M-A takes seventh in Hollister meet

Menlo-Atherton High School tied for seventh in the annual Hollister Relays Friday night with ten points. Sequoia High School tied for fifth with eleven points.

Menlo-Atherton took a second in the 440-yard relay with a time of 44.7 seconds and in the sprint medley, a fourth.

Bill Hatcher of M-A placed third in the century in 10.4 seconds.

M-A Track Season Ends

Menlo-Atherton High's "B" track team rang down the curtain on activities for the year by tying for seventh place in the Hollister Relays Friday night.

Most of the Bears' 10 points were gained on team strength in short relays. They took second in the 440-yard relay with a time of 44.7, which was their best for the year, and fourth in the sprint medley.

Members of the relay team were Ray Williams, Jim Stamper, Ray Walker, and Bill Hatcher.

Best individual performance of the team was turned in by Bill Hatcher, who ran the 100-yard dash in 10.4 to take third place.

The only Sequoia District team to do better than M-A was Sequoia, which tied for fifth place with 11 points.

Dan Britts set a new varsity and school record in the mile with a time of 4:36.2. He placed sixth.

Dunker (56-8¹/₄), Erickson Glitter

HOLLISTER — Jeff Dunker put the shot 56-8¹/₄, second best in Sequoia District history, and Chris Erickson contributed three brilliant relay legs to lead Woodside High to the team championship of the annual Hollister Track Relays Friday night.

Dunker, a senior, improved his school record by nearly two feet in his final high school meet. He had two other efforts over 55 feet.

Erickson ran the anchor 440 in 50.1 to give Woodside fourth in the mile relay and came back minutes later with a fine leg in the 440 relay, in which teammate Neill Platts nipped Carlmont for first place in 44.4. Erickson also ran a 1:23 — 660 leg to help win the sprint medley relay.

Woodside's Fred Storek equalled the meet record of 9.9 in winning the 100-yard dash, but may have had an aiding tailwind.

Woodside nipped Capuchino 29-28 for the varsity title. Gunn was third with 23 and Carlmont fourth with 21.

Sequoia's Mark Pigman turned in one of the most impressive class B marks of the meet, winning the 100-yard dash in 10.1.

Washington of San Francisco won the B meet with 21 points. Sequoia tied for fifth with 11 and Menlo-Atherton tied for seventh with 10.

Woodside's Dunker has been bettered in the shot in Sequoia District history only by Menlo-Atherton's Larry Kennedy, who put 57-10¹/₂ in 1961 in the same Hollister meet. Kennedy went on to become NCAA discus champion for New Mexico.
