Davenport, Tracy Smith, Miller Feature AAU

New York, N.Y., June 25-26--Willie Davenport set a meet and tied the collegiate record of 13.3 in the high hurdles, Jim Ryun ran a 52.6 last 440 to give New York its first outdoor sub-four-minute mile and Pat Traynor ran an 8:40.6 steeplechase for another meet record--all in the 1966 AAU championships on a Randalls Island cinder track in probably the best shape of its long life. Meet records were also set by Art Walker in the triple jump and Ron Laird in the two-mile walk, and tied in the 440, the high jump and the pole vault.

It was like old times at the AAU. Instead of the handful of NCAA athletes who braved official displeasure to run last year, college athletes were entered in droves as 62 out of the 100 scorers at Bloomington, plus many more who had missed out there and were looking for another chance.

Performances were uniformly good right through the program, averaging 972 points on the Portuguese tables, with a high of 1016 for Bob Seagren's 17-foot pole vault and a low of 936 for Traynor's steeplechase, which nonetheless makes him the third fastest American behind George Young and Jeff Fishback. And the marks undoubtedly would have been even better in the middle and long distances if the emphasis hadn't been on finishing in the top two or three to make the national team for the Russian and Polish dual meets.

In the 100, Charlie Greene had to use his "Super-Satellite Gear" (that's what he calls it) to overtake James Hines in the last 15 yards. UCLA frosh Harold Busby was a close third as the first two were caught in 9.4 into a slight wind. Greene skipped the 220, which looked like a good idea as Hines opened up a four-yard lead in the straight and held off Adolph Plummer's closing rush to win in 20.5, Plummer getting the same time. Tom Jones finished third. The time was called wind-aided, but Hines' coach, Stan Wright, felt an error might have been made in the wind reading, and if the decision is reversed, Hines and Plummer will get a piece of the meet record. Of his 100 race, Greene said, "With a heat, semi-final and a final all in one day, it seemed I was warming up every half hour or so." Missing, of course, from both sprints was Tommie Smith, injured in the NCAA.

The 440 figured to be a three man race, and it was most of the way. Lee Evans ran 46.5 in his heat, then tied the meet record with a 45.8 semi that saw Ron Freeman II eliminated in 46.2. Right behind Evans was Dave Crook with his second 45.9 of the year, and recovered from the virus that slowed him in the NCAA. Theron Lewis won the other semi in 46.3 from easier opposition. In the final, Crook went out fairly fast, while Lewis keyed on Jim Kemp as he had in the NAIA. Lewis caught up to Crook at about the 220 and held the lead around the curve and into the straight. Evans, who had planned to catch Lewis at the 330 mark, began his drive going into the turn and seemed to be flying, but he was still some three yards back when they straightened out for home. So he just dug in harder and made up the difference and more, winning by three yards in 45.9. Lewis could find no answer as his shoulders tightened up, and he was almost nailed at the tape by the onrushing Bob Frey, with Crook fading to fifth behind Vince Matthews. Evans is unbeaten in the quarter this year.

The 880 was exciting right from the start of the first heat, which saw Tom Farrell and Ted Nelson run 1:47.7 and 1:47.8 to eliminate Dave Perry (1:48.2), Charlie Christmas (1:48.4), Dave Fishback (1:48.7) and Ricky Urbina (1:48.8). In other heats, non-qualifiers included Frank Tomeo (1:48.5), Wade Bell (1:48.9) and Jim Metcalf (1:48.9). Strong men wept. In the final, George Hunt set a speedy pace, with John Perry right behind him and everyone else up close. Hunt passed the quarter in 52.1 and kept the lead as the others jockeyed for position down the backstretch, Nelson moving up to third on the outside and Farrell trapped in a box in fifth place. Then Farrell found some room going into the last turn and shot into the lead. Nelson moved with him but never could regain the four yards down the long straight, while Dave Patrick and Peter Scott roared up to take third and fourth seven yards further back. Farrell's 1:47.6 was a personal best for 880-yards, his converted 1:46.6 800-meters at Tokyo

is faster.

Tom, who is getting married July 2, said, "I felt real strong today, much better than in the trials, when I was sick for 45 minutes after the race. I was worried about being boxed, but got out of it just in time. I plan to miss the Polish meet because of my honeymoon, but I do want to run against the Russians." He added that he feels he can run "at least this fast" every time out from now on.

In the mile, Ryun followed Richard Romo through a 63.8 first quarter, and pulled nearly alongside at the half in 2:05.9, with Dyrrol Burleson, Tim Danielson and Jim Grelle in close attendance. The pace picked up, with Ryun, Burly and Grelle all running 60.1 for the third lap, and they kept accelerating as Ryun moved in front on the backstretch. But still nobody was sprinting. Then, suddenly, somebody was. It was Ryun, who spurted into a huge lead starting 180 yards from the tape. The 6'2", Kansas 19-year-old kept pouring it on to finish 12 yards in front with a 3:58.6. His last 440 was split in 52.6, surely one of the most devastating last quarters ever unleashed in a mile race. To give you an idea, Burleson's last quarter was a sizzling 53.8--faster than any of his up to this race--yet he lost 10 yards, finishing second in 4:00.0 to Grelle's 4:00.6 for third.

Tracy Smith came within two-feet of an exceptional double win at three- and six-miles. In the three, four runners--Smith, George ("the steeplechase is for peasants") Young, Tom Laris and Van Nelson--ran as a group almost the entire race. Laris tried a kick with a 220 to go but Young and Smith passed him easily coming out of the turn and staged a desperate struggle to the tape. Young got there first by two feet as both clocked 13:27.4, good time in the 87-degree, muggy New York weather.

Tow-headed Tracy came back the next day in somewhat cooler weather to win the six-mile big--by exactly 220 yards from Billy Mills--in 28:02.0. Smith broke away from Mills and Oscar Moore after three-miles and kept widening his lead to the end. A notable fifth was taken by Spokane high schooler Rick Riley with a 29:11.4 effort. Another former Spokane prep star, Gerry Lindgren, was withdrawn from the race on doctor's orders with viral bronchitis.

The steeplechase saw the culmination of a great comeback year by 1963 champion Pat Traynor. Prevented by illness from doing his best in the 1964 AAU and Olympic trials, Traynor virtually quit in 1965. But early this year he resumed his masochistic hobby, and from the looks of it spent some time on hurdling practice, too. Traynor stayed up close as Mike Manley set the early pace, but fell back to third when Ray Barrus took over and started to push it. At the gun, Barrus led Manley by 15 yards and Traynor was another 15 in arrears. Traynor made it all up in the next 220, going on to win from Barrus by more than 20 yards in 8:40.6, best time by an American since 1964. Behind him, Barrus and Manley were rewarded for their pace-making efforts with 8:43.4 and 8:47.6 respectively, and Bob Price surprised with an 8:53.6 for fourth.

Both hurdles races were humdingers. Davenport opened up a yard lead on Don Shy by the fourth barrier of the highs, and held two feet of it to the tape for his collegiate record equalling 13.3, with Shy getting 13.4 and Earl McCullough 13.7. NCAA champ Ron Copeland ran 14.2 in his semi and was shut out. In the intermediates, Jim Miller, who usually goes out fast and then fades, went out fast and kept going. The result was his best ever, a sparkling 50.1 and the title. Behind him, Geoff Vanderstock and Bob Steele finished well to run 50.2 and 50.3 for second and third, while favored Ron Whitney closed fastest of all but couldn't make up enough of the yards he had given away.

All the jumps except the triple were closely contested. In the vault, Bob Seagren cleared 17'0" on his final try to win from Paul Wilson and John Pennel at 16'8". Only four others, Mel Hein, Dick Railsback, Jeff Chase and Peter Chen, could clear 16-feet as a headwind made the vaulting tricky. "I wasn't vaulting well," Seagren said, "But I'm happy to win." Wilson took only two vaults before attempting 17-feet, clearing 16'0" and 16'8" and passing 15'0", 15'6" and 16'4". Soon somebody may pass all the way up to 17.

The high jump had seven men over 6'10", four over 7'0" and three over 7'1". Stan Albright was the first, Western-rolling over on his third attempt, inspiring Otis Burrell and John Hartfield to clear

it, too. At 7'2", though, Burrell was the only one to clear, again proving himself to be the best in America. Hartfield took second by virtue of a pass at 6'6", and John Dobroth was fourth at 7'0".

In the long jump, Ralph Boston won his sixth straight championship, although it took a comparison of second-best jumps to make him the winner. The world record holder's 26'3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " was equalled by Charlie Mays, but Boston's 26'2" spare beat Mays' 25'9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Darrell Horn took third with 25'9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", as the jumpers faced the same wind that harried the vaulters.

Art Walker had the triple jump all to himself. After fouling his first two jumps he qualified with 50'9 $\frac{1}{4}$ ", then went 53'0" on his fourth and a meet record 53'8" on his fifth. Horn was nearly a yard behind in second at 50'11 $\frac{3}{4}$ ".

In the shot put, Neal Steinhauer caught Randy Matson on an off-day, and the tall Texas barely squeaked through to win by 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " over the hefty Oregonian, 64'2 $\frac{3}{4}$ " to 64'1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Parry O'Brien, who first won this meet as a Southern Cal soph in 1951 with a put of 55'9 $\frac{1}{4}$ ", was third in 62'1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Defender John McGrath was seventh at 59'5 $\frac{3}{4}$ ".

Al Oerter overcame stiff challenges from Matson and Rink Babka to win his sixth AAU discus crown. Oerter and Matson led the trials with 190'4", but Babka spun his fourth try 191'2" to grab the lead. Then Oerter, who must be as good a clutch performer as any sport has ever seen, threw 193'9" in the fifth round to go back into first. Matson improved to 190'9" on his final try and Babka essayed 189'6", so Oerter was home free. The wind was behind the throwers, and the final three rounds were delayed 15 minutes to suit the live TV schedule, neither of which proved very helpful. Jon Cole, a 199'5" man, finished eleventh with 171'10".

In the hammer, Ed Burke led after two rounds with a throw of 216'10", but Hal Connolly took the lead on his third try with 219'0". Tom Gage posed a threat with a new personal best of 215'2" on his fourth throw, but nothing more happened until the next-to-last attempt of the competition, when Burke fired one 220'0". Connolly, unruffled by an eager announcer giving Burke's mark as he started to turn ("I didn't hear a thing"), came close-but-no-cigar with a reply of 218'9". Connolly, now 34 and "still learning", is experimenting with a new wind-up he got from Gyula Zsivotzky. For Burke, his first AAU title was another milestone in his steady progress since his sophomore year at San Jose State (1960) when he threw 161'7" in the NCAA meet. George Frenn, who threw 120'1" the same year in the AAU, was fourth at 199'5"; he is still recovering from a broken small bone in his right ankle and 16 weeks in a cast.

The Southern California Striders won the team title with 122 points to 69 for the Pasadena AA, with the host New York AC and the 49ers tied for third with 56 each. Although not perfect, this was the best-run AAU meet of the seven this writer has seen.
