City College of San Francisco's foursome of Adam Banks, Robert Prince, O. J. Simpson and Lee Betten toured the 440 relay in 40.9, surpassing the record of 41.0 established by Bakersfield in 1960. The mark also equals the pending record turned in by Pasadena City College earlier this season.

Simpson, Rams football star who scored 26 touchdowns last fall, turned in a strong leg despite running with a cast on his left wrist. Betten fought off a determined challenge by Ben Olison of Bakersfield. Bakersfield was a close second in the old record time of 41 flat.

Bakersfield turned the tables in the 880 relay, smashing one of the oldest junior college records on the books when the quartet of Leotis Adams, Pat Weedle, Don Johnson and Olison ran 1:24.7 to erase the former standard of 1:25.6 set

by Riverside in 1938 and tied by San Diego in 1958.

Leading all the way, Neil Duggan of Alan Hancock set a torrid pace on the final lap to win the two mile in 8:54.0, rubbing out the junior college record of 8:57.4 set by Bob Delaney of Santa Ana in 1964. Foothill's Russ Mahon was third in 9:23.5.

Unheralded Stanley Royster of Los Angeles City College turned in the best JC. long jump mark in the nation this season with a leap of 25-0½.

## Gerry Sets 3-Mile Mark At Seattle

SEATTLE (AP) — Ambling in lonely splendor through the gusty breezes of a chilly afternoon, little Gerry Lindgren of Washington State University posted a 12:53 three-mile Saturday in the Northern Division, Pacific Athletic Conference track meet to eclipse his own American record and miss the world mark by a second.

The small sophomore's big effort was not enough to lift his team higher than third place in the four-team meet as big Neal Steinhauer led Oregon to its 13th consecutive division championship.

Steinhauer retained his titles in shotput and discus and cracked the platter record with a toss of 185-3, just an inch less than 12 feet better than the discus mark set by Oregon State's Lou Fasano in 1964.
