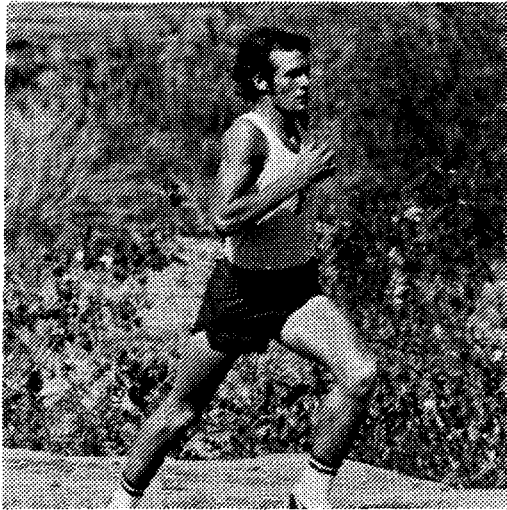

MEET VALLEY ATHLETE

NED BAIRD: Fresno High School. Born July 13, 1955 at Fresno, California. 5-11, 145 pounds.
BEST TIMES: 880--2:00.9, mile--4:23.6, 2 mile--9:37.2, 440--about 52-53. 6 mile Watermelon Run--33:30.

TRAINING: Works out once or twice a day, seven days a week, eleven months a year. Weekly mileage varies depending on the time of year. Before cross country and into the first couple of weeks of the season 80-plus miles per week. Later in the season 30-50 miles plus speed work. During off-season about 50 miles a week. Track season mileage similar to cross country. Coached by Mr. (Coach) Allen. Previously competed in the ninth grade at Hamilton Junior High School.
DESCRIPTION: Speed workouts two or three days a week, overdistance two or three days a week, an easy day before a meet. Prefers competition once a week.

If anyone is to take the Valley cross country crown from Redwood's Juan Garcia it would surely be Ned Baird. Ned is a very strong, courageous type runner. He won't be giving anything away to Juan and certainly could be the one to pull an upset. Ned has already chalked up wins in the Reedley Fiesta Race and the North Yosemite League meet. His favorite racing distance is two miles and his racing strategy simply is, "to beat the other guy." Is Ned peaking for the Valley meet? Or has he been running in top form all season?

"I like to peak for the Valley meet. But in general I like to stay in top shape all year and prime myself for the Valley."

As a sophomore Ned was Fresno High's outstanding runner. Last year as a junior he was cross country captain and outstanding runner as well as outstanding distance runner in track and presently holds the school record for the two mile run. This year's goals include a Valley championship, a sub-9:00 two mile, under 4:15 in the mile, and to break 2:00 in the 880. Long range goals are, "to keep running as long as I am able."

Ned competes in track because, "I like it and I like the people I meet." He gets to bed before 10:00 pm the night before a meet; takes lots of vitamin C and a multivitamin and doesn't eat or drink much before a practice or meet.

After school Ned would like to keep involved with track as a p. e. teacher and coach; or go into some type of forestry work. As for college he 's considering UC Berkeley or UCLA, but favors the coaching reputation of Fresno City College.

Monday-12X440 under 65.

Tuesday-15-20X440 under 65.

Wednesday-3 or 4 miles and 6-8X440 under 65.

Thursday-light jog.

Saturday-Overdistance, 10 plus miles.

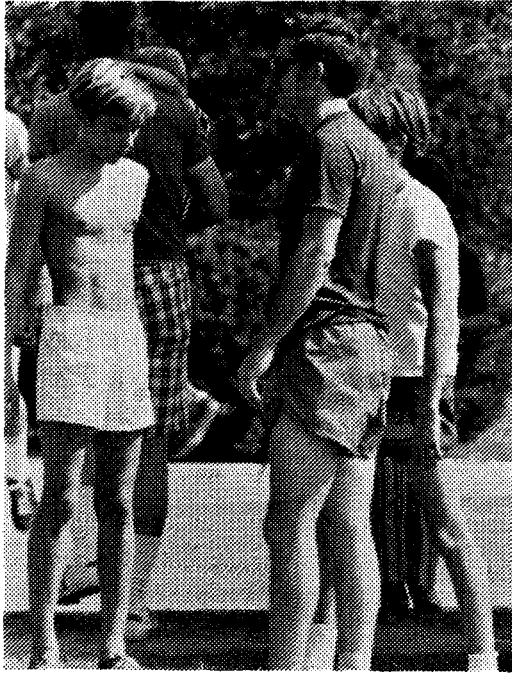

MEET VALLEY COACH

JOE HERZOG of Hamilton Junior High School:

Coaching at the junior high level is a tricky job for a coach. Should he push on the kids to get the most out of them or should he merely let them on their own. Both extremes can have detrimental effects on a young boys future in athletics. Pushing too hard might get results, but also might cause a burning-out (a la swimming). Yet the coach must exert guidance and direction for the neophyte trackster. Joe Herzog has been coaching at the junior high level for eight years and has developed a good program and sound philosophy of how much to push and how much to not push.

Joe was born in Los Angeles, California. He attended Morningside High School where he lettered two years in varsity cross country and track. The Morningside cross country team won the league championship all four years of his participation. In track he was league 660 champ his junior year, but was unable to compete his senior year due to a fractured ankle. From 1959-1961 Joe ran for El Camino Junior College and from 1961-1964 for Fresno State. Lifetime bests: 22.3, 1:56, 4:22, and 9:50.

After receiving his teaching credential from Fresno State he landed a teaching and coaching position at Hamilton J. H. S. in 1965. He has been successfully coaching cross country, basketball, and track at Hamilton ever since. Joe is single, and he enjoys hunting and fishing (mostly fly) when he finds time.

Under Coach Herzog's guidance the Hamilton cross country teams have won three league titles; the track teams two and basketball three. His basketball won-loss record is 50 & 26. Some outstanding individuals he has helped include: Roger Croft (10.2, 9.0 70HH, 13.2 120LH), Bob Larson 1:27.1 660), Mike Lyons (13.8 LH), Greg Podsakoff (6-0 1/2), Bob Simmerman (133-3 disc), Jeff Feramisco (21-1, 10.5), Ned Baird (4:48, 10:36), Rick Oaxaca (4:45.0), and Dave Oaxaca (3:23, 2:05.5, 4:48). On this year's squad Mark Ferry appears to be the standout. Mark won the Junior Olympic 120 LH title last year as well as being runner-up to Mark Southwick in the City JHS Cross Country Championships last year.

Coach Herzog is not only a coach but a runner, himself. He runs with the boys in workouts when he can. "I am no longer coaching basketball which gives me more time to run. I am looking forward to running this coming track season(220, 440, 880) depending on how much running I get in. I enjoy long running for training, but the 880 is my favorite racing distance."

As for coaching technique: "We believe in mileage and proper technique. We do some repetition running starting the fifth week of training and one day per week of intervals the last three weeks. Because our kids are young (12-15) I think that cardiovascular development should come first. We run some relays when we want some speed work. We run on the track during cross country season only three to five days per season. Running should be fun first of all. We point for the league championship only and let the other meets take care of themselves. We always run to win but I have always stressed 'do your best and give an honest effort when you compete.' We've had fair team success and a great deal of individual success."
