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Ray Dashes Legit 9.3, 20.9 Sprints

Athens, O., April 14-15--Clarence Ray of Kentucky State proved today that his illegal 9.2 last week was some indication of his ability as he took the 100 in a convincing 9.3 and the 220 turn in 20.9 to highlight the eighth annual Ohio U Relays. Ray defeated strong fields after poor starts in both races.

In other highlights, Ohio U soph Emmett Taylor won the 440 in 46.7, Sam Bair of Kent State zipped away with the mile in 4:06.3 and Aaron Hopkins of Toledo took the triple jump at 49'9".

Texas Southern Cuts Loose 39.6 Effort

Grambling, La., April 15--Texas Southern "put everything together," as coach Stan Wright described it, and joined Southern U as co-holder of the 39.6 world 440 relay record. Though not pointing for such speed here, TSU's mark came in the traditionally fast Grambling Relays.

Bobby Evans, Clyde Duncan, Lee Smith and Jim Hines executed their baton passes to perfection as they blazed a lap on the fast track. While only matching Southern's world and American marks, Texas Southern probably will be given the collegiate best all alone. Southern's 39.6 isn't recognized in that category.

Boston a Terror: 27' 3-4", 50'3 1-2", 14.1

Knoxville, Tenn., April 15--Ralph Boston was at his versatile best in the Dogwood Relays as he pieced together one of the top one-day triples on record. His 27'³/₄" leap in the long jump, plus a narrow foul that measured 27'⁵/₂", rates as a fine piece of work in itself. But the Strider star added a windy 50'3¹/₂" triple jump victory and a third-place 14.1 in the high hurdles.

Jumping with a wind that never read more than 3.6 miles per hour, Boston had a strong series in his specialty: 26'3¹/₂", 26'8³/₄", F (27'⁵/₂"", 27'³/₄"", 26'10³/₄" and 26'9³/₄". Richmond Flowers sped the hurdles in 13.8 while bucking a wind reported at 10 mph.

Matson Moves Farther Away: 71'5 1-2"

College Station, Tex., April 22--Randy Matson, who had been flirting with the world shot put record for two months, saved the big effort for his "Day". The 71'5¹/₂" toss--10¹/₄" beyond his mark of two years ago--was Randy's way of thanking Texas A&M fans who had turned out to salute him at his final home meet.

Matson clicked for the longest-ever mark on his first attempt.

He then went on to compile a series averaging 69'1¹/₂", not quite his best, with throws of 68'11³/₄", 69'7¹/₂", 68'1³/₄", 68'7¹/₂" and 67'5". He doubled with a 200'11" discus victory.

Randy admitted he felt "more pressure than I have since the 1964 Olympics" as he raised the shot record for the fourth time. In the past 25 months, the graceful giant has upped the standard by 3¹/₂ feet. This time it came in a triangular meet which Baylor won with 70 points to Texas A&M's 55 and Texas Tech's 44.

Winds Blow Flowers, Gray to 13.4, 9.3

Columbus, Ohio, April 22--Despite violent winds that gusted between 25 and 35 miles an hour--or maybe because of them--a number of outstanding marks were recorded at the 43rd Ohio State Relays. Richmond Flowers took advantage of the friendly breeze to rip off a 13.4 mark in the high hurdles. Tom Gray of Morehead State and Orin Richburg of Kent State rode it to a 9.3 100 with Gray winning by inches.

Gary Schwartz, former Kansas ace now competing with the Hocking Valley Track Club, unleashed a 190'7" discus toss. That far outdistanced his previous best of 179'10" as he moved into the nation's top 10 for the season.

Ryun Tours 3:54.7 Despite Publicity Pressure

Lawrence, Kans., April 20-22--Spectators and pressmen had to wait until the Saturday finals of the Kansas Relays to understand what coach Bob Timmons meant by "quality time effort", a phrase that had popped up when he was asked about Jim Ryun's goal in the Glenn Cunningham mile.

Ryun again had to tackle the last half of the race alone, but he cleared up the confusion about Timmons' terminology by racing to 3:54.7, the 12th fastest ever and his third best. John Lawson, now running for the 49ers Track Club, forged to the lead at the gun and led Ryun through the opening quarter of 58.6. The steady pace continued through a 1:58.4. Though Ryun appeared ready to assume the lead at 770, he stayed on Lawson's shoulder down the straight and edged into the front spot while rounding the fifth turn.

A quality effort was assured as Ryun passed the 1320 in 2:58.6, and the crowd rose to shout its encouragement and approval. The 19-year-old sophomore shifted into his high gear down the backstretch and sprinted home in 56.1 for a last half of 1:56.3, only five-tenths slower than the one he ran enroute to 3:51.3 last summer.

"I picked it up in the third quarter," Ryun pointed out. "That's the thing I did this year that I didn't do last year (in the 3:55.8 race here). Last year I was 3:01 and this year it was 2:58." And he had good words for Lawson, winner of Thursday's 10,000, saying, "He set it up perfectly."

Ryun's 3:54.7 broke Bob Day's collegiate record of 3:56.4 and ranks third on the US list behind his own world mark and the 3:53.7 at Compton last June. Jim's activities were not limited to the mile, however. When relay anchorman Ben Olison was called home due to his father's death, Ryun took over the number three mile relay carry. The only Kansas runner to better his 47.0 was Dwight

Peck, who sprinted 46.8 for 3:10.1 behind Rice's 3:06.6.

Rice received a superlative performance from mop-up man Conley Brown. He grabbed the stick with about a 10-yard lead on Oklahoma's Bill Calhoun, who caught him by the 220. Sophomore Brown then opened another big gap and finished with 45.7. Calhoun sped 46.3 to give Oklahoma 3:08.4.

Speed came in bunches from the college division despite coolish 50-degree temperatures as Texas Southern swept to victories in the 440 (40.0), 880 (1:22.8) and two-mile (7:30.8) baton events, plus a non-winning 3:21.1 sprint medley effort. The combo of Clyde Duncan, Bobby Evans, Lee Smith and Jim Hines seemed assured of victory by the first hand-off, continued to execute excellent passes and gave Hines an insurmountable lead. He finished with the world's third-best mark, which trails only Abilene Christian (1:22.6) and Southern (1:22.7). Hines added a 100-yard dash victory of 9.4 on a rare, windless midwestern day.

Arkansas AM&N, getting a 45.9 anchor by 1966 Southwest Athletic Conference 440 champ Elbert Stinson, circled the four laps in 3:07.5 after a 3:09.4 heat. In the sprint medley, Felix Johnson from Prairie View A&M, caught and passed Texas Southern's powerful George Hunt in the last 40 yards for a 3:20.8 victory. Johnson took the baton slightly ahead of Hunt after Thurman Boggess of Prairie View had sprinted 45.8. Hunt overtook Johnson, only to have the favor returned in the stretch, though Hunt's 1:49.1 split was a tenth quicker than Johnson's.

Oklahoma State's Chris McCubbins appeared ready to become the US's number one steeplechaser as he demolished a good field and finished strongly in 8:46.6. McCubbins is 10 seconds ahead of any time reported this early last year.
