Beaty wins 220 in Region; Mackey, Springer strong

If Leigh's two-miler Bill Mackey and Del Mar's miler Karl Springer continue to improve this week as they did last week, they may be the West Valley Athletic League's best bet to advance to the State high school track and field finals June 3 and 4 at Berkeley.

Some ten WVAL varsity trackmen qualified last Friday at the Central Coast Section (Region II) meet at Cupertino to advance this Saturday to the CCS meet at Ginn High School, Palo Alto.

CCS trials will start at 9:30 a.m. and run through 11:20 and finals will run from 1:30 p.m. to 4:30. The top three finishers at this meet advance to the State meet the following Saturday at University of California's Edwards Field.

Westmont's Ted Beaty was the only WVAL winner at Cupertino, taking the 220 in 22.2 and scratching in the 440 after qualifying for the finals.

The WVAL produced six second-place winners, several who look like possible State finalists. Los Gatos' Bill Winkleman was second in the long jump with a leap of 22-2 1/2, a fine effort for a junior and not far off the winning mark of 22-4 3/4 by Earl Harris of Ayer.

Mackey of Leigh won the WVAL two-mile two weeks ago in 9:49.9 and bettered that time greatly at Cupertino, running a 9:34.4, on the heels of Mike Gunion (Wilcox) who recorded a 9:33.4.

Springer, the WVAL champion in 4:33.6, ran a 4:25.9 in the Regionals for his second place behind a 4:24.4 by Joey Orsua of Sunnyvale.

Other second places by WVAL entries were: Dan Willis (Leigh), 120 high hurdles, 15.0, Eric Pousard (Leigh), high jump, 5-11, and Rich Dunn (Leigh), triple jump, 45-10.

Mitch Mandich of Los Gatos was third in the high hurdles in 15.1 and teammate Ron Azevedo

was sixth in the lows.

Other WVAL place winners: Westmont relay team, seventh; Bill Hites (Leigh), pole vault, seventh; Hale Vagts (Del Mar), 100, sixth; Art Tracey (Westmont), discus, seventh; Steve

Hevenaugh (Del Mar), 880 seventh, and Rich Perez (Leigh) 440, sixth.

The Santa Clara Athletic League dominated first places, taking 11 of 15 and the Mount Hamilton League took three.

The Native Sons of the Golden West are sponsoring a cleft-palate benefit Friday night with game receipts going to the Grand Parlor to be used in operating the childrens' cleft-palate clinic at the U.C. Medical Center in San Francisco.

San Jose and Fresno will also clash Saturday night at 7:30 in Municipal Stadium. On Sunday the Bees and Little Giants will meet immediately after the San Francisco Giants and Philadelphia Phillies finish their game which starts at 12 noon at Candlestick Park.

Arrangements have been made for special buses to leave Municipal Stadium at 10 a.m. for the twin bill. Total price for the

transportation and game tickets is \$5.25, but fans must purchase their tickets in advance at the Bees office in Municipal Stadium.

On Memorial Day the Bees and Fresno will meet at Buck Shaw Stadium in Santa Clara at 7:30 o'clock. The game was moved to Santa Clara because two former University of Santa Clara stars, centerfielder Howie Martin and third baseman Alan Gallagher, play for Fresno. Gallagher is one of the top hitters in the league with a mark of .359.

San Jose first baseman Don Anderson paced the circuit in hitting through the latest official statistics with a mark of .400. The Bees had three other men over .300, shortstop Art Miranda at .355, rookie third baseman Phil Mastagni at .337 and catcher Dennis Paepke at .318. Mastagni and rightfielder Dave Torgerson turned in nine game hitting streaks recently, both ending together in a game with Stockton.
