And so, after a four day battle with the flu, we decided the only way to catch up was simply to STOP, put out an issue with what has been done and begin anew with the May issue.


And that's what we have done. This will be the last of the small issues and everything sent to us will appear from now on. And no more hospitals! They're 'gross', as Number Four daughter says.

NEBRASKA WINS NCAA TITLE

Syracuse, New York, March 9/10: It took less than 6.80 seconds for Nebraska to capture the NCAA Indoor Championship once again. The Huskers sprinters - Merlene Ottey, Angela Thacker and Janet Burke - finished 1-2-3 in the 55m sprint for 24 big points and no one could catch them. Nebraska won only one other event - Thacker's upset victory over Carol Lewis - but that was enough. Gary Pepin's charges picked up points in the 500, hurdles, high jump and 4x400 to insure the win.

Tennessee, on the other hand, captured four events for 40 of their 48 second place points, but couldn't pick up the stray points to stay close to Nebraska. Joetta Clark and Cathy Rattray won the 1000 and 500 and the Vols took both relays.

Villanova surprised with its third place finish thanks to the 1-2 placing by Veronica Mc-Intosh and Patty Bradley in the 800. And we actually had an NCAA Championship where Disa Gisladottir did not win the high jump this is the first. Washington State freshman Mary Moore took the event at an even six feet,






