OPEN LETTER FROM THE COORDINATOR OF THE AAU BOYS NATIONALS ...

The Orange County Blue Angels Boys T & F Club would like to thank all the clubs and unattached participants for their good sportsmanship during the 1974 National AAU Boys Championships held in Pasadena, CA.

It was very rewarding to see a great number of clubs from all over the United States. Also, the kind and complimentary comments are appreciated and aknowledged.

However, as may be expected in a championship where there are over 600 athletes and countless preliminary heats for all the events, it is impossible to satisfy everyone, much less go through the complete program without problems.

The following criticisms and/or comments have been heard and deserve to be mentioned:

1) TRACK & FIELD FACILITIES: The City of Pasadena sponsored the championships and offered any of the city's track facilities. The OCBA Club manned by only its volunteer members chose the Pasadena City College facility because of the crowd control set-up and its much better track. The warm-up area was isolated from the competition but this afforded the participants complete con-

NEED FOR SCHEDULE CHANGES ...

I would like to thank Meet Director Fred Davis, the Orange County Blue Angels and the City of Pasadena for the outstanding job they did at this year's Boys Age Group Nationals. The only quarrel I have with the meet is its late date.

The Girls Nationals were held on June 25/26, while the Girls "Junior" Championships took place June 19/21. Next year's Boys Nationals will be August 9 and 10.

August is just too late in the season. Most clubs begin training in February (or earlier) and attend local Association invitationals and Championships, state and/or regional championships and the Jr.Olympics.

These meets run well into late June and early July.

To keep sharpening your young athletes for competition in August can be extremely taxing and increases the incidence of injuries. Many top athletes have either changed age-groups (the birth year system should be adopted) or gone on vacation and lost their conditioning.

The AAU should standardize the dates of association Championships and the Junior Olympics, as well as schedule the Boys Nationals earlier in the year. This year, boys association championships were held as late as June 29 (Inland Empire) with most falling between May 18 and May 26 throughout the country.

centration for warming up. The only delays between warming up and competing were during the running events for the decathlon. This could not be avoided.

2) SEEDING OF PARTICIPANTS:

Due to the number of participants expected for the competition, it was felt that athletes coming from out of state would be at a disadvantage because of their early entry, while local participants could wait until the last week end to turn in a low qualifying time. The seeding by alphabetical order was fair to everyone and was acceptable to local AAU officials. As a note of interest, many participants did not come anywhere near the qualifying times they had submitted.

3) EVENT TIME SCHEDULES:

The schedule as presented in the entry forms were adhered to, with the exception of the hurdle events. The change was due to five participants entering two events that were scheduled one after the other. The competition started late, (e.g.20 minutes to 1 hr and 25 mns., due to lack of timers and judges). However, once the competition began, the events were run very efficiently.

4) OFFICIALS:

In a meet of this stature there should not have been the need to go to the stands for timers and judges. This was the reason for the late starts

Junior Olympic competition ran from May 25 in Arizona to July 20 in Region XI (Wyoming-Montana-Dakota). Most J.O. meets fell between June 15 and July 14.

An <u>example</u> for 1976 might be: Assn. Championships - May 22 or 29; State/Reg. Championships - June 4/5; RRCA Postal Mile - June 12; Junior Olympics - June 19/20 or 26/27; Boys Nationals - July 2-4

The Nationals from July 2-4 would be a real natural. It would not only be our nation's bi-centennial, but also an Olympic year. After 1976, the Junior Olympic and Boys National dates could be permanently switched if desired.

Our club is fortunate to have an outstanding facility available to us. Dablo Valley College in Pleasant Hill (23 miles northeast of San Francisco) has four long jump pits, two shot put rings, two pole vault runways and a nine lane all-weather track.

We would be willing to bid for the 1976 Boys Nationals. Let's just have it earlier in the year!

5) COMPLAINT DEPARTMENT:

The sign-in papers gave instructions for filing complaints. Several were filed, and while it is difficult to satisfy everyone who is complaining, it will suffice to say that the complaints were carefully considered by both the Meet Director, the Head Judge and Timer before the final decision was made. One decision of a relay team that was bumped off their lane was not a popular one. The decision was made in all fairness to the team that was bumped off and did not finish the event, as the passing line judge felt it was unsafe due to interference with adjacent lane.

In closing, the OCBA Club would like to thank the Pasadena Centennial Committee for sponsoring the National Championships. We feel we have gained much experience and would like to extend good wishes and much success to next year's host of the Boys National Championships.



1) 15 year-old KELLY JOHNSON, a member of the Valley Viking TC, (CA), topped the bar at 6-6, winning this event at the Boys Nationals at Pasadena.

2) Another Viking standout is 13 year-old MORRIS COLE. Morris was the double sprint champion at the Nationals, with 10.3 and 23.1 in the 100/220 races. In the picture he is seen leading (from left to right) GREG SMITH (PA), ANTHONY GIBSON (CA), MICHAEL PENN (PA) and DAVID SAUNDERS (D.C.).

3) At right of photo we see JOHANNA FORMAN beating NANCY SHAFER in a recent 880 race. The 14 year-old Falmouth, Mass. star (just turned 15) distinguished herself by winning the half-mile at the National Junior Olympics, defeating JULIE WISE of Maryland.

4) One of the finest young athlete to appear on the Age Group track scene is 14 year-old JIM FAVROW, from Manhattan, Kansas. This powerful and personable youngster emerged a double winner (shot and discus) from the Nationals. With RANDY FUSCO (Austintown, OH) providing strong competition in both events, Jim threw the 12 1b ball 52-10 1/2 and the 1.6 kg discus 140-0.

From the Editors

Last year, at least a dozen top U.S. age groupers were actually competing in the wrong age group according to information received by STARTING LINE. Most of these athletes were too old for the age group in which they were competing...according to present rules.

A very prominent coach told us recently that he purposely put some 12 year-olds in the AAU 10-11 division, because the 12-13 division was too tough. Though no attempt was made to take disciplinary measures against this coach, a number of other coaches have been disciplined or banned because they entered athletes in the wrong age division.

At least one member of this year's U.S. Junior team which competed against the U.S.S.R. was not eligible for the team because she was too old. But she was allowed to compete anyway. On the other hand another athlete was allowed to compete in the preliminaries <u>but not the finals</u> of her biggest meet of the year, because her birthday happened to occur on the second day of the two day meet.

These are only the most recent examples of a long series of injustices, violations and just plain cheating largely brought on by the needless confusion of the present AAU age group system of determining age group by <u>date of birth...a</u> system that can and should be changed.

More and more programs are incorporating the idea of a "cutoff" date for determining an athlete's age group. Eastern Girls Track League uses April 1, Valley Conference (Ca) uses March 1, Junior Olympic Track & Field uses May 1 (though most other JO sports use Janauary 1 as do many CYO programs and Canadian age group programs). <u>All</u> programs which have a series of meets must have a "cut-off" unless the goal is endless confusion.

The simplest, easiest to administer and most universal is the January 1 "cut-off" date. In other words, an athlete's age group for the entire galendar year is determined by his or her birth year. STARTING LINE believes it long past time when all AAU and Junior Olympic track & field programs incorporate this commonly accepted international system.

If you believe the same, encourage your local representative to the AAU National Convention (October 13-19 in Washington, DC) to vote for the rule changes which have been submitted to take care of this thorny...but unnecessary...problem. Then we can move on to other things.

COMMENTARIES BY MAX ZUCKER

Close to 600 young athletes from 24 states participated in the third Annual Boys Age Group Track & Field Championships.

Hosted by the Orange County Blue Angels T&F Club and sponsored by the Pasadena Centennial Committee, the meet attracted 75 of the best Boys teams in the nation .

Originally scheduled to take place in Lenoir, N.Carolina, the meet was subse-quently transfered to California and awarded to the Orange County Blue Angels.

Meet Director FRED DAVIS and his dynamic wife LOUISE did a tremendous job of organization, considering the time element and the usual lack of assistance, especially in the area of officials.

In meets of such scope, there is bound to be some complaints and Mr. GARCIA, the meet coordinator has tried to answer some of the criticisms in an open letter to S.L. and which has been printed in the FORUM page (page 2) of this issue.

MEET DIRECTOR FRED DAVIS ON THE GO. . AND GO ...

Boys 14-15 Division

Two double winners in last year's Nationals, DWAYNE EVANS (as a 14 year-old) and JIM FAVROW (in the 12-13 Div.) came right back and did it again.

DWAYNE, who now resides in So. Cal, took both sprint titles for the second year in a row. In the 100, he resis-ted the strong challenge of OSCAR SINGER and JAMES CHESTNUTS, top speedsters from the Columbus Community TC of Ohio (Singer went on to be the star in the long jump, recording 22-0 3/4), and in the 220, Evans just ran away from the field, with last year's 12-13 Nat. Champ TERRY SMITH (Colorado Springs) edging Philadelphia's AARON HARVEY by an inch.

14 year-old JIM FAVROW from Manhattan KS, probably the best young prospect to come along in the weight events, had no trouble adjusting to the higher division, collecting once more the Gold in the Shot and the Discus. In both events he was challenged by RANDY FUSCO, the 6-foot, 210-pound powerhouse from Niles, Ohio, particularely in the discus event.

WILLIAM CONTEE from Washington, D.C., emerged on top in a good 880 field, outlasting 14 year old Philadelphian BRYON McMILLAN. Runner-up in the long jump, MARK CLAYPOOL from Sugar Grove IL, went on to win the quarter in good time.

Topeka's JOHN HARDESTY had sweet revenge in the 180 Lows, after having been soundly beaten on the 39" Hurdles by JEF-

FREY JONES of Metairie, LA. Among other highlights: MIKE MAYHEW (Athens, OH) and JAY BENDEWALD (Mead, WA) won the distance events with relative ease, and 14 year-old KEVIN BUTLER from Columbus OH, won another Race Walking title.

KELLY JOHNSON and JAMES EARNEST, both from El Monte, CA, displayed their fine talents in the high jump and pole vault, respectively, while Salina's CURTIS SELLS was the master in the triple jump, with 14 year-old PAUL BATES (Menlo Park, CA) not far behind.

The Columbus Community TC was totally unbeatable in the 440 Relay, recording a fantastic 42.8 (!) in the heats.

The Mallory Challengers, the Intercity Striders (both from Philadelphia, PA) and the Long Beach Lancers provided a fitting climax to this excellent meet, finishing .2 apart in the 880 Medley Relay, bringing the spectators to their feet.

BOYS 12-13 Division

The East sent the best they had but couldn't stop Califor-nia's top sprinter, MORRIS COLE from Pomona, from taking both sprint titles. Morris was particularely devastating in the 220, breaking the tape way ahead of Philadelphia's Best GREG SMITH. Greg was also the runner-up in the 100 and took a 3rd. in the long jump. One should note the 4th place standing in the sprints (and 2nd spot in the shot) of 12 year-old ANTHONY GIBSON (San Fernando, CA). This young man is loaded with talent and will be a definite threat in this division next year.

DAVID SAMAS, from Sacramento, CA, had an easy win in the long jump at 18-6 3/4, and was a strong runner-up in the 440 behind the very gifted DAVID SAUNDERS (Washington, D.C. CYO).

Tall and lanky NATHANIEL CHRISTIAN from Denver, made it two years in a row in the 880. This race was truly national in scope and in class - the first 6 places were filled by athletes from six different states, and 2:07.8 was only good enough for third spot!

Iowa's MICHAEL DIMENT had his reputation of a sub-4:40 miler to protect. He didn't disappoint, whipping an excellent field of top milers from many states. The ASSUMMA twins, CHUCK and FRANK decided to concentrate on the 2-mile, finishing 1-2, as expected, 150 yards in front of the fine distance ace from Sewickley PA, TOM RHODES.

MICHAEL PENN of Philadelphia, combined speed and technique to completely rout the opposition in the 70 yd Lows, tying the meet record of 9.1 in the process.

RANDY LESEBERG from Dubois Wyoming, attempted an unusual double, the pole vault and the discus...and won both. JOHN KEIZUR or Eugene OR, topped the bar at 5-6, gaining

close win over an evenly matched group of high jumpers. SCOTT SCHWAB (Manhattan, KS) performed well enough in the

triple jump for a solid victory, well earned after a good season. Hubbard's (OH) WALLY ANGELO didn't have much problems taking the shot put title.

The Morris Estate TC of Pennsylvania had too much talent in the relays and no team could even get near them.

The photographers were told to look out for Jeffco's JIM BANICH (age 10) in the Shot. But we should have known better, as the shot put sensation of the year, WARREN SAPP just overpowered everyone with an all-time Best performance of 43-2 1/2. We can't say that we hadn't been warned.

RUSSELL BIRD from Calabasas CA and JEFFREY FROMMER of Lakewood CO topped the bar at 5-0 in the high jump, a performance that has been exceeded only once before. A 10 year-old from La Puente, CA, JAMES WILLIAMS, took a solid 1st place in the long jump over the very stylish CLAUDE RODRIGUEZ of Avondale, LA.

For the fifth straight season, the Southern Pacific AAU (southern California) sponsored the "Girls Age Group National Championship" meet. This year, it was held at Long Beach State's seven lane black Chevron 440 track.

Weather started off fairly nice but became cooler later with a chilling wind. Four age group divisions were contested and there were so many outstanding performances one doesn't know where to start.

In the 9 and younger group, probably the best performance was turned in by TANYA DAWKINS who won three individual events. Tanya won the quarter in 63.8, which breaks the old National Record (NR) of 64.4, but records are not kept (officially) in this division any longer; I think they should resume. Tanya had a previous best this season of 66.0 FRANKLE BAKER (68.9) made Tanya run the first 220 like on must in order to have good results in the quarter.

Tanya holds the US best for age seven (73.6) and eight (66.1) and now age nine. She also won the short sprints in 12.5 and 29.0 into a slight headwind in the 220. It wasn't easy, as STACEY GRANGER with her great start made Tanya come and get her. Stacey ran 12.5 and 29.2, bettering Tanya's age eight record of 12.6.

In this meet, at least eight National Records were set and one tied. In the 10-11 group, VICKIE COOK won the mile walk in a new NR time of 8:24.7, after having walked a 8:57.5 while just a nine year-old earlier in the year. She also won the first 3000 meter National Championship Walk for 13 and under earlier. At Long Beach, JOYCE BRO-DOCK, was second in 8:32.2 and it was Joyce's 8:30.5 record that her Rialto Road Runner teammate, Vickie, bettered.

SANDY BEACH dropped down to the half mile and was rewarded with a new record 2:21.7. During the year Sandy was beaten in the mile only by MARI GIBBS, who won the mile here. FORTLAND FORD of Philadelphia tied an AAU record by winning the 100 in 11.7 and she ran a good 220 too.

The best 12-13 performance was probably the 28.5 200 meter hurdles by JO= ANN ERB. TAWNY SINGLETON, age 12, won the other hurdle race in 12.1, which is one tenth of the National best mark, but is best for age 12.

PAULA ROSE was one of the biggest surprises with an unexpected 2:14.0 880 win. She won full of run and going away as she bettered the approved NR of 2:15.9, though not as good as Mary Decker's 2:12.7.

Hurdle races highlighted the 14-15 group. SONYA HARDY ran 14.0 in the 100 meter hurdles, but the race was windaided. She also ran legs on two relay team, one of which, the 880 medley, ran one-tenth of the NR (1:47.3) with Sonya running the anchor quarter. Just the day before, the Boulder Cinderbelle ran 13.7 in the Women's AAU Nationals to finish fifth.

In the 300 meter hurdles, SUSAN WHITE ran a great 44.7 to break her own record of 45.3. Sue has a best of 61.4 in the 400 meter hurdles in 1974.

DOLLIE FLEETWOOD, with fleet feet, ran 10.9 to better her own pending mark of 11.0. She had finished second at Bakersfield to 15 year-old ANGEL DOYLE. KATHY ADAMS won the two mile in 10:54.7 and CHRIS SAKELARIOS edged LINDA BRO-DOCK in a thrilling mile race walk. They walked together for most of the race with Linda doing the leading until the final straight. Both girls were timed in a record setting 7:49.7.

In these National age group meet, many best performances have been achieved. In think a meet of this type is needed and should be continued on an annual basis. San Jose started this type of championship meet in 1968 and it has continued annually since. Let's hope it stays around awhile!

NOTES by BILL PECK

Three great throwers did battle in the 12-13 weight events. Pennsylvanian GINA PIATT not only won the six pound shot at $41-3\frac{1}{2}$, but was an excellent second in the discus at 114-9 and tossed the javelin over 100 feet as well. CHRISTI PYLE narrowly lost the shot and had a PR 123-1 to win the disc (a double bettered only by Debbie Rivera as an age grouper).

Close behind $(40-1\frac{1}{2})$ in the shot was JACKIE NELSON, who also took the spear throw at 126-3 and was close to 100 feet in the platter. She's just 12111

Girls of all ages and in all events are obviously better prepared and more serious than in past years. None were prepared better than the handful of gals from the Pacific Northwest at this meet.

Spokane's SALLY LAYMAN and Portlands's "veteran" BAMBI FOULKES hardly missed a step in flopping to high jump victories in the 12-13 and 10-11 divisions respectively. Bambi jumped her own height.

DEANNA COLEMAN, just 12, of Washington was a brilliant third in the 12-13 880 at 2:15.2, but even more impressive was Portlander ERYN FORBES. Eryn merely demolished the best 12-13 mile field ever, running away to a 4:56.1 (second fastest ever for the age group), unfortunately on a suspect curbless track.

A strong second in the 12-13 mile was DONNA CAMPBELL, whose 5:02.6 is faster than older sister Robin ever ran as a 13 year-old.

Hastily planned, the meet could have been a disaster, especially considering the unexpected 700 plus entries and too small facilities. But meet director JIM ALLEN and meet manager RICH EDE, along with dedicated officiating crew who labored quietly from 12:00 noon to 8:00 pm, turned the meet into an "experience" which few wanted to leave, even in the gathering dusk.

One thing for sure. It was the biggest assault on age group best performance lists in girls age group history.

USA-USSR Junior Track and Field Meet June 28-29, 1974 Austin, Texas

Some great high jump and 1500 meter run battles highlighted the third annual clash between the juniors from the world's two greatest track powers at Texas University Stadium.

Junior men's team scores showed the powerful U.S. squad outdistanceing the visiting Soviets 133-99 (5-3-2-1 scoring). A strong visiting team of junior women downed a thin U.S. women's squad 82 to 64, for a combined score of 197 to 181 for the host Americans.

Vertical jumping was probably the best junior competition ever seen. New Yorker BILL JANKUNIS needed all of his 2.18 meter (7-2) clearance to win the men's high jump, with fourth place going at 6-10. The junior women were even better, relatively speaking. All four girls broke the previous meet re-cord, led by the USSR's GALINA PRILEPI-PINA at 1.83m (6-0). Close behind were New Orleans' SUE HACKETT (second at 5-11) and Texan LOUISE RITTER (fourth at 5-10).

Meet records were also broken in both 1500m races. Talented Ohioan TOM BYERS ran a brilliant 3:39.8, surging from behind to edge equally talented

pacesetter SERGEI ABRAMOV. Byers also made the U.S. Senior team. LUDMILA GORVUNOVA (4:25.5) led a Soviet sweep in the women's "metric mile", with tough, but inexperienced JAN MERRILL from Connecticut a close third.

Unlike the first meeting of the two teams in Sacramento (1972), the U.S. men completely dominated the distance runs, while continuing to sweep the sprints - with CLANCY EDWARDS winning the 100 and 200.

Men's field events were about even, with Soviet hammer thrower YURI SEDYK turning in the outstanding mark, a brilliant 226-11. However, the top athlete for the visitors was VLADIMIR BURIAKOV, who looked like one of the worlds' great decathlon prospects by scoring an amazing 7606 points (more than 200 points over Craig Brigham's meet record).

On the distaff side, Reno's KATHY WESTON was the star. She broke Mary Decker's meet record in the 800 meters at 2:03.7, after a tough battle with the visitors' RAVILLYA IZMAILOVA. Kathy broke her own meet 400 meter record too, but had to be content with runnerup spot to a brilliant 53.0 run by SHEILA INGRAM, from Washington, D.C. The two combined on a smashing mile relay win too.

LUDMILA USHATIK shocked her American counterparts with a swift 11.5/24.3 double win in the sprints. Both times were reported to be USSR junior records. The big U.S. female surprise was CHERYL BUTLER's 20-8 long jump, another meet record for D.C. girls.

American girls were badly outclassed in two of the three weight events and the hurdles, partly due to a very poor team selection process. But the shot put (4 kg) was a different story. KATHY DEVINE and EMILY DOLE exploded to give the traditionally strong USSR girls a closer fight than they expected (Kathy losing by only five centimeters).

U.S. head coach STEVE BARTOLD was highly complimentary of the conduct of the entire team, saying "In the men's events we scored a few more points than I expected. The same applies to the women's competition...it was one team. I don't want to single out any individuals".

USSR head coach OLEG KONSTANTINOV commented, "We set ten new Soviet junior records. I had thought the meet would be decided one way or another by about a five pointmargin. The U.S. squad was very well organized." ASARI GERCHINOV, head of the USSR delegation added, "I felt this American team was much better than the one we saw in Odessa (USSR) in 1973. I believe, they could have won even against an all-European team."

LINCOLN, NEB - AUG 9-12 - FROM SAM GIAMBELLUCA & PETE CAVA (AAU)

The assault on National AAU-Chevrolet Junior Olympic records began Saturday with 238 blue-chip athletes (age 14 thru 17) gunning for new standards in 20 events at the University of Nebraska's Ed Weir Track. Not long after the meet started the long expected rains came to Nebraska, but no one could tell what was falling faster --- the

downpour or the records. In the Girl's events, 17 year-old speed merchant MARY LOU JANOSH, from Oshkosh, NB, broke the 100 record in the prelims with a 10.7 clocking, before winning the event. She jumped the gun twice in the 220 and was disqualified.

JOHANNA FORMAN, the 15 year-old east Falmouth, Mass, high school student, won the 880 in a JO record time, bettering the six-year-old standard by a tenth.

CHRIS REMLING, of Encinitas, CA, took the gold in the high jump on the basis of fewer misses, with four gals tying the jo standard at 5-6.

RUDY PEARSON, 17, of Trout Lake, WA, an also-ran for 2

years in the mile Race Walk, finally won the event.

NATIONAL POSTAL SIX-MINUTE RUN CONTEST

STARTING LINE announces the third annual Six-Minute Run Postal Contest for school teams and physical education classes. The purpose is to stimulate physical fitness for boys and girls in elementary and intermediate schools.

We will award certificates to the five members of at least the top three schools in each of the following divisions: (1) ELEMENTARY SCHOOL BOYS, (2) ELEMENTARY SCHOOL GIRLS, (3) JUNIOR HIGH /INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL BOYS and (4) JUNIOR HIGH/INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL GIRLS.

BEST BOYS TEAMS

Elementary - St Rose of Lima (Brooklyn, NY) 1974 204 laps Jr HS/Int - Augusta Raa (Tallahassee, Fla) 1974 224 laps

1. SCHOOLS ELIGIBLE are any public or private school in the United States (graded or ungraded schools).

2. RUNNERS ELIGIBLE for a team must be in current attendance at a single school (AAU registered runners are eligible). In Elementary Divisions, runners must be in the sixth grade or below and must have been born after 1961. Runners in Junior High/Intermediate Divisions must be in the eighth grade or below and must have been born after 1959.

3. A TEAM consists of any five runners at the school, who run as far as possible within a single timed sixminute period on any regulation quarter-mile (or 400m) or 220 yard track - indoor or outdoor.

4. TIMING (of the six minutes) may be done with any accurate watch with a sweep second-hand.

5. MEASUREMENT of the distance covered is figured to the furthest 110 yard segment for each runner. A runner must complete 110 yards before the six-minute period expires in order to get credit for covering that distance. In case of team ties, the team with the youngest total age will be the winner.

GIRLS/ SHOT & DISCUS CONTEST

Mount Lebanon Track Club appears to be the power in the 1974 version of the year-long team contest for girls shot and discus. The Pennsylvanians may be factors in all four divisions, when all results and details are in.

After a summer of concentrated improvements by four strong teams, Mt. Lebanon has emerged the leader in the girls age group shot put with a team of national champ GI-NA PIATT plus 11 year-olds MARY MACIEJCZYK and KATHY TRAV-ERS. Three California teams also compiled excellent three girl totals (see results at right).

Mt. Lebanon may lead the age group disc too, but they as well as the Salinas Valley TC (Ca) and Flanagan Clan (Wa) have some questionable marks, which could be cleared up with additional info.

Surprisingly, two high school teams have scored well in the Junior Girls shot put, though such teams as Flathead Valley Timberettes (Mt), San Jose Cindergals (Ca), Sports International (DC), Nebraska TC and Mt. Lebanon are missing only a third eligible girl to take the top spot (it takes a trio for this team contest). Flathead Valley and Mount Lebanon are easy leaders in the Junior discus.

Team winners in each division will be determined on the basis of the furthest total.distance covered by five runners in a single six-minute timed run. All runners must attend the same school.

Contest entries may be sent at any time, but must be received by STARTING LINE no later than May 10, 1975, so that we may have time to tabulate the results and mail the appropriate awards before the school term finishes.

Early entries are encouraged and you may enter a school team more than once. ANY SCHOOL SUBMITTING AN ENTRY BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 1974 will receive a complim entary copy of the 1974 STARTING LINE HANDBOOK.

FEET POINTING IN VERSUS FEET POINTING OUT

QUESTION:

My son's right foot points out. What can be done?

> E.C. GREENWALD Louisville, KY

DR. MIRKIN:

I remember a newspaper article about a runner who became the world's fastest human and an Olympic champion in spite of a deformity requiring casts to be put on his feet the first few years of his life.

The sprinter was born with his foot pointing in (pidgeon toe). A physician, thinking that this was abnormal, put casts on the child's feet in an effort to turn the feet out.

Every football coach can tell you that the strongest feet in the world point in. The weakest feet point out. I have heard football coaches tell me that they pick their halfbacks by watching students walk in the corridor andasking the pidgeon toed students to try out for the team.

I have seen shoes with bars and even casts put on feet in an effort to keep the feet from turning in. No treatment is ever indicated in feet that point in, except when there is a twisting of the lower bones of the leg.

All parents who have kids with both feet turning in should be delighted. You may have a track man or a halfback. If both feet turn out, however, your kid will have to work very hard to achieve in competitive athletics.

Only one foot pointing out implies:

1) Injured nerve to the hip muscles (gluteus or hamstring) and could be caused by:

a) an injection into the hip; b) a twisting of the bone of the lower leg (tibial torsion);


2) Tight hamstring and calf.

A competent physician should be able to examine the child and decide if he has a tight hamstring or calf. If this is the case, treatment would be to stretch the hamstring and calf: A) With the knees straight, bend down and touch the toes. Hold the tight position for the count of ten. Relax for a few seconds and repeat for a total of 10 minutes. Do this exercise before each workout daily. B) Stand 3/4 of your height away from a wall. Lean toward the wall and rest your hands on the wall. You will note that your calves are tight and your heels are off the ground. Lower the heels to the ground. Hold for the count of ten. and then relax. Do this exercise for five minutes before each workout.

C) Lie down on the ground with your buttocks and youe heels touching the wall. You are on your back. Try to do situps but hold the situp for a count of ten. Relax and repeat for 2 minutes.

Heavy regular training will eventually correct the toeing problem. No casting, injection, surgery, heat or foot exercises can help and may indeed cause harm.

AROUND THE WORLD WITH CASEY

At the 1972 Olympics in Munich, I met a young man who teaches in the only high school in the island of Tortola in the British West Indies.

While most of the American men went out of the stadium every time a women's event started, this chap stayed and watched and asked me questions. It seems he had never before seen girls participate in track & field, although they did have some T & F for boys in their school. He went home with the dream of starting some for the girls. His name is Rey O'Neal. Not long ago he sent me some pic-

Not long ago he sent me some pictures of his athletes and their facilities. You think you have it tough? Rey writes, "Our training area is a tract of sand, covered with clumps of grass here and there. There is a 300m track on the field across the road, but this area is available to us only when soccer and softball teams are not using it."

Rey's two best athletes are DERRY FAHIE, very versatile and good decathlon prospect, and EPHRAIM PENN, a 15 year-old boy who has developed into the best all-around athlete in high school. Among the girls, there is ALMARIE MADURO, who at age 16 is considered Tortola's best all-around female athlete. Almarie ran crosscountry with the boys last fall, and in the spring she beat Rey himself in the sprints!

They have no Tartan runways, no Port-a-Pits, and none of the fancy equipment some of our youngsters have grown up with, but Rey was hoping to send a team to the mini-Caribbean invitational. His young athletes must be truly dedicated to the sport, and should be an inspiration to others who "don't have it so good"!

NEWS FROM ABROAD

Children of American Air Force and Army servicemen in Germany participated in a track meet, part of Independance celebration and sponsored by the Ramstein roadrunners and the Ramstein Air base central fund.

Major Ronald McKinney, formerly a resident of Virginia and now based in Sembach, Germany, reports:

"The meet was a huge success, which goes to show that kids like to run all over the world. We tried to run it as capably as possible, and the number and enthusiasm of the adult volunteers are proof that the Air Force and Army people here in Germany support very actively such healthful occupation for their children. Many of the adult volunteers didn't have any children at all, and helped out of a love for track and the recognition of the need for children to compete.

"There were 201 youngsters competing on the 440 oval cinder track. Ages were as of the day of the meet, and trophies were awarded for boys and girls in six different age groups. That meant a total of 108 trophies!

"Some of the highlights of the meet were provided by 13 year-old REUBEN ATKINSON, Jr in the 440 (63.5), by 7 year-old TIM PAUDLER who ran the mile in the good time of 6:56.9, and in the same event by MIKE McKINNEY, (the former Sports International prodigy and age-7 Mile record holder/Ed.) who recorded an outstanding 5:28.4 as 10 year old.

"All in all the results were quite good, considering that there is almost no competition over here and little training. We're planning on running these meets at least once per year and preferably more often. Some of these Americans kids are competing in the German "Volkslauf", which run from around 400m all the way up to 10,000m. All are out on the roads or in the woods, none on the track and competition in general is not tough.

"Speaking for Mike and myself, we are enjoying it here in Europe, but competition-wise we're a little stale and are looking forward to getting back to the States and some good training and the top-flight competition in age group races"



HI-YU SUMMER GAMES SEATTLE, WA - July 26 - 28 - from Jack Pfeifer

Over 800 American, Canadian and West German athletes competed in the first edition of this international extravaganza. Two separate stadiums had to be used for the boys and girls from forty teams, including invited guests from the Braunschweig Track Club in West Germany.

Some competitors from Washington, Oregon and British Columbia were stifled by unusually hot weather for the northwest. But this did not deter some fine battles in boys intermediate (14-15) division, notably the 400 and 1500 meters (won by MIKE ISHERWOOD and JONATHAN SMITH of BC, after tough battles).

Braunschweiger ANDREAS WOHLE won a nice high jump duel. Top American boys were Seattle-ites MIKE JACKSON and KEN NEAL, who had nice triples in the two youngest divisions, and Portlander MARK DAGG, who galloped a fine 12-13 1500 meters.

On the girls side, DEBBIE QUATIER cruised a sub-10:00 minute 3000 meters, but complained "that wasn't any fun at all" because of the heat. DIANE JOLIVET, a Seattle 11 year-old, cleared 4-7 in the high jump. Javelinists TRA-CEY CHILCOTE (143-4) and SONYA BENNETT were impressive as was Tracey's Selah, Washington teammate CHERYL ROULIER in winning two middle distance events. The best race of the day, however, was won narrowly by MARCHI WIERSON, age 11, from Portland, in the midget 800 meters.


