Ryun, who took over the lead on the last lap, was timed in 8:25.2. Grelle, from Portland, Ore., had the same time, bet-tering the American record of 8:26.0 set by Bob Schul in Wood-land Hills, Calif., August 29,

A four man team from the University of Southern California broke the world record in the two mile relay with a time of 7:17.4, clipping a full second

off the old mark.

The old mark was set by Oklahoma State at 7:18.4 at Fresno, Calif., May 8, 1965.
Favored Texas finished sec-

ond in 7:18.5—one-tenth second off the record — and Villanova was third in 7:18.8. Georgetown did not finish the race.
