# Westmoor Is NPL Champ

The Westmoor High School track team added the finishing chapter to its sterling epic of 1966 Peninsula track and field supremacy yesterday.

Coach Bob Lotti's Ram cinders, to the surprise of nobody, brought the 1966 North Peninsula League track title to the Westmoor campus as they cantered home an easy winner in the NPL Finals at windy and cold Oceana High School.

## BASEBALL

### Dons Cinch First-Ever SPAL Title

The San Carlos High School baseball team, using a delightful formula for winning, today has its first-ever baseball championship firmly tucked away under its belt.

The Dons, whose formula includes the two ingredients of winning for yourself and getting timely aid from others, cinched at least a tie for the South Peninsula Athletic League laurels yesterday afternoon as they knocked off Ravenswood, 4-2. This victory, coupled with Woodside losing to Sequoia, 3-2, gives San Carlos a three-game lead with but a trio of contests remaining.

In the other games, Menlo-Atherton was completely eliminated from the title picture, as it was upended by Gunn, 6-5, and Carlmont was taking out some early season frustration on Cubberley, winning 8-1.

The Dons, now in their sixth season of varsity baseball, topped out to a quick lead in the first when Steve Goetz singled, stole second, and scored on a double by Charlie Bukker. Goetz ran his stolen base mark to 15, one shy of the SPAL record.

The Trojans bounced back with a run in the second on a tremendous home run off the bat of Gary Hamilton, and went ahead in the third on a single by Terry Brust, and an RBI by Roy Robinson.

Then Don hurler Dave Rose settled down and allowed just one more hit the rest of the way, retiring the last seven men to ace him, as he racked up league win number seven without a loss. Rose, in striking form, also ran his whiff mark up to 69 K's in 49 innings. In addition to his prowess on the mound, he also is batting .400 with 14 runs batted in.

San Carlos scored three times in the top of the fourth on a double by Bob Emery, a triple

The Rams piled up 94½ points, compared to distant second place South S.F.'s 48 points.

"This is without a doubt the best team I have ever coached," he stated after the victory. "They were unselfish, full of spirit and gave forth with a tremendous team effort," he further added between smiles. "It was our depth and spirit."

The Westmoor team went through the 1966 dual meet season undefeated and boasted wins over Catholic Athletic League champion Serra, South Peninsula Athletic League champion Carlmont, and Mid-Peninsula League champion Burlingame.

Lotti thought that the turning point which really inspired his team on to the smashing victory was Bruce Herald's upset of South S.F.'s Gary John in the 440. Herald, who broke from lane six, went to the front right away and scored a wire-to-wire victory in 51 seconds flat.

Five weather-beaten NPL standards fell by the wayside in the meet. Herald's upset in the 440 was a new mark, as was teammate Milo Torres' 10:02.4 clocking in the two-mile run.

South S.F.'s fine sophomore sprinter Russ Cottrell also rewrote the record books in the 100-yard dash as he traversed the century in 10.1. Cottrell made it a double for the day by winning the 220 with a 23 second flat clocking.

Jefferson's Jasper Brown etched his name into the history book as he shattered the 180-yard low hurdle mark with a 19.8 effort.

In the field events, Westmoor pole-vaulter Jimmy Johnson cleared the bar at 13-1½ for a new NPL standard.

Terra Nova tied for the class B championship by taking a narrow 61-60 decision over the Ram lights. The Westmoor B's had gone undefeated during the dual meet season.

Leading Terra Nova's upset were Steve Wilson and Bob Keeler. Ray Untalan was a double winner for the Jefferson class B thinclads, annexing both the discus and shotput. South S.F.'s Tony Anninos also captured two events, winning the 70 yard high hurdles and the 220.
