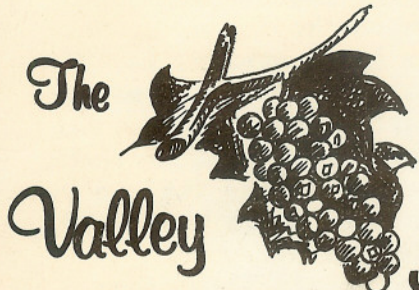
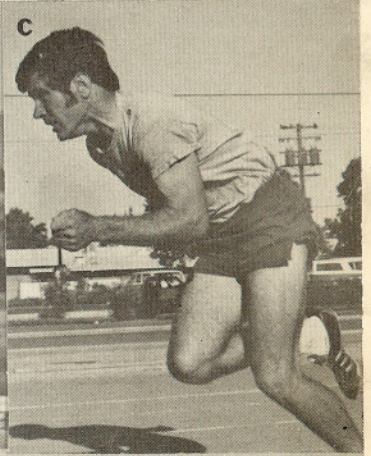
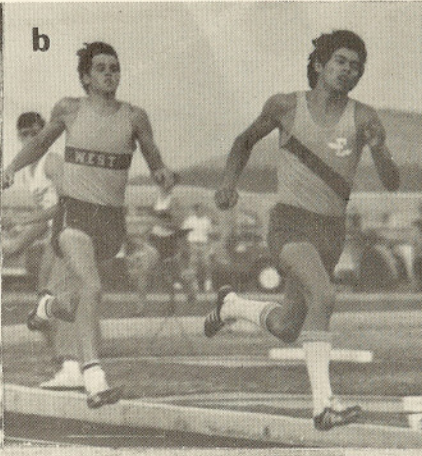

FRESNO ELANS T. C.

The big news for the Elans is Iva Wright. Iva was a double winner at the AAU Girl's Track and Field Championships held in Canton, Ohio. Miss Wright successfully defended her discus title by spinning it 138-2 in cold, windy weather. This year she also picked up the national title in the shot put with a personal best put of 47-11 $\frac{1}{2}$.

Also at the AAU Meet 15 year old Yvette Brownlee placed fourth in the discus with 125-8, and sixth in the shot put with her 42-8 $\frac{3}{4}$ life time best. Debra Haynes didn't place but made it to the shot put finals with a 38-9 $\frac{1}{2}$ effort.

At the AAU Age Group Championships held at Irvine, California, Elans member, Tarea Brewer, won the 12-13 year old discus throw with a lifetime best of 92-4 $\frac{1}{2}$.

Some big news in the North Visalia Track Club is Jesse Gayton equaling the national record for the 12-13 division one mile. Jesse has been getting very tough competition from rapidly improving Art Segura. The club was pleased with the performances of it's members at the Visalia One Hour Run. WASCO WILDKAT T. C.

At the recently conducted State Girl's and Women's Track and Field Meet, four out of the six girls who made the trip representing the Wasco Wildkats won medals. Coached by Brad Tomasin (Wasco), Jim Arriaga (Corcoran), and Wayne Walters (Orosi), the girls left for Hayward State College on Saturday, June 17th to compete at the college track on Sunday, June 18th.

The biggest surprise and improvement shown by the girls who made the trip was the 5:12.3 mile recorded by 13 year old Patsy Cervantes. This time was good enough to win the 12 - 13 state title and was some 8 seconds under the previous best. Patsy is from Corcoran as is one of her teammates, Carla Irving (13 years) who placed third in the 880 yard run with a good time of 2:24.9 seconds. Shirley Noldon from Orosi also running for the Wildkats placed sixth in the same 880 yard race with a personal best time of 2:28.3 seconds. The Wildkats other medal winner was 13 year old Teri Frye from Bakersfield, who placed third in the 440 yard run with a good time of 61.3 seconds.

The Wildkat Track Club which originated in Wasco, some three years ago has now expanded to include girls from the entire south central area of California. Saturday Night in Saginaw

Once upon a time, in fact on June 24th, in the early morning light (6 a.m.) a band of foolhardy men and one woman, members of the High Sierra Track Club, headed out upon an odyssey that would drive them from the Fresno Pacific College campus to Hayward Field Stadium in Eugene, Oregon. The pilgrimage was to attend the sacred United States Track and Field Olympic Trials. The only thing that was strange about their trip was that these followers of the "Golden 440 Loop" had decided to travel the 700-plus miles by foot in the form of relay instead of taking more conventional means of transportation.

Don "Huggy Bear" Gregory ran the first ten mile leg with 55 year young Harry Harder who had come to wish the group "God's speed and safety". Richard Petersen, who turned out to be the true iron man of the journey, took the baton to the 20 mile mark where he gave it to dangerous Dave Bronzan (as it turned out he was only dangerous to himself).

After only 28 miles the first minor injury occurred. Dave walked the last two miles of his 10 miles and made a rather slow pass to Steve Ward who proceeded to wear down the roads for the next ten miles. Big Bill Cockerham took the pass from Steve in a style that appeared to be right out of Track and Field Technique and charged off into what appeared to be desert for his 10 mile stretch.

The group continued to pass the baton on in this manner for another 30 miles the first day out. After camping at Lake McSwain that night, the pack arose early and pounded out another 90 miles the second day, including 2½ fast miles by the chief cook and dishwasher Donna Cockerham, who also happens to be Big Bill's wife. The second day ended at Thornton, California where a man rumored to be the mayor was looking forward to seeing us so badly that he celebrated just a little too much and was passed out by the time we steamed into the wide spot in the road.

The third day by noon, after being told to get down out of the trees at the State Capitol (a long story), and after spending close to an hour looking for Big Bill who had gotten lost because he did not follow the course that he had mapped out, Donna sprinted into Woodland. Here we were to team up with the notorious Napa Valley Road Runners, who were going to travel the rest of the journey with us. After a short wait our five man group was now a gang of nine. By days end we were at Oroville where mosquitoes tried to carry away "Huggy Bear".

The fourth day was truly the toughest day of the trip. "Huggy Bear" seemed to go into some type of summer hibernation and could not make his body work very well. Dangerous Dave, who was now back to full strength, got nabbed by the C.H.P. for running up Interstate 5 without a written permit and said that now famous line, "Let's be just a little reasonable, huh?" (which did not go over too well with the man). Also the temperature hit 109 degrees and we hit the first bad hills. But we forged on. By 10:30 p.m. we had made it to Dunsuir where we spent the night.

Wednesday, the fifth day, we had cut the length of our individual legs to only a couple of miles at a time to survive the hills and the 100+ degree temperature. By 1 p.m. we had conquered the Siskiyou Mountain Range (elevation 4310 at the summit) and crossed into Oregon. From the summit to Ashland, a distance of 15 miles, was all down hill and our spirits once again rose as

"Huggy Bear" kept yelling "Go for a P.R. (personal record)" to each runner. It was the first time we had felt like letting the feet fly in several days. Our spirits were also lifted by the addition of another runner, Sam Samakis, a junior from Newport Harbor High. On their way to Portland, the Samakis family stopped us along the highway to ask if Sam could join us for the rest of the trip. He was enlisted on the spot.

That evening we ran the most beautiful mileage along the lazy Rogue River but we realized that the next day would have to be a flyer because we had to cover 110 miles by 4 p.m. if we were to make the opening ceremonies at the Trials.

With this in mind, Dave, Bill, and Richard, who was still pushing on fast mileage, started running two mile legs at sub-six minute pace at 4 a.m. Thursday. By 6 a.m. they had covered 19 miles and the day was off to a good start. This day turned out to be our best day. Just the realization that we were so close made it possible for us to really move. And by 3:30 p.m. on June 29, after five and a half days of running, we had traveled by foot from Fresno to Eugene, Oregon.

The Napa Valley runners had made arrangements with quite a few northern California Kiwanis Clubs to pick up donations for the U.S. Olympic team along the way. So not only had we completed a unique type of training but also had collected just over \$1000 to help send our best track and field athletes to Munich to compete with our brothers from other lands.

We made base camp at Saginaw, Oregon, which is about 13 miles south of Eugene, for the ten days that we watched the trials. So two days after arriving at the end of our journey we spent Saturday night in Saginaw.
