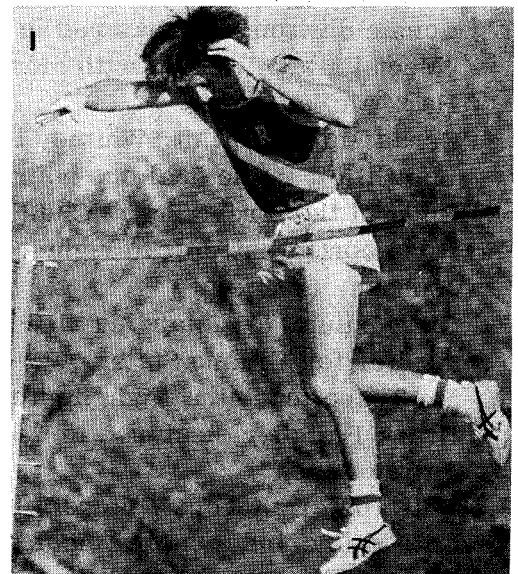
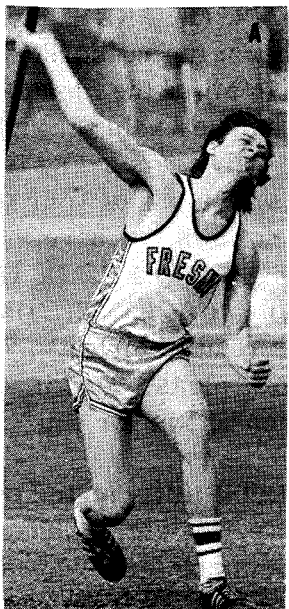

MEET VALLEY COACH

FRANK FLETCHER of Hoover High School: One of the strongest track teams in the Valley this year is Hoover High School and undoubtedly one of the reasons is Frank Fletcher, the head coach at Hoover.

Frank was born in Massachusetts but attended Hope High School where he competed in track (880 in 1:57.8) and cross country. He later finished his secondary education at Seton Hall Prep where he ran the 880 in 1:56.4. He later completed his education at Seton Hall and then UCLA. At Seton Hall he and his teammates were able to break the indoor world record for the two mile relay with a time of 7:33.9. The splits for this excellent time were: Tony Luciano-1:55.0, Robert Ranier-1:55.3, Frank Fletcher-1:52.2, and Chet Lipski-1:51.4. At UCLA he was the captain of the track team.

With such an impressive running history, it seems only natural that his coaching career would also be successful. During his twenty-three years of coaching, he has beaten over 80% of his opponents. He also, while at Edison High School of Fresno, coached the State Team Champions of 1963. While at Hoover he coached the 1970 NYL Champs. This year the team captured, so far, the Fresno City Championships and the Campbell Relays, plus they were the dual meet champions of the North Yosemite League.

This year's team has many outstanding performers, a few of the team members are: Ken Slaton, 100-9.9; Danny Williams, long jump-22-7, triple jump-48-0; Russ Brown, shot put-57-10; Mark Hull, mile-4:23.0; Randy Stephenson, 880-1:59.5; Keith Ory, 880-1:59.4; Matt Thomas, high jump-6-4 1/2; Victor White, 120 HH-14.5. These are just a few of the team members Coach Fletcher has on this year's squad.

Coach Fletcher is not the only member of the Fletcher family enjoying a good year in track. His son Rick, who attends UCLA, is presently having a very fine season, clearing seven feet a number of times and establishing himself as one of the best high jumpers in the history of the Valley.

When asked what the greatest thrill he experienced during his eight years of coaching at Hoover, he answered, the winning of the league meet in 1970.

He stated that he couldn't really pinpoint his coaching philosophies, but whatever they are, they apparently work, and we hope he continues to use them in the future.

MEET VALLEY ATHLETE

LONNIE SHELTON of Foothill High School, Bakersfield. Born October 19, 1955 at Bakersfield, Ca. 6'8", 235 pounds.

BEST MARKS: shotput - 64-2; discus - 186-9, triple jump - 47-7 3/4.

TRAINING: once a day, four days a week, four months a year. Coached by Dave Olds and Ted Oliver.

DESCRIPTION: training is balanced between one third weight training, one third technique and associated skill work, and one third bulk or quality putting or throwing.

As the track season rounds into the home stretch for 1973 Lonnie remains undefeated in both the shot and discus (up till WCR) and has set new Foothill High records in the shot (64-2), discus (186-9), and triple jump (47-7 3/4). He is Foothill's track team co-captain and 1973 SYL Champion in the shot and disc. The 64-2 put would have been a Valley record had not a cloth tape been used; records must be measured with a steel tape to be official.

Lonnie likes track because of the competition. He tries to be at top form all year rather than peaking for just a few big meets. Meet strategy is to pop out a good throw early - goes "all out" on his first effort. As for immediate goals 200 feet and 65 feet don't sound beyond his reach; he would like to realize those before this year is over because this might be his last year to concentrate on track.

Lonnie will be continuing his academic career at Oregon State University. He plans to major in education and participate in basketball and maybe track. This will be determined by how well things progress at Oregon State. He wants to concentrate on basketball, hopefully have a successful college career, and be drafted by a professional team.

Lonnie chose Oregon State because he feels the educational program there is a good one. He also wanted to go to a school where he would have a good chance to play and to start in basketball. He wants to get his degree first and hopefully go into professional basketball.

Head Foothill High Track Coach, Ted Oliver, says of Lonnie's potential, "Lonnie has a great deal of physical ability and is coachable. If he applied himself to track and field I feel he would be of Olympic caliber. I feel he would excel in the shot and discuss and would make a great decathlon prospect."

5 X 50 yard sprints
Work on second event

Wednesday

15 X switches
10 X hops without shot
15 X hard puts
5 X 50 yard sprints
5 X flights of stairs (weight vest)
Weights

Thursday

5 X switches
5 X easy puts
2 X 50 yard sprints
Jog 440

Each workout is preceded by a team warmup.

BAKERSFIELD NOTES

WEST HIGH WINS 1ST SYL CHAMPIONSHIP

B. C. CAPTURES 6TH STRAIGHT METRO TITLE

With eight first places the West High "Vikings" won the South Yosemite League track championships May 4th at Bakersfield College. It was windy and cold. Six of the first places came from the two Andrews brothers. Tom Andrews, a senior, won the 220 in 22.3, the 120 highs in 14.5 and the triple jump with a 46-1 1/2 leap. Sophomore Joel Andrews won the 100 against the wind in a slow 10.4. He won the 180 lows by edging South's Sam Cotton 20.2 to 20.5. Joel also won the long jump with a 22-6 effort. The other two wins for West came from the 440 relay (42.7) and the pole vault where West went 1-2 with Wayne Abney reaching 13-1 and Sandy Mann 12-6.

Because of the cold weather and high winds blowing against the runners faces in the home stretch only two meet records were broken. Foothill's Lonnie Shelton broke records in both the shot put and discus. Shelton sailed the discus 185-4 with Palla (169-3) and Swanson (150-2) of West picking up second and third places. Shelton threw the shot 61-2 with West's Bill Muxlow second at 55-6.

East High's Randy Cockerel had a 49 flat anchor leg in the mile relay to give East an impressive 3:20.5 victory. South was second in 3:23.8. Mike Boyd high jumped 6-2 to get East's only other first. In the running events Bakersfield High scored their only first with senior Tim Anderson winning the two mile in 9:26.2. Anderson was pressed by juniors Alex Hinzo of West (9:29.4) and Ken Henricks of Highland (9:32.4). Ed Rios of Foothill was fourth in 9:32.6.

Tom Elieff (Highland) won the mile in 4:26.7 with Tom Chavez of Bakersfield a close second in 4:28.3 and Ed Rios of Foothill third in 4:32.4. South High runners captured the 440 and 880 races. Harlan Hunter won the 880 in 1:57.8 by holding off Foothill's Daily Brown (1:58.3) and Bakersfield's Art Bell (1:58.7). Ed Ruffin won the 440 in 49.8 hitting the wire ahead of soph Roosevelt Lewis of Foothill (50.3) and teammate Sam Cotton (50.3). Team scores were West 74, South 51, Bakersfield 50, Foothill 48.

North High moved most of their varsity athletes to "B" Class to win that division. Dave Quick led the star with a record triple jump leap of 45-11 1/2. In "C" Class Foothill ran away with the championship. The Trojans were led by Walter Pratt in the 180 lows (21.6) and 220.

Bob Covey's Bakersfield College Renegades scored 162 points to win their sixth straight Metropolitan Conference track championship. Bakersfield had eight first places. Chris Glover led the Gades by two wins. He won the 220 in 21.8 with teammates Don Myers second (21.9) and Frank Durham fourth (22.1); and the 440 in 49.1 with Bakersfield getting a 1-2-3 sweep. Durham was second and Mark Twinting third with identical 49.3s.

Phil Foster defended his title in the 880 by running 1:53.4. Larry Boanen ran 1:54.0 for second and Darryl Cox was fourth in 1:56.6. Bakersfield's Dan Villalovas came from far behind to win the three mile in 14:17. Matt Woessner was fifth in 14:49.1.

Bakersfield captured both relays with 42.4 and 3:19.1. They have run 3:15 earlier.

In the field events Bakersfield had two first places. Mike La Fave threw the discus 151 feet with teammate Ken Nelson third (143-8 1/2) and Dennis Heinricks sixth at 131-7. La Fave threw a lifetime best of 51-4 for second in the shot. Charlie Wortiska placed sixth with a put of 45 feet. Andre Jackson grabbed top honors in the triple jump at 46-1 1/2. Rodney Lee was fourth (44-3) and John Kindred fifth (43-8).

A real set-back for the Gades was in the hurdle races. McKinley Mosley was leading the 440 intermediates and fell over the eighth barrier. He was unable to finish. Mosley also hit the fifth hurdle in the 120 highs and almost fell. He still came back to take third in 14.5.

Other Renegades capturing places were Rick Gavin second in the pole vault at 14-6. Gary Mosher picked up sixth with 13-6. In the high jump Leon Anderson cleared 6-4 for second place. The 100 was a tight race with Don Myers placing fourth. The first four were all timed in 10.1. Jerry Robertson was sixth at 10.2. Dave Salcido, suffering from a cold, didn't run well in the mile finishing fifth in 4:25.4.

Two disappointments for the Gades were in the long jump where Gary Daulong failed to place and in the pole vault where Steve Story did not clear the opening height.

APRIL MEANS IMPROVEMENT

The month of April has been the big month of improvement by Valley college track men. In the 100 yard dash Ed Jeffries of Fresno State moved from 10.0 to 9.7 since the last report. Rus Shelton from Reedley College has been moving in the 220; his last run was a fast 22.2. Big improvement in the 440 included Duchala from Modesto College who has lowered his best to 49.0, Warmerdam of Fresno has a 50.0 and Johnson of Fresno City has run 50.1.

The half milers have been hot with Larry Boaen of Bakersfield lowering his season best to 1:54.0. Tom Garcia of Fresno Pacific has dropped two seconds to 1:56.0. FSU's Hauck has posted a 1:56.2 and Harry Nicholas is showing signs of the Harry of old with his 1:56.4 for Fresno City College. Former Delta ace, Dave Garcia, now wearing the Fresno State colors has moved to the top in the mile rankings with a lifetime best of 4:15.3. The three mile has big improvements from Villalovous of Bakersfield (14:17.5), Hall of Fresno City(14:24.9) and Artherholt of Modesto(14:28.2). COS's Juan Garza scooted to 14:50.9. FSU runner Julio Rosa lowered his lifetime best in the steeple chase by over 30 seconds with his Valley leading 9:37.5.

In the high hurdles FCC timber-toppers, Alexander and Dietrich, have shown considerable improvement; Alexander getting a 14.4 and Dietrich moving to 15.2. The 440 intermediates saw Greg Zulum coming on with 53.2.

One lap relays are starting to click - Fresno City College running 42.0 and Fresno State 42.4. The mile relay saw Bakersfield run 3:15.8 and Modesto JC improve to 3:20.0.

In the pole vault Steve Hardison of Fresno Pacific leads with 16-2 1/2. Randy Kearns moved up to 15-6. George Flint had a good day with his 15-0.

The triple jumpers had a very good month. Meadows of COS improved from 44-8 to 47-11 1/2. FCC's Greenman got off a 47-10 1/2. Taplac of Reedley added a foot and a half with his 47-10 1/2. Roger Trujillo of Fresno Pacific moved ahead of teammate Tony Rotella in the Valley ranking with his 49-3.

One of the biggest improvements came in the shot put with FCC's freshman, Boyd, adding almost four feet with 51-3 1/2. Hammer throwers have made big jumps also. Nelms(FSU) spun 150-9 and teammate Rodarte 139-1. FPC frosh Kroeker threw 138-0.
