MEET VALLEY COACH

Bob Clemensson, Arvin High School: In 1965, Ted Oliver, now the cross country coach for Foothill High School in Bakersfield, started cross country at Arvin High School. When Ted left Arvin for Foothill, the school was going to drop Cross Country as a sport until Bob said he would coach the team. Bob has coached cross country every year since 1965 and has also been the assistant track coach since 1971.

Bob attended Drake University and it is here where Bob started running. He wasn't on any cross country team, but ran to just relieve tension. He graduated in 1964 with his B. A. in Business Administration. He later attended Northern Arizona University where he got his M. A. in 1969. It was at Flagstaff where Bob worked out Jim Ryan and others who were training for the Mexico Olympics.

Bob still runs for pleasure. He runs 3000 meters every morning at 5 a. m. before coming to school, and runs a mile with his cross country and track teams as warm-ups. He also rides his bike over 20 miles a weekend, and swims 1/2 mile every morning after running, until October. He also plans to start cross country skiing this year. If you haven't guessed it yet, Bob is still single.

Bob's record at Arvin is very impressive. His teams were South Sequoia League Varsity Cross Country Champions in 1968, 1969, 1970, 1971, 1972, and East Yosemite Champions in 1973. His sophomore teams were league champions in 1968, 1970, and 1972. With the emphasis changing from Fresh-Soph to JV, his JV team took the league championships in 1973. His 1973 team placed 6th in the Valley. Also his JV team qualified for the Valley. His 1973 team was probably his best team. The 1973 team tied with East in the Kern County Invitational for first place. Arvin placed second to Highland in the Area Meet, missing the championships by only 4 points.

When asked who were Bob's standouts on this year's team he replied, "I have the best group of boys a coach could ask for! I had 15 boys and 3 girls on the cross country team--none dropped out and it was only one more than was needed for the two cross country teams and the girl's team of three. At Arvin we have quality not quantity! Jesse Garcia was our outstanding runner (he is a sophomore) but his times were not that good (9:58). Junior Reyes, Isaac Salcido, Bobby Castro, Jesse Rodriguez, and Reggie Medina all ran together and were the heart

of the team--not fast but consistent and together (just like Madera, but not as fast)." It should be pointed out that Bob is only losing two seniors this year and will be a threat again next year.

Who were Bob's outstanding runners in previous seasons? His first standout was Ernesto Contreras (1965-66) who was in the top ten in the Valley as a sophomore and a junior, but who quit school. Next was Sergio Rodriguez (1970-71) who set a school record for the two mile in 9:31.9 and was the first school representative at the State Track Meet in 14 years. Next was Richard Rodriguez (1969-1972) who broke Sergio's record and also set a school record in the 880 with a time of 1:58.

When asked what kind of training his team follows, he replied, "My basic theory is that a team that is in the best physical condition to run can and will win most of the time. Workouts are distance twice a week 5 to 8 miles, and speed workouts (440's and 880's twice a week). We run in deep dirt or sand, up and down "sandhills" where we had our home meets until a complaint by an EYL school stopped us for future use of our course (the course was too difficult for them!). I work on a 70 second quarter-mile as being the best pace but only the top two or three runners can keep this up. Practice and distance running has to be fun and so the team and I have an enjoyable time at most practices. I also try to have them run 60 seconds for the last quarter on the miler. I also believe in L. S. D. workouts at the beginning of the season and Short Fast Distance at the end."

When he was asked how a student will benefit from a cross country program he replied, "Athletics help a student know themselves. Cross country is the best sport in high school or college because the student can compete at this sport all his life--unlike baseball, football or basketball. The student learns that he must not give up and keep trying--distance running proves to a runner that anyone can improve if they keep running during the summer and comeback and really try--distance runners must run year round (. . . as we all know)."

Coach Clemensson also has some ideas on how to improve high school cross country. First, he would like to see girls run against girls only, like they do in Bakersfield. He also feels that all cross country races should be lengthened to 3 miles. He feels that 2 miles is too short. He points to the Valley Meet and the confusion at the finish with over a 100 runners within a 60 second interval.

After discovering the times of his runners, when asked what his best times are he replied, "I won't tell."

MEET VALLEY ATHLETE

MIKE JURKOVICH of Bullard High School in Fresno. Senior, 6-0, 150 pounds. Born in Fresno, California, September 16, 1955.

BEST MARKS: Two mile 9:22.5 (State Meet '73); two mile cross country, 9:14.

TRAINING: Twice a day, six days per week, 9 months per year. 55 miles a week. Morning workouts medium to long distance at a comfortable pace. Afternoon workout for quickness and speed. Coached by Will Olds.

Mike won the Fresno City Cross Country meet, the NYL meet and the North Area Divisional--he placed second in the Valley Championships. He won the Valley Two-mile track title last season. His 9:22.5 is the Bullard High record.

For a favorite event, Mike finds it hard to choose but feels he likes distances of two miles or more. He likes to stay in top shape all season rather than pointing and peaking for one particular race. His favorite strategy is to take over one fourth of the way through the race and carry it on in. Training rules include 8-10 hours of sleep and plenty of Vitamin "C".

Mike isn't sure yet where he will go to college next year but plans on attending an institution with an outstanding track program, so he would be able to compete at a high level.

Coach Will Olds is, understandably, proud of the accomplishments of Mike and says, "Mike works out twice a day and once on weekends. He averages about 50-55 miles each week. His morning workouts are on his own, usually 3 to 5 miles. His afternoon workouts at school are more quality workouts, usually 2-5 miles at a 75 second pace and faster. He runs a lot of short runs, 100 to 200 yards, at a fast pace.

"Mike is a very competitive person. He is driven by a fierce personal pride. He's serious toward his running and achievements in running. Mike carries a 3.6 G. P. A. and also has a part-time job

"His best marks as a sophomore were 4:30.8 in the mile and 9:29 in the two-mile. As a junior his mile was 4:26 and two-mile, 9:22. His best mark is his 9:23.8 on a slightly hilly cross country course which is considered a medium to slow course. This mark held up through the valley meet.

"This year in track, Mike will run many miles in meets, but likely settle on the 2 mile for the valley. Mike is just beginning to run his 2 mile like he should. He hopes to be in the top 10 in the State Meet this year. From a coaches standpoint, Mike is an excellent runner to coach."

MEET VALLEY ATHLETE

JIM HUEBNER of Bullard High School in Fresno. Senior, 6-0, 155 pounds. Born in Fresno, California on July 20, 1956.

BEST MARKS: 440 -- 51.6 ('73); 880 -- 156.4 ('73); Mile -- 4:19.0 ('73); 2 Mile -- 9:51 ('72); 3 Mile-- 15:25 ('73); 6 Mile -- 31:49 ('73); discus -- 102-6 ('73).

TRAINING: Twice a day, six days a week, eight months a year. 50-60 miles a week. Mornings consist of 5-6 miles with Mike Jurkovich. Monday and Wednesday afternoon--hard, fast runs mostly on the grass. Tuesday--weights and two repeat miles under 4:30. Thursday--light weights and easy run. Saturday and Sunday--long runs. Coached by Will Olds.

Jim may appear to play second fiddle to Mike, however, that isn't the case at all. Jim has many honors and credits himself. He was voted "Most Outstanding" in both cross country and track in both 1972 and 1973. He placed second in the Valley mile in 72-73 as well as finishing third in the Valley Cross Country Championships.

Jim competes in track, "...because the work you have to put into it makes the winning, or just improving, seem like the best thing in the world." The racing strategy most frequently used is to hang on and kick. He hopes to run around 1:52, 4:14 and 9:25 this coming track season and would eventually like to break 4 minutes. For college he plans to major in business as well as continue his track career. He feels Stanford has the good business program and Fresno State the track program.

Jim is a humble champion and quick to say, "The biggest assets to my running career were my parents Coach and Jurkovich."

Coach Olds says of Jim, "Jim came to Bullard as an excellent tennis player with no background of running. During his sophomore track season his first 2 mile race was 9:57. That was his first track meet with only a weeks work. His best time was 4:23.8 as a sophomore. His junior year he was 3rd in the Valley in cross country. During track he had a 4:19 and a 1:56 half-mile. This year Jim will take a good look at the half before he decides what race to run in the Valley.

"Jim has a variety of talents, he is a top tennis player also a fine basketball player and skier.

"Jim has a happy carefree personality. He is easy to work with and eager to compete. His biggest weakness was lack of experiences in races. Now he is a seasoned competitor and a tough runner to beat. Jim does about the same type of workout as Mike. Both runners plan on running in college."

VALLEY VIEWS

On Sunday, December 16, two Valley athletes participated in the First Rim of the Pacific Marathon held in Hawaii. Fresno Pacific's Don Gregory placed seventh with a 2:47:30 in the field of over 150. Dr. Jeff Stone placed 120th in just over four hours. Gregory led through the first five miles before being forced to search out rest rooms on two different occasions. The eventual winner was Duncan McDonald in 2:37:34.

HILL AND DALE RUN

OR

THE HART PARK LARK ALL IN THE DARK--RACE?

Great field--over 140 runners--what a field! Tracy Smith, Granillo, Sam Garcia, Bob Price, Ed Cardena, Juan Garcia, plus a top high school team from Arcadia. Weather 40°---fog 1st mile--first group 4:35--I went by at 5:00 (tail end of first group). Then we started to climb--for a 1/2 mile--very steep--with switch backs. You could see the leaders in the fog above you. After 1 mile of hills you jump a fence--then run up more hills--at about 2 1/2 miles the leaders were a good 440 ahead of us (Smith, Price, Cardena, Garcia, Granillo). Then things started to change fast--Cox was 60 yards ahead of me with Huebner--White of Roosevelt was 30 yards behind me--someone yelled, "We're going the wrong way!" (All kinds of things were thought and yelled). The front group was still going on, they didn't stop until they came to a dead end. PANIC. Front leaders now were last--1/2 mile back. The tail end was now the HEAD! So like a large wave they started coming down the hill with the tailenders now the leaders running like "hell" trying to keep the lead and other smarter runners trying to run just to stay away from the "cloud of dust" of arms and legs coming down the hill after them. So now a race of 6 miles was now a race of 6-7-8 or 9 miles depending on where you were when they sounded the "PANIC" button. (I must have been about 20th when we were turned around and I ended up in 11th place at the finish.) My time for .6 miles? or whatever was 42:40.

Funny things that happened: (1) When someone yelled "You're going the wrong way - the turn was a mile back" one runner said, "Don't tell anyone - we'll just turn around and start back" and another, "Tell every one they have to touch the fence."

(2) Another one yelled, "Line up the way you are in now - we'll stay the way we are now until we get back to the turn we missed.

(3) Someone said, "The heck with it" and just started walking back.

(4) But cooler heads prevailed. Everyone just took off down the hill like a bat out of Hades!

I must have passed 20 runners by the time we got back to the right turn off. I caught White and Huebner

was on my tail. I was trying to run as hard and as fast as I could - thinking all the time Tracy and crew took the RIGHT turn and they were miles ahead. When I got to the last down hill spot, about a mile and a half from the finish I could see Villalovous and Woessener about 200 yards ahead and no one in front of them. I thought, then, that Tracy and crew were finished, dressed, and on their way back to L. A., I only prayed that the judges would still be there to get our times.

With a half mile to go son Scotty yells, "get it on, Dad, you're in 10th place." That's when "super charger" Huebner kicked in. When the dust settled I finished in 11th place. I went to my car, put on my sweats, and walked back to finish to check on son Mike; here comes Tracy Smith 51st., and Juan Garcia 55th, as well as many other top runners behind my 11th place (Granillo 15th, Price 24th, Cardena 25th.). That's how it was the day I beat Tracy Smith, world record holder indoor three mile.

The post race awards dinner yielded superb food and all free. It was a great handicap race. Next year I'm going back and should do better, because I now know the course - 6, 7, 8, 9 mile. It won't matter which course they run - I'll know them all!

A TEAM IS BORN

This year is the first year for John Muir ever having a full cross country team, and also has proved to be an outstanding team for the size of the school, especially the 8th grade team. In the past John Muir has had a few good runners such as Patsy Cervantes who ran a 5:12 mile in the state meet placing first. Carla Irvine also running in the state meet placed third in the 880 in 2:24 as a 7th grader. Bill Hill ran a 55.8 and John Orosco a 4:45 last season. But this is in the past. This year Muir has the largest team (24 runners) it has ever had from a student body of only 430.

The 8th grade boys didn't form a team until October; and then they started rolling. They were undefeated in league meets (San Joaquin Junior High Cross Country League) and tied Clark of Clovis in the league championship. Coach Jim Arriaga feels they would have won the league meet had their number three man not been injured in Pop Warner football. They did place first in the Nipomo Invitational,

the Hanford Invitational, the Hamilton Invitational; the Kings County Championships, the John Muir Invitational, and the Clovis Relays. The outstanding runner on this 8th grade team was Manual Perez who ran exceptionally well considering this was his first year of running. He was the individual champion at the Nipomo Invitational, Hamilton Invitational and the Kings County Championships. His only defeat to a Valley runner came at the hands of Eddie Flores of Coalinga at the Muir Invitational. He later defeated Flores by 17 seconds over a 1.2 mile course. His time at the 1 mile in that race was 4:51.

Another outstanding runner from John Muir is Ramon Ramirez, a 7th grader. His first race ever was the 9th Fresno Invitational where he placed third. He was undefeated in league meets and won the league championship by 10 seconds. He won the Hamilton Invitational, Muir Invitational and Kings County Meet. As a 13 year old runner he is expected to do very well when track rolls around.
