

THE RACE GOES TO THE RELAXED ...

Excerpted from an article in the LOS ANGELES TIMES, May 21, 1974

Would you like to run faster? You can, you know. All you have to do is relax.

"Well," says L.C. (Bud) Winter, "that's maybe not quite all. But relaxing is the main thing. The way to run faster is with a four-fifths effort. Just take it nice and easy. Remember George Allen's demands for a 110 per cent close to a record, says: 'That seemeffort? He's wrong about that. Going all-out is counter-productive. Our greatest athletes have been the sleepylooking guys".

Fair enough, but who says so? Who is Bud Winter?

He is a track coach, a specialist in sprinting. For many years, Winter has rated as the most consistently successful coach of sprinters on the planet.

During his three decades at San Jose State, Winter's sprinter's broke or tied the world record at all distances, from the 50 yards and meters to the 440 yards and 400 meters. For a period in the late 60's they held all 10 records at the same

"Everybody can learn to run faster, and most people can improve a lot. Your inherent speed is just part of it. The trained sprinter is faster, and the key is learning to relax under the pressure of combat. An athlete who wants to die for dear old Rutgers or San Jose State misses the point. He's no good dead.

"In an all-out try, your antagonistic muscles mess up your performing muscles. A clinched fist is the mark of a loser. So is a set jaw.

"Antagonistic muscles are the reverse of the performing muscles. For instance, it takes one set of muscles to extend the arm and another set to draw it in. Under conditions of tension, antagonistic muscles drag you back. Relaxation leads to full efficiency of performing muscles. The thing you want is leg speed, and relaxation achieves this. Therefore, to run at top speed you run with a four-fifth effort.

"This theory applies to other things too. Have you ever stood next to a shot putter who, after coming ed easy. I'm going to gun it this time'. The guy wants to set a shot put record, but when he guns it the second time, it falls three feet short of the first one.

"Another example. At San Jose, to get a man's inherent speed, we measure him at 30 yards with a running start. If he is any kind of athlete, he'll do it the first time in 3 seconds. Then we talk it over and I tell him to have two things in mind when he runs it again -keeping his hands loose and his jaw loose. At that time, invariably, he takes from 1/10 to 2/10ths off his speed

"I was chairman of relaxation research in Navy Pre-Flight during the war, working with all kinds of people. We took guys who failed in gunnery, who froze at the controls, and made them into some of the best shooters in the navy. We had 100 per cent results. After six weeks in our relaxation program they could fall asleep, if they wanted to, in two minutes.

"To be a great sprinter, it takes perfect form. You've got to have that to reach your full potential. Some sprinters don't have good form. Bob Hayes still runs like he is pounding grapes into wine.

"There a re quite a few essentials to acquire perfect form, starting with high knees. A man doesn't walk with his knees up, so first you have to develop the muscles for it. The second and most important essential is foreleg reach. The knees have to be pumped high but they can't be pumped straight down unless what you want is to run in place. A long stide is obligatory. If your stride is only one-quarter inch longer than the next guy you'll beat him by eight inches at 100 yards, other things being equal.

"But a long stride is hard to learn. The tendency is to bring the knees down like a drum majorette; they make lousy sprinters.

"Other essentials are good arm action, lean forward, run tall, and dig a hole in the track with each foot as it comes down. Run as high on your toes as you can, and bound forward, not up. One foot should always be on the ground and working.

"Very often the difference between winning and losing is the ability to reafirm the fundamentals near the end of the race. A loser's form deteriorates in the last 15 or 20 yards. The champion is able to emphasize his form there; because we have drilled him on it every day.

"It is not how long you work but what you do. And the key is the right kind of exercises. Two or three hours of aimless running a-complishes very little. A sprinter can sustain his form with an hour and a half of exercises, five or six days a week. The only other thing they would need is the ability to relax"

THANKS, BUT NO THANKS...

An open letter from DAVE SANCHEZ, Coach of the Duke City Dashers, of Albuquerque, New Mexico.

We would like to thank the Blue Angels Track Club for their generous hospitality during our recent visit to Los Angeles, for the Southern Pacific Association AAU Age Group Championship.

We hope to return the favor when they

come to the Duke City some day.

We were quite disappointed in the meet however. We realize that little things happen once in a while that can't be helped, but so many things happened during this meet that it seemed that this was the first meet these people have ever put on. For instance:

- 1) No wind guage was used (luckily the athletes were going into the wind).
- 2) During the 10-11 440 Relay, we were put in lane five for the starting man, our second man was placed in lane six (even after protesting to the exchange judge), our third and anchor men were placed in lane seven (even after they had protested also).
- 3) The 9-Under 440 yd Dash was not staggered. All ten runners were placed

on the same line and told to break at a certain point. This race should have been staggered and with ten runners, there should have been two flights.

4) At the start of this race two of my boys were tripped and hit the track.

No recall gun was started! After protesting bitterly, I was told by the starter, "We can run them over". After being told that he couldn't do that, he stated "It doesn't matter since both runners were from the same club".

I couldn't believe this guy. Regardless of who is involved, a fall within 10 yards of the starting line means that the race is to be recalled. The starter's decision brought no satisfaction to me or my runners.

I was most disappointed that the meet director didn't step in and help settle the issue.

5) In the 440 Dash of the 10-11 division, there was one more runner than lanes, so instead of running two flights they doubled two of my boys in one lane!

I protested this and was told to "get lost". I asked the starter why he staggered this race and not the 9-Under 440, and he answered, "We learn from our mistakes". I am sure he must have learned a lot at this particular meet.

- 6) It was an extremely hot day, but that was no reason to allow people to just sit on the track.
- 7) During the 880 Medley Relay, my boys were not permitted to place their marks, while other teams were.

These and other minor mistakes were quite demoralizing for a group of kids who had looked forward to a good meet and a good time.

They were ready to head home by 11:30 and it was difficult to keep them up to finish the meet. I had a hard time staying myself.

This meet was supposed to be put on by many clubs, yet many events were held up (starting with event #1), due to a lack of officials.

It was good to see that Albuquerque, only a fraction the size of L.A., can put on the good meets it does.

We cordially invite the people who will be putting on the Boys National Meet in August, to come to Albuquerque and see how it's done!

Most regretfully, we will be scratching that meet from our schedule in August,

- 1. Marks must be made on standard outdoor facilities (surveyed track with curb, reasonably legal jumping pits, throwing rings, toe boards, etc...).
- 2. There must be at least three timed or measured competitors in the event, which is part of a regularly scheduled meet (hastily improvised record attempts are not acceptable).
- 3. In the sprints, hurdles, long & triple jumps, wind assistance should be reported (wind guage readings are best; wind estimate helps).

4. The weight of the shot, discus, hammer and javelin must be reported (some indication) that implements have been properly checked for weight and dimensions will help determine the validity of the mark).

5. In hurdle races, note height of hurdles as well as distance of race.



WASHINGTON, Pa - May 19 - from JOHN HARWICK

BRIAN PHARR and GINA PIATT were voted the top stars in a constellation of stellar performers from 26 eastern track teams. Brian, from Philadelphia's Morris Estate Track Club, was chosen on the basis of a brilliant 12-13 880/mile double which led a whole host of many terrific middle distance performances. There were four 9-under half-milers faster than 2:37.1 (!) and four 10-11 milers better than 5:26.

DAVID SAUNDERS, the first U.S. 11 year-old under 60 seconds, ran a marvelous 54.9 here as a 12 year-old (this surpasses all previous times reported for the age by a big margin). David led three other 12-13,s under 57 seconds.

Gina Piatt's superior 12-13 weight triple, in which she exceeded 100 feet in both the javelin and discus while missing 40 feet in the 6 pound shot by less than five inches, inspired two of her Mt. Lebanon 10-11 teammates to better 32 feet in the shot. Other super 12-13,ers were the D.C. Travelers duo of MELISSA HILL (58.7) and LaROYA HUFF (25.6) in the long sprints. /Site - Washington HS/ Results:





Among the incredible detail reported in easy-to-read tabulated style was: (1) the wind reading on every race and every long jumper in every division plus the best legal mark if the best jump was wind-assisted, (2) details on the way in which ties were broken in the high jump, (3) the fate of non-finishing hurdlers, (4) the name of each runner on every relay team, (5) notation of every meet, district and national record bettered, and (6) indication of the events in which two or more age divisions were combined into one race.

Without doubt, meet director BILL PETERSON and compiler RICH EDE leave no stone unturned in getting accurate, speedy and complete meet results to all interested parties. Even hometowns of unattached athletes were listed.

Though variable winds held some performances in check, TERRI SABOL made use of the zephyrs to top 150 feet in the discus and EMILY DOLE shoved the 4 kg. shot over 44 feet. 


