DIGEST DISCLOSURES

San Diego High's 880 relay team ran 1:29.8. The eye opener here is that it was the tenth straight year that Gaveman combo has gone below 1:30.

Tom Porter of Sonora, who seems to be a regular name in this column, has failed to qualify for the State Meet for the second year in a row. Last year, Northern Cal's premier pole vaulter did 14-6 several times and then was held out of the Sac Joaquin Sectionals by his coach for disciplinary reasons. This year he has had a bad knee plus several muscle pulls and the latest injury kept him from qualifying again. He has done 14-11, second in the North to only Wayne Myers of Foothill (Sacramento), who is tops at 15-0 1/2.

Last issue, we told you that 28 Californians had done 6-6 or better in the high jump and that 15 more were between 6-5 and 6-6. Now that list of those over 6-6 has gone up to 31, while "only" 11 boys are between 6-5 and 6-6. Another interesting note is that 13 boys are over 6-8.

Trackmen (and fieldmen too) who are chosen as athletes of the week by the DIGEST will receive parchment certificates through the mail very soon. If we don't send them directly to the athlete's address then we'll send them to the schools involved. So, athletes of the week, be patient!

TRACK(WEEK OF MAY 8)-- Otis Martin(Lincoln, San Diego): A junior who shows a lot of promise, Otis ran 9:17.7 in the San Diego Finals last season but was nervous in the State Meet and did not place. During this week, the wiry Martin clocked a wonderful 9:13.1 in the two mile and held off junior teammate Lloyd Lygar, who has a best of 9:17.9. In the San Diego Finals last week Martin took second behind El Cajon's junior whiz Armando Valencia and Aygar third. At the pole in the first mile, the trio was even and all were given splits of 4:23!..... WILD(MAY 8)-- William Morris(Compton): The second straight high jumper picked for this honor, tall William(6-4) broke the Southern Section record with a 6-10 1/2 leap. Good enough for fifth on the all-time prep list. He indicates that a long list of colleges have offered him scholarships and he is still undecided on his final choice.

TRACK(WEEK OF MAY 15)-- Jim Hill(Edison, Stockton): Jim is one of those rare gems who shines in more than one sport like he's just been polished. During the better part of the spring, Jim pitched for the Edison baseball team and then competed in track without much warming-up. He shocked many observers by 14 when he scooted to clockings of 9.5 and 20.6 which put him near the top of both the state and national sprint lists..... FILLID(MAY 15)-- Wayne Myers(Foothill, Sacramento): Wayne went 14-1 3/4 during bad weather at the Sac Joaquin Sub-Sectionals to top all his competition there in the vault. He has a best of 15-0 1/2 and also runs a 10.0 100 and anchors the Foothill relay squad. Last year, he went 13-5 3/4 early in the season and then came up with a leg injury.

TRACK(MAY 22)-- Armando Valencia(El Cajon): Only a junior, Armando has one of the fastest two mile
