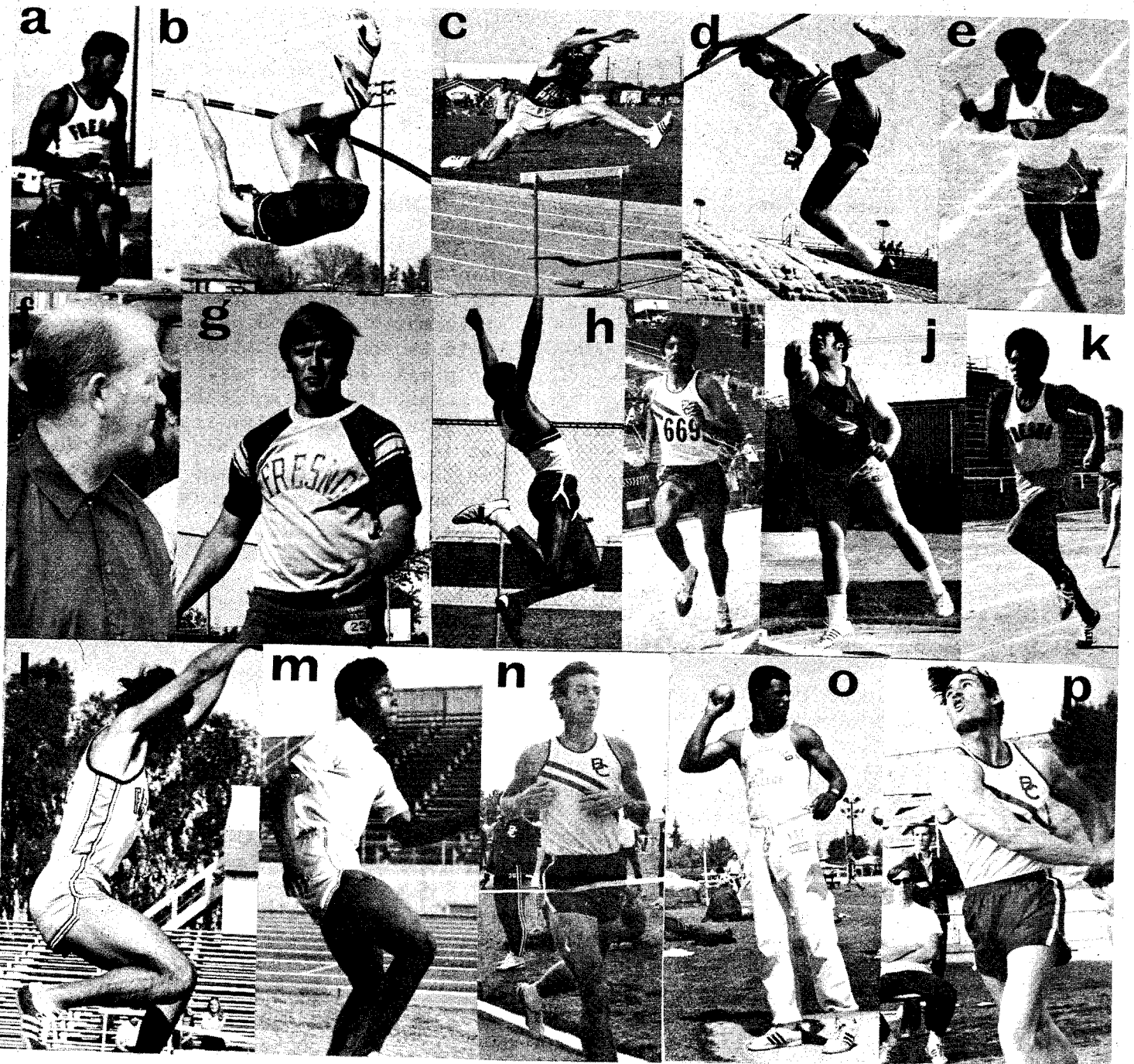

HIGH SIERRA T.C.

The High Sierra senior meets have been coming along very well. Results of the first one are: 50 and Over 100-Will Parks (52) 13.1; 220-Will Parks 20.0; Six Mile-1. Don Zarjn (52) 41:04, 2. Lee Scott (50) 41:38, 3. Harry Harder (54) 41:43. 40 and Over 100-Ted Radamaker (47) 11.0; 2. Dewey Jan 12.9; 220-1. Ted Radamaker (47) 25.5, 2. Ron Gates (40) 33.1; Six Mile-Sid Toabe (48) 37:17.5. 30 and Over 100-1. Bud Jewett (34) 11.2, 2. Ray Mullins (31) 11.3; 220-Bud Jewett (34) 25.6; Six Mile-1. Wayne VanDellen (34) 32:09, 2. Frank Delgado (36) 38:50, 3. Jim Thaxter (38) 39:01

Wayne VanDellen has become interested in orienteering and placed second in such an event recently in San Diego.

A look at the 1972 Best Marks list will show that the High Sierra track team is coming right along. Most noteworthy is Steve Hardison's 15-6 vault which he accomplished at the Mt. Sac Relays. Steve feels he will add another foot onto this the next time he vaults.

The two-mile relay team of Bill Cockerham (1:57), Dave Bronzan (2:00), Dave Donaldson (1:57) and Mike Denny (1:54) placed third at the Sacramento Relays (7:49) and will lower that time considerably at the WCR.

High Sierra members also made a very good showing at the New Ways Invitational where Louis Amps won the 100 (9.7) and 220 (21.4) and placed second in the high jump and long jump. Jess Gonzales won the 440, Dave Donaldson won the mile with Cockerham second, Bill Deeter won the shot put, and High Sierra won the mile relay.

Dave Bronzan and Wayne VanDellen came home one:two in the Visalia 10 mile run with a new meet record of 53:17 for Dave. In that race Harry Harder knocked nearly 4 minutes off of his previous best time with his excellent senior (54) time of 70:18.

WASCO WILDKAT T. C.

Kevin Knox of the Wasco Wildkat Track Club and holder of numerous 9, 10, & 11 year old national and world records, established his first world age group 12 year old record by recording a two mile run time of 10:29.5. The record was set at the SPAAAU Boys Age Group Track Meet on April 9 at the College of Canyons. The old record was 11:19.8 set in 1971 by Vance Eberly of Sparta Track Club of San Jose. Young Knox, breaking the record by 50 seconds, was not pushed after passing the mile mark at 5:12.

Other fine performances by Wildkats were Randy White's fine 2:15.0 880, which puts him less than four seconds behind the world 12 year old record for this race. Wildkat coaches feel that this record is within White's reach this year.

Nine year old Jackie Kent is making a name for himself in the younger race. Kent ran a good double with a 2:42.0 half mile and came back to speed through a 72.0 440.

Todd Knox recorded the third fastest 880 ever by a 10 year old with a good early season time of 2:26.9. Todd holds the 9 year old record at 2:29.6 and is just rounding around into shape for this track season.

Sprinter Lewis Richardson picked up a double win in the 12 & 13 100 & 220 yard dashes. Bill Hill ran an official 5:01 mile in the same division.

Others placing high were Kevin Smith, Dennis Stowe, Jimmy Dillingham, Shawn Shambaugh, Don Byrum, David Amick, Robin Messick, Eddie Lujan, Kim Crawford and Mike Mosby.

FRESNO ELANS T. C.

The Elans traveled to the coast for the San Jose Invitational and made a very strong showing. Yvette Brownlee picked up a pair of first places to lead the way. She won the 14-15 Age Group shot put with a 41-11 heave and the discus with 130-8.

Iva Wright captured the Women's Division discus with a 146-8 toss and placed second in the shot put to AAU indoor record holder, Maren Seidler.

The Elans picked up seven places in the 14-15 Division. Tony Landucci was third in the discus and fourth in the shot. The 440 relay team of Heather Haskell, Anita Carter, JoAnne Burns and Debbie Leal (3) placed sixth.

GREG JONES: Senior, Lemoore High School. Born September 16, 1953, at Hanford, Ca. 175 pounds, 5'11" tall.

BEST MARKS: 100 Yard Dash--9.5(72); 220 Yard Dash--21.6(72); 440 Yard Dash--47.3(71); Long Jump--23'2"(72).

TRAINING: Once a day, four days a week, 4 months a year. Lots of work on form and fast repeat intervals at short distances. Starts two times a week. Weight training in the winter months.

Lemoore High School consistently has one of the top track teams in the Valley. Leading the way for this year's team is senior sprinter and Valley leader, Greg Jones. Greg showed he was fast early in the season with his 9.7 100 yard dash mark, but then his real potential for greatness when he turned a legal 10.4 for 100 meters in the Sanger Invitational. His 220 yard dash and long jump marks also indicate that he's headed for a high quality track career. Greg isn't new on the Valley track scene, however, as he currently holds the Valley junior class record in the 440 yard dash.

Greg is coached by Lemoore's head coach, Bob Fraley, and says he runs track because, "I enjoy running." He doesn't have any rigid training rules, doesn't work through dual meets, and would like to make the State Track Meet. After graduation from high school the University of Southern California is Greg's first choice for college.

Those of you who have seen Greg run will agree that he has a great career ahead of him in track. Those of you who haven't yet seen him run can watch him on TV in the State Meet.

We don't know how he does it but Ron stays right on top of Valley high school track.

IS DISTANCE RUNNING MORAL ?

The life of a human is unique among all animals; simply because man is responsible for what he thinks and does. In other words, as the philosopher, Descartes said, "Man is a moral being."

The discipline of moral philosophy is the study of all man's endeavors in regards to their moral implications. Everything man does has moral implications.

In other words, everything man does can be labeled right, wrong, or neither. After seven years of running, it finally occurred to me that I might be doing something immoral. So, I decided to play philosopher and look at running from the moral philosopher's view.

First, one must know that there are two basic ways in which acts are looked at in moral philosophy. First, we'll look at the deontological view. The deontological view is one of rules and laws. In other words, we should have a set of moral laws or rules and abide by them in every situation. Distance running looks very poor from the perspective of this view. For instance, most men hold that needless pain is evil. Well, if we concede to this statement, we must decide if distance running is inflicting needless pain. We know, for instance, that running a marathon is an act of inflicting pain. The question still unanswered is: is it a needless pain? According to moral philosophers, the runner who wins is probably making the pain worthwhile. As for the losers, they are doing a terrible injustice to their bodies. So, looking at distance running in the light of the deontological view, it is both moral and immoral, depending on whether or not you're a winner or a loser. There is the second view concerning morals which is called the teleological view.

The teleological view says that we must base all judgments about moral or immoral acts solely on the basis of consequences. In other words, if the consequence of an act is good, then the act can be deemed moral. If the consequences are bad, then the act is immoral. What then, does this say about distance running? What are distance running's consequences? Well, first, we are told that it makes us healthier; so that is one good consequence. It teaches us discipline and gives us pride in our bodies. It teaches us how to push ourselves in a way that only a distance runner can explain. It gives us time alone with our minds. Most of all, I believe a distance runner really learns to know himself. He knows what he is like when the going gets tough. Now, looking at this obviously biased list of consequences of distance running, we must conclude that distance running, in the light of

LEMOORE ELEMENTARY MEET

March 23, 1972

The following outstanding marks and times were made at the triangular meet with Lemoore Elementary, P. W. Engvall, and Meadow Lane Schools, in Lemoore, California, on March 23, 1972.

In the fourth grade 50-yard dash, Yvette Herring from Meadow Lane, blazed a 6.3 for first place, with Olga Gaffney from Lemoore Elementary, running a 6.5 to take second. In the 100-yard dash, Yvette's sister, Audra Herring from Meadow Lane, had little competition with a 13 flat clocking. In the long jump, Audra Herring again dominated the scene with a leap of 12 feet 11 inches. The high jump was won by Verna Beach, from Lemoore Elementary, at 3 feet 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches.

In the fifth grade girls division, Lemoore Elementary swept the 50-yard dash, with Marie Alinez at 7.2, Kim Bernhardt at 7.9, and Tammie Whitaker running 8 flat. In the 440-yard dash, Kim Bunch ran a 63-second winning time for Meadow Lane, with Tami Rollins of Lemoore Elementary, running a 63.6-seconds for second place. The 880-yard run was won in a good time of 2 minutes 54 seconds by Stacey Kelly, from Meadow Lane. Pam Allen jumped 3 feet 9 inches to win it for Meadow Lane, in the high jump, with her sidekick, Kim Bunch, only half an inch behind. Debbie Hamblin, from Meadow Lane, won the long jump at 12 feet 4 inches.

In the sixth grade girls' division, Karen Hall/won the 100-yard dash at 13.3, and Miss Thompson, from P.W. Engvall, won the 220-yard dash at 32 flat. A fine half mile was run by Miss Harris, of P. W., and Janie Silva leaped 13 feet 7 inches, to capture the long jump for Meadow Lane.

In the boys fourth grade class, Mark Whitaker blazed across the fifty with a 6.9 for Meadow Lane, with Mark Gilkey, from Lemoore Elementary, right at his heels at 7 flat. Two other fast times were recorded in the 100 with Paul Jackson, of Meadow Lane, running 13.4, and John Swenson, from Lemoore Elementary, running a 13.5. Jim Goodman, from Lemoore Elementary, had a fast winning time of 56.3 in the 330, and Mike Rollins, from Lemoore, ran a 70.4 in the 440. Paul Jackson won the long jump at 12 feet 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches, to be the only double winner for Meadow Lane. Roger Flower, from Meadow Lane, had a good high jump of 3 feet 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches, to win that event.

Some of the most impressive marks of the total meet came from the fifth grade boys, focusing on a boy from Lemoore Elementary, George Gaffney, who still has the National age record in the 100-yard dash, when he was nine years old. Gaffney, now eleven years of age, won the 100 in a fine time of 12.3, and also doubled in winning the long jump with an outstanding leap of 15 feet 7 inches. His sidekick from Lemoore Elementary, Bert Swenson, also had a fine

time in the 100 at 12.5 and leaped 12 feet 11 inches in the long jump, to take second in both events. Another outstanding runner from Lemoore Elementary, Horace Herring, had outstanding times in the 440-yard dash, at 66.4 seconds. Another double winner for Lemoore Elementary was Gary Baumgartner, who won the 880 in 2 minutes 43.8 seconds, and then threw the shot 22 feet 10 inches to take that event. Last, but not least, Richard Lopez from Lemoore tied for second place against two boys who were one and two years older than he, by triple-jumping 26 feet 5 inches. He just missed a better jump, because his hand fell back.

The sixth grade boys showed some good speed with Gene Billingsley, from Meadow Lane, winning the 100-yard dash in 12.4, and Chip Clemens winning the 220 in 30.6, for Meadow Lane. Gene Billingsley also doubled, with an outstanding triple jump of 22 feet 10 inches, to win that event. Stephen Thomas, from Meadow Lane, ran a swift 2 minutes 32.4 seconds half to win it, and Hendrix, from P. W., ran an outstanding mile in 5 minutes 33.3 seconds, to take that event. Finishing up the meet, in the shot put, a fine first was taken by Roe, from P. W. Engvall, at 25 feet 3 inches, with the six pound shot.
