own pending mark of 54-4-1/2. Walker also had jumps of 54-6-1/2 and 54-3-1/4.

Other stadium records were set by Ed Redin the javelin Paul Wilson and Bob Seagren in the pole vault, Pat Traynor in the 3000 meter steeplechase. The 100 meter hurdle record was tied by Don Shy of San Diego State.

Red, a 24-year-old graduate student at Arizona State U. hurled the javelin 270 feet 4 inches on his final attempt to better the old mark of 268-9 by Bill Alley of Kansas in 1960. Red came through after Frank Covello had uncorked a throw of 260-4-1/2 to move in front in the competition.

Wilson, a freshman at University of Southern California, won the pole vault at 17 feet 2 inches on fewer misses although Seagren also cleared that height. Their effort broke the mark of 16 1½ by Jim Eshelman of Stanford.

Traynor, the AAU champ from Long Beach, took the steeplechase in 8:47.2, well under the old standard of 9:00.8 set by Bruce Mortenson of Oregon in 1965. Shy, a football star at San Diego State, pulled an upset by winning the 110 meter hurdles in 13.7 to equal the stadium mark set by Lee Calhoun of North Carolina State in 1956. Shy finished in front of Tom White of the Striders and Willie Davenport. The latter is the current AAU champion.

Outstanding performances in the women's events were by Charlotte Cook, who won the 400 meters in 53.8, and Barbara Ferrell, who edged record holder Wyomia Tyus in the 100 in . 11.6.
