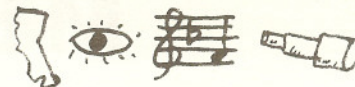
Whose left? Maybe the UCLA/Pepsi Meet will be the biggest of 1984 after all.

MT. SAC RELAYS

ASHFORD 10.88w

Walnut, California, April 24/28: The 26th Annual Mt. San Antonio College Relays produced an overabundance of fine performances.

Much interest was centered on Evelyn Ashford's first real outing of the 1984 season. The garrulous sprinter reeled off a wind-aided 10.88 after an early battle with Alice Brown for the lead. Merlene Ottey, trailing as usual for the first half of the race, made a good drive over the final 50 meters for second in 11.03.

Ashford was not so dominant when she returned later for her 400 contest against Chandra Cheeseborough. Running inside of Cheeseborough, Ashford ran a slowish first 200 in 25.1 and found she did not have the strength to match Cheeseborough's finishing drive. The ex TSU sprinter won in 51.05 to 52.11.

Francie Larrieu won the 3000 in 9:02.32 over some old rivals - Monica Joyce, Jan Merrill and Julie Brown. Merrill appeared several times during the last couple of days of the meet running the 800, 1500 and 3k. It's always a pleasure to watch Merrill run for one can see those wheels turning in her head at all times!

Darlene Beckford, Liberty AC, captured the 1500 in a close finish over Northern Arizona's Angela Chalmers, a British import. Michelle Bush led the race at 68-2:16.7-3:26.8, but Joan Hansen took over after three laps and was soon passed by Merrill who turned on the burners. 'Twas to no avail, however, for Beckford and Chalmers, who had run the first three laps in last position, passed opponents with mucho speed as Bush did not finish and Hansen was relegated to seventh.

There was a fantastic (for the USA) discus competition. Holland's Ria Stallman won it at 219'2 and Lorna Griffin's 202'9 good for only 6th place. Cal State Hayward's Diane Oswald had a mark of 160'4 - good for 16th! Other good marks included the 22'10½ mark by Carol Lewis in the long jump, the 22.13 wind-aided 200 by Valerie Brisco, a 66'0½ toss of the shot by West Germany's Claudie Loesch and Stephanie Hightower's 13.10 clocking for the 100m hurdles although no wind reading was given.

In another development, Sherri Howard, out of real competition since 1980, won the College/Open Division sprints in a legal 11.24 and a windy 22.78 to indicate she is getting ready for the Trials.

Jackie Joyner captured a competitive heptathlon with 6329 points with Cindy Greiner and Patsy Walker also over the 6000 point mark. So competitive was the competition that Mt. SAC's Li-Jiau Tsai set a new National Junior College mark at 5559 and only finished 7th.

PENN RELAYS

AR FOR VILLANOVA

Philadelphia, Pa, April 24/28: Villanova set a new American record in the distance medley, the University of Tennessee ran four great relays, Benita Fitzgerald had a legal 13.18 in her 1984 hurdle debut and seven 1500m runners were under 4:18 as the Penn Relays staged its umpteenth Annual Meet.

Villanova opened with a 3:21.4 1200 by Mary Ellen McGowan and followed with a 55.7 400 by NCAA Indoor 800 champ Veronica McIntosh. However, they were still in second place behind Tennessee whose Alicia Harvey had romped 3:21.4 and Ilrey Oliver's 53.3 one lap leg. But Patty Bradley blew the race wide open with her best-ever 2:01.3 for her 800 to Tennessee's 2:04.9 by Carol Davidson. Anchor leg of 4:34.9 by Villanova's Searby lost some ground to Joetta Clark's 4:33.4, but the Wildcats prevailed in 10:53.27, just a tick in front of Tennessee's 10:53.96, both teams under the old American Record.

Tennessee had quite a relay day with times of 3:30.99 for a win in the 4x400, 8:20.66 for a win in the 4x800, 44.89 for second in the 4x100, and the distance medley team at 10:53.97.

Other good performances came from Louise Ritter at 6'4 in the high jump and Sharrieffa Barksdale's win over Villanova's Patty Bradley in the 400 hurdles, 56.53 to 57.04.

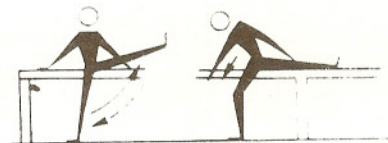

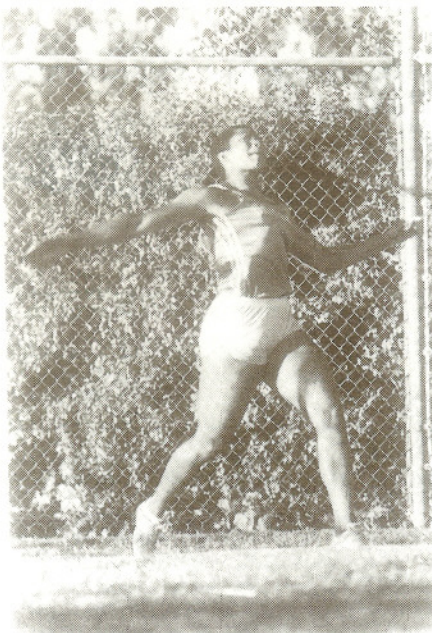

LETTER

"Your columns concerning the use of steroids is a sad commentary on the state of athletics today. It is disheartening to read that "Athletes will risk ANYTHING to win a gold medal", and that "The athlete who really knows what he is doing doesn't GET CAUGHT with (HGH) in his system". How far we have moved from the Olympic ideal when winning becomes more important than the contest, and we publicly commend cheaters. In all fairness, steroids probably should be made accessible to all, or to none; as long as debate continues, whether or not to use steroids will remain a personal choice. Certainly those who wish to compete AND to maintain a purity of body and spirit are discouraged from joining the athletic community. And sadly, athletes today are regarded by many of us as no better than drug abusers.

"About your article on Jarmila Kratochvilova. Our society already accomodates the athlete's freedom of choice; what your article suggests is that it now redefine its concept of femininity for the athlete, to make her more 'comfortable' with her choice. Frankly, I don't think that is society's responsibility. The feminist movement in this country has done much to insure that women are provided with choices unavailable to previous generations. Today's woman can choose a career as a homemaker, engineer, athlete or artist. Any choice we make will demand sacrifice. After generations of struggle, we have cast aside the burden of trying to please parents, teachers, husbands and children, and learned that the person we must please FIRST is ourself. The sacrifices an athlete must make are not those I would be comfortable with, but I can respect her choice and admire her accomplishment. It is an unflattering portrait when a discus thrower whose chosen path requires physical bulk complains that she is being treated unfairly because she is compared to women who are not required to make that same sacrifice.

"I don't know who Deanne Johnson's contemporaries are, but I know of NO woman aspiring to be either 'sterile' or 'fragile'. Today's woman is encouraged, if not required, to be independent, self-reliant, healthy and physically fit. Most of us can also AFFORD to be attractive. Eastern European women, given a measure of the economic independence and leisure time enjoyed by their Western sisters are quick to seek out the cosmetic counter and shed their babushkas, (if photo-journalists can be believed). Martina Navratilova is certainly a case in point, and as such, hardly an appropriate defender of your stereotypical Eastern European woman! And to criticize Mary Decker for curling her hair before a meet sounds suspiciously like sour grapes....whether she does or not, it does not seem to affect her performance on the track.

"Lastly, the athlete as a public figure should realize that she will be subjected to the same painful scrutiny accorded politicians, actors and royalty. The press IS unmerciful, but to whine that such scrutiny is unfair is childish as well as a waste of time. Like others who choose a public life, the athlete must learn to accomodate this unenviable lack of privacy with a measure of dignity. Like women who pioneered in other fields, the female athlete has chosen a course

that requires not only dignity, but stamina and grit. She will find, as they did, that quiet determination is more effective in bringing social change than acrimonious debate."

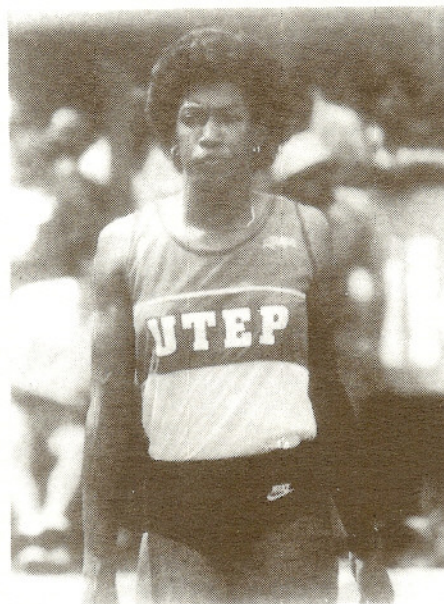
