Preparation of a yearbook is a complex process. Early in the school year the staff must spend long hours establishing policies, assigning blocks of space to each activity represented in the book, mastering layout technique, selecting pictures already available and planning pictures to be taken of forthcoming events, selling advertising, and meeting with the publisher's representative. These are just a part of the initial tasks to be completed. Once these preliminary steps are finished, the real work of page preparation begins.

Hundreds of pictures must be arranged to fit properly; captions have to be typed; precise layouts are drawn; copy is written, checked, and carefully fitted to the exact space allotted to it; finished pages are triple checked for accuracy before they are shipped to the publisher. And all this has to be done in time to meet deadlines which always come too soon.

Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays often find the staff hard at work. Hours are not counted, only results. We all owe a great deal to the excellent staff of *Olympian 70*.

The Materials Production Department offers facilities and services uncommon to many schools. It is graphically independent from original art work to bound copy. Drawing tables, lettering equipment, automatic typesetting equipment, plate maker, offset press, jogger, collater, power staplers and equipment for plastic bindings, are in three rooms, with a separate darkroom and process camera for photolithography.

The purpose of the department is to produce the printed and audiovisual materials necessary for instruction and the general use of the school. This includes dry mounting and lamination of materials, the production of overhead transparencies, slides and movies for classroom use. Materials and equipment are available for teacher-aides' and teachers' use.

Instruction in the graphic arts processes is available to interested students through various channels: Work Experience, Graphic Arts, Research Observer Program, Exploratory Experiences, and School Service. Students are also encouraged to use the facilities for individual projects in other subjects, such as art, science, math, business, home economics, music, foreign language, industrial art, English and history.

Journalism and Materials Production work closely together for the production of the *Oracle*. Copy is typed, negatives made and the paper is folded in this department. The *Target* is printed here and assembled by volunteer PTA members.








Business



The ORACLE is a self-supporting newspaper published every other full school week. All income comes from advertising sales; the paper is free to students and staff at Gunn. Business Manager Vicki Pedley does much of her ad solicitation by phone but also goes into the business community for copy pick-ups, consultation and new accounts. Tim Reed, in ad layout, has the task of fitting copy and art work within a prescribed number of column inches most effectively. He consults with page editors as to how many inches of advertising will go on each page. Teri Braasch handles statements, bookkeeping, correspondence and makes deposits along with writing and production. Printing bills and supplies, other than those which are part of classroom instruction in Journalism, are paid from the ORACLE account. This year the Executive Board voted a gift of \$500, plus a loan of \$500, to purchase a new Strip Printer for headlines and ads.




