



The Athlete's Kitchen

Shake It or Leave It?

at less sait!!! For years, medical professionals have encouraged us to reduce our sodium intake as a means to prevent hypertension. But what about sweaty athletes who lose more sodium than the average person-should they also reduce their salt intake?

According to an update on the current sodium research (published in Dairy Council Digest, Dec. 1984), not only healthy athletes but also healthy "non-athletes" with NO family history of hypertension can perhaps ease-up on self-imposed salt restriction. Sodium - the part of salt that's considered "the culprit" - may not cause hypertension after all.

Of the 18% of Americans who have high blood pressure, only 10% have a known cause for the problem. The remaining 90% have no exact diagnosis except for a combination of risk factors that includes family history, race, age, obesity, smoking, stress and diet. Although past studies have suggested a correlation between a high salt intake and high blood pressure, there's no proof that healthy people will reduce their incidence of becoming hypertensive if they lower their salt intake. Population studies have failed to show a direct cause-andeffect relationship. Some nationalities with a high salt diet have little or no hypertension, and vice versa. The findings are inconsistent.

If you do have hypertension, restricting your salt intake may help only the 30-50% of you who are salt-sensitive. However, for most people, eating lots of salt did not cause the hypertension - nor will reducing salt Intake prevent it. According to the medical research that has tried to create high blood pressure in people, only massive

amounts of salt -- ten times what you'd normally consume -- may have an effect. Ninety percent of Americans (82% with normal blood pressure and 8% with high levels) can maintain a normal sodium balance despite large intakes. Thus, there seems to be no clear-cut reason for everyone to strictly "shake the habit".

Rather than focussing on salt, we should perhaps pay more attention to our potassium intake. A high potassium diet may more effectively control blood pressure than a low salt diet. According to the American Journal of Clinical Nutrition, a study of 265 Southern Californians showed that the ones who routinely ate a potassium-rich diet (le fruits, vegetables, unprocessed foods) had lower blood pressure than those who tended towards the lower potassium, more highly processed fast foods, snacks and refined grain products ... the conveniently available foods that "fast laners" tend to frequently eat. The people who ate the high potassium diet seemed to benefit from potassium's "protective affect"

Dr. Louis Tobian, chief of the hypertension unit at the University of Minnesota, reports that potassium, in addition to protecting against high blood pressure, helps to make your arteries stronger and better able to withstand blood vessel damage that can occur with aging. He suggests that potassium-rich foods may be more strongly protective of your blood vessels than the sodium in salt is harmful. He recommends that we eat "natural foods" similar to primative man's intake.

To increase the potassium content of your diet, try to eat more fruits, vegetables, whole grain breads, bran cereals, lentils, beans, nuts and protein foods. Have dark breads instead of white; potato more often than rice or noodles or pasta; natural fruit juices instead of imitation fruit drinks or powdered fruit beverages. Focus on the colorful vegetables - tomatoes, broccoll, carrots. "Go bananas" over bananas!

October 21.

Some big invitationals were run this past week-end beginning with the prep Orange County Championships. At that one, boys teams from Villa Park, Foothill, Buena Park and Mission Viejo came away victorious while girls teams from Newport Harbor, Edison, Esparanza and Dana Hills came home #1. At the Los Angeles County Championships at College of the Canyons, it was Saugus, lead by the Stonerock brothers. Crescenta Valley and Cathedral taking boys honors, while Hart, Arcadia, and Maranatha were girls winners. At the Palos Verdes Invitational, Los Gatos won the boys championship while the girls from the host school did likewise. Hawthorne, Alemany, and the Sherman Indians were boys champs at the Alemany Invitational, while Hawthorne, Alemany, and San Gabriel won girls races.

In Community College action, Grossmont and Central Arizona were mens winners at the Mt. SAC Invitational, while LA Valley and Cerritos were womens champions. At the Santa Barbara Invitational the men from Mira Costa ran away from Orange Coast 25-65.

In 4- year college action, at the Wisconsin Invitational, UCLA lead by Jon Butler's 12th place finish, was 5th with 141 points to 46 for the winning Wisconsin Badgers.

October 28.

The big and virtually only meet of the week as far as the preps are concerned was held at Mt. SAC as the Mt. SAC Invitational brought together virtually every top team in the state. The big race of that meet was the boys sweepstakes race which brought together the Mastalir brothers and their Jesuit High teammates from Sacramento against the Stonerock brothers and their Saugus High team. In the individual race it was Eric and Mark Mastalir going 1-2 with Darin and Kirk Stonerock right behind at 3-4. This individual battle also decided the team competition as Jesuit just nipped Saugus 97-98. In the girls competitions, it was Fair Oaks Bella Vista just nipping Mission Viejo 88-91. Rebecca Chamberlain of San Jose's Leigh High was the individual winner.

In 4-year college invitationals, first at Cal Poly Pomona, the host team swept both mens and womens competition 33-76 over the UCLA "B" team and 32-39 over UC Irvine. At the Cal Lutheran Invitational it was Biola over UCSD 56-60.

□ November 4.

The 4-year Colleges held a number of championship meets Saturday beginning with the PCAA meet at UNLV. There UC Irvine coming off a probationary year took

both mens and womens competition 30-52 over New Mexico State, 25-48 over San Diego State.

At the WCAC Meet, it was the Portland men over Santa Clara 26-37 while the USIU women outran Nevada Reno 21-56.

At the PAC West Meet Stanford took a surprisingly close 31-41 decision over runner-up UCLA.

At the NAIA District 3, Pt. Loma's men outdistanced Westmont 39-53, while Azusa-Pacific's women likewise topped Westmont 29-32.

At the SCIAC Meet, Oxy took both divisions 22-55 over Pomona-Pitzer's men and 35-35 tie-breaker over Claremont-Mudd-Scripps.

For those of you following prep track, that quartet of record breaking girls from Muir High who seemed destined to go to UNLV are all at Nebraska. Two of them reportedly had to pull some strings to get out of Letters of Intent at UNLV.

If you think that scholarships are reserved for college athletes only, you should think again. After talking with a couple of parochial school coaches, I've learned that a \$1,000 reduction in school tuition is not uncommon for prospective jocks entering private high schools.

One of the big upsets in the College X-Country scene took place in the Pac-10 Championships at Palo Alto where Stanford was a surprise 60-75-102 winner over Oregon & UCLA. The biggest surprise however was the 4th place finish of Arizona, the nation's #1 ranked team. A similar finish in the Regionals would put the Wildcats out of the Nationals.

At the NCAA Division II Western Regionals, the Cal Poly Pomona men were awesome with a 1-2-3-4 finish en route to a 26-79 win over runner-up CPSLO; while the CPSLO women were likewise runaway 32-77 winners over 2nd place C/S Northridge.

At the SoCal Community College Championships at Citrus, the Grossmont men appeared to regain their SoCal dominance with a 33-109 victory over runner-up Pasadena, while the Mira Costa women just got by the Valley Monarchs 68-79.

At the CIF Southern Section prelims at Mt. SAC, boys teams from Villa Park, Saugus, Valencia and Sherman Indian Institute as well as girls teams from Newport Harbor, Walnut, Nordoff, and Morro Bay established themselves as the teams to beat for divisional championships.

□ November 18.

Lots of major championships were decided over the week-end; so lets start with the NCAA District 8 where the men from

Arizona regained their winning form with a 58-75 victory over UCLA. PAC-10 titlest Stanford grabbed the 3rd and final NCAA qualifying position with 95 points just two points ahead of perennial finalist Oregon. PCAA champ UC Irvine was in 5th with 128 points.

In the womens competition, with only 2 NCAA berths available it was Oregon just edging out a surprising Washington team 63-64, while UCLA grabbed the 3rd place with a 79-79 tie-breaker over UC Berkeley.

In the Division III Western Regionals at Turlock, it was a big day for Oxy, as the men destroyed the field with a 27-69-79 win over Redlands and UC San Diego while the women just outdistanced the College of Notre Dame and Claremont 52-55-69.

In the State Community College Championships at Fresno, it was Grossmont as expected the mens winner with a 41-55 victory over a fast closing Taft team, while L.A. Valley scored its first womens championship ever with an 83-87 win over SoCal champ Mira Costa.

At the Southern Section CIF Championships at Mt. SAC, boys teams from Simi Valley, Saugus, Loyola, and Atascadero won championships while Palos Verdes, Arroyo Grande, Hesperia, and Morro Bay were girls team champions. Fastest times of the day belonged to Darin Stonerock of Saugus at 14:54 and Melissa Sutton of Newbury Park at 17:32.

DAVID MACK

1985 was a year of redemption and vindication for David Mack. After ranking third globally and first nationally in 1983, he appeared to be headed for even greater accomplishments in 1984. With the Olympic Trials and the games themselves scheduled to take place in his hometown of Los Angeles, Mack seemed headed for possible olympic glory.

However 1984 turned out to be a season that Mack, 24, would just as soon forget. After recovering from a stress fracture suffered early in the year he began to experience severe pain in his legs. He would train well one day but then have to take five days to recover. With his training hampered and frequently interrupted he ran at the trials in June in sub-par shape and finished 8th in his quarter-final.

Shortly thereafter Dr. Ronald Baxter of Houston diagnosed Mack's leg problems as compartment syndrome, an affliction which had also threatened the careers of superstars John Walker of New Zealand and Mary Decker-Slaney of the United States. The condition occurs when the leg muscle over-develops and is constricted within it's own sheath. The over-developed muscle presses against nerves, causing excruciating pain. The surgical solution basically involves slitting the sheaths;

which allows the muscle to ease free of it's confinement. Shortly after this was performed in July of 1984 Mack began to train in earnest again.

While many track and field "experts", including this one, expected 1985 to be a rebuilding year for the 5-10, 150 pound Santa Monica Track Club athlete, Mack had the most productive season of his career.

After running in the 1:47-1:48 range in the early part of the U.S. season he was pulled to a 1:44.77 clocking for 4th at the TAC Championships in June.

He then proceeded overseas and reeled off a superb series of times in August, reminiscent of his 1983 European campaign. On August 21st he ran 1:44.57 in Zurich, then a PR-equalling 1:44.39 in Berlin two days later followed by a 1:44.49 effort in Cologne on the 25th. Three days later he lowered his PR to 1:43.35 in Koblenz to thish 3rd behind Joaquin Cruz's season leading 1:42.60. The effort moved Mack to sixth on the all-time world performer list in addition to making him the second fastest American in history.

The confident, soft-spoken Mack reflected candidly on his past, present and future career during this interview in October.

CTRN: You had a very long and productive 1985 season; have you taken any break from training since returning from Europe?

Mack: Yes I have. I took off approximately 2½ weeks after the European season. It wasn't a structured break. I just worked out when I felt like it. I'd usually go out and jog 2-4 miles every third day or so.

CTRN: Did your 1985 performances surprise

Mack: No, I wasn't surprised at all. I don't want it to sound as though I'm not proud or appreciative of my accomplishments because I am. However by the end of the season I was actually a little disappointed because I expected to run faster.

I felt that in 1983 I never reached my potential. The event revolutionized last year and unfortunately I wasn't able to be a part of it. I always felt that my natural progression would have put me in the elite group last year so this year didn't surprise me.

CTRN: How frustrating was it to watch the Olympic Trials 800 final as a spectator?

Mack: It was very disappointing in a certain way. Not because all those guys (Earl Jone-1:43.74, Johnny Gray-1:43.74, John Marshall-1:43.92 and James Robinson-1:43.92) ran that fast but because I wasn't a part of it. I have always admired James Robinson a great deal so I was very happy to see him run that fast.

It was disappointing because you shoot for your short-term goals however your long-term goal is the Olympic Games and the World Championships if you're involved in track and field like I am.

It was pretty sad that the Olympics

themselves were held in my own back yard and there was nothing I could do. Overall I think I handled the situation about as well as anyone could have.

CTRN: When did you first notice the compartment syndrome problems?

Mack: Early on in my college career. In high school I only logged about 18-25 miles a week. In college I increased that figure to 35-40 miles a week and then under Joe Douglas (SMTC Coach) I upped my mileage to 45-65 miles a week.

From what I understand the injury develops over a period of time. It doesn't just happen overnight or even in a season. It's an accumulative type of injury. So I guess in my case it was inevitable.

My first signs of it were in 1981 however it didn't require surgery then. I assumed it

was just shin splints. Actually at the end of the '83 season I experienced the worst pain ever following my last race in Italy. I laid off three weeks following the end of the season and it felt fine until last year. I developed a stress fracture initially and that healed but then the compartment syndrome developed.

CTRN: Can you describe your training? Do you have a summer and winter program?

Mack: Basically what you would call our winter program extends all the way to the end of May. It's structured to develop a good strength base for the summer season in Europe. The European season can last to the middle of September so you've got to have that good base behind you. My winter program basically consists of good quality road work. Every couple of weeks I'll run 15 miles at 5:25-5:45 pace.

As the track season rolls around we'll taper off a little bit but the quality will be better. Whereas before I'd run 15 miles at 5:25-5:45 pace I'll run 9 miles at 5:17-5:25 pace

CTRN: Do you run intervals during the winter?

Mack: Yes we do. But we do it on the roads. We'll frequently run road miles. In a 9 mile run we'll run 5 miles at 4:15-4:25 pace with a half-mile jog between each.

During track season the quantity of the intervals is reduced some but the quality is improved.

CTRN: Do you lift weights to help your running?

Mack: Last year was my first year that I lifted weights and that was due to the fact that I was on a rehabilitation program to help my legs following the surgery.

CTRN: Any upper body lifting?

Mack: Not really. Although I plan to lift some this season.

CTRN: You were on a real hot streak in August; how did the 1:43,35 PR feel?

Mack: Not me. (Shaking his head, laughing) I was getting pulled to those times.

It wasn't as exciting as one would think because of the results. I was actually contemplating going home following that race. I had been over in Europe a long time and I was getting pretty tired towards the end.

The race itself seemed like any other race, probably because I didn't win. I was pleased with the PR however I wasn't pleased with the outcome.

I was uncomfortable with the pace early in the races. They would frequently go out in 49 seconds for the opening 400 and I just didn't have the confidence at that time to stay with the leaders early in the race. I was running some decent times however I wasn't running with the aggressiveness to win any races.

In Koblenz I decided beforehand that I wanted to be a factor in the race and not just a part of it. However I still got left behind early and it wasn't until the last 300 meters that I was able to gain on the leaders. I closed well but I just ran out of track.

CTRN: Following Koblenz you ran two sub-par races in Brussels and Rieti. What happened?

Mack: Basically I was just dog tired and run down. At Brussels I had a sore hamstring and at Rieti I had restrained my ankle beforehand so those races weren't indicative of my talent.

I've never been worried about rankings or I probably wouldn't have run those last two meets. I look at myself as a winner and if I'm not going to be number 1 then there's no sense worrying about whether I'm going to be ranked 6th or 7th. It doesn't make much difference at that point.

CTRN: You won the California State 800 titles in 1978 and 1979. Back then, when you were racing Johnny Gray and Jeff West, did you ever envision yourself becoming one of the world's elite? Had you thought that far into the future?

Mack: In high school I always thought that Jeff West, Johnny Gray and myself would become elite athletes.

But I didn't know the route that I would have to take to get there. I just thought that if you did the hard work and persevered, fast times would be the obvious result. I didn't know all the variables involved; such as injuries, people moving, bad coaches and university programs you didn't agree with. All those things affect your development as an athlete.

As ignorant as my thinking may have been back then, I did honestly believe that we would all become elite athletes.

CTRN: Can you rate some of the world's other leading 800 meter runners? What are your impressions of Joaquim Cruz, Johnny Gray, Sebastian Coe, Steve Cram or Sammy Koskei?

Mack: What do you mean by impres-

CTRN: Strengths and weaknesses.

Mack: In my own personal opinion I believe that Sammy Koskei is the strongest and most durable of those athletes you just named. I think his weakness is a lack of confidence in himself and a lack of knowledge of his own ability and potential. I think he places too much emphasis on other athletes performances.

Of all the people that you just named I fear Sammy the most. I don't fear that he can beat me, because we can all be beaten. But if we're all in a race together where everyone is on; which almost never happens, I feel that no one can beat me except

see the 800 slowing down much. It's still at a raw stage. It's still in a developmental period.

There isn't one person in particular I see dominating the event. I see a few 1:41 clockings next year and possibly even a sub-1:41 race by someone. Within two years I think there's a good chance that the 1:40 barrier will be broken.

CTRN: What type of opening lap is needed to run a world record? Say a 1:40.5?

Mack: Obviously there's many ways to run it. But I've broken it down to the following 200 meter splits. I'd like to go out in 24.0 and then run my second 200 in 25.0. That gives me an opening 400 in 49.0. I then follow that up with a 25.5 to put me at 600 meters in 1:14.5. It's not impossible when you look at it that way.

The key to it is not falling apart. You're slowing down but you're still maintaining. I mean 26.0 is still moving but that's after starting out at 24.0. It won't be easy but I feel that it is possible.

CTRN: In 1983 you were the rabbit for both Sydney Maree and Steve Ovett in their world record 1,500's. Do you have any plans at taking a serious shot at the 1,500's meter and/or mile distance this upcoming season?

Mack: Yes, definitely. It's something I haven't been as courageous about as I have been in the 800. I'm disappointed in myself because I think I should have attacked it way before now.

This season I plan to give an honest effort at the distance. And I've set some pretty high goals for myself.

CTRN: What type of goals?

Mack: I'd like to run at least 3:31 in 1986, minimum. Not my first race out obviously but towards the end of the season. I think I can run at least a 3:49 mile, if not better.

But it's going to take a lot of effort. And it's not so much effort in training but in the race itself because I've done the basework to run 1,500 meters and the mile.

I ran with Sydney and I was very comfortable. I think I could have finished. I'm not saying I could have run a world record but I think I could have run 3:33. And that would have lowered by PR by over 11 seconds.

perhaps Sammy. That's if he runs to his potential.

CTRN: How much faster can the world record get?

Mack: It's hard to say. The only limitation I've ever put on myself is 1:38. That's always been my goal since high school and college.

I think next year will be a fast year. I don't

CTRN: What are your goals for the upcoming season?

Mack: I'd like to win Zurich again, Berlin again, Koblenz and Brussels. Basically I want to win the major European races.

I don't concern myself too much with the American season because I'm usually train-

ing through all my races at that time of year. The European season in July and especially August is what I'm primarily concerned about.

CTRN: What are your long-term career goals? How much longer do you plan on

competing?

Mack: I'd like to run as long as possible. I think that longevity is a quality to be admired as much as a world record or major victory. Mike Boit and James Robinson are two athletes who I admire a great deal

because of their longevity.

Eventually I see myself competing in the 5,000 meters. I've always admired that race. It's not that I'm discontent with the 800 or the mile but in the years ahead you tend to lose some speed but gain strength. The 5,000 would better suit me in the future when I'm older. I have pretty good endurance for an 800 meter runner and I like running long distances so I don't think it would be that hard to make the transition to the longer race.

As far as goals go, I just want to do something really unique and outstanding,

like set the world record. It doesn't really matter to me it it's in the Olympics or at Zurich or Brussels.

I'd like to have an unprecedented season like Coe had in 79 and 81 or like Carl Lewis had last year.

CTRN: What would mean more to you, an Olympic or world championship gold medal or a world record.

Mack: That's a loaded question. (Pausing to think for a moment), First of all I place more emphasis on the World Championships than the Olympic Games. And that's not because I wasn't fortunate enough to make the Olympic team. The Olympics have become too political with all the boycotts. The 1984 games were good but the fact remains that the Eastern-Bloc countries weren't there.

Whereas the World Championships in Helsinki in 1983 and no boycotts and everyone was there. A meet like that is good for the sport. So a world championship gold medal in 1987 would mean a lot to me.

But I don't hold any one thing superior over something else. A medal in the World Championships or a world record or a unprecedented season would be something I could live with. Either one of those would be outstanding to me.

As long as I can say that I did my best I'll be satisfied.

David Anthony Mack was born in Los Angeles, California on May 25, 1961. He graduated from Locke High School in 1979 and attended the university or Oregon for three years. He currently competes for the Santa Monica Track Club.

He and his wife Carla have a one-year-old daughter, Eryn.

His previous list of achievements include the 1978 and 1979 California State high school titles, the 1982 NCAA crown as well as a 6th in the 1980 "Olympic" Trials and a 2nd in the 1983 TAC Championships. He was also a member of the 1983 world championship team.

At the NCAA Div. II Championships at East Stroudsberg, PA., the men from Cal Poly Pomona grabbed 5th place with 154 points while CPSLO was close behind in 7th with 214. On the distaff side, CPSLO continued their dynasty with a 3-7-8-11-12 individual finish and a microscopic team score of 30 ahead of runner-up C/S Northridge with 86.

At Milwaukee at the Division I Champion-

ships, Wisconsin was a double winner taking the mens title 67-104 over Arkansas as well as the womens 58-98 over an lowa State team which had some team members killed in an airplane crash following the meet. UCLA was 12th in the mens meet and a surprising 6th in the womens meet ahead of Washington State and Oregon as Polly Plummer was 4th individually only 9 seconds out of first.

☐ December 2.

Its not often when a 10K race upstages a marathon on the same program, but such was the case at San Diego's Holiday Bowl. In the women's 10K, Zola Budd making her first return to SoCal since the Olympics, ran the entire 10K course escourted by San

Diego distance aces Tom Lux and Bill Cleves in a winning 33:15 as anticipated protests never materialized. In the mens 10K, Thom Hunt of Coronado was leading at the 2-mile mark when the San Diego trolley crossed the course and the leader was made to stop for 20 seconds as 29 followers caught up with Thom. The brief rest seemed just what Steve Scott needed as America's premier miler overtook Thom to win in 29:20.

In the mens marathon, Agapius Masong of Tanzania was the winner in 2:16:58, while Gabriele Anderson-Schiess of Switzerland, best known for her staggering finish in the '84 Olympics, was the women's winner in 2:42:27.

RUNNING CONNECTIONS Part II

"Athletics is basically a case of the blind leading the blind. Whatever you've learned or been taught, reverse it and you'll be nearer to the truth!"

We have to reverse what has been learned or taught in the past gradually adding on more time and distance to those crucial starting distances as we get progressively stronger and fitter with each breakdown adapting to stress conditioning strong primary and secondary tanks, instead of working against ourselves trying to lower the runner's time the old-fashioned way being a slave to a stopwatch training to a printed schedule doing interval training and piling up the mileage. Time in its abstract form is a precious commodity in short supply and we have to use it to our advantage along with distance for running faster times, instead of letting it defeat us like we have done unsuccessfully in the past by not learning how to control pain and stress.

Roger Bannister's historic, first four-minute mile set the standard for conditioning a strong secondary tank in all distances from the 800 meters to ultramarathoning. In all middle and long distances where the breakdown comes into play for balancing the primary and secondary tanks, most distance runners are never pushed to their limits because they never knew how to properly condition a strong secondary tank that would allow them to go beyond their in-

born primary tank.

Herb Elliott's greatest asset for being undefeated in the Mile and 1500 meters was he had an invincible secondary tank no one else in the world could beat holding a hard pace fartleking with ebb and flow tactics over the full distance of the race. Elliott's great secondary tank was the dominant factor that prevailed in his era over all the other milers' strengths and weaknesses. The athlete or distance runner has to be so well coached or trained, like Herb Elliott was in his day, that he is in a class by himself ahead of the rest of the world. "The distance runner should have such a strong secondary tank," Cerutty explained, "it turns the other runners into psychos making them wish they had never been born! It's like running a handicap race, once you get a headstart on the rest of the world with strong primary and secondary tanks, no one can ever catch you no matter how gifted they are or how hard they train leading up to the Olympic final."

The primary tank composed of those crucial starting distances carries the distance runner from the gun to the middle of the race where he instinctively switches over to his pain or secondary tank finishing the last half of the race on the same amount of strength and effort used over the first half of the race.

The young distance runner should build a primary tank in his formative years as early as high school and college first getting in touch with those crucial starting distances he can run at race pace practicing his event, then later on when he is a mature adult, the secondary tank is build-in with numerous breakdowns over the years in the Conditioning Period adapting the athlete to greater stress for holding a hard pace over the full distance of the race setting a new world record.

The formula is training intensively running quality miles initially finding those crucial starting distances the distance runner can easily run at race pace without any real serious training in the very beginning of his career forming the primary tank practicing his event going from there running longer distances enroute, as he gets progressively stronger and fitter with each breakdown conditioning a strong secondary tank that is equal to, or greater than the inborn primary tank, until the full racing distance is mastered for a new world record.

The distance runner has to adopt a new mental attitude reversing much what he thought in the past which only brought marginal success shifting the focus away from the end product when the athlete imagines himself crossing the finish line winning the race or setting a new world record standing up on the dias with a gold medal hanging around his neck with the national anthem playing and the crowd applauding in the background and be realistic coming down to Earth, as it were, concentrating his energies on the beginning laying the proper foundation by getting in touch with those crucial starting distances forming a primary tank practicing his event, then later conditioning a secondary tank. "With the beginning was born the end," said Cerutty.

"First things first, the infant has to learn to crawl before he can walk and run, and the same thing applies to training when the distance runner forms the primary tank with those starting distances he can run at race pace at the beginning of his career, then going from there connecting longer distances enroute building a strong secondary tank with the breakdown that will carry him over the rull distance of the race for a new world record."

The distance runner has to reach out getting in touch with those crucial starting distances, for example 50-55 second quarters for the Mile and 1500 meters, going from there connecting longer distances enroute gradually adding on more time and distance after each breakdown conditioning strong primary and secondary tanks for holding a hard pace from start to finish setting a new world record.

The distance runner conditions the proper neural pattern for any race with those crucial starting distances he can run at race pace forming the primary tank, then moves to a select group of middle distances which represent the halfway point, finally completing the neural pattern puzzle connecting even longer distances enroute adapting to greater stress with each breakdown conditioning a strong secondary tank for the finale or end of the race peaking for a new world record or a gold medal performance at the Olympic Games.

Running Connections answers the question "why does man run?" Percy Cerutty said it the best, "The athlete runs, jumps or throws, because it makes one feel good about self coming alive cleansing all that hatred and venom out of the system making us more kind, loving, understanding and compassionate of all mankind. Feeling good about the self, glad to be alive, unifies the mind, body and spirit for the ultimate performance."

It is the primal instinctive urge from within for survival of the fittest who can run the fastest, jump the highest and throw the farthest that drives the human spirit to conquer the impossible in sport and life, and it is also the journey up the mountain

because it is there waiting to be climbed making life all the more worthwhile for a meaningful existence in the quest for excellence and perfection giving all that is in us for reaching and hopefully surpassing our human potential. "The miler lives more in four minutes running his guts out to complete exhaustion than most people live in a lifetime!" said Cerutty.

The golden rule is to simply go out and run as hard as you can for as long as you can stand it pushing yourself to the limits until you collapse reaching the breakdown, then going directly into active rest letting the endorphins adapt the organism to greater stress for running faster times, so put the organism under the required stress long enough running various distances at race pace and, in time, it will gradually adapt to that stress for setting a new world record. Running comes down to who can stand the most stress running the fastest putting one foot and leg in front of the other holding a hard pace for the longest period of time crossing the finish line first winning the race or setting a new world record.

The athlete or runner must not become a mechanical robot, or what Cerutty called a "zombie" locked in the one running movement when all that dynamic energy can be diffused channeling it into five basic movements and three supplemental gaits breaking up the flow, so the person avoids going off into a tangent falling asleep, frozen and hypnotized in his neural patterns entering a self-imposed dream world or 'sterile cocoon' escaping the pain and stress that naturally comes from running hard and fast when breaking through the pain barrier setting new world records. The distance runner uses his racing tactics varying the gaits, pace and tempo dictating the flow of the race.

Cerutty's running style was designed for maximum lung consumption fully filling the upper and lower lobes of the lungs for running with a longer stride bringing about a radical departure from the old running style. The athlete's mind, body and spirit must be freed and emancipated with the breakdown canceling out the old neural patterns, so the athlete will be open to a variety of motions as possible using different muscle groups for a wider range of movements constantly changing the energy levels over the long run. Instead of running the whole time with just one movement, which according to Cerutty is badly done, we need five basic movements breaking up the flow of kinetic energy that is released through exercise via the neural patterns.

"The athletic world is ready and waiting for a new running style that will usher in a new set of world records in all running events," Cerutty said with a gleam of enthusiasm. "The hopelessness of running with locked elbows which restricts proper breathing when the distance runner should raise his shoulders shortening the neck muscles taking off the sixteen pounds of the square inch of the atmospheric pressure, so the oxygen rushes into the lungs entering the bloodstream going to the working muscles, then expelling the carbon dioxide dropping the forearms down to the side, instead of back and forth as most runners do, bringing about a different running

style that is superior to the ordinary running style characteristic of a highly neurotic society."

Running has made some long strides with the running boom and it still has a long way to go for unlocking man's potential. The athletic world is on the cutting edge of making many new discoveries rendering the past training methods obsolete, those once highly regarded as the way to do it for getting to the very top. We simply cannot train athletes with the methods used in the past and expect to achieve world-class results keeping pace with the world's best athletes. There is always a better way to train breaking the existing world records, but we have to adapt to greater stress chartering unknown territory going where no man has gone before, opening new doors closing the old ones behind us never looking back, as the old gives way to the new advancing athletics and sport for future generations.

The world records in all running, track and field events are steadily improving each year and they will continue to improve, as the youth of the world is getting taller, faster and stronger meeting the supreme challenge every four years at the Olympic Games. Coaches and athletes have found success is more wrapped up in the mind and for this reason the athlete's spiritual nature has to be developed along with the person's mental and physical attributes.

The running boom began in 1977 with Jim Fixx's The Complete Book of Running and ended at the 1984 Los Angeles Olympic Games when the United States failed to win a gold medal in men's distance running. History will record the Los Angeles Games as a financial success for the Los Angeles Olympic Organizing Committee and a major setback for distance running proving the running boom made significant gains for popularizing jogging setting middle and long-distance running back twenty years. The United States with its thousands of gifted athletes is potentially the greatest

athletic nation, but we still have not mastered the art of coaching distance runners which is more than a science developing the mental, physical and spiritual dimensions as it applies to the total person or athlete, because we have over-intellectualized sport to the point with drugs, commercialization, automation and high-tech creating what Hackenschmidt called an unnatural set of compensations that we no longer rely on pure instinct, that sacred quality for greatness highly valued by Cerutty, Hackenschmidt and Newton, for reaching the ultimates or Everests in athletics and sport.

Most will agree it was a blessing in disguise the Soviets and East Germans did not attend the Los Angeles Olympics. Somewhere along the way the United States got sidetracked by the so-called authorities, a classical case of the blind leading the blind, and it is time to make some radical changes revising the system, starting with the Olympic marathon trials, reversing much what has been done in the past regrouping for the 1988 Olympics in Seoul, Korea, if we expect our distance runners to be a threat in future Olympiads.

Percy Cerutty's Stotan training system is divided into three training periods, what he called the three trials to glory, over the course of the training year and the key is to take one step at a time accomplishing what each one of the three training periods were originally intended bringing the athlete to his full potential for a peak performance by the end of the track season.

The athlete is advised not to take any shortcuts combining the training periods together before the secondary tank is built-in with numerous breakdowns over an average of four years during the Conditioning Period. Once the secondary tank is in tact, the distance runner should combine the Conditioning and Race Practice Periods into nine months of solid intensive training conditioning and practicing for his event gearing for the outdoor track season.

Looking briefly at the three training periods, here is the way they are divided up over the course of the athlete's training year.

The Conditioning Period extends over the first six months of the athlete's training year during cross-country and road racing season and is used primarily for the breakdown phase conditioning a strong secondary tank equal to, or greater than the distance runner's inborn primary tank which is composed of those crucial starting distances.

The Practice Period during the indoor track season in winter is used for programming the proper neural patterns rehearsing the event connecting together the various segments or pieces of the puzzle in their proper order from start to finish according to how they will unfold on the day of competition.

In the Competitional Period during track season, the athlete or distance runner reinforces the secondary tank and sharpens the neural patterns conditioned in the last two training periods by doing mini-workouts "Ironing out" the dead spots or 'bad patches' that disrupt the internal flow peaking for a personal best effort by the end of the summer for international competition.

The training year for any athlete in the world who is using this book as a guide training for the Olympic Games is divided up into three training periods: the Conditioning Period (six months), the Practice Period (three months) and the Competitional Period extends over the last three months of the outdoor track season.

If the athlete lives in the northern hemisphere, he would follow this program:

* Conditioning Period (6 months): high school and college-July through December; World Class-September through February.

* Practice Period (3 months): high school and college-January through March; World Class-March through May.

* Competitional Period (3 months): high school and college-April through June; World Class-June through August.

If the athlete lives in the southern hemisphere, where the seasons are reversed, he would use this format:

* Conditioning Period (6 months): high school and college-April through September; World Class-June through November.

* Practice Period (3 months): high school and college-October through December; World Class-December through February.

* Competitional Period (3 months): high

school and college-January through March; World Class-March through May.

The world-class athlete's training year is extended further into the summer months, because they have more track meets competing in Europe, than the high school or college athlete.


The training schedules presented in this book are based on my neural pattern training system and should only be used as a guide helping the coach and athlete plan a sound training program enabling the person to adapt to stress in his own unique way performing to his full potential.

Percy Cerutty taught the athlete how to control pain and stress releasing the endorphins in the brain inspiring the distance runner to train intensively reaching the breakdown stage, then instinctively backing off going directly into active rest when the endorphins are released into the bloodstream adapting the organism to greater stress loads and pain tolerances for running faster times setting new world records.

The key is mastering the inner self knowing how each person adapts to stress in his or her own special way which is different from anyone else in the world, so put the human organism under the required stress long enough and, in time given the right amount of patience and persistence, it will gradually adapt to stress when the pitultary and endocrine glands release beta endorphins building up immunities to the thing that tried unsuccessfully to defeat it in the first place.

Leading up to serious competition when the athlete gets excited or stimulated by the pure act of running, jumping or throwing, this emotional reaction psyches up the athlete releasing endorphins gearing for the impossible performance that borders on the uftimate or Everest in athletics and sport for setting a new world record. When the pain and stress becomes too unbearable, the athlete compensates when the soul leaves the body producing an "outof-the-body" experience many feel when they get near the breaking point reaching or surpassing their full optimal potential.


"The coach and athlete has to realize the body is strengthened with a natural diet and training intensively with the breakdown causing endorphins to be released adapting the organism to greater stress for setting new world records," said Cerutty. "The mind is strengthened by building selfconfidence becoming independent in your own personality resting entirely in yourself without letting anything weigh you down from reaching, what should be, your full optimal potential. A creative, intelligent mind thrives on variation and change in all things and is destroyed by too much routine and regimentation, as nature hates orthodoxy! I do really seriously think we just have to take another good look at all these athletic techniques of running, jumping and throwing, along with learning how to healthfully survive and the intelligent ones will do so with the objective of athletic supremecy. The world is wide open for what we have to teach setting the future world records, so give me a higher mountain to climb!"





MYSTERY RUNNER AT STANFORD INVIT.

On October 7th at the Stanford Invitational a young man, who gave his name as Riivk Huntsman of Palo Alto High School, attracted a lot of attention for his outstanding running. He led at the mile point and was still leading at the finish of the large school race. He finished to the left of the chute. He was allowed to run unattached in the race, because he was not eligible to run officially.

He told authorities at Palo Alto High School that he was 16-years-old and that he had come from a commune in Nevada.

It now turns out that his story was not true. He actually is James Arthur Hogue, a 26-year-old who ran cross country for the University of Wyoming and attempted to run for the University of Texas.

He enrolled in September as Jay Mitchell Huntsman. He was using the name and birthdate of a San Diego child who died as an Infant.

it has not been determined why Hogue attempted this scam.

The natural question that comes with the successes of the Jesuit of Sacramento team this season is where do they rank all-time among California squads. In doing a little thinking and researching it appears they are right up there among the top couple who have ever stepped on a course in the Golden State. Lompoc High School, with an amazing group in the early 1970's, might be the only one that could be considered better. Led by the very tough Terry Williams, the 1972 Lompoc group raced to a still standing National 5-man 10-mile relay record of 46:20.9 on

the Track in mid-October of the season. Williams led with 8:58.4, Alvin Gilmore clocked 9:15, Jim Schankel 9:17, Jim Wars rick (current Lompoc Coach) 9:20, Tony Nunez 9:29, and sixth man Jim Galbraith clocked 9:37. Pretty awesc ne for the middle of the Cross Country season. That same squad dominated the Team Sweepstakes Race in the Mt. SAC Invitational, scoring 33 points and having a team time that was a minute and a half ahead of anyone else during the day (this was in the days of two mile courses). The Lompoc athletes took 6 of the too 11 places in that Sweepstakes run and had 6 of the top 19 times from the entire day at Mt. SAC in 1972. In the Section Prelims the Lompoc squad scored 24 points, and in the Section 4A Finals they placed 1-5-6-8-10 in scoring 26 (individuals displaced) points to defeat the State's largest Section's Large School divisions finalists all by themselves. CIF Northern California Championships Sierra College, Rocklin, Dec. 5-

19:32

Overcast skies and a rain-soaked course failed to dampen the competition at the Eighth Annual Northern California CIF Cross Country Championships held on Sierra College's (Rocklin) scenic three-mile course. Extensive efforts by officials prior to the race to drain ponded water from some of the muddler portions of the route, allowed the race to remain on the regular course. Despite the less-thanperfect conditions, Gunderson's Laurie Chapman cut almost six seconds off the course and meet records with an outstanding 16:47.8 to maintain her undefeated season. Senior Rebecca Chamberlain (Leigh, San Jose), the defending champion and former course record holder, attempted to stay with Chapman through the first mile, covered in 5:13.1, but the Gunderson senior was too strong pulling away to an impressive 48 second victory. The Central Coast Section dominated the girls' individual placings with the top seven finishers coming from the southern part of the Bay Area, in-cluding senior Shannon Clark (Mt. View) who finished second in this race the last three years and third this year. In the team competition, senior Monica Daley (Los Gatos) led her teammates to their se-cond consecutive championship, the first double winner in meet history. The young team of Monica Daley, sophomore Darcy Parker, freshmen twins Sara and

Stephanie Hartman, and freshman Jen-nifer Jocelyn scored an extremely low 61 points, with Leland (San Jose) edging out Bella Vista (Fair Oaks) for second place

105 points to 108 points.

With the results of all the section qualifying meets in hand, it appeared that Jesuit (Carmichael) seniors Eric and mark Mastalir would once again be racing each other for championship honors. A twoweek bout with knee tendonitis prevented Eric, the course record holder at 14:28.1, from competing in the race thwarting his opportunity for the individual championship and Jesuit's chance for the team championship. Other top qualifiers included undefeated North Coast Section champion, senior Chris Hoepker (Encinal, Alameda), senior Adam McAboy (Miramonte, Orinda), the North Coast Section runnerup; senior Scott LaForce (Los Gatos), an impressive victor in the Central Coast Section; senior Mike Wall (Lassen, Susanville), the Northern Section champion; and Central Section standouts junior Jason Lienau (Clovis) and Jesse Llanes (McLane, Fresno) and David Naranjo (Sanger). McLane's Jesse Lianes was the early leader posting 4:28.2 for the first mile followed by a large pack led by Mark Mastalir close behind. Mastalir quickly made up the distance extending his lead with a 9:34.3 two mile and finishing with a personal record 14:40.5, lowering his previous mark for the number four individual and performance in course history. Adam McAboy (Miramonte, Orinda) finished a strong second in 14:52.3 with Vallejo junior Mason Myers the top underclassman in third with a 14:55.3. Individually this was one of the fastest races in Northern California meet history with four runners under the 15:00 barrier and the top eight breaking 15:15.0.

The team race was to be a battle of the State's best (parochial school or otherwise) matching Jesuit (Carmichael), the Sac Joaquin Section champion; Bellar-mine (San Jose), the Central Coast Section champion; Bishop Moreau (Hayward), champions of the North Coast

Section; and Lassen (Susanville), the Northern Section champion and defending Northern California and State Champions. With the tight finishing group of senior Mark Callon (19th), sophomore lan Champeny (25th), junior Rob Meinhardt (27th), sophomore Torre Pena 32nd), and junior Scott Robinson (57th), Bellarmine captured its first-ever Northern California Championship edging Moreau by five points, 85 to 91. Lassen, hampered by the loss of number two runner Tom Estes to Injury, finished third with 133 points.

Individually, Daren (9:08.65 3200 meters) and Kirk (9:16 3200 meters) Stonerock from Saugus, the Mastalir twins, Eric (9:03.31 3200 meters) and Mark (4:13.65 1500 meters), along with Paul Thomas (9:27 12 3200 meters) from Jesuit, Mason Myers (Vallejo-4:21 as a soph and the Stanford winner), San Diego's best in Robbie Lopes (Monte Vista), would all hook up in the race. Daren is notorious for taking the pace out, which he did here. A pack of six fried to tag along through the mile (both Stonerocks, both Mastalirs, Jim Zimmer of Simi Valley and Jason Lienau of Clovis). Daren led through one mile on the flat at 4:43. Going up the steep switchbacks after the mile point both Mastalirs edged ahead of the group. with Eric steadily pulling away as the front group came off that challenging loop and headed towards a steep 80 yard grade called "poop-out" hill just prior to 2 miles. Looking very strong, Eric clocked 12:35 at the top of the last "reservoir" hill and cruised on in at 14:38. Meanwhile, Mark also edged away from the Stonerock duo, recording a 14:57 for 2nd, with Daren 15:04 and Kirk 15:08. The 14:38 is a slightly good clocking, about a 4:55 per mile pace on a course 64 yards short of three miles over some monster hills The 14:38 is #2 on the all-time course list behind Jeff Nelson's 14:32 CR Jeff still holds the National Two Mile Record outdoors. Eric is ahead of people like Eric Reynolds, national Kinney champ a few years back from Camarillo, and a flock of other flyers. Mark's 14:57 is equal to number eight all-time. In the race, Mason Myers (Vallejo) probably ran the strongest last mile and a half to get up for 5th in 15:11 (an excellent junior time), with Thomas coming in as Jesuit's 3rd runner in 6th at 15:19. Jesuit added 16:05 and 16:58 clockings to record a 77:57 team time to take down the 78:08 Course Record set way back in 1977 by a Helix from San Diego squad. Saugus was a close second point-wise (97-98) and also had an excellent team time of 78:59 (#7 All-Time). This race is very amazing. The course has got to be at least 15 seconds slower per mile due to the hills, so you can conservatively subtract 45 seconds to compare to a flat three mile. A 16:15 (worth 15:30 on the flat) will get you 30th place, a 16:45 (worth 16:00 on the flat) will get you 50th place. A real salute must go out to Walt Lange and his outstanding Jesuit crew.

The men's individual sweeps race featured strong San Diego High junior Marc Davis, who ran 9:19.0 for 3200 meters last year as a soph, who led a pack through the mile at 4:48, then pulled away to a 14:58 win. Mark Dani (Valhalla, San Diego) ran a strong last mile to finish 2nd in a fine 15:00.

Rebecca Chamberlain (Leigh. San Jose) was the State 3200 meter champ at 10:23.85 and was 2nd last year in the Kinney National Cross Country Championships. Her appearance here in the Individual Sweeps was one awaited by many. Southern Californians Tracey

Williams (Mountain View, El Monte), Darcy Arreola (Grossmont), and a flock of others would hope to challenge the northerner. Heather Scobie (Saugus) took the pace out hard through a 2:34 first half mile, with a pack of teammate Amy Reiter, Williams, and Arreola. Chamberlain sat back fully 20 yards at that point and was still a ways back through a 5:30 mile, where Tracey Williams had overtaken the Saugus frosh star, Scobie. Up the switchbacks Chamberlain put on a move unlike any ever seen around here to come off the top of the four tiered hill with a 50 yard lead. Needless to say the race was over at that point, as the San Jose star powered farther away while the group struggled over the top. By the end Rebecca had a 150 yard lead and recorded an excellent 17:45 (#7 All-Time). Williams was 2nd in 18:17,

with Arreola 3rd at 18:19.

4A Women

This was a very interesting year in this division. Newport Harbor, the defending champions with most of the key players back, was felt to be easily the state's best until a shocking midseason defeat by Palos Verdes at the kenny Staub Invita-tional at La Crescenta Park. The Staub course features some poor footing and enough ups and downs to duplicate timewise Mt. SAC, where the Section Finals would be held, so things became interesting. Newport featured the super duo of Buffy Rabbitt and Maggie Henson, while PV was a pack-running group. A number of top individuals also graced this division. Melissa Sutton was the defending champion from Newbury Park. with she and Christy Farrell (Thousand Oaks) both qualifiers for the National Kinney Cross Country Championships last fall. Sheri Smith (Woodbridge, Irvine), Suzette Basore (Pasadena), and Michelle Lewis (Buena, Ventura) could also run with anyone around.

In the Prelims Heats Newport blasted a 95:45 team time heat victory that put them far ahead of the pack. Palos Verdes appeared to be under control in a 98:19 ef-

In the finals Palos Verdes, under Coaches Joe Kelly and Rod Flager, put together a perfect peak, featuring a 33 se cond 1-5 gap between 18:56 and 19:29 and an average of about a 31 second improvement for each of those runners from the week before to surprisingly easily handle Newport 69 (95:44) to 94 (95:45). The PV time is the #8 All-Time on the course. Shockingly, a Thousand Oaks squad put together a super finals race to also slip in ahead of Harbor with 75 points (95:24 #5 AT). Christy Farrell's 18:12 for 3rd was backed up by close to a 40 second improvement per runner by runner by numbers two through five. TO would have taken it all if Jenny Bessel had ever been able to get back to last year's form (18:36) after early season Il-Iness problems-as it was she ended up the team's 5th this year at 19:52. Newbury Park, TO's Maramonte League-mates also put together a super Finals effort recording 95:47 (100 points) for 4th.

Individually the 4A Women's featured the slowest first mile of all four divisional runs-5:35. At that point Melissa Sutton (Newbury Park) really went to work. After blasting the switchbacks during the second mile the Panther junior steadily pulled away to a fine 17:32 win (#6 AT here). Rabbitt did her job for Newport with an 18:06 for 2nd, with Farrell (TO) 3rd in 18:12.

4A Men Simi Valley had been ranked number one all season long and had performed in many, many meets at a very high quality. Villa Park, the #2 ranked team was quite a ways back, and Simi had handled Goach Dave White's group easily in the Esperanza Invitational and in the heat of the Mt. SAC team sweepstakes run (Simi 80:24-VP 82:14).

Villa Park has fallen victim to some bad breaks down through the years and their prelims effort showed that they were determined to put it together this goround. Their 79:59 heat victory surprisingly brought them in ahead of Simi, which recorded 80:20 in another heat, with improving Mission Viejo 80:49 the winners of the third heat.

In the Finals Simi put together another super run, putting four in before VP's third runner and winning 47 (79:50 #14 All-Time Team Time)-70 (80:22). Mission Viejo was 3rd (113-81:24) in front of young Palos Verdes (139-82:04) and Dana Hills (145-82:24) squads.

Individually, Glendale junior Richard Erbes, the latest distance star coached by former Olympian John Barnes, was the favorite after a controlled 15:29 Prelims heat. Erbes had run 15:22 in the Mt.SAC Invite here. David Moore of Orange, that county's best, tried to break away from Erbes from 2 to 21/2 miles, but Erbes finished very strong, looking like he had a lot of run left in his 15:20 victory over Moore (15:36) and Mark Lindrud (Mission Viejo) (15:37), Jim Zimmer led the Simi crew with 4th at 15:42, and Jose Alcaraz (Santa Ana Valley) put together a good Finals race for 5th at 15:43.

Arroyo Grande, coached by Greg DeNike, was the defending champions, with that team returning basically intact They were ranked #1 all season long, with midseason challenge by Lompoc threatening their eminence for a time. AG was easily the division's fastest in the Mt. SAC Invite at 98:44. In the Finals competition they held true to their form with a controlled, strong team effort for 82 points (98:17). Coach Al Britt of Esperanza, last year's runner-ups, had to go a bit

of a different route, and he and his girls showed real patience in pulling the sick and injured together for a fine Finals effort to repeat as 2nd placers with 112 (101:03).

Individually, there were a number of strong runners here. Lisa Rizzo (Hart, Newhall) was the defending champion and was running like ahouse afire this season. Super frosh runners Heather Scobie (Saugus) and Sandra Acosta (Walnut) were running very strongly. AG's Sharon Plante had run 18:19 here last

Scobie went out like a rocket in the Finals, coming by the mile at 5:25. Surprisingly, during the tough second mile Acosta edged closest. Heading up and over the final Reservoir hill the super frosh duo battled back and forth for the lead with an intensity few can muster so late on a challenging course. Scoble appeared to have it wrapped up, until Sandra mounted a determined 100 yard rush at the finish to edge in ahead of the Saugus flash, with both given the same 18:14 time. Acosta's time is especially amazing, with something over a minute of improvement on this course in the last month. Plante was 3rd in 18:36, with Charmine McIntyre (Wilson, Hacienda Heights) 4th at 18:47. Last year Charmine was a high placer for Bishop High in the IA division. Rizzo finished 5th to cap a brilliant prep cross country career. 3A Men

Saugus, coached by Steve Spraker, was another squad that had the collar of a #1 ranking all year long hung around their neck. This was a team that could certainly handle the pressure, though, as they survived one bad break after another all season long to emerge as among the state's top couple of teams and only suffer defeat once, to Jesuit of Sacramento (by one point) in the Mt. SAC Team Sweepstakes run. With an interesting (Golden League) schedule with three-way duals a couple of Saturdays during the season, Saugus was free to run a number of Invitationals-which they did in picking up six titles in those meets. There were a number of other fine teams in this division. Young Buena Park and La Habra squads battled all year long in the Freeway League, with LH taking the League title away from BP for the first time in a decade. Torrance, coached by Gerald Holland, and Arroyo (El Monte) guided by Tim O'Rourke, two of Southern California's most respected mentors, were also fine groups. Hart (Newhall) also returned a top team. Individually, Daren and Kirk Stonerock of Saugus, Section 1600 meter champ (4:14.68m) Raul Serratos (Moreno Valley), and defending divi-sional champion, Aaron Mascorro (Rosemead), a 15:20 heat winner, are all very respected runners.
In the Finals Saugus once again ran

and hid from everyone, riding Daren (14:54) and Kirk's (15:24) 1-2 and some solid backup to a 47 point total and 78:36 team time. The team time takes down Barstow's 1983 Sectional best of 78:39, and marks this year's Saugus group as among the best two or three squads in Southern Section history. Torrance, peaking as usual in fine style, edged Arroyo for 2nd 115 (81;36)-121 (81:42), with Hart losing 3rd on the 6th runner rule, also hav

ing 121 (81:39).

Individually, Daren Stonerock came to run. After a 4:43 first mile he had no company, with Mascorro, usually able to come up with a super peak in this Meet, never able to make a dent in Stonerock's huge lead. At the top of Reservoir Hill (21/2 miles) Daren was the same time as Eric Mastalir in his 14:38 earlier from the season, but during the last half mile the slight Saugus star tired noticeably to finish in 14:54. The 14:54 is the 6th fastest ever here, putting Coach Spraker's star in some pretty select company.

2A Women

Hesperia, a sleeping desert giant as a school that started with very little notice, but has grown to 1800 students exploded

in the midseason to enjoy some big Invitational successes. The Scorpions were easily the division's fastest in the Mt. SAC Invite, with a fine 101:10 team time victory in their race. Mountain View (El Monte) was the defending champion, and with the returning 1-2 individual finishers, Tracey and Lisa Williams, it appeared they should be easy winners again, but they could not seem to get it together during the season. Nordhoff (Ojai), last year's runner-ups, was again strong. Temple City's Amy Dabul, a 10:42 3200 type in Track was hoped to give Tracey a run for the individual title.

Hesperia cruised to a 3rd in their heat, and then came out in the Finals to put together a strong performance that was unbeatable this day. Nicole Houle (3rd-18:40) and Robbyn Bryant (4th-18:41), along with Barbara Beydler, who did not run in the Prelims, but was 13th in the Finals at 20:16 helped the team to 82 points (100:35 team time). Nordhoff put together a fine race for 92 points (100:35).

Individually, Tracey Williams was gone through a 5:15 mile and nobody ever came close as she breezed to a 17:37 win (#7 All-Time here). Dabul sat too far back to threaten for the title, and finished 2nd in a fine 18:13.

2A Men

Loyola (Los Angeles), the defending titlests and ranked number one all season long, was by far the division's fastest off its 82:00 in the Mt. SAC invite. Loyola looked very controlled in the Prelims and raced 83:27 in a heat win. A Valencia group coming on strong recorded 83:05 in another race victory.

In the finals the senior dominated Loyola group, led by the 3rd of Mike McCracken (15:40), 4th of Joseph Brink (15:40), and 9th of John Sloan (18:12), cruised to a fine 81:07 and 69 point total. Valencia pushed Loyola all the way, led by the fine individual win of Chris Lugo. Lugo had started the season very strongly, then had a midseason of mediocre performances. Here Chris put together an excellent last mile in moving past a number of people on the way to a fine 15:34 win. Junior Tom Campbell (Lompoc) ran a strong race for 2nd at 15:36 ahead of McCracken and Brink of Loyola. Favored David Schumacher (St.Anthony, Long Beach) was 5th.

1A Women

The Los Padres League has dominated this division for the last few years. Because of a cockeyed League rule they can only send two teams on to the Section competition. In a comedy of tragedies the defending Section champs, Atascadero, #1 ranked all of 1985, never got out of the League. After a dog-eat-dog League competition where Atascadero ended up tied for second the League has another screwy rule that states if you were the last team of those tied to go onto the Section competition you get to stay at home. So "by-by" to the division's number one ranked team that had everyone back from the 1984 titlests. Like we said, "There ain't no sure thing." The people who think up rules in that League we have our doubts about.

Anyway, Morro Bay and Cabrillo (Lompoc) headed south to chew up the competition. In the Prelims they had easily the top times, 108:56 for MB, 107:49 for Cabrillo. A number of fine individuals grace this division. Azusa's Roberta Moronez led the prelims at 18:55, with Los Pedres individual champion Evelyn Martino (St. Joseph, Santa Maria) 19:15, Wendy Logsdon (St.Monica, Santa Monica) 5:09 1600m and 19:17, and the defending champion, Carrie Barber (Atascadero) 18:53 from last year.

In the Finals Morro Bay put together a good run and totaled 71 points (106:23) to win. Coach Ken Cronquist brought his Maranatha squad around in fine style and they surprised with a second place 79 points (106:22). Cabrillo was 3rd at 93 (107:17).

Individually, Logsdon put together a very strong race to hold a consistent lead over Martino and Barber to win 18:57-19:08-19:15.

1A Man

It was a foregone conclusion that Sherman Indian (Riverside) would take its third consecutive title (and 4th in the last 5 years) with a big peak here. It was a typical Sherman season with some excellent team races, and others that were not so good, but the Indians have an uncanny ability to put it together in the Finals. But they do run the race for a reason, and those are people out there running, so reality occasionally strikes.

In the Prelims heat winners were close--Sherman 84:57, Atascadero 85:06, and Cathedral 85:03.

This year it was someone else's turn for the big peak-Atascadero had its 3-4-5 runners improve 20-84 seconds to turn in an 84:03 team time and 66 points to edge Sherman (72-85:11). Coach Mark Anderson had some solid returnees, but the work and improvement of the remainder of the top five must be saluted. Sam

Richards (5th-16:24), Todd Everett (6th-16:29), Mark Alexander (11th-16:45), and Matt Huckaby (15th-16:46) led the Greyhounds to victory: Sherman continued its tradition probably equal to any, in the entire United States with their second place.

Individually, John Trefecanty (Cathedral, LA), a junior, handled fellow junior Bret Kimple (Carpenteria) 15:48-16:00 in a rerun of their earlier Mt.





Bud Light USTS

September 28, Hilton Head Island, S.C.

Twenty-five-year-old Scott Molina of Del Mar, CA - the man they call "The Terminator" - topped the best field ever assembled in the sport of triathion to win the Bud Light USTS. It was Molina's third national cham-

plonship title and his sixth consecutive win on the 1985 Bud Light USTS circuit, a series of short-course triathions all measuring 1.5 kilometers (.9 miles) on the bike, and 10 kilometers (6.2 miles) on the

Molina worked hard for this win, starting out in ninth place after the swim in ocean water that was so choppy and rough "it was like swimming in a washing machine," said one competitor. A strong

wind and current off the Island were responsible for the rough water - not hurricane Gloria which fortunately swung far north of the Carolinas.

Djan Madruga, 26, of Brazil, was the tirst swimmer out of the water in 23 minutes and one second. A bronze medalist at the 1980 Olympics in Moscow, Madruga maintained the lead throughout the bike, swooping into the transition area more than three minutes ahead of Molina.

On a run course that included a short stretch on beach sand, then a sprint across the fairway of the Palmetto Dunes championship golf course, Molina ran a quick 32:59 10K to snatch first place from Madrugs in the last mile of the run. His finish time: 1:57:16. Madruga's second place time was 1:57:48. Mark Allen of Del Mar, Calif., three-time winner of the Nice (France) Triathlon, took third at 1:57:52 and former Ironman champ Scott Tinley of Encinitas, Calif., finished in 2 hours flat for fourth place. Harold Robinson of Ithica, New York, took fifth at 2:00:59.

In the women's race 28-year-old Linda Buchanan dominated a field that contained at least a dozen women with potential to snatch the Championship: the Puntous and Girard twins, defending champion Beth Mitchell, Joanne Ernst, Gaylene Clews of Australia, AT&T points leader Juli Brening, Julie Olsen, former world record holder Allison Roe of New Zealand, and Joy Hansen.

Buchanan was second out of the water by only 12 seconds and quickly took control of the race out on the bike course. Now living in Leucadia, Calif., just north of San Diego, Buchanan spent years training in Davis, Calif., where the roads run fast and flat - perfect training for the Hilton Head course where pure speed paid off. Head down and working hard, Buchanan gained three and a haif minutes on Juli Brening of Kirkland, Wash., who was in second place at the start of the run.

Buchanan finished at 2:07:42 to take the top prize money; her new training partner Sylviane Puntous took second place at 2:09:43. Joy Hansen of Dei Mar, Calif., took third at 2:10:41 and Sylviane's identical twin sister Patricia finished fourth at 2:11:01. Beth Mitchell, the 1984 National Champ, held on for fifth at 2:13:08.

Coronado Bridge 10K

October 6. San Diego.

About 6,000 road racers, walkers and race walkers competed Sunday, Oct. 6 in the sixth annual Coronado Bridge 10K Race and Two Mile Walk/Run that benefits the San Diego Chapter of the Leukemia Society of America, Inc. Leading the way across the finish line was Ralph Serna, 28, of Anaheim, whose time was 30:40. Although the U.C. Irvine gradute has run faster 10Ks, Serna said he was pleased with his performance. His personal best for the 10K is 28:55. But Sunday's competition was fought on uphill terrain and Serna said the initial climb up the bridge slowed him considerably.

Serna just edged out another Orange County runner. Jon Konigh of Irvine took second place with his time of 30:48. Last year, Konigh placed seventh in the 5K at the National Track Championships, And he qualified in the 5,000-meters at the 1984 Olympic trials with a time of 13:47.

The third place winner was Ron Cornell of San Pedro. Cornell's time was 31:06.

The first woman to win the race was Ngaire Drake, 36, of Wellington, New Zealand. Her time for the 6,2 mile run was 36:37. Drake has also won two marathons this year-one in Japan and one in New Zealand. She said she plans to compete in the New York marathon later this

Following Drake was Marilyn Nichols with a time of 37:59 and Kathleen Kinane with a time of 39:34.

These races were held on a clear and sunny morning with temperatures around 50 degrees at the 9:00 a.m. start and reaching close to 70 by afternoon. The temperatures along the out and back courses on the Avenue of the Glants were generally cooler due to the shading of the surrounding redwood trees. Altogether 752 runners competed this day; 264 finishing the full marathon and 488 the half. Surprisingly, 40% of the runners entered in the half marathon were women; perhaps a record for a nonwomen's only event.

The winner of the marathon in a time of 2:26:20 was 46 year old Jim Bowers of Santa Rosa. He lead throughout and finished over 7 minutes ahead of second place finisher Mike Holt of Arcata (2:33:56). Jim has always run well at Humboldt finishing second last year, and he also holds the course record of 2:22:17 set in 1980. The winning female was first time marathoner Audrey Kemp, 28, of Cupertino in a time of 2:56:23. Audrey also won by the same margin of over 7 minutes over second place finisher Darlene Wallach, 34, of San Jose

After taking the lead early, Ray Webb, 24, of Arcata went on to easily win the half marathon in a fine time of 1:08:27, just over 3 minutes ahead of the nearest competition, Patrick McGuire, 25, of Reno. For the second year in a row, Luanne Park, 25, of Chico not only won the women's half, but set a new course record; this time lowering her mark to

Modesto 10K

October 27. Modesto.

Arturo Barrios, on the verge of becom-ing a world class 10K runner, and a sure bet to be a member of the 1988 Mexico Olympic Team, defeated a very talented and strong 10K field in the Modesto 10K.

Barrios, the 23 year old Southwest Conference 5K and 10K 1984 and 1985 Cham-pion and current senior at Texas A&M, had one of his toughest challenges to date, competing against several sub-29 minute runners and strong international talent, including pre-race favorite and 2 time defending champion course record holder (28:55) Danny Grimes, Grimes, who was ranked 16th in the nation in 1984, also set the fastest Northern California 10K time by an American in this race last year, and was just coming off a 2:14 marathon 3 weeks prior to the Modesto race. In defeat, Grimes, one of the speakers at Saturday night's Runners' Dinner Forum, was gracious, but vowed he would not run a marathon prior to the 1986 Modesto 10K.

On hand at this highly touted race were former San Jose State star and former winner of the San Jose Mercury News 10K, Simon Kilili; Kevin Jones, a sub-30 runner and assistant cross country coach at Cal-Poly SLO; Rich McCandless, a 29:12 runner from Los Gatos; Jeffrey Adkins from Martinez with a best of 29:39: Steve Venable from South Lake Tahoe with a best of 29:27 and recent winner of the Hoy's Sports 10K in San Francisco; Matt Gary from Carmichael with a 29:43 PR; Lynn Mentzer from Reno with a 29:40 PR; Casey Reinking with a 29:58 PR from Santa Clara; Jeff Shaver from San Jose with a 29:42 PR; and Steve Strangio from Fremont with a 29:50 PR.

The race also featured two national XC college powerhouses, Cal Poly SLO, currently ranked 2nd in the United States, and the University of Nevada Reno. Both schools sent full contingents.

Defending 10K women's champion, Sharlet Gilbert from Richmond, was back to fending off her challengers Shella Raiston from Cyn Country, Sandy Coffey from Yuba City, and Patti Scott-Baler

Then, somewhere between five and six miles, the lead exchanged, and Sal took it. They came into the final 150 yards, and Les put on a surge. At the very last moment, Sal saw this skinny Londoner there. Sal nudged him out."

In the previous week's Modesto 10K race, Roberts, visiting from Britain, waxed Vasquez, taking first in the master's division. "I've just spent two weeks here (in the U.S.)," said Roberts. "I've had the fantastic fortnight of my whole life," he commented after his narrow defeat in Sunnyvale. Among Roberts' notable wins is the World Masters Track and Field Championship in the 5,000 meter event in Rome this summer.

Vasquez, who lives in Alameda, is a two-time winner of the Mill Valley Dipsea. His credits include winning The Athletic Congress National Championship for Masters in the 10K and 15K events.

Lasse Viren Finnish Invit.

What an amazing race this is. For one thing, it's cross country, which most people don't really like. For another, it's iong-20 kilometers, twice as long as the more popular 10K. Then, the site is so isolated that it's a long way to get to even when you live in the neighborhood. And if that weren't enough to do it in, there is also the problem of money. Like, there ain't none.

Yet, year-after-year this race not only perseveres it actually flourishes Sculptor-runner-coach Eino, who in artistic tradition likes to go by his first name only, is the driving force. Finnish-born and bred, he drums up considerable support from the Finnish commercial community in the form of great merchandise awards. In addition, he is on friendly terms with enough elite runners to be able to spike up his field every year with several of them. The roster of runners who have run on the Sycamore Canyon course reads like a who's who of long distance running. Lasse Viren himself has appeared twice. Adrian Royle, Jon Sinclair, Grete Waitz, Marty Cooksey-this doesn't even scratch the surface. Of course, it gets tougher every year as the top runners become more expensive. Yet, even this year, the field was outstanding. Mark Anderson from Boulder, a two-time U.S. cross country team member was there. Gary Tuttle, a former winner and 3 times runner-up was back to give it another try. A pair of Canadian Olympians, Art Boileau and Gordon Christie, were on hand. And the worldfamous mountain goat, Chuck Smead. And several top locals including Ron Ysais, Jerry Alexander and Brian Russell.

A good field for anyone's money. An impossible for NO money. The women's field wasn't quite as strong, but it was pretty good, especially considering that it was all local talent. Judith Vivian, Beth Milewski and Mary Tracey, all sub-35 10K runners, led the women's entries. As a matter of fact, anyone who couldn't break minutes in the 10K wasn't even welcome in this 10 a.m. event. There was an earlier race, starting at 8 o'clock for the less capable and ambitious. Tuttle's girlfriend was the first woman finisher in that one, so Gary may have been thinking he was a favorable omen.

That she did. Hitting the hill with more momentum than Tracey, who had made

In all, this by-invitation-only race drew only about 60 folks compared to close to 300 for the open race. But, as we said, they were good ones. Gary Tuttle knows this course about as well as anyone and he didn't waste any time showing it. Jumping off quickly, he soon had a 15-yard lead. Mark Anderson was the only one who really went after him Racing over dirt trails, crossing dry washes and gullies. Tuttle led the leaders through the first mile in about 4:29 or so with Anderson maybe 10 yards back. At that point, they began to pull away from the rest of the lead pack. They were already ahead. but now they were breaking contact. Going through the numerous gullies that crossed their path. Anderson noticed that he would pick up a few yards on those short downs and ups. Tuttle would then get some of it back but, drawing on his cross country strength. Anderson kept gaining and by 4 miles had caught up and edged into the lead. At that point, Ander-son wasn't "making a move", he admitted later. Just running his race, trying to stay loose and keeping up just a little bit of pressure. In fact, from there on til about the 9 mile mark. Anderson put on enough pressure to put the race in his pocket. At 6 miles, the course goes on to a black-top road and a few yards later, well, maybe 200 yards, it hits the only hill on the course. A cross country course with only one hill and with a paved road yet. Trouble is, it's a mean piece of hill. The race director swears it's only a quarter mile of rise. The runners, including Anderson (and yours truly, who has run it once in a workout), are just as certain that it's a half mile. At least

The truth is probably in between. But it is one hell of a quad buster

Just what Anderson, the cross country man, wanted. Going up, he was told by a spectator that he had about 200 yards on Tuttle. A couple of miles later, having come off the Q.B. (quad buster) and made a near 180 degree turn to head back towards the finish. Anderson could see for himself that he had done what he had to do: shaken loose from Tuttle. He was off the pavement now and, to some extent, feeling more at home, minus the Colorado snow, and he cruised in breathing a little easier but keeping up enough pressure just in case... He crossed the

Tuttle came across a minute later with a ho-hum-second-again look. Well, taking second in this race, even 3 years in a row especially three years in a row, isn't something to be ashamed of, I mean, the next two guys after Tuttle were Olympians. And the four guys after that are all sub-30 10Kers, or close enough to not make it worth arguing about. So, Tuttle's seconds haven't been so bad. He's chased in top quality every year.

Smead and Ysais had tough luck. As

with Tuttle, they know the course well But Smead had "one of those days" and Ysals had caught the flu earlier in the week. Smead tried to go with the leaders but gave it up. Ysais caught up with him and commented, "We look like s...." Smead agreed. They wound up finishing together, each looking like he was pacing his brother-in-law.

Judi Vivian was the winner of the women's division. Recently returned from a European honeymoon, she admitted that she wasn't in her best shape. She watched Mary Tracey take off ahead and put a few yards of daylight between them. Vivian felt the early pace was too fast, but she was counting upon her distance strength to save the day. Up to about 5 Tracey was showing the way. then Vivian's strength began to tell By six miles, she had a slight lead. There's an aid station there and Vivian decided not to slop. Tracey did, grabbing some water. Vivian wanted to but she knew that, "...I had to get her somewhere ... so I

her pit stop just a short way back, she pulled away. She built up enough of a lead to win by almost a minute in 1:16:43 and passing the water stop turned out to be a wise decision. Coming through the last mile, Vivian was very tired and admitted to not being up to fighting off a challenge then. She didn't have to, fortunately, Fortunately, because Tracey look ed as though she was still holding up pretty well. Third place Beth Milewski looked as wiped out as Vivian. Oh well, nobody's in top shape this time of the year, unless you're going to the TAC Cross Country Nationals.

Still, as usual out here, it was a good race-men's, women's and even master's












