QUESTION: I got shin splints one year ago during the indoor season. It is now one year later and I still have pain in my legs. I am so mad, I can't concentrate on my study.

DR, MIRKIN: The treatment of running injuries is always dependant on the cause.

We now know that all running injuries come from:

1) Overuse syndrome
2) Muscle unbalance
3) Structural defects
4) Lack of flexibility

Muscle unbalance is usually the cause of shin splints.

The muscles in the front and back of the leg are opposing muscles (see fig.1). The anterior muscles (tibialis) pull the front of the foot up while the posterior muscles (calf) pull the front of the foot down.


## ILLUSTRATION OF OPPOSING MUSCLES FIgURE 1

Proper training for competition in volves overextending and cutting back.

When a runner overextends, his muscles are injured. As the muscle heals, it shortens.

The muscles most often affected are located in the back of the upper (hamstrings) and lower legs (calf). This would explain the tightness in the back of the legs that comes the day after a hard workout.

Tightness (shortening) in the calf tends to pull the front of the foot down, thus putting added tension on the anterior muscles. If the runner tries to run fast, particularly on indoor board tracks, the tibialis muscle can be strained or torn (shin splints).

Thus the treatment must be aimed at stretching the posterior muscles and letting the anterior muscle heal.

## TREATMENT:

1) Posterior leg muscle stretching.
a) stand on steps and drop your heel below your toes.


HEEL LOWER THAN TOES
b) Toe touching


STAND KNEES STRAIGHT TOUCH TOES


SITTING, KNEES STRAIGHT
REACH FORWARD,
HOLD FEET FOR 5 SECONDS
RELAX AND REPEAT
c) Lean against a wall with your body $3 / 4$ of your height away from the wall and lower the heel.

2) Stop all running for 7 to 10 days to allow primary healing.
3) Start long slow distance. Do no intervals or fast running until there is no pain on running.

QUESTION: Can running with a. 20 pound jacket harm a runner?

DR, MIRKIN: Distance runners and sprinters aim their training at developing different type of muscles.

The distance runner wants an efficient, endurance type of muscle which is long and thin and requires less oxygen and nutrition for its use and has less power.

The sprinter and jumper has short, fat muscles which are larger, take more oxygen to feed and are developed primarily for power.

Heavy weights and explosive fast running tend toward the short fat muscle of power, while multiple repeats with a smali load tend toward the endurance muscle.

If your daughter is a distance runner, she is wasting her time.

If your daughter is a sprinter or jumper, she will benefit from the heavy jacket.

There is no evidence whatsoever that running with a weighted jacket will cause lasting damage.

QUESTION: Does cycling adversely affect the muscles used in running competition?

Henry Bent, Raleigh, N.C.

DR, MIRKIN: Certainly not.
The best training for running is running. As long as the bulk of one's exercise comes from running, no other form of exercise can possibly enlarge or stretch the muscles so that the runner will be adversely effected.

Swimming and cycling, although not benefiting or hurting running muscles, can be used to maintain cardiorespiratory efficiency while one is unable to run because of an injury.

Weight lifting to build up one's arms is not very beneficial, because the muscles developed by weight lifting are not used to mimic the arm motion used in running. If one wanted to build up the arms and upper body, one would carry weights while running.

To limit a young runner's activities, be it basketball, or anything else, because it could harm his running muscles, would not only be unreasonable, but also may decrease his desire to run.

## From the Editors WHY NOT NOW?

Sooner or later, the United States will catch up with the rest of the world in adopting the International system of age grouping by birth year, rather than by birth date. As a matter of fact, the appropriate rule changes have been drawn up for submission at the forthcoming national AAU convention, October 13-19 at Washington, D.C.
You can help eliminate the confusion and inadequacies of the present system, by making sure the representative from your area votes to approve the new age group legislation at the convention.

The proposed rule changes make January 1 (of the year in which the athlete is competing) the date on which his or her age group is determined. For example, all athletes who were 13 years of age on Januaryl, 1975 would stay in the "12-13" Division all year, no matter when they had a birthday during the year.

This would apply to all boys and girls competing in all Junior Olympic and AAU Age Group Track \& Field/cross country competition. Half of the JO sports already have adopted this system.

The large majority of nations of the world, including Canada, havethis system. The AAU National Junior Men's Championships and whenever we compete against other nations in Junior competition, we use this system.

You can help simplify age grouping, by supporting the birth year system. Why wait to change? Why not now?

## From the Publishers

The third annual National AAU Junior Championships returned to the University of Florida campus for the second year, but with three significant changes. For the first time there was a girls competition as well as a boys. The girls however had to be born in 1956 or later while the boys could be born in 1955.

The second change was a springy new Chevron 440 track that replaced an old surface that was very hard. The last change was the running of all races in meters rather than yards.

College freshman CLANCY EDWARDS scored a sold sprint double, winning the 100 and 200, both into a slight wind. In the 100, Edwards faced three national high school 100 yard record holders - GREG EDMOND, WILLIE SMITH and last years winner CARTER SUGGS plus the national high school freshman (9.5) and sophomore (9.4) class record man, HOUSTON McTEAR.

McTear, with a super-swift start, won the first heat in 10.5 while Suggs in 10.4 was .2 victor over an eased up Edwards in the second heat. Edmond downed Smith, 10.5 to 10.6 in the final qualifying heat.

The final proved to be a three man race despite the final times. At the 50 meter mark, McTear, with another quick start, held a two yard advantage over Smith, while Edwards had yet to seperate himself from the pack. At 100 yards, McTear still had a yard on Smith and the fast-closing Edwards. The final nine yards proved fatal for McTear as Edwards nipped him by a deceiving tenth.

Just as in the 100, the 200 evolved into a three runner race, Edwards, the College Division II champ, was the favorite, although high schooler MILLARD HAMPTON defeated him (both 20.9) in a heat that saw Edmond run third and CHARLIE WALKER (Lakewood HS, NJ) finish a non-qualifying fourth in 21s flat.
 HAMPTON, Silver Creek H.S and 2. WILLIE SMITH, Uniondale H.S..

In the second heat, Willie Smith built up a great five yard lead on the turn and won easily in 20.8s. National Junior College champ DON MERRICK won the third heat in 21.0 s .

The final saw Smith again blasting the turn, but Edwards spotted him only two yards before passing him in the stretch to win by a tenth. Meanwhile, Hampton had entered the straight even with Edwards and finished third, with the same time as Smith and five yards up on fourth placer Merrick.

The 400 was full of surprises. In heat one, EVIS JENNINGS, a 47.5 freshman in college, led by two yards with 80 to go, when high school junior RON HARRIS suddenly powered his way by the slightly built Jennings to win in 46.0 (a time which was the best ever by an eleventh grader and the third best high school time ever behind Ulis Williams and Ron Ray). Harris' previous best was a second place 47.5 in his state meet.

PALMER SIMMONS, whose previous best was $47.9 y$, finished third in 46.9. CURTIS BYRD, another Cal Poly freshman at 47.6 y , won the second heat in 46.4 to upset MARK COLLINS and last years second place finisher KEITH TINNER.

In the final, Jennings again moved to an early lead, but by 300 meters Byrd in lane two had assumed a slight lead over Harris who was in lane three. In the stretch Byrd eased away from Harris to win by three-tenths. Tinner held on for third, to again qualify for the USSR dual meet (for the relay, along with fourth placer Collins).

TOM BYERS, a college freshman whose best high school mile was only 4:18.0, totally dominated both 800 and 1500 m finals. In the 800 , the field was bunched at the quarter in 55.0. Then around the third turn Byers suddenly moved to the front and assumed a comfortable five yard lead down the backstretch.

Two or three runners made a charge at Byers but each time he would again build up a five yard advantage. MARK BELGER was the only runner who looked capable of catching Byers but he never really got the chance, but the high schooler managed to get himself boxed in for 750 meters and only by coming to a complete standstill in stretch did he get out. Over the final 50 meters Belger was the fastest finisher as he moved from fifth to second.

The 1500 final began to look like a re-run of last years mile. MATT CENTROWITZ, who was second last year, moved to the front with splits of 58.6 and $1: 59.6$, and then another college frosh CURTIS BECK went to the lead at the three-quarter mark in 2:58.2.

Byers, who ran only 20 miles a week as a prep, showed the benefit of his two-a-day college workouts as he blasted by Beck with 300 meters remaining to win easily. Byers $3: 42.8$ time is equivalent to running a mile in just over four minutes. STEVE LACY from Wisconsin became the fifth fastest high schooler ever by finishing fourth in $3: 47.2$, behind Beck and Centrowitz.

High school junior RALPH SERNA's chances didn't look good in the 5000 . Friday he had run the 10000 but he had dropped out with just over a mile remaining, looking tired. Saturday, in the shorter race he faced RICH KIMBALL the years top prep distance runner, with a best mile of $4: 02.4$, two mile of $8: 46.6$ and three mile of $13: 43.4$.

So, with two miles gone in the 5000 it was surprising to see Serna running on Kimball's shoulder as they moved away from the field. Even more shocking was Serna suddenly running a 67.5 tenth quarter after a series of 69 second laps. Kimball was unable to respond and Serna went on to a six second victory.

The winner passed three miles in 13:45.4 to break Craig Virgin's junior class record of 14:39.2. It was only the second time Serna had run three miles. The first was last summer when he ran 14:10.2 to set a national sophomore class record.

Collegian JIM BUELL won the 10000 with a steady burst of speed over the last two laps, but the real story was high school soph ERIC HULST who finished second, seventeen seconds back. Eric passed six miles in 29:32.8 which is excellent time considering the humidity (though he has run 20 seconds faster).

Third spot went to GUY ARBOGAST in a time which moves him to fifth on the all-time high school list. For sixth placer ROBBIE PERKINS it was third year in a row he has scored in this meet and he qualified for the U.S. junior team the last two years. Just behind Perkins was DAN SCHLESINGER, who was third in the six mile last year.

College athletes took the top seven spots. Freshman TOM McCHESNEY outsprinted BOB CHRISTENSEN to win comfortably, with third placer GEORGE MALLEY well back. The times for the first two rank them sixth and eighth, respectively, on the all-time U.S. junior list for the event.

Good high school hurdlers can't compete with good college freshmen, so the theory goes. The only problem is, high school junior DEDY COOPER isn't just good - he's great! After Big Ten champ PHIL STAPP nipped fellow collegian MIKE JOHNSON 14.2 to 14.3 in the first heat, Cooper easily took the second in 14.2.

In the final the field was off fairly even, but by the fifth hurdle Cooper had begun to move away to a victory, two-tenths ahead of Johnson and third placer LARRY BUNTING, another college freshman. Cooper's time of 14.1 broke the junior class record of 14.2 set in 1952 by the great Milt Campbell, who was Olympic decathlon silver medalist that year (and won the gold in 1956).

In the first intermediate hurdle heat, high schooler GARY SCHMIDT stunned the crowd with a winning 51.8. He had never before run a full lap of hurdles, but his time moved him into third place on the all-time prep list. GREG ECKMAN won the second heat with an easy looking 52.5.

In the final all eyes were on Eckman and Schmidt. Eckman ran smoothly, striding 15 steps between barriers the entire race, while Schmidt would sprint all out, hop the hurd7e, then begin to sprint again.

With 80 meters remaining Eckman was moving strongly but Schmidt was running out of gas. Suddenly, the crowd noticed that RICH GREYBEHL, who was in lane nine using the same style as Schmidt and battling Eckman for the lead. The college freshman finally prevailed as both runners were timed in 51.6 , with Greybehl replacing Schmidt as the third fastest prep in history.

Then he clears 7-1/4 but still trails Jankunis because of more misses. Finally he clears not only $7-7 \frac{13}{4}$ but also $7-2$, both on his third attempt! Unfortunately, while jumping at 7-3, Barrineau injured his ankle and was forced to skip the USA/ USSR junior meet. Still it wasn't a bad day's work.

EARL BELL continued to demonstrate that he is the best freshman pole vaulter in the nation. For the third straight week, the eighth place finisher in the NCAA cleared 16-8, this time defeating fellow freshman KIM SCOTT and indoor prep record holder TIM JOHNSON, both at 16-4. Jan Johnson's younger brother was third with more misses.

## JUNIOR WOMEN

In reality, the girls portion of the meet was a hastily improvised meet to qualify competitors for the U.S. Junior Team. As the result of late planning and dates which conflicted with other national meets 3000 miles away in California, half of the top eligible junior women were not present. Especially noticeable was the lack of contestants in the discus and javelin, which drew only four and two throwers, respectively.

On the brighter side, competition for the top spot in the jumps was keen. SUE HACKETT leaped $5-9$ but was only runner-up to Texan LOUISE RITTER (5-10) in the high jump. EMILY DOLE and KATHY DEVINE were less than an inch apart around 47 feet in the shot put, with the heavier 4 kilogram bulb.

Double qualifiers KATHY WESTON of Nevada ( 400 \& 800 meters) and ROSETTA BIRT (100 \& 200 meters) were impressive as was 1500 meter winner DEBBIE QUATIER of Washington state.

Girls interscholastic track is beginning to make a great impression on top quality track \& field. Direct products of high school competition, such as sprint winner ANGEL DOYLE, were prominent in many events here.

The gals took advantage of the super facilities of Bakersfield Memorial Stadium (with the "cushioned" tartan track), the well directed meet under the guidance of Gil Bishop and Bob Covey and surprisingly cool (well it was in the 80 's) weather.

Many of the top eligible competitors were missing from Bakersfield, having qualifield for the USA/USSR Junior Dual Meet in Austin, Texas. As a result of poor scheduling, the top junior women had to choose between trying to make the international team at Gainesville, Florida on June 14 \& 15 or trying for national honors here. Many competitors here should have been on the U.S. team.

100 yard Dash A weak field was made even weaker by the eliminations (due to false starts) of heat winners GAIL dOuglas and TERESA BAUGH. 2. There must be at least three timed or measured competitors in the event, which is part of a regularly scheduled meet (hastily improvised record attempts are not acceptable).
3. In the sprints, hurdles, long \& triple jumps, wind assistance should be reported (wind guage readings are best; wind estimate helps).
4. The weight of the shot, discus, hammer and javelin must be reported (some indication) that implements have been properly checked for weight and dimensions will help determine the validity of the mark).
5. In hurdle races, note height of hurdles as well as distance of race.

Data in the following lists include (left to right): (1) Time or distance, (2) Name of athlete, (3) Birth yeax, if known, (4) Home state, (5) Date of best mark

The Boys age group will come under the heading of Division I, II, III, IV and V. Each time we feature a Division, we will will spell out what marks are included.
