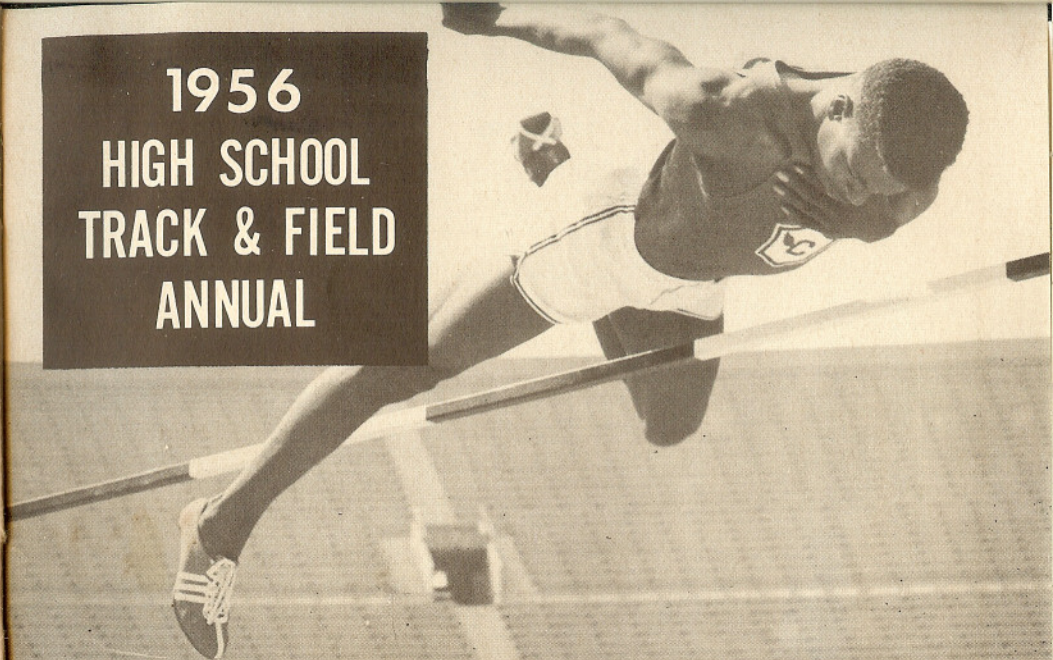

FOREWORD

So far as the author knows this is the first time a booklet listing the outstanding performers of all-time in each standard high school event plus relay and miscellaneous marks has ever been published. Every attempt has been made to verify the marks contained herewith. In the process many have been thrown out which proved to be erroneous. One cannot be so naive as to think that some marks have not been overlooked, but it is felt that all but a very few have been included.

No mark has been restricted because of the meet it was made in, the competition or the conditions under which it was made. It is believed in some circles that dual or triangular meet marks should not be included. In many states a big percentage of the meets are dual or triangular affairs (in California probably at least 85%) and because of weather conditions, shortness of season, etc., athletes off times do not have the advantage of the conditions when the "big" meets come up.

Marks made in AAU or other outside competition have been included as have non-winning marks in all types of competition where it has been assumed that such times (unofficial in most cases) are reasonably accurate.

The sprints are always a big headache. Trying to verify if a performance was made with a wind under the allowable is a thankless task. It is very possible and quite probable that some of the marks on the non-wind list do not belong there and vice-versa. Likewise, in a smaller way, for the hurdles.

It will be noted that some of the marks included were by boys enrolled in high school who were ineligible to compete in interscholastic athletics under the rules of their state associations. Also included are some performances by boys in prep schools. It is felt that since there is no national age limit it would be unfair to penalize a boy who, though ineligible under the rules of his state, would have been permitted to compete in other states. Milt Campbell is a good example. He reached his nineteenth birthday on December 9, 1952, which made him ineligible for the 1953 outdoor season. Had Campbell been in a Southern California high school, for instance, he would have been eligible. Likewise in many other states.

In the case of prep school boys some of them are completing their normal high school education while others are one and two years beyond the high school level. It was decided to include marks by prep school boys if: they had not received a diploma from previous attendance at a high school; had not attended a total of more than four years in a high school and prep school; and had not reached their twentieth birthday. Many prep school boys were eliminated on the above specifications.

I would like to thank all the Track Coaches, Athletic Directors, State High School Officers, High School Sports Editors, Metropolitan High School Writers, the athletes themselves and the many others who were kind enough to answer my letters of inquiry. I will appreciate it if any interested track fan will bring my attention to the errors in performance, meet, place, date, spelling or of omission that I have made. I shall be happy to award a complimentary copy of the book for any bona fide correction or addition.
