

# San Carlos Prep Leaps 6-91/2 i

John Radetich of San Carlos High erased the oldest, most famous name from the SPAL track record book Thursday when he high jumped 6 feet, 9½ inches in a dual meet at Gunn High in South Palo Alto.

Radetich, whose previous best jump this season was 6-1½, took the 19-year old record away from Les Steers, who leaped 6-6½ for Palo Alto in 1937 and went on to become the best high jumper in the world for a number of years.

ber of years.

The 6-1½ San Carlos senior cleared the record height with inches to spare on his first at-

tempt. Waiting only long enough for the standards to be raised to seven feet (the bar sagged to 6-11½), he got over on his first try but knocked the bar off with his trailing leg.

His remaining two attempts were not as close.

"Somebody smashed my marker when I went over 6-9½,"
Radetich said later, "and I couldn't get my steps right at 7-feet." The meet practically came to a standstill as athletes and fans rushed to the high jump area to watch John try

for 7.

Radetich jumped 6-4 early last season, fourth best in league history, but had made it over

6-2 only once since then. "I had a feeling I was going to have a good day when I jumped 6-1½ in practice Tuesday," John explained. "That's three inches higher than I've ever gone in practice."

He also praised the facilities at Gunn. "That's the first time I've jumped off Grastex this year and the foam rubber in the pit is great. It felt just like I was floating over, it was great,"

he enthused.


Radetich will have several more chances to enjoy the Gunn pit this spring as the SPAL, Regional and Central Coast Section meets all will be held at the new Palo Alto school.

Inspired by Radetich and by Bob Meyer's upset victory over Gunn's heralded Rich Gendreau in the low hurdles, San Carlos picked up 15 points that logic said belonged to Gunn and whipped the Titans 69-53 to stay on Carlmont's heels in the SPAL championship race.





John Radetich of San Carlos High erased the oldest, most famous name from the SPAL track record book Thursday when he high jumped 6 feet, 91/2 inches in a dual meet at Gunn High in South Palo Alto.

Radetich, whose previous best jump this season was 6-11/2, took the 29-year old record away from Les Steers, who leaped 6-61/2 for Palo Alto in 1937 and went on to become the best high jumper in the world for a num-

ber of years.

The 6-1½ San Carlos senior cleared the record height with inches to spare on his first at-

tempt. Waiting only long enough for the standards to be raised to seven feet (the bar sagged to 6-111/2), he got over on his first try but knocked the bar off with his trailing leg.

His remaining two attempts were not as close

"Somebody smashed my marker when I went over 6-91/2," Radetich said later, "and I couldn't get my steps right at 7-feet." The meet practically came to a standstill as athlets and fans rushed to the high jump area to watch John try

Radetich jumped 6-4 early last season, fourth best in league history, but had made it over 6-2 only once since then. "I had a feeling I was going to have a good day when I jumped 6-11/2 in practice Tuesday," John explained. "That's three inches higher than I've ever gone in practice.

He also praised the facilities at Gunn. "That's the first time I've jumped off Grastex this year and the foam rubber in the pit is great. It felt just like I was floating over, it was great," he enthused.

Radetich will have several more chances to enjoy the Gunn pit this spring as the SPAL, Regional and Central Coast Section meets all will be held at the new Palo Alto school.

Inspired by Radetich and by Bob Meyer's upset victory over Gunn's heralded Rich Gendreau in the low hurdles, San Carlos picked up 15 points that logic said belonged to Gunn and whipped the Titans 69-53 to stay on Carlmont's heels in the SPAL championship race.

Carlmont battered Woodside 75-47 at home for its 55th consecutive SPAL dual meet victory and fifth this year. San Carlos has a 4-0 record.

Ravenswood set a school scoring record in blistering Menlo-Atherton 91-31 and Cubberley thundered past Sequoia 84-38 in the other SPAL meets. Palo Alto won a nonleague triangular
