

decision was made. I can't see how the family made the move without some sort of assurance from officials in England that all would be well.

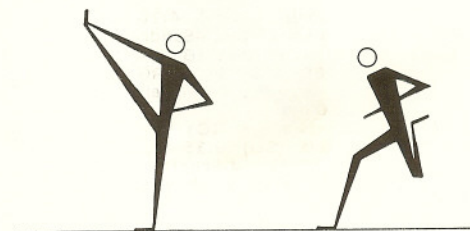
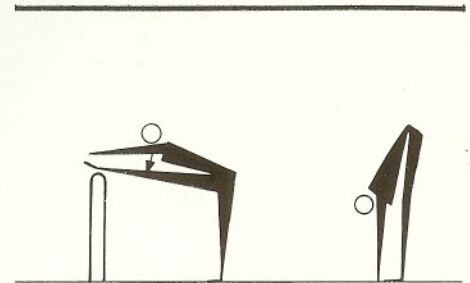

INDOOR WRAPUP

EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Goteberg, Sweden, March 3/4: The Europeans staged their Annual Indoor Championships and in spite of numerous non-entries as athletes aim for the Olympics, managed to turn in some fine performances.

Although no scores were kept, the Czechs dominated the meet with wins in the 200 (Kratochvilova), the 400 (Kocembova) and the 800 (Matejkovicova) on the track and the shot (Fibingerova) in the field. Fibingerova, now 34, won her seventh European Indoor shot title, most ever by a woman and equalling the men's mark set by Valeriy Borzov.

Poland's Lucyna Kalek won the 60m hurdles and became the seventh gold medal winner in this event for her country.

Fita Lovin, Romania, captured the 1500 in spite of her 33 years. Lovin sped through quarters in 64.48-2:12.86-3:21.20 on her way to victory.

As fast as Lovin ran, the 3000 runners took the opposite tack with the first 800 in a very slow 2:36! This, of course, set things up for lanky Brigitte Kraus, second behind Decker at the World Championships last summer, and she won her third European title in 9:12.07. Talk about prolific, Kraus has won 51 national titles over the past 13 years of running.

In the high jump, seven jumpers were still in the competition with the bar at 6'4¾! Ulrike Meyfarth finally won it on fewer misses at that height while Maryse Ewanje-Epee (France) and Danuta Bulkowska (Poland) were also over that height.

The three running Czechs turned in good marks. Kratochvilova's 200 clocking was 23.02 while the 800 winner, Matejkovicova, had 1:59.52. But it was Tatyana Kocembova who had the meet's best performance with her 49.97 win in the 400. Kocembova's margin of victory was the largest ever in a major championship with runner-up Erika Rossi (Italy) timed in 52.37.

England came through with a couple of surprise winners in Beverly Kinch who took the 60m dash and Sue Hearnshaw who won the long jump.

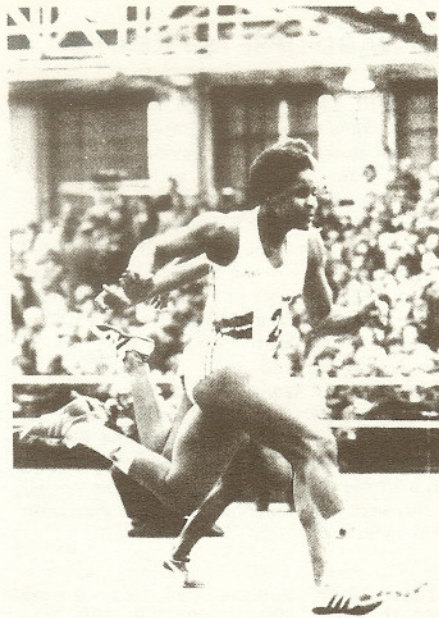

GREAT SPRINTING IN CANADIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Toronto, Canada, Feb. 25/26: Angela Bailey nipped Angella Taylor at the line in the 50 meters as both dipped under Taylor's Canadian record. Bailey's 6.16 second clocking is a personal best by a full tenth while Taylor's 6.19 is one one-hundredth under her old best.

Charmaine Crooks' 53.08 second 400m win dominated the 400 meters.

Karen Nelson was the only double winner of the Championship winning the 50m hurdles in 7.06 - just one one-hundredth ahead of Faye Blackwood. Nelson's 19'5½ long jump win was, however, inferior to Jill Ross-Griffen's 19'9¾ heptathlon effort. Ross-Griffen improved her season's best score to 4407 points.

Veteran Nancy Rooks (3000m in 9:12.30), Debbie Brill (high jump at 6'4) and Rose Hauch (shot put at 52'9) won their specialties as did newcomers Sue Durrell (200 in 24.35), Camille Cato (800m in 2:07.43) and Sandra Rettie (1500m in 4:24.2).

Tucson, Arizona, March 24: England's Judy Livermore picked up three golds as the University of Arizona staged its Annual Willie Williams Memorial Meet. The real battle came in the scoring as Arizona pipped BYU by only four points, 151-147.

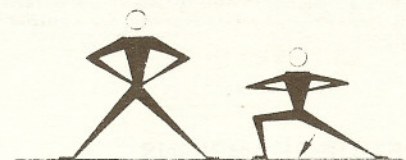

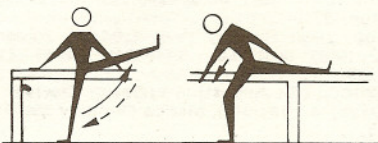
Hastings, Nebraska, April 7: Eight teams gathered for the Hastings Invitational, a non-scoring event, but Midland College was the dominant force with eight victories.

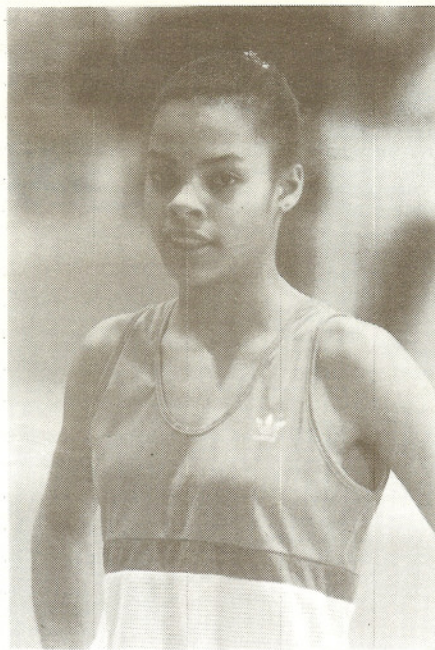

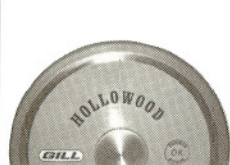

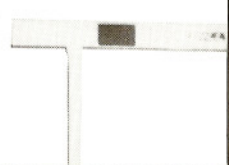
