CANADA TAKES A LOOK AT CALIFORNIA AGE GROUP SWIMMING

The author, National Technical Dirrector of the Canadian Amateur Swimming Association, recently undertook a study of one of the highly competitive age group swimming programs in the United States. His purpose was to gather facts for the formulation of priorities for competitive swimming in his country. Readers will recognize some familiar developments in age group track, in this article excerpted from the Swimming Times of England.

Age group swimming was spawned as a formal programme in the United States in 1952. Its aim was to meet a need "to move large groups of youngsters into mass swimming development programmes". But it grew faster than anyone could have imagined.

The new programme quickly spread around the world and drew millions of adherents to competitive swimming. But, in this rapid development, there were all sorts of unforeseen developments.

The big-name coaches, who hitherto had been able to draw the best available swimming talent, were pressed into having age-group feeder systems within their teams. This was because many young coaches, setting out in the sport, realised they could get in on the ground floor by training young swimmers and taking them through the ranks all the way to maturity. Thus, the supply of swimming talent to the top coaches was not so readily available.

COACHES EARN MORE WITH AGE GROUP

Young coaches found that they could earn more money by filling their programmes with scores of age-group swimmers. Meet organisers found a new and ready source of finance by running mammoth swim meets. Coaches found that young swimmers were capable of absorbing a tremendous amount of work. Ranking-lists and publishing the names of 11 year-old national champions, together with rewards and long trips to meets, in many instances, put undue pressures on the youngsters and often led to satiation at an early The question is whether age-group swimming is meeting the aims of its originators had in mind at its inception.

DOES AGE GROUP PRODUCE "THE GOODS"?

It has been said that few age-group champions and record-holders have carried on to success at the senior level. Conversely, some of the great Olympic champions have come successfully through the age group ranks to win success.

The writer, recently did a survey of age-group swimming in California. He analysed the operation of 22 clubs. It's seemed the obvious place to start because this is where age-group first saw the light of day. It was interesting to find that many coaches of age-group programmes were actually age-group swimmers themselves when the programme started 23 years ago.

The California survey of age-group swimming looked into four main areas: the swimmer, the coach, the parent and the programme. A different interviewing technique was used on each occasion. The aim was to "get under the skin" of the individual coach and the individual programme.

THE FACTS EMERGE

Although the study is still months from completion, many interesting facts have emerged. For example, it is not generally appreciated how much Californian swimming owes to recreational programmes which farm young swimmers into AAU teams. Another interesting point is that many of California's great swimming clubs have been the result of combined between 7 to 10 clubs based around a fine central swimming pool facility.

Age-group swimming in the United States has assumed gigantic proportions. It is not unusual for 3000 to 5000 swimmers to compete in a two-day meet. National records are published for all the age-groups upwards, starting with 10 and under. Often too much pressure is placed on youngsters to be the best in the country at an early age. There are other abuses of the system; notable parental projection, too many rewards too soon, too much training and too many meets at a tender age.

MAMMOTH MEETS

Because of the length of week-end age-group meets in California, many coaches only take their swimmers to compete in half of the first day's events and half of the following day's events. Many coaches restrict their age-group swimmer's participation in these big age-group meets to one 2-day meet in any given month. They also tend to restrict out-of-town travel to once a month and a big trip once a ... season.

Some coaches have thrown up their arms in despair at attending these mammoth meets and have arranged private conference meets between neighboring clubs.

HOW MUCH WORK FOR AN AGE GROUPER?

One of the critical questions concerning age-group development hinges around how much work to give a developing young swimmer. Physiological research has shown that youngsters, involved in endurance training at an early age, appear to have a greater possibility of realising what endurance potential they have at maturity.

However, some age-group coaches in California say that there should be a balance between the physiological and phychological. They are prepared to sacrifice some of the physiological development at an early age in order to keep the youngsters "unpressurised" as long as possible...in fact, until they are ready to do well in the senior ranks. But this is not always as easy as it sounds.

One thing is certain. Age-group swimming has branched out in many directions since the formal programme started and the early aims seem lost in limbo. What we have now is established fact. Swimming administrators must decide which aspects of agegroup swimming to retain in developing new goals for the future.

From the Publisher

Many of our readers will be surprised to receive this issue much earlier than usual. The reasons for this unusual phenomena were two-folds - First, we wanted the issue out for the Boys and Girls Nationals, and last (but definitely not least) I will be leaving for the Olympic Trials in Oregon (for a much needed vacation) and had to be done with all the mailing before June 15.

Usually, around this time, we wait a little bit longer before going to press, hoping to catch as many of the May meets as possible. Our initial list of best performers found in the center spread of this issue, reflects in many ways the absence of some of the better meets that were missed because of this early deadline.

Last year, the June issue (that came out in early July) already contained such high performance meets as the Central Cal and N.Carolina Junior Olympics, the Valley Conference (CA) championships, the Junior West Coast Relays, the So. AAU champs, the D.C. CYO Championships, as well as the Mound and Miami Valley Invitationals among many others. All those meets take place towards the end of May or early June.

Hardest hit by the absence of this material was the Boys lists, in which the depth in all divisions leaves much to be disired. We didn't even come out with a Boys Intermediate list (athletes born in 1960-61) as the results in this division were not sufficiently significant at this time to warrant inclusion, although the level of the marks on hand were already quite promising.

We'll make it up in the next issue with a "Frosh/Soph Report", in which some of the finest athletes in the nation competing in Junior High and High Schools will be highlighted. Some of the performances that we already have on hand for that feature will take your breath away. We just wanted to wet your appetite.

The next issue will also come out early (in other words on time), as our indispensable Bill Peck will be going to Montreal for the Olympic Games, and nothing will stop him from his third consecutive pilgrimage to the Games. He wants everything on paper by early July. I want, therefore, to urge all meet directors to send in their results as soon as their meet is over (Mark Becker, do you get the hint?).

Speaking of Olympic Games, everyone make sure to send in your entries on the Olympic Prediction Contest (see page 5 of this issue) and the Olympic puzzle (see April issue for details) before the July 10 deadline. They are a lot of fun and you can win prizes!

SCHOOL CONTEST RESULTS

SIX MINUTE RUN POSTAL CONTEST Results of Fourth Annual Competition Announced

Third time was the charm for McKinley Middle School. After finishing a close runner-up the previous two years in the Boys Intermediate School Contest (missing a win on tie-breaking rules last year), the Muncie, Indiana came up victorious in the 1975-76 contest. Coach Joe Rogers well-balanced five man crew was led by 2:12 half-miler RANDY HANEY, and two sub-5:00 minute milers, NATH-AN DROWN and LEE DAVIS, all of whom covered 4 3/4 laps in the prescribed six-minute span. It was the third try of the school year which got McKinley its winning total of 23 1/4 laps...the best ever achieved in the four year history of the competition.

Runner-up to McKinley was Clark Intermediate of Clovis, California, a Fresno area school long noted for an outstanding cross country program. Not only was Clark second among intermediate boys entries, but the won the intermediate/elementary girls competition, equalling the best girls total ever achieved. JENNIFER HEATON and TRACY SATOWSKI led Clark to the title by covering 4 1/4 laps each, tieing the best ever individual girls total. A perennial Clark rival, Kings Canyon Junior High of Fresno, took the third spot among intermediate boys.

Top domestic entry in the Elementary Boys Division was from Oakdale Christian School of Grand Rapids, Michigan (home town of a recent president we recall). GARY WARNERS led the way (he tied the highest individual distance ever in this division) as Oakdale totaled 19 3/4 laps, fourth highest ever among sixth graders or below. Actually, the best elementary entry came from overseas, namely from Tonbridge, Kent, England...the heart of distance running world-wide. Sussex Road County Primary School's five member team accumulated 20 laps with perfect balance (each boy negotiating four laps). Due to the interest shown in our USA contest, we are awarding special duplicate certificates to Sussex Road, without displacing Oakdale Christian or any other American schools. In the results below, the English lads have been inserted in the position they would normally occupy.

An area familiar to our contest, was once again prominent in all divisions. New Hyde Park (NY) schools garnered second in Elementary Boys, second and third in combined Elementary/Intermediate Girls and fourth among Intermediate Boys. NHP Road School was runner-up in Elementary boys by virtue of a tie-breaking rule (youngest total age) over Lorena Street School of Los Angeles. Defending champ Douglas Smith School of Alief, Texas was fourth this time.

Sixty-seven school teams entered this year's contest. Many entered more than one team and some entered all three divisions. Leading the way, as usual, in terms of total participation was the Syracuse (NY) City School District, which had 455 youngsters running last October ...they totaled 342 miles, which is a lot of distance in six minutes. Syracuse even uses the football scoreboards to keep track of the running time. Several other school districts have indicated interest in participating next year.

The 1976-77 contest begins as soon as school starts next fall. We will have some special Olympic momentoes for the schools with the top early entries (before December 1). You may write for sample entry blanks or look for announcement in July-August issue of Starting Line. Same general rules will apply.

Results from leading schools in the 1975-76 Contest appear below. All individuals of the first five teams in each division have been sent certificates. We thank all the participants and look forward to your entries beginning in September.



- 4. The weight of the shot, discus, hammer and javelin must be reported (some indication that implements have been properly checked for weight and dimensions will help determine the validity of the mark).
- 5. In hurdle races, note height of hurdles, as well as distance of race. * * * * * * * * * * * *

Most noticeable improvement reflected by the early results received by Starting Line through May 30, is the greatly increased use of metric measurement. Not only are open and age group running events being run in meters more frequently, but often field events are being measured metrically. While SL will continue to use the older system, at least temporarily, is listing field events... and grouping times made at metric distances along with other marks...we hope the metric trend will continue beyond this Olympic year. We look forward to the day, not far off, when the mile and "quarter" will be the exception, rather than the rule.

In compiling the girls best performance lists, we are happily getting more complete and accurate information from many areas. If you don't see your results recorded in Starting Line, most likely it is because we have not seen them. Remember, we welcome results from anyone... so send us the significant meet summaries from your area (dittoed, handwritten, typed, newspaper clippings or whatever). Just remember to include the basic information we need (see below and first page of regional news).

One new policy this year in compiling girls best performances lists: we are assuming that all times made in distance races (800 meter or longer) are valid only if they have been made on tracks with an inside barrier (curb or otherwise). Times made on all other tracks will be regarded as questionable. It make a difference folks, if the runner travels around the curve with a curb limiting the path. A curbless (short) track, which is illegal according to all rules, allows the runner to run about a half-second difference per lap. So we will regard the times made on these short tracks equivalent to wind-aided sprints, long jumps on downhill pits, etc. Information on the legitimacy of the track, included with the results, will be appreciated.

Information in the lists below includes (from left to right): (1) the girl's best valid outdoor performance of 1976 as reported in complete meet result summaries received at STARTING LINE by May 30, (2) full name of athlete, (3) home state, (4) date of best performance.

Performances included in the regular lists below have met the following criteria:





GAIL OLSON, 15 year-old sophomore at Sycamore High School, IL, stunned the track & field world with a 7-foot high jump effort, becoming the youngest person to clear that height.

That leap changed his life foreever, but it might be some time before Olson can handle the subtle pressures exuding from standing in the limelight.

And that's what his coach Gary Dinges worries about. Prior to his 7-foot effort, his best was 6-10 early in the season that was the state's best.

"Everything was perfect when Gail cleared 7 feet," said Dinges. "But everyone seem to expect more out of him than he may have. We're still only coun try folk, and I don't know how all this attention will affect Gail."

Coach Dinges was a distance runner in his youth and uses some of the techniques of distance running to help Olson, who runs two miles every day.

Distance running, Dinges maintains, pumps more blood to the muscles that propel the jumper over the bar. works," he adds with a smile. "We really can't break it down systematically, but our high jumpers get better lift and explosion."

Olson, a 6-4, 170-pounder also plays basketball and is on a rigorous weight training program all year around. "Maybe that also helps Gail," said the coach. "We just don't know enough about the high jump to figure out how it works".

What Dinges understand well is the forces that will adversely affect Olson. "I know there is no way to avoid it, but I am worried how he will take all the pressures that are sure to build up."

"I really don't know all the reasons for Gail's success, but he certainly is more mature physically. But what is success? If you could only put it in a pill and sell it, you could make a fortune".




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
