

Muir Wins CIF Track Title

Muir won as expected. The Mustangs' Jerry Proctor stole the show, and CIF Southern Section records were set in the shot put and the two-mile.

But the rest of the stars failed to shine and were as cold as the chilly air at Cerritos College in the Southern Section track-and-field finals Friday night.

As many as six CIF records and three national marks were imperiled off past performances, but the big guns just didn't go off.

15 For Heglar

Pole vaulter Paul Heglar of Muir, with a best of 16-3, won his specialty as expected, but settled for a disappointing 15 feet. He had the bar raised to 16-7 after winning the event, but went UNDER the beam on each of his three tries.

Southern Section high jump record-holder William Morris of Compton fell far short of his 6-10 1/4 lifetime best, winning at 6-8, which was four inches better than second best.

John Hubbell of Long Beach Poly accounted for

his record with a 67-9 3/4 shot put, which exceeded by three inches his previous best effort that was set in last week's semifinals.

Sunny Hills' Dennis Murphy, whose 67-2 was tops in Southern California until last Friday, finished a poor second at 64-11 1/4.

The other record was established by two-miler Mike Sellers of West Torrance, who stepped off a 9:12.0 to erase the week-old standard of 9:12.9 of Western's Ron Fister.

Fister finished fourth, but was disqualified for pushing an opponent on the last lap.

Walter Opp's powerful Muir team, which led all schools by qualifying eight for the finals, took advantage of its team strength for the victory before a crowd of 9,000. Particularly impressive for Muir was Proctor,

whose "Iron Man" effort picked points for the Mustangs in four events. Proctor won the long jump at 24-4 1/4 (five points), placed fourth in the low hurdles (two points), finished fourth in the high hurdles (two points) and ran on the relay team which finished second.

Muir compiled 22 points, easily outdistancing second-place Bolsa Grande at 14. Oxnard (13) was third, and Compton (12) fourth in team scoring.

Double winners were Bruce Gridley of Northview, who took the 120 highs in 13.8 and 180 lows in 18.8, and sprinter Jim Smith of Upland, who ticked off the 100 in 9.7 and 220 in 21.1.

The top five finishers in each event qualified for the state meet, which will be held next Friday and Saturday in Berkeley.
