Awakening Spirits or Crushing Them? Cal State Hayward Drops Track and Field

Not long after California State University, Hayward dropped its men's and women's track and field, cross country, swimming and tennis teams, athletes crammed into the office of school president Norma Rees to hear her explanation of the February budget cuts.

"She was saying how she was a great supporter of college athletics and hated to see the programs go," runner Vicki Wagenbach said. "So I raised my hand and said, 'if you're so supportive, how come I've never seen you at any of our meets?'"

"She said, 'I attend all meetings.' She didn't even know what a track meet was. She said 'Hand me \$100,000, then we'll talk.' She was really cold."

The recent decision to drop track was disturbing in many ways. Cal State was forced to cut \$350,000 from its 1992-93 budget and dropped some of its most successful sports, ones with winning reputations and high graduation rates. Football, a perennial losing program that attracts little community interest and has a poor graduation rate, remained unharmed.

"This is not only bad for track and field, but for athletics in general," CSUH co-head coach Bob Maguire said. "When a school like the stature of Hayward drops the sport -- a Division II program with no scholarships -- it has ramifications other than track and field. It does not bode well for intercollegiate athletics."

San Francisco Bay area track suffered a blow when the once-proud San Jose State

program was dropped after the 1988 season. Now, the intercollegiate opportunities for young athletes are even smaller.

Of the 13 four-year Bay Area schools with athletic programs, only five (Stanford, California, San Francisco State, College of Notre Dame and Menlo) are expected to field track and field next year.

Junior quartermiler Geoff Garvin came to Hayward out of Kaiser High in Hawaii, where he had never broken 50 seconds.

"It gave me a place where I could go and compete right away and develop," he said.

Garvin has since run a 48.19 and hopes to reach the NCAA Division II qualifying standard of 47.2.

"Very few high school kids in this area are going to be offered scholarships," said Marshall Clark, San Jose State's last coach, now at Saratoga High. "The young kids simply won't have an opportunity to develop their skills. And there's not that many coaching jobs to jump to without relocating."

A more serious consequence to the university's interest could be a lawsuit.

In February, a U.S. Supreme Court ruling said that victims of sex discrimination in schools can sue for damages. Under the Title IX law intended to curb sex discrimination in schools, the imbalanced budget between men's and women's sports (though four sports for each are still offered), because of football, could give shunned women athletes enough ammunition to sue.

Stan Clark is the department chair for physical education and kinesiology, and made the final decision to cut the programs after hearing the recommendations of a five-member ad-hoc committee.

"I agonize for them," Clark said of the affected athletes and coaches. "We certainly didn't want to lose programs, but we were caught in a severe budgeting situation, not just on this campus, but all over the California State system."

Clark, it should be noted, coached the Pioneer men's tennis team for seven years, building it into one of the top 10 in the nation. He was personally responsible for bringing in current men's coach Mike Edles to succeed him, and now has to fire him.

"Anyone who knows my background cannot accuse me of being biased," he said.

Guidelines the committee kept in mind were: keep at least four men's and women's sports to retain NCAA membership, seven men's and women's sports are required for membership in the Northern California Athletic Conference, and football, men's and women's basketball and women's volleyball are required of NCAC schools.

Hayward broke one NCAC rule by failing under the seven-sport requirement, but kept the four required sports so Cal State wouldn't be placed in "double jeopardy" with the NCAC, Clark said. He hopes the NCAC will overlook the minimum sport deficiency and amend its constitution to allow Hayward to remain a member.

Track and field was dropped primarily because of the high salaries earned by longtime coaches Maguire and Marcel Hetu.

The committee did not take into account graduation rates (80 percent for track in the 15 years Maguire has coached), tradition, success on the field, or costs of replacing high jump and pole vault pits and refurbishing

the track -- necessary expenses within the next three years.

The cuts may have seemed simple: dollars and cents. But problems have surfaced.

First, Maguire heard about the decision from a newspaper reporter while the other coaches and athletes found out when the

story was printed the next day. The administration planned to announce the cuts later in the week.

Secondly, the committee didn't follow the correct procedures.

"The committee was a device in which we shot ourselves in the foot," Maguire said.

In December, a vote of the department, including Maguire and Hetu, selected the committee members to look into cutting the budget. The committee was to report its recommendations back to the department.

"They had to take on a task no one wanted to take on," Clark said.

Nonetheless, the committee reported only to Clark, who felt forced by the university administration to make the cuts. Once made, they were all but etched in stone.

In reality, the track staff had no say in the decision-making process other than voting on committee members. Also, they were told not to try to raise their own funds. The reasoning was that the amount would need to be raised every year, not just once.

"What we're getting is the top five or six people in power on campus are new," Maguire said. "And none have proclaimed themselves to be friends of athletics. They have chosen to detach themselves and stay at a distance. It's easy to cut programs you're not emotionally involved with."

Also, the timing was poor. The administration chose a timetable that wouldn't conflict with recruiting season. The problem is that deadlines for applying for fall terms at other schools have long passed.

Athletes that wish to transfer and recruits that have committed to Cal State must somehow be admitted through a back door to other schools.

An athlete such as 42-foot triple jumper Felicia Harris, who has two seasons left, is hampered because she needs to stay close to home to better care for her daughter.

"We have three athletes that were planning to go to Hayward," DeAnza Community College coach Jim Linthicum said. "They had not applied anywhere else. It really has a domino affect. You hope that other schools want you in return and hope they have slots available."

Parents, too, have a direct interest in the situation.

"Needless to say, I was upset," said Bill Garvin, Geoff's father and a former Cal distance runner. "My son has committed three years and has earned a certain amount of respect. This is a poor way to repay the athletes."

"It's always easy for organizational leaders to cut things they're not familiar with. Their failure is to recognize sports as education. Why couldn't they do it three years from now when the freshmen will be seniors?"

"This is a model of a great program. It's non-scholarship with no history of drugs or crime. We should be using this as an example."

Maguire can't understand why a department would cut some sports, but not all.

"At least I would know the person (president) has an opinion," he said. "At that point we could begin a discussion."

It doesn't work that way at Cal State Hayward, where athletic director Al Matthews, a member of the ad-hoc committee, chose to retire after the winter quarter to possibly free funds that would help cut the deficit. His sacrifice went for naught.

Maguire, who has coached since 1949, will retire.

Hetu is involved in *Special Olympics*, track clinics and sports psychology. He could work in those three areas if he gives up coaching.

Spring coach Willie White, who guided Berkeley High to five state girls titles and two boys championships, will remain as Cal State's women's volleyball coach and may organize a track club for post-high school athletes.

Though coaches and athletes will move on, memories of fine years at Hayward could be overshadowed by a sour ending.

"Education is much more than job training," Bill Garvin said. "Education is meant to awaken the spirit as well as the mind. She (President Rees) is not awakening spirits, she's crushing them."

MEET SPOTLIGHT

World Cross Country Championships

March 20-22.

Franklin Park, Boston, MA.

The theme of the meet was "The World is Coming to Boston" and that's what happened the weekend of March 20-22 as 615 athletes from 54 countries came to participate in the 20th IAAF World Cross Country Championships at Franklin Park in Boston. The park had undergone major renovation by the city and the course used for the TAC national championship meet in November. White Stadium, site of the ceremonies and finish line, had been upgraded and the course was *routed* through there on each lap. The weekend was a series of 6 races, starting with the International Veteran's (Masters) Cross Country Classic on Friday, the four championship races on Saturday, and the Jubilee 5K road race in downtown Boston on Sunday.

International Veteran's Cross Country 8K

Originally scheduled to include one loop of the championship course, six inches of snow on Thursday covered the park and left race officials scrambling to change the masters course so they could work on clearing the main course for Saturday. The result was a 300 meter stretch at the start using the same area and gates as the championship, four 1900 meter loops over gentle terrain through the snow, and a 100 meter straightaway to the finish.

Pierre Levisse of France, second to Ivan Huff at the nearby New Bedford Half Marathon a week earlier, was by far the class of the field and the only questions were: a) how many runners would he lap and b) how much would he win by? And the answers are: a) more than half the field and b) 70 seconds over the USA's Charlie McMullen, as two runners from Canada and one from Ireland rounded out the top five. Men are eligible at age 40 and women at 35 with North Carolina's Bob Boal the oldest runner at 79.

Junior Women's 4,000 Meters

This first race on Saturday's championship slate was marked by the late scratch of Melody Fairchild, the 1990 Kinney National Champion and third place finisher in the 1991 worlds. Most of the attention was on the Kenyans who had the defending champion Lydia Cheromei, 14, and the youngest runner, a 13 year old, but it was Britain's Paula Radcliffe with a five second victory over Junxia Wang of China for the individual title. Cheromei was third and another Brit, Jennifer Clague, fourth. The top U.S. runner was Pamela Hunt of Ithaca, NY, in 15th with no Californians on the girls squad. Junior teams had a maximum of six runners with four to score and Ethiopia had all four between 9th and 18th for a 4 point win over Romania with the USA 9th.

Senior Women's 6,000 Meters

The center of attention was Lynn Jennings, not only the two time world champion and pre-

race favorite but a lifelong New Englander who had run on this course as a high schooler in the later 70's. This was her day as she was in or near the lead from the gun, challenged by Catherina McKiernan of Ireland and Albertina Dias of Portugal. An expected challenge from Liz McColgan never materialized as Liz, coming down with a cold, was well back at the start and never near the leaders. Jennings relies heavily on her finish and it paid off again as she fell slightly behind coming into the stadium but kicked into gear with the end in sight to win by two seconds. Vicki Huber was alone in fourth most of the race and hung on to that position by one second to help the Americans to a second place finish behind Kenya.

Alhambra's Sylvia Mosqueda ran a solid race to finish 42nd, one place behind McColgan, and wound up as the 4th and final scorer for the USA's silver medalists. The former Cal State L.A. runner, a CCAA conference cross country champion, was used to dirt and trails but the snow and the cold caused her problems. Now back in California after a stay in Oregon, Mosqueda was happy with her teams second place finish and is now considering going to Alamosa to train at altitude while preparing for the Olympic Trials 10,000 meter.

Senior Men's 12,000 Meters

Khalid Skah of Morocco had won in 1990 and 1991 but claimed to be concentrating on Barcelona and not in top shape. Of course,

that's what everyone in the field was saying and Skah was still considered a top contender along with any one of half a dozen Kenyans. After the first lap of the multiple loop course, there were a dozen in the lead pack consisting primarily of the favored Africans and it looked the same after two laps. Moments later, the race for first was over. Kenya's John Ngugi, already a four time winner, became the first five time winner in meet history (including all versions of this race going back to 1903) when he made a big break 1/3 of the way into the race. No one went with him then and no one could challenge him later. Asked after the race if he thought someone would catch him, Ngugi smiled in a way that said "Not even a chance" and politely stated that, no, he didn't expect anyone to catch him. Led by Ngugi and a runner-up finish from William Mutwol, Kenya rolled to their 7th straight team victory as 5 of their 6 scorers were in the top 8. Mutwol and Richard Chelimo would go on to Carlsbad a week later and smash the world 5000M road racing record. The top U.S. finisher was TAC champion Todd Williams in 19th as the U.S. team took 8th.

The closest the race came to having a Californian was Australia's Peter Brett, who had competed for Hancock J.C. in Santa Maria

and then Fresno State. Brett ran well for half the race but said he felt flat for the second half. He wound up 95th and 6th for his team as the Australians finished 9th led by marathoner Steve Monaggetti in 6th.

This was indeed a junior version of the men's race as Kenya had the top individual and the team winner while Ethiopia had the runner-up in both categories. The top American, in 17th, was Jason Casiano, a freshman at Wisconsin where he is a teammate of California's Bryan Dameworth and James Menon. California had no one on the team, unlike the mid 1970's when the state not only had runners like Roy Kissin, Ralph Serna, Hal Schultz, and Don Moses making the team, but provided the world junior champion for four years in a row (Rich Kimball-1974, Bob Thomas-1975, Eric Hulst-1976, Thom Hunt-1977) and the U.S. had the winning team each time. This year's team was ninth.

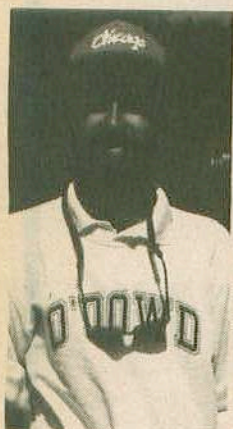

Now here's a walk-on coach with a very interesting occupation. Brown is the president of 800-SOFTWARE, one of the nation's leading software dealers. His company was in the

■ Cal State Hayward Drops Track and Cross Country

Hayward, February 27.

Cal State Hayward will eliminate men's and women's teams in track, cross country, swimming, and tennis beginning next fall as part of the athletic department's estimated \$300,000 in budget cuts handed down by university president Norma Rees' office. "What we lose as a school pales in comparison to what the student athletes and coaches lose," athletic director Al Mathews said. "Fortunately we will be able to hang on to what we have got."

NCAA transfer rules allow for athletes to transfer and immediately be eligible to compete if the school previously attended dropped their sport. "I came up here for basketball and track and now that is gone," said sophomore distance runner Gayle Saunders. "The whole thing just gets me a little upset, because they just didn't seem to care about the athletes at all."

The coaches affected by the cuts include longtime track coaches Marcel Hetu and Bob McGuire. McGuire, who has been at Cal State for 15 years, thinks that worked against both him and 12-year men's coach Hetu. "I told my kids that in this case it hurt to be a dinosaur," he said. "These rent-a-coaches can be brought in now for nothing whereas us old guys make a bigger cut." (Prep Editor: Hayward's men's track and field teams won the NCAA Division II championship in 1977 and has won nine NCAC titles, the last one in 1983. The women's program won the 1981 AIAW Division III national crown and has won nine conference championships since 1978, the last in 1988.)

■ Long jumper Powell wins Sullivan Award

Indianapolis, March 3.

Mike Powell (Edgewood High School, West Covina 1981), who broke Bob Beamon's storied 23-year-old world record in the long jump, was presented the Sullivan Award as the nation's top amateur athlete for 1991. Powell, 28, finished first among 10 finalists in national voting for the award by some 2,500 people. The voting included the media, past winners and representatives of the nation's amateur athletic programs. It was presented by the Amateur Athletic Union.

Powell became the 36th track and field athlete to receive the Sullivan. A leap of 29 feet, 4 1/2 inches in Tokyo last year topped the record that had stood since Beamon's gold medal performance (29-2 1/4) in Mexico City at the 1968 Olympics.

■ Steve Guerrini (Santa Rosa '91/Wake Forest '95)

Steve Guerrini (Santa Rosa '91), who placed third in the State Meet 1600 meters in 4:13.85, is now a freshman at Wake Forest University in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. Wake Forest set a new school record of 7:23.59 in the 4 X 800 at the low State Last Chance Meet on March 6. The old record was 7:34.90. Guerrini ran the second leg in 1:51.24. Wake Forest had the 14th best time in the nation, but only the top ten qualify for the NCAA indoor meet. Guerrini also ran a 4:14.8 mile at the U.S. Air Meet at Johnson City, Tennessee on January 25.

Guerrini has also attended a training camp for steeplechasers. Last year he placed third in the National Junior TAC steeplechase in 9:22.13, which was the fastest time in the nation by a high schooler by over nine seconds.

■ Sneaker companies take it to court High-tech designs spawn legal battles

Portland, Ore.

The battle of Nike vs. Reebok isn't just being fought on the basketball court. It's in federal court as well. The \$5.8 billion sports shoe industry has gotten so competitive in recent years that patent suits have flourished.

✓ Avia, a Reebok subsidiary, sued Nike in April 1991, saying Nike's Air 180 shoes infringe on Avia's patents.

✓ Nike countersued, claiming Avia's running, basketball, tennis and cross-training shoes infringe on Nike patents.

✓ Nike sued L.A. Gear in February 1991, claiming its Catapult basketball shoe infringes on Nike patents for heel springs and laces.

✓ Nike also sued L.A. Gear in February 1990, alleging its MVP-1 shoe copied Nike's design for its Air Jordan basketball shoe.

The suits point out how sophisticated the sneaker industry has become, and how competitive. "It's not unlike the computer software business," says John Horan, an industry analyst in Glen Mills, Pa., who writes a trade newsletter. "You've got a couple of very big companies that have spent millions of dollars on R&D and I'm sure have hundreds of patents. People are very aggressive legally in protecting their designs.

"It becomes a very important marketing tool for them because it keeps a lot of smaller companies from getting at them by making a similar shoe."

The legal tangles in the industry developed along with the high-tech designs. Canvas and rubber used to be all you needed to make a pair of sneakers. But today, the major companies use sophisticated blueprints for high-performance shoes that athletes—armchair or otherwise—demand when they buy their shoes.

Now manufacturers pour millions of dollars into research and development—and hire small armies of lawyers to protect their investments.

"When you're the author of every major ad-

vance in performance shoe design in the last 20 years, then you've got to scramble pretty hard to protect those developments," says Dusty Kidd, spokesman for Nike Inc., based in Beaverton. Nike is now preparing its defense against Portland-based Avia Group International. The suit claims Nike copied Avia's "Cantilever" technology—its system of cushioning the foot and knees from the pounding they take in exercise.

"They stole the technology, just stole it," says Avia President Bill Dragon. "They're trying to position it as a Reebok suit. But it's not. This isn't a fight with Reebok. This is not just a patent. We're talking about the most precious asset of our company, the crown jewel."

"Air" technology is our crown jewel, something we believe is the best cushioning system in the world," counters Lindsey Stewart, Nike's corporate counsel, who dismisses the suit as "ridiculous." Stewart says Nike's main line of shoes, the "Air" series, is designed around a pocket of air inside the sole that cushions the foot. The "Cantilever" design relies on ridges on the rims of the soles that cushion the foot by flattening outward. Stewart says the Nike-L.A. Gear cases were settled out of court. The major suits are generally settled that way, Horn says.

■ Drastic S.F. school cutbacks proposed. Cortines calls for pay cuts, bigger classes, end of sports, elementary music

San Francisco schools—facing a \$25 million shortfall in next year's budget—may be forced to eliminate school sports, reduce teacher salaries or, ultimately, have the state take control of their finances, according to a new report issued by Superintendent of Schools Ramon Cortines. Cortines' suggested cuts to next year's \$448 million budget include: Eliminating interscholastic sports and the elementary music program.

Last year, the Board of Supervisors saved the schools' sports by levying a surcharge on all Giants and 49ers tickets. Team officials said they would be willing to accept the increase in ticket prices as long as it was a one-time deal.

Unless city officials are willing to fund the athletic and music programs again, Cortines

is recommending they be cut. Most of the budget problems could be avoided if the schools are allowed to spend proceeds from a sales tax measure passed by San Francisco voters in December. The measure would raise some \$14 million for the 1992-93 school year, and would reduce the shortfall to \$11 million. But state Sen. Quentin Kopp filed a suit in Sacramento Superior Court in January asking that the tax be invalidated because it got only a majority vote and not two-thirds as required under Proposition 13. School officials plan to keep the money in an escrow account until the legal questions are resolved. The most drastic proposal offered by Cortines is to turn over the district's budget process to the state Department of Education and force them to make the cuts. Several board members have said they would rather cede control to the state than to cut such things as music, sports and electives.

LONG BEACH POLY WINS EARLY SEASON SPRINT RELAY SHOWDOWNS

Long Beach Veterans Memorial Stadium, Sat, March 7th -- In a showdown of the nation's two top prep girl sprint relay groups, the Long Beach Poly Jackrabbits handled Morningside of Inglewood in the 4x100 and 4x200 races at the inaugural Long Beach Poly Relays. The Meet was a big first year success despite threatening skies that sprinkled a bit on those in attendance at the fine new all-weather facility at Veterans Memorial Stadium.

Morningside was the national leader last spring in the 4x100m event at 45.90, with that entire squad (Lashawn Stringer, Sanoma Nickson, Tai Ne Gibson, and Santishia Arnold) returning this year. At 10:30 Saturday morning in the 4x100m the first big showdown for the day would take place between Morningside and Poly, a team that picked up outstanding junior high sprinter Andrea Anderson. Muir (Pasadena) and Bakersfield led a strong field joining the two teams. Morningside anchor runner Arnold received the baton slightly ahead of Poly, but the amazing Andrea Anderson blazed up to and past the veteran Arnold for a narrow Poly win 47.24-47.32. Surprisingly, Poly ran the race without Andrea's cousin Channel and Latasha Prothro, who Coach Charles Clinton expects to add more speed to the Poly group, but this day had them concentrating on other events. Morningside took a mid-day sprint Medley with a team of Hakkia (13.2 100m), Williams (12.4), Moses (26.2 200m), and Jaronda White (57.8 400m) recording a fine 1:49.73. In a very close finish in that event White edged defending State 400m champion Janice Nichols (Bakersfield), who closed her Driller squad to second with a 56.0 final lap. The 4x200 event featured event more speed, with Felicia Williams (26.2) opening up a good lead for

Morningside over Poly's Zandrea Shorts (27.2). On leg two, another of Poly's super frosh stars, Aminah Haddad (12.51 last year in the 8th grade for 100m), blazed 23.4 with the strong wind down the backstretch to move ahead of Tai Ne Gibson (25.2). Latasha Prothro (25.4) maintained the lead for Poly on leg three over Lashawn Stringer (25.5), with Andrea Anderson anchoring another big Poly win with a 24.0 anchor to hold off Sanoma Nickson (24.5), with Poly racing an excellent early season 1:39.07 to Morningside's 1:40.47. The fireworks are far from over for these two super sprint groups that should push each other far under the 46.0 barrier for the 4x100 meter event this season. In the late afternoon 4x400 Morningside was a comfortable winner, with White (58.3), Arnold (59.8), Gibson (59.7), and Stringer (60.8) racing 3:58.6 to leave Poly some 25 meters behind at 4:02.4.

On the Boys' side Muir (Pasadena) showed good passing and speed in a 42.52 4x100m relay win over a top field, with Haslip (23.4 200m), Guy (22.4), Brumfield (50.6 400m), and Kenny White (1:58.6 800m) competing for the winning Mustang Sprint Medley Relay team that recorded a fine early season 3:35.20. Defending State 4x400m relay Champion Morningside took that event at 3:22.7. Powell (Long Beach Poly) had the top field event mark with his 47-3 1/4 wind-assisted Triple Jump, with soph Larry Parker (Bakersfield) winning the High Jump at 6-6. Bryan Woodward (Poly, Long Beach) had fine relay splits of 1:58.0 (800m) and 48.2 (400m) during the afternoon, with T.J. Reyes (Lakewood) 4:25.6 for the 1600m segment of a Distance Medley Relay.

Marion Jones (1000 Oaks) extended her string of wins over 200 meters in this meet to three (with a national indoor grade record in each of those wins). Shante Williams (Independence, San Jose), Lesa Parker (Bishop O'Dowd, Oakland), and Allison Dring (Mt. Carmel, San Diego) all placed high in their events.

Marion Jones has healed quickly after her January Basketball fall that dislocated her jaw and broke a wrist. Playing in roundball games from March 1st on, Marion's season ended on Thursday, March 12th with a loss to Lynwood. On Friday Jones was off to Syracuse! Saturday evening action in the National Meet has heat races over 200 and 400 meters. Marion got the whole show off in style when she blazed 24.07 in her opening heat win, a National Junior Class Indoor record, destroying the old 24.50 mark. Lesa Parker (O'Dowd, Oakland) looked good in the 200 heats, racing 24.84 for second. In 400 meter heats the same evening, Allison Dring (Mt. Carmel, San Diego) chased impressive New York frosh Jowanna McMullen with a qualifying 56.96 second place effort.

In Sunday's Finals a number of Golden Staters shone brightly! Marion Jones blasted out in the 200 meter finals, then fought off a surprising challenge from Penn HS of Philadelphia sophomore Jennifer Wilson over the final 20 meters to win 23.93- 24.04. Marion's clocking bettered her

Saturday evening grade indoor national record. Qualifying Standards 1992 U.S. Olympic Track and Field Trials

TAC Executive Committee Okays Changes in Olympic Trials Standards

October 16, 1991. Indianapolis--The Executive Committee of The Athletics Congress has approved a change in the qualifying standards for next year's U. S. Olympic Track and Field Trials.

The changes relax the qualifying standards in all but two of the 36 events--20 for men, 16 for women--at the Trials. The Trials, set for June 19-28 in New Orleans, will determine the American track and field team for the Olympic Games.

"The changes," said TAC president Frank Greenberg of Philadelphia, who chairs the Executive Committee, "were adopted after we discovered that athletes and coaches were using standards that were incorrect." Greenberg explained that less stringent qualifying marks had been in circulation since February of this year, and the Executive Committee realized that many athletes and coaches would be using the inaccurate standards as the gauge for entry into the Trials. "We didn't want to see anyone come to New Orleans thinking they'd qualified, only to wind up heartbroken over two one-hundredths of a second," said Greenberg.

Greenberg explained that only athletes who meet the 'A' standards--those published in the official entry form--will have their Trials expenses paid. The expenses covered include air travel, ground transportation in New Orleans, room and meals.

The same offer will stand for other qualifiers needed to reach the minimum field in each event, plus any others who eventually qualify for the U.S. Olympic team.

Women's Invitational/Exhibition Events

The International Competition Committee of The Athletics Congress/USA will conduct women's invitational/exhibition events at the 1992 U.S. Olympic Track and Field Trials at the discretion of the Women's Track and Field Committee. Female athletes will be invited to compete in the following events by the Women's Track and Field Committee.

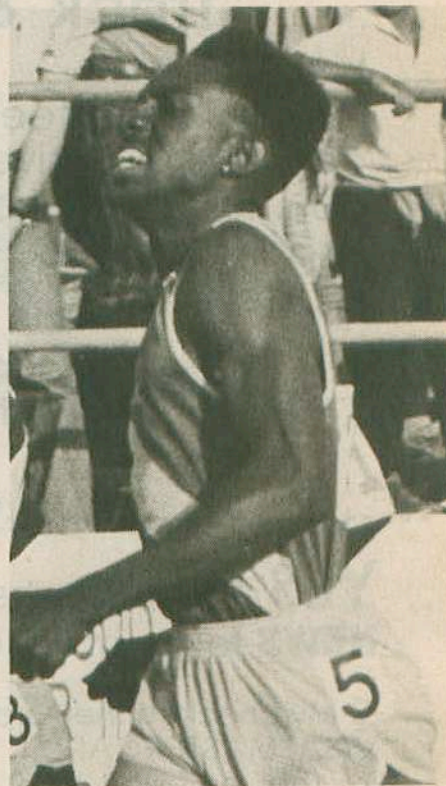
