TEAM SPOTLIGHT

CUPERTINO YEARLINGS

The Cupertino Yearlings Track and Field Club was founded in the Spring of 1973 by George Staton, BJ Friend and Bill Jones; all formerly from the San Jose Yearlings. The club was initiated as an age-group track and field organization and pretty much remains that way today. The girls have been the backbone of the group with the boys struggling to establish themselves.

In the six year history of the Yearlings, they have achieved a number of notable accomplishments. Most notable achievement last cross country season was a fourth place finish in the AAU National Cross Country Championships in the Bantam Division - Kerry Bratton paced that fine performance with her individual sixth place finish. The girls have also notched a number of Pacific Association and State Championships over the years.

New members may join the team and earn the right to wear the dark green uniform by attending the annual team tryouts in January. The team members are selected from this by the coaches. Other interested parties may try out and practice with the club for one week to determine their interest in running.

Some of the outstanding members on this year's team include: SHERRILL MILLER a 14-15 sprinter who holds club records in the 100(12.4), 200 (25.2) and 400(56.3), she was 200 and 400 PA-AAU Champion last year as well as second in the State in both events. PAUL WADE a 12-13 walker. Last

The Yearlings club helps athletes not only with coaching and organization but also with entry fees, travel expenses and even some grant-in-aid funds occasionally for the monthly dues. Funds for these activities are generated from monthly dues, a run-a-thon, sales of "gift checks" booklets and two AAU sponsored runs.



PROFILE ON: *Leslie Deniz*

LESLIE JEAN DENIZ: Gridley Union High School junior. Age: 16; Height: 5-6; Weight: 167. Born May 25, 1962 in Oakland, California.

Best Marks: Discus- 139-2(77), 150-9 (78), 168-6(79). Shot put- 42-2½(78). Coached by Ed Roach, Chuck Voorhees, and Bruce Ebbe.

Determination! That probably best describes Gridley junior Leslie Deniz, who, in just little more than two years, has become one of the top junior women's discus throwers in the nation.

Leslie, last year, finished second in the junior national championships in competition against girls two and three years older and earned a trip to the Soviet Union and West Germany.

She's hoping to do even better this season and from the way the 16-year-old Gridley High School athlete started off the 1979 season, the sky's the limit.

In her first meet of the track season, Leslie fired the discus 163-2 and admittedly still has a ways to go to reach top form.

"I've been doing heavy lifting right now," said Leslie. "I'll do that for about half of the season and then taper off."

"I'm looking for high school meets to qualify me for nationals."

To qualify for AAU national competition, athletes must surpass minimum marks in a meet other than a duel meet.


"I have a mark in mind that I want to reach by the end of the year," Leslie said, "but I just don't want to say."

But she is very aware that the national high school discus record for high school girls is 169-7. Last year in the CIF state meet, the winner of the event was Christi Pyle of Glendale, a junior who threw 149-3. Pyle however, had surpassed that mark in other meets.

Leslie, among the best prep discus throwers in the state for the past two years, has never made it to the state meet.

First, only one athlete from the North Section meet advances to state. Secondly, Lassen's Karen Stampfli has, for the past two years, gotten off one good throw to beat Leslie. And thirdly, Leslie spent most of last season hobbled by a knee injury.

"The knee's fine," said Leslie, "as good as it ever was."

"I'm short, so I've just got to take my chances (on the follow through)," she said.

Leslie's goals are to help her Gridley teammates toward the Westside League and North Section titles, qualify for the state meet and again make junior nationals and the team that will face the Soviet juniors when they visit the United States this summer.

If, along the way, she happens to break a few discus records, well, that's all on the plus side of the ledger.

How does a young lady get started throwing the discus? "The summer before my freshman year in high school I was introduced to one of my present coaches who handed me a discus to throw. The first day's throw was approximately 89 feet and I was on my way."

Deniz is working under the direction of three coaches - Gridley High School's Bruce Ebbe, who handles her weight program; Highway Patrolman Ed Roach of Gridley, who helps with her daily workouts as much as possible; and former Oregon coach Chuck Voorhees of Santa Rosa, her discus coach.

Leslie has been lifting weights almost year-round for the past two years, under the supervision of Ebbe and Roach.

"Right now I'm benching 195 pounds," she said. "I'm doing squats at 290 and dead lifts of 300 pounds. I'm cleaning 170 pounds. I'll taper off later in the season."

Seniors Track Meet

February 24, 1979: Kentfield. 5th. ANNUAL NORTHERN CALIFORNIA SENIORS TRACK MEET

The 5th Northern California Seniors Track Meet at the College of Marin this year invited youngsters to compete with the seniors for the first time.

EMERY CURTIS (the oldest competitor) age 71 from Calistoga broke two age group world records both held by A. Reiser of West Germany. Emery threw the 600 gram javelin 118-1 surpassing Reiser's 115-11. Emery also threw the 8 pound shot 34-5 bettering Reiser's 33-10. SPENCER LETCHER age 47 of Berkeley threw the 800 gram javelin 174-3, the 2 kilo discus 110-10 and the 16 pound shot 34-0-2. BOB ROEMER of Sacramento age 53 set meet records in the javelin and long jump. He threw 127-0 and jumped 17-0-1/2. Bob also ran an 11.6 100 yard dash and a 25.0 for 220.

Other outstanding efforts were made by youngsters as well with DIANA ROSSMAN age 12 from Menlo Park (Herbert

Hoover Club) long jumping 16-0. Eleven year old CHRISTINE CERKEL of Greenbrae jumped 13-0-1/2 and NICK ATHANASAKOS of San Rafael, age 15 jumped 17-2. The best senior long jumper was KERMIT WALKER of Redwood City age 42 with a 21-3. Kermit also won the high jump at 5-6 and the triple jump with a 40-0 jump.

In youngsters mile BOB GOVI, age 17 ran a 4:37. MIKE ARAGO age 24 of Mill Valley won the event with a 4:21. WILLIAM DWYER, age 38 of San Francisco finished at 4:42, RON TREABESS, a marathoner and age 36 ran a 4:55. In the 40-44 age group JIM ERBES of Hayward age 41 ran a 4:56 followed by PHIL HAGER, age 42 of Tiburon at 5:03 and BURL LENNIER, age 44 of Bethel Island at 5:36. The 45-49 was won by KEN PAUL from San Mateo at 5:29. RAY MANANNAH of Ceres and age 63 won his age group with a 5:49 mile, not bad since he only has one lung; he late won the 880 in 2:40.

HARRY KOPPEL of Belmont, age 65 stated he wanted to try for a world record in the 100 yard dash as he already holds the record in the 100 meter dash.

So five watches were used on him. John Satti also age 65 from San Francisco ran with Harry and together they finished both with the time of 12.1 and bettering the previous record of 12.3, and fortunately for Harry he just nosed out John at the wire to be the winner and new record holder. In addition to winning the 100 John won the 220 with 29.6, the 440 with 71.2, the triple jump with 24-6-1/2 and the long jump at 15-9.

BRUCE SPRINGBETT, age 46 from Los Altos won the 45-49 100 yards in 10.9 and finished second in the 220 to HANS BRUHNER with a time of 24.9 to Bruhner's 24.8.

DON PICKETT of Tiburon, age 51 set a new meet record for 50-54 age group with a 16:35 three mile run.

Over 150 participants competed against (with) each other ranging in age from 5 to 71 and some of the youngsters received some surprises when men and women old enough to be their grandparents beat them at their specialty. COMMUNITY COLLEGES

RUN PAST 4-YEAR SCHOOLS

A decade ago, Junior Colleges, or Community Colleges as they like to be called now, were considered to be a refuge for high school tracksters who weren't quite good enough to make a 4-year college team.

Things have changed however, and as the following charts point out, the Community Colleges have now passed the 4-year schools from NCAA Division II NCAA Division III, and NAIA in track and field proficiency. The chart analysis was made by taking the winning marks from the championship meets of the four college divisions for each of the last three years then scoring them on a 5-3-2-1 basis.

While most people will say the reason for the 2-year schools recent success is the 14 scholarship limit now imposed on

to the fact many 4-year college coaches have left their high pressure positions for the low pressure atmosphere found at the Community College level. Example: Ron Alice from Long Beach State to Long Beach Community College, and Steve Haas from Oxy to San Jose City College.

(2) FACILITIES. A growing number of Community Colleges have all weather track facilities which rank among the finest in the country. Example: San Jose City College, Mt. SAC, Bakersfield, Hancock and Canyons.

(3) ATTITUDE: The old "I'm going away to college" attitude has been replaced by an "I'd rather go to hometown CC feeling." This is due mainly to the "I like to do my own thing" attitude of young people. It seems they are better

State to Long Beach Community College, and Steve Haas from Oxy to San Jose City College.

Things have changed however, and as the following charts point out, the Community Colleges have now passed the 4-year schools from NCAA Division II NCAA Division III, and NAIA in track and field proficiency. While most people will say the reason for the 2-year schools recent success is the 14 scholarship limit now imposed on the universities and the influx of foreign athletes. I see three entirely different reasons for the switch in power:

(1) COACHING. The number of outstanding coaches in the Community College ranks has swelled recently due

(2) FACILITIES. A growing number of Community Colleges have all weather track facilities which rank among the finest in the country. Example: San Jose City College, Mt. SAC, Bakersfield, Hancock and Canyons.

(3) ATTITUDE: The old "I'm going away to college" attitude has been replaced by an "I'd rather go to home-town CC feeling." This is due mainly to the "I like to do my own thing" attitude of young people. It seems they are better able to do their own thing at home as opposed to a foreign environment.

Whatever the reasons are, the 2-year school have made a very good case, at least from the standpoint of track and field, for doing away with the word "junior" from their title.

So. California T-F Diary

March 12:

Not much time for narrative this week, but here is some interesting news on the Long Beach City College recruiting "rumors" I mentioned. After Long Beach ran past Pasadena 80-54 in a dual meet and former PCC high jumper Jerry Sanders went 7-1½ in that meet, the front page of the sports section of the *Pasadena Star News* had headlines quoting PCC coach Walt Butler as saying LBCC and Ron Alice "stole my athletes." I heard about this a few days after the story hit and haven't gotten a copy of that paper yet. More on this story next week.

March 19:

In the girls high school division, I am more and more convinced that Westchester High is the team to beat at the State Meet. In the Boys division, I say it will be either Pasadena High or Muir High of Pasadena taking home all the state marbles.

In the community college ranks, it is still the Big "5" of Long Beach, Mt. SAC, Grossmont, Fullerton and Pasadena the only teams with any chance of a SoCal or State Title, in the mens. 

But now, as the sun grew warmer, Josie and Cece Smith, 6 and 8, began to hop up and down with excitement. Along with friends Chandra and Gena Turrentine, 8 and 7, they had gotten up early in the morning to be part of the estimated 2,500 female racers making the run.

"Josie was up at 3 a.m., she was so anxious," said her mother, Jennifer Smith, "but the girls run at Cardiff School and thought they'd like to try this as their first race."

All down the lines, as the runners waited for the starting gun, they talked about the race, the first for many of the women.

"Last year, I just wasn't into it that much," said one woman in a green-and-white T-shirt with the words "Turtles Try Harder" on the front, "but this year, it's exciting." Her friend in a "Run, Life's Worth It" T-shirt, nodded in agreement.

The sharp report of a gun cracked through the air, and the mass of runners began to surge forward, slowly at first, although all had cleared the starting line in 45 seconds. Then there was less talk and the continual solid sound of feet hitting pavement.

"You can do it, Liz," one man called out; as he jogged beside the racers, "I know you can do it, honey."

Binder, who also came in first in the women's division of the Mission Bay Marathon this year to set the women's record for that event (her time - 2 hours, 47 minutes), said that she had been concentrating on building up her speed during daily practice runs.

"It's a dream come true that I won. I try to run every day." She added that her first "thrill of victory" would be to call husband, Tom, an engraver with National Steel and Shipbuilding Co. and tell him.

She said the most positive result would be the winner's expense-paid trip to New York, she said, to compete in a L'eggs race in June.

Whether winners or not, most of the women seemed to feel that just getting out and running was "very worthwhile," as Tammy Lopez said.

"I feel good, really good now," Lopez said after the race. "I run about 4 or 5 miles, 6 days a week, and I'm tired now, but I feel good."

For Cecelia Amaya, forced to stop running about halfway along the course by a bad cold, being oblivious to all the other runners is something that happens after about three miles of running.

"You just get a natural high, and you don't notice all the others. But maybe next year I can finish the race. I get a great lift from running."



While Donna Mayhew may not have the size of your average female javelin thrower, she is proof that there is no substitute for hard work, good coaching, and a strong arm. At the recent Bakersfield Invitational, she upped her own school record to 163-11 which is about 30 feet further than the winning mark at last year's state meet. She was also selected as "Athlete of the Meet" at Bakersfield.

Donna's association with the javelin began in the 9th grade. Her father, a track and field enthusiast, noticed what a

good arm she displayed while playing softball and encouraged her to try throwing the spear. Anybody visiting the Glendale College campus during the week-days will have a good chance of seeing Donna going through her daily routine of running, throwing and lifting, as she spends every spare moment before, between, and after classes doing some phase of her training routine.

I really felt good on the jump and made it by 2-3 inches."

Mary Decker's hip injury is healing slowly in New Zealand.

After Greg Foster, the UCLA hurdler-sprinter, was disqualified for a false start in the 200 meeter UCLA-Tennessee dual some of the Tennessee sprinters clapped in approval. Foster was visibly upset and even more so when he was reportedly taunted by some of the Vols. Fosters feelings were bruised. But an athlete in the stands, USC long-triple jumper Ken Hays was suffering more. He got into a fight he said he didn't provoke and injured his left shoulder. Hays, a transfer from Pasadena CC, is recovering from knee surgery and is expected to compete for USC in a few weeks. "I don't expect to get hurt while I'm watching a meet," said Hays, who had cuts under his eyes in addition to the shoulder injury.

Triple jumper Milan Tiff said, "I jumped 58-2 at the USA-USSR meet in Fort Worth, but an official took it away from me. He said I fouled. I argued the mark in the sand he'd

put down just beyond the board came from the pressure from the board, not my foot. Inspite of it I feel my progress to 60 feet is steady..... Clancy Edwards, fastest man in the world last year in both the 100 and 200 meter dashes, says he's shooting for quality performances this season and will cut down on his quantity. The former Trojan sprinter who now runs for the Tobias Striders does not plan to duplicate his grueling schedule which saw him run in 55 open competitions from March to September in 1978. "I want to be ready for the Olympics," Edwards told the Southern California Track Writers at their weekly luncheon. "I'm just running in a few quality meets so as not to tire myself out running all over Europe like I did last year."

San Gorgonio High School in San Bernardino has a unique situation on its girls track team - a family mile relay of Howard, Howard, Howard and Howard. The Howard sisters include Sherri, a junior who has run 53.7 quarter mile, Denean, a freshman, who has run 56.7; Artra, a senior, who has run a 2:18 half mile, and Tina, a sophomore. They came from Alaska when their father was transferred to Norton AFB. They recorded a superb 3:51.9 in the 1600 meter relay at the Arcadia Invitational.

San Jose State assistant coach Don Riggs had more than just a nice surprising win in the Long Beach dual meet steeplechase event. The winner was his son, freshman Jeff Riggs winning his first college victory - 9:40.4....In the Stanford UCLA dual meet Cardinal jumper Darrin Nelson got off his best long jump of the season, 25-4 $\frac{1}{4}$, but twisted his knee and had to withdraw from the rest of the meet. "We don't know how serious the injury is," said coach Payton Jordan. "It may be a pulled ligament. That's happened to him before, but it might be more serious."

Most decent local meets are put on by colleges which are pretty hostile to our participating in their meets. My long distance bill, just finding out when meets are and when they want entries, is terrible.

The University of Washington has threatened to call the police to prevent three of our local athletes from using their track to train. However, another club with business backing, Sports West, is allowed to use the track. Sports West's coach is women's coach for the school.

Thanks again for saying all this so directly.



Why CROSS COUNTRY?

Teenage violence is on the increase among American boys and girls. Alcohol and drug abuse is on the rise. Many teenagers have lost the feeling of belonging to society and have instead joined one of the increasing number of gangs. A large segment of our teenage population seems in need of a direction in their lives - something to which they can devote their time and effort. Educators, administrators, law enforcement people, and the media have spent a considerable amount of time examining these problems of today's youth. Much money has been spent at the local, state, and federal level on new and innovative approaches aimed at meeting this growing challenge.

At this seemingly crucial time in the fight against juvenile delinquency the school districts in this state are considering cutting back or even eliminating one of the major deterrents to such anti-social behavior - organized interscholastic athletics. One of the sports that seems to be at or near the top of the list of those that are expendable (3rd in the CIF Section Questionnaire) is cross country. This is because cross country has never been one of the "glamour sports." It does not raise large amounts of revenue like some sports do. It does not dominate sports page headlines.

It is not even a professional sport. So why shouldn't cross country be eliminated? Cross country should not be cut out or even cut back because more than any other sport it has the potential to help fight juvenile delinquency. The reason that the word "potential" is used is because traditionally cross country has been treated like a second class sport. Little effort has been made to get experienced coaches in most schools. School papers, rallies, and other activities have not given cross country the same notice as other sports. Often physical education teachers and coaches have considered cross country for "pansies" who were "chicken" to go out for football. Consequently, this lack of status associated with cross country has discouraged many good athletes from participating. Cross country really hasn't been given a chance in many schools.

If cross country were given an equal chance in all schools it could and would directly effect the incidence of juvenile delinquency in many ways. First of all, cross country teaches moral standards as high as any sport. The successful runner is a dedicated athlete. He or she finds that they must train hard and consistently. They often must train all year around to realize their full potential. Drinking and smoking are out for the serious cross country runner, as are any

other drugs, because they negatively affect running performance. Good diet and sleep habits are important also. The long distance runner learns to take pride in his or her body and finds that good health habits along with a rigorous training schedule are rewarded by good running performances. The runner develops a good feeling when running, commonly known as "runner's high." Cross country helps to build disciplined young men and women who have self esteem. They learn to appreciate hard work and its rewards along with the natural high of running as opposed to the unnatural highs of alcohol and other drugs.

In addition to all of these fantastic things that cross country can do for the mind and the body of the runner, there is another great thing about cross country - almost anyone can do it. Cross country does not favor the naturally gifted athlete as much as other sports. The less gifted athlete can overcome his or her lack of natural ability through regular training. The history of cross country is full of stories of less talented athletes becoming world class performers. As Dr. George Sheehan would say, "Through running everyone can become an athlete." If cross country is eliminated, many potential athletes at the high school level will have to turn to other things besides athletics.

Realistically speaking, no sport should be cut or cut back until qualified coaches have been given the chance to initiate interest. The financial difference in running athletic programs at the high school level as compared to the cost of juvenile delinquency is far greater, not to include moral aspects taught in athletics.

Now, more than ever, is the time to encourage cross country. Long distance running is by far the fastest growing

sport in this country. It is finally gaining the status that it deserves. The physical benefits of running along with the excitement of running competition are becoming increasingly well known to the American public. More than any other high school sport it is one that can be continued throughout life to the great benefit of the individual without any special equipment or facilities. Cross country running is finally coming of age in this country.

When one examines all of these benefits offered by cross country, at the high school level, the costs of such a program seem minuscule indeed. Cross country has traditionally thrived on budgets that would not even be considered by other sports. This is a sport that requires no special training or meet area. No practice gear is usually provided by the school. Insurance is among the lowest for high school sports. All that is really needed, and all that has usually been provided, is a coach, a few uniforms, insurance, and transportation to meets. Cross country has been and will continue to be an inexpensive sport.

The school district that decides that cross country is well worth the small price tag, should promote it the same way that it does other major sports. Where qualified coaches aren't present, the ability to coach cross country should be used as a criterion when hiring teachers. There are many well qualified teachers who were cross country runners in college.

Often it has been asked, "Can we afford to continue sports like cross country?" With the needs of today's youth, and the potential that cross country has for meeting these needs, we must ask ourselves, "Can we really afford to eliminate sports like cross country?"
