

# Burlingame spikers win sectional meet

There's an old saying in sports that when the going gets tough, the tough get going.

The toughest competitors in the Central Coast Section track qualifications at Gunn High School Saturday proved to be sprinter James Marshall of Ravenswood and hurdler Randy Weil of Burlingame.

Marshall beat the field in both the 100 and 220-yard dashes and then came back to give the Trojans another win with a fine anchor leg in the relay.

Jet-propelled James, who ran the 100 in 9.6 earlier in the season, was clocked in 10.1 in the 100 and 21.9 in the 220. His time for the final 220 yards of the relay was even swifter as the Trojans clicked off a 1:31.1 for the half mile event.

Weil had to beat two outstanding hurdlers — Bob Evers of Cubberley in the lows and Rich Gendreau of Gunn in the highs.

Weil won the highs in 14.6 with Gendreau finishing second and Weil came through again in the lows as he whipped Evers and was time in 19.3.

## TEAM TITLE

The team title went to Burlingame, thanks to the points by Weil and a one-two finish in the pole vault. Jeff DeManes defeated teammate Steve DeLoach in the pole vault, 13-6.

For outstanding performances, the awards went to a pair of South Peninsula Athletic League participants.

John Radetich of San Carlos continued his string of successes in the high jump by winning with a leap of 6-7 $\frac{3}{4}$ .

John Enscoe of Palo Alto, who seems to run only as fast as he wants to win, took the mile in 4:33.5.

## WELCH WINS

Other winners for the SPAL were Ben Welch of Woodside in the discus with a throw of 171-0 $\frac{1}{2}$  and Rick Brandeberg of San Carlos, who finished fast to take the quarter mile in 50.3.

Rich Hunter of Gunn gave it a battle but lost to more experienced Ted Lydon of San Mateo in the two mile. Lydon's time was 9:26.5.

The SPAL has a chance to get one more competitor in this week's CCS finals at Gunn.

Halfmiler John Lilly of San Carlos, held out of the meet because of illness, will meet the fifth place finisher in a runoff for a spot in the finals. Lilly has run 1:55.8 and, if he is healthy, should win easily.

In Class B, Sequoia and Mills tied for the team title with 32 points each.

A good chunk of the Mills points came from Bob Garcia who put together one of the most bizarre double wins in prep track history. He won the two mile run and also the pole vault. The only Midpeninsula winner in the Class B meet was the Menlo-Atherton relay team.

The Bears of M-A finished third in B scoring with 28 points.

This week's CCS meet is the last of the season for the B track men.

The top three finishers in the varsity events Saturday qualify for the state championships to be held June 3-4 at the University of California in Berkeley.

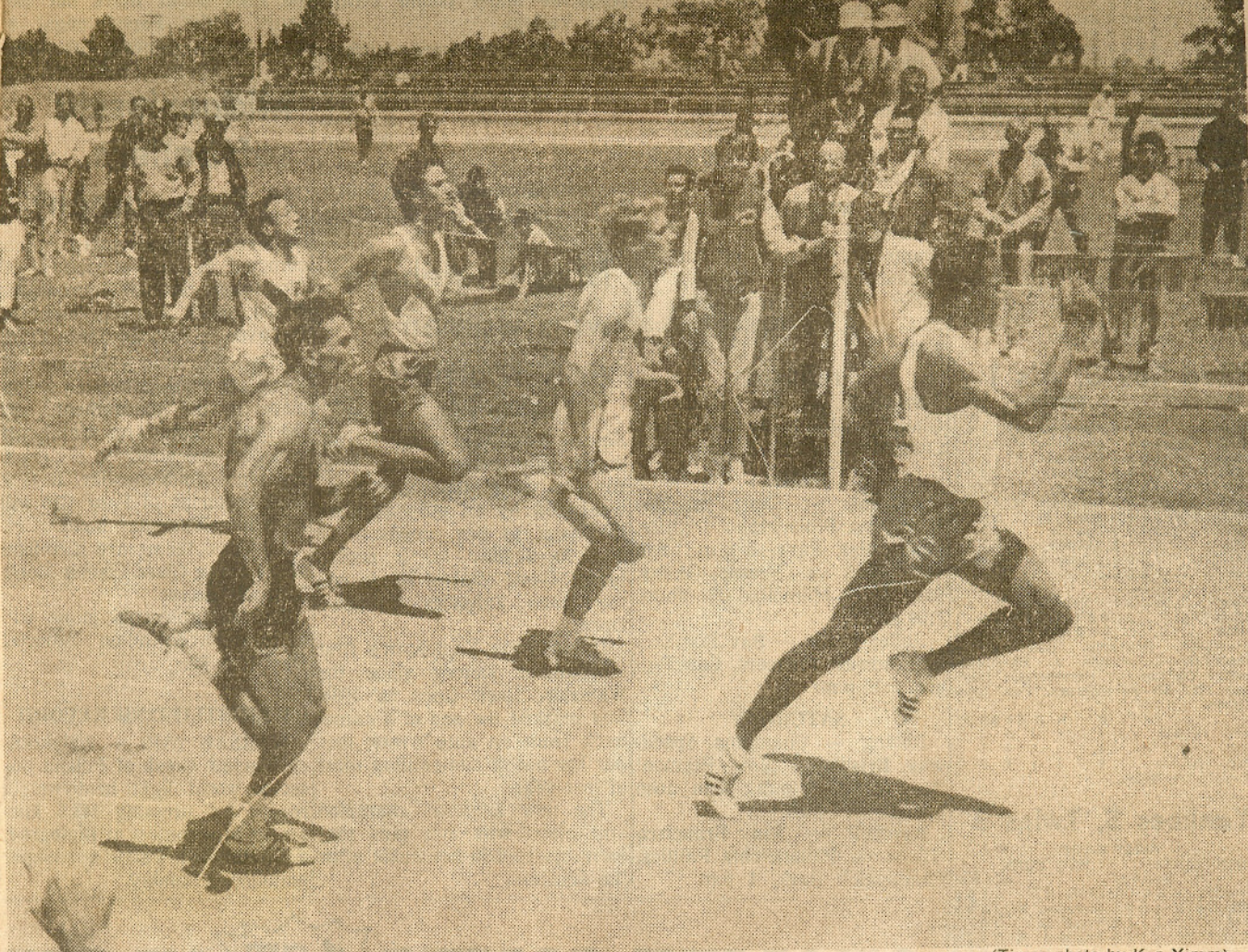

# SPAL Spikers In Good Marks

PALO ALTO — In quantity, the SPAL did not do as well as hoped in Saturday's Regional Track qualifying meet here Saturday, but in quality the league stood up just fine.

The SPAL won seven events (it was favored in nine) and was outscored as a league 103½ to 96½ by the neighboring Mid-Peninsula League.

Several marks by SPAL entries promise to stand up well in the Central Coast Section Championships on the same track next Saturday.

John Radetich of San Carlos, for instance, would seem a cinch for a state meet berth in the high jump off his 6-7¾. Ditto Ben Welch, of Woodside, who threw the discus 171-0¼.

San Carlos' Rick Brandenburg won the 440 in 50.3, Ravenswood's Jim Marshall the 100 and 220 in 10.1 and 21.9 and Palo Alto's Jon Enscoe the mile in 4:23.5. Ravenswood's relay team provided the other SPAL win in 1:31.1 after clocking 1:30.6 in trials.

Burlingame won the varsity

meet with 35½ points. San Mateo beat Ravenswood for second 27-26.
