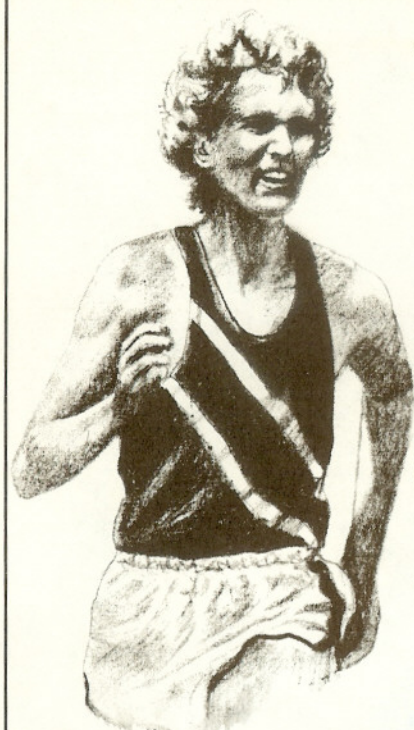

Nehemiah Tops All Barriers

When his official time for winning the Eastern States 120 high hurdles was told to him, Renaldo Nehemiah jogged back up the St. John's University track in Jamaica, N.Y., smiling broadly.

He stopped in front of where his parents were seated in the stands and held up nine fingers, five on his left hand and four on his right. They knew then, and the world soon learned, that Nehemiah had done it.

In winning the Easterns highs title in 12.9, the senior from Scotch Plains-Fanwood High (Scotch Plains, NJ) had accomplished what no other hurdler in recorded history ever had—he flitted over 10 barriers in less than 13 seconds. No matter that they were the 39" prep variety; he had broken the barrier.

And that race was just the high point of a sensational season in which Nehemiah broke many barriers, established five high school records and firmly established himself as the finest hurdler in prep history.

For that season, Renaldo Nehemiah is the 1977 High School Athlete of the Year.

For Nehemiah, outdoors was merely an extension of the stellar indoor campaign for which he was named Indoor Athlete of the Year. But if Nehemiah's achievements indoors were stellar, then his outdoor accomplishments were galactic.

He twice tied the prep highs mark of 13.2 before breaking it, first with 13.0 and then that stunning 12.9. He ran the 330 hurdles in 35.8, a hand-timed record, and 35.9, the two fastest hand times ever.

And over the full 42" barriers, Nehemiah was merely world class. He won the National Junior title with an auto-timed 13.89 and the US-USSR Junior match in a hand-clocked 13.5—both prep records, of course.

And in events he didn't train specifically for he produced marks of 9.4, 10.43, 20.9 and 24-11½, plus a 46.5 relay leg.

But it all takes a backseat to that one burst of speed and power and rhythm at the Eastern States. Nehemiah says it was very important to him to perform well in that particular meet.

"Last year, I fell and didn't finish in the highs and I wanted to do better this year," explains "Skeets," a nickname he picked up an infant because "I had a pretty short crawl."

But by his 18th year (born 3/24/59), he had grown to 6-1/158 with a 36" inseam. And that physical equipment had been prepared thoroughly. Plus, explains Scotch Plains coach Jean Poquette, all the conditions conducive to record performances dovetailed together for that May 30 race.

"He was mentally prepared, he was physically prepared, he was on a good facility and good competition was there," the coach enumerates. "Plus he had just set the national record in the 330s two days before and we knew that if he could run a record in the 330s, then he was really ready for one in the 120s."

So in the heats, Nehemiah flashed to a 13.0 clocking, breaking the 13.2 mark he had already tied twice earlier in the year. Two slight catches, though—the runners weren't allowed to use blocks and a remeasurement of the track turned out short by close to 2".

But even under those circumstances, both coach and athlete felt Nehemiah could run faster. "That's when we first talked 12.9," says Poquette. "During the season, we had talked about breaking 13.2 and maybe getting to 13-flat. Twelve-nine was more a motivational thing than a realistic goal."

Then in the final, with blocks and the proper finish line this time, the barrier of 13 seconds fell. But while he was happy to be the only hurdler ever under 13, Nehemiah was more thrilled by the 13-flat.

"I think that was because I had finally broken the record on my own," the soft-spoken hurdler says. "Usually I can come pretty close to judging my time by the way I felt. I felt nice and smooth in the 12.9, but I felt faster and better in the 13.0. Actually, I just tipped the 7th hurdle in the 12.9 or I could have run faster."

What is it about Nehemiah that makes him so good? "He's a very aware athlete and is very intelligent as an athlete," says Poquette. "He is the type who looks constantly not at what he does right, but continually evaluates what he does wrong and how to correct it. As a result of this type of thinking, he had become very informed on what a hurdler should be doing correctly."

"Plus he has the great ability to take verbal instruction and transform that into a mental picture of what needs to be done. And finally, we both talked to anyone who might be able to teach us anything and then we talk about what we've learned. Talking has had a lot to do with it."

One unique feature of Nehemiah's preparations

was his training exclusively over 42" hurdles, and sometimes even 45" barriers.

"The high school hurdles were so low," says Skeets. Adds Poquette, "Because they seemed so low, he would ease up over the high school highs and start making technical mistakes because there was no challenge. We switched to the higher hurdles because we didn't want any bad habits to become ingrained into his technique."

Working over the big barriers meant that there was no switching and adjusting for Nehemiah when meets like the AAU Junior and USSR Junior meets came around. More importantly, training over 45" barriers caused the 42-inchers to look low, which was important to Nehemiah's technique.

"We run through the hurdles, not over them," says Poquette. "There's no lay-out on top of it or separate leg actions of lead-leg and trail-leg. It's a unified action. He is never out of a sprint position, but he is extremely flexible in the hips going over the hurdle."

The word "we" is commonly used when both coach and athlete speak of hurdling. It is clear their relationship is central to Nehemiah's accomplishments in 1977.

And they agree about the future. Nehemiah: "Well, the obvious thing is the world record. But I also must become consistent in my technique. You have to win races before you can set records."

Poquette: "Because of his speed and technical efficiency, his attitude and goals, we feel he has world record capability. His best of 13.5 equates to 13.74 auto-timed. The world record (by Alejandro Casanas) is 13.21. So we're still .53 behind the world record."

Nehemiah: "I feel that a hurdler should be able to run over the big highs in what he ran over the high

school hurdles. I feel I can run a world record."

Poquette: "With that kind of goal, any athlete who eases off in college thinks he had already arrived. We're half-a-second away from our goals. His motivation is not what he has achieved but what he is working towards. The only thing that his achievements have indicated to us so far is that our goals are not out of line with his potential."

So all of Nehemiah's 1977 achievements are just part of the journey along the road. And the ultimate destination? Nehemiah has the last word:

"Hopefully it will all arrive in 1980."

Record-Setters Crowded At Top

Athletes who established high school records predominated in the voting for 1977's prep Athlete-of-the-Year. So much so, in fact, that six of the first seven finishers all entered their names into the prep record ledgers.

No question about No. 1—hurdles superstar Renaldo Nehemiah, who received 21 first place votes to compile a perfect 210 points. He is the first unanimous selection since Craig Virgin in 1973.

Runner-up Gail Olson, who set the high jump best while a junior, tallied all second-place votes save two.

Massive discus recordman Dock Luckie, who finished third in the voting, tied the platter mark before bettering it twice.

Only vaulter Randy Hall in fourth missed a national mark, but his seasonal-high 16-10 is the 2nd-highest prep vault ever, nonetheless.

Three one-lap recordmen follow: hurdler Paul Lankford, auto-timed 400 setter Anthony Tufariello and James Sanford, fastest ever in the auto-timed

quarter-mile.

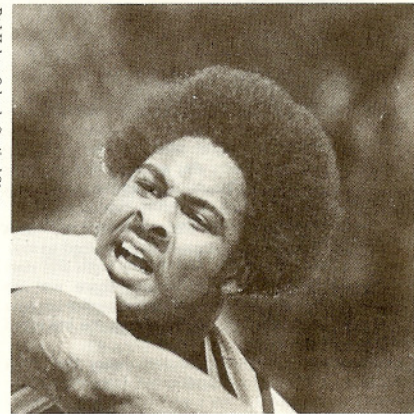
There are lots of ways to view Gail Olson's achievements in 1977: he had 14 meets over the once awesome height of 7-feet; 5 clearances over 7-2; a new high school record of 7-4; only 5 meets all year long under 7-feet. Any way you look at it, the runnerup for Athlete of the Year honors had quite a season.

In the six years since he was inspired by sister Andra's exploits in the high jump (she was an Illinois State champion and has flopped 5-7½), Gail has improved dramatically.

The 6-4½/160 pounder started at 4-4 in 1972 and reached 6-3½ by '75. In 1976, however, he made his first major breakthrough, to 7-2.

This year, as a junior at the Sycamore (Ill) High, Olson really hit stride, with a high school record 7-3½ in his hometown on April 21st, and another HSR at DeKalb on May 10th. In that meet, Gail did not even remove his sweats until his second try at 7-4.

Olson completed his splendid domestic season with a 5th-place 7-3 finish at the AAU meet at UCLA, highest finish by a prep since 1969.



DOCK LUCKIE

Multi-talented Luckie took just enough time away from his other athletic pursuits (football and wrestling) to tie the prep discus record once and break it twice.

Dock got only better as the season progressed. In fact, his best throw, the current prep mark of 205-8, came in his last meet of the year in Honolulu, June 18th. The 6-3/240 All-American in three sports had a total of 5 throws over 200 feet.

In addition, he did double field duty in the shot, tossing a PR 67-9 to make himself the second-longest prep putter of 1977.

Besides his innate talent, Dock has one special trait that makes him great: guts. After injuring a knee so severely in the ninth grade that doctors said he would never compete again, Luckie threw in a thigh-to-ankle-cast. He uses that tenacity in big competitions, too: Luckie recorded his first 200-footer at Conference, his second in the State meet, third at the Atlanta Classic, fourth at the IPI, and his best in his final meet of the season.

He's not luckie, just good.

1977 All-American Team

Renaldo Nehemiah, who set records in nearly every hurdle category, Gail Olson, the sensational high jumper who dominated the greatest high jump field in prep history, and Dock Luckie, the discus record setter, are the top selectees on this year's All-American team. They finished 1-2-3 in Athlete-of-the-Year balloting as well.

Selections are based upon the number and quality of top performances, winning efforts in important meets and results of head-to-head competitions with the other leading performers.

100—JESSE WILLIAMS (Princess Anne, Virginia Beach, Va): Williams was undefeated and ran seven 9.4 clockings prior to his 9.3-to-9.5 win over Wyatt at the Atlanta Classic. He then went on to take the Golden West sprints. 2. Cyril Wyatt (Oak Ridge, Orlando, Fla); 3. Carl Williams (Columbia, West Columbia, Tex—junior).

220—JAMES SANFORD (Pasadena, Calif): His 20.80 ranks him 3rd all-time and his 46.60 state win is a national automatic timing record. Sanford also took the International Prep 220 (20.8) over Wyatt, anchored 41.2 and 3:13.7 state winners, sped a 45.5 relay carry and his sole loss was the state 220 final, just 20 minutes after his 440 win. 2. Cyril Wyatt (Oak Ridge, Orlando, Fla); 3. Carl Williams (Columbia, West Columbia, Tex—junior).

440—ANTHONY TUFARIELLO (Hewlett, NY): Undefeated against preps, Anthony ran four sub-47 races including a 46.5, a 46.8 GWI win and an automatic record 46.09m for the AAU Junior title. He then ran 46.9m against the USSR Juniors, had a 45.9 relay carry and a 21.3 220. 2. Jeff Walker (North, Akron, Ohio); 3. James Sanford (Pasadena, Calif).

880—DAVE AYOUB (Central, Peoria, Ill): His 1:48.9 state win moves him to third all-time. He had five sub-1:51.2 races and was the top prep (fourth) at the AAU Junior (1:49.7m). His sole prep loss was to Walters at the IPI. 2. Jim Walters (Estancia, Costa Mesa, Calif); 3. Todd Harbour (Port Isabel, Tex).

1 Mile—DIRK LAKEMAN (South, Eugene, Ore): Undefeated by a prep, Dirk ran a fine 4:04.9 at the Prefontaine Classic after a 4:06.9 to 4:07.2 state meet win over Bill McChesney. He also clocked 1:52.2 and 9:12.3 in side events. 2. Mark Stillman (Willow Glen, San Jose, Calif); 3. Bill McChesney

(South, Eugene, Ore).

Steeple—JOHN TUTTLE (Alfred-Almond, Almond, NY): Moved to fifth all-time with a 9:14.5, the same afternoon as his 4:10.6. Tuttle also took the Penn Relays 2M (8:57.2). 2. Jim Coogan (Chaminade, Mineola, NY); 3. John Gregorek (St Anthony's, Smithtown, NY).

Two Miles—ALAN SCHARSU (Fitch, Austintown, Ohio): Undefeated at 2M, junior Scharsu moved to fifth all time with his 8:45.8 and went under 8:56 three times, including an Atlanta Classic victory (8:52.6). He also won the 5000 against the Soviet Juniors in 14:20.1 (13:57.4y). 2. Tom Graves (Sandburg, Orland Park, Ill—junior); 3. Brett Hoffman (St Petersburg, Fla).

Three Miles—BILL MCCHESENEY (South, Eugene, Ore): McChesney was second in this event last year, plus thirds at 2M and 6M, but early-season injuries slowed his progress. He still had fine 4:07.2, 8:57.7 and 14:12.5m efforts, the latter at the Prefontaine Classic. 2. Alan Scharsu (Fitch, Austintown, Ohio—junior); 3. Chris Fox (Martinsburg, W Va).

Six Miles—STEVE ALVAREZ (Coachella Valley, Coachella, Calif): Steve won the USTFF Junior title in 29:10.2 where a total of nine dipped under 30:00. Earlier Steve had run 8:56.4. 2. Rod Berry (Redwood, Larkspur, Calif—junior); 3. Steve Ortiz (Kennedy, Barstow, Calif).

Long Distances—CLANCY DEVERY (South Salem, Salem, Ore): In only his second attempt at the marathon, Clancy smashed the record by 42 seconds with his 2:23:05 effort. This fine junior also clocked 9:14.4, 9:48.1 steeple and 30:31m. 2. Tom O'Neil (Jesusit, Carmichael, Calif); 3. Robert Lopez (Glendale, Ariz).

120 Hurdles—RENALDO NEHEMIAH (Scotch Plains-Fanwood, Scotch Plains, NJ): Prepdom's Athlete-of-the-Year produced that sensational national record of 12.9 and also clocked 13.0 and 13.1 among his nine races at 13.4 or quicker. In side events, he had 9.4, 10.43, 20.9 and 24-11½ bests, while over the 42" hurdles he set hand-times (13.5m) and automatic (13.89) records, 2. Carl Namons (Franklin, Philadelphia, Pa); 3. Randy Brooks (Creighton Prep, Omaha, Nebr).

180 Hurdles—**GEORGE BOUTTE** (New Iberia, La): Boutte was undefeated in this event with 11 races under 19.0 topped by an 18.5. He had 13.7/18.6 state wins and also went 13.6 (13.5w) and 24- $\frac{1}{2}$. 2. Mike Holloway (Linden-McKinley, Columbus, Ohio); 3. Willie Majors (Wyandotte, Kansas City, Kans).

330 Hurdles—**RENALDO NEHEMIAH** (Scotch Plains-Fanwood, Scotch Plains, NJ): Renaldo was the sole athlete this season to win All-American honors in two events as he ran six races under 37.0 topped by his national record 35.8 and a 35.9 IPI win. 2. Wyman Daniels (Killian, Miami, Fla); 3. David Washington (Bethel, Hampton, Va).

400 Hurdles—**PAUL LANKFORD** (Farmingdale, NY): His 50.52m win against the USSR Juniors is an automatic record and moves him to second all-time. He also won the AAU Junior (50.87m), as well as clocking 13.5 (13.1w) and 37.5. 2. Andre Phillips (Silver Creek, San Jose, Calif); 3. Pat Mastro (Catholic, Paramus, NJ).

High Jump—**GAIL OLSON** (Sycamore, Ill): This junior repeated his top placing by setting national records of 7-3 $\frac{1}{4}$ and then 7-4. The first is a world age-16 and the latter a world age-17 record. In all he cleared 7-2 in 7 meets. 2. Dennis Smith (Santa Monica, Calif); 3. Jeff Woodard (New Albany, Ind).

Pole Vault—**RANDY HALL** (Calhoun, Port Lavaca, Tex): His 16-10 moves him to second all-time and he was over 16-0 a total of nine times, including a string of 7 straight meets over 16-6. Two of those 16-6s won at Atlanta and the IPI. 2. Anthony Curran (Crespi, Encino, Calif); 3. Billy Pierce (Sanger, Calif).

Long Jump—**LAMONT KING** (Dysart, Peoria, Ariz): King's 25-9 $\frac{1}{2}$ win against the USSR Juniors moved him to fifth all-time. Also ran sprints and hurdles, was first prep (3rd) at the Junior AAU (25-5 $\frac{1}{2}$), took GWI honors (24-10 $\frac{1}{2}$) and had 4 other meets over 24-0, including one narrow loss. 2. Kurt Durham (Oakland, Calif), 3. Donnie Butler (Fremont, Los Angeles, Calif—soph).

Triple Jump—**GREG ARTIS** (Fike, Wilson, NC): Artis had 24-8/51-5 $\frac{1}{2}$ state wins, the latter giving him eighth all-time. He was undefeated by a prep in this event as he also won at Atlanta (50-1), was first prep (3rd) at the AAU Junior (50-11 $\frac{1}{2}$) and then had a fine 51-2 $\frac{1}{2}$ in the Soviet Junior meet. 2. Dokie Williams (El Camino, Oceanside, Calif—junior); 3.

Sanya Owalabi (Sleepy Hollow, North Tarrytown, NY—junior).

Shot—**VINCE GOLDSMITH** (Mt Tacoma, Tacoma, Wash): His two 69-11 efforts give him fifth all-time and he was over 68-0 in nine meets plus throwing 181-1. He took the IPI at 69-8. 2. Dock Luckie (Central, Ft Pierce, Fla); 3. Ken Lanier (Marion-Franklin, Columbus, Ohio).

Discus—**DOCK LUCKIE** (Central, Ft Pierce, Fla): Up from third spot last season, the "Doc" had five meets over 200-0 including a 202-9 record equaller and then records of 204-7 at Atlanta and 205-8 in Hawaii. In between he took the IPI (200-11) and went 67-9, also at Atlanta. 2. Jared Finley (Wyandotte, Kansas City, Kans); 3. Mark Sutherland (Shawnee Mission South, Overland Park, Kans).

Hammer—**ROBERT MENARD** (Woonsocket, RI): Menard, with a best of 190-8, had just one loss, to an Irishman at the IPI. 2. Bill Borden (Fitch, Groton, Conn); 3. Bravell Dodd (Classical, Providence, RI).

Javelin—**TERRY DAFFIN** (Catholic, Baton Rouge, La): Overcoming injuries, Daffin was undefeated and improved his PR by more than 10 feet with his 224-7 GWI win. 2. Mike Hartle (Clarion, Pa); 3. Todd Lovell (Newberg, Ore).

Decathlon—**VIN REILLY** (St Joseph, Metuchen, NJ): Reilly recovered from a javelin-through-the-leg in April to retain his All-American top spot and become only the third prep to ever top 7000 points. His 7139 won against the USSR Juniors and his 7057 was the Junior AAU winner. Going 15-1 $\frac{1}{2}$ outdoors, Vin had 15-6, 6-10 $\frac{1}{2}$ indoor efforts. 2. Keith Collins (Cashmere, Wash); 3. Gary Bruner (Indio, Calif—junior).

440 Relay—**OAK RIDGE**, Orlando, Florida: This Cyril Wyatt-anchored team equalled the season's best with its 41.0 Golden South win and then sped 41.1 at Atlanta. 2. Garland, Tex; 3. Pasadena, Calif.

880 Relay—**BETHEL**, Hampton, Virginia: Undefeated, Bethel set a national record of 1:25.0 with its Golden South win over Oak Ridge, last year's top team. It also had two other sub-1:27s. 2. Oak Ridge, Orlando, Fla; 3. Richmond County, Rockingham, NC.

Mile Relay—**WOODSON**, Washington, DC: This team, with only an opening meet loss in Jamaica, had five races under 3:16.5 led by a 3:13.8. The biggest win (3:14.4m) was for the Penn Relays title. 2. Yates, Houston, Tex; 3. Pasadena, Calif.

Sprint Medley—**COLUMBIA**, Maplewood, New Jersey: With Erwin Pluys anchoring in 1:51.3, Columbia produced a 3:25.3, the fastest time in 10 years and fourth-fastest ever. 2. Forest Brook, Houston, Tex; 3. Ferguson, Newport News, Va.

Distance Medley—**SOUTH**, Eugene, Oregon: The four-mile champions the past two season, South changed events and lowered the national record by 1.4 seconds to 10:01.6. 2. Mt St Michael, Bronx, NY; 3. Georgetown Prep, Rockville, Md.

SPRINTS

Cyril Wyatt (Oak Ridge, Orlando, Fla) and junior Carl Williams (Columbia, West Columbia, Tex) were superb two-event sprinters, both with 9.2/20.8 bests. Williams, a double state champ, was undefeated and should be the best in 1978. Wyatt, also a double state champ, had 11 sub-9.6 and 8 sub-21.2 clockings. His wins included the International Prep Invitational 100 (9.4) and the Atlanta Classic 200 (21.0).

Jesse Williams (Princess Anne, Virginia Beach, Va) was the top 100 performer off his seven 9.4 clockings and a 9.3 to 9.5 win over Wyatt at the Atlanta Classic. Jesse, who also ran 21.3, won the Golden West Invitational sprints. Dave Russell (Henry, San Diego) had 9.61/21.24 bests and was a double state champ as he handed James Sanford (Pasadena) his only 220 loss of the season (20.97w to 21.22w) just 20 minutes after Sanford had run an automatic record 46.60 in the quarter. Sanford, who had a superb 20.80 heat clocking, also sped a 45.5 relay leg and anchored his team to 41.2/3:13.7 bests. Later one of his seven sub-21.2 races took the IPI 220 (20.8) over Wyatt (21.1).

Other top senior sprinters were Marcus Washington (Toulminville, Mobile, Ala) with three 9.4s and a 21.3, Derius Covington (Richmond County, Rockingham, NC) and Madison Miller (Arsenal Tech, Indianapolis) at 9.5/21.0 and Tony Burney (Sanford, Fayetteville, No. Car.) at 9.5/21.1. Brad McDonald (Northwestern, Baltimore) went 21.0 behind Wyatt at Atlanta and then won at the US-USSR Junior meet in 21.26m. Steve Skinner (Jackson, Cambria Heights, NY) also sped 21.0, while Willie Turner (Easton, New Orleans, La) won National Junior Olympics titles at 9.64 and 21.43.

Many of the best sprinters however were underclassmen. Soph Mitchell Bennett (Bonham, Tex) claimed a class record 9.3 behind Williams' 9.2 while two other Texas sophs, Kenneth Jackson (Sherman) at 9.5 and Eference Murphy (Texas, Texarkana) at 21.2, each won a state title. Junior Dwight Jones (Maryvale, Phoenix, Ariz) tripled in 9.65, 21.30 and 46.62m, plus a 45.9 relay carry.

Junior Mike Blaylock (Madison, Dallas) and soph Derald Williams (Wolfson, Jacksonville, Fla) each went 9.4 while Eric Brown (Bethel, Hampton, Va) returns from 9.5/10.4/21.1 clockings. Add in the likes of soph Anthony Polk (Winslow, Ariz) at 21.22, LaNoris Marshall (Dysart, Peoria, Ariz) at 9.5/21.35 and Phillip Epps (Atlanta, Tex) at 21.2(21.1w) and 1978 looks like a vintage year. At least 18 dashmen at 9.5 and 14 at 21.2 return.

440 YARDS

Anthony Tufariello (Hewlett, NY) was undefeated and was probably the nation's best. After an early 46.5 (and a 45.9 relay leg), he took the GWI race (46.8) and set an automatic record of 46.09m with his Junior AAU win. He then ran 46.9m against the USSR Juniors.

The season's best race took place at the IPI where Jeff Walker (North, Akron) ran 46.5 to defeat Sanford (46.7), Antone Blair (Alliance, Ohio) at 46.7 and Walter McCoy (Seabreeze, Daytona Beach, Fla) at 47.3. Walker had a 46.4 best, ran 9.5/20.7 for state titles and his straightaway 20.6 broke Jesse Owens' 44-year-old state record. Blair, also a fine sprinter, had 9.6 and 21.1 (20.9w) bests, while McCoy won the Atlanta Classic (46.9) from the 47.0 for Albertus Horne (Phoebus, Hampton, Va). Later McCoy ran 46.52m and 46.57m at the Junior AAU, and produced two 45.9 relay legs, one a metric carry against the USSR Juniors.

Another triple threat was Ron Williams (Chatsworth, Calif) off his 9.5/21.0/47.01 bests while several state champions were speedy. Arthur Williams (South Oak Cliff, Dallas) ran 47.0, junior Deon Hogan (Kettering, Detroit) clocked 21.2/47.1 bests and Mark Claypool (Kaneland, Maple Park, Ill) and Daryl Patterson (Bethel, Hampton, Va) both ran 47.2.

Besides Arizona's Jones, watch for Michael Cooper (Woodlawn, Baton Rouge) and Bryant Newbill (Strake Jesuit, Houston) off 47.4 efforts and Brad Jackson (Cedar City, Utah) off a 47.6 as five others under 48.0 also return.

880 YARDS

Eight two-lappers ran under 1:51.0 and the IPI race gathered much of this talent together. Canadian Don Heugan took that race with a sizzling 1:48.7 to top Jim Walters (Estancia, Costa Mesa, Calif) at 1:49.7, Dave Ayoub (Central, Peoria, Ill) at 1:50.5, Chuck Aragon (Los Lunas, NM) at 1:50.7 and Erwin Pluys (Columbia, Maplewood, NJ) at 1:50.9. Earlier Ayoub's 1:48.9 state win moved him to third all-time and won from the 1:50.1 for Chris Heroux (Maine North, Des Plaines). Walters topped Dave Kingsland (El Modena, Orange, Calif) at their state meet, 1:49.4 to 1:50.0. In a league meet Walters had also topped Kingsland as they both ran 1:51.3 while Aragon, with four sub-1:52 races, had a fine 1:49.8m at the Junior AAU.

Todd Harbour (Port Isabel, Tex), also a 4:12.6 miler, was undefeated and had three sub-1:52.5 races topped by his fine 1:50.1 GWI win. Tom Martin (Memorial, Evansville, Ind) had two 1:50.9 efforts, one for his state title and the other for the Junior Olympics win. He had a 49.4 opening lap in the latter. Mike White (Richmond, Calif) and Oregon champ John Schaer (Crescent Valley, Corvallis), both with 1:51.8, pace the returnees (4 in 1:52.2-1:52.5 range).

MILE

The mile was very exciting due to matchups among the best. Dirk Lakeman (South, Eugene) and teammate Bill McChesney had two of the top races. Lakeman won them both, first at district when both ran 4:08.6 and then at state (4:06.9 to 4:07.2) with lanky junior Jon Pentland (Ashland) third in 4:08.9. Later, at the Prefontaine Classic, Lakeman sped a 4:04.9.

Mark Stillman (Willow Glen, San Jose) claimed California honors with his 4:06.9 to 4:07.9 state meet win over junior Mark Fricker (Hemet) with Charlie Christensen (Edison, Huntington Beach) at 4:08.5. There was loads of talent there as one state meet heat found a 4:11.8 in 6th place not advancing to the final. Fricker also ran 8:59.3 and 3:49.4 at the Junior AAU, Christensen clocked a 3:50.2 while Stan Ross (Serra, San Mateo, Calif) ran 4:08.2.

Roger Jones (Ramsey, NJ), the Penn Relays champ at 4:09.5, took the GWI race from Kevin Byrne (Catholic, Paramus, NJ) 4:08.1 to 4:09.3 before Byrne ran a fine 3:48.0 at the Junior AAU. The IPI mile was also swift and also won by a Canadian, Andy Zeltkans, at 4:08.5. Tom Rapp (Madison, Trotwood, Ohio) clocked 4:09.1 there ahead of the 4:09.9 for Bob Hicks (Sandburg, Orland Park, Ill). Earlier Hicks took the state title in 4:08.5 from the 4:09.3 for junior teammate Tom Graves.

Besides Graves, Pentland and Fricker, a most notable returnee is 16-year-old Todd McCallister (Deerfield, Ill) off his 4:08.5 Atlanta Classic win and even better 3:48.8 Junior AAU clocking. Other top returnees are Randy Stephens (Woodlawn, Birmingham, Ala) off 1:52.5/4:10.4 efforts and Jon Stormo (Agoura, Calif) at 4:10.2.

STEEPLECHASE

The depth in this event increases yearly as 15 went under 9:40 this season. John Tuttle (Alfred-Almond, Almond, NY), the Penn Relays 2M champ (8:57.2), produced a fine 4:10.6 mile/9:14.5 steeple one-day double and moved himself to sixth all-time. He topped the 9:24.3 for junior John Gregorek (St Anthony's, Smithtown, NY) in that race. Jim Coogan (Chaminade, Mineola, NY) was the most active with three sub-9:27 races,

topped by a 9:21.4.

DISTANCES

The two mile was dominated by underclassmen, making 1978 appear to be a record-breaking year. Junior Alan Scharu (Fitch, Austintown, Ohio) had three sub-8:55 clockings topped by his world age-16 record of 8:45.8. Only four preps have ever run faster. He also took the Atlanta Classic title in 8:52.6 from the 8:57.4 for Chris Fox (Martinsburg, W Va). Fox outran Scharu at the Junior AAU with 13:50.2y/14:21.9m clockings, but Scharu came back to beat Chris and win the Soviet Junior race in 13:57.4y/14:20.1m. Junior Tom Graves took the Illinois title in a fast 8:51.9 to rank second nationally while third was soph Frank Assumma (Eisenhower, Rialto, Calif) with an 8:52.9 to 8:53.4 state meet win over junior Rod Berry (Redwood, Larkspur, Calif). Frank's twin brother Chuck ran 8:55.4 for a section win. The IPI race was also quick as Bill Weidenbach (North, Grosse Pointe, Mich) nipped Brett Hoffman (St Petersburg, Fla) as both clocked 8:53.0 ahead of the 8:55.3 for Tim Holmes (Downey, Modesto, Calif). Hoffman had two other sub-8:55 races and a 4:10.4 while Holmes ran 4:12.2 and 14:00.3y. Six of the 17 under 9:00 will return. Bill McChesney, injured for part of the season, ran 8:57.7 and a fine post-season 14:12.5 5000. Steve Alvarez (Coachella Valley, Coachella, Calif), who earlier had run 8:56.4, won a fine 6M race in 29:10.2 from Rod Berry (29:13.2) with 8:55.4 two-miler Steve Ortiz (Kennedy, Barstow, Calif) next in 29:15.3. Six others ran under 30:00 in that race.

LONG DISTANCE

Junior Clancy Devery (South Salem, Salem, Ore) ran the second marathon of his life and improved the national record by 42 seconds to 2:23:05. Tom O'Neil (Jesus, Carmichael, Calif), whose 9:05.8 2M was like a sprint, moved to fourth all-time with a 2:24:32 and also set a 20M record of 1:49:29. Five other performers ran under 2:33 and two return. As of press time, junior Scott Reid (Stevenson, Wash) had the leading one-hour distance, 11M, 3y.

HIGH-LOW HURDLES

There were a large number of fine hurdlers in 1977, but their abilities received little notice when compared with Mr. Nehemiah.

Mike Holloway (Linden-McKinley, Columbus, Ohio) was closest to Nehemiah with a 13.4 and was undefeated until his 5th (13.8) at the Atlanta Classic. Carl Namons (Franklin, Philadelphia) used his third 13.6 of the season to win that race with Florida champ Eugene Miller (Dunedin) also clocked in 13.6. Andy Walker (Northeast, St Petersburg, Fla), with a 13.6 best, defeated Mike Mosley (Humble, Tex) for the GWI title as both ran 13.8. For the season, Mosley had four 13.6s, including a state title.

George Boutte (New Iberia, La) was very good with 13.6 (13.5w), 24-½ and 11 races under 19.0 led by an 18.5. Randy Brooks (Creighton Prep, Omaha) had 9.5w/13.4w state wins before a 13.6 (2nd) at the IPI behind Nehemiah's 13.1, and then 13.5 and 13.67 for the Junior Olympic title. Junior Phillip Johnson (Gardena, Calif) took state honors with an auto record 13.66, just ahead of 48-½ triple jumper Ken Margerum (Fountain Valley) at 13.78. Arkansas had two 13.7 performers in Keith Butler (Hall, Little Rock) and Barry Brown (Central, Little Rock). Butler's four 13.7s included a state win and third at Atlanta while Brown also clocked an 18.5.

Several performers could move into the 13.2-13.3 range in 1978. Along with Californian Johnson, Sherman Davis (Boca Raton, Fla) and age-16 record-setter Orlando McDaniel (Lake Charles, La) return from 13.5s, Georgia champ Dexter Hawkins (West Fulton, Atlanta) is back from a soph-class record 13.6 plus 3-event state champ Steve Parker (Athens, Ala) at 9.6, 21.2 and 13.6 (13.5w).

McDaniel also sped 18.6, as did Darrell Nettles (Lee, Baton Rouge, La), while state champ Larry Poe (Hall, Little Rock) returns from an 18.8. Around a turn, Garcia Chavis (Grimsley, Greensboro, NC) had the fastest time (19.04) with Willie Majors (Wyandotte, Kansas City, Kans) next at 18.8.

INTERMEDIATE HURDLER

As in the highs, no one ever got near to Nehemiah, but Wyman Daniels (Killian, Miami) and David Washington (Bethel, Hampton, Va) were superb. Both won the state titles in 36.7 and both ran 36.4 at the Atlanta Classic with Daniels just winning. Daniels, who ran 47.0 and 13.8 in side events, then took the GWI race (36.9), while Washington won the IPI (37.0).

The other class hurdler was Paul Lankford (Farmingdale, NY). He clocked 13.5 (13.1w) and 37.5, before running an automatic record 50.87m for the Junior AAU title. He then clicked to a 50.52m win against the USSR Juniors. Those times rank second and fourth on the all-time performances list, and the latter rates as an auto-timed prep record. Texas was well represented as Ricky Thomas (South Park, Beaumont) at 36.8 and 13.81 hurdler Leonard Lewis (Ball, Galveston) at 37.0 each won state titles while Eddie Robinson (Livingston) ran 37.1. Andre Phillips (Silver Creek, San Jose, Calif) went 47.1, 36.43LH and 53.41y, while Ramon Grubbs (Blair, Pasadena) produced 36.48 and 48.7%. Best in Illinois was state champ Tyrone Williams (Lane Tech, Chicago) at 36.3LH. The top returnees are Rourke Lowe (Aloha, Beaverton, Ore), whose 37.05 is a junior class auto record, and Chris Person (Plainfield, NJ) whose 37.1 is the hand-timed class record.

HIGH JUMP

This was the finest event of the season and the greatest high jump season ever. Gail Olson's consistently sensational performances have been documented elsewhere (p. 6), but he had superb backup as 28 cleared 7-feet and another 18 went 6-10% or better. The old record for 7-footers in a season was 11 and the trend will be for even more 7-footers as nine returnees have already cleared that height and at least four more cleared 6-10%. In addition Olson just might reach his goal of 7-6.

Dennis Smith (Santa Monica, Calif) moved to third all-time with his 7-2 state win over the 7-0 for Bill Hice (Oakland) who had gone 7-½ the week before. Hice later cleared 7-2 himself. Smith's two losses were both on misses, one at 7-0 to James Frazier (Fremont, Los Angeles) and once to Rod Smith (Western, Las Vegas) who had six 7-footers topped by a 7-1¼. Undefeated Jeff Woodard (New Albany, Ind) went 7-1¼ and took the IPI at 7-1 from the 7-0 of Mike White (Bartram, Philadelphia). White won the Penn Relays (7-1) over Chris Becton (Bensalem Township, Cornwells Heights, Pa) at 7-0. Mike became the third 7-2 performer and junior Terry Ellis (Pateros, Wash) the fourth in summer action. Those at 7-1 were Larry Meyer (Fremont, Nebr) and Rob Olson (El Camino Real, Woodland Hills, Calif).

Following Olson and Ellis, the top returnees will

be Rick Carey (Nanuet, NY), Greg Thompson (Malverne, NY) and Spencer Sunstrum (Pearce, Richardson, Tex) at 7-¼ and Donald Cuba (Gilmer, Tex), Marc Holland (Willingboro, NJ), Greg Seay (Ryan, Okla) and Manuel Toppins (Rogers, Newport, RI) at all 7-0.

POLE VAULT

Like the high jump, this event also had fine depth as 10 topped 16 feet and 23 scaled 15-6. Randy Hall (Calhoun, Port Lavaca, Tex) moved to second all-time with his 16-10, was over 16-0 nine times and had seven consecutive meets over 16-6. Two of his 16-6s took Atlanta Classic and IPI honors.

California had 12 over 15-1 led by the 16-4¼ for junior Anthony Curran (Crespi, Encino). Curran also had nine meets over 16 feet, seven of them consecutive. Following Curran were GWI champ Jim Sidler (Villa Park) at 16-3¼ and Billy Pierce (Sanger) at 16-1½. Pierce garnered seconds at state and IPI and was second prep at the Junior AAU, all at 15-6. Two other Texans topped 16 feet. Gary Lankford (Taylor) went 16-3 and 16-2, while junior Rick Hayely (Tuloso-Midway, Corpus Christi) cleared 16-1½. Two other fine 16-footers were Brian Shaw (Duncan, Okla) and Ray Crook (Wooster, Reno, Nev). Frank Angelone (Lansing, Kans) moved to 2nd nationally when he went 16-4¼ in a regional Junior Olympic meet over the 16-1¼ of junior Jeff Buckingham (Gardner, Kans), who then took the JO title at 16-0. Besides Curran, Hayley and Buckingham, the top returnees are Oregon champ Steve Crane (Douglas, Portland) at 15-8 and Greg Ernst (El Dorado, Placentia, Calif) at 15-7.

LONG JUMP

Lamont King (Dysart, Peoria, Ariz) began slowly with 9.82, 37.911H and 24-1¼ during the regular season. He then suffered his sole prep loss, 24-7 to 24-8½ to junior Wayne Walker (Pueblo, Tucson) at the Luke-Greenway meet, but rebounded with GWI honors (24-10¼) and was top prep at the Junior AAU (25-5¼). He then won against the Soviet Juniors with a 25-9¼ to move to fifth all-time. Greg Artis (Fike, Wilson, NC) took his state title (24-8), lost at Atlanta 24-6¼ to 24-7 to Theo Manley (Lake Wales, Fla) and then went 24-5 at the Junior AAU. Kurt Durham (Oakland, Calif) spanned 25-¼ at state to just nip soph Donnie Butler (Fremont, Los Angeles) who had a stunning 24-11¼. Durham also had 25-1w and 48-11¼ (49-2w) performances.

Best in the East was Jason Grimes (Overbrook, Philadelphia) at 25-¼ while Todd Bell (Middletown, Ohio) jumped 24-9¼ and then took state (24-6¼) and IPI (24-3) honors. With 11 returning from 23-9 or better leaps, the event should continue its resurgence.

TRIPLE JUMP

Greg Artis led the nation with his 51-5½ state win, bounced 50-11¼ at the Junior AAU, won at

Atlanta (50-1) and then hit 51-2½ in the US-USSR Junior meet. Junior Dokie Williams (El Camino, Oceanside, Calif), with an age-16 record equalling 51-2½, also went 50-6¼ at the Junior AAU and his 51-½ took the state title from the 49-5¼ for Cary Tyler (Washington, Los Angeles). Tyler later covered 50-6¼. Barry Davis (Beaumont, St Louis, Mo) was state (50-7½) and IPI (49-8¾) champ, while Joey Smith (Denbigh, Newport News, Va) went 50-7. Chip Benson (Lutheran, Los Angeles) legally jumped 48-11¼ but then took the National Age Group title with a windy 50-5¼. Behind Williams the top returnees are Sanya Owlabi (Sleepy Hollow, North Tarrytown, NY) off his 51-1 Penn Relays win and a windy 51-11 and Aaron Williams (Wilson, Tacoma, Wash) 50-¾ and a Junior Olympics win (49-3¼). The days of Dave Tucker's 52-6¼ record look numbered.

SHOT PUT

Vince Goldsmith (Mt Tahoma, Tacoma) was in a class by himself. Not one of his 14 meets was below 65-9 and he threw beyond 68 feet nine times topped by two 69-11s which rank him fifth all-time. He took the IPI title at 69-8 and also spun the disc 181-1. Dock Luckie (Central, Ft Pierce, Fla) used this event as a diversion and his 67-9 took the Atlanta title. Ken Lanier (Marion-Franklin, Columbus, Ohio) at 66-5¼ and Frank Warren (Phillips, Birmingham, Ala) at 65-1 (plus a 64-7 GWI win and a 188-6 were both undefeated as was Joe Maciejczyk (Bethel Park, Pa) until he hit a PR 65-0 behind Goldsmith at the IPI.

Texas had fine depth and a possible heir to national recordman Sam Walker. Massive Hosea Taylor (Longview) threw the farthest with a 66-3 regional effort. He needed that to edge the 65-11 for 16-year-old soph Mike Carter (Jefferson, Dallas). Carter took state honors from Taylor, 64-9¼ to 64-1¼, just missed the class discus record with a 181-8 and set class records of 54-8¼ and 153-8 with the big implements. Mike looks like a 70-footer in two years, but his more immediate concern will be 1978 when he faces another 16-year-old, Carlos Scott (Waller, Tex). Scott hit 65-4¼ and 182-3. Nationally, three others return between 62-4 and 62-6.

DISCUS THROW

The impressive throwing of record holder Dock Luckie is detailed elsewhere (see p. 6). The entire event was impressive with a dozen 190-footers and an incredible 51 topping 180 feet. Second nationally was Mark Sutherland (Shawnee Mission South, Overland Park, Kans) with a 202-3 effort which moves him to third all-time. Mark, who also put 64-1¼, was just the tip of the Kansas wheat pile which saw Matt Friedman (Great Bend) rank third nationally with a 198-11 and take second at the IPI, while Jared Finley (Wyandotte, Kansas City) ranked fourth with his 198-9. GWI champ Finley had four meets over 190 feet, was state champ in both shot (63-3) and discus and his 171-6 with the big platter at the Junior AAU moves him to fourth all-time.

Shawnee Mission South had loads of talent as it became the only school to ever have four performers over 180 in both the same season and the same meet. Junior Scott Lofquist moved into a tie for third all-time with Sutherland on the junior class list with his 193-6. His 16-year-old teammate Jim Bell hit 181-8 and 15-year-old frosh Clint Johnson set age and class bests with his 181-1.

David Thomson (Santa Ynez, Calif) had a 194-10 best and a state meet win (190-0) over junior Dave Porath (Atwater) at 189-7. The longest throw in

Texas (192-11) belonged to Hosea Taylor but James Headley (Marshall, San Antonio) took state honors at 191-8. Best of Illinois' two 190-footers was Pat McCulla (Quincy) at 193-3 while Todd Austin (Westminster, Colo) won his state meet at 192-5. Besides Lofquist, Porath and Matt Gauthier (Valhalla, El Cajon, Calif) at 191-2 there are at least 11 others returning over 180 feet. This could make Luckie's record short-lived and 200 feet could take a beating in 1978.

HAMMER THROW

Only four performers topped 190 feet as this event returned to normal with the graduation of record holder Manny Silverio. Bill Borden (Fitch, Groton, Conn) at 193-2 plus 62-1 and Bravell Dodd (Classical, Providence) at 192-10 threw the longest.

JAVELIN

There were 8 220-footers led by the 227-5 for Mike Hartle (Clarion, Pa). Mike had two other meets over 222 feet and competition from junior teammate Kurt Lehnortt at 221-5. Terry Daffin (Catholic, Baton Rouge, La) improved more than 10 feet with his 224-7 GWI win. This topped Todd Lovell (Newberg, Ore), who earlier had a 220-7, and Tom Meyer (Lexington, Mass) who had a 222-11 best. The other 220-footer was Gary Orndoff (Medford, Ore) at 223-1. Besides Lehnortt, four others are returning with 210-plus efforts. The best of these look to be Brian Cullinan (Kennett, Conway, NH) and Gary Barrow (University, Baton Rouge, La) as they went 222-5 and 222-2 at the Junior Olympics.

DECATHLON

Vin Reilly (St Joseph, Metuchen, NJ) became only the third prep to top 7000 points and he did it twice. His 7057' took the AAU Junior title and his 7139 beat the Soviet Juniors. These marks give him the sixth and eighth best performances ever. Keith Collins (Cashmere, Wash) was state champion (6504) and later, using prep weights and hurdles, he took the Junior Olympic title (7178). In all, six performers topped 6000 points and six 5600 pointers return. The tops for 1978 could be Gary Bruner (Indio, Calif) with his age-16 record 6334, or Arizona champion John Irvine (West, Phoenix) off his 5979.

RELAYS

Bethel (Hampton, Va) with a 1:26.0 and Oak Ridge (Orlando, Fla) with a 1:25.9 and seven sub-1:27.0 races, met at the Golden South Invitational to decide the national 880 "title." The result was a 1:25.0 to 1:26.4 win for Bethel and a 0.4 reduction of the 1966 national record set by White Plains (NY). The same meet found Oak Ridge running 41.0 to equal the seasonal best of Texas champ Garland. Three teams, Strake Jesuit (Houston), Woodson (Washington, DC) and Yates (Houston), had tied for the national mile relay lead at 3:13.8 until Pasadena (Calif) ran 3:13.7 at the California state meet. Lake Charles (La) may have a shot at the new 880 record as it twice ran 1:26.4 with two frosh and two juniors.

South (Eugene, Ore) set a national record for the third consecutive season. This time it was a 1.4 second reduction of the distance medley standard to 10:01.6. Columbia (Maplewood, NJ) moved to fourth all-time with a 3:25.3 sprint medley, while East St Louis (Ill) had four sub-7:47 2M races led by its 7:42.9 and 7:42.8 state meet heat and final clockings.□

INTERNATIONAL PREP

Nehemiah The Big Star--Again

Evanston, Ill., June 11—Renaldo Nehemiah, who doesn't seem to perform at anything less than a sensational level, destroyed two excellent prep hurdles fields at the International Prep Invitational. He zipped 13.1 over the highs and then cruised 35.9 over the 330 barriers.

Only his own clockings of 12.9 and 13.0 are faster than that 13.1 and the 35.9 missed his own freshly-set national best by just a tenth. It is the equal-2nd performance in prep history.

Far back in each race, but still with fine clockings, were Randy Brooks (13.6) and David Washington (37.0).

Although overshadowed by Nehemiah, a trio still produced exceptional performances. In the discus, Dock Luckie whipped the plate out to 200-11, his fourth effort beyond 200 feet in 1977.

Luckie had to take a backseat in the shot to Vince Goldsmith, however. Dock placed third (64-10) while Goldsmith armed 69-8—the No. 2 mark of both Goldsmith's career and the '77 season. That mark gave Vince the six-longest marks of the year.

Vaulter Randy Hall topped 16-6 for an easy victory, a foot above his pursuers and the seventh meet in a row in which he has cleared at least 16-6.

One of the meet's most exciting and competitive races turned out to be the 440. Fast-starting Jeff Walker blazed past the 220 at around 21 seconds with 220 winner James Sanford in hot pursuit.

Even though Walker faded in the stretch, he held on for a 46.5 victory, his second-fastest time of the year. Sanford just nipped Antone Blair for second, as both timed 46.7.

Sanford had earlier scored a 20.8 furlong victory ahead of slightly-injured Cyril Wyatt (21.1). Wyatt himself had taken a 9.4 100 win earlier.

All three distance races produced quality finishes. Dave Ayoub sped the first lap of the 880 in 52-flat but was collared in the stretch, first by Canadian Dan Heughan (1:48.7) and then by California champ Jim Walters (1:49.7). Ayoub held on for third (1:50.5).

In the mile, Bob Hicks went out fast and built up a 15-yard lead by the end of the first lap. But his lead was whittled down on each successive circuit by another Canadian as Andy Zeltkans scored a 4:08.5 win. Tom Rapp (4:09.1) nipped Hicks by 0.3 for second.

In the two mile, William Weidenbach just caught Brett Hoffman at the tape as both timed 8:53.0.

ATLANTA CLASSIC

Luckie Flips Prep Record

Atlanta, Ga., June 4—Up until the moment he stepped into the discus circle for his fifth throw at the Atlanta Classic, Florida's massive Dock Luckie (6-3½/232) had a best for the day of "only" 195-6.

But in one quick whip, Dock sailed the prep plate out to 204-7 and Atlanta, growing in quality every year, had its first record. Luckie's big throw topped the national discus mark set last year by Greg Martin (Pascagoula, Miss) and tied by Dock only six weeks earlier.

And Dock wasn't finished, taking the shot in a personal best of 67-9.

High jump sensation Gail Olson met a field of 7-foot preps for the first time this season. He had no problem handling the challenge, outjumping everyone else by 4" even though he cleared "just" 7-0.

Ohio junior Alan Scharus had hoped to take a crack at the national two-mile record. But instead of going out and forging the kind of pace it takes to run an 8:40, he played tag with West Virginian Chris Fox until it was too late. He still emerged as an easy winner, 8:52.6 to 8:57.4, as four others ran between 9:03 and 9:07.

Cyril Wyatt sped a 9.5 100, but was blown away by the 9.3 of diminutive Jesse Williams. It was considered an upset by many, but Williams claimed superb credentials on his own, having run six 9.4s during the season.

Many state champion hurdlers took their lumps from Philadelphia Carl Namons, who came south and ran his second 13.6 in a week. Formerly undefeated Mike Holloway could finish only 5th. A notable 6th at 13.9 went to Dexter Hawkins, only a sophomore.

Randy Hall continued his mastery of the vault with a 16-6 triumph, his sixth consecutive meet over that height.

Good Efforts Despite Wind

Sacramento, Calif., June 11—The same wind which has hampered efforts in the Golden West Invitational for the last couple of years blew into town again this year. But even if times were a bit slower due to the breeze, many event winners won in impressive style nonetheless.

The mile was billed as the top race with season-leader Kevin Byrne entered. But he was shocked by New Jersey neighbor Roger Jones, who turned on the speed 70 yards from home to race to victory in a personal-best 4:08.1, just 0.1 off Byrne's national leader. Kevin slowed to 4:09.3, still an easy second.

In the half mile, Texan Todd Harbour avoided the maniacal 51.0/1:20.0 pace set by Indianan Tom Martin. Instead, Harbour ran a more even pace to emerge as a 1:50.1 victor, lowering his best by more than two seconds. He won by exactly two seconds, as Martin faded to fifth.

Probably the closest race of the meet came in the highs, run into a strong wind. Andy Walker used his quick start to hold off the big closing rush of Mike Mosley, as both clocked 13.8. Mosley also placed second in the long jump, notching a PR 24-3 behind the excellent 24-10½ for Lamont King.

Wide victories were claimed by 330 hurdles winner Willie Daniels (36.9) and 440 victor Anthony Tufariello. Daniels won by a full second, while Tufariello's 10-yard margin gave him a 1.2-second edge.

Tufariello, who also placed third in the 220, was named winner of the Maree Rodebaugh Inspirational Trophy. The award was named after the GWI meet director the past two years and long-time Pacific AAU official, who was killed in a shot putting accident only two weeks earlier. A big ticket drive was held in her memory and an overflow crowd of almost 9000 fans resulted.

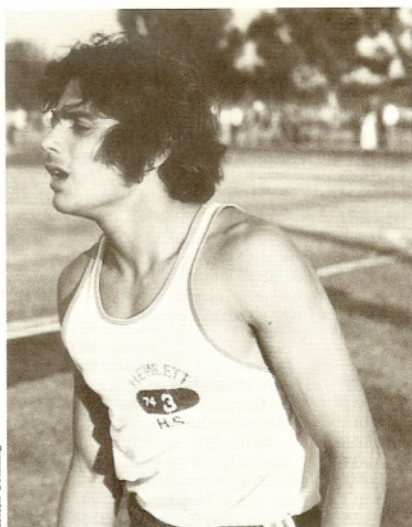

Explaining The Statistics

Eligibility: All U.S. high school athletes (not those from possessions such as Puerto Rico) from freshmen through seniors who competed in recognized competitions may qualify so long as they have not received a diploma from previous attendance in high school and haven't exceeded four years or reached their 20th birthday. Team affiliation is not a prerequisite for the inclusion of an athlete's marks. He need only be a legitimate high school student. Athletes considered ineligible by local rules will be carried if they conform to *T&FN* policies. The indoor and outdoor lists both contain marks from Sept. 1, 1976 to Aug. 31, 1977. Spring graduates remain eligible for the lists until Aug. 31 of their graduating year.

Records: *T&FN's* national high school records do not necessarily concur with those of the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations. The differences are based on five points: 1. While the federation only accepts marks from meets involving at least five teams, *T&FN* will consider those from dual meets; 2. While the Federation limits the season to the actual semester of track, *T&FN* will consider marks from the entire year; 3. While the Federation takes only winning

marks, *T&FN* lists some non-winning ones also; 4. While the Federation lists only marks by athletes from its member schools' *T&FN* considers all preps; and, 5. While the Federation only reviews marks registered in interscholastic competition, *T&FN* will consider marks from any authorized competition.

Indoors, no times made in turn races on oversized tracks (over 220 yards) are accepted. For class records, the frosh limit is 16 years, soph 17, junior 18 and senior 19. The age records represent only the bests made by U.S. high school students.

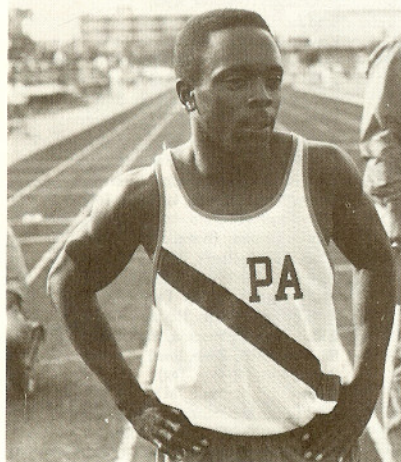
Timing: Although fully-automatic timing has become the standard in sprint races internationally speaking, very few prep races are yet timed in this more-accurate manner. But those which were have been incorporated into the lists (times in 100ths), and calculated their "value" by assigning a conversion factor of either 0.24 (100, 220, 120H) or 0.14 (440 and 440H).

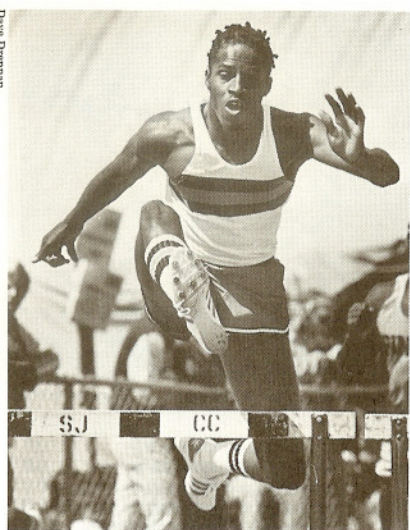

INDOOR ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

Nehemiah Tops Undercover, Too

There were outstanding performances during the 1977 indoor season other than those of Renaldo Nehemiah (Scotch Plains-Fanwood, Scotch Plains, NJ), but one would hardly know it from looking at the records list. Of the season's 11 record performances, Nehemiah accounted for no less than seven. It is little wonder, then, that he was an easy winner of the title of Indoor Athlete of the Year.

If awards were given for record-equaling, Nehemiah would be a candidate for the all-time championship—all seven of his record-performances matched previously-standing marks. Nehemiah used the formidable formula of speed, competitiveness, and consistency to compile his stellar record.

He opened his record-producing season in December by twice running the 4-hurdle 60 highs in 6.9, matching the mark held by Reggie Blackshear. Then, within a two-week span in February and March, he thrice equalled the 5-hurdle 60 record (also 6.9) set last year by Dan Lavitt. In the midst of all this, he was able to tie the 42" records over 60y (7.2) and 55m (7.3). Whew!

Certainly no other hurdler could approach

Nehemiah, and he dominated his event in a way that few have before him. Undeclared by preps and prolific as a record-setter, Renaldo Nehemiah showed himself to be clearly the class of the indoor season.

Lewis' record 7-2 clearance was too little too late to surpass Nehemiah. It was no less notable, though, as Lewis didn't jump until March after a long basketball campaign.

Byrne was the leading miler, with two efforts of 4:08.0. Sutherland led the shot and moved to No. 2 ever indoors with 67-5½. Bell's 24-7½ long jump made him 5th all-time, while Holloway twice tied the 70y highs record.

NEHEMIAH opened his season by twice tying Reggie Blackshear's 4-hurdle 60 highs record of 6.9. He followed by equalling Larry Shipp's 60y and 55m highs records over the big hurdles with respective 7.2 and 7.3 clockings. Then in three separate meets he equalled Dan Lavitt's year-old 60-highs record over 5-hurdles with more 6.9s and produced four 7.0 clockings in addition.

The only hurdler who could get close was Paul Lankford (Farmingdale, NY) with a 7.0 in the Eastern States meet behind one of Renaldo's 6.9s. Mike Holloway (Linden-McKinley, Columbus) joined three other record holders in the 70-highs as he twice ran 8.2.

Dennis Lewis (Ypsilanti, Mich) cleared 7-2 in the high jump at a Detroit age group meet to top the record of 7-1½ set two years ago by Tim Walker and Rudy Reysen. In all, 15 cleared 6-10 and eight of these return. Two of the four 7-footers, Greg Thompson (Malverne, NY) and Marc Holland (Willingsboro, NJ) will return while Dennis Smith (Santa Monica, Calif) previewed his outdoor 7-2 with a 7-0 in his sole indoor appearance. Bill Hice (Oakland, Calif) went 7-0 when rain forced the Junior Olympics event indoors in August.

INDOORS the top sprinters seldom meet, but the best, on consistency alone, was probably Jesse Williams (Princess Anne, Virginia Beach, Va). Virginia had nine sprinters at 6.2 or better and Jesse handled them all quite easily with three 6.0 clockings at the state meet. This included junior Kenneth Foster (Wythe, Richmond) who had 5.4 and 6.0 clockings. Down south, Joe Yelder (Davis, Montgomery, Ala) had a 6.0 state win while Marcus Washington (Toulminville, Mobile, Ala) was quickest over 50y with his 5.2. Out west, junior Mike Carter (Sandia, Albuquerque, NM) had a 6.0 and 6.1 and, along with Foster, leads four 6.1 performers back for 1978.

The Hoosier Relays provided the top 300 race as Madison Miller (Arsenal Tech, Indianapolis) nipped Brian Brase (Brebeuf, Indianapolis) 30.6 to 30.7. The times rank them 2-3 all-time. Ohio had the top 440 talent as Jeff Walker (North, Akron) moved to second all-time with his 48.9 win over the 49.7 for Nate Smith (Kennedy, Cleveland) while Calvin Thomas (Glenville, Cleveland) later ran a 49.4.

Anthony Tufariello (Hewlett, NY) and Joe Toles (Uniondale, NY) had several superb match races. The best of these was the Eastern States 600 where both ran 1:10.6 to rank second all-time. Tufariello took Toles in two other races, 1:11.8 to 1:12.2 and then 1:11.8 to 1:12.0 at their state meet.

Another fine 600 race found Mike Ricks (Menchville, Newport News, Va) winning the Naval Academy title from William Contee (Woodson, Washington, DC) 1:11.6 to 1:11.7. The 880 leader at 1:55.2 was John Tuttle (Alfred-Almond, Almond, NY) who also won his state 1000 title (2:14.2) and his

4:13.2 mile ranked third nationally. Roger Jones (Ramsey, NJ) clocked 1:56.1, and 4:14.4, but his best effort was in winning the Easterns 1000. He ran 2:12.6 there, well ahead of Tony Uzdavines (Williamstown, NJ) at 2:14.0 and junior Vince Mutarelli (Mt St. Michael, Bronx, NY) at 2:14.2.

KEVIN BYRNE (Catholic Paramus, NJ) was easily the top distance star off his two 4:08.0 clockings and an 8:59.7. He led the nation in both events and his mile times rank him fourth all-time. Steve Ferri (O'Connell, Arlington, Va) was next in both events with 4:11.5/9:11.1 efforts. The latter took the Naval Academy race from the 9:06.0 of Cliff Wimer (Solanco, Quarryville, Pa). Just as outdoors, three of the top returnees are Alan Scharus (Fitch, Austintown, Ohio), Rod Berry (Redwood, Larkspur, Calif) and soph Frank Assuma (Eisenhower, Rialto, Calif). All ran between 9:08.2 and 9:09.2.

John Sarros (Bloom Township, Chicago Heights, Ill) led the vaulters with a 15.9 effort, just ahead of the 15-8 for Ray Crook (Wooster, Reno, Nev). Earlier Crook's 15-6 at the Sunkist meet topped three others, all at 15.1. At 15-6 were Jim Stewart (Snider, Ft Wayne, Ind) and decathlete Vin Reilly (St Joseph, Metuchen, NJ), who also produced a 6-10½ effort.

Todd Bell (Middletown, Ohio) moved to fifth all-time in the long jump with a 24-7½ leap and had two other 24-foot meets. Jason Grimes (Overbrook, Philadelphia, Pa) took the Easterns title with 24-2, best ever in the East. Junior Mark Hanson (Topeka, Kans) and teammate Sam Jenkins waited until rain forced a June Junior Olympics meet indoors to reach 24-4¼ and 24-3¼, 6th and 8th all-time.

Junior Sanya Owalabi (Sleepy Hollow, North Tarrytown, NY) led the triple jump at 50-5½ with Joey Smith (Denbigh, Newport News, Va) next at 49-11½. Chip Benson (Lutheran, Los Angeles, Calif) took the Sunkist title from junior Dokie Williams (El Camino, Oceanside) 49-6¼ to 49-1¼, with three others over 48 feet. Another fine returnee off a 49-1 is Louis Martin (Gar-Field, Woodbridge, Va).

MARK SUTHERLAND (Shawnee Mission South, Overland Park, Kans) was the shot leader at 67-5½, moving to second all-time with the third best performance. Vince Goldsmith (Mt Tahoma, Tacoma, Wash) previewed his outdoor efforts with a 66-1¼ in limited action while the most consistent, with three meets over 63-7, was Ken Lanier (Marion-Franklin, Columbus, Ohio) whose best taped 65-¾.

Bethel (Hampton, Va) took the Naval Academy 880 relay 1:30.0 to 1:30.5 for Woodson (Washington, DC), while Franklin (Philadelphia, Pa) took the mile relay there over Woodson, 3:20.2 to 3:21.0. This moves Franklin to fourth all-time. The best, however, was the Easterns race where Boys (Brooklyn, NY) equalled second all-time with its 3:20.1 ahead of Franklin (3:20.6) and Woodson (3:21.2).

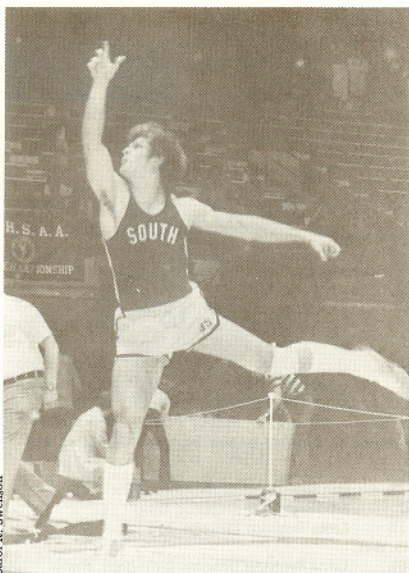

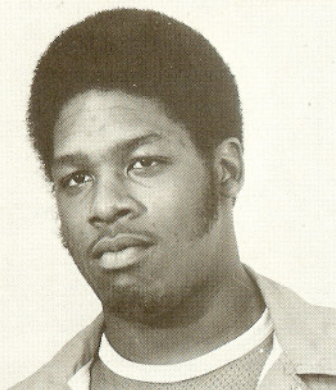

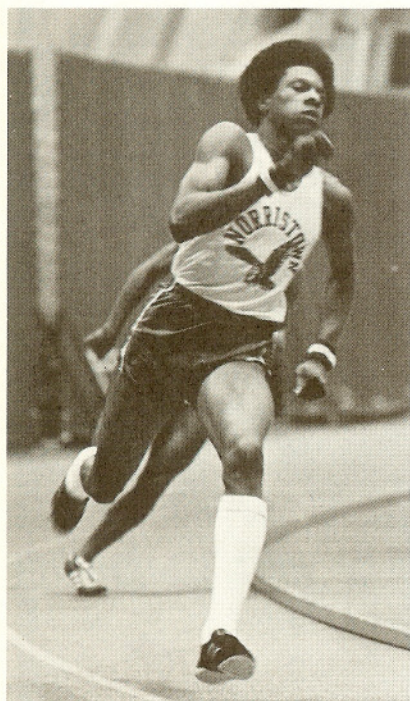

Shea Getting Older And Better

Julie Shea has literally grown up with the sport of women's track.

Shea, *T&FN's* first-ever woman Prep Athlete of the Year, has been making news since way back in 1972, when she ran a 5:01.4 mile-at the age of 12.

Although still only 18, Julie has been competing for a full nine years in the sport, and at the top level almost from the beginning (see progression).

But to win *T&FN's* AOY award for 1977, Julie relied on better racing than ever. A student at Cardinal Gibbons High School in Raleigh, North Carolina, Shea was one of three girls on the high school team, one of whom was her sister. Together, they formed the "Raleigh Rats" club, and with Julie providing the points, fared none too badly in national competition.

Her season started on an auspicious note. At the NC State Meet, she successfully lowered her own prep mile record from 4:48.4 to 4:43.1.

"I wanted to go under 4:50," recalls the soft-spoken Shea, known as "Bugs" to her friends. "I hadn't done any speed work, so I wasn't keying on a certain time. What I hated about it was that the track was like a road, a really hard surface, and there was no curb on it, so I didn't know what to expect."

With the prep record nonchalantly in possession, Julie next tackled the AAU 3000, a distance she likes. Her 9:18.5 in 5th was good enough to qualify her for the U.S. national teams competing against the Italians and Soviets. And that's *senior* teams. Julie did not even compete in the U.S. Junior meet—she's too good.

The Italy meet provided her biggest thrill to date. "I got my best time by 3.5 seconds, and it came as quite a shock," she says seriously. Her 9:15.4 second-place, top finish by an American, was the second-best ever by a prep, and the 5th-fastest ever by an American woman. Julie came back against the Soviets with a creditable 9:19.4, her third-place again the top spot by an American.

"I think the international experience was really good for me," she says, "really helped me to grow. I try to run my own race, because I can't try and control how the other people run, so I try and take control over myself, and I think I learned how to do that better this summer."

"I really enjoyed it, and I learned how to run against the older runners; they run rougher and tougher than we do over here."

Julie will continue to sharpen her elbows next year, when she enters North Carolina State as a freshman. Most probably Shea will continue to coach herself, as she has done so successfully for the last four years, with an occasional assist from her father. And she will also keep the family track club going—if only as a joke—and plans to run in more than just track races.

"I get a thrill out of every race. I really like the Cherry Blossom road race, and the Bonne Bell Mini-Marathon, which I won last year. This year, I didn't run very well" (she placed fourth).

On the track, Julie's favorite distance might be the even longer than the 3000, but competitively, she plans to stick with the 1500 for one very simple reason: "One of my dreams has always been to run in the Olympic Games, and since they don't have anything longer than the 1500, I might have to move down. I would love to run in Moscow."

1977 OUTDOOR REVIEW

There's Quality In Numbers

"Quality from quantity." That pretty much describes the 1977 high school season for women. As more and more women compete at the prep level, the quality of marks improves correspondingly.

And the "more" took a quantum leap in '77: up some 37% to more than 400,000 women participants. Such a broadening of the base can't help but mean that the talent at the top of the pyramid will get better and better.

And so it was in 1977. You have just read about the stellar season compiled by distance whiz Julie Shea, which nabbed Athlete-of-the-Year honors for her. But a strong case could be made for Helene Connell, too.

The senior from Memorial of Jackson, N.J., pulverized the disc record, upping the old mark of 157-7 set in 1973 by Suzie Snider (Waco, Tex)—and not once but six times.

Helene's longest heave came in the qualifying round of the AAU Championships, when she spun the plate 165-5. She placed 7th in the finals (164-9), but came back two days later to take the national Junior crown with a 159-4 heave.

In the US-USSR Junior match, she placed 2nd at 164-4 and threw in a 3rd in the shot (43-8 1/4) for good measure. During the season, her shot best measured 46-10 1/4.

Washington's Patsy Walker really spread her talent around. She rated highly on the yearly lists in the 100 meter hurdles (14.42) and long jump (19-10 1/2) and also appeared in the high jump (5-8 1/4). But it was in the pentathlon where the talented senior from little Yelm was most prominent.

Walker amassed 4103 points in the full international event—which not only gave her the AAU Junior title, but also a new prep record. Her score was higher than the winner of the AAU Senior

title and was almost equal to the old prep record set with "easier" scoring.

Patsy then went on to finish 4th in the US-USSR-Canada international match with 3972 points, the highest finish by an American. The winner of that competition was 1974 European champion Nadyezhda Tkachenko.

A prime example of the season's quantity, and quality, came in the two-mile where no less than 16 women ran faster than the old national best (10:51.6 by New Jersey's Hilary Noden). Washington's Irene Griffith ran fastest with 10:25.4.

Over the 100-meter low hurdles, Kris Costello (Lynbrook, San Jose, Calif) zipped 13.97 to win the California State title and better the 13.9 hand-timed national best set by Iowa's Debbie Esser.

Relay records fell en masse. Four teams bettered the old 440 record of 46.8 (Trimble Tech, Ft. Worth, Tex) led by the 46.14 of California State winner Crawford of San Diego. Second in that race went to Centennial (Compton) in 46.42. Hand-timed efforts which were better than the former mark were turned in by Harrisburg, Pa (46.2) and by Trimble Tech itself (46.3)

In the 880 relay, Northwestern of Miami, Fla. sped 1:39.5 to trim 0.2 from the former mark.

Two teams ducked under Trimble Tech's mile mark of 3:52.4—and the fastest was Trimble itself in winning the Texas State crown with 3:50.2. Locke of Los Angeles took the California title with 3:52.1. In the Texas meet, Trimble had a record day, its 46.3 setting a national mark (but later bettered by Crawford).

In the two-mile, Falmouth, Mass., obliterated its own 9:40.4 record with a 9:11.4 in the AAU Junior championship race. In all, five teams ended up running faster during the year than Falmouth's old record.

Olympic and international veteran Chandra Cheeseborough equaled her own hand-timed 100 yard

record of 10.3, matching the mark she first set in 1976.

The year produced many other outstanding performances, as well. In the 400, both the AAU Senior and Junior titles were claimed by high schoolers.

Sharon Dabney, who never ran during the season for her high school (Bartram, Philadelphia), took the AAU Senior title with a career-best 51.55 to become the 4th-fastest American in history. She later scored international victories versus West Germany and the USSR.

Jennie Gorham (North, Kansas City, Mo) took the AAU Junior race in 52.73, but passed up the dual with the USSR to concentrate on the Junior Olympics—where she won all three sprints.

Cheeseborough finished 3rd in both AAU Senior sprints and ran on the U.S. 400 relay squad which won all three international contests (Italy, West Germany, USSR).

Johanna Forman, a member of Falmouth's record two-mile relay unit, was a national-team alternate and ran as a guest in two meets, finishing 3rd versus Italy in 2:05.6.

In the US-USSR Junior match, several preps performed well. High jump winner Sharon Burrill became the 5th 6-footer in U.S. history with her 6-0 triumph, while teammate Anne Gilliland topped 5-11 in second to become 6th-highest in U.S. history.

Californian Ann Regan (Camden, San Jose) became the second-fastest prep two-lapper ever with her 2:04.4 in second. Linda Goen (North, Bakersfield) finished only 4th in the international, but earlier won the National Junior championship (2:05.4).

1977 Women's Outdoor List

As far as we know, this is the first women's high school list ever published. Our thanks to the compiler, Rich Ede.

It has taken 7&FV years to build up the reporting network which allows us to do such a complete job on the men's lists. With women's high school track still in its infancy, we haven't had nearly the time to ensure such completeness. Class information, for example, was very hard to come by. So bear with us if you find amendments to what we have published. And be sure to pass them along to us.

The only significant difference between these lists and our men's lists is that we do not carry women who did not actually represent their schools in competition. This eliminates such fine performers as Sharon Dabney (Bartram, Philadelphia), the National AAU champ at 51.55.

We have not restricted marks to high school competition alone, however. As with the men, a mark need only have been made in a legitimate competition before Sept. 1.

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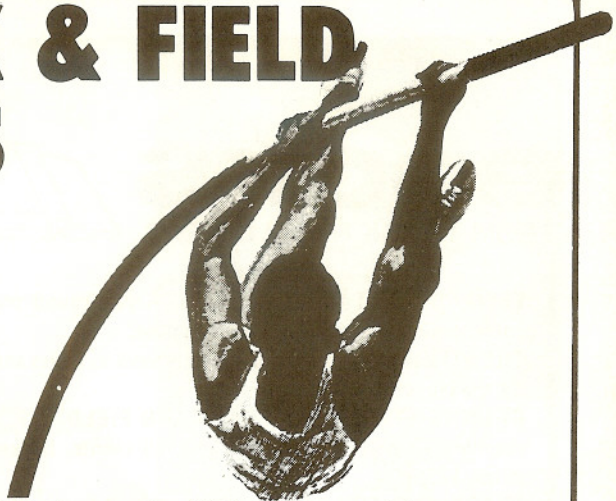
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
