4, with Nigerian Ajayi Agebebaku from Missouri third with 25-334. Agbebaku came right

back to take second in the triple jump with 54-5½.

Pauletto beat Texas-El Paso's Hans Almstrom in the shot put, 64-1½ to 62-5½, to bring Central Michigan its first NCAA track and field title. Neilson beat Dartmouth juniors Ed Kania, 66-41/2, and Ken Jansson, 64-31/4, with his 68-73/4, becoming the first to win back-to-back crowns in the 35-pound weight throw.

Notwithstanding the foreign performances, the natives were not exactly standing around in the background. Not only did Americans win everything on the track through the 1,000 yards, but two of the champions were freshmen-Maryland phenomenon Renaldo Nehemiah in a controversial 60-yard hurdles

final and Walter McCoy, the 600 winner from Florida State.

The others were all underclassmen with the exception of splendid Villanova senior Mark Belger. The American record holder with a 1:48.1 in the 880, Belger polished off another undefeated indoor campaign with a winning 1:49.1. It was his 13th consecutive triumph at 880 yards since 1976.

Nehemiah, fastest man in the heats with 7.11, got a bad start in the final, while teammate Greg Robertson started well and led for most of the race. Nehemiah caught up at the fifth hurdle; but at the tape it appeared to be Robertson by an eyelash over Auburn's James Walker, with Nehemiah right behind him.

The first official results showed that Nehemiah was first, Robertson was second and Walker was third. But upon appeal from Auburn coach Mel Rosen, Walker and Robertson were reversed. The time was 7.16. Defending champion James Lee of Nebraska was eliminated in the quarterfinals. In the 60, Curtis Dickey of Texas A&M pulled away in the final 30 yards for an easy win in 6.15.

Howard's Richard Massey, second overall last year, won his section of the 440 for the second straight time but to little avail. In 1977, he was second to Smith by a

tenth of a second. This time, he was third behind Smith and Grace.

McCoy, who gained the 600 final as a result of Bogue's disqualification, took it in 1:09.6. The time stood up when Alabama's Joe Coombs won the other section with 1:09.9 in another close duel.

Aside from the hurdles, the closest championship race came in the 1,000-yard battle between four-time Big Eight champion Randy Wilson of Oklahoma and two-time ICAAAA titlist Don Paige of Villanova. Paige moved on top with a lap and a half to go, then held off Wilson. The naked eve could not separate them: but

the clock did, Paige winning by a hundredth of a second in 2:07.88

Coombs anchored Alabama to a 3:15.1 win in the mile relay, catching Howard's Reggie Sojourner at the tape, 3:15.2. Auburn placed third overall with 3:15.7. New Mexico, which led for much of the two-mile relay was named first in the race after Texas-El Paso, with Peter Lemashon on the end, was disqualified. Lemashon had been entered in the race as an alternate only, and the team was disqualified for using an ineligible runner. New Mexico's time was 7:27.5. Villanova moved up to second at 7:31.1. Brigham Young led all the way in the distance medley relay against a challenging Wisconsin, with miler Kevin Hyde holding off the Badgers' Jim Stintzi, 9:46.2 to 9:46.8.
