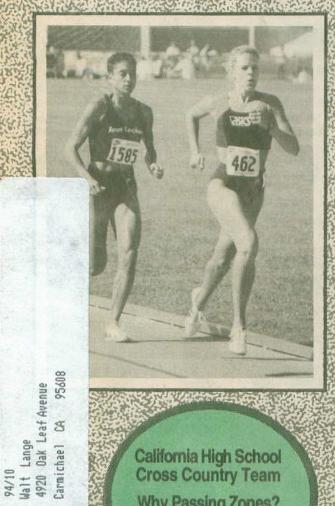

Matching the spread of colors from the new blooms of flowers are also the dazzling array of uniforms dashing about the tartan oval.

For track and field afficionados spring is a good time of the year. However, along with all of the excitement on the track, there is one down side to spring -- spring cleaning! I was recently trying to restore some order to an otherwise entropystricken garage, when I stumbled across a dilapidated cardboard box filled with equally dilapidated trophies. These were my trophies from by-gone days of glory. Trophies earned running for the glory of Duarte High School and Westmont College. Trophies from Chaffee Relays, Bishop Amat Metric Meet, Mt. SAC Relays, and many that had lost their identification plates and which I couldn't even remember where they had been won.

These trophies were lost in a dusty corner of the garage. Thirty years ago they were among my most prized possessions; they meant the world to me then. As a dedicated athlete I had given up so much in the quest to own them. Now what are they? Memories? Some I can't even identify. Was it worth it? All of the sacrifice and effort to gain these scraps of wood

No, in all honesty, it wasn't worth it. If this is all I have to show for all of those years of training, training, training. A

dusty piece of wood buried in the back of the garage isn't much to show for all of that time and energy.

From the standpoint of material rewards, track doesn't offer much to very many. But, fortunately, track is much more than collecting material rewards. By training for and competing in track and field, I was able to shape my very being. I would not be who I am today without the lessons learned and growth accomplished through the struggle for those beat-up pieces of wood. Each one of those old awards represents change, direction and refinement in my life. They trace much of the journey that has brought me to where I am now The trophies are not what is important from that time. What is important is what happened to me during that time. The old awards represent and remind me that participation in track and field can make us better people. I like to think it did that for me. I see it happening to others eve-

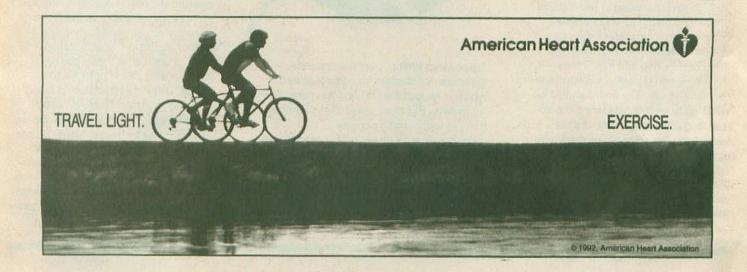

Why Passing Zones?

Track and field, which tests the basic qualities on which other sports are built--speed, reflexes and strength--is the most "natural" among them. Unlike football, baseball, basketball or soccer-sports defined by elaborate rules--track and field requires only a few. Basically, track and field athletes are told to run as fast as they can, throw as far as they can, jump as long or as high as they can, and never mind how. One of the major objectives of The Future of Track and Field was to bring our sport even closer to its "pristine" natural state by eliminating rules which are unncessary, arbitrary, even irrational. Thus, we have proposed that every style of jumping or throwing be allowed, as long as it relies exclusively on the resources of the human body and does not resort to artificial aids. mechanical, chemical or otherwise.

More specifically, the restrictions which forbid jumpers to take off on both feet or throwers to use both hands should be eliminated to allow for high jump tumbling or two-handed throwing. So should the rule which compels triple jumpers to hop, step and jump rather than hop, hop and jump or hop, hop and hop, if they think they can do better with these alternative styles. The board should be widened to enable measuring the actual long and triple jumps, the distance from the edge of the plant rather than the edge of the board.

The same search for "naturalness" has led us to suggest removing the circle to allow shot, discus and hammer throwers the freedom enjoyed by

javelin throwers, ie., throw from behind a foul line however they wish, as long as they do not cross if after releasing the implement.

We have also suggested an alternative 100 meter dash initiated by a running start of the kind used in harness racing, or bestowing the "fastest human" crown by



"speed trap timing" over the distance sprinters can sustain maximum speed, which is no less than 30 and no more than 40 meters. But more about these innovations in forthcoming papers.

For the time being, let us concentrate on the 400 meter relay whose passing zones offer a good illustration of the arbitrariness of certain track and field rules, The natural character of this team event, whose purpose is to carry the baton around the track as fast as possible, is compromised by several artificial restrictions. There must be four members on each team, no more and no fewer; each teammate must run roughly 100 meters, no more and no less; and the baton must be passed within three designated zones, each 20 meters

Now why should relay teammates all have to run the same distance if they believe they can bring the baton home faster by having their "long sprinter" run, say, 130 meters, their "short sprinter" only 70?

Why compel relay teams to use four sprinters if they think they can do better by using three? Why not allow relay teams to compensate for the loss of speed which goes with longer distances--maximum speed cannot be sustained for more than 35 meters--by passing the baton only twice instead of three times--3 x 133.3 rather than 4 x 100?

Why not allow them to use more than four sprinters if willing to risk passing the baton five times instead of three, thus betting on the higher speed which goes with shorter distances against the deceleration and risks of additional baton passes, say, 6 x 66.6 rather than 4 x100?

The only restriction placed on 400 (rather than 4 x100) meter relay teams would be to stay in their lanes, and never mind how many teammates they use or what distance each of them covers. Removing these artificial relay rules would introduce a measure of variety and unpre-

dictability in this event. It would make its outcome dependent, not only on the talent available, but also on how deftly the talent was used, A team with less speed could defeat a "speedier" one not only by smoother baton passes, but also by craftier exploitation of the talent at hand.

As for the longer relays, we have suggested that the 4 x 200, 4 x 400, 4 x 800 and 4 x 1500 become the 800, 1600, 3200, and 6000 meter relays, which means that no more than four teammates would be allowed to divide the distance among themselves and run whatever fraction of the total they choose. Now restricted to 4 legs of 400 meters each, the 1600 meter relay could be run as a sequence of, say, 330 x 370 x 550 x 350 meter legs.

The "no passing zone" relays are more faithful to the spirit of these team rather than individual, events. Instead of running the same distance (which can be timed individually), each teammate could run the distance most likely to help the team by bringing the baton home faster.

A more fanciful relay experiment would have relay runners carry and pass two batons. It would be fascinating to see how coaches would solve the problem of passing two implements instead of one. Two-baton relays would allow handicapping mixed relays by having men carry heavier batons than women, an innovation which would not work well with one baton only. Carrying a heavier baton in one hand is likely to unbalance the runner's stride.

Our proposal is not as unprecedented as it may appear at first. As early as the Greek Olympiads, long jumpers used to run and jump carrying weights in both hands. "The Greeks always used jumping weights, halteres, in the long jump. These jumping weights, which somewhat resemble and were probably the origin of dumbbells, were made of metal or stone and varied in weight from 2 1/4 to more than 10 pounds." (Ken Doherty,

△February 21

As has been the case in recent years, the Sunkist Invitational Indoor Meet officially opened the 1994 track and field season here in SoCal. If the results from this meet are any indication of things to come, then 1994 will, again, be the year of the woman. World record holder Irena Privalova got things started with a meet record 6.08 in the 50 meters. Jackie Joyner Kersee then smoked a strong 50 meter hurdle field in 6.87, which is the fourth fastest all-time by an American. Maria Mutola of Mozambique just missed breaking Mary Decker Slaney's world record in the 800 with a 2:00.21 clocking, Finally, Suzy Favor-Hamilton regained her winning form and pulled away to a 4:38.2 mile. In the men's competition, the top performer, surprisingly enough, came from the high school football 50, where Canyon Springs junior Bryan Howard destroyed the national prep record with a 5.69 clocking. That time ranks him 14th in the world.

While the 11,569 fans in attendance were treated to some exciting performances in the 10-plus hours of action, there was a negative overtone in the stands because of the refusal of one coach to let his athlete participate. The athlete was Gail Devers and the coach was Bob Kersee, former UCLA women's head coach, who has since moved down to an assistant so that he can spend more time with his club athletes. Devers had signed a contract to run the 50 meters for \$9000 plus some perks. However, Kersee indicated that he was told by promoter Al Franken that Gail would be the only world class performer in the field. Subsequently, world record holder, Irena Privalova joined the field a week before the met. Kersee then demanded more money, saying that he had accepted minor league money because Gail was facing minor league competition.

With a major league field, she should be entitled to major league bucks. The extra money was not to be forthcoming.

I find a number of flaws in Bob's reasoning. First, a contract was signed which said nothing about the competition. Second, the meet was in Gail's backyard, which causes no significant break in her training schedule. Third, \$9000 is a lot of money for 6 seconds work. Fourth, and most important, the sport of indoor track has declined to the point where there is only one indoor meet left in the state. Everyone who is part of the sport owes it to the sport to do what they can to keep it alive. For professionals, greed is the poison which will kill the goose that lays the golden egg. I have always been a fan of Bob Kersee because of the success he has had coaching local athletes, including those at my alma mater, UCLA. Bob will continue to be a major league coach, however, in my opinion, his decision at Sunkist was a minor league move.

In the only other track meet reported on a rainy weekend, the Riverside CC men demonstrated that they are still the team to beat for the Orange Empire Conference as they scored an easy 98-44-34-7 win over Saddleback, Grossmont and Cuyamaca.

□ February 28

This was another light week for outdoor track action. CalTech, which for vears was the doormat of the SCIAC, appears to have their best team ever as they cruised by Whittier and Fresno Pacific in a pair of tri-meets by scores of 256-144-54 and 181-161-56.

On the community college scene, Santa Monica scored a pair of tri-meet victories winning 80-53-9 over Valley and Canyons in the men's meet and 116-34-

16 over Canyons and Valley in the women's. The Golden West men were close 77-66 dual meet winners over Saddleback.

△March 7

The Los Angeles Marathon dominated the running scene in SoCal over the weekend and brought with it a result which may be unpredecented in marathon or road racing, for that matter. Paul Pilkington, a school teacher from Utah, was assuming a role he had played in his last four marathons which was one of a paid rabbit. He would receive \$3,000 for running a 5:00 mile pace for the first 16 miles. He did just that, and the rest of the field, assuming he had

dropped out at 16 miles after putting some distance between himself and the pack, continued to compete among themselves. However, instead of dropping out, the rabbit kept going and going and going until he reached the finish line out of sight of the rest of the field; his winning time was 2:12.13. The second place finisher, Luca Barzaghi of Italy, a 2:08 marathoner, thought that he had won as he cruised to the finish line with a smile wondering why there wasn't more fanfare over his winning effort. In fact, the second through fifth place finishers all protested Pilkington finishing, as they said that they were told by the meet director that he would drop out at the 16 mile mark. However, the protest was turned down and the results stood. Pilkington picked up the \$3,000 rabbit money plus the new Mercedes and \$15,000 for winning the race, plus an additional \$12,000 for winning the U.S. National Championships which was being combined with this race.

The women's race turned into a real sleeper as Olga Appell, who had just become a U.S. citizen after being one of Mexico's top marathoners, destroyed the field by over 9 minutes in a U.S.-leading 2:28.12. This was the first time in the history of this race that the U.S. runners won both the men's and women's race.

In community college track action,
Moorpark appears to be the team to beat
in the men's division as the Raiders won
a couple of tri-meets by scores of 10957-11 over Glendale and Canyons and
107-39-35 over Ventura and Valley. The
Ventura women edged out Moorpark and
Valley 72-68-24, while the Moorpark
women were easy 78-50-35 winners over
Glendale and Canyons. Riverside looked
tough in both men and women's divisions
as they toppled Rancho Santiago in a

dual meet 90-41, and 95-18. Mt. SAC continued to look tough with a 94-39 and 115-14 pair of dual meet wins over Pasadena

In four-year college action, UCLA opened its outdoor season by sweeping a pair of four-way meets over Cal State L.A., UCSB and Long Beach State by scores of 98-36-27-26 and 106-25-18-17. Top mark of the meet would go to the Bruins Karen Andrews with a discus throw of 172-8.

Over at USC, the Trojan men took a four-way affair with CS Northridge, CPSLO and UC Irvine 98-55-34-7, while the Lady Matadors topped the women of Troy, CPSLO and UCI 66-50-32-24.

△March 14

UCLA brought a handfull of athletes to the NCAA Division I Indoor Championships, but was able to demonstrate the potency of Coach Art Venegas' throwing corps. The Bruins Mike Godina upset outdoor champ Brent Noon 65-8 3/4 to 64-8 1/2 in the shot, as UCLA took four of the top eight places.

Closer to home, USC swept a pair of tri-meets as the men defeated Long Beach State and Cal State LA 105-57-23, while the women eased by San Diego State and Long Beach State 87-42-39. UC San Diego did likewise with Cal Poly Pomona and UC Riverside 146-125-44 and 123-104-68.

On the community college scene, Glendale swept a pair of tri-meets from L.A. Valley and College of the Canyons 69-65-43 and 77-49-36.

In Major prep invitationals, the Palm Springs Invitational saw the Hemet boys and girls, as well as the La Sierra boys and Yucaipa girls take team titles. At the Burbank Relays, Quartz Hill was crowned the overall team champion.

Along with athletes from Brazil, Japan, Angola, Kenya, Nigeria, Jamaica, Australia and Ethiopia, were collegiate squads from Iowa, USC, Fresno State, UNLV, Cal Poly SLO and Central State of Ohio. Among the long list of top athletes competing were Joaquim Cruz, Anthuan Maybank, Meredith Rainey, Sandie Richards, Mary Onyali, Chryste Gaines, Calvin and Alvin Harrison, and Inger Miller. Butch Reynolds and Andre Valmon were on hand to sign autographs and provide commentary. The meet was the first in the weekly series scheduled to be broadcast by Prime Network.

The meet combined open races and relays with over 500 performers competing in more than 40 events, resulting in a dozen stadium records. In the field events, the top performance came in the pole vault with Dean Starkey and Billy Payne each clearing 18-8 1/4 to top Australian Simon Arkell, Local resident, Cal Poly graduate and Olympian Sue Rembao defended her title in the high jump, taking the jumpoff over Gwen Wentland. although well below her own stadium record of 6-4. Other Olympians battled it out in the weights as Connie Price-Smith set a meet mark in the shot put (60-7 1/ 4) to win over Pam Dukes, with Dukes also second in the discus behind Christen Kuehl (184-5).

On the track, there were individual doubles, relay doubles, and runners who did both. Meredith Rainey won the 800m and also ran legs on the winning dis-

tance medley and 1600m relay teams while the men's relays were highlighted by Joaquim Cruz and Club Brasil's titles in the distance medley and 4x800. In the individual distances, Shola Lynch pulled away from Ceci St. Geme to win the 1500, but St. Geme came back to win the 3000m over Riverside CC's Emebet Shiferaw with Lynch 5th. Foot Locker's Matt Giusto used his speed to win the battle of sub-4:00/milers, cruising down the final stretch of the 1500 in front of former Cal Poly runner Jim Sorenson.

The meet also gave local fans a look at some of the most promising athletes of the next few seasons. Anthuan Maybank, the #1 combination 400m/long jumper of all time and ranked in the top 20 in the world last year in both, anchored his lowa team to a win in the men's 4x100m while Inger Miller helped her USC team to a runner-up spot in the women's 4x100m. 1993's top California preps Alvin and Calvin Harrison took 2-3 in the 400m, ran legs for Hartnell in the mile relay, and spent some time getting tips from two spectators who watched the race--Valmon and Reynolds.

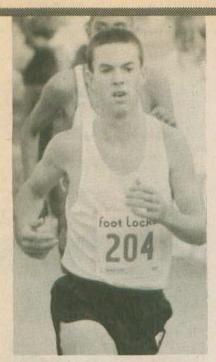

Notes from the Director

State CIF Cross Country Meet Will Remain the Same

It is official now. The move to decrease the number of individual entries in the State Cross country meet has been tabled at the state level. To make the final story of a long, drawn-out process short and quick, only two sections within the state were in favor of reduction and there were not enough votes on the State Federated Council to pass the motion to reduce. It is my feeling that the format of the meet will probably stay as is for a long time. I would like to thank the various individuals in every part of the state that did such a great job over the last 7 months in generating support within their section. Some sections had to change administrative votes, others had only to maintain these votes, but all of us had to work together with regard to a decision that was be made with regards to our sport.

Hopefully, we can carry this lesson in unity over to other problems that we will face with regards to our sports. There will be more challenges statewide, and we need to remember that working together can help us to effect the decision-making process in a positive way.

At the same time, we learned some valuable lessons for the organization. The first is that we need to stay better informed within each section about what is happening with your sport. Who are the one or two persons in every section that the Alliance can call on to get the right answers about how your section might vote in a critical decision? The second is that we need to develop more leadership and participation within each section? How do we do this? I think that it starts with every coach, both track and cross country, realizing that you must be in-

volved with a coach group to some degree. You cannot depend on someone else making decisions for you when it has been shown that without our input they will probably make decisions that will negatively affect our sports.

As a result of the experience, we have changed some things within the Alliance structure. In the future, Scott Fairley (Head Cross Country and Track coach at West Valley High in Cottonwood, North Section) will be working with me on Alliance projects in the state.

Hopefully, this will give me a better sense of communication with the northern part of the state, as well as input about how certain things affect the smaller schools.

If there is a goal for the organization this track season, it would have to be to increase the involvement of the California track and field coaches in the Alliance. While we continue to increase membership in the cross country season by about 5% per year, the spring shows a big dropoff in enrollment. If anyone has a suggestion that would

help us with this problem, please drop us a line.

■ Major Track and Field Rule Revisions for 1994

Rule Reference 2-3-1; 2-3-2; 2-3-3: Clerical and team scoring errors may be corrected up to 48 hours. Appeals must be filed within 30 minutes after the announcement of event results. Correction of meet results involving an ineligible participant may be made at any time.

3-8-7: The fully automatic timing operator may no longer recall a start. 4-3-1; 9-5-1: Beginning with 1996-97 school year, the use of a manufacturer's logo or trademark will be limited to 1 1/2" X 1 1/2" square.

4-3-2; 9-5-2: The waistband of a competitor's shorts shall be worn above the hips.

4-5-1; 9-6-3: Prohibited taunting and baiting.

4-5-9(e); 9-6-7: Deleted 4-5-9(e) and 9-6-7 to make the wearing of a watch permissible.

4-5-11: Contestants who are bleeding, have an open wound or an excessive amount of blood on the uniform may complete the running event or field event trial. However, the competitor may not participate further until appropriate treatment has been administered.

6-3-2: Recommended the use of metric gauges to measure the discus implement.

7-4-2(g): Prohibited steadying the pole vault crossbar with the hand(s).

PREP EDITORIAL

I was glad to see the deletion of the watch rule. That rule never made any sense to me, as splits are called out to athletes each lap on the track. When the rule first went into force, I can remember seeing athletes at the Mt. Sac Cross Country Invitational throwing their watches over the fence to their coaches. Unfortunately, I have also seen athletes disqualified for this rule violation.

I think that rules for high school competition should mirror those of international competition as much as possible.

Another rule that needs to be changed is: (5-7-4) "A runner who commits a false start shall be disqualified." I think we should go back to the old rule of allowing one false start, as they do in international competition. That way high school runners won't be at a disadvantage when competing at the USA Track & Field Junior or Senior Championships.

A Sign of the Times

"The waistband of a competitor's shorts shall be worn above the hips." (Rule: 4-3-2).

This is a rule change that was brought about by a change in high school clothing styles. It may be acceptable at some high schools, but it won't be allowed in our sport.

Shhhh, Angela Harris receives award

January 28--Most of hurdler Angela
Harris' competitors never see her face
because they are always behind her during the race. Last Friday night no one
was supposed to see Harris at all as she
accepted the first ever SportsGirl of the
Year award presented by the Bay Area
Sports Awards Program at the University of California-Berkeley.

Harris won the award for her performance as a state champion hurdler and national record setter for both Skyline High and the Acorn Running Club, as well as her involvement in the community. Chosen the best of all entries for girls age 17-under in Alameda, Marin, and Contra Costa counties, Harris was supposed to be one of six people honored in

front of the largest crowd ever assembled at a Cal women's basketball game.

The award ceremony was held during half-time of the Cal-Stanford game and NCAA rules prohibited Harris from accepting the award or even being in the building during the game because she is a high school senior and it somehow could be construed as a recruiting violation.

The five other winners received their awards and mention was made of a SportsGirl winner, but the Women's Sports Foundation representative who was announcing the awards was not even allowed to mention Harris' name.

When asked how she felt about being left out of the ceremony Harris said she was a little disappointed about the circumstances surrounding the award, but she was gracious in accepting it in anonymity saying she understood the reasons behind the rules.

"I still received my award even though my name wasn't announced," said Harris. "I was told what the rules were and it was acceptable then."

Harris felt the award was important not just to give her recognition, but to acknowledge the hard work and importance of women athletes especially in a sport like track where men's events get the majority of coverage and accolades.

"It lets me know that there are people who know what I am doing," said Harris. "Because I'm a woman running in the sport I'm not recognized. To be rewarded for that, it feels good. They are starting to realized we are just as good as men in any sport. Maybe not as fast or swift, but as good."

Harris was a worthy winner of the award. She ran the fastest time in the nation last year in the 400-meter hurdles, running a 58.82 at the Junior Nationals in Spokane, Washington. She went on to win the state championship in the 300-meter hurdles with the second fastest time in the nation, just one tenth of a second behind the national best.

Harris was also part of the Acorn Club relay teams that set national age group records in the 4x100 meter and 4x200 meter relays.

"I love to run the relays, but my specialty is the hurdles," said Harris. "I didn't love tham at first but I've grown to love them.

"I believe I can go faster. Those are my goals."

Part of the award had to do with the athletes' life outside of sports. Harris is active in her church and works with children at the Acorn Community Center. She was nominated by her high school and club coach Darryl Hampton.

It was mentioned during the ceremony and in the program that Harris comes from a one-parent family. She did not mind that recognition either and she is proud of that fact and of her mother's support.

"It's reality," Harris said. "My mother is a good parent. She's a mom and a dad. She supports me in everything I do."

Harris begins the winter track season this Saturday in Reno, Nevada.

She plans on running her final high school season at Skyline this spring and will continue in the summer with the Acorn Club in the age group races around the country.

Harris is looking at Arizona State
University and the University of Nevada
Las Vegas as possible college choices.

Perhaps you caught the article on page 30 of the December issue of CAL-HI Sports regarding my son Kyle's (Bella Vista, Fair Oaks) fight to overcome the severe hip fracture he suffered in a football game last October. In any case, I felt you would be interested in his recovery and plans for the 1994 track season.

Kyle's doctor regards his recovery from this potentially career ending injury as nothing short of "remarkable." We had intially anticipated 6 to 9 months of therapy and loss of his senior track season. However, through grueling hard work Kyle has regained full use of his hip; he is well into training for his comeback and expects to be 100 percent

when the big meets roll around. Kyle's first meet will be the Sacramento Jamboree at Sac State on March 11th.

Even though he was unable to compete in last year's state final, his 13.9 and 37.52 makes Kyle California's top returning high hurdler and second only to Muir's Ken Haslip in the intermediates. ■ Recruiting violation forces Los Gatos' Harmatz to resign

By Victor Chi and David Kiefer Mercury News Staff Writers San Jose, February 24--A letter that

Willie Harmatz said was sent innocently last summer has cost the prominent Los Gatos track and cross-country coach his job.

Harmatz, whose teams have won 12 Central Coast Section titles in the past 16 years, resigned Friday in an attempt to prevent the CCS from penalizing Los Gatos for a recruiting violation.

"I violated a rule," Harmatz said. "If I resigned, I wouldn't hurt the athletes. There are too many kids who are college-scholarship material that depend on doing well at the CCS and state meets. I didn't want to jeopardize that for them."

Butch Lumby, the Wildcats' sprint coach for the past three years, was named head coach by Athletic Director Butch Cattolico, who said he is looking for a distance and cross-country coach.

The trouble began in June when Har-

matz mailed an information packet -- the kind he sends to all incoming freshmen interested in his program -- to Trevor Guina, an athlete who trains under Harmatz on an individual basis.

Guina had an inter-district agreement to finish his final year at Fisher Middle School in Los Gatos though he had moved to Campbell to live with his mother. However, the continuation agreement ended at the conclusion of eighth grade, which Harmatz and Guina were not aware of.

"He kept saying he wanted to come here, be getting another inter-district agreement," Harmatz said. "I wasn't sure how he was going to do that, and wasn't at our junior high sign-up at Fisher."

Harmatz thought he was playing it safe by sending Guina summer cross-country training schedules, information on meets and camps, and a letter describing the pros and cons of Los Gatos High "in case he was still questionable."

Meanwhile, Guina's mother had already enrolled him at Westmont.

A tip from a Los Gatos parent to Los Gatos-Saratoga Union High School District superintendent Dr. Todd Likens was followed by calls to the parent, who turned the letter over to the CCS several weeks later.

It was determined the letter from Harmatz violated Section 5.10 of the California Interscholastic Federation bylaws, which state that any communication to secure or retain a student as a resident may be seen as an inducement and constitutes undue influence.

"He's been an extraordinarily fine coach," Likens said. "I feel strongly there was no conscious attention to do something wrong, but we were caught in the middle of doing what we think we have to do, though it may leave room for second-guessing."

Early last week, the Los Gatos administration was alerted. And after meeting with Harmatz, they recommended he resign.

"This was a hard decision for us," Cattolico said. "But there was no question in any of our minds when we saw the letter."

Harmatz filed his resignation Friday, but will continue to help until a distance coach is named.

The CCS eligibility committee had yet to decide if penalties were necessary.

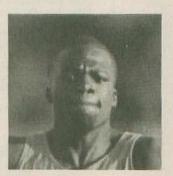

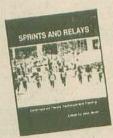

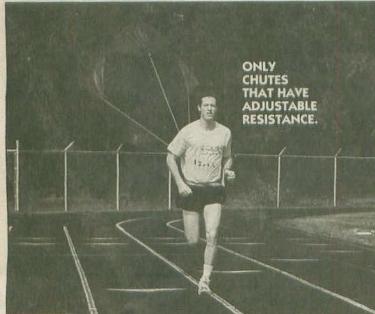
